Nebraska continues its four-game homestand to open the 2024 season on Saturday night when the Huskers take on the Colorado Buffaloes in a highly anticipated non-conference matchup. The battle between the two long-time rivals is set for 6:30 p.m. at Memorial Stadium. NBC will provide the national television coverage and the game can be heard on the Huskers Radio Network and Huskers App.

The Huskers kicked off the 2024 campaign with an impressive 40-7 victory over UTEP on Saturday. The Husker offense topped 40 points for the first time in two seasons and the 33-point victory margin was Nebraska's largest win in three seasons.

Nebraska showed balance on offense, topping 200 yards in both rushing and passing. Four running backs played a key role for Nebraska and true freshman quarterback Dylan Raiola had a successful debut with 238 yards and two touchdown passes. The Blackshirt defense continued to be stingy, allowing just seven points and 205 yards of offense to the Miners.

Colorado opened its season last Thursday night with a 31-26 victory over North Dakota State in Boulder. The Buffs' high-powered passing attack was on full display, as Colorado threw for 445 yards and averaged better than 17 yards per completion.

Saturday's matchup will be the fourth between Nebraska and Colorado in the past seven seasons. CU won close contests in both 2018 and 2019 before defeating the Huskers, 36-14, in Boulder last season. Nebraska will be looking for its 50th all-time victory over the Buffs, with the Huskers holding a 49-21-2 lead in the series.

SERIES HISTORY: NEBRASKA VS. COLORADO

Nebraska and Colorado will meet for the 73rd time on Saturday night. The Huskers hold a commanding 49-21-2 all-time lead in the series, but the Buffs have won three straight meetings, all since 2018.

- Nebraska and Colorado met 63 straight seasons from 1948 to 2010, while members of the Big Seven, Big Eight and Big 12 Conferences.
- Saturday's meeting is the fourth meeting between the schools since 2018.
- Colorado was 10-9-1 in the first 20 games in series history, but Nebraska owns a 40-10-1 edge since 1962, including a 23-1 stretch from 1962 to 1985.
- Nebraska won 15 of the final 19 meetings as conference opponents between 1992 and 2010.
- The series featured a nine-year streak from 1988 to 1996 in which both teams entered the game ranked in the top 20. Six of those games pitted top-10 foes and the 1996 game marked the third-ever top-5 matchup between the schools. The 1992 game marked the first time in modern college football history that both teams entered with the same ranking in the Associated Press poll (tie-8th).

HUSKERS SET TO SHINE UNDER THE LIGHTS

Nebraska's matchup with Colorado is the first of three consecutive prime-time home games at Memorial Stadium. Following this Saturday's game, the Huskers will play host to Northern Iowa (Sept. 14) and Illinois (Sept. 20) in night games in Lincoln.

- This will mark just the third time in school history the Huskers have played three straight home night games. Nebraska also hosted three consecutive prime-time games in 2008 (New Mexico State, Virginia Tech, Missouri) and 2002 (Arizona State, Troy, Utah State).
- Nebraska has a strong history of success in night games in Lincoln. The Huskers are 50-10 in home night games at Memorial Stadium. The first prime-time game in Lincoln was a 1986 victory over Florida State, when CU Coach Deion Sanders was a sophomore for the Seminoles.

1994 NATIONAL CHAMPIONS RETURN TO LINCOLN

Nebraska will honor its 1994 national championship team as part of the festivities surrounding this weekend's game. The 1994 team will have a private reception on Friday evening in Lincoln, and be honored on the field at the start of Saturday's game.

- The 1994 Huskers earned the first of Coach Tom Osborne's three national championships in four seasons by posting a perfect 13-0 record.
- Nebraska's biggest regular-season victory in the 1994 season was a 24-7 victory over Colorado at Memorial Stadium. The Huskers entered the game ranked third in the AP poll, with the Buffs at No. 2. The victory vaulted Nebraska to No. 1 in the following week's poll, a spot the Huskers occupied the remainder of the season.
- Nebraska clinched the 1994 national championship with a 24-17 victory over No. 3 Miami in the Orange Bowl.

SOLICH TO RECEIVE COLLEGE FOOTBALL HOF CAMPUS SALUTE

Former Nebraska Head Coach, assistant coach and player Frank Solich will be honored in Lincoln this week with a National Football Foundation/College Hall of Fame On-Campus Salute. Solich is part of the 2024 College Football Hall of Fame class that will be inducted in December in Las Vegas.

- Solich will be recognized on the field during the first half of Saturday night's game with Colorado. Representatives from the College Football Hall of Fame and Fidelity will be part of Solich's recognition.
- Solich spent six seasons as Nebraska's head coach from 1998 to 2003, compiling a 58-19 record with the Huskers. Solich also served as an assistant coach for 19 seasons at Nebraska, and was on the coaching staff for three national championship teams. He went on to serve as the head coach at Ohio University for 16 seasons from 2006 to 2021 and won 115 games with the Bobcats.

NOTING LAST WEEK'S GAME

- Nebraska's 40 points marked its first 40+ point game since a 56-7 victory over Northwestern in 2021. The 33-point margin of victory was NU's largest since that 49-point victory over the Wildcats. The victory margin was the largest in an opener since a 43-10 win over Fresno State in 2016.
- The Huskers' 23-point second quarter was their highest-scoring quarter since scoring 28 in the first quarter against Bethune-Cookman in 2018.
- True freshman quarterback Dylan Raiola became just the second Husker true freshman quarterback to start a season opener since WWII, joining Adrian Martinez who started in 2018 against Colorado.
- Nebraska threw for 284 yards, its highest total since throwing for 354 yards at Purdue in 2022. Nebraska's 2023 season high in passing was 199 yards vs. Michigan.
- Nebraska had 507 yards of total offense, including 284 passing and 223 rushing. The total offense output was Nebraska's best since gaining 575 yards against Georgia Southern in 2022. The last time Nebraska topped 200 yards in both rushing and passing offense also came against Georgia Southern.
- Receiver Isaiah Neyor had 121 yards on six catches, tying his career high in receptions and falling just five yards short of his career high in yardage (126 at Boise State in 2021). It was his fourth career 100-yard game.
- Nebraska recorded a safety in the second quarter on a three-yard TFL by Ty Robinson. It marked Nebraska's first defensive safety since the 2009 Holiday Bowl against Arizona.

BLACKSHIRT DEFENSE MAKES STRONG 2024 DEBUT

The Nebraska defense was one of the nation's most improved units in 2023. The Blackshirts opened the 2024 season with a strong showing in a 40-7 victory over UTEP. Nebraska limited the Miners to 12 first downs, 56 rushing yards and 205 total yards.

- Nebraska held UTEP to seven points, marking the eighth consecutive opponent the Huskers have limited to 24 or fewer points. This is the longest stretch Nebraska has limited the opposition to 24 points or less since a 14-game stretch spanning the 2009 and 2010 seasons.
- NU limited UTEP to 205 total yards, marking its eight consecutive opponent to gain less than 400 yards. The last time Nebraska had held eight straight opponents to less than 400 yards was an eight-game stretch spanning the 2009 and 2010 seasons.
- NU allowed just 56 rushing yards, marking the ninth time in 13 games under Head Coach Matt Rhule the Huskers have held the opponent to less than 100 rushing yards.

NEBRASKA SHOWS BALANCED OFFENSE IN OPENER

Nebraska's offense posted its most explosive showing under Coach Matt Rhule in its season-opening victory over UTEP.

- Nebraska's 40 points were its most since scoring 42 against Georgia Southern in 2022, and the 33-point margin of victory was Nebraska's largest since a 56-7 victory over Northwestern in 2021. It was the Huskers' largest margin of victory in a season opener since a 43-10 win over Fresno State to open the 2016 season.
- The Huskers gained 507 yards of total offense against the Miners, the most by Nebraska since gaining 575 yards against Georgia Southern in 2022. The Huskers reached 339 yards before halftime, which was just 80 yards shy of last year's season high for total offense for a full game (419 vs. Louisiana Tech).
- Nebraska's 284 passing yards were its most since throwing for 354 yards at Purdue in 2022. Nebraska's season high in passing yards in 2023 was 199 vs. Michigan.
- Nebraska added 223 rushing yards with 11 players having at least one carry. The win over UTEP marked the first time Nebraska topped 200 yards in both rushing and passing since 2022 against Georgia Southern.

RAIOLA EFFICIENT IN HUSKER QUARTERBACK DEBUT

True freshman quarterback Dylan Raiola had an impressive collegiate debut in the season opener. Raiola completed 19-of-27 passes for 238 yards and two touchdowns, while playing just one series after halftime. Raiola became just the second true freshman Husker quarterback since World War II to start a season opener, joining Adrian Martinez in 2018. Raiola earned Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors for his play in the opener.

- Raiola is the first Husker freshman (redshirt or true) quarterback to win his first start since Taylor Martinez guided Nebraska to a victory over Western Kentucky in the 2010 season opener.
- The 232 yards of total offense by Raiola compared favorably to other Husker freshman quarterbacks over the past three decades making their starting debuts.

VETERAN RECEIVERS MAKE QUICK IMPACT

Nebraska added a pair of veteran receivers through the transfer portal in the offseason. Jahmal Banks joined the Huskers from Wake Forest, while Isaiah Neyor came to Nebraska after previously playing at Texas and Wyoming. The two seniors each check in at 6-4 and 220 pounds, and showed an immediate connection with quarterback Dylan Raiola.

- Neyor posted his fourth career 100-yard receiving game and first since 2021 with six receptions for 121 yards and a 59-yard touchdown against UTEP. Neyor's six catches matched his career high and his 121 yards were just five yards shy of a career high. Five of Neyor's receptions came before halftime.
- Banks also made his mark in the opener with four catches for 61 yards, including a 21-yard touchdown catch just two seconds before halftime.
- Both players have had productive collegiate careers before joining the Huskers. Banks now has 111 career catches for 1,465 yards and 14 career touchdowns. Neyor has 59 catches for 1,261 yards and 13 touchdowns in his career. Neyor averages an impressive 21.4 yards per catch in his career.

HUSKERS POSSESS VETERAN OFFENSIVE LINE

The most experienced unit on the Nebraska team is the offensive line. Husker offensive linemen have combined to play in 224 career games with 153 career starts entering this season.

- According to research compiled by West Virginia's Mike Montoro, Nebraska's 158 combined offensive line starts ranks as the fifth most in the country. Husker offensive linemen have also combined for 229 career games played, a total that ranks ninth nationally.
- **Bryce Benhart**, a member of the Outland Trophy watch list, leads the way with 42 career starts, starting 42 of Nebraska's 45 games at right tackle the past four seasons. Benhart's 42 career starts are the most starts by an offensive lineman in program history.
- **Turner Corcoran** has started 32 games for the Huskers with 27 starts at left tackle, three starts at left guard and two starts at right tackle. Corcoran had started 30 consecutive games before suffering a season-ending injury against Northwestern last season.
- **Ben Scott** is in his second season as Nebraska's starting center. A member of the Rimington Trophy watch list, Scott started 11 games for the Huskers last season, and he has made 40 career starts including his three seasons at Arizona State.
- Bolstering the line is the addition of transfer **Micah Mazzccua**. Mazzccua has started 22 games in his career, including 11 starts at right guard for Florida in 2023 and 10 starts at Baylor in 2022.
- **Teddy Prochazka** has started 11 games for Nebraska, but he will miss the 2024 campaign after suffering an injury during fall camp. The injury marked the third time in four seasons that Prochazka has suffered a season-ending injury.
- **Justin Evans** (6 starts), **Henry Lutovsky** (4 starts) and **Joey Mancino** (1 start) have also started at least one game on the Nebraska offensive line.

TRANSFERS ADD EXPERIENCE TO NEBRASKA ROSTER

Nebraska added 60 newcomers to its roster in 2024. That number includes a large freshman class of 48, but adding experience to the roster are 12 first-year transfers, including six FBS transfers.

- The group of six FBS transfers all came from Power Conference programs. The six players have combined for 166 games played and 84 starts in their careers.
- **Stefon Thompson** played in 36 games with 21 starts at linebacker for Syracuse. He entered the 2024 season with 169 career tackles, 20.0 tackles for loss and 10.5 sacks. Thompson owns the most tackles, TFLs and sacks of any Husker on the 2024 roster.
- **Micah Mazzccua** started 21 games on the offensive lines at Baylor and Florida. In 2022 at Baylor, PFF ranked Mazzccua as the best run-blocker in the Big 12 and the nation's 15th-best run blocker.
- **Ceyair Wright** made 15 starts at cornerback for USC in 2022 and 2023. He totaled 41 tackles as a Trojan with 1.0 tackle for loss, one interception and five pass breakups.
- **Isaiah Neyor** has started 14 games in his career. He was a second-team All-Mountain West Conference selection in 2021 at Wyoming before spending two seasons at Texas. Neyor has caught 59 passes for 1,261 yards and 13 touchdowns in his career. Neyor ranks second to fellow first-year transfer Jahmal Banks in career receptions, yards and touchdowns among Huskers.
- **Jahmal Banks** played in 43 games with 11 starts at Wake Forest before transferring to Nebraska. Banks totaled 107 receptions for 1,404 yards and 13 touchdowns as a Demon Deacon. He owns the most career receptions, receiving yards and receiving touchdowns of any current Husker.
- **Dante Dowdell** spent one season at Oregon before transferring to Nebraska. Dowdell had 17 carries for 90 yards and one touchdown in 2023 for a Duck team that ranked second nationally in total offense and scoring offense. He had eight carries for 55 yards in Nebraska's opener.

NINE HUSKERS EARN SPOTS ON PRESEASON WATCH LISTS

Nine Nebraska Cornhuskers made a preseason watch list for a major national award this summer.

- True freshman **Jacory Barney Jr.** was named to the watch list for The Jet Award, presented to the nation's top returner. The award is named after Husker Heisman Trophy winner Johnny Rodgers.
- **Bryce Benhart** was one of 75 linemen named to the preseason watch list for the Outland Trophy. Benhart was an honorable-mention All-Big Ten selection as Nebraska's starting right tackle in 2023. The Outland Trophy is presented annually to the nation's best interior lineman.
- **Brian Buschini**, the 2021 FCS Punter of the Year, was one of 33 punters named to the preseason watch list for the Ray Guy Award, which is presented annually to the nation's best punter.
- **Thomas Fidone II** was one of 48 tight ends named to the preseason watch list for the John Mackey Award, presented annually to the nation's best tight end. Fidone led Nebraska with four touchdown catches in 2024, the most by a Husker tight end since 2010.
- **Isaac Gifford** was honored for his work on the field and in the community with an appointment to the Allstate Wuerffel Trophy Watch List. Gifford led Nebraska with 86 tackles while earning honorable-mention All-Big Ten accolades. Off the field, he earned a Sam Foltz 27 Hero Leadership Award in 2024 and was named to both the Brook Berringer and Tom Osborne Citizenship teams.
- **Nash Hutmacher** was one of 90 players - and 37 defensive linemen - named to the preseason watch list for the Chuck Bednarik Award, presented annually to the outstanding defensive player in college football. Hutmacher was an honorable-mention All-Big Ten selection last season.
- **Dylan Raiola** was named to the Polynesian College Football Player of the Year watch list and the Shaun Alexander Award Watch list.
- **Isaiah Neyor** was one of 93 players named to the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award watch list. The award is presented to the top offensive player who played high school or college football in Texas.
- **Ben Scott**, an honorable-mention All-Big Ten selection in 2023, was one of 40 centers named to the Rimington Trophy watch list. The Rimington Trophy - named after former Husker center Dave Rimington - is presented annually to the nation's top center.

RHULE LOOKS FOR ANOTHER STRONG SECOND SEASON

Nebraska went 5-7 in Matt Rhule's first season. The Huskers aim to increase their win total this season, something Rhule has done at each of his previous two collegiate head coaching stops.

- In his first head coaching job at Temple, Rhule helped the Owls to a four-win improvement from his first season to his second. Then at Baylor, Rhule guided the Bears to a six-win improvement from year one to year two. That improvement ranked third nationally and was the largest win improvement of any Power Conference program that season.
- Rhule took on rebuilding jobs at Temple, Baylor and Nebraska, which contributed to an 8-28 combined record in his first season at each school. But excluding his first season at Temple, Baylor and Nebraska, Rhule boasts a 44-22 record with three 10-win seasons in five years.
- Rhule has a proven record as a program builder. He led both Temple and Baylor to the highest win totals in program history in his third season at each school.
- Rhule guided Temple to a pair of trips to the American Athletic Conference title game, the first two appearances in the league title game in school history. His 2016 Owl team won the school's first conference title in nearly 40 years.
- Rhule led Temple to back-to-back bowl appearances for the first time in school history in 2015 and 2016.
- At Baylor, Rhule became the first head coach at a Power Conference school to take a team from 11 losses (1-11 in 2017) to 11 victories (11-3 in 2019) in two or fewer seasons.
- The 2019 Baylor team set a school record for wins with 11 and the Bears' 9-0 start was the best in school history.

MAJORITY OF STAFF RETURNS & RULE CHANGE BOLSTERS STAFF

The Huskers return eight of their 10 full-time assistants from last season, welcoming two new full-time assistants to the coaching staff. In addition to the two new assistants, an NCAA rule change has permitted additional staff members to provide on-field coaching.

- **Donovan Raiola** is in his third season at Nebraska in 2024 after being the lone assistant coach retained by Matt Rhule following the 2022 season.
- Other returning coaches on the offensive staff include offensive coordinator **Marcus Satterfield** (second season), running backs coach **E.J. Barthel** (second season) and wide receivers coach **Garret McGuire** (second season). The four returning offensive assistants helped the Huskers rank second in the Big Ten in rushing last season.
- **Glenn Thomas** is the lone new addition to the offensive staff, serving as Nebraska's quarterbacks coach and co-offensive coordinator. He came to Lincoln after one season as an offensive assistant with the Pittsburgh Steelers, helping the Steelers to a berth in the AFC playoffs in 2023.

- Thomas spent five seasons on Matt Rhule's coaching staffs at Temple and Baylor, serving as the offensive coordinator for the Owls in 2016 and as the co-offensive coordinator at Baylor from 2017 to 2019. Thomas also has recent experience as a quarterbacks coach and offensive coordinator at Arizona State (2022) and UNLV (2020-21).
- On defense, coordinator **Tony White** (second season) returns as does linebackers coach **Rob Dvoracek** (second season) and defensive line coach **Terrance Knighton** (second season). Last year, that trio helped Nebraska post its best scoring defense, total defense and rushing defense since the Huskers joined the Big Ten in 2011.
- **John Butler** is the only new defensive assistant, serving as the Huskers' secondary coach and pass game coordinator. Butler came to Nebraska after spending the previous six seasons as the defensive backs coach for the Buffalo Bills. Buffalo had a top-five pass defense rating in five of his six seasons, helping the Bills win four AFC North titles and make five playoff appearances.
- Special teams coordinator **Ed Foley** also returns for his second season in 2024. He helped Nebraska rank third nationally in blocked kicks in his first season last fall.
- With the removal of the NCAA rule limiting the number of on-field coaches, Matt Rhule has announced 10 more staff members who will provide additional on-field coaching this fall.

SINGLE-DIGIT NUMBERS AWARDED TO 'TOUGHEST' HUSKERS

For the second straight season, single-digit jersey numbers were awarded to the team's "toughest" players. The single-digit honorees were chosen through a players-only vote and the players then got to choose which single-digit number they wanted.

- The tradition of single-digit numbers being reserved for the chosen few dates back to Rhule's time at Temple.

"I got really tired of having a guy in my program who had spent three years at like No. 47... wanted to wear No. 1 or No. 3, and he had earned it and we would give it to a recruit," Rhule said prior to the 2023 season. "What we decided was (numbers) 1-9, now 0-9, would go to the nine or now 10 'toughest' guys on the team. When I say 'toughest', we define that for the guys, but really the guys who best exemplify what it means to be a Cornhusker. To be accountable, to be dependable, to be tough, hard-working, competitive every single day."

NOTES FROM NEBRASKA'S 2023 SEASON

Nebraska enters 2024 with a goal of making significant progress in Matt Rhule's second season. Despite finishing 5-7 in 2023, Nebraska made progress in many areas in Rhule's first season. Four of the seven losses were by three points with a fifth loss by a touchdown in overtime. Due to injuries, Nebraska used three different starting quarterbacks in its five one-score losses.

- Nebraska had the program's fewest penalty yards per game (42.8) since 1998.
- The Huskers ranked among the nation's 15 most-improved teams in rushing offense, rushing defense, total defense and scoring defense. Nebraska had the nation's No. 2 most-improved rush defense, the No. 3 most-improved total defense and the No. 10 most-improved scoring defense. Offensively, the Huskers had the 14th most-improved rushing attack from the 2022 to the 2023 season.
- Nebraska posted its best statistical rushing defense, total defense and scoring defense since joining the Big Ten in 2011. The Huskers allowed their fewest points per game (18.3) since 2010, their fewest yards per game (303.5) since 2009 and their fewest rushing yards per game (92.9) since 1999.
- NU ranked eighth nationally in rushing defense, 11th nationally in total defense and 13th nationally in scoring defense in 2023. The Huskers posted their highest national ranking in rushing defense since 1999 and best national ranking in total and scoring defense since 2010.
- Nebraska held eight opponents to 14 or fewer points in 2023, a first for the program since the 2009 season, when the Huskers led the nation in scoring defense.
- The Huskers held six of their 12 opponents in 2023 to fewer than 300 total yards, while also limiting eight of 12 opponents to fewer than 100 rushing yards.
- Nebraska totaled its most sacks (32) since 2014 and most tackles for loss (76) since 2016.
- Offensively, the Huskers ranked second in the Big Ten in rushing in 2023 (176.8 ypg).
- Nebraska also had one of the best big-play offenses in the Big Ten. The Huskers ranked second in the Big Ten with eight plays of 50 yards or longer in 2023 while leading the league in rushes of 40 yards or longer, 60 yards or longer and 70 yards or longer.
- From a special teams standpoint, Nebraska ranked third nationally with four blocked kicks in 2023. The Huskers recorded their most blocked kicks since 2014.

A LOOK AT NEBRASKA'S 2024 SCHEDULE

Nebraska will play three non-conference games and nine Big Ten contests in 2024, including games against UCLA and USC, each of whom are in their first season as a Big Ten member. The 2024 season marks the first time since Nebraska joined the conference in 2011 that the Big Ten will not utilize a divisional format.

- Nebraska will play Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Ohio State, Purdue, Rutgers, UCLA, USC and Wisconsin. The Huskers will not play Maryland, Michigan, Michigan State, Minnesota, Northwestern, Oregon, Penn State or Washington.
- Nebraska opened the 2024 season at home against UTEP, marking the first season since 2019 that Nebraska played its first game of the season at home. It was also the first time since 2019 that the Huskers have opened the season against a non-conference opponent.
- The Huskers played their opener in August for the fourth straight season and for the fifth time in the past five full seasons (2020 excluded).
- Nebraska plays each of its first four games at home. The four straight home games to open the season marks the Huskers' longest season-opening homestand since 2013 (five games).
- Beginning with the Colorado game, the Huskers will play three consecutive home night games for only the third time in program history (also 2002 and 2008).
- The Big Ten opener is against Illinois on Friday, Sept. 20 at Memorial Stadium. That contest will mark Nebraska's NCAA-record 400th consecutive sellout while also being the Huskers' first weekday home game since 2001, when Nebraska played Rice on Thursday, Sept. 20, in a game postponed five days due to the Sept. 11 attacks.

NEBRASKA AMONG TOP ALL-TIME PROGRAMS

Nebraska is playing its 135th football season this fall, and the Huskers have historically been one of the top programs in college football history.

- Nebraska ranks eighth in NCAA history with 918 wins and 53 all-time bowl game appearances.
- The Huskers have won five national titles. Nebraska's four Associated Press national championships (1970, 1971, 1994, 1995) rank seventh all-time and NU's four coaches poll titles (1971, 1994, 1995, 1997) rank fourth.
- Nebraska's 46 conference titles rank second in NCAA history.
- The success extends to the classroom as well. Nebraska football has produced more Academic All-Americans (108) and more NCAA Top 10 Award winners (9) than any other team in any sport in NCAA history.

HOME OF THE HUSKERS



Memorial Stadium celebrated its 100th year in 2023. In the fall of 1922, a drive for \$430,000 in stadium construction funds was undertaken by faculty, students, alumni and friends of the University.

The stadium was named Memorial Stadium to honor all Nebraskans who served in the Civil and Spanish-American Wars; the 751 Nebraskans who died in World War I; the 3,839 in World War II; the 225 in Korea; the 422 in Vietnam; and those in Iraq.

Construction was completed in a few more than 90 working days and Memorial Stadium was dedicated on Oct. 20, 1923, at the Homecoming game in which Nebraska was held to a scoreless tie by Kansas.

The field at Memorial Stadium was named Tom Osborne Field - after the Huskers' legendary Hall-of-Fame coach - in 1998, one year after Osborne's retirement following 25 years and 255 victories as head coach.

- Beginning with the Colorado game on Sept. 7, the Huskers will play three consecutive home night games for only the third time in program history (also 2002 and 2008).
- The Big Ten opener against Illinois on Friday, Sept. 20 will mark the 400th sellout at Memorial Stadium. The game will also mark the first Friday night home game in school history while being the first weekday home game (excluding Black Friday) since 2001, when Nebraska played Rice on Thursday, Sept. 20, in a game postponed five days due to the Sept. 11 attacks.

COACHING STAFF NOTES

- **Matt Rhule** is in his second season at Nebraska in 2024. Rhule is in his 12th season as a head coach after previously leading programs at Temple (2013-16) and Baylor (2017-19) along with an NFL stint as head coach of the Carolina Panthers (2020-22).
- Rhule owns a career record of 53-50 in his eight seasons as a college head coach. He has a proven record as a program builder after taking on rebuilding projects at Temple, Baylor and Nebraska.
- Rhule's college teams have taken a step forward in his second season at each school. Temple improved by four wins in Rhule's second season in 2014 and Baylor improved by six wins in his second season in 2018, an improvement that led all power conference teams and ranked third in the FBS.

- Rhule then guided both the Owls and Bears to a school-record win total in his third season, when both teams also played in the conference championship game.
- Eight Husker assistants return from last season: **Marcus Satterfield** (offensive coordinator/tight ends), **Tony White** (defensive coordinator), **Ed Foley** (special teams coordinator), **E.J. Barthel** (running backs), **Rob Dvoracek** (linebackers), **Terrance Knighton** (defensive line), **Garret McGuire** (wide receivers) and **Donovan Raiola** (offensive line).
- **John Butler** (secondary/pass game coordinator) and **Glenn Thomas** (co-offensive coordinator/quarterbacks) are in their first season at NU.

SCOUTING THE COLORADO BUFFALOES



Colorado opened the 2024 campaign with a 31-26 victory against North Dakota State in its season opener last week.

The Buffaloes enter Saturday averaging 504 yards per game, with 445 yards per game through the air and 59 yards per game on the ground. Dallan Hayden paces the Colorado rushing attack with nine carries for 20 rushing yards.

In the passing game, Shedeur Sanders has completed 26-of-34 passes for 445 yards, four touchdowns and an interception. Jimmy Horn Jr. has seven receptions for 198 yards and a touchdown, followed by Travis Hunter with seven grabs for 132 yards and three scores.

Defensively, the Buffaloes are allowing 26 points per game and 449 yards per game this season. Trevor Woods leads the CU defense with a team-high 10 tackles, followed by Shilo Sanders with nine stops. LaVonta Bentley and Chidozie Nwankwo have posted a team-high one sack apiece this season.

Deion Sanders is in his second season as the head coach at Colorado.

Sanders began his tenure with the Buffaloes with a 4-8 overall record in his debut season in 2023.

Sanders came to Colorado after spending three years as the head coach at Jackson State, where he was 26-6 overall and won back-to-back Southwestern Athletic Conference championships competing on the FCS level. The Tigers were 3-3 in his first year in 2020, but compiled an 11-2 record in 2021 and 12-1 mark in 2022 to earn Sanders consecutive SWAC Coach of the Year honors.

Prior to joining the collegiate coaching ranks at Jackson State, Sanders had been involved in coaching for over a decade. Sanders was the offensive coordinator at Trinity Christian School (Cedar Hill, Texas), leading the Tigers to three straight Texas Association of Private and Parochial Schools (TAPPS) titles and a 42-3 record.

DEION SANDERS VS. NEBRASKA

Saturday's matchup is the second all-time meeting for Sanders against the Huskers after Colorado picked up a 36-14 win over the Big Red last season.

Matt Rhule has a proven track record as a program builder. In his first two collegiate head coaching jobs at Temple (2013-16) and Baylor (2017-19), Rhule led both the Owls and the Bears to their most victories in school history in just his third season. He also took both teams to the conference championship game in year three.

Rhule took Temple from two wins in his first season to a school-record 10 victories in both his third and fourth seasons with an appearance in the conference championship game both seasons. He then took Baylor from one win in his first season to a school-record 11 victories in his third season and an appearance in the Big 12 Championship Game and the Sugar Bowl.

Before taking the Nebraska job, Rhule one won conference title, three division titles and produced three seasons with double-digit wins in a five-season span (2015-19).

TAKING TEMPLE TO NEW HEIGHTS

In his tenure at Temple from 2013 to 2016, Rhule took the Owls to new heights.

- In Rhule's second season in 2014, Temple posted the program's first win over an SEC team since 1938, its first win over a ranked opponent in 16 seasons and the program's largest margin of victory in nearly 50 years.
- Rhule won 10 games in both 2015 and 2016. He is responsible for two of the three 10-win seasons in Temple's 124-year history.
- He also took the Owls to back-to-back bowl games in 2015 and 2016, the first time Temple played in a bowl in consecutive seasons.
- In 2015, Rhule led Temple to the American Athletic Conference Championship Game, the first conference title game in program history.
- The next season, Rhule guided the Owls to their second conference title in program history and the first in nearly 40 years.
- Temple has spent a total of 16 weeks ranked in the 88-year history of the Associated Press top-25 poll. More than half of those top-25 rankings (9) came under Rhule in 2015 and 2016.

AN ENCORE AT BAYLOR

At Temple, Rhule led the Owls to their highest season win total in program history, their first conference championship game appearance and an impressive run in the national rankings. He produced an encore by repeating each of those same feats in three seasons at Baylor.

- Baylor finished with 11 losses in Rhule's first season in 2017 but two years later, he guided the Bears to 11 wins in 2019. Baylor became the first Power Conference program to go from 11 losses to 11 wins in two or fewer seasons.
- Baylor won its final two games of the 2018 season and its first nine games of the 2019 campaign. The 11 straight victories marked the second-longest winning streak in school history, while Baylor's 9-0 start in 2019 was the best start in program history.
- In 2019, Rhule led Baylor to its most wins (11) in school history, the Bears advanced to their first Big 12 Championship Game and played in the Sugar Bowl for only the second time in program history.
- Baylor finished with a No. 13 ranking in 2019, the Bears' second-highest final ranking since 1951.
