# THIS IS NEBRASKA

In its first 30 years, the Nebraska soccer program, under the direction of Coach John Walker, has competed among the nation's elite in collegiate soccer on an annual basis. Walker took the reins of the Husker program during its inaugural season in 1994, and has developed teams to compete for conference championships and the NCAA Tournament.

Nebraska has earned 365 wins and made 32 NCAA Tournament appearances, including nine trips to the NCAA Sweet 16 and three Elite Eight berths. In that time, the Huskers also won a conference-best five Big 12 Tournament titles and had 70 student-athletes earn first-team All-Big 12 honors. The Huskers transitioned to the Big Ten Conference in 2011, adding 38 all-conference honors and claiming both the Big Ten regular-season and tournament titles in 2013 and the Big Ten regular-season title in 2023. Nebraska's athletes consistently go on to find success at the next level of soccer as professional and national team players, including Haley Hanson, who has spent time playing for the U.S. Women's National Team after being drafted seventh overall in the 2018 NWSL Draft by the Houston Dash.

One of the reasons Nebraska has been able to develop a successful program is the level of dedication shown by the University. From its humble beginnings off campus at the Abbott Sports Complex, the soccer program now enjoys state-of-the-art facilities, including administrative offices, locker rooms and indoor training areas, located in the heart of campus. In 2024, the Huskers will play their 10th season at Barbara Hibner Stadium, which was part of a \$20.4 million project in conjunction with the Nebraska Soccer and Tennis Complex. The new soccer facilities include one outdoor, lighted, full-sized competition field with seating for approximately 2,500 spectators. With a wealth of support and a history of success, Nebraska soccer expects to contend for more championships in the years to come.



# **SOCCER FACILITIES**

The home of the Huskers, Barbara Hibner Stadium and Hibner Field, and its surrounding facilities provide NU players with every tool needed to be successful. The facility, which opened in 2015, is located just north of Nebraska's Innovation Campus and the Bob Devaney Sports Center.

Part of the \$20.4 million Nebraska Soccer and Tennis Complex and approved by the University of Nebraska Board of Regents in 2013, the facility features a championship field, stadium lights, stadium seating, a fun zone for kids and dazzling views of downtown Lincoln. Hibner Stadium seats up to 2,500 and has direct access to restrooms, concessions and other fan amenities.

When it's not gameday, the Huskers can be found in the Hawks Chambionship Genter, which houses offices, locker rooms, meeting rooms and indoor practice facilities for the Nebraska soccer program. Nebraska is one of the few schools in the nation with all of its soccer facilities located on campus.



#### ATHLETIC MEDICINE

Nebraska features one of the most well-trained and highly skilled athletic medicine staffs in the country. Under the guidance of Director of Athletic Medicine Dr. Lonnie Albers, Head Athletic Trainer and Physical Therapist Jerry Weber (pictured, bottom) and Football Head Athletic Trainer Mark Mayer, the Nebraska athletic medicine staff consists of five physicians, 14 full-time athletic trainers and eight graduate assistant athletic trainers.

Nebraska's medical facilities have long been among the nation's best, and Husker Athletic Medicine will have a new home in 2023 with the completion of the Go B1G Project. Currently, NU's athletic medicine center is housed in the Tom and Nancy Osborne Athletic Complex. In addition to Ne-braska's North Stadium facility, Hawks Field, Bowlin Stadium, Pinnacle Bank Arena, the Bob Devaney Sports Center and the Nebraska Soccer and Tennis Complex all feature athletic medicine areas.

Nebraska uses advanced equipment, including two anti-gravity treadmills (pictured, top) to help ath-letes recondition after injuries. Nebraska's Athletic Medicine Center also features a hydrotherapy area that includes a three-level laned pool, as well as hot and cold plunge tanks (pictured, middle). The Hydroworx 1000 Treadmill Pool is equipped with two cameras underwater for evaluation and assessment.

#### **SPORTS PSYCHOLOGY**

Continuing its commitment to complete care for all student-athletes, Nebraska has a staff of five in-house mental health providers specializing in performance psychology who work directly with student-athletes, teams and coaches. Under the leadership of Director of Sports Psychology Dr. Brett Haskell, the Huskers' sports psychology staff provides counseling, psychological services, mental skills training, teambuilding and leadership development services for each of Nebraska's 24 sports and more than 600 Husker student-athletes. The staff works directly with student-athletes to help them develop skills to enhance personal well-being, address mental health and train psychological skills to optimize performance.





Coach John Walker came to Lincoln in April 1994 and 30 seasons later, he has built a tradition-rich program at Nebraska that includes 13 NCAA Tournament appearances. Under Walker, the Huskers have made nine NCAA Sweet 16 appearances, including three trips to the Elite Eight.

As a member of the Big 12 Conference, Walker and the Huskers captured three regular-season conference crowns (1996, 1999, 2000) and five Big 12 Tournament titles (1996, 1998, 1999, 2000, 2002) in 15 seasons. Nebraska transitioned to the Big Ten in 2011 and two years later, won both the regular-season and conference tournament championships, while also earning the regular-season title in 2023.

Walker has guided the Huskers to a 365-193-61 record in 30 years as the only head coach in program history. He surpassed the 300-win milestone in 2016 when NU knocked off then-No. 16 BYU on the road, ending the nation's longest home winning streak. Walker's 200th career win came in the 2005 NCAA Tournament against Creighton. Walker is the only head coach to produce more than 100 wins in fewer than eight seasons.

With a proven system, an innovative coaching philosophy, a well-respected program and an ability to recruit some of the nation's most talented players, Walker has the Huskers focused on contending for conference and national championships on an annual basis. The Huskers have implemented a year-round approach to training and conditioning that includes a strong schedule every fall and spring.

Additionally, Nebraska has traveled abroad for international competition, including trips to Europe in 2006, 2011 and 2019, and Iceland in 2023. During the summer of 2019, the Huskers spent nearly two weeks in Scotland and won each of their five games, while also exploring the country. In 2015, the Huskers ventured to Canada to play in international exhibitions, while supporting three former Huskers in the FIFA Women's World Cup.

#### Building from the Beginning

In 1994, Nebraska became the first Big Eight school to add women's soccer as a varsity sport, and Walker was optimistic about the future of soccer in the Cornhusker state because of the University's commitment to building a winning program.

Although Nebraska was ahead of other Big Eight schools, Walker started the 1994 season behind the rest of the nation in recruiting because of his late hiring. However, in his first season as the Huskers' mentor, Walker managed to put together a collection of scholarship players and walk-ons who recorded a surprising 14-4-0 mark and earned credibility around the nation with a successful inaugural campaign.

Walker and his staff followed their initial on-field success by compiling an excellent incoming class that included transfers Kari Uppinghouse, who became Nebraska's first first-team All-American in 1996, and third-team All-America goalkeeper Rebecca Hornbacher.

Walker's goal when he started at NU was to have the Huskers in their first NCAA Tournament by the 1998 season. Walker not only achieved

that goal, he shattered his own timeline as NU reached the postseason in 1996 and placed itself among the nation's best by winning two tournament games and advancing to the Elite Eight.

Along the way, Walker established himself as one of the finest coaches in America, earning United Soccer Coaches National Coach-of-the-Year, Central Region Coach-of-the-Year and Big 12 Conference Coach-of-the-Year recognition in 1996.

Walker led the Huskers to a perfect regular season with a 19-0 record and the first regular-season Big 12 title. Nebraska extended its winning streak to 21 games with two more wins at the Big 12 Tournament. The Huskers entered the NCAA Tournament with the nation's longest winning streak as the only unbeaten and untied team in the country.

In the opening round, Nebraska topped Minnesota by a 3-2 margin in overtime to set up a rematch with Duke. The Huskers had come from behind to defeat the then-No. 6 Blue Devils, 3-1, in Durham, N.C., on Sept. 8, for Nebraska's first-ever win over a ranked opponent. Although Duke came to Lincoln with a rich soccer tradition and plenty of NCAA Tournament experience, the Huskers dominated the Blue Devils from start to finish in a 3-0 win.

With the victory, the Huskers earned a trip to Oregon for the Elite Eight to challenge perennial power Portland. Although the Huskers battled until the end, they fell to the Pilots, 1-0. The Huskers finished the 1996 season with a 23-1-0 record and a final No. 6 national ranking. In addition to Uppinghouse and Hornbacher, NU's Lindsay Eddleman also garnered All-America recognition in 1996.

#### After Breaking Through

Nebraska earned seven consecutive top-15 national finishes from 1996 to 2002, and qualified for 10 straight NCAA Tournaments from 1996 to 2005.

In 1997, NU made the NCAA Sweet 16 and finished the season ranked No. 7 nationally with an 18-4-0 record. Sharolta Nonen earned her first of three All-America awards in 1997.

The following season, Nebraska overcame the loss of five senior starters, including All-Americans Uppinghouse and Hornbacher, to finish with a 17-4-1 record and claim a second Big 12 Tournament title. The Huskers advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 and finished with a No. 10 national ranking. Kim Engesser was named Big 12 Player of the Year and earned All-America recognition, along with Nonen and Isabelle Morneau.

In 1999, Nebraska enjoyed its best season in the program's 25-year history, running to a 22-1-2 final record, a Big 12 regular-season title and a Big 12 Tournament crown. The Huskers missed their first trip to the NCAA Women's College Cup Semifinals by the narrowest of margins, as Notre Dame advanced on sudden death penalty kicks, 4-3, after one of the greatest matches in NCAA Tournament history. NU earned the No. 5 ranking in the final poll of the 1999 campaign.

Walker was named Big 12 Coach of the Year and Nonen was tabbed Big 12 Player of the Year, as NU posted a perfect 10-0-0 mark in conference play. Nonen and Morneau repeated as All-Americans in 1999.

Nebraska swept the Big 12 regular-season and tournament titles again in 2000 before making the Sweet 16. NU finished in the top 10 nationally for the fifth consecutive season with the No. 9 spot in the final rankings after going 22-2-0. Christine Latham was named conference player of the year and claimed All-America honors, along with Meghan Anderson and Jenny Benson.

In 2001, Latham became the first league player to be named Big 12 Player of the Year in back-to-back seasons when she led the Huskers back to the Sweet 16. NU finished the season ranked 12th nationally, as Latham claimed All-America status for the second consecutive season.

Nebraska won its fifth Big 12 Tournament title in 2002 before making its seventh consecutive Sweet 16. Latham became the second Husker to earn All-America honors on three occasions. NU finished the 2002 campaign with the No. 13 ranking.







Nebraska added NCAA Tournament appearances in 2003, 2004 and 2005, finishing in the top 25 nationally during each of those seasons. NU reached the Sweet 16 in 2004, while making the second round in 2003 and 2005. Two-time All-American Brittany Timko became the first three-time Big 12 Player of the Year (2004, 2005, 2006).

As a member of the Big 12 Conference, Nebraska posted a league-best 98-43-8 regular-season mark (.685 winning percentage) in 15 seasons.

#### Fostering a Strong Fan Base

As the Huskers started having success, fans took notice. Nebraska's perfect regular season in 1996 established a devoted following of Husker faithful as NU produced the sixth-highest average attendance in the nation.

In 1999, NU set a single-season school record and ranked among the top five in the nation with 1,529 fans per home game. In 2002, NU rewrote the single-game attendance record, when 4,830 fans attended the Nebraska vs. North Carolina contest to open the season.

Nebraska spent 10 years playing at the Abbott Sports Complex (1995-2004) before moving on campus to the Nebraska Soccer Field in 2005. NU played at the Nebraska Soccer Field for 10 seasons before the opening of Barbara Hibner Stadium in 2015.

NU's tradition of strong fan support continued at Hibner Stadium, as the Huskers averaged more than 900 fans per home game for seven of the nine previous seasons. In 2023, NU's home attendance average was 1,323, good for second most in program history and second most in the Big Ten.

#### Transition to the Big Ten

In 2013, Nebraska claimed both the Big Ten regular-season crown and tournament title to snap Penn State's 15-year reign atop the conference and put NU soccer back on the national radar. The Huskers posted their highest win total since 2000, going 19-4-1 overall and achieved the No. 13 ranking in the final poll along with the No. 4 spot in the final RPI.

The Huskers advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament after freshman Jaycie Johnson scored four goals in NU's first-round win over Southeastern Louisiana. She became the fifth player in NCAA Tournament history to score four goals in a game and tied the single-game school record.

Nebraska went 10-1-0 in conference play, including a 5-0 record on the road during Big Ten play in 2013. Walker took home Big Ten and Regional Coach-of-the-Year honors, while All-American Ari Romero was named Big Ten Defender of the Year and Jordan Jackson was named Midfielder of the Year by the conference.

In 2016, Nebraska made its 12th NCAA Tournament appearance and advanced to the second round before falling to then-No. 18 UCLA. Johnson received All-America recognition after scoring nearly half of Nebraska's goals during the season.

Walker completed his 30th season at the helm in 2023, leading his team to a 17-4-3 record, a Big Ten Championship and an Elite Eight appearance. Additionally, the 2023 Big Ten Coach of the Year and his staff were named the North Region Staff of the Year by the United Soccer Coaches, and the team ended the year ranked No. 7.

#### Athletes Continue to Haul in Awards

In 30 years, 14 Huskers have earned a total of 20 All-America certificates from the United Soccer Coaches (formerly the NSCAA) and five Huskers have captured freshman All-America accolades under Walker. In addition, 63 players have earned All-Region honors under Walker's tutelage, including 36 first-team honorees.

As a member of the Big 12 Conference, the Huskers collected 70 regular-season all-conference selections and 33 All-Big 12 Tournament awards in 15 seasons. Nebraska had eight players earn Big 12 Player-of-the-Year honors in an 11-year span from 1996 to 2006, including two-time honoree Christine Latham (2000, 2001) and three-time winner Brittany Timko (2004, 2005, 2006).

Morgan Marlborough also achieved Big 12 Offensive Player-of-the-Year honors on two occasions, taking home the award in 2009 and 2010. She became just the third freshman to win a player-of-the-year award in conference history in 2009. Marlborough added All-America honors in 2010

The success carried over when the Huskers joined the Big Ten in 2011. NU has produced 38 All-Big Ten selections, including nine first-team awards in ten years as a member of the conference.

In addition to awards for on-field performance, the Huskers have been

honored for their work in the classroom. Seven soccer student-athletes have earned CoSIDA Academic All-America honors, including first-team selections Caroline Flynn in 2016 and Eleanor Dale in 2023. Two Huskers have garnered Scholar All-America accolades from the United Soccer Coaches, including first-teamer Breanna Boyd in 2002.

#### Success Beyond Nebraska

Walker has helped Husker players compete at the international level, as 11 former Huskers have competed in 17 FIFA Women's World Cup competitions since the event's inception in 1991. Karina LeBlanc (Canada) made five straight World Cup appearances before announcing her retirement in 2015. She was one of three former Huskers to play in the 2015 World Cup, along with Selenia lacchelli (Canada) and Ari Romero (Mexico)

LeBlanc is also one of three former Huskers to play in the Olympics, along with Brittany Timko (Canada) and Amy Walsh (Canada). Timko ranks tied for sixth on Canada's all-time caps list (132). LeBlanc (110) and Walsh (102) are also ranked in the top 15.

In April 2018, Haley Hanson was called up to the U.S. Women's National Team roster. She made her first appearance for the USWNT on April 8 in an international friendly against Mexico.

Former NU athletes have seen success at the professional level as well. Seven Huskers were selected in the inaugural Women's United Soccer Association (WUSA) Draft in December 2000. Nebraska's total number of athletes selected was second behind North Carolina. Four of the first 24 players chosen in the draft were former Huskers.

Nebraska added two draftees in 2001 before Breanna Boyd earned the No. 8 overall pick in the 2002 WUSA Draft by the defending champion Carolina Courage. Christine Latham also became an instant starter for the San Diego Spirit when she was picked up as a discovery player for the WUSA team in 2002.

Walker boasted five former athletes on 2003 WUSA rosters, three of whom were named to All-Star rosters, which ranked seventh among all NCAA Division I programs. The WUSA folded in 2003, but Women's Professional Soccer (WPS) began in 2009. LeBlanc was drafted No. 5 overall by the Los Angeles Sol in 2009, as one of four Huskers to play in the league before it folded in 2012 and was replaced by the National Women's Soccer League (NWSL).

In 2014, Jordan Jackson and Ari Romero were drafted by the Houston Dash. In 2017, Jaycie Johnson was taken 27th overall by the North Carolina Courage and Caroline Flynn was drafted 40th overall by the Portland Thorns. Hanson was the No. 7 overall pick in the 2018 NWSL Draft when she was selected by the Houston Dash. Two Huskers were selected in the 2020 draft, with Sinclaire Miramontez selected 27th overall by the North Carolina Courage and Meg Brandt selected 34th overall by Reign FC, and five 2020 graduates are currently playing professionally overseas.

While Walker built the Huskers, he continued to expand his coaching experience as a staff coach for the Canadian National Team from 1995 to 2008, working with the Senior National Team, U-20, U-17 and U-16 National Teams during that time. During the summer of 1999, Walker was an assistant coach for Canada's Women's World Cup team. He also served as an assistant coach for the 2008 U-20 Women's World Cup in Chile.

#### John's Journey

Walker came to Nebraska from Queen's University in Kingston, Ontario, following achievements at the collegiate, national and international levels.

Walker was named national staff coach for the Canadian Soccer Association in 1992, and the following year he was appointed an assistant coach for the Canadian World University Games team. Walker holds a Canadian "A" coaching license (highest level), a Level V certification and a USSF "A" license. Walker was a national coaching instructor for the Canadian Soccer Association and served as director of high performance for Ontario, where he supervised coaches and players at Ontario's National and Provincial Training Center.

Walker was a standout sweeper for Queen's University from 1982 to 1985 and received bachelor's degrees in physical education and physical therapy from Queen's in 1987. He earned a master's degree in coaching science from Miami of Ohio in 1988. He also is a graduate of the Canadian National Coaching Institute.

The Kingston, Ontario, native is married to Mary Holmes and the couple has one daughter, Ally, and four sons, Declan, Cameron, Keegan and Liam.









# MARTY EVERDING

# ASSISTANT COACH • 27TH SEASON QUEEN'S UNIVERSITY (1989)

Marty Everding enters his 27th season overall at Nebraska in the fall 2024 season.

Everding returned to the Huskers as an interim assistant coach in 2010 and then moved to a permanent assistant in 2011 after spending 13 years with Nebraska from 1994 to 2006. In his previous stint with the program, Everding played a crucial role in the ascension of Nebraska to national prominence.

During the 2016-19 seasons, Everding saw the emergence of goalkeeper Aubrei Corder. A three-year starter, Corder has climbed up Nebraska's career goalkeeping charts in nearly every statistical category. She stepped in as a true freshman in 2016 and played every minute of the season, earning 11 shutouts in 22 appearances en route to an NCAA Tournament berth.

Corder continued her success as a sophomore in 2017, posting seven complete game shutouts to earn third-team All-Big Ten honors. During the season, she became the ninth Husker goalkeeper to surpass the 100-career save milestone. In 2018, Corder once again played nearly every minute for the squad and recorded five complete-game shutouts.

In 2015, Erika Johnson spent the majority of the time in NU's net, earning 70 saves and six shutouts. Kelly Schatz started all 19 games in 2014 and compiled 55 saves for the Huskers.

From 2011 to 2013, Everding developed three-year starter Emma Stevens into Nebraska's all-time saves leader (278). In her final season with the Huskers, Stevens recorded 94 saves on NU's Big Ten regular-season and tournament title team. A second-team All-Big Ten selection in 2013, Stevens ranks among the top five of several career goalkeeping categories at Nebraska, including wins (37), minutes in goal (6,221), games started (69) and games played (73).

As the Huskers' goalkeeping coach, Everding developed two of the best goalkeepers in Big 12 Conference history. In 2000, Karina LeBlanc led the Big 12 and ranked second nationally with a 0.40 goals-against average.

LeBlanc went on to start in goal for the Canadian National Team and the WUSA's Boston Breakers, and followed in the footsteps of All-American Rebecca Hornbacher, who started in goal for the Huskers in 1996 and 1997. Hornbacher also played for Boston in its inaugural WUSA season, while continuing her career as a collegiate goalkeeping coach. LeBlanc also made appearances in the FIFA Women's World Cup in 1999, 2003, 2007, 2011 and 2015.

Everding helped transform former Husker Erin Miller from a defender to an all-conference goalkeeper. In her two seasons in the net, Miller recorded 239 saves, 21 shutouts and a 0.98 goals-against-average.

After proving he could do it once, Everding took on the challenge of transforming Brooke Bredenberg from a midfielder to a goalkeeper. Bredenberg had a solid 2003 spring season in goal under Everding's tutelage, not conceding a goal to an amateur team through five contests, including 2003 national runner-up Santa Clara. Bredenberg went on to post a 1.39 goals-against average in 2003 before moving back to midfielder.

Katie Wright stepped in and started both of Nebraska's NCAA Tournament games and recorded 1.5 shutouts for the season. Wright then played every minute of the 2004 season, allowing just 29 goals in 23 games for a goalsagainst average of 1.25. Wright also stopped 108 shots, becoming just the second player in school history to post 100 saves in a season.

In 2005, Everding helped true freshman Jamie Klages start 18 games and compile a 1.19 goals-against average while stopping 88 shots and posting six shutouts. Klages was invited to train with the U.S. Under-21 National team.

Everding was a player at Queen's from 1981 to 1983 and 1986 to 1988. He was an assistant coach at Queen's from 1989 to 1990, before joining Walker's Nebraska staff.

Everding graduated from the Canadian National Coaching Institute and holds a Canadian Level IV coaching license as well as a USSF "B" license.

A native of Kingston, Ontario, Everding graduated from Queen's in 1989 with a bachelor's degree in drama and education. Between coaching stints, Everding worked as a secondary school teacher.

Everding and his wife, Sarah, have been married for 30 years, and have three daughters, Talia, Nicki and Mia. Talia graduated from the University of Nebraska in May 2016. Nicki graduated from Nebraska in December 2017. Mia is currently attending the University of Nebraska.



# IAN BRIDGE

# ASSISTANT COACH • 9TH SEASON VICTORIA, B.C.

Ian Bridge joined the Nebraska soccer staff in 2015 and begins his ninth season as an assistant coach in 2024. During his time with the team, Bridge has helped the Huskers to three trips to the Big Ten Tournament and a spot in the 2016 NCAA Tournament and the 2023 NCAA Elite Eight.

Last season, NU claimed the 2023 Big Ten Regular-Season title, ended the year ranked No. 7 in the United Soccer Coaches poll and finished in the Elite Eight for the first time since 1999.

In 2018, the Huskers went 9-7-5 overall and tied for fifth in the Big Ten with a 5-3-3 mark. In the Big Ten quarterfinals, NU tied Ohio State, but the Huskers advanced on the penalty kick shootout. Nebraska faced a rigorous schedule, which included 10 NCAA Tournament qualifiers and five teams that finished in the top 25 of the final RPI.

Nebraska went 9-5-5 during the 2017 season, starting the season with a 4-0 record before tying for eighth in the conference. The team had 11 different players score at least one goal during the season, as NU's offense increased productivity from the 2016 team that made the NCAA Tournament. After the season, Haley Hanson was drafted with the seventh overall pick of the NWSL Draft by the Houston Dash.

With one of the toughest schedules in the nation in 2016, the Huskers posted an 11-6-5 record en route to a spot in the NCAA Tournament. NU went 5-3-3 in conference play to finish sixth in the Big Ten. The 2016 squad saw the emergence of a strong freshman class and the coronation of Jaycie Johnson, who finished her career with 42 goals. Johnson and CoSIDA Academic All-American Caroline Flynn were each drafted following the season.

During Bridge's first season at Nebraska in 2015, the Huskers went 8-7-2 overall, which included two wins over top-25 teams. NU touted one of the toughest schedules in the nation, facing seven ranked teams during the season.

Before Nebraska, Bridge spent two years as an assistant coach for the University of Victoria men's soccer team. Bridge helped the Vikes to a 10-3-3 overall record for the 2014 season, including a trip to the men's Canada West Final Four.

A native of Victoria, B.C., Bridge stacks up an impressive list of coaching experience, acting as the head coach for the University of Victoria women's soccer team for 11 seasons from 1990 to 2001. During his time at Victoria, Bridge developed the program from club to full varsity status and a perennial conference leader. In 1998 and 2000, Victoria captured its first two Canada West Conference titles in the program's history. The team added silver and bronze medals at the CIS National Championships those same two years.

Bridge served as an assistant coach for the Canadian Women's National Team from 1997 to 2009. During that time, Canada qualified for the Women's World Cup in 1999, 2003 and 2007, while adding an appearance in the 2008 Olympics. At the 2003 Women's World Cup, Canada finished fourth, marking its best showing at a World Cup.

He was the head coach for the Canada U-19/U-20 women's team from 2001 to 2008, leading the team to a 1-0 overtime loss to USA in the U-19 World Cup final in 2002. He helped lead Canada to four consecutive U-20 FIFA World Cup appearances in 2002, 2004, 2006 and 2008 before stepping down in 2009. Bridge also served as the head coach of the women's U-17 team (2009-2010).

From 2010 to 2012, Bridge was the head coach of the Victoria Highlanders PDL men's team and helped the Highlanders earn a berth into the 2011 SW playoffs.

Before entering the coaching scene, Bridge enjoyed over a decade-long professional soccer career from 1979 to 1991. Bridge began as a defender in the North American Soccer League (NASL) with the Seattle Sounders (1979-83) before a season with the Vancouver Whitecaps in 1984. He played in 124 games in six seasons with the NASL and recorded 13 career goals before traveling to Switzerland to play for the FC La Chaux-de-Fonds from 1985 to 1990. In his final season with the Swiss club, Bridge served as the player-coach.

Bridge returned to North America to play in the Canadian Soccer League, first with the Victoria Vistas in 1990. In his final season before his professional retirement in 1991, Bridge competed for the Kitchener Kickers and the North York Rockets that same year. Throughout his professional career, Bridge appeared 33 times for the Canadian national team, scoring six goals. He played every game for Canada in the 1984 Los Angeles Olympics, and the 1986 FIFA World Cup in Mexico. Bridge was inducted into the Victoria Sports Hall of Fame and the Canadian Soccer Hall of Fame in 2003.









# SAVANAH ANDERSON-BAER

# ASSISTANT COACH • 2ND SEASON UNIVERSITY OF NEBRASKA (2020)

Former Husker forward Savanah (Uveges) Anderson-Baer begins her second season as assistant coach in 2024.

A 2018 All-Big Ten selection and two-time captain, Anderson-Baer spent two seasons post-graduation playing professionally. In 2020-21, she competed for the Orlando Pride and in 2021-22, she was apart of the MSV Duisburg team in Germany. After her professional playing career, Anderson-Baer was a medical assistant while coaching at TOCA. She was also a cardio pulmonary intern at St. Elizabeth hospital and a volunteer coach in Nicaragua with Soccer without Borders.

Anderson-Baerwasa three-year letterwinner for the Huskers from 2017-2019, capturing All-Big Ten and Preseason honors. A two-time Academic All-Big Ten member, she made 44 appearances at Nebraska and scored 11 goals and tallied four assists. Anderson-Baer, who graduated in 2019, was a 10-time member of the Nebraska Scholar-Athlete Honor Roll.

Last season, Anderson-Baer helped the Huskers claim the 2023 Big Ten Regular-Season title, end the year ranked No. 7 in the United Soccer Coaches poll and finish in the Elite Eight for the first time since 1999.



# JAMIE VAUGHN

#### EXECUTIVE ASSOCIATE AD - COMPLIANCE 12TH YEAR WAYNE STATE COLLEGE (1997)

Jamie Vaughn came to Nebraska in July of 2012 as the Associate AD for Compliance after holding the same position at Kansas State for the three previous years. Vaughn was promoted to Executive AD - Compliance at Nebraska in March of 2018.

Vaughn leads a compliance staff of seven members that is charged with ensuring that the conduct and operations of Nebraska's 24 athletic teams are in compliance with NCAA and Big Ten Conference rules and regulations. He is also responsible for administrative oversight of the track and field, cross country and soccer programs.

Vaughn assumed the role of Associate Athletic Director for Compliance at Kansas State in 2009. In his time at K-State, Vaughn evaluated and re-organized the Compliance Office structure and daily operations. He also assisted with the development of the Athletic Department's five-year strategic plan and served as the campus contact to the NCAA for the University's Third Cycle Certification process.

Before his time in Manhattan, Vaughn was the Assistant Athletic Director for Compliance at Texas Tech from 2007 to 2009, where he successfully led the daily operations of the Red Raiders' Compliance Office.

Vaughn also has experience in the Big Ten Conference, having worked as an assistant compliance director at Ohio State from 2004 to 2007. During his time in Columbus, Vaughn was directly responsible for the reregistration of professional sports agents, financial planners and disability insurance providers, and he initiated the integration of the compliance office with the Student-Athlete Advisory Board. Vaughn also worked on the compliance staff at New Mexico State from 2002 to 2004.

Vaughn worked in various roles at his alma mater, Wayne State (Neb.) College from 1997 to 2002. He provided rules education for student-athletes, athletic staff and academic counselors at Wayne State as the NCAA Compliance coordinator in 2001 and 2002. He also served as an admissions specialist, assistant sports and recreation facilities manager and graduate assistant women's basketball coach at the school.

Vaughn graduated with honors from Wayne State with a degree in English writing and literature in 1997 and earned his master's in sports administration and management in 2002.

Jamie and his wife, Karin, have a daughter, Kayla, and a son Tyler. Karin is also a graduate of Wayne State College.

Troy Dannen, a leading voice in collegiate athletics with extensive experience as an athletic director and deep ties to the Midwest and Big Ten, was announced as Nebraska's Director of Athletics on March 20, 2024.

Dannen previously served as Director of Athletics at the University of Washington, a fellow Big Ten institution. Previously, he was AD at Tulane, and before that led athletics at his alma mater, the University of Northern Iowa. Dannen brings Midwestern roots, having grown up on a farm just outside Marshalltown, Iowa.

"Frommy first conversation with Troy Dannen, I knew he

was a perfect fit for Nebraska," University of Nebraska Interim President Chris Kabourek said when Dannen's hiring was announced. "He is a fierce competitor, he holds himself and his programs to uncommonly high standards, and he cares personally about the success of student-athletes in sports, school and life. Troy sees the vision and momentum we have here at Nebraska, from our bold investments in facilities to our record success in the classroom to our bold plan to elevate our national reputation and competitiveness, and he is excited to be a part of it. I am thrilled that we've found someone who is 100% aligned with our high expectations and will be all-in on Nebraska.

Dannen said: "Joining the Nebraska family is truly an honor. My family and I are humbled by the opportunity to be part of such a proud athletics program, institution, community and state. Growing up in Iowa, I watched a lot of Nebraska football on Saturdays with my family. I've spent a lot of time in the state and I've found that we share a similar approach to life, work and sports: Work hard, stay humble, compete and expect to win.

"There is a storied tradition at Nebraska, but more work to be done. I truly believe our best years are ahead of us. I couldn't be more grateful to Interim President Chris Kabourek for this opportunity. Chris has championed an inspiring vision for excellence across the University of Nebraska and he and I are completely aligned on where Nebraska needs to go in the future. I look forward to doing my part to helping Nebraska win championships across the board, graduate our student-athletes and elevate the world-class reputation of the University of Nebraska. I can't wait to arrive in Nebraska and get to work."

Head Football Coach Matt Rhule said: "I'm so fired up about this hire. Interim President Kabourek has found exactly the right person to lead the Huskers forward. Troy sees what we see – that Nebraska is a special place, with special people, a great vision and the courage to be unabashed about wanting to win across the board. The fact that someone of Troy's caliber wants to join Team Nebraska will light a fire across our entire department. Let's go!"

Dannen has been at Washington since 2023. He's also in his fourth year as chair of the NCAA Football Competition Committee and as an Executive Committee member of the Football Oversight Committee.

From 2021 through 2023, Dannen served on the NCAA Constitution Committee and then the Division I Transformation Committee, as one of a small group of chancellors, presidents, directors of athletics, commissioners and Faculty Athletic Representatives across all three NCAA divisions tasked with charting a future path for college athletics. In 2022, Dannen was a finalist for Sports Business Journal's Athletic Director of the Year award, and he received the Distinguished American Award by the Sugar Bowl Chapter of the National Football Foundation.

He arrived at Washington after serving as Director of Athletics at Tulane University since 2015. While at Tulane, Green Wave student-athletes earned 49 All-American honors, won a national championship, 21 conference championships and earned 41 postseason appearances.

In 2022-23, Tulane football won their first American Athletic Conference football championship, and won the Cotton Bowl over USC, ranked 9th in the nation at that time. Men's basketball won 20 regular season games for the first time in two decades. Men's tennis advanced to its sixth NCAA tournament in seven years, both bowling and beach volleyball finished ranked in the Top 20, and baseball won the conference championship.

Tulane's football program participated in an unprecedented three consecutive bowl games from 2018-20, winning back-to-back bowl games for the first time in 128 years of football at the University.

In the classroom, Tulane student-athletes excelled at a high-level. At the end of the 2022-2023 academic year, over 68% of Green Wave student-athletes earned a 3.0 GPA or better, with a 93% Graduation Success Rate and a record-setting department Academic Progress Report of 992, with seven teams earning a perfect 1000 APR score.

Dannen spearheaded fundraising efforts and numerous capital projects at Tulane. He helped secure the largest unrestricted gift in Tulane Athletics history, an endowment gift which funds the operation of a new sport (sailing), and a \$10 million lead gift for capital renovations, which is the second largest gift in department history. In addition, marketing and licensing revenue grew four-fold, and in 2022-23, Tulane football, basketball and volleyball set ticket sales and revenue records. Under Dannen's leadership, the Green Wave Club Annual Fund grew by 40% in terms of donors, and 45% in terms of dollars.

Increases in fundraising and major gift donors positively impacted capital project development and completion. A \$13 million renovation to the Reilly Natatorium, home of the swimming and diving program, as well as \$8 million in renovations to locker rooms and the Wilson Center sports medicine center were completed in 2023. Dannen also oversaw construction of a new dining facility, weight room, basketball and volleyball locker rooms. Tulane also completed a \$2.4 million academic center renovation and a \$5 million television and digital production center.

Dannen came to Tulane after serving eight years as the Director of Athletics at the University of Northern Iowa (UNI) from 2008-15. During his tenure, the Panthers enjoyed success at both the conference and national levels, as UNI was recognized with 39 All-Americans, 13 Coaches of the Year and nine Missouri Valley Conference (MVC) Players of the Year. UNI football, men's basketball, women's basketball, volleyball and softball combined to reach 15 NCAA tournaments and 20 postseason berths during that stretch. For his efforts, Dannen was recognized as NACDA's FCS Athletic Director of the Year in 2014.

Prior to his time at UNI, Dannen served as the Iowa High School Athletic Union's Executive Director for seven years.

Dannen graduated from UNI in 1989 with a degree in communications. He is married to Amy, and together they have four children: Elle, Emily, Holly and William.

of Nebraska-Lincoln, Nebraska's flagship, Big Ten research institution on July 1, 2023. He is a 30-year veteran of higher education with a track record of growing research, increasing student success and building impactful partnerships.

In his first year as Chancellor, the University experienced rising retention and graduation rates, demonstrated positive signs related to enrollment, and expanded its research and creative activity efforts.

- In Fall 2023, almost 4,700 first-time freshmen enrolled at UNL—an increase of 1.3 percent from 2022. 75.4 percent of those first-time freshmen are from Nebraska.
- Spring 2024 overall enrollment reversed a trend of five straight years of spring enrollment declines.
- Over the last five years, UNL retention from first to second year has increased 2.3 percentage points and four-year graduation rate has increased more than 8.5 percentage points.
- In 2023, the university's total research expenditures grew to

\$366 million, a 37 percent increase over the past decade. UNL has also experienced tremendous growth in externally sponsored federal funding, increasing to a record \$163 million in 2023.

Chancellor Bennett came to Nebraska after nine years of successful leadership at the University of Southern Mississippi. During his tenure as president, USM was reclassified from a Carnegie R2 to an R1 university, signaling growth in research prestige and funding. Dr. Bennett also invested in programs to support student recruitment, retention and outcomes, including for the 30 percent of USM students who were first-generation. His efforts led to an improvement in the university's six-year graduation rate.

Prior to his role at the University of Southern Mississippi, Dr. Bennett served at the University of Georgia for more than a decade. He was the senior administrator for student programs and services for Georgia's 34,000-plus students; oversaw \$150 million in capital projects; and made key staff and programmatic investments in extracurriculars, mental health programs and other areas to better support students.

Dr. Bennett has also been the dean of students at Winthrop University in Rock Hill, South Carolina, and associate dean of student life at Middle Tennessee State University.

Chancellor Bennett values community leadership and service. He has served on numerous boards, including the Mississippi Aquarium, Northeast Georgia Girl Scouts of America, Catholic Health East (Philadelphia), and St. Mary's Health Care System in Athens, Georgia. He is a member of Kappa Alpha Psi fraternity and Past Sire Archon for Sigma Pi Phi fraternity, The Boulé.

Dr. Bennett earned a bachelor's degree in mass communication, a master's degree in educational administration, and an education specialist degree from Middle Tennessee State. He earned his Doctor of Education degree from Tennessee State University.

He and his wife, Temple, are the parents of two adult daughters, Colby and Logan.

Scott M. Fuess Jr. is in his fifth year as Nebraska's Faculty Athletics Representative, having started on July 1, 2020.

As faculty athletics representative, Fuess serves as a liaison between the Office of the Chancellor and Athletic Department. He also serves on the Athletic Department's Executive Staff. His areas of focus in the role include the welfare of student-athletes, NCAA and Big Ten Conference compliance, maintaining the positive relationship between athletics and faculty, developing and responding to NCAA legislative proposals and representing the university at related NCAA and Big Ten Conference

The half-time position - which was restructured to an expected term of five years - reports directly to the University of Nebraska System President and consults with Director of Athletics Troy Dannen. He splits time between faculty representative duties and academic responsibilities.

Fuess, the Steinhart Distinguished Professor of Business and former chair of the College of Business' economics department, has worked at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln since 1986. He serves on the Faculty Senate's Intercollegiate Athletics Committee, having chaired the committee for 2018-19 and a sub-committee in 2017-18. He also has served on numerous Big Ten Conference committees, including the Sports Management Committee, the Compliance and Reinstatement Committee and the Legislative Review Committee. For 2022-23 he served as Chair of the B1G Compliance and Reinstatement Committee.

Fuess earned a bachelor's degree from the University of Delaware, as well as master's and doctoral degrees from Purdue University. His research interests are labor economics, the economics of collegiate sports, and the economy of Japan. He has earned numerous "Distinguished Teaching" awards. In 2016 he received the UNL College of Business "Distinguished Service" award.

On April 26, 2024, the Board of Regents appointed Jeffrey P. Gold, M.D., as the ninth president of the University of Nebraska System.

Dr. Gold has held several roles at the University of Nebraska System since 2014, including chancellor of the University of Nebraska Medical Center, chancellor of the University of Nebraska at Omaha, and executive vice president and provost.

Before joining UNMC, Dr. Gold was chancellor of the University of Toledo's academic and clinical health sciences. He previously served at the Albert Einstein College of Medicine-

Montefiore Medical System and the Weill Cornell College of Medicine-New York Presbyterian Medical Center. Dr. Gold is a graduate of the Cornell University College of Engineering and the Weill Cornell College of Medicine

Gold has served as UNMC chancellor and chair of the board of UNMC's clinical partner, Nebraska Medicine, since 2014. He assumed executive vice president and provost duties in 2021, becoming the university system's chief academic officer and primary liaison to the Board for academic affairs matters.

From 2017 to 2021, Gold concurrently held the role of University of Nebraska at Omaha chancellor, leading the state's metropolitan university.

At UNMC, Gold has overseen a period of significant growth in enrollment, research, academic offerings, philanthropy and facilities. Enrollment has reached a record high for 23 straight years, and research grants and contracts now exceed \$250 million. Continued success in technology transfer at both UNMC and the University of Nebraska-Lincoln have helped Nebraska rank among the world's top earners of patents for seven years running.

UNMC has expanded the breadth of its programs, notably through a successful partnership with the University of Nebraska at Kearney that has added health education programs to NU's rural campus. Together with support from public and private partners, the UNMC-UNK collaboration has significantly bolstered the healthcare pipeline in the central and western parts of the state. Gold was announced today as the inaugural recipient of the Heartland Hero Award from the Rural Media Group.

UNMC has received national and international attention for its leadership in treating infectious disease, particularly during the Ebola outbreak of 2014-15 when UNMC was among a small number of select sites chosen by the U.S. Department of State to care for Ebola patients.

During Gold's tenure, UNMC opened the Fred & Pamela Buffett Cancer Center, to date the largest public-private partnership in university history and a key driver of UNMC's global leadership in cancer research and care. UNMC has also opened iEXCEL, a high-tech clinical simulation and experimental learning center, the Dr. Edwin G. & Dorothy Balbach Davis Global Center, a new home for the Munroe-Meyer Institute, and a new home for the Lincoln division of the College of Nursing, among other physical upgrades that have significantly expanded the campus' footprint.

UNMC has benefited from more than \$800 million in private philanthropy since Gold's arrival, with more expected through the ongoing Only in Nebraska campaign.

Gold holds tenured faculty appointments in UNMC's College of Medicine and College of Public Health, where his research interests in health care policy, population health and epidemiology are concentrated.

Raised in Brooklyn, Gold is the product of the New York City K-12 public school system. He became the first in his family to go to college and earned his bachelor's degree in theoretical and applied mechanics from Cornell University. He earned his M.Ď. from the Weill Cornell College of Medicine and completed his general surgery residency at The New York-Presbyterian Hospital and Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center. Gold completed his cardiothoracic surgical fellowship training at the Brigham and Women's Hospital in Boston, with additional training in pediatric cardiac surgery at the Boston Children's Hospital of Harvard Medical School.

Gold has been certified by the American Board of Surgery and by the American Board of Thoracic Surgery, specializing in adult and pediatric cardiac surgery. He is licensed in Nebraska, Ohio, New York and New Jersey.

Gold has been married for almost 50 years to Robin Hayworth, M.D., a medical school classmate. The couple has two adult children and two grandchildren.

#### UNIVERSITY BOARD OF REGENTS

**UNITED SOCCER COACHES** ALL-AMERICANS

Fourteen Huskers have earned 20 All-America awards from the United Soccer Coaches (formerly the NSCAA) in the past 30 seasons.

Eleanor Dale became Nebraska's most recent All-American after her record setting and program-breaking senior season in 2023. Dale rewrote the record books after tallying 28 goals and earning mutliple national and regional honors. Dale was the first Husker first-team member since 2000.

Jaycie Johnson earned third team honors in 2016 as she led the team in goals scored (11), points (24) and gamewinning goals (6) during the 2016 campaign.

Midfielder Kari Uppinghouse was Nebraska's first firstteam All-American in 1996. Uppinghouse provided a dominant physical presence in the midfield while leading the Huskers to their first NCAA Tournament and a 23-game winning streak as a junior in 1996. Two other Huskers, Lindsay Eddleman – who became Nebraska's first freshman to earn All-America honors - and goalkeeper Rebecca Hornbacher, joined Uppinghouse as All-Americans in 1996.

In 1998, three Huskers earned All-America honors, including Sharolta Nonen, who became the first Nebraska player to become a two-time All-American. Isabelle Morneau and Kim Engesser also added the first honors of their careers.

In 1999, Morneau claimed her second straight secondteam award, while Nonen became the first Husker to be a three-time All-American.

Jenny Benson earned first-team All-America honors as a senior defender in 2000, after moving from the midfield in the spring. Midfielder Meghan Anderson also earned first-team honors, while forward Christine Latham, the Big 12 Player of the Year, nabbed second-team honors.

Latham scored a conference-high 46 points on 18 goals and 10 assists to earn third-team honors in 2001. She was also named to the third team in 2002, after scoring 35 points on 16 goals and three assists.

Brittany Timko earned third-team All-America honors in 2004 and 2005. A three-time Big 12 Player of the Year, Timko finished the 2004 season with 15 goals, 13 assists and 43 points. In 2005, Timko set a Big 12-record with 21 assists and added 11 goals for a total of 43 points for the second consecutive season.

In 2010, Morgan Marlborough earned second-team honors after an 18-goal, 12-assist campaign. The two-time Big 12 Offensive Player of the Year ranked second nationally with 48 points.

In 2013, Ari Romero earned second-team accolades as she led the back line to eight shutouts while powering Nebraska to Big Ten regular-season and tournament titles.

#### **HUSKERS IN THE WORLD CUP**

Beginning in 1991, the best women's soccer players in the world have battled for the Women's World Cup every four years in front of hundreds of thousands of soccer fans in stadiums across the globe.

Husker Head Coach John Walker made his debut with the Canadian World Cup team as an assistant coach in 1999. He was joined on that team by five of his former NU athletes.

In 2003, seven former and future Huskers made the 20-player roster. The Husker-heavy squad played to the semifinal match, where it was defeated by Sweden, putting it up against the United States in the consolation finals where it lost 3-1. Four Huskers earned roster spots in 2007, while Karina LeBlanc and Brittany Timko returned to the squad in 2011. LeBlanc made her final appearance on the grand stage at the 2015 World Cup in Canada before announcing her retirement. Joining her on the 2015 Canadian squad for the first time was Selenia lacchelli, a national team member since 2013. LeBlanc served as an analyst for Fox Sports during the 2019 Women's World Cup.

In addition to the rich Husker history rooted in Canadian soil, former defender Ari Romero earned her place on Mexico's World Cup roster for 2015, becoming the first Husker to represent a country other than Canada. In all, 11 former Huskers have played on women's soccer's grandest stage in the Women's World

#### 2015 Women's World Cup

Former Huskers Karina LeBlanc and Selenia lacchelli saw action on the pitch as Canada played in the Group A squad with the Republic of China, New Zealand and the Netherlands. The 2015 World Cup marked LeBlanc's fifth consecutive appearance as a part of the Canadian National Team, while lacchelli made strides in her first World Cup showing. Ari Romero played as a key member of the Mexican National Team's defense, leading Mexico in games against France, England and Colombia in the Group F division. In addition to the former Husker players, ex-Husker star Christine Latham returned to the games as a color analyst for Fox Sports Canada.

#### 2011 Women's World Cup

Brittany Timko and Karina LeBlanc returned to the 2011 World Cup as part of Canada's National Team. The Canadians were put in Group A with France, Nigeria and host-team, Germany. Canada opened with a 2-1 loss to Germany and was then shut out by France, 4-0. The team's final match with Nigeria was scoreless until the 73rd minute when Perpetua Nkwocha scored the only goal of the game to give Nigeria a 1-0 win.

#### 2007 Women's World Cup

Four former NU greats made repeat appearances on the 2007 Canadian National Team. Tanya Dennis saw the most game action, as she appeared in three matches, while Brittany Timko and Amy Walsh each played in one game. Karina LeBlanc rounded out the Huskers to make the squad. Canada failed to advance past pool play, losing 2-1 to Norway to open the World Cup, before rebounding with a 4-0 win over Ghana. Canada scored just 37 seconds into its third match, but Australia rebounded to tie the game at two. The tie provided Australia the one point it needed to advance into the quarterfinals and edge out Canada.

#### 2003 Women's World Cup

Former Huskers Brittany Timko, Tanya Dennis and Sasha Andrews all saw action on the pitch for Canada in its fourth-place finish in the 2003 FIFA Women's World Cup, the Canadian's best finish in history.

Timko played all 540 minutes in six contests of the World Cup and notched one assist in the tournament. Dennis played 450 minutes in the back in the first five games before suffering a concussion.

Former Husker All-American Christine Latham was responsible for three of Canada's 10 goals during the tournament, including two goals in a 3-0 win over Argentina.

Making repeat appearances on the Canada World Cup squad in 2003 were All-America defenders Sharolta Nonen and Isabelle Morneau, and All-America goalkeeper Karina LeBlanc. All-American Breanna Boyd made the original roster, but did not compete because of an injury.

#### 1999 Women's World Cup

All-America defenders Sharolta Nonen and Isabelle Morneau, All-Big 12 midfielder Amy Walsh and All-Big 12 defender Tanya Franck earned spots in Canada's starting lineup, while All-American Karina LeBlanc played a key role as a reserve on a talented Canadian squad. In addition to the Huskers on the field, Nebraska Head Coach John Walker represented the Huskers on the sideline as an assistant coach with the Canadian National Team.


