RIFLE GLOSSARY

Air rifle – A gun that uses a .177 caliber lead pellet propelled by compressed air instead of a gunpowder charge. The rifles can weigh up to 12.12 pounds.

Cleaned – A perfect target, in which the shooter hits a 10 on each of the 10 targets on the sheet for a score of 100. Can also be used to refer to a perfect match.

Front sight – The sight attached to the end of the barrel of the rifle, holding the front aperture.

Electronic targets – A target system that uses microphones and sound waves from the bullet or pellet going through the paper to send to a monitor on each point.

Iron sights – Sights that employ no magnification.

Kneeling – Shooting from a kneeling position with a sling and kneeling roll to support the position.

Off hand – The unsupported standing position.

Perfect match score – In air rifle and smallbore, 600 is perfect.

Prone – Shooting from a lying position.

Record shots – Also known as “shots for record,” those shots that are counted toward the match score, with “sighters” not included.

Relay – One group of shooters firing the match at the same time.

Shooting glove – A padded glove, with or without fingers, used to ensure the comfort of the non-dominant hand (i.e., a right-handed shooter wears

a glove on the left hand) as the shooter supports the rifle.

Shooting jacket – The jacket is made of leather or canvas and provides support and pads the shooter to minimize the effect of pulse and recoil. There are strict guidelines regarding the thickness.

Shooting boots – Boots designed for rifle shooting. They have the toe end of the sole and the heel cut flat for stability.

Shooting trousers – Snug canvas and/or leather pants usually worn over running tights or sweatpants. They often have padded reinforcements sewn on both knees and the seat to prevent the slipping of elbows and knees when firing from the kneeling position.

Sighting shots – Practice shots taken before going “for record.” Sighting shots are unlimited and may be fired before the beginning of each position. Once a position’s first record shot has been fired, no further sighting shots are permitted.

Sling – Adjustable strap with buckle adjustments and arm cuffs that provide stability. A sling is attached to the rifle and helps to support it in prone and kneeling positions.

Smallbore – A .22 caliber gun with an iron sight used in competition. It can be customized with special accessories and/or alterations (barrel length and style, stock, design, etc.) to fit the shooter’s needs and comforts.

SCORING SYSTEM

AIR RIFLE

Course of Fire – Competitors stand and shoot lead pellets from .177 caliber rifles at targets 10 meters away.

Rifle – Air rifles can be either air or gas powered and weigh up to 12.12 pounds by NCAA regulations.

Time – Competitors have 75 minutes to fire 60 shots from the standing position.

Perfect Match Score – A perfect match score of 600 is the maximum for air rifle.

SMALLBORE

Course of Fire – In smallbore three-position rifle, athletes fire .22 caliber rifles from the kneeling, prone, and standing (also called off hand) positions at targets 50 feet away.

Rifle – Smallbore rifles may not exceed 17.6 pounds by NCAA regulations.

Time – Competitors have 105 minutes for 20 record shots in the kneeling position, 20 record shots in the prone position and 20 record shots in the standing position.

Perfect Match Score – A perfect match score of 600 is the maximum for smallbore.

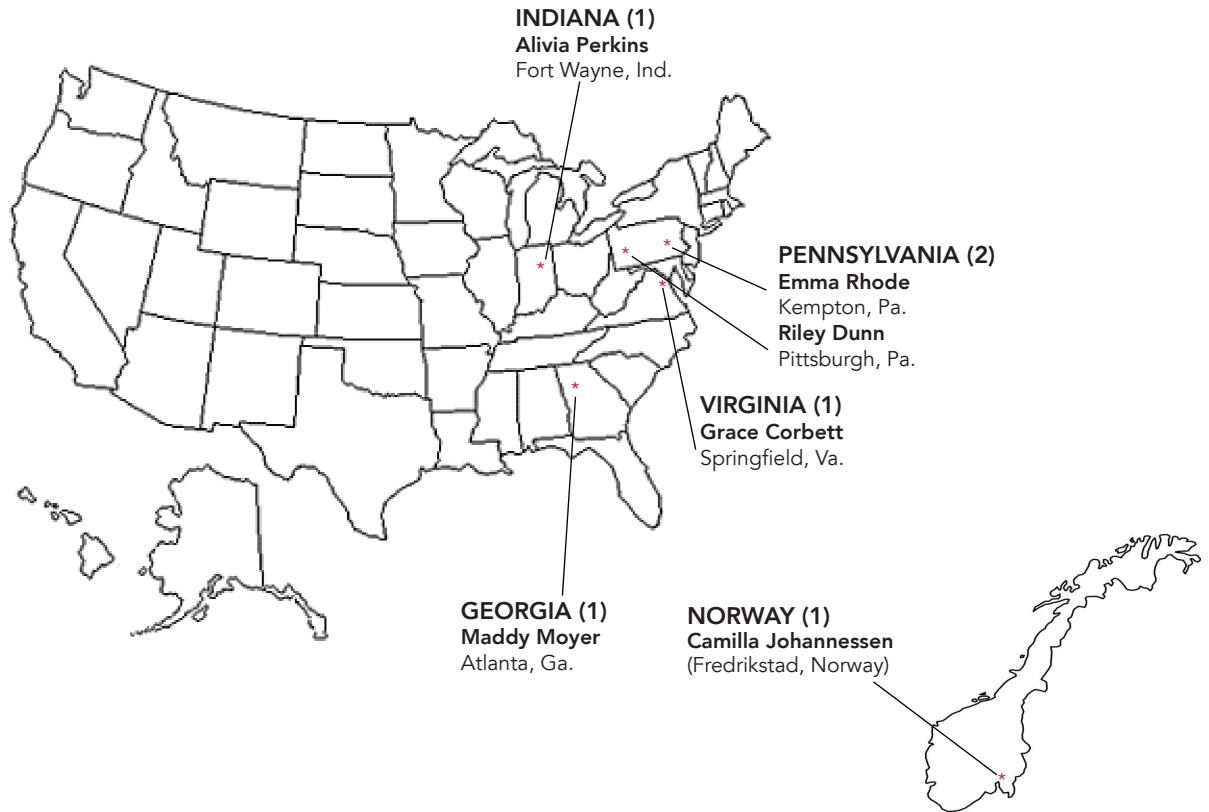

NEBRASKA RIFLE 2024-25 OUTLOOK

The Nebraska rifle team will look to continue its success for the 2024-25 season after another record-breaking season in 2023-24. Head Coach Richard Clark looks to make an impressive debut. Before his arrival to NU, Clark was an assistant coach at Army West Point for the 2023-24 season.

The Huskers enjoyed numerous achievements in the 2023-24 season. The team had two CRCA All-Americans in Cecelia Ossi and Emma Rhode. Ossi shot a program-record score of 597 in the smallbore. The team shot the highest air rifle (2,384 at Air Force) and aggregate (4,728 at Air Force) scores in program history and tied the third-highest smallbore score in program history (2,345 against WVU).

The Big Red return two shooters from last year in Rhode and junior Camilla Johannessen.

Rhode, a junior, will look to lead the Huskers after earning the highest air rifle season average for a sophomore in program history (594.94) in 2023-24. In addition, she was a second-team CRCA All-American in air rifle. Her remarkable sophomore season also featured averages of 584 in the smallbore and 1,178.54 in the aggregate, both ranking second on the team.

"I'm excited to have Emma back," Clark said. "She has been one of our counters for the past two seasons and has a lot to offer this program both on and off the range. I look forward to her stepping into a leadership role and mentoring our freshmen off the range while being a great example of how to get things done on the range."

Johannessen competed in every match last season for the Huskers, including the NCAA Championships. She earned a career high of 581 in the smallbore last season while averaging 572.39 in the smallbore, 584.77 in the air rifle and 1,157.15 in the aggregate.

"Having Camilla back is exciting," Clark said. "If you want to know what it means to be a student athlete at Nebraska, look no further than her. She is constantly pursuing perfection in the classroom, on the range and in all other facets of life. I look forward to seeing what she can accomplish this year."

Despite losing three shooters from last season, the Huskers will be adding four freshmen to the squad. Grace Corbett, Riley Dunn, Maddy Moyer

and Alivia Perkins all look to make strong debuts for the Husker rifle team in 2024-25.

Corbett comes to Nebraska from West Springfield High School in Springfield, Va. She placed first in the U21 Virginia Junior Olympics Air Qualifier, which made her eligible to compete in the 2024 Junior Olympics in both the smallbore and air rifle. She competed in the 2022 and 2023 Junior Olympics and garnered First-Team All-Metro honors in 2023.

"Grace has been a joy to have around at practice," Clark said. "In the few short weeks she has been on campus, she has already proven that she is a student of the sport and eager to gain experience as she starts her freshman year here at Nebraska. I'm excited to see what she can do as she gains experience and progresses through her four years here."

Dunn brings an impressive resume to the Husker rifle team. A native of Pittsburgh, Dunn was a four-year all-conference athlete during her career at McGuffey High School. During the 2022-23 school year, she was the WPIAL Pennsylvania individual championship gold medal winner, becoming just the third student athlete to win multiple WPIAL individual titles. Dunn continued her accomplishments, as she qualified for the 2024 Junior Olympics and was also the 2024 Pennsylvania Interscholastic High School Rifle State Champion in three-position smallbore.

"It's been a pleasure getting to know Riley," Clark said. "She always brings a fun and light mood to practice, but knows how to put in work to help push herself and her teammates to the next level. I am excited to see what the next four years have in store for her."

Moyer comes from Lumpkin County High School near Atlanta, Ga. Moyer made the Georgia All-State rifle team while shooting the highest season average in the region. As a junior, she placed second at the Georgia State Championships. At the 2023 Dixie Doubles Tournament, she placed third in the junior division in air rifle and 14th overall in the same event.

"It's exciting to have Maddy on campus this year," Clark said. "She has shown her strong pursuit to excel both on and off the range. Maddy has already been competing at a high level and

I am excited to see where the next four years take her as she takes advantage of the resources UNL has to offer."

Perkins comes from Fort Wayne, Ind., where she was a 2024 Indiana Junior Olympics silver medalist in air rifle and smallbore, along with earning a gold medal in 3P Air for the Indiana State Rifle and Pistol Association. She set a new state record for 3P air in 2024, breaking her own previous record in 2023. In 2023, Perkins won the gold medal for the Women's U18 Junior Olympics in smallbore, as well as winning gold in the smallbore and bronze in the air rifle at the Indiana Junior Olympics. Perkins also competed in the Indiana Junior Olympics in 2021 and 2022.

"It's great to have Alivia on campus," Clark said. "She brings a large wealth of knowledge and experience to the program and has competed for Junior World Cup and Junior World Championships teams throughout her high school career. I am excited to see her continue hard work and help push our program forward throughout her years here."

THIS IS NEBRASKA

The Nebraska rifle program is heading into its 27th season of existence in 2024-25, with Head Coach Richard Clark at the helm for the first year of his tenure. Clark was most recently the assistant coach at Army West Point in 2023-24.

Since its berth in 1998-99, the program has amassed over 300 victories and earned 15 top-six finishes at the NCAA Championships across 20 qualifications. The team has finished in the top three at the NCAA Championships five times, while NU has produced four individual national champions. Nebraska rifle team members have earned a total of 63 All-America awards.

Rifle athletes enjoy numerous benefits from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, both academically and athletically. These benefits include, but are not limited to, top-notch facilities, access to high-quality dining halls, an impressive athletic medicine and training staff, state-of-the-art training equipment, helpful academic advisors and various life skills and community service opportunities.

RICHARD CLARK

Head Coach (First Year)

Richard Clark was named head coach of the University of Nebraska rifle program in July of 2024.

Clark, who helped Kentucky to a pair of NCAA team titles during his collegiate career, joined the Husker program after spending the 2023-24 season as an assistant coach at Army West Point. The Cadets finished 14th in the final CRCA Rankings, while Anusha Pakkam captured All-Great American Rifle Conference honors and was Army's Scholar-Athlete of the Year recipient. In addition, Chris Jennings placed third in both smallbore and air rifle at the 2023 USA Shooting Junior Olympics, becoming the first Army shooter to make the finals at the event since 2019.

A member of the USA Shooting Development Team, Clark represented Team USA at the 2023 ISSF World Cup in Rio de Janeiro. He was also the 2022 NRA National 3-Position Champion, while setting two national records in the process and was a 2022 Pershing Team Member, representing the highest-scoring American and highest scoring competitor in the annual match between the United States and Great Britain. Clark also won the 2022 Lones Wigger Iron Man Trophy,

which recognizes the champion of the 14-day NRA National Smallbore Rifle Championship with over 100 competitors.

Clark, a native of Jackson, Mich., enjoyed a distinguished college career shooting at the University of Kentucky. He was a three-time All-American during his career, helping Kentucky to NCAA titles in 2021 and 2022. As a senior, he earned CRCA All-America honors in all three disciplines, earning second-team honors in both air rifle and smallbore while being a third-team honoree in aggregate. He averaged 585.538 in smallbore and 597.077 in air rifle for an aggregate average of 1179.615, while posting career highs in both smallbore (592) and air rifle (598). During his junior year, he earned honorable-mention All-GARC honors while his scores of 585 (smallbore) and 594 (air rifle) helped Kentucky to an NCAA title. Clark was a five-year contributor for the Wildcats, earning honorable-mention All-America honors in 2020.

Clark graduated with a bachelor's degree in kinesiology with a minor in coaching from Kentucky in 2022 before completing a master's in business administration in 2023.

KRISTEN DERTING

Assistant Coach (First Year)

Kristen Derting was hired as Nebraska rifle's assistant coach in August of 2024.

Derting is a graduate of Ole Miss, and competed on the Rebel rifle team for five years. During that time, she was a six-time CRCA All-American and an 11-time All-GARC (Great American Rifle Conference) team member. During her collegiate career, Derting earned career highs of 594 in the smallbore, 598 in the air rifle and 1,188 in the aggregate.

Derting qualified for the USA National Team and has competed in five international competitions over the last two years, including the World Cup in 2023, the Continental American Championships in 2022.

The Salem, Ore., native was a force for the Rebels, as the team qualified for four straight NCAA Championships during her tenure. In 2023-24, Derting led the team with an air rifle average of 593.4 and competed in both the smallbore and air rifle in every match for Ole Miss.

Derting earned her bachelor's degree in hospitality management from the University of Mississippi in December 2023 and her master's degree in hospitality administration/management from the University of Mississippi in August 2024.

DR. RODNEY BENNETT

Chancellor

- In Fall 2023, almost 4,700 first-time freshmen enrolled at UNL—an increase of 1.3 percent from 2022. 75.4 percent of those first-time freshmen are from Nebraska.
- Spring 2024 overall enrollment reversed a trend of five straight years of spring enrollment declines.
- Over the last five years, UNL retention from first to second year has increased 2.3 percentage points and four-year graduation rate has increased more than 8.5 percentage points.
- In 2023, the university's total research expenditures grew to \$366 million, a 37 percent increase over the past decade. UNL has also experienced tremendous growth in externally sponsored federal funding, increasing to a record \$163 million in 2023.

Dr. Rodney D. Bennett began his work as the 21st chancellor of the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, Nebraska's flagship, Big Ten research institution on July 1, 2023. He is a 30-year veteran of higher education with a track record of growing research, increasing student success and building impactful partnerships.

In his first year as Chancellor, the University experienced rising retention and graduation rates, demonstrated positive signs related to enrollment, and expanded its research and creative activity efforts.

Chancellor Bennett came to Nebraska after nine years of successful leadership at the University of Southern Mississippi. During his tenure as president, USM was reclassified from a Carnegie R2 to an R1 university, signaling growth in research prestige and funding. Dr. Bennett also invested in programs to support student recruitment, retention and outcomes, including for the 30 percent of USM students who were first-generation. His efforts led to an improvement in the university's six-year graduation rate.

Prior to his role at the University of Southern

Mississippi, Dr. Bennett served at the University of Georgia for more than a decade. He was the senior administrator for student programs and services for Georgia's 34,000-plus students; oversaw \$150 million in capital projects; and made key staff and programmatic investments in extracurriculars, mental health programs and other areas to better support students.

Dr. Bennett has also been the dean of students at Winthrop University in Rock Hill, South Carolina, and associate dean of student life at Middle Tennessee State University.

Chancellor Bennett values community leadership and service. 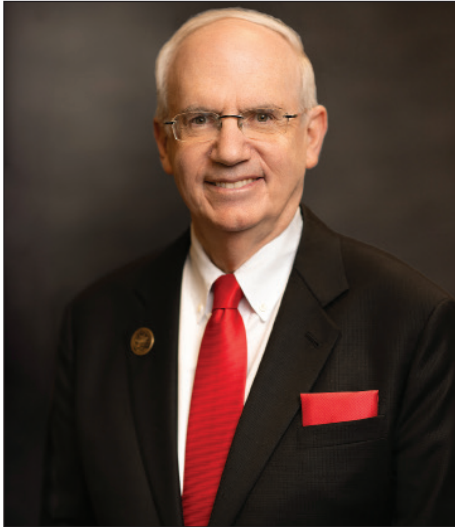

Scott M. Fuess Jr. is in his fifth year as Nebraska's Faculty Athletics Representative, having started on July 1, 2020.

As faculty athletics representative, Fuess serves as a liaison between the Office of the Chancellor and Athletic Department. He also serves on the Athletic Department's Executive Staff. His areas of focus in the role include the welfare of student-athletes, NCAA and Big Ten Conference compliance, maintaining the positive relationship between athletics and faculty, developing and responding to NCAA legislative proposals and representing the university at related NCAA and Big Ten

chancellor of the University of Nebraska Medical Center (UNMC) and board chair for the Nebraska Medicine Health System from 2014 to 2024. As UNMC's chief operating officer, Dr. Gold was responsible for all aspects of campus leadership, program quality and operation—including 7 colleges, 37 institutes and centers, 5,429 faculty and staff and 4,700 health professions students.

In July 2021, Dr. Gold was named the Provost and Executive Vice President of the University of Nebraska System in addition to his ongoing UNMC/Nebraska Medicine responsibilities. In this role, he served as the chief academic officer of the University of Nebraska System and liaison to the Board of Regents for academic affairs. From May 2017 through June 2021, Dr. Gold served as the chancellor of the University of Nebraska at Omaha, the state's only public metropolitan university—a role he held concurrently with being UNMC's chancellor.

He holds tenured faculty appointments in UNMC's College of Medicine and in the College of Public Health, where his research interests in health care policy, population health and epidemiology are concentrated. He has authored over 200 peer-reviewed manuscripts, 350 national presentations, 40 books and chapters and engaged in over 300 invited professorships and keynote presentations.

Dr. Gold is a first-generation student; he graduated from the Cornell University College of Engineering with a bachelor's degree in Theoretical and Applied Mechanics. He earned his M.D. from the Weill Cornell College of Medicine and completed his general surgery residency

at The New York–Presbyterian Hospital and Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center. He completed his cardiothoracic surgical fellowship training at the Brigham and Women's Hospital in Boston, with additional training in pediatric cardiac surgery at the Boston Children's Hospital, both of the Harvard Medical School.

He has been certified by the American Board of Surgery and by the American Board of Thoracic Surgery, specializing in adult and pediatric cardiac surgery. Dr. Gold is licensed in Nebraska, Ohio, New York and New Jersey.

Dr. Gold leads several key economic development boards for the State and the University System, including the Greater Omaha Chamber, University Tech Development Corp, the University Tech Transfer Corp, and UNeTech Corp.

His national leadership roles have included more than 50 national professional committees and more than 100 national organizations, volunteer boards, government and public health councils. He has worked extensively with national- and state-level elected and appointed governing and administrative bodies as an advisor and trusted resource in the areas of higher education, research and clinical care.

Dr. Gold has been married for more than forty years to a medical school classmate. He has two adult children and two grandchildren.

Jeffrey P. Gold, M.D., became the ninth president of the University of Nebraska System on July 1, 2024, following a national search by the Board of Regents.

As president, Gold leads a four-campus university system that enrolls nearly 50,000 students and employs 16,000 faculty and staff on campuses in Lincoln, Omaha and Kearney, plus academic divisions and research and extension centers across the state. He serves as chief spokesman and chief executive officer for the system, which operates on a \$3 billion annual budget and includes a flagship Big Ten institution, a world-renowned academic health sciences center, Division I athletics programs, and preeminent institutes focused on water and agriculture, national security and defense, infectious disease and early childhood education.

He is a nationally recognized higher education and health care leader and advocate. He was the





TROY DANNEN

Athletic Director

Troy Dannen, a leading voice in collegiate athletics with extensive experience as an athletic director and deep ties to the Midwest, is in his first year as Nebraska's Director of Athletics. Dannen was hired on March 20, 2024, and has hit the ground running in Lincoln.

Nebraska Athletics enjoyed success during Dannen's first championship season, as the Husker baseball program won its first Big Ten Tournament title and reached the 40-win plateau for the first time since 2014 while the Husker track teams put together impressive showings. The Husker men won the Big Ten Outdoor title and earned their best NCAA Championship finish since 2016 with a 13th-place finish, while the Husker women posted their second straight top-10 NCAA finish and placed ninth at the national meet. Nebraska finished 22nd in the final 2023-24 Learfield Director's Cup, the program's highest finish since 2010.

Dannen has been a leader in charting the course for a new era of collegiate athletics, serving from 2021 to 2023 as a member of the NCAA Constitution Committee and the Division I Transformation Committee. Dannen also previously served as the chair of the NCAA Football Competition Committee and was an Executive Committee member of the Football Oversight Committee. In total, Dannen has served on seven NCAA committees.

In 2022, Dannen was a finalist for Sports Business Journal's Athletic Director of the Year award, and he received the Distinguished American Award from the Sugar Bowl Chapter of the National Football Foundation.

Dannen came to Lincoln after serving as Director of Athletics at the University of Washington. He helped guide the Huskies' transition to the Big Ten Conference and oversaw a football program that reached the College Football Playoff National Championship Game in January of 2024.

He arrived at Washington in the fall of 2023 after serving as Director of Athletics at Tulane University since 2015. While at Tulane, Green Wave student-athletes earned 49 All-America honors, a national championship, 21 conference championships and 41 postseason appearances.

In 2022-23, Tulane football won its first American Athletic Conference football championship and won the Cotton Bowl over USC, which was ranked ninth in the nation at that time. The men's basketball program won 20 regular-season games for the first time in two decades. Additionally, men's tennis advanced to its sixth NCAA Tournament in seven years, both bowling and beach volleyball finished ranked in the top 20, and baseball won the conference championship.

Tulane's football program participated in an unprecedented three consecutive bowl games from 2018 to 2020, winning back-to-back bowl games for the first time in 128 years of football at the University.

In the classroom, Tulane student-athletes excelled at a high-level. At the end of the 2022-23 academic year, over 68 percent of Green Wave student-athletes earned a 3.0 GPA or better, with a 93 percent Graduation Success Rate and a record-setting department Academic Progress Report of 992, with seven teams earning a perfect 1000 APR score.

Dannen spearheaded fundraising efforts and numerous capital projects at Tulane. He helped secure the largest unrestricted gift in Tulane Athletics history, an endowment gift that funded the operation of a new sport

(sailing), and a \$10 million lead gift for capital renovations, which was the second-largest gift in department history. In addition, marketing and licensing revenue grew four-fold, and in 2022-23, Tulane football, basketball and volleyball set ticket sales and revenue records. Under Dannen's leadership, the Green Wave Club Annual Fund grew by 40 percent in terms of donors, and 45 percent in terms of dollars.

Increases in fundraising and major gift donors positively impacted capital project development and completion. A \$13 million renovation to the Reilly Natatorium, home of the swimming and diving program, as well as \$8 million in renovations to locker rooms and the sports medicine area inside the Wilson Center were completed in 2023. Dannen also oversaw construction of a new dining facility, weight room, basketball and volleyball locker rooms. Tulane also completed a \$2.4 million academic center renovation and a \$5 million television and digital production center.

Dannen came to Tulane after serving eight years as the Director of Athletics at the University of Northern Iowa (UNI) from 2008 to 2015. During his tenure, the Panthers enjoyed success at both the conference and national levels, highlighted by an NCAA Sweet 16 appearance in 2010 by the UNI men's basketball team. During his eight-year tenure, UNI was recognized with 39 All-Americans, 13 Coaches of the Year and nine Missouri Valley Conference (MVC) Players of the Year. UNI football, men's basketball, women's basketball, volleyball and softball combined to reach 15 NCAA tournaments and 20 postseason berths during that stretch. For his efforts, Dannen was recognized as NACDA's FCS Athletic Director of the Year in 2014.

Prior to his time at UNI, Dannen served as the Iowa Girls High School Athletic Union's Executive Director for seven years, overseeing 400 high schools and 10 sports.

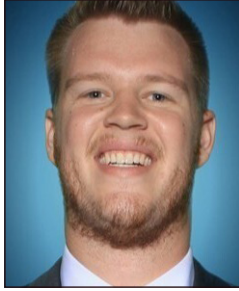

She set the new state record in 3P air, breaking the mark that she had previously set in 2023.

In 2023, Perkins was the Women's U18 Junior Olympic Smallbore gold medalist, and won gold in the smallbore and bronze in the air rifle at the Indiana Junior Olympics. She was a smallbore and 3P air gold medalist, along with an air rifle bronze medalist for the Indiana State Rifle and Pistol Association. Perkins competed at the 2023 Junior World Championships as a member of the USA Shooting Futures National Team, which placed third in the 50m smallbore.

Seven-Time CRCA All-American and 2023 NCAA Smallbore Champion Cecelia Ossi



NEBRASKA RIFLE 2023-24 RECAP



The Nebraska rifle team made its second-straight NCAA appearance in 2023-24 to cap an impressive season. The Huskers finished eighth at the NCAA Championships and ended the season ranked No. 8 in the CRCA (College Rifle Coaches Association) poll.

NU posted numerous team records over the course of the year – it scored the highest mark in program history with a 4,728 at Air Force, along with one of the top five smallbore scores (2,345 vs. WVU) and three of the top five air rifle scores (2,384 at Air Force; 2,381 at UTEP; 2,379 at UTEP).

Cecelia Ossi and Emma Rhode both ended their seasons with All-America honors from the CRCA. Ossi was named a first-team CRCA All-American in the smallbore, and was a second-team CRCA All-American in the air rifle and aggregate. Rhode was named a second-team Air Rifle All-American and was given honorable mentions in both the smallbore and aggregate.

Ossi's averages of 587.69 in the smallbore and 594.23 in the air rifle were both the highest averages earned by a senior in Nebraska history. Rhode's average of 594.54 in the air rifle ranked first on the team and is the highest average by a sophomore in program history.

The Big Red kicked off the season with a home match against Ohio State, where Nebraska claimed the 4,698-4,684 victory. Then, NU hit the road to face off against Air Force, where it shot the record-high 4,728, along with the highest air rifle score (2,384) in program history.

Then, the Huskers lost three straight matches to then-No. 1 West Virginia and then-No. 2 TCU. In the second match against WVU, NU tied the third-highest smallbore score in program history with a 2,345 and Ossi tied the school record in the air rifle with a 598. Nebraska proceeded to bounce back with a 4,704-4,632 victory at The Citadel.

NU concluded the fall portion of the season at the 2023 Fall Classic, where it competed against then-No. 1 West Virginia, then-No. 8 Air Force and then-No. 9 Murray State. The Big Red came out with a victory against Murray State (4,700-4,692) and losses to WVU (4,741-4,700) and Air Force (4,709-4,700).

After a two-month break, the Huskers began the spring season on Jan. 14 against then-No. 3 Kentucky, where they fell to the Wildcats by a score of 4,723-4,696. Then, NU hosted its final home match of the season against Georgia Southern. The Eagles came out with the 4,725-4,702 victory.

The Huskers got back in a rhythm in their final matches of the regular season with two victories at UTEP. Ossi broke the school smallbore record in the second match against the Miners, and NU tied the second-highest (2,381) and third-highest (2,379) air rifle marks in program history in the two competitions. It also notched the fifth-highest total score (4,720) in school history.

The Big Red began the postseason with a fourth-place finish at the PRC (Patriot Rifle Conference) Championships, which included victories over Ohio State and UTEP and losses to Alaska-Fairbanks, TCU and Air Force. Then, Nebraska traveled to Columbus, Ohio, for its NCAA Qualifier match against Ohio State and Akron. NU placed second of the three teams with a score of 4,703.

At the 2024 NCAA Championships, the Big Red grabbed an eighth-place finish with scores of 2,317 in the smallbore, 2,363 in the air rifle and 4,680 in the aggregate. Ossi qualified for the finals in the smallbore and finished in eighth place.

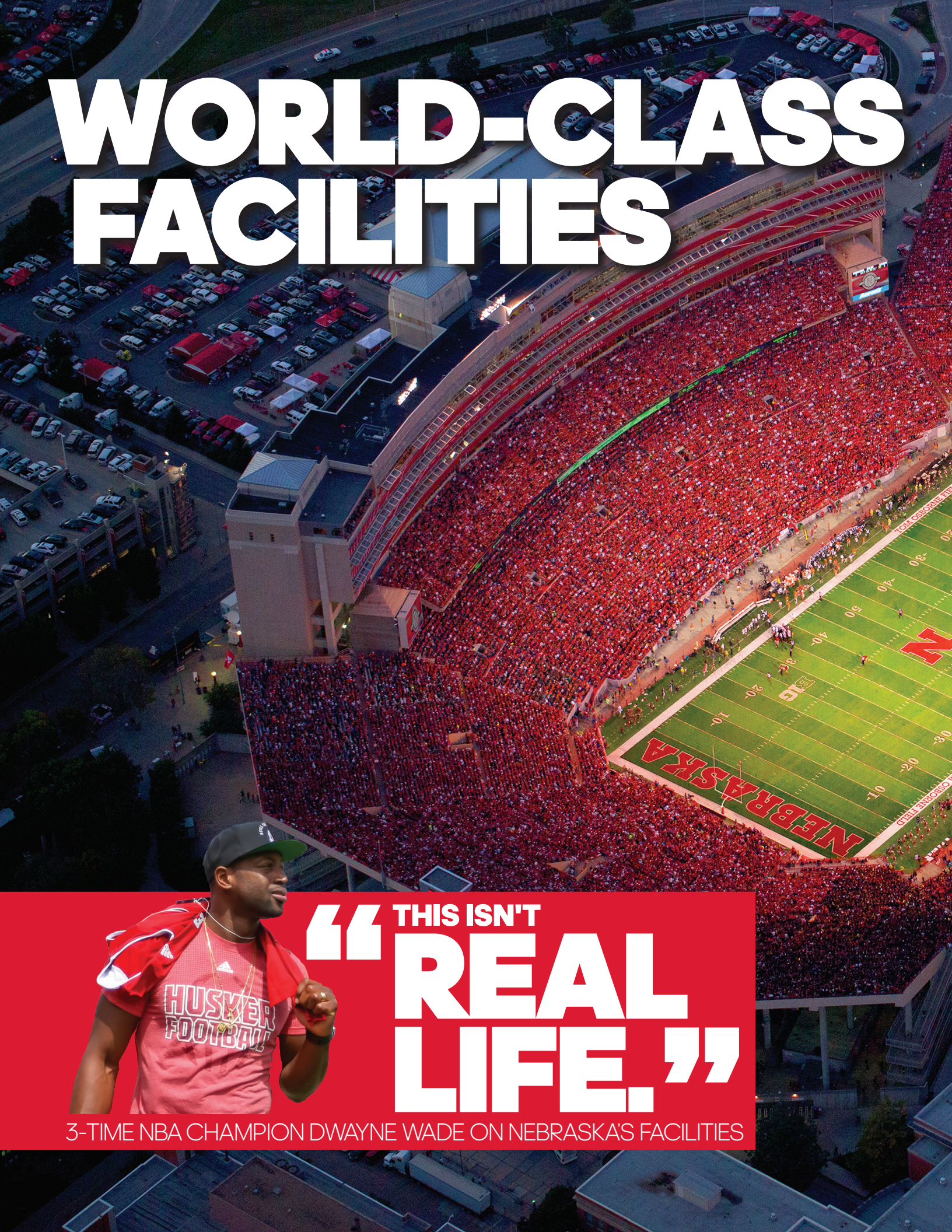

ATHLETIC MEDICINE

Nebraska features one of the most well-trained and highly skilled athletic medicine staffs in the country. Under the guidance of Associate Athletic Director for Athletic Medicine Brandon Yoder, the Nebraska athletic medicine staff consists of 22 full-time athletic trainers, two graduate assistant athletic trainers, as well as a team of primary care, sports medicine and orthopedic physicians.

Nebraska's medical facilities have long been among the nation's best, and the Husker football program moved into the Osborne Legacy Complex in 2023. The facility includes state-of-the-art equipment for the evaluation, diagnosis, treatment and rehabilitation needs of the players. The athletic medicine staff continues to strive for growth with advanced coursework, allowing for innovation and research-based decisions to improve medical outcomes in conjunction with other athletic performance units to help create an all-encompassing health care model.

In addition to the Osborne Legacy Complex, the Tom and Nancy Osborne Athletic Complex, Hawks Field, Bowlin Stadium, Pinnacle Bank Arena, the Bob Devaney Sports Center and the Nebraska Soccer and Tennis Complex all feature athletic medicine facilities.



SPORT PSYCHOLOGY

Continuing its commitment to complete care for all student-athletes, Nebraska has a staff of five in-house mental health providers specializing in performance psychology who work directly with student-athletes, teams and coaches. Under the leadership of Director of Sport Psychology Brianna Ward (above), the Huskers' sport psychology staff provides counseling, psychological services, mental skills training, teambuilding and leadership development services for each of Nebraska's 24 sports and more than 600 Husker student-athletes. The staff works directly with student-athletes to help them develop skills to enhance personal well-being, address mental health and train psychological skills to optimize performance.

ACADEMIC COUNSELING

A team of 14 academic staff members are in place to monitor daily academic progress, promote skill development, receive consistent course feedback, assist with the advising/registration process and monitor eligibility and progress toward graduation.

TUTORIAL SUPPORT

A tremendous resource for all academic abilities, tutorial support is available from day one up to college graduation in all subject areas. Tutorial support is provided both in-person and virtually. Nebraska's tutorial program is certified by the College Reading and Learning Association.

STUDY HALL

Student-athletes attend a supervised study hall within the newly-opened Osborne Legacy Complex that features day, evening and weekend hours. Student athletes are required to complete a specific number of study hours each week and/or a list of academic tasks as determined by their academic counselor, learning specialist and coach.

MENTORING

Academic staff serve as mentors to all incoming student-athletes and select returning student-athletes. The student-athletes meet with their mentor weekly to develop time management skills, gather and report academic progress information and discuss academic success strategies.

EDUCATIONAL ASSESSMENTS

Assessments are administered upon the request of the student-athlete, academic counselor or coach. Learning specialists are available to administer and score informal assessments, which include a reading comprehension and a writing assessment. When more in-depth assessments are necessary, referrals are made to a neuropsychologist who conducts the assessments. If it is determined a student-athlete has a learning disability or another medical condition that impedes the student from reaching their academic potential, appropriate accommodations are implemented by the Office of Services for Students with Disabilities.

STUDENT-ATHLETE ORIENTATION

Each new student-athlete attends an orientation at the beginning of their academic career. Student-athletes are introduced to staff, faculty, administrators and a variety of resources that help facilitate the transition into college while enhancing awareness of support services in the Athletic Department and across campus.

PERSONAL COUNSELING

Student-athletes will find a supportive and caring environment at Nebraska. Transitional issues, stress management, time management, academic focus and problem resolution are all addressed in a proactive manner throughout the year. If necessary, counseling referrals are also made to designated practitioners.

COMPUTER RESOURCES

All student-athletes are provided the opportunity to have a laptop for use during their academic career at Nebraska. The Osborne Legacy Complex has printers and desktop computers available for student-athletes to use in the facility. A full-time computer specialist is on-site and available to assist with technology needs.

PERFORMANCE NUTRITION

The purpose of the Performance Nutrition department is to provide services that enhance the student-athlete's overall health and recovery.

GOALS

- To offer a variety of food and beverage products that are readily available and accessible for all student-athletes.
- To provide a wealth of education and resources that each student-athlete can utilize to enhance their overall level of knowledge and awareness as it pertains to fueling their body for competition and recovery.

DESCRIPTION OF SERVICES

Performance Nutrition seeks to provide fueling options and education to Husker student-athletes, so they are adequately prepared and knowledgeable on the impact nutrition can have in their lives as athletes and after sport.

NUTRITION OVERVIEW

Our Training Table is the primary resource for student-athletes to seek out holistic fueling options. Our Training Table operates and sets its menus with a student-athlete first mentality. We seek to provide healthy, accommodating nutrition options for all our athletes at breakfast, lunch and dinner. The Training Table also features a demo kitchen, allowing our student-athletes to practice their culinary skills and learn more about making nutritious meals.

Our fueling stations are the secondary resource for student-athletes to fulfill their fueling needs. The primary goal of our fueling stations is to provide quick and easy sources of nutrition and hydration to supplement training and competition.

Husker Bucks are provided to student-athletes to supplement meals on their own. Athletes have the chance to purchase a meal at local restaurants or to use for groceries at the grocery store.

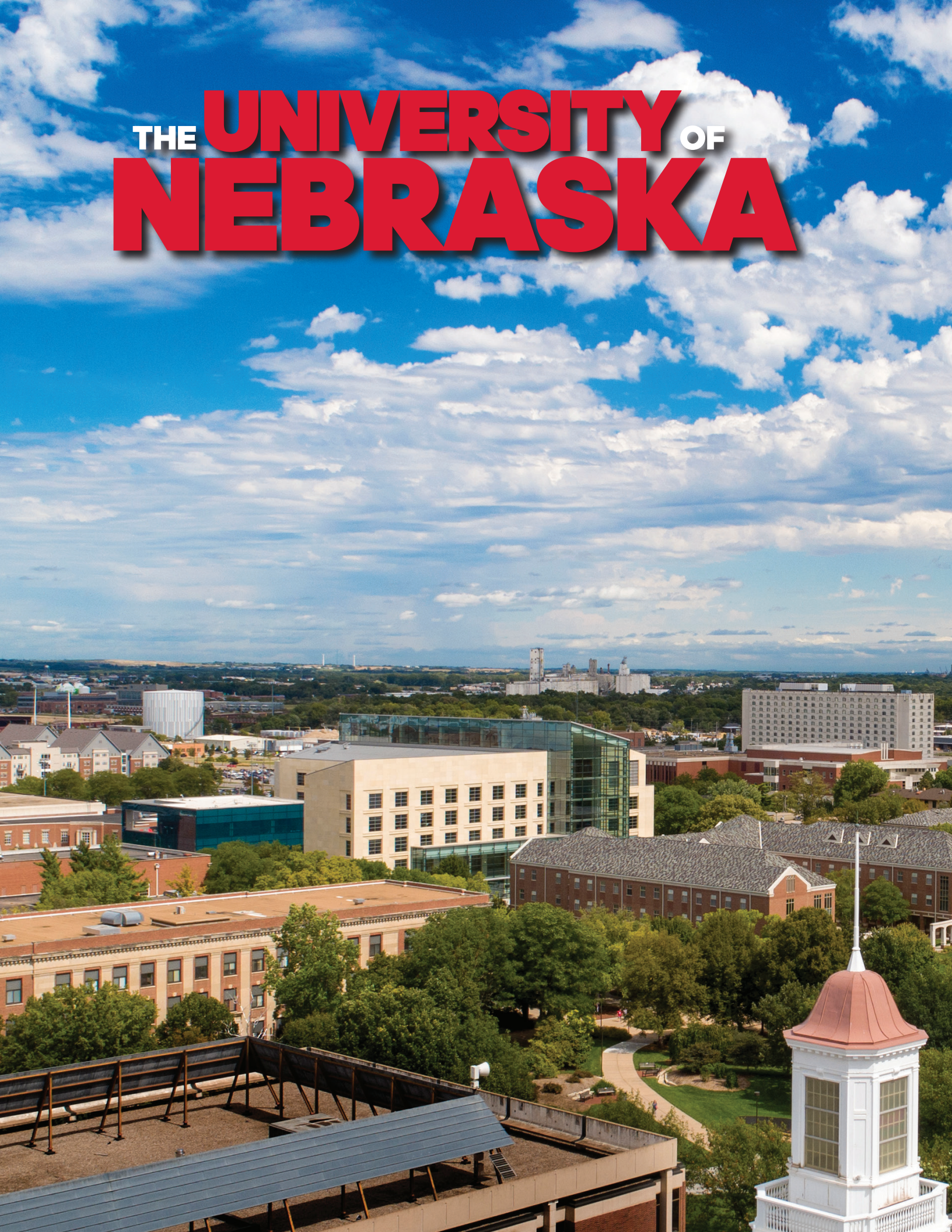
EDUCATION AND CONSULTATION

Each team has a sport specific dietitian who oversees the nutritional needs per team. Our dietitians are a great resource for education and consultation to our student-athletes. The dietitians conduct DEXAs for bone density and lean mass trending, hydration testing, consult with athletes individually, provide nutrition education team talks (hydration, pre-workout fueling, recovery nutrition), host cooking classes and grocery store tours, and assist with fueling options surrounding competitions.

HUSKERS & FLIK

Flik athletics specializes in fueling athletes. Flik Athletics currently fuels over 25 professional teams across NFL, NBA, WNBA, MLB, MLS and USL Championship league. Nebraska will be the first college athletic program they have partnered with. In partnership with team dietitians, trainers, and coaches, Flik's team of chefs and dietitians create customized hospitality services and programming that elevate the athlete's culinary experience.
