HUSKERS HOST BETHUNE-COOKMAN ON SATURDAY NIGHT

The Nebraska men's basketball team looks to improve to 2-0 on the season, as the Huskers welcome Bethune-Cookman to Pinnacle Bank Arena this Saturday. Tipoff between the Huskers and Wildcats is set for 7 p.m. and tickets are available for the matchup by visiting Huskers.com/Tickets, calling 800-8-BIGRED during business hours (Mon.-Fri., 9 a.m.-4 p.m.) or at PBA beginning at 5:30 p.m.

Nebraska (1-0) comes off an 87-67 win over UTRGV on Monday night. Brice Williams' 27-point effort led four Huskers in double figures, as Nebraska pulled away after UTRGV pulled to within 69-65 with less than six minutes remaining. Connor Essegian had seven of his 13 points off the bench in the decisive 12-0 spurt as Nebraska out-scored UTRGV 18-2 over the final 5:50. Essegian went 4-of-5 from the field, including 3-of-4 from 3-point range in his Husker debut. Rollie Worster had 18 points - one off his career high - and nine rebounds while pacing NU in both steals (four) and assists (three). Andrew Morgan chipped in 10 points and five boards off the bench, as newcomers combined for 51 of the 87 points against the Vaqueros.

Nebraska relied on a solid defensive performance, as the Huskers limited UTRGV to 39 percent shooting and forced 20 turnovers which led to 26 Husker points. NU had nine steals and enjoyed a 42-32 advantage on the glass.

While the newcomers made an impact, Williams continued his strong surge dating back to last year, as his 27 points was his highest output since scoring a career-high 32 points against UAB on March 4, 2023. He is averaging 24.3 points per game in the last four contests. The 6-foot-7 guard averaged more than nine free throw attempts in that span while shooting 92 percent from the line.

Bethune-Cookman (0-1) opened the season on Tuesday with a 94-61 loss at Texas Tech. The Red Raiders shot 57 percent from the field, including 16-of-30 from 3-point range, and posted a 44-21 advantage on the glass. Reggie Ward Jr. paced Bethune-Cookman with 15 points and seven caroms while Brayon Freeman added 12 points in the loss. Ward is the only returning starter from a Wildcat squad that went 17-16 and played in the CBI in 2023-24.

9 Following his 27-point effort against UTRGV on Monday, Brice Williams has nine 25-point games in his career. The 27-point effort is the most points by a Husker in an opener since Shavon Shields had 28 vs. Florida Gulf Coast in 2013.

SCOUTING BETHUNE-COOKMAN

Bethune-Cookman comes to Lincoln with an 0-1 record after dropping Tuesday's opener at Texas Tech. The Wildcats returned one starter and four letterwinners from a team that went 17-17 last season and played in the College Basketball Invitational last season. Bethune-Cookman was picked eighth in the SWAC preseason poll and will be tested in non-conference play with trips to Texas Tech, Nebraska, Tulane, Minnesota, Virginia, West Virginia, South Florida, Davidson and Mississippi State before opening SWAC play in January.

Reggie Theus is in his fourth year at Bethune-Cookman and has improved the Wildcats' win total each season. Theus had previous stops at Cal State Northridge (2013-18) and New Mexico State (2005-07), where he guided the Aggies to the 2007 NCAA Tournament before he was hired by the Sacramento Kings. He spent parts of two seasons with the Kings, posting a 44-62 mark. As a player, Theus earned All-America honors and helped the Runnin' Rebels to the 1977 NCAA Final Four before playing 13 seasons in the NBA.

Senior forward Reggie Ward Jr. is the Wildcats' top returnee, as he started 27 of 33 games and averaged 9.6 points and 4.5 rebounds per game. He led BCU with 15 points on 7-of-10 shooting and seven boards vs. Texas Tech. The other three returnees - Seneca Willoughby, Simeon Womack and Mason Dorsey - combined for just 6.3 ppg last season. Head Coach Reggie Theus brought in an 11-man recruiting class highlighted by former Creighton forward Antwann Jones, who played at UCF last season. Jones had five points against Texas Tech but left the game early because of an injury. Forward Daniel Rouzan started 27 games at Manhattan last season, averaging 11.4 points and 4.6 rebounds per game, while Brayon Freeman was a double-figure scorer at both George Washington and Rhode Island, where he averaged 14.3 ppg in 2022-23. Freeman joined Ward in double figures on Tuesday with 12 points and three assists.

Saturday's meeting is the second meeting between the two programs, and the first since a 70-26 Husker win on Dec. 20, 2004. The 26 points by Bethune-Cookman that night is the fewest points scored by a Husker opponent since 1947. The Huskers are 29-1 against the current members of the SWAC.

LAST TIME OUT

Brice Williams scored a game-high 27 points, while Connor Essegian had seven of his 13 points off the bench in a decisive second-half run, as Nebraska defeated the University of Texas-Rio Grande Valley, 87-67 on Nov. 4.

Williams carried the Huskers with 19 first-half points, and Nebraska eventually built a 15-point second half lead before UTRGV came back. The Vaqueros whittled away the lead and pulled to within 69-65 on K.T. Raimey's basket with 5:52 left before Essegian took over. The 6-foot-4 guard started a 12-0 Husker spurt with seven unanswered points, as he hit a 3-pointer and then connected on two free throws on the next possession to push the lead to

nine with 4:13 left. Essegian then capped a personal 7-0 spurt with a driving layup to extend the lead to double figures with 3:52 left. NU, which got six straight stops, eventually extended the margin to 81-65 after a Juwan Gary basket with 2:40 left.

The Big Red had four players in double-digits, as Rollie Worster finished with 18 points, nine rebounds and four steals while Andrew Morgan added 10 markers.

OPENING NIGHT NOTES

- Nebraska improved to 88-41 (.682) all-time in season openers and has won 22 of the past 24 openers dating back to an 87-83 setback at Oral Roberts to begin the 2000 season.
- Nebraska improved to 31-4 in its past 35 season openers dating back to the 1990-91 campaign.
- Nebraska's 87 points is its highest total in a season opener since scoring 102 on McNeese State in 2020-21.
- Nebraska has won 13 straight games at home dating back to last season.
- Brice Williams finished with 27 points, his highest total as a Husker. His previous high was 25 vs. Oregon State last year.
- Williams' 27-point night was the highest by a Husker in a season opener since Shavon Shields had 28 in the first-ever game at Pinnacle Bank Arena to open the 2013-14 season.
- Williams now has four straight 20-point efforts dating back to last season's Big Ten Tournament.
- NU forced 20 turnovers, its highest total since forcing 21 turnovers vs. Kennesaw State on Dec. 22, 2021.
- NU's 35 free throws were its highest total since going to the line 36 times against Florida A&M last season.

A QUICK LOOK AT THE 2024-25 HUSKERS

Nebraska enters the 2024-25 season with a solid returning group despite the loss of Rienk Mast to season-ending surgery. The Huskers return six players - not including Mast - who saw action a season ago, including starters Brice Williams and Juwan Gary. In addition, junior guard Sam Hoiberg was one of three Huskers who played in all 34 games in 2023-24.

• Nebraska features one of the oldest rosters in the country. Of the 17 players on the 2024-25 roster, nine have played at least three seasons of college basketball. Juwan Gary, Brice Williams and Rienk Mast are all in their sixth year of college while Braxton Meah, Ahron Ulis and Rollie Worster are beginning their fifth season of college basketball. According to research by Chris Kowalczyk at VCU, Nebraska is one of 10 programs nationally with at least six players who are in their fifth year or greater in college basketball.

• Nebraska's active roster features three players who have started a combined 72 games at Nebraska entering the 2024-25 season: Juwan Gary (37); Brice Williams (34) and Sam Hoiberg (1), but that tells only part of the story. The 16 active players have combined to start 380 career games at the Division I level. That list includes Rollie Worster (101); Brice Williams (61); Andrew Morgan (59); Juwan Gary (55); Braxton Meah (47); Ahron Ulis (27); Connor Essegian (19); Berke Büyüktuncel (8) and Gavin Griffiths (3). In addition, Rienk Mast has 111 career starts, including 32 games last season at Nebraska.

• After having one active player with previous NCAA Tournament experience last season (Juwan Gary), the 2024-25 Huskers have nine players who have played in the NCAA Tournament. All seven of Nebraska's returnees saw action in the Huskers' game at Texas A&M last spring, while Ahron Ulis played in three tournaments as part

WILLIAMS LOOKS TO BUILD ON POSTSEASON SUCCESS

Senior guard Brice Williams looks to build in his postseason success as he begins the 2024-25 campaign. He proved to be a go-to scorer in the Huskers' postseason run, averaging 23.3 points per game during the Big Ten and NCAA Tournaments.

- Williams got off to a quick start to the 2024-25 season with a game-high 27 points against UTRGV.
- His 23.3 ppg after the end of the regular season is the highest by a returning Big Ten player entering 2024-25. Of the seven players who averaged 20+ ppg in the postseason, he is the only one back at a Big Ten school this season.

- Williams has more 20-point games in three postseason games (three) than in 31 regular-season games (two).

That continues Williams' trend of playing his best basketball under the brightest lights, as he is averaging 16.6 points in nine career postseason games (conference tournaments, 2023 CBI and 2024 NCAA), well above his career scoring average of 10.3 points per game. Over the last two years, that number jumps to 18.5 ppg after his 24-point effort in the NCAA Tournament against Texas A&M.

- Williams' father, Henry was the MVP of the Metro Conference Tournament in 1992, averaging 26.6 ppg in helping Charlotte to an NCAA Tournament berth.

GARY LOOKS TO MAKE 3RD YEAR JUMP

One player who could make a big jump in 2024-25 is senior Juwan Gary. Under Fred Hoiberg, the other seniors who were third-year players made significant jumps in their final year at Nebraska, as Keisei Tominaga and Derrick Walker both earned All-Big Ten honors in their third year at Nebraska after transferring into the program.

Last season, Gary averaged a career-best 11.6 points per game on nearly 50 percent from the floor. He tallied 16 double-doubles after posting 20 during his first four collegiate seasons. Gary was second on the team in rebounding at 6.1 rpg. Gary finished with nine points in NU's season-opening win.

Nebraska has won 26 straight games when out-rebounding its opponent dating back to Nov. 27, 2022, against Florida State. The Huskers were 16-0 in 2023-24 season when out-rebounding foes.

WORTH NOTING

- Jack McVeigh became the 16th Husker to play in the NBA as he made his debut in Houston's win over San Antonio on Nov. 6. McVeigh, who played professionally in Australia and Germany, played three seasons at Nebraska from 2016-18.
- Nebraska has scored 80-or-more points in each of the last five games dating back to the 2024 regular-season finale against Michigan after scoring 87 in the opener against UTRGV. The last time Nebraska scored 80-or-more points in five consecutive games was a 10-game stretch between Nov. 25-Dec. 19, 1995. The first and last games of the streak both came against new Big Ten member Oregon.
- Nebraska enters the 2024-25 season coming off one of its most successful seasons in program history. The Huskers went 23-11 in 2023-24 and tied for third in the Big Ten standings before reaching the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2013-14. The Huskers' 23 wins were the most since setting a school-record with 26 wins in 1990-91, while NU's 12 conference wins also ranked second in school history.
- Nebraska has increased its win total in each of the past three years, marking the first time NU has done that since the mid-1960s (1963-64 to 1965-66). If Nebraska can improve its win total this year, it would mark the first time since a four-year stretch from 1945-46 to 1948-49 that the Huskers improved their win total in four consecutive seasons. According to BTN Research, Nebraska was one of four teams nationally and the only team in a power conference to improve its win total by at least six games in each of the past two seasons (2022-23 and 2023-24). The others are James Madison, Lamar and South Florida.
- Over the past two seasons, NU has won 21 conference games, the highest two-year total since the 1965-66 and 1966-67 teams won 22 conference tilts. The last two seasons under Fred Hoiberg mark just the fourth time in school history that Nebraska has won 20 or more conference games in a two-year span.
- Nebraska was one of 24 teams nationally that finished in the top 50 both in offensive and defensive efficiency in KenPom. NU was one of four Big Ten programs to accomplish that in 2023-24, joining Purdue, Wisconsin and Michigan State. It marked the first time that Nebraska has been ranked in the top 50 in both offensive and defensive efficiency in the KenPom era (1996-97).
- Nebraska made its biggest jump on the offensive end in 2023-24, averaging 77.7 points per game. It is an increase of nearly nine points per game from the 2022-23 campaign and NU's highest scoring average since 1995-96 (80.2 ppg). NU climbed from 149th to 32nd nationally in offensive efficiency in KenPom. Prior to last season, NU's highest average since joining the Big Ten was 73.3 ppg in 2021-22. The Huskers are 25-8 under Fred Hoiberg when scoring at least 80 points, including 20-5 over the last three seasons.
- Nebraska looks to continue its strong work from the foul line in 2024-25. Last season, Nebraska shot 76.0 percent from the line, its highest percentage from the charity stripe since the 2011-12 team set a school record with a .766 free throw percentage. NU ranked 32nd nationally in free throw percentage in 2023-24.

BIG RED OLYMPIANS

Nebraska was one of just nine programs nationally with multiple players in men's basketball at the 2024 Olympics, as former Huskers Keisei Tominaga (Japan) and Jack McVeigh (Australia) represented their countries. It marked the second straight Olympics for Tominaga, who played 3x3 at the Tokyo Games. In addition, former Husker great Tyronn Lue served as an assistant coach for Team USA, which won its fifth consecutive gold medal in Paris.

In all, NU has had four Olympic basketball players since 2012, including Aleks Maric (2012, Australia), Ade Dagunduro (2012, Nigeria), Tominaga (2020, 2024, Japan) and McVeigh (2024, Australia).

ESSEGIAN, BÜYÜKTUNCEL: REPRESENTING IN INTERNATIONAL PLAY

In addition to the Olympians, two other Huskers spent part of their summer playing for their national teams.

Connor Essegian spent part of the summer of 2024 playing for the Armenian National Team, averaging 13.0 points and 5.5 rebounds per game as Armenia won the LA International Cup Title. He tallied 20 points on 7-of-15 shooting along with six rebounds and three steals in the win over Ireland in the title game.

Berke Büyüktuncel spent the summer playing for his native Türkiye at the European U20 Championships, averaging 12.0 points and a team-high 7.7 rebounds in seven games. He shot 51 percent from the field, including 54 percent from 3-point range and posted two double-doubles in the tournament.

HUSKERS FROM AROUND THE WORLD

Nebraska's roster has had an international flavor in recent seasons and that trend continues in 2024-25 with Berke Büyüktuncel (Bursa, Türkiye) and Rienk Mast (Groningen, Netherlands) on the Husker roster. During Fred

HUSKERS IN THE NBA

A trio of former Nebraska Cornhuskers were on opening night rosters for the 2024-25 season. Dalano Banton and Bryce McGowens are teammates on the Portland Trail Blazers, while Jack McVeigh is a rookie with the Houston Rockets. It is the fourth straight season that Nebraska has had multiple players on NBA rosters.

Banton comes off his best season as a professional, averaging 10.3 points 3.3 rebounds and 2.4 assists per game while splitting time with both the Boston Celtics and Portland Trailblazers. He flourished after his trade with Portland, averaging 16.7 points, 4.8 rebounds and 3.6 assists per game in 30 games. Banton begins his fourth NBA season after being a second-round pick in 2021. After sitting out the 2019-20 campaign, Banton played in all 27 games, including 22 starts, for the Huskers in 2020-21, averaging 9.6 points per game while leading the Huskers in both rebounding (5.9) and assists (3.9) per game. He was the first Husker since 1974 to lead NU in both rebounding and assists in the same season. Banton posted the second triple-double in school history with 13 points, 11 rebounds and 10 assists in just 21 minutes against Doane and totaled 14 games in double figures.

McGowens begins his third NBA season, as he is on a two-way contract with the Trail Blazers after signing with the organization over the summer. McGowens spent the first two years with the Charlotte Hornets, playing in 105 career games and averaging 5.2 points, 1.9 rebounds and 1.0 assists per game. McGowens was the No. 40 overall pick in 2022, the highest drafted Husker since 1998. At Nebraska, he was a third-team All-Big Ten performer as a freshman in 2021-22, averaging a team-high 16.8 points and 5.2 rebounds per game. An eight-time Big Ten Freshman of the Week, McGowens had 11 games with 20-or-more points, including a season-high 29 points against both Sam Houston and Rutgers.

McVeigh is with the Houston Rockets after signing a two-way contract prior to the 2024 Paris Olympics. He played in a pair of preseason games for the Rockets, averaging 7.5 ppg on 60 percent shooting and 3.0 rebounds per game. This is his rookie season after he played professionally in Australia and Germany, and he became the 16th Husker to play in the NBA when he made his debut on Nov. 6, 2024. McVeigh comes off a strong performance in the 2024 Olympics, averaging 9.5 points per game on 52 percent shooting, including 10-of-19 (.526) from 3-point range. McVeigh played three seasons at Nebraska before returning home to begin his professional career. His best year was in 2016-17, when he averaged 7.5 points and 2.5 rebounds per game in 30 games, including 11 starts. He was a member of the Huskers' 2017-18 team that won 23 games, including a school record 13 conference games.

In addition to the three former Husker players in the NBA, Tyronn Lue is in his fifth season as head coach of the Los Angeles Clippers. Lue, who played at Nebraska from 1996-98, has guided the Clippers to an 184-134 record and three postseason appearances in his four seasons. Last year, he coached Los Angeles to a Pacific Division title. Before taking the Clippers job, Lue led the Cleveland Cavaliers to a 128-83 record, three NBA Finals appearances and the franchise's first NBA title in 2016.

DOUBLE-DIGIT RUNS IN 2023-24

After having 23 double-figure runs in 2023-24, the Huskers recorded their first double-figure run this season in Monday's opener. NU went on a 12-0 second-half run to pull away from UTRGV.

HUSKER COACHING STAFF

- Nate Loenser is in his fourth season on the Husker staff. He joined the Husker program after spending five seasons with the Chicago Bulls organization. Loenser was an assistant coach for the Bulls under both Fred Hoiberg and Jim Boylan for three seasons. He also served as the Bulls' video coordinator and head coach of the Windy City Bulls. Loenser worked with Hoiberg at Iowa State for two seasons.
- Adam Howard is in his third year on the coaching staff. He was selected to participate in the 2023 and 2024 TopConnect Basketball Symposiums, an event featuring some of the nation's top assistant coaches. Prior to joining the NU staff, he spent four years at South Alabama, helping the program to 75 wins in that span after the program had seven straight losing seasons. In 2021-22, South Alabama won 21 games, the school's highest total since 2008. Howard also coached at Troy, Tennessee, Southern Miss and Morehead State after playing collegiately at Western Kentucky.
- Ernie Zeigler is in his third year at Nebraska. He joined the NU staff in August of 2022 after spending six years on Ben Howland's staff at Mississippi State. The Bulldogs had four postseason appearances between 2018-22. Zeigler spent six seasons as the head coach at Central Michigan (2007-12) and previously served stints at UCLA, Pittsburgh, Kansas State, Detroit, and Bowling Green. He helped UCLA to an NCAA runner-up appearance in 2006.

Nebraska is 14-1 at home in non-conference play over the last two-plus seasons and is 27-9 (.750) at home in non-conference action in Fred Hoiberg's six seasons at Nebraska.

Hoiberg's six seasons, NU has had players on the roster from 13 countries, including the United States, Australia, Canada, England, France, Iceland, Japan, Lithuania, Mali, Senegal and Slovenia.

HOME SWEET HOME

The Huskers finished with an 18-1 record inside Pinnacle Bank Arena in 2023-24, setting a single-season mark for home wins in a season.

- Following Monday's win over UTRGV, Nebraska has won 12 straight at home dating back to last season.

• The .947 mark in 2023-24 was NU's best home mark by winning percentage since 1965-66 when NU went 11-0 at home. NU was a perfect 10-0 at home in Big Ten Conference play, marking the third time NU has posted an unblemished home conference mark since World War II (also 1965-66, 2017-18).

• Nebraska filled up Pinnacle Bank Arena in 2023-24, averaging 14,597 fans per game to rank 15th nationally. Nebraska has ranked in the top-15 nationally in every season but one since Pinnacle Bank Arena opened in 2013-14. In all, seven of the top 25 schools in average attendance came from the Big Ten Conference.

TALL TALES

Braxton Meah gives the Huskers the luxury of a seven-footer on the roster. At 7-foot-1, the Washington transfer is the tallest Husker on the roster since Sergej Vucetic during the 2012-13 and 2013-14 seasons. Meah led the Huskies in field goal percentage (.770) and blocked shots (27) last season.

LONG RANGE SUCCESS

NU led the Big Ten and finished 26th nationally with 9.4 3-pointers per game. Nebraska set a school record with 319 3-pointers, shattering the previous mark of 270 set in 2018-19. NU's 9.4 3-pointers per game was the program's highest per game average since setting a school mark with 9.5 3-pointers per game in 2001-02. A Hoiberg-coached team has led its conference in 3-pointers per game five times in 10 years, while three of NU's four highest per game totals in program history have come during Hoiberg's five seasons at Nebraska.

TICKETS ON SALE NOW

Husker fans can now purchase individual game tickets for the 2024-25 Nebraska men's basketball season. The Nebraska Athletic Ticket Office announced that 300 Level Tickets for all 17 matchups are now on sale. The Big Ten Conference games are priced at \$17 apiece (including fees), while the non-conference games are priced at \$12 per game (including fees). Tickets can be purchased by visiting Huskers.com/Tickets or calling the Nebraska Athletic Ticket Office at 800-8-BIG-RED during business hours (9 a.m.-4 p.m., Monday-Friday).

The home schedule includes 10 Big Ten Conference matchups, including games against defending Big Ten Tournament champion Illinois, postseason qualifiers Iowa, Minnesota and Ohio State. Indiana (17), UCLA (22) and Rutgers (25) were all in the AP Preseason Top 25, while Illinois, Ohio State, Michigan and Maryland received votes in the preseason AP poll.

In addition to single-game tickets, a pair of other options are currently available for the 2024-25 season. Season tickets start at \$153 for all 17 contests, while the Starting 5 Mini Plan is on sale for \$50. The Starting 5 Plan allows fans to pick any two conference games and three of the non-conference games.

NEBRASKA HEAD COACH FRED HOIBERG

NEBRASKA (2019-PRESENT)

- Hired as Nebraska's 28th men's basketball coach on March 30, 2019, a position his grandfather (Jerry Bush) held for nine seasons from 1954 to 1963.
- Named Jim Phalen National Coach of the Year and shared Big Ten Coach-of-the-Year honors (coaches and media) in 2024.
- Coached Nebraska to a third-place finish in the Big Ten in 2023-24, the highest conference finish by NU since 1992-93.
- Guided Nebraska to its first NCAA Tournament appearance since 2014.
- Led Nebraska to its fourth win over a No. 1 team in school history and first time since 1982 (1/9/24 vs. No. 1 Purdue).
- Is the only coach in school history with two road wins against top-10 teams (2021-22 at No. 10 Wisconsin; 2022-23 at No. 7 Creighton).
- Guided Nebraska to three consecutive road wins over ranked opponents (No. 23 Ohio State and No. 10 Wisconsin in 2021-22 and No. 7 Creighton in 2022-23) for the first time in school history.
- Had NBA Draft Picks in both 2021 (Dalano Banton) and 2022 (Bryce McGowens) and has produced 12 players who have reached the NBA.

CHICAGO BULLS (2015-18)

- Coached the Chicago Bulls for three-plus seasons, posting a 115-155 record.
- Became just the fifth coach in franchise history to post a winning record in his debut season.
- Took the Bulls to the 2017 NBA Playoffs where they won the first two games against the top-seeded Boston Celtics, as the Bulls were the first No. 8 seed to take a 2-0 lead against a No. 1 seed since 1993.
- Was the fifth coach in NBA history to have each of his first two career playoff victories come on the road.

IOWA STATE (2010-15)

- Served as head coach at his alma mater for five seasons, posting a 115-56 record, which is the top winning percentage in school history (.673).
- Led the Cyclones to four straight NCAA Tournament appearances - a program record - while his 115 wins were the most in a five-year stretch in school history.
- Guided Iowa State to back-to-back Big 12 Tournament titles in 2014 and 2015.
- Produced four All-Americans, 12 All-Big 12 honorees and 10 players who played in the NBA.
- Named Big 12 Coach of the Year in 2012, as the Cyclones went from three conference wins to 12 in one season.
- Won 28 games and reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2014.
- Led the Big 12 in scoring offense in two of his last four seasons and topped the conference in 3-pointers four times in five years.

MINNESOTA TIMBERWOLVES (2005-10)

- Served as Vice President of Basketball Operations in 2009-10, overseeing the day-to-day operations of basketball programs including college and pro scouting, salary cap management and NBA Draft preparations.
- Was the Assistant General Manager for three seasons, helping the Timberwolves orchestrate a draft-day trade for five-time all-star Kevin Love in 2008.

AS AN NBA PLAYER (1995-2005)

- Spent 10 years in the NBA with the Indiana Pacers (four seasons), Chicago Bulls (four seasons) and Minnesota Timberwolves (two seasons) after being selected in the second round of the 1995 NBA Draft.
- Was a member of three NBA Playoff Teams, including a Timberwolves team that reached the 2004 Western Conference Finals.
- Shot 40 percent from 3-point range during his career and led the NBA in 3-point shooting in his final season (48.3, 2004-05).
- Ended his NBA career abruptly at the age of 33 after undergoing open-heart surgery to repair an aneurysm in his aortic root.

AS A PLAYER AT IOWA STATE (1991-95)

- Started all four seasons at Iowa State, averaging 15.8 points, 6.9 rebounds, 2.8 assists and 1.6 steals per game in his collegiate career.
- His No. 32 was retired by Iowa State in 1997 and Hoiberg is a member of the Iowa State Hall of Fame.
- Garnered third-team All-America honors as a senior in 1994-95, averaging 19.9 points per game to help the Cyclones win a then-school-record 23 games and was named Big Eight Co-Male Athlete of the Year in 1995.
- Two-time Academic All-American who was inducted into the CSC Academic Hall of Fame in 2016.

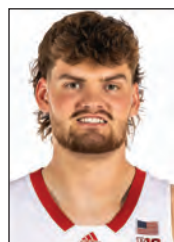

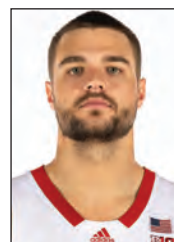
