Nebraska returns to Lincoln for Homecoming Weekend as the Huskers take on Rutgers in a Big Ten Conference matchup at Memorial Stadium. Game time is set for 3 p.m. CT with FS1 providing the television coverage of the contest. The game can also be heard on the Huskers Radio Network and the Huskers App.

The Huskers stand at 4-1 on the season and 1-1 in Big Ten Conference play following a 28-10 road victory at Purdue. After trailing 3-0 deep into the third quarter, Nebraska exploded for 28 points in just over 12 minutes of action to pull away for the victory. The Nebraska defense limited Purdue to just three points until the game's final minutes, while the balanced Husker offense drove into Purdue territory on every possession in the game.

Rutgers comes to Lincoln with a 4-0 record following a 21-18 victory on Friday night against Washington in the Scarlet Knights' Big Ten opener. The win over the Huskies followed a perfect non-conference slate highlighted by a road victory at Virginia Tech. Coach Greg Schiano's team features one of the nation's top rushing offenses, as Rutgers averages 237.8 rushing yards per contest and better than 420 yards per game in total offense. The Scarlet Knights have committed just two turnovers through four games in the 2024 season.

Saturday's game marks the first matchup between the schools in Lincoln since 2017. The past two meetings between Nebraska and Rutgers have been in Piscataway with the Huskers winning in both 2020 and 2022. Overall, Nebraska has won all six meetings in the series, including both games at Memorial Stadium.

THIS WEEK'S NUMBERS

Saturday's game is the only scheduled college game this season matching head coaches with NFL head coaching experience. Nebraska Coach Matt Rhule led the Carolina Panthers for three seasons, and Rutgers Coach Greg Schiano was the head coach of the Tampa Buccaneers for two seasons.

Nebraska has scored at least 24 points in each of its five games. It marks the first time Nebraska has scored at least 24 points in its first five games since 2016 when NU scored at least 24 in the first seven games. It marks Nebraska's first five-game streak with at least 24 points at any point since a five-game span between the 2018 and 2019 seasons.

Saturday's game is the 113th Homecoming game in University of Nebraska history. The Huskers are 85-23-4 on Homecoming and have won 12 of their last 14 Homecoming games. Nebraska is 9-2 against Big Ten opponents on Homecoming, including 1-0 vs. Rutgers.

SERIES HISTORY: NEBRASKAVS. RUTGERS

Nebraska and Rutgers will be meeting for the seventh time overall and the sixth time as Big Ten Conference opponents. The Huskers have won each of the six matchups in the series, including victories at Memorial Stadium in 2014 and 2017.

- The most recent meeting occurred in a Friday night matchup at Rutgers in the 2022 season, with the Huskers winning 14-13.
- Saturday's game will be the first matchup in Lincoln since the 2017 season when Nebraska posted a 27-17 victory over the Scarlet Knights.
- Before the 2014 matchup in Lincoln, the schools had not met since a 28-0 Nebraska victory in 1920 at the famous New York Polo Grounds.

NEBRASKA CELEBRATES 400TH CONSECUTIVE SELLOUT

Nebraska celebrated its 400th consecutive sellout at Memorial Stadium on Sept. 20 against Illinois. The Huskers have sold out every game at Memorial Stadium for more than six decades, beginning with a game against Missouri on Nov. 3, 1962. Nebraska has sold out its final three games of the 2024 season, including Saturday's Homecoming matchup with Rutgers, which will stretch the sellout streak to 403 games by season's end.

- During the sellout streak, Memorial Stadium has expanded several times and capacity has grown from 31,080 in 1962 to the current capacity of 82,841. Over 31 million fans have watched the Huskers at Memorial Stadium during the streak.
- Nebraska has a record of 324-76 during the sellout streak. The game against No. 24 Illinois was the 87th matchup against a ranked opponent during the sellout streak, with Nebraska owning a 47-40 mark in those games.

HUSKERS COMPLETE NON-LEAGUE PLAY UNDEFEATED

Nebraska opened the season with three consecutive non-conference victories, marking its first 3-0 start to the season since 2016. It was also the first time Nebraska was unblemished in non-conference play since 2016. The Huskers fell out of both national polls following their overtime loss to Illinois, but the start to the season remains Nebraska's best in eight years. Nebraska has continued to receive votes in both polls the past two weeks.

- Nebraska was in both national polls for two consecutive weeks (Sept. 8, Sept. 15). Nebraska rose as high as 22nd in both polls. The No. 22 AP ranking was Nebraska's highest since being ranked 17th entering the 2016 regular-season finale at Iowa.
- The Sept. 20 game with Illinois was the first matchup of two AP ranked teams at Memorial Stadium since 2013 (vs. UCLA) and the first Big Ten games between two ranked teams since 2011 when 13th-ranked Nebraska defeated No. 9 Michigan State.

NEBRASKA SHOWING ABILITY TO CONTROL GAMES

Nebraska controlled its first three games from start to finish. The Huskers did not trail in their three first games, and out-scored the opposition by a total of 102-20. While Illinois prevailed with an overtime score, Nebraska trailed for less than 12 minutes of regulation game action against the Illini, and followed by trailing for only four minutes at Purdue.

- Nebraska won each of its first three games by at least 18 points. It marked the first time NU won three straight games by at least 18 points since the middle of the 2014 season, when the Huskers defeated Northwestern (21), Rutgers (18) and Purdue (21). The Huskers added a fourth win by at least 18 points with its 28-10 win at Purdue.
- Nebraska scored on its opening drive in each of the first three games. Those scoring drives covered 72, 49 and 75 yards.
- In five games, Nebraska has out-scored the opposition 58-3 in the second quarter. In 2023, Nebraska was out-scored 81-66 in the second quarter. The Blackshirts held Purdue scoreless in the first half, marking the second opponent that NU has shut out in the opening half (Colorado).
- Opponents have had very little success early in games. Dating back to 2023, Nebraska has allowed just two first-quarter touchdowns in its past 12 games. Just two opponents in the past 18 games have scored a touchdown on its opening drive.

NOTING LAST WEEK'S GAME

- Nebraska totaled five sacks, its secondhighest total of the season (six vs. Colorado). James Williams (2.0) and M.J. Sherman (1.5) both set career highs in sacks. Williams' 2.0 sacks were the most by a Husker this season.
- Nebraska held Purdue scoreless in the first half, marking the second opponent Nebraska has held scoreless in the first half (Colorado). Nebraska has allowed just three points in the second quarter this season.
- John Bullock recorded his first career interception and returned it 35 yards for a touchdown. It marked Nebraska's second interception for a touchdown this season (Tommi Hill vs. Colorado). It marked the first time since 2017 that Nebraska had two pick-six TDs in a season.
- Nebraska out-gained Purdue, 418-224, marking the third opponent held to under 275 total yards this season (UTEP, Colorado).
- Senior receiver Jahmal Banks caught a 6-yard TD in the third quarter for Nebraska's first points. It marked his second touchdown of 2024 (UTEP) and his 15th career receiving touchdown. Banks finished with five catches for 82 yards and has 13 receptions the past two weeks.
- Emmett Johnson totaled 98 all-purpose yards (50 rushing, 48 passing) on just 11 attempts. His 48 receiving yards were a career high (43 vs. UNI) while his 27-yard reception was also career long.
- Sophomore wide receiver **Jaylen Lloyd** had a 25-yard reception in the first quarter. Lloyd has 10 career receptions with seven of those catches covering at least 25 yards.

BLACKSHIRT DEFENSE OFF TO STRONG 2024 START

The Nebraska defense was one of the nation's most improved units in 2023. The Blackshirts opened the 2024 season with similar strong play through five games.

- Nebraska allowed just 20 combined points in its first three games, the fewest through three games since NU allowed 16 points in the first three games in 2005.
- Nebraska has held four of five opponents to 10 or fewer points this season. The Huskers are allowing 12.2 points per game to rank third in the Big Ten and ninth nationally.
- With an overtime touchdown, Illinois ended a streak of 10 straight opponents Nebraska had held to 24 or fewer points. It was the longest stretch Nebraska had limited the opposition to 24 points or less since a 14-game stretch spanning the 2009 and 2010 seasons.
- Before the Illinois game, the Huskers held seven straight opponents at Memorial Stadium to 14 or fewer points. Since the start of the 2023 season, just two of 11 opponents at Memorial Stadium have scored more than 14 points.
- Dating back to last season, Nebraska has held 12 straight opponents to less than 400 total yards. The last time Nebraska held more than 12 straight opponents to less than 400 yards was part of a 14-game stretch spanning the final three games of 2008 and first 11 contests of 2009. The Huskers have held UTEP (205), Colorado (260) and Purdue (224) to less than 300 total yards.
- Nebraska held Colorado to just 16 rushing yards on 22 attempts, the fewest rushing yards by an opponent since Purdue had -2 rushing yards in 2020. NU opened the season by allowing just 56 rushing yards against UTEP and allowed Purdue to rush for only 50 yards. In 17 games under Head Coach Matt Rhule, the Huskers have held the opponent to less than 100 rushing yards 11 times, including eight games with 75 yards or less.
- Nebraska is one of only two teams who has not allowed a rushing touchdown (lowa). Dating back to last season, the Huskers have not allowed a rushing touchdown in 10 of their past 12 games.

WINNING THE TURNOVER MARGIN

Nebraska's defense has posted multiple takeaways three times in 2024 (UTEP, Colorado, Illinois), and single takeaways against UNI and Purdue. The Huskers have a takeaway in all five games, Nebraska's longest streak since a six-game stretch spanning the 2022 (final two games) and 2023 (first four games) seasons. In turn, the offense has just three turnovers in five games, giving Nebraska a +5 turnover margin. Last year, NU posted a -17 turnover margin. Nebraska is currently 18th nationally in turnover margin at +1.0 per game.

- The multiple takeaways in consecutive games (UTEP, Colorado) marked the first time the Husker defense accomplished that since 2020 when Nebraska had multiple takeaways against Northwestern and Penn State.
- The first two games was the first time Nebraska had a positive turnover margin in consecutive games since the final two games of the 2022 season when the Huskers had a +1 (Wisconsin) and +3 (Iowa) turnover margin in consecutive games. The Huskers have followed up with positive turnover margins in consecutive games against Illinois and Purdue.
- The Huskers have outscored opponents 31-0 in points off turnovers this season following John Bullock's interception return for a touchdown at Purdue.

DEFENSE PUTTING POINTS ON THE BOARD

Nebraska has outscored opponents 31-0 in points off turnovers, with the defense doing some of that work on their own. In the season opener against UTEP, NU recorded a safety and followed up with a pick-six by **Tommi Hill** against Colorado. **John Bullock** added an interception for a touchdown at Purdue.

• The interception for a touchdown by Hill against the Buffs was Nebraska's first pick-six since Cam Taylor-Britt had a 38-yard interception for a touchdown against Iowa in 2019. It was Nebraska's first defensive touchdown of any kind since Deontai Williams returned a fumble for a score against Penn State in 2020.

- With Nebraska adding a second pick-6 at Purdue it marks the first time Nebraska has had a pair of interception returns for touchdowns in the same season since 2019. Nebraska's two defensive touchdowns rank sixth nationally
- In the 40-7 win over UTEP in the opener, defensive lineman **Ty Robinson** had a tackle for loss for a safety. It was Nebraska's first defensive safety since 2015.
- With scores in back-to-back games to open the year, it marked the first time the defense scored in consecutive games since 2015, when Joshua Kalu had an interception return for a touchdown at Minnesota, and a week later the Huskers had a safety against Northwestern in Lincoln.

NEBRASKA SHOWING BALANCED OFFENSIVE ATTACK

The Nebraska offense has been balanced and efficient through five games. In the season-opening victory over UTEP, Nebraska posted its most explosive effort in the past two seasons. The Huskers backed that up with impressive outings against Colorado and UNI, scoring three first-half offensive touchdowns in each of those victories.

- Nebraska's 40 points against UTEP were its most since scoring 42 against Georgia Southern in 2022, while the 33-point margin of victory was Nebraska's largest since a 56-7 victory over Northwestern in 2021. It was the Huskers' largest margin of victory in a season opener since a 43-10 win over Fresno State to open the 2016 season.
- Nebraska has scored at least 24 points in all five games, the first time NU has had five straight games with 24 or more points since a streak spanning the 2018 and 2019 seasons. It is the first time the Huskers have scored at least 24 points in their first five games since 2016.
- The Huskers gained 507 yards of total offense against the Miners, the most by Nebraska since gaining 575 yards against Georgia Southern in 2022. The Huskers reached 339 yards before halftime, which was just 80 yards shy of last year's season high for total offense for a full game (419 vs. Louisiana Tech).
- Nebraska's 284 passing yards against UTEP were its most since throwing for 354 yards at Purdue in 2022. Nebraska's season high in passing yards in 2023 was 199 vs. Michigan. Nebraska has added passing outputs of 281 yards vs. UNI, 297 yards against Illinois and 257 yards at Purdue. The Huskers average 260.8 yards per game through the air.
- Nebraska added 223 rushing yards against UTEP with 11 players having at least one carry. The win over UTEP marked the first time Nebraska topped 200 yards in both rushing and passing since 2022 against Georgia Southern.
- The first five games have showcased Nebraska's many offensive weapons. Sixteen players have carried the ball, while 15 Huskers have caught a pass. In the opener, Nebraska had 11 ball carriers and 11 receivers, the most in both categories in a single game since 2021.

RAIOLA EFFICIENTLY GUIDING HUSKER OFFENSE

True freshman quarterback **Dylan Raiola** has been impressive in leading Nebraska to a 4-1 start. In the season opener, Raiola completed 19-of-27 passes for 238 yards and two touchdowns, while playing just one series after halftime. Raiola became just the second true freshman Husker quarterback since World War II to start a season opener, joining Adrian Martinez in 2018. Raiola earned Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors for his play in the opener.

Raiola has thrown for better than 200 yards four times, including a career-high 297 yards and three touchdowns against Illinois. Overall, Raiola has thrown for 1,224 yards and nine touchdowns against two interceptions. His passing yardage total leads all FBS freshmen and he is one of only three freshmen with more than 1,000 passing yards.

- Raiola's three touchdown passes against Illinois marked the first time a Nebraska quarterback had three touchdown passes since Casey Thompson at Iowa in 2022.
- Raiola has completed 70.4 percent of his passes to rank 11th nationally and second among freshmen. He connected on at least 70 percent in each of the first three games. He is the first Husker quarterback to complete at least 70 percent of his passes in three straight games since Jeff Quinn in 1980.
- On a national level, Raiola was the first true freshman since Marcus Mariota (2012, Oregon) to complete at least 70 percent of his passes in each of his first three games.
- Raiola was the first Husker freshman (redshirt or true) quarterback to win his first start since Taylor Martinez guided Nebraska to a victory over Western Kentucky in the 2010 season opener. Martinez won his first five starts of the 2010 season.
- The 232 yards of total offense by Raiola against UTEP compared favorably to the starting debuts of other Husker freshman quarterbacks over the past three decades.

VETERAN RECEIVERS MAKING QUICK IMPACT

Nebraska added a pair of veteran receivers through the transfer portal in the offseason. **Jahmal Banks** joined the Huskers from Wake Forest, while **Isaiah Neyor** came to Nebraska after previously playing at Texas and Wyoming. The two seniors each check in at 6-4 and 220 pounds, and have shown an immediate connection with quarterback Dylan Raiola.

- The duo has combined for 37 receptions for 543 yards and six touchdowns. Neyor has 17 catches for 291 yards and four touchdowns, while Banks has 20 catches for 252 yards and two touchdowns.
- Neyor posted his fourth career 100-yard receiving game and first since 2021 with six receptions for 121 yards and a 59-yard touchdown against UTEP. Neyor's six catches matched his career high and his 121 yards were just five yards shy of a career high. He added four catches for 31 yards against Colorado, had a TD catch against UNI, and a pair of touchdowns against Illinois. Neyor leads Nebraska in receiving yards and touchdowns.
- Banks also made his mark in the opener with four catches for 61 yards, including a 21-yard touchdown catch just two seconds before halftime. He had a pair of catches against Colorado, and one against UNI. He tied his career high with eight receptions for 94 yards against Illinois, then led Nebraska with five catches for 82 yards and a touchdown at Purdue.
- Both players have had productive collegiate careers before joining the Huskers. Banks now has 127 career catches for 1,656 yards and 15 career touchdowns. Neyor has 70 catches for 1,431 yards and 16 touchdowns in his career. Neyor averages an impressive 20.4 yards per catch in his career.

HUSKERS POSSESS VETERAN OFFENSIVE LINE

The most experienced unit on the Nebraska team entering the 2024 season was the offensive line. Husker offensive linemen combined to play in 224 career games with 153 career starts entering this season.

- According to research compiled by West Virginia's Mike Montoro, Nebraska's 178 combined offensive line starts ranks as the fifth most in the country.
- Bryce Benhart, a member of the Outland Trophy watch list, leads the way with 46 career starts, starting 46 of Nebraska's 49 games at right tackle the past four seasons. Benhart's 46 career starts are the most starts by an offensive lineman in program history.
- **Turner Corcoran** has started 35 games for the Huskers with 30 starts at left tackle, three starts at left guard and two starts at right tackle. Corcoran had started 30 consecutive games before suffering a season-ending injury against Northwestern last season. He was injured early in the Illinois game and missed Nebraska's game at Purdue.
- **Ben Scott** is in his second season as Nebraska's starting center. A member of the Rimington Trophy watch list, Scott started 11 games for the Huskers last season, and he has made 44 career starts including his three seasons at Arizona State.
- Transfer **Micah Mazzccua** joined the Huskers this season and has started 23 games in his career, including 11 starts at right guard for Florida in 2023, 10 starts at Baylor in 2022, and two games for the Huskers this season.
- Justin Evans (10 starts), Henry Lutovsky (7 starts), Gunnar Gottula (1 start) and Joey Mancino (1 start) have also started at least one game on the Nebraska offensive line. Evans has been in the starting lineup for all five games this season, with Lutovsky starting the past three contests. Gottula filled in for the injured Corcoran and made his first career start at Purdue.
- **Teddy Prochazka** has started 11 games for Nebraska, but he will miss the 2024 campaign after suffering an injury during fall camp. The injury marked the third time in four seasons that Prochazka has suffered a season-ending injury.

TRANSFERS ADD EXPERIENCE TO NEBRASKA ROSTER

Nebraska added 60 newcomers to its roster in 2024. That number includes a large freshman class of 48, but adding experience to the roster are 12 first-year transfers, including six FBS transfers.

- The group of six FBS transfers all came from Power Conference programs. The six players have combined for 186 games played and 96 starts in their careers.
- Stefon Thompson played in 37 games with 21 starts at linebacker for Syracuse. He entered the 2024 season with 169 career tackles, 20.0 tackles for loss and 10.5 sacks. Thompson owns the most tackles, TFLs and sacks of any Husker on the 2024 roster. He made his first career start at Nebraska against UNI and had six tackles and added five against Illinois.
- Micah Mazzccua started 21 games on the offensive lines at Baylor and Florida. In 2022 at Baylor, PFF ranked Mazzccua as the best run-blocker in the Big 12 and the nation's 15th-best run blocker.
- Ceyair Wright made 15 starts at cornerback for USC in 2022 and 2023, and made his first Nebraska start at Purdue. He totaled 41 tackles as a Trojan with 1.0 tackle for loss, one interception and five pass breakups. Wright saw extensive action against Illinois and responded

with six tackles, his first career sack and a fumble caused. He added a team-high five tackles and two PBU at Purdue.

- Isaiah Neyor has started 17 games in his career. He was a second-team All-Mountain West Conference selection in 2021 at Wyoming before spending two seasons at Texas. Neyor ranks second to fellow first-year transfer Jahmal Banks in career receptions, yards and touchdowns among Huskers.
- Jahmal Banks played in 43 games with 11 starts at Wake Forest before transferring to Nebraska. Banks totaled 107 receptions for 1,404 yards and 13 touchdowns as a Demon Deacon. He owns the most career receptions, receiving yards and receiving touchdowns of any current Husker.
- Dante Dowdell spent one season at Oregon before transferring to Nebraska. Dowdell had 17 carries for 90 yards and one touchdown in 2023 for a Duck team that ranked second nationally in total offense and scoring offense. Dowdell leads Nebraska with 277 rushing yards and four touchdowns, including a career-high 74 yards against Colorado and 72 yards against Illinois.

NINE HUSKERS EARN SPOTS ON PRESEASON WATCH LISTS

Nine Nebraska Cornhuskers made a preseason watch list for a major national award this summer.

- True freshman Jacory Barney Jr. was named to the watch list for The Jet Award, presented to the nation's top returner. The award is named after Husker Heisman Trophy winner Johnny Rodgers.
- **Bryce Benhart** was one of 75 linemen named to the preseason watch list for the Outland Trophy. Benhart was an honorable-mention All-Big Ten selection as Nebraska's starting right tackle in 2023. The Outland Trophy is presented annually to the nation's best interior lineman.
- Brian Buschini, the 2021 FCS Punter of the Year, was one of 33 punters named to the preseason watch list for the Ray Guy Award, which is presented annually to the nation's best punter.
- Thomas Fidone II was one of 48 tight ends named to the preseason watch list for the John Mackey Award, presented annually to the nation's best tight end. Fidone led Nebraska with four touchdown catches in 2024, the most by a Husker tight end since 2010.
- Isaac Gifford was honored for his work on the field and in the community with an appointment to the Allstate Wuerffel Trophy Watch List. Gifford led Nebraska with 86 tackles while earning honorable-mention All-Big Ten accolades. Off the field, he earned a Sam Foltz 27 Hero Leadership Award in 2024 and was named to both the Brook Berringer and Tom Osborne Citizenship teams. In September, Gifford was named a semifinalist for the Campbell Trophy and was placed on the watch list for the Jason Witten College Man of the Yar.
- Nash Hutmacher was one of 90 players and 37 defensive linemen named to the preseason watch list for the Chuck Bednarik Award, presented annually to the outstanding defensive player in college football. Hutmacher was an honorable-mention All-Big Ten selection last season.
- Dylan Raiola was named to the Polynesian College Football Player of the Year watch list and the Shaun Alexander Award Watch list.
- Isaiah Neyor was one of 93 players named to the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award watch list. The award is presented to the top offensive player who played high school or college football in Texas.
- **Ben Scott**, an honorable-mention All-Big Ten selection in 2023, was one of 40 centers named to the Rimington Trophy watch list. The Rimington Trophy named after former Husker center Dave Rimington is presented annually to the nation's top center.

NINE HUSKERS NAMED TO SENIOR BOWL WATCH LIST

A total of nine Huskers made the preseason watch list for the Reese's Senior Bowl. The Reese's Senior Bowl is widely regarded as the preeminent college football all-star game and the first stage in the NFL Draft process. The 2025 game will be played on Feb. 1 in Mobile, Ala.

• Five offensive players made the Senior Bowl watch list: wide receivers Jahmal Banks and Isaiah Neyor, tight end Thomas Fidone II and offensive linemen Micah Mazzccua and Ben Scott.

SINGLE-DIGIT NUMBERS AWARDED TO 'TOUGHEST' HUSKERS

For the second straight season, single-digit jersey numbers were awarded to the team's "toughest" players. The single-digit honorees were chosen through a players-only vote and the players then got to choose which single-digit number they wanted.

• The tradition of single-digit numbers being reserved for the chosen few dates back to Rhule's time at Temple.

"I got really tired of having a guy in my program who had spent three years at like No. 47... wanted to wear No. 1 or No. 3, and he had earned it and we would give it to a recruit," Rhule said prior to the 2023 season. "What we decided was (numbers) 1-9, now 0-9, would go to the nine or now 10 'toughest' guys on the team. When I say 'toughest', we define that for the guys, but really the guys who best exemplify what it means to be a Cornhusker. To be accountable, to be dependable, to be tough, hard-working, competitive every single day."

RHULE LOOKS FOR ANOTHER STRONG SECOND SEASON

Nebraska went 5-7 in Matt Rhule's first season. The Huskers aim to increase their win total this season, something Rhule has done at each of his previous two collegiate head coaching stops.

- In his first head coaching job at Temple, Rhule helped the Owls to a four-win improvement from his first season to his second. Then at Baylor, Rhule guided the Bears to a six-win improvement from year one to year two. That improvement ranked third nationally and was the largest win improvement of any Power Conference program that season.
- Rhule took on rebuilding jobs at Temple, Baylor and Nebraska, which contributed to an 8-28 combined record in his first season at each school. But excluding his first season at Temple, Baylor and Nebraska, Rhule boasts a 48-23 record with three 10-win seasons in six seasons.
- Rhule has a proven record as a program builder. He led both Temple and Baylor to the highest win totals in program history in his third season at each school.
- Rhule guided Temple to a pair of trips to the American Athletic Conference title game, the first two appearances in the league title game in school history. His 2016 Owl team won the school's first conference title in nearly 40 years.
- Rhule led Temple to back-to-back bowl appearances for the first time in school history in 2015 and 2016.
- At Baylor, Rhule became the first head coach at a Power Conference school to take a team from 11 losses (1-11 in 2017) to 11 victories (11-3 in 2019) in two or fewer seasons.
- The 2019 Baylor team set a school record for wins with 11 and the Bears' 9-0 start was the best in school history.

MAJORITY OF STAFF RETURNS & RULE CHANGE BOLSTERS STAFF

The Huskers returned eight of their 10 full-time assistants from last season, welcoming two new full-time assistants to the coaching staff. In addition to the two new assistants, an NCAA rule change has permitted additional staff members to provide on-field coaching.

- Donovan Raiola is in his third season at Nebraska in 2024 after being the lone assistant coach retained by Matt Rhule following the 2022 season.
- Other returning coaches on the offensive staff include offensive coordinator Marcus Satterfield (second season), running backs coach E.J. Barthel (second season) and wide receivers coach Garret McGuire (second season). The four returning offensive assistants helped the Huskers rank second in the Big Ten in rushing last season.
- Glenn Thomas is the lone new addition to the offensive staff, serving as Nebraska's guarterbacks coach and co-offensive coordinator. He came to Lincoln after one season as an offensive assistant with the Pittsburgh Steelers, helping the Steelers to a berth in the AFC playoffs in 2023.
- Thomas spent five seasons on Matt Rhule's coaching staffs at Temple and Baylor, serving as the offensive coordinator for the Owls in 2016 and as the co-offensive coordinator at Baylor from 2017 to 2019. Thomas also has recent experience as a guarterbacks coach and offensive coordinator at Arizona State (2022) and UNLV (2020-21).

- On defense, coordinator Tony White (second season) returns as does linebackers coach Rob Dvoracek (second season) and defensive line coach Terrance Knighton (second season). Last year, that trio helped Nebraska post its best scoring defense, total defense and rushing defense since the Huskers joined the Big Ten in 2011.
- John Butler is the only new defensive assistant, serving as the Huskers' secondary coach and
 pass game coordinator. Butler came to Nebraska after spending the previous six seasons as the
 defensive backs coach for the Buffalo Bills. Buffalo had a top-five pass defense rating in five of
 his six seasons, helping the Bills win four AFC North titles and make five playoff appearances.
- Special teams coordinator **Ed Foley** also returns for his second season in 2024. He helped Nebraska rank third nationally in blocked kicks in his first season last fall.
- With the removal of the NCAA rule limiting the number of on-field coaches, Matt Rhule has announced 10 more staff members who will provide additional on-field coaching this fall.

19 PLAYING 2024 SEASON AS COLLEGE GRADUATES

Nineteen Huskers are playing this season as college graduates, including 15 players who earned their degrees from Nebraska and four players who joined the Husker program as graduate transfers. In addition to the 19 players who have already graduated, 11 Huskers are on track to earn their degrees in December.

A LOOK AT NEBRASKA'S 2024 SCHEDULE

Nebraska completed non-league play at 3-0 and is in the middle of a nine-game conference schedule. The Big Ten slate includes games against UCLA and USC, both in their first season as a Big Ten member. The 2024 season marks the first time since Nebraska joined the conference in 2011 that the Big Ten will not utilize a divisional format.

- Nebraska is playing Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Ohio State, Purdue, Rutgers, UCLA, USC and Wisconsin. The Huskers do not play Maryland, Michigan, Michigan State, Minnesota, Northwestern, Oregon, Penn State or Washington.
- Nebraska opened the 2024 season at home against UTEP, marking the first season since 2019 that Nebraska played its first game of the season at home. It was also the first time since 2019 that the Huskers have opened the season against a non-conference opponent.
- The Huskers played their opener in August for the fourth straight season and for the fifth time in the past five full seasons (2020 excluded).
- Nebraska finished a four-game homestand against Illinois. The four straight home games to open the season marks the Huskers' longest season-opening homestand since 2013 (five games).
- The Huskers played three consecutive September night games. This is only the third time in program history (also 2002 and 2008) that Nebraska has had three straight night home games.
- The Big Ten opener against Illinois marked Nebraska's NCAA-record 400th consecutive sellout. It was also the Huskers' first weekday home game since 2001, when Nebraska played Rice on Thursday, Sept. 20, in a game postponed five days due to the Sept. 11 attacks.

NOTES FROM NEBRASKA'S 2023 SEASON

Nebraska entered 2024 with a goal of making significant progress in Matt Rhule's second season. Despite finishing 5-7 in 2023, Nebraska made strides in many areas. Four of the seven losses were by three points with a fifth loss by a touchdown in overtime. Due to injuries, Nebraska used three different starting quarterbacks in its five one-score losses.

- Nebraska had the program's fewest penalty yards per game (42.8) since 1998.
- The Huskers ranked among the nation's 15 most-improved teams in rushing offense, rushing defense, total defense and scoring defense. NU had the nation's No. 2 most-improved rush defense, the No. 3 most-improved total defense and the No. 10 most-improved scoring defense. Offensively, the Huskers had the 14th most-improved rushing attack from 2022 to 2023.
- Nebraska posted its best statistical rushing defense, total defense and scoring defense since joining the Big Ten in 2011. The Huskers allowed their fewest points per game (18.3) since 2010, their fewest yards per game (303.5) since 2009 and their fewest rushing yards per game (92.9) since 1999.
- NU ranked eighth nationally in rushing defense, 11th nationally in total defense and 13th nationally in scoring defense in 2023. The Huskers posted their highest national ranking in rushing defense since 1999 and best national ranking in total and scoring defense since 2010.
- Nebraska held eight opponents to 14 or fewer points in 2023, a first for the program since the 2009 season, when the Huskers led the nation in scoring defense.
- The Huskers held six of their 12 opponents in 2023 to fewer than 300 total yards, while also limiting eight of 12 opponents to fewer than 100 rushing yards.
- Nebraska totaled its most sacks (32) since 2014 and most tackles for loss (76) since 2016.
- Offensively, the Huskers ranked second in the Big Ten in rushing in 2023 (176.8 ypg).
- Nebraska also had one of the best big-play offenses in the Big Ten. The Huskers ranked second in the Big Ten with eight plays of 50 yards or longer in 2023 while leading the league in rushes of 40 yards or longer, 60 yards or longer and 70 yards or longer.
- From a special teams standpoint, Nebraska ranked third nationally with four blocked kicks in 2023. The Huskers recorded their most blocked kicks since 2014.

NEBRASKA AMONG TOP ALL-TIME PROGRAMS

Nebraska is playing its 135th football season this fall, and the Huskers have historically been one of the top programs in college football history.

- Nebraska ranks eighth in NCAA history with 921 wins and 53 all-time bowl game appearances.
- The Huskers have won five national titles. Nebraska's four Associated Press national championships (1970, 1971, 1994, 1995) rank seventh all-time and NU's four coaches poll titles (1971, 1994, 1995, 1997) rank fourth.
- Nebraska's 46 conference titles rank second in NCAA history.
- The success extends to the classroom as well. Nebraska football has produced more Academic All-Americans (108) and more NCAA Top 10 Award winners (9) than any other team in any sport in NCAA history.

HOME OF THE HUSKERS



Memorial Stadium celebrated its 100th year in 2023. In the fall of 1922, a drive for \$430,000 in stadium construction funds was undertaken by faculty, students, alumni and friends of the University.

The stadium was named Memorial Stadium to honor all Nebraskans who served in the Civil and Spanish-American Wars; the 751 Nebraskans who died in World War I; the 3,839 in World War II; the 225 in Korea; the 422 in Vietnam; and those in Irag.

Construction was completed in a few more than 90 working days and Memorial Stadium was dedicated on Oct. 20, 1923, at the Homecoming game in which Nebraska was held to a scoreless tie by Kansas.

The field at Memorial Stadium was named Tom Osborne Field - after the Huskers' legendary Hall-of-Fame coach - in 1998, one year after Osborne's retirement following 25 years and 255 victories as head coach.

2024 NEBRASKA SEASON NOTEBOOK

SCHEDULE NOTES

- Nebraska's schedule consists of three nonconference games followed by nine Big Ten contests. The 2024 season marks the first time since Nebraska joined the conference in 2011 that the Big Ten will not utilize a divisional format.
- Nebraska will play Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Ohio State, Purdue, Rutgers, UCLA, USC and Wisconsin. The Huskers will not play Maryland, Michigan, Michigan State, Minnesota, Northwestern, Oregon, Penn State or Washington.
- Nebraska played its first four games at home, marking the longest season-opening homestand since 2013 (five games).
- The Huskers played three straight home night games for only the third time in program history (also 2002 and 2008).
- The Big Ten opener against Illinois was the 400th sellout at Memorial Stadium. It also marked the first Friday night home game in school history while being the first weekday home game (excluding Black Friday) since 2001, when Nebraska played Rice on Thursday, Sept. 20, in a game postponed five days due to the Sept. 11 attacks.

COACHING STAFF NOTES

- Matt Rhule is in his second season at Nebraska in 2024. Rhule is in his 12th season as a head coach after previously leading programs at Temple (2013-16) and Baylor (2017-19) along with an NFL stint as head coach of the Carolina Panthers (2020-22).
- Rhule owns a career record of 56-51 in his eight seasons as a college head coach. He has a proven record as a program builder after taking on rebuilding projects at Temple, Baylor and Nebraska.
- Rhule's college teams have taken a step forward in his second season at each school. Temple improved by four wins in Rhule's second season in 2014 and Baylor improved by six wins in his second season in 2018, an improvement that led all power conference teams and ranked third in the FBS.
- Rhule then guided both the Owls and Bears to a school-record win total in his third season, when both teams also played in the conference championship game.
- Eight Husker assistants return from last season: Marcus Satterfield (offensive coordinator/tight ends), Tony White (defensive coordinator), Ed Foley (special teams coordinator), E.J. Barthel (running backs), Rob Dvoracek (linebackers), Terrance Knighton (defensive line), Garret McGuire (wide receivers) and Donovan Raiola (offensive line).
- John Butler (secondary/pass game coordinator) and Glenn Thomas (co-offensive coordinator/ quarterbacks) are in their first season at NU.

• Nebraska's roster features 152 players. A player's class reflects the fact that the 2020 season did not count as a year of eligibility.

- The roster features 91 returning players and 61 newcomers. Nebraska returns a total of 20 starters and 39 letterwinners.
- Nebraska has added 13 transfers and 48 true freshmen to its roster in 2024. Among the 13 transfers are seven FBS transfers, three junior college players, two FCS transfers and one NAIA transfer.
- All six of Nebraska's FBS transfers came from Power Conference programs (Florida, Oregon, Syracuse, Texas, USC and Wake Forest).
- The roster features players from 29 states and one foreign country (Germany).
- Nebraska has had a letterwinner from 47 of the 50 states in its history, missing only Idaho, New Hampshire and Rhode Island.
- States with multiple players on the Huskers' 2024 roster include: Nebraska (53), Texas (12), Iowa (8), Florida (7), Pennsylvania (7), California (6), New Jersey (5), Arizona (4), Colorado (4), Georgia (4), Missouri (4) Illinois (3), Louisiana (3), Maryland (3), Minnesota (3), New York (3), Tennessee (3), Hawaii (2), Kansas (2), Michigan (2), Mississippi (2), Montana (2) and South Dakota (2).
- The states of Alabama, North Carolina, Nevada, Utah, Washington and Wisconsin are each represented with one player on Nebraska's 2024 roster.
- The players who are wearing a single-digit jersey number (0-9) earned the right to wear that number through a team vote.

Rutgers is off to a 4-0 start after picking up a pair of three-point wins against Virginia Tech and Washington in the last two weeks.

The Scarlet Knights enter this week's game averaging 35.0 points and 428.0 yards per game, with 190.2 yards per game through the air and 237.8 yards per game on the ground. Athan Kaliakmanis has completed 59of-96 passes for 761 yards, seven touchdowns and an interception. Dymere Miller leads Rutgers with 15 receptions for 227 yards and a touchdown, followed by

Ian Strong with 12 grabs for 186 yards and a score. Kyle Monangai paces the Rutgers rushing attack with 97 carries for 589 yards and six scores. He ranks third nationally in rushing yards per game. Samuel Brown V has carried the ball 33 times for 172 yards and three touchdowns.

Defensively, the Scarlet Knights are allowing 16.2 points per game and 352.3 yards per game. Dariel Djabome leads the Rutgers defense with a team-high 36 tackles, followed by Desmon Igbinosun with 22 stops. Rutgers has totaled 14 tackles for loss, four sacks and three interceptions through four games this season.

Greg Schiano is in his fifth season back as the head coach of Rutgers. The Wyckoff, N.J., native is in his second stint with the Scarlet Knights after serving as the head coach at RU from 2001-11.

Schiano has led the Scarlet Knights to eight bowl games, including six victories. He has coached the leading rusher, passer and receiver by yards in Rutgers football history, sending all to the NFL.

Schiano served as the head coach of the Tampa Bay Buccaneers for two seasons from 2012-13. He then returned to the college ranks as the associate head coach and defensive coordinator at Ohio State from 2016-18.

SCHIANO VS. NEBRASKA

Greg Schiano will face Nebraska for the third time as a head coach on Saturday. Schiano holds an 0-2 record against the Huskers after the Big Red picked up road wins in Piscataway in 2020 and 2022.

Schiano faced NU three other times as the associate head coach and defensive coordinator with Ohio State from 2016-18. The Buckeyes claimed victories in all three of the meetings.

RUTGERS INFORMATION

Rutgers has fielded a football team since 1869 and the Scarlet Knights have tallied 675 wins as a program. Rutgers has claimed one national championship and a conference title.

The Scarlet Knights have made 12 bowl game appearances, claiming seven wins. Rutgers' last bowl game appearance came last season when the Scarlet Knights defeated Miami, 31-24, in the Pinstripe Bowl.

Matt Rhule has a proven track record as a program builder. In his first two collegiate head coaching jobs at Temple (2013-16) and Baylor (2017-19), Rhule led both the Owls and the Bears to their most victories in school history in just his third season. He also took both teams to the conference championship game in year three.

Rhule took Temple from two wins in his first season to a school-record 10 victories in both his third and fourth seasons with an appearance in the conference championship game both seasons. He then took Baylor from one win in his first season to a school-record 11 victories in his third season and an appearence in the Big 12 Championship Game and the Sugar Bowl.

Before taking the Nebrasksa job, Rhule one won conference title, three division titles and produced three seasons with double-digit wins in a five-season span (2015-19).

TAKING TEMPLE TO NEW HEIGHTS

In his tenure at Temple from 2013 to 2016, Rhule took the Owls to new heights.

- In Rhule's second season in 2014, Temple posted the program's first win over an SEC team since 1938, its first win over a ranked opponent in 16 seasons and the program's largest margin of victory in nearly 50 years.
- Rhule won 10 games in both 2015 and 2016. He is responsible for two of the three 10-win seasons in Temple's 124-year history.
- He also took the Owls to back-to-back bowl games in 2015 and 2016, the first time Temple played in a bowl in consecutive seasons.
- In 2015, Rhule led Temple to the American Athletic Conference Championship Game, the first conference title game in program history.
- The next season, Rhule guided the Owls to their second conference title in program history and the first in nearly 40 years.
- Temple has spent a total of 16 weeks ranked in the 88-year history of the Associated Press top-25 poll. More than half of those top-25 rankings (9) came under Rhule in 2015 and 2016.

AN ENCORE AT BAYLOR

At Temple, Rhule led the Owls to their highest season win total in program history, their first conference championship game appearance and an impressive run in the national rankings. He produced an encore by repeating each of those same feats in three seasons at Baylor.

- Baylor finished with 11 losses in Rhule's first season in 2017 but two years later, he guided the Bears to 11 wins in 2019. Baylor became the first Power Conference program to go from 11 losses to 11 wins in two or fewer seasons.
- Baylor won its final two games of the 2018 season and its first nine games of the 2019 campaign. The 11 straight victories marked the second-longest winning streak in school history, while Baylor's 9-0 start in 2019 was the best start in program history.
- In 2019, Rhule led Baylor to its most wins (11) in school history, the Bears advanced to their first Big 12 Championship Game and played in the Sugar Bowl for only the second time in program history.
- Baylor finished with a No. 13 ranking in 2019, the Bears' second-highest final ranking since 1951.
