The Nebraska softball team begins postseason play this week when the Huskers travel to Iowa, which is hosting the 2024 Big Ten Softball Tournament at Bob Pearl Field.

The Huskers ended the regular season with a 29-22 record and finished fourth in the Big Ten Conference with a 12-9 record. Nebraska earned the No. 4 seed and a first-round bye for the Big Ten Tournament. The Huskers will open play on Thursday at 1:30 p.m. in a quarterfinal matchup against either No. 5 seed Minnesota or No. 12 seed Illinois.

Nebraska has had success at the Big Ten Tournament since it was brought back in 2022 following a two-year absence due to the pandemic. The Huskers won the 2022 Big Ten Tournament and made the semifinals at last year's tournament. Nebraska and Northwestern are the only teams who have made the Big Ten Tournament semifinals each of the past two years.

Nebraska has won 10 conference tournaments in school history, including six in the Big Eight, three in the Big 12 and one in the Big Ten. The Huskers have made the championship game 15 times in their 39 all-time conference tournament appearances in program history, including two championship game appearances in their first nine Big Ten Tournaments.

Every game of the 2024 Big Ten Tournament will air live on the Big Ten Network. A free radio broadcast of every Nebraska game will also be available on Huskers.com and the official Nebraska Huskers app.

LEADING OFF

- Nebraska is seeking its 30th win which would be the 24th time Rhonda Revelle has led NU to 30 wins in a season.
- Six of Nebraska's 24 players (25 percent of the roster) are out for the season with an injury (list on page 6).
- Nebraska has played nine extra-inning games this season, its most extra-inning games in a season since 1982 (11).
- The Huskers have played 18 one-run games this season, their most one-run games in a season since 2007.
- Nebraska has come from behind in 18 of its 29 wins, including 11 wins when the Huskers trailed by multiple runs.

- Nebraska ranks fifth nationally in double plays (30) and sixth in doubles (89).
- According to the NCAA RPI, Nebraska has played the 36th-toughest schedule in the country and the toughest schedule of any Big Ten team.
- Billie Andrews needs one stolen base to become the first player in school history with 50 career steals & 50 career homers.
- Sarah Harness won twice last weekend to give her 65 career wins. She is one of 20 active Division I pitchers with 65 wins.
- Katelyn Caneda has 96 career hits and is four hits from becoming the 12th Husker with 100 hits prior to her junior year.

- Associate Head Coach Lori Sippel is in her 35th year at Nebraska. Sippel is believed to be the longest-tenured assistant coach in the history of Husker Athletics.
- Revelle (1981-83) and Sippel (1985-88) also played for NU. Including their playing and coaching careers, Revelle and Sippel have been a part of 1,425 of Nebraska's 1,607 all-time victories (89 percent).
- Nebraska played 21 home games this season, which marked the most regularseason home games in the 23-year history of Bowlin Stadium.
- This year marked the first time Nebraska has played more home games (21) than true road games (14) in a season since 2010
- NU played a 21-game Big Ten schedule in the final year the conference will feature 14 teams. The Huskers did not play Indiana, Maryland, Michigan State, Ohio State or Purdue this season.
- Iowa is hosting the Big Ten Tournament, which is set for May 8-11. The top 12 teams in the final regular-season standings qualify for the tournament.
- The 64-team NCAA Tournament bracket will be announced on Sunday, May 12 at 6 p.m. (Central) on ESPN2.

GRAY TIES RECORD WITH THIRD B1G PLAYER-OF-THE-WEEK AWARD

Sydney Gray was named the final Big Ten Player of the Week of the 2024 season on Monday. Gray was honored for the third time this season, which ties for the most player-of-the-week honors in a single season in Big Ten history.

- Gray is just the eighth player in Big Ten history to be named the Big Ten Player of the Week three times in one season. She is only the third player to win the award three times in a season since the Big Ten expanded to 12 teams beginning with the 2012 season.
- Gray is a four-time Big Ten Player of the Week in her career, which ties for the 10th-most awards in conference history.
- Gray was honored this week after an outstanding series at Minnesota last weekend, when she helped the Huskers to a 2-1 series victory and a top-four conference finish. Gray went 6-for-11 (.545) in the three-game series with two home runs and seven RBIs. She had at least two hits, one run and one RBI in each game of the series.
- In game one, Gray homered as part of a 2-for-4 day in Nebraska's 7-6 come-from-behind victory. The next day, Gray hit the go-ahead three-run homer in another comeback win and finished 2-for-3 with five RBIs. In the series finale, Gray went 2-for-4 with a run and an RBI.
- Led by Gray, Nebraska took home five player-of-the-week awards in 13 weeks this season. While Gray was a three-time winner of the award, **Billie Andrews** was named the Big Ten Player of the Week twice.

Nebraska has shown a knack for coming from behind this season. The Huskers have trailed in 18 of their 29 wins, including 11 times when Nebraska came back from a multi-run deficit. The Huskers' largest comeback this season has been five runs, twice.

- The Huskers have won four times when trailing after six innings this season. Nebraska is 4-13 when trailing after six innings in 2024 after a 3-74 record in the previous five seasons combined.
- Nebraska's four wins this season when trailing after six innings are its most since the 2016 team also won four times when trailing after six innings. Another win when trailing after six innings would give Nebraska its most such wins in a since at least the start of this century.
- Twice NU has won on a walk-off home run when trailing in the bottom of the seventh inning.

NAIL BITERS FOR THE BIG RED

Not surprisingly given its tough schedule, Nebraska has become accustomed to playing close games. The Huskers have played 18 games decided by one run (35 percent of their schedule).

- Nebraska's 18 one-run games are its most in 17 seasons since the 2007 Huskers played 25 games decided by one run.
- The Huskers are 11-7 in games decided by one run, its most one-run wins in a season since 2007, when the Huskers were 15-10 in one-run games.
- Eleven of Nebraska's 21 Big Ten games were decided by one run (52 percent). The Huskers were 6-5 in one-run games during the conference season.
- Nebraska has also played nine extra-inning games this season, which matches the total of extra-inning games the Huskers played in the 2022 and 2023 seasons combined.
- The nine extra-inning games for Nebraska this season are its most since the 1982 team of which Rhonda Revelle was a member played 11 extra-inning games.
- Nebraska is 5-4 in extra innings this season. The five extra-inning wins are the most by a Husker team since the 2007 squad went 6-2 in extra-inning games.
- The Huskers went 4-2 in extra innings during the Big Ten season.

NEBRASKA RANKS THIRD IN THE BIG TEN IN EXTRA-BASE HITS

Nebraska has hit 89 doubles, five triples and 55 home runs for a total of 149 extra-base hits. The Huskers rank second in the conference in doubles and third in extra-base hits.

• Nebraska is one just 11 teams in the country with 80 doubles and 50 home runs.

HUSKERS HAVE FACED BIG TEN'S TOUGHEST SCHEDULE

The fact that Nebraska earned a bye at the Big Tournament is a testament to the toughness and fight the Huskers have shown this season. Not only did Nebraska finish fourth in the Big Ten standings while playing most of the conference schedule with 25 percent of its roster sidelined with injuries, the Huskers have also played the Big Ten's toughest schedule this year.

- In Monday's NCAA RPI ranking, Nebraska had the No. 37 strength of schedule in the country. The Huskers have faced the toughest schedule this season of any Big Ten team according to the RPI, as Penn State ranks second with a No. 44 strength of schedule.
- In conference play, Nebraska played each of the other top five seeds (Northwesten, Michigan, Rutgers and Minnesota). Ohio State and Michigan State were the only other Big Ten teams to play series against each of the top three seeds, while Nebraska and Ohio State were the only Big Ten teams to play series against four of the top five seeds.
- The Huskers not only played each of the other top five Big Ten teams, nine of their 11 games against those opponents were on the road.

OFFENSE RANKS HIGHLY IN SCHOOL HISTORY

Nebraska boasts one of the top offenses in school history this season. The Huskers also rank sixth nationally in doubles and 32nd in home runs.

- Nebraska's 89 doubles rank fourth in school history. The Huskers need five doubles to tie the school record (94) and six to set a new program record for doubles in a season.
- The Huskers are averaging 5.8 runs per game. That currently ranks as the fourth-highest scoring average in school history. Nebraska has a chance to become just the third team in school history to average 6.0 runs per game, joining the 2015 (6.9 runs per game) and 2022 (6.0 runs per game) teams.
- Nebraska has totaled 149 extra-base hits and is on pace for 152 extra-base hits this season. That extra-base hit total would rank fourth in school history.
- Nebraska owns a .480 slugging percentage that is on pace to rank fifth in school history.

TOP-25 RANKINGS

Nebraska has been ranked in the final NFCA poll in 15 of the 29 years the poll has existed. The Huskers were one of only six teams nationally to be ranked in the final poll in each of the first 12 years it existed (1995 to 2006).

REVELLE ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS

Rhonda Revelle has produced 14 academic All-Americans at Nebraska. That total ranks fourth among all active Division I softball head coaches.

WCWS APPEARANCES

Nebraska has advanced to the Women's College World Series seven times to rank 15th in NCAA history.

Four former Huskers have competed in the Olympics, combining for five Olympic Games. A fifth Husker (Taylor Edwards) was a 2020 Olympic alternate for Team USA.

HUSKERS HIT BY INJURY BUG

Nebraska has had its share of adversity this season, as the Huskers have dealt with multiple injuries. Six Huskers have suffered season-ending injuries and a total of 12 players have missed at least one game this season due to injury, including six returning all-region players.

- **Abbie Squier**, a returning All-Big Ten and all-region selection, is out for the season following offseason surgery. Squier had been the Huskers' starting right fielder the past two seasons and was a first-team All-Big Ten selection in 2022.
- **Jordy Bahl** suffered a knee injury in the first game that required season-ending surgery. A first-year transfer from Oklahoma, Bahl was a first-team All-American in both 2022 and 2023. She was the Big 12 Pitcher of the Year both seasons after going 44-2 with a 0.99 ERA.
- Caitlin Olensky suffered a season-ending injury against Illinois on March 22. She owns Nebraska's lowest ERA this season by nearly a full run.
- Talia Tokheim missed the first 23 games this season while rehabbing a season-ending injury from 2023. Upon her return, Tokheim hit three home runs in six starts before she suffered a season-ending injury against Penn State on April 7.
- Dakota Carter, Nebraska's top pinch runner, is out for the season with a shoulder injury.
- Abbey Newlun suffered a knee injury during the fall that required season-ending surgery.

BILLIE ANDREWS BREAKS HUSKER HOME RUN RECORD

Billie Andrews ranks 32nd nationally in home runs per game (0.3) with 15 homers in 47 games. She is Nebraska's all-time home run leader with 58 career homers.

- Andrews hit the record-breaking 55th home run of her career against Illinois on March 22. Nebraska's previous home run record was 54, set by Taylor Edwards (2011-14).
- Andrews has also tied another home run record. She has seven games with multiple homers in her career, tying Tristen Edwards (2017-21) for the most multi-homer games in NU history.
- Andrews has 15 home runs this season. She is the first Husker to hit 15 or more home runs in three different seasons and just the second to have two 15-homer seasons.
- Andrews ranks 14th among all active Division I players with 58 career home runs.

BILLIE ANDREWS JOINS 40-40 CLUB & NEARS 50-50 MARK

Billie Andrews has joined Jennifer Lizama as the only players in program history to hit 40 career home runs and steal 40 career bases. With her next stolen bases, Andrews would become the first Husker with 50 career home runs and 50 career stolen bases.

- There are only nine active players with 40 career homers and 40 career stolen bases. Of those nine, Andrews is one of only four who has played her entire career in a power conference.
- With her next stolen bases, Andrews would become just the fourth active player with 50 career home runs and 50 career stolen bases. The only three active players with 50 career homers and steals entering this week were: Addison Barnard (Wichita State), Kiki Milloy (Tennessee) and Karli Spaid (Miami [Ohio]).

BILLIE ANDREWS AMONG BIG TEN ALL-TIME HOME RUN LEADERS

Billie Andrews' production at the plate is leaving its mark in the Big Ten record book, as she finds herself on the Big Ten's all-time home runs list.

• Andrews' 58 career home runs rank sixth in Big Ten history. Andrews needs two home runs to become just the sixth player in Big Ten history to hit 60 career home runs.

BILLIE ANDREWS WITH MORE CAREER HITS THAN GAMES PLAYED

Billie Andrews has produced 232 hits in only 206 career games. She ranks seventh all-time at Nebraska in hits.

• Andrews is guaranteed to become just the seventh four-year Husker to finish with more hits than games played. Andrews has 26 more hits than games played, a difference that ranks third in school history behind multi-time All-Americans Ali Viola and Tobin Echo-Hawk.

ANDREWS AMONG BIG TEN & NATIONAL LEADERS

Billie Andrews is the Big Ten's active career leader in hits and home runs, and she also ranks highly among the Big Ten and active national leaders in other categories.

- Andrews leads all Big Ten players in hits (232) and home runs (58) while ranking second in runs (187) and RBIs (151). Andrews is second to Indiana's Cora Bassett (190) in runs scored, but Bassett is in her fifth season while Andrews is in her fourth year. Similarly, Andrews is second in RBIs behind Penn State's Gaby Garcia (170), a first-year transfer in her fifth season.
- Nationally, Andrews is ranked 14th among all active players in career home runs (58), 18th in total bases (450) and 21st in runs (187).

BILLIE ANDREWS NAMED NU'S FEMALE STUDENT-ATHLETE OF THE YEAR

Billie Andrews won Nebraska's most coveted award at the Huskers' annual recognition banquet on April 28 when she was named the 2023-24 Nebraska Female Student-Athlete of the Year. With the honor, Andrews will be the Huskers' Big Ten Medal of Honor recipient this season.

- Andrews is just the third softball player to be named the Female Student-Athlete of the Year
 in the 34 years the award has existed. The other softball players to win the honor were Mattie
 Fowler (2016) and Jenny Smith (1998).
- Andrews owns the distinction of being chosen as both the Nebraska Female Athlete of the Year (2022) and the Female Student-Athlete of the Year (2024). She joins volleyball player Mikaela Foecke and diver Abigail Knapton as the only three women to win both awards.

ANDREWS LOOKING TO BECOME 4-TIME ALL-CONFERENCE PICK

Billie Andrews has earned All-Big Ten honors in each of her first three seasons. She was the only freshman to be a first-team all-conference selection in 2021. Andrews was a second-team All-Big Ten pick as a sophomore in 2022 before again earning first-team accolades in 2023.

- Andrews is looking to become a four-time all-conference selection. Only seven Huskers have been a four-time all-conference pick, and Andrews would be just the fifth position player to earn all-conference honors every season of her career.
- Andrews is already one of only six Huskers to be a two-time first-team All-Big Ten selection.
 In 2024, Andrews will look to join Tristen Edwards as the only Huskers to earn three first-team All-Big Ten awards. Overall, only nine players in program history have earned three first-team all-conference accolades.

Nebraska has won a total of 10 conference tournament titles in school history, including six in the Big Eight, three in the Big 12 and one in the Big Ten (2022).

- Nebraska has qualified for each of the nine Big Ten Tournaments since the tournament was reinstated in 2013.
- NU is 8-8 at the Big Ten Tournament.
- Nebraska owns an all-time record of 67-43 in conference tournaments.
- Rhonda Revelle owns a 41-27 record (.603) in her 24 conference tournament appearances at Nebraska. She has accounted for 61 percent of the Huskers' all-time conference tournament victories (41 of 67).
- Revelle has guided the Huskers to four conference tournament titles and five runner-up finishes.


