MEN'S GYMNASTICS EVENTS



FLOOR EXERCISE

The entire floor area must be used during the exercise, which consists primarily of three to five tumbling passes performed in different directions. The new NCAA scoring system requires gymnasts to include non-acrobatic elements, acrobatic forward, backward and sideward elements and a dismount. The exercise must also contain elements of balance, strength, jumps and leg circles. The area of the floor exercise mat is 40 feet by 40 feet.

POMMEL HORSE

The gymnast must cover all three areas of the horse, the middle and both ends, while performing continuous circular movements interrupted only by the required scissor element. The only parts of the body that should touch the apparatus are the hands. The entire exercise should flow with a steady, controlled rhythm. Considered by many to be the most difficult of all men's gymnastics events, the pommel horse is also the most subtle. Each move is defined by complex hand placements and body positions. NCAA rules require gymnasts to include single leg work, circles, spindles and handstands, side and cross travels, kehres and wendeswings and a dismount. The pommel horse stands 42 inches high as measured from the top of the mat to the top of the apparatus.



STILL RINGS

The ring routine must include a swing to a handstand, swing to a strength element and a static strength skill. The exercise must also include kip and swing portions that may not lead to a held position. Examples of strength elements include a cross, an inverted cross or a planche. The rings should be absolutely still and in control at the end of each skill. The rings are 100 inches from the top of the mat.

VAULT

Each individual vault is categorized in the Code of Points, the official text giving relevant value of each skill performed. During the pre-flight from the springboard to the horse, the body must maintain proper form, i.e. legs together and straight. During the second flight, from the horse to the landing, the gymnast's body must rise and show a complete body extension before landing. The landing should be firm, without extra steps, and in line with the horse. The men's vault stands 53 inches high. The runway is a maximum of 82 feet long.



PARALLEL BARS

A parallel bar routine consists of swinging, flight and hold elements. The gymnast is required to execute swinging skills which originate from a support, a hang below the bars and an upper arm hang. Also required is at least one skill from the strength, leg swing and side bar element group. The parallel bars stand 70 inches high.



HIGH BAR

The routine on the high bar consists exclusively of swinging parts without stops. The gymnast must execute at least one move in which he releases and re-grasps the bar, and must perform at least one giant with either his back to the bar or with an "eagle" grip in which the wrists are rolled outward until the thumbs are on the outside. The gymnast is also required to perform an "in bar" skill like a stalder circle. The bar is 100 inches from the top of the mat.



MEN'S GYMNASTICS SCORING

HISTORY:

Prior to 2005, both men's and women's gymnastics used the well-known scoring system with a top score of a "perfect 10." However, in 2005, gymnastics officials created a new scoring system for men's gymnastics. In this new system, there is no limit to the score a gymnast can achieve for his routine. The top performances in men's gymnastics right now are receiving scores in the 15s and, occasionally, the low 16s.

There are three components used in judging a men's gymnastics routine: difficulty, element groups and execution.

THE DIFFICULTY SCORE:

There are nine countable skills, plus a dismount. Skill values range from A to H, with A being the easiest and H being the hardest. (A: 0.1, B: 0.2, C: 0.3, D: 0.4, E: 0.5, F: 0.6, G: 0.7, H: 0.8). Judges will add the values of the 10 skills together to get the gymnasts' difficulty score.

Example Routine: E(0.5) D(0.4) C(0.3) C(0.3) D(0.4) B(0.2) A(0.1) B(0.2) B(0.2) D(0.4) equals a difficulty score of 3.0.

ELEMENT GROUPS:

There are four different element groups on each event and each group is worth 0.5. For each of the element groups that a gymnast fulfills, he receives 0.5. If all four element groups are fulfilled, a gymnast will receive 2.0.

EXECUTION SCORE:

Each gymnast automatically starts with an execution score of 10.00. Judges can take the following deductions from that 10.00 score:

Small Error 0.1 (little step, small leg separation, slight knee bend, slight arm bend)

Medium Error 0.3 (big step, medium leg separation, medium knee bend, medium arm bend)

Large Error 0.5 (large leg separation, large knee bend, large arm bend)

Fall 1.0 (falling off apparatus)

The totals of these three components are added together to reach a start value:

Execution Score	10.0
Element Groups	2.0
+ Difficulty Score	3.0
= Start Value	15.0

If the gymnast had 0.9 points taken off for execution errors, the execution score would be 9.1 and the final score would look like this:

Execution Score	9.1
Element Groups	2.0
+ Difficulty Score	3.0
= Final Score	14.1

WHAT TO LOOK FOR:

Though the scoring system is complicated, fans can still identify great routines without knowing everything about the scoring system. When watching a routine, be sure to look for:

Good Form and Execution: A gymnast should always look as though he is in complete control, even when performing the most difficult of skills. Good form in gymnastics includes pointed toes, straight arms and legs and a tightness throughout the body. Every movement should look planned.

Strength Moves Held Long Enough: On the still rings and on floor, the gymnast must stay in position for two seconds on each strength move (e.g. an iron cross).

Height and Distance: In tumbling passes, vaults and release moves, the gymnast should look as if he is exploding off the apparatus. On vault, the distance a gymnast travels from the horse is also a factor in his final score.

A Stuck Landing: On vaulting, dismounts, and tumbling passes on floor, the gymnast should end with a "stuck landing" -- he should not move his feet once they hit the ground. The gymnast is not allowed to lunge backward out of tumbling passes. (The women used to be able to do this without deduction, but it is now considered an error in women's artistic as well).

Uniqueness of the Routine: A great gymnast will perform a routine that looks different from the rest. It will have something special about it -- risky tricks, an artistic flair or skills that are simply unique from others performed in the competition.

Media Parking: Parking for the media is in lot 52 on the south side of the Devaney Center. Handicap parking is primarily on the East side of the Devaney Center.

Devaney Center Directions: The Bob Devaney Sports Center is located on the west edge of the Innovation Campus. To reach it from the Lincoln Municipal Airport, turn right on Northwest 12th Street as you drive out of the airport. Northwest 12th Street becomes Cornhusker Highway, which intersects with 14th Street. Exit south on 14th Street off Cornhusker Highway. Travel to Military Avenue and turn left. Continue a half mile and enter the Innovation Campus. Take the first right turn before the Devaney Center and follow the access road to Lot 52 on the South Side of the arena. From Omaha's Eppley Airfield, follow the signs to downtown Omaha and I-480. Take I-480 west to I-80, then take I-80 west approximately 60 miles to I-180. Exit south on I-180, then exit east to Cornhusker Highway and follow the instructions above.

The best time for in-season interviews is after practice in the practice gym. Practice is typically held from 2 to 5 p.m at the Devaney Center. For post-meet interviews, Nebraska gymnasts and coaches are generally available on the gym floor immediately following the presentation of team and individual event awards. The best time to reach Coach Chuck Chmelka is weekdays from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. Interviews with Coach Chmelka should be coordinated through Lauren Karlin in the Communications Office at (402) 472-2263 or (913) 747-5787 or by e-mail at lkarlin3@huskers.unl.edu.

Media Services: Pre-meet notes and media guides will be provided before each meet. Final results will be available following each meet in the press room. Press row for most Nebraska gymnastics meets is located on the south sideline of the gym floor. The Devaney Center media work room is located off the southwest corner of the floor level, across from the interview room.

HEAD COACH | 16TH SEASON

Coach Chmelka enters his 16th season as Nebraska's head coach prepared to lead the Huskers through their 15th season in the Big Ten in 2024. In his last 15 years as NU's head coach, he helped produce 10 top-10 NCAA finishes and 22 All-Americans. Chmelka looks to continue leading the Huskers to become

one of the nation's top programs in the years to come. In 2024, Chuck Chemelka produced five All-Americans (Taylor Christopulos, Zac Tiderman, Cooper Giles, Asher Cohen, Sam Phillips). Chmelka led the Huskers to their first regular Big Ten season title. Chemelka also coached the team to a fourth-place finish at the NCAA Championships.

In 2023, Chmelka produced three All-Americans (Taylor Christopulos, Donte McKinney, Zac Tiderman) and a fifth-place finish at the NCAA Championships. Chmelka also led the Huskers to a third place finish at the Big Ten Conference Championships.

In 2022, Chmelka produced two All-Americans (Dillan King, Donte McKinney) and a fourth-place finish at the NCAA Championships. He led the Huskers to a second-place finish at the Big Ten Championships, tying for the best finish since joining the conference.

In 2021, Chmelka produced four All-Americans (Taylor Christopulos, Charlie Giles, Evan Kriley, Mitch Tyndall). Chmelka led the Huskers to their best conference finish since joining the Big Ten, taking second. The season was highlighted by a first-place finish at the NCAA Qualifiers and a fourthplace finish at the NCAA Finals.

In 2020, Chmelka produced one regular season All-American (Jake Bonnay) despite the season ending early due to the coronavirus pandemic. Nebraska was on track to reach the NCAA Championship Finals for the fourth year in a row. The Huskers finished the season ranked fourth in the CGA Coaches

In 2019, Chmelka led the Huskers to their best finish since 1999, as the team finished third nationally. Chmelka produced five All-Americans who earned six All-America awards (Jake Bonnay, Charlie Giles, Khalil Jackson, Josh Martin, Anton Stephenson). He coached Anton Stephenson to his third Big Ten vault title.

In 2018, Chmelka led the Huskers to a fifth-place finish at the NCAA Championships with four All-Americans. He also developed the vault program, as Anton Stephenson placed second at the NCAA Championships and earned the gold medal at the Big Ten Championships. Chmelka also had

and earned the gold medal at the Big Ien Championships. Chmelka also had three Huskers place in the top three at the Big Ten Championships (Anton Stephenson, Jake Bonnay, Kyle King).

In 2017, Chmelka led the Huskers to the team finals at the NCAA Championships for the first time since 1999, as Nebraska finished sixth nationally, Chmelka produced two All-Americans (Austin Epperson, Kyle King) both on floor. Additionally, Anton Stephenson claimed the vault title at the Big Ten Championships, becoming Chmelka's first conference winner and NU's first Big Ten Champion. Chmelka also helped Chris Stephenson claim NCAA Gymnast-of-the-Week accolades.

In 2016, the team shattered school records nearly every week, including total team score, total floor score (twice), total pommel horse score (twice) and total high bar score. Individually, Ethan Lottman and Kyle King broke the program record on pommel horse (15.55) and floor (15.85) respectively. The Huskers made a run in the postseason as well. Daniel Leal placed second on parallel bars at the Big Ten Championships. At the NCAA Championships, the team finished seventh. Four gymnasts took home All-America honors (Ethan Lottman, Sam Chamberlain, Austin Epperson, Anton Stephenson). It was the first time since 1998 that four gymnasts brought home an All-America honors. In 2015, Chmelka helped the Huskers overcome several health issues

during the season. Junior Ethan Lottman erupted for a breakout year under Chmelka, earning All-America honors on pommel horse at the NCAA event finals. Lottman also captured the Elite 90 Award and was a CSC Academic All-American.

In 2014, the Huskers finished strong despite being plagued with injuries early. Senior Wyatt Aycock led the team in the all-around, earning his second All-America honor. Over the course of the season, 15 Huskers tied or set career highs on individual events. These achievements helped pave the way for NU's eighth-place finish at the NCAA Championships.

In 2013, Chmelka produced three All-Americans (Wyatt Aycock, Grant Perdue, Sam Chamberlain). This trio became NU's 48th, 49th and 50th All-Americans since 1975. At the time, the three All-America awards were the most earned in a eason for the Huskers since 1999.

In 2012, Chmelka led the Huskers to their first season in the tradition-rich Big Ten Conference. Under Chmelka's leadership, NU completed its inaugural Big Ten season with a 10th-place finish at the NCAA Championships paced by freshman All-American Grant Perdue.

In 2011, the Huskers continued to build by posting another top-10 national finish despite a lineup made up of primarily first- and second-year gymnasts.

In his first season as head coach, Chmelka helped the Huskers return to the national top 10 by tying for ninth with a veteran team in 2010.

Before the 2010 season, Chmelka replaced legendary NU coach Francis Allen, an icon of U.S. men's gymnastics.

Prior to becoming head coach, Chmelka served as an assistant under Allen (1986-2009), and assisted with three of the Huskers' eight national team championships. Since Chmelka joined the staff in 1986, he has coached Nissen-Emery Award winners Wes Suter (1986) and Tom Schlesinger (1988) and helped Nebraska win eight conference titles. Chmelka was named the 2007 CGA West Region Assistant Coach of the Year and was a finalist for the 2009 CGA West Region Award.

Chmelka competed at Nebraska from 1978 to 1981 and was a member of NU's first three national championship teams in 1979, 1980 and 1981.
Since 1982, Chmelka has been the program director and head coach for the Nebraska School of Gymnastics (NSG) boys' team, producing Nebraska All-Americans Dusty Jakub, Blake Bukacek, Derek Leiter, Ryan McEwen, Burkett Powell and Jason Christie. NSG athletes have competed in the Junior Pan American Games, Junior Olympic Nationals, Olympic Festival and have traveled abroad for various competitions (Junior Pacific Alliance Championships and USA vs. Canada).

After completing his eligibility at NU, Chmelka was a volunteer assistant coach while finishing his bachelor's degree in community health, which he earned in 1982. In 1988, Chmelka added a bachelor's degree in education.

An Omaha South graduate and product of Omaha Sokol and the legendary Phil Cahoy Sr., Chmelka was a high school and collegiate teammate of Husker Olympians Jim Hartung and Phil Cahoy Jr.

One of gymnastics most highly decorated competitors of all time, Jim Hartung enters his 20th season as a Nebraska assistant coach in 2025 Hartung has dedicated his life to bettering the sport he loves. Over the last 33 years, Hartung has worked in all aspects of the gymnastics community from competing to judging and now coaching and has earned a level of success paralleled by few in his field.

Hartung garnered All-America status on five of six events during his freshman season and went on to amass a total of 22 All-America awards and seven NCAA individual titles over the next of 22 All-America awards and seven NCAA individual titles over the 1824, three years. His accolades included a pair of all-around titles in 1980 and 1981. Hartung led the Huskers to their first four NCAA team titles and consequently became Nebraska's first Nissen-Emery Award winner in 1982. The Omaha native finished his collegiate career as the most highly

decorated gymnast in Nebraska history.

His tremendous collegiate career led Hartung to the Olympics, as he was first selected to the U.S. team in 1980. Hartung repeated the honor in 1984 after graduating from NU. He helped the United States to its first and only team gold medal at the summer games in Los Angeles, California.

After competing in the Olympics as an athlete, Hartung went on to spend nearly a decade as a visitation coach for the U.S. national team and became one of the top 10 gymnastics judges in the world.

Hartung has four children, Jim, Nick, Jake and Hannah.

Troy Dannen, a leading voice in collegiate athletics with extensive experience as an athletic director and deep ties to the Midwest, is in his first year

as Nebraska's Director of **HUSKER ATHLETIC DIRECTORS** Athletics. Dannen was hired H.D. Gish on March 20, 2024, and has hit Dana X. Bible the ground running in Lincoln. Lawrence McCeney

Nebraska Athletics enjoyed success during Dannen's first championship season, as the Husker baseball program won its first Big Ten Tournament title and reached the 40-win plateau for the first time since 2014 while the Husker track teams put together impressive showings. The Husker men won the Big Ten Outdoor title and earned their best NCAA Championship finish since 2016 with a 13th-place finish, while the Husker women posted their second straight top-10 NCAA finish and placed ninth

at the national meet. Nebraska finished 22nd in the final 2023-24 Learfield Director's Cup, the program's highest finish since 2010.

Dannen has been a leader in charting the course for a new era of collegiate athletics, serving from 2021 to 2023 as a member of the NCAA Constitution Committee and the Division I Transformation Committee. Dannen also previously served as the chair of the NCAA Football Competition Committee and was an Executive Committee member of the Football Oversight Committee. In total, Dannen has served on seven NCAA committees.

In 2022, Dannen was a finalist for Sports Business Journal's Athletic Director of the Year award, and he received the Distinguished American Award from the Sugar Bowl Chapter of the National Football Foundation.

Dannen came to Lincoln after serving as Director of Athletics at the University of Washington. He helped guide the Huskies' transition to the Big Ten Conference and oversaw a football program that reached the College Football Playoff National Championship Game in January of 2024.

He arrived at Washington in the fall of 2023 after serving as Director of Athletics at Tulane University since 2015. While at Tulane, Green Wave student-athletes earned 49 All-America honors, a national championship, 21 conference championships and 41 postseason appearances.

In 2022-23, Tulane football won its first American Athletic Conference football championship and won the Cotton Bowl over USC, which was ranked ninth in the nation at that time. The men's basketball program won 20 regular-season games for the first time in two decades. Additionally, men's tennis advanced to its sixth NCAA Tournament in seven years, both bowling and beach volleyball finished ranked in the top 20, and baseball won the conference championship.

Tulane's football program participated in an unprecedented three consecutive bowl games from 2018 to 2020, winning back-to-back bowl games for the first time in 128 years of football at the University.

In the classroom, Tulane student-athletes excelled at a high-level. At the end of the 2022-23 academic year, over 68 percent of Green Wave student-athletes earned a 3.0 GPA or better, with a 93 percent Graduation Success Rate and a record-setting department Academic Progress Report of 992, with seven teams earning a perfect 1000 APR score.

Dannen spearheaded fundraising efforts and numerous capital projects at Tulane. He helped secure the largest unrestricted gift in Tulane Athletics history, an endowment gift that funded the operation of a new sport (sailing), and a \$10 million lead gift for capital renovations, which was the secondlargest gift in department history. In addition, marketing and licensing revenue grew four-fold, and in 2022-23, Tulane football, basketball and volleyball set ticket sales and revenue records. Under Dannen's leadership, the Green Wave Club Annual Fund grew by 40 percent in terms of donors, and 45 percent in terms of dollars.

Increases in fundraising and major gift donors positively impacted capital project development and completion. A \$13 million renovation to the Reilly Natatorium, home of the swimming and diving program, as well as \$8 million in renovations to locker rooms and the sports medicine area inside the Wilson Center were completed in 2023. Dannen also oversaw construction of a new dining facility, weight room, basketball and volleyball locker rooms. Tulane also completed a \$2.4 million academic center renovation and a \$5 million television and digital production center.

Dannen came to Tulane after serving eight years as the Director of Athletics at the University of Northern Iowa (UNI) from 2008 to 2015. During his tenure, the Panthers enjoyed success at both the conference and national levels, highlighted by an NCAA Sweet 16 appearance in 2010 by the UNI men's basketball team. During his eight-year tenure, UNI was recognized with 39 All-Americans, 13 Coaches of the Year and nine Missouri Valley Conference (MVC) Players of the Year. UNI football, men's basketball, women's basketball, volleyball and softball combined to reach 15 NCAA tournaments and 20 postseason berths during that stretch. For his efforts, Dannen was recognized as NACDA's FCS Athletic Director of the Year in 2014.

Prior to his time at UNI, Dannen served as the Iowa Girls High School Athletic Union's Executive Director for seven years, overseeing 400 high

Dannen grew up on a farm just outside Marshalltown, Iowa, and graduated from UNI in 1989 with a degree in communications. He is married to Amy, and they have four children: Elle, Emily, Holly and William.

Dr. Rodney D. Bennett is the 21st chancellor of the University of Nebraska–Lincoln, Nebraska's flagship, Land-Grant and Big Ten institution. He is a 30-year veteran of higher education with a track record of

growing research, increasing student success and building impactful partnerships.

Chancellor Bennett came to Nebraska after nine years of successful

leadership at the University of Southern Mississippi. During his tenure as president, USM was reclassified from a Carnegie R2 to an R1 university, signaling growth in research prestige and funding. Dr. Bennett also invested in programs to support student recruitment, retention and outcomes. including for the 30 percent of USM students who were first-generation. His efforts led to an improvement in the university's six-year graduation rate.

While at USM, Dr. Bennett established new faculty positions in highgrowth areas and increased the average salary for full-time faculty; oversaw \$300 million in facilities work; and launched the largest fundraising campaign in the University of Southern Mississippi's history. He was a strong champion of the

Division I athletics program, investing in new facilities and programs to support student-athletes, including a dedicated mental health counselor to serve student-athletes. Throughout his time as president, he brought a conservative approach to budget management, meeting or exceeding the budgetary goals set by the Mississippi Institutions of Higher Learning Board of Trustees.

Prior to his role at the University of Southern Mississippi, Dr. Bennett served at the University of Georgia for more than a decade. He was the senior administrator for student programs and services for Georgia's 34,000-plus students; oversaw \$150 million in capital projects; and made key staff and programmatic investments in extracurriculars, mental health programs and other areas to better support students.

Dr. Bennett has also been the dean of students at Winthrop University in Rock Hill, South Carolina, and associate dean of student life at Middle Tennessee State University.

Chancellor Bennett values community leadership and service. He has served on numerous boards, including the Mississippi Aquarium, Northeast Georgia Girl Scouts of America, Catholic Health East (Philadelphia), and St. Mary's Health Care System in Athens, Georgia. He is a member of Kappa Alpha Psi fraternity and Past Sire Archon for Sigma Pi Phi fraternity, The Boulé.

Dr. Bennett earned a bachelor's degree in mass communication, a master's degree in educational administration, and an education specialist degree from Middle Tennessee State. He earned his Doctor of Education degree from Tennessee State University.

He and his wife, Temple, are the parents of two adult daughters, Colby and Logan.

Scott M. Fuess Jr. was named the University of Nebraska-Lincoln faculty athletics representative on Feb. 21, 2020. He officially began his new role on July 1, 2020.

As faculty athletics representative, Fuess serves as a liaison between the Office of the Chancellor and Athletic Department. Areas of focus in the role include the welfare of student-athletes, maintaining the positive relationship between athletics and faculty, NCAA compliance, developing and responding to NCAA legislative proposals and representing the university at related NCAA and Big Ten Conference meetings.

The half-time position - which was restructured to an expected term of five years - reports directly to Chancellor Ronnie Green and consults with Athletic Director Bill Moos. The representative splits academic year time equally between academic responsibilities and faculty representative duties.

"The faculty athletics representative plays a key role as a leader dedicated to protecting and enhancing the student-athlete experience both here at Nebraska and across the NCAA," Green said in announcing Fuess' appointment. "Scott has needed experience with intercollegiate athletics and in training the next generation of athletics administrators. I know he will serve in distinction, continuing Nebraska's tradition as a national leader in the student-athlete experience."

Fuess, the Steinhart Distinguished Professor of Business and former chair of the College of Business' economics department, has worked at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln since 1986. He serves on the Faculty Senate's Intercollegiate Athletics Committee, having chaired the committee for 2018-19 and a sub-committee in 2017-18.

"It's an honor to serve the university as its faculty athletics representative," Fuess said. "I embrace the challenge to uphold and advance the university's well-earned reputation for supporting student-athlete academic success, as well as our renown for ethical leadership in intercollegiate sports."

In August 2018, Fuess was named director of the university's crossdisciplinary master's degree program that offers a specialization in intercollegiate athletics administration. The program - which has been completed by 48 Huskers - is built on MBA coursework, allowing students to earn hands-on experiences through Nebraska Athletics, industry professionals, other universities and alumni.

Fuess earned a bachelor's degree from the University of Delaware, as well as master's and doctoral degrees from Purdue University. His research interests revolve around issues of economics, primarily in labor, collegiate athletics and Japan.

Jeffrey P. Gold, M.D., is a nationally recognized leader and tireless advocate for transforming higher education, academic medicine and health care delivery.

He became the eighth chancellor of the University of Nebraska Medical Center (UNMC), Vice President of the University of Nebraska System and the chair the board of UNMC's principle

clinical care academic health system partner, the Nebraska Medicine Health System, in January of 2014.

In July of 2021, Dr. Gold also was named the Provost and Executive Vice President of the University of Nebraska System in addition to his ongoing UNMC/Nebraska Medicine ongoing responsibilities. In this role, Dr. Gold is the chief academic officer of the University of Nebraska System and liaison to the Board of Regents for Academic Affairs.

As UNMC's chief executive officer, Dr. Gold is responsible for all aspects of campus leadership, program quality and operations, including 7 Colleges, numerous institutes, a staff and faculty of about 7,000 and its 4,300 health professions students. Additionally, Nebraska Medicine has over 8,500 employees and an operating budget of well more than \$1.9\$ billion. The combined annual economic impact of the "500-mile campus" academic health center with 7 Health Profession Colleges in seven Nebraska cities, 2 Institutes, 37 Centers of Excellence exceeds \$5.9\$ billion and employs in total more than 42,000.

From May 2017- June 2021, Dr. Gold served as the Chancellor of the University of Nebraska at Omaha (UNO), the state's public urban metropolitan university. The University of Nebraska at Omaha has seven thriving colleges, an enrollment of over 13,000 undergraduate students, 3,000 graduate students, a broad public service mission and an NCAA Division I-A athletic program. Following more than four highly successful years of growth and prominence at UNO, in 2021, Dr. Gold stepped down to assume the University of Nebraska System responsibilities.

Dr. Gold holds a tenured faculty appointment at the rank of Professor in the College of Medicine Department of Surgery and as well, as a tenured Professor in the College of Public Health, where his research interests in health care policy, population health and epidemiology are concentrated. He also chairs several key economic development corporate boards for the University System including the University Technology Development Corp, The Medical Center Development Corp, the University Technology Transfer Corp, Nebraska Enterprises Corp, UNeTecH Corp, and several others.

Prior to joining UNMC, Dr. Gold served as Chancellor of the University of Toledo's academic and clinical health sciences, which includes the Colleges of Medicine, Nursing, Pharmacy, Health Science and Human Service, and Graduate Studies. In that role, Dr. Gold had full leadership responsibility of the clinical, education and research programs, the faculty practice plan and the integrated hospital and ambulatory health care delivery system.

Prior to joining the University of Toledo, Dr. Gold served in academic and clinical leadership roles at the Albert Einstein College of Medicine – Montefiore Medical System as professor, department chair and heart center director and previously at the Weill Cornell College of Medicine – New York Presbyterian Medical Center as professor and division chief of children's cardiac surgery, where he was an active academic cardiac surgeon. His research has been extramurally supported for decades, including by the NIH, AHA, AHA, ACC, AMA, NYSDOH and many others.

Dr. Gold is a proud graduate from the Cornell University College of Engineering, where he received a degree in Theoretical and Applied Mechanics. He earned his M.D. from the Weill Cornell College of Medicine and completed his general surgery residency at The New York – Presbyterian Hospital and Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center, where he later served as the administrative chief resident. He completed his cardiothoracic surgical fellowship training at the Brigham and Women's Hospital in Boston with additional training in pediatric cardiac surgery at the Boston Children's Hospital, both of Harvard Medical School.

Dr. Gold has been certified by the American Board of Surgery and by the American Board of Thoracic Surgery, specializing in adult and pediatric cardiac surgery. He is licensed in Nebraska, Ohio, New York and New Jersey.

Dr. Gold's national leadership roles are extensive, and have included more than 50 national professional committees and more than 100 national organizations, volunteer boards, government/public health councils, and industry. He has recently served as the Chair of the American Medical Association's Council on Medical Education and as chair of the AMA/AAMC's Liaison Committee on Medical Education. He is a member of the AMA House of Delegates. Dr. Gold has also served in numerous roles on governing boards and as the elected leader of regional and national professional, accreditation and advocacy organizations in the educational, research and clinical care delivery sectors.

He has worked extensively with national and state level elected and appointed governing and administrative bodies as an advisor, advocate and trusted resource in the areas of higher education, research and clinical care. He continues to be highly engaged in these areas in the public sector, including the US congress, as well as with the regional and national private philanthropic and corporate sectors. In these roles, he is a highly sought after thought leader at all levels of federal, state and local government, higher education, academic health care and public policy. He is a highly regarded keynote public speaker based upon his extensive experience and respected judgment.

Dr. Gold has recently completed service as the Chair of the Board of the Accreditation Council on Graduate Medical Education as well as currently serving in several other national leadership positions in the Association of American Medical Colleges, the \

American Medical Association, the American Hospital Association and other prestigious organizations. In addition, he has been elected the Chair of the AMA Council on Medical Education, the president of the Thoracic Surgery Directors Association and as a Director of the Board of the Society of Thoracic Surgeons.

Dr. Gold serves on several key National Academy of Science, Engineering & Medicine steering committees, including the Clinician Wellbeing Taskforce, the COVID-19 Taskforce and the All Hazard 21st Century Threats Taskforce. In addition, he has been very active on the national level in multiple educational, research and clinical COVID-19 pandemic response, with hundreds of educational and media appearances, webinars, congressional/departmental/agency hearings and briefings. These media appearances include a weekly live hour long national broadcast as host, a weekly regional NCN hour long live broadcast and biweekly CNN and FOX national appearances.

He has been repeatedly recognized as a Top 50 Health Care Executive and as a Top 100 Physician Executive, as well many national awards for service leading numerous community volunteer programs, philanthropic campaigns and programs. He continues his research interests actively with ongoing publications and presentations and continues to serve several journal editorial boards. Dr. Gold has authored over 200 peer-reviewed manuscripts, 350 national presentations, 40 books and chapters and over 300 invited professorships and keynote presentations.

He has been married for more than forty years to a physician and has two adult children.

2024 (SENIOR)

After being named First-Team All-Big Ten for a second consecutive year, Taylor Christopulos brought home four All-America awards at the NCAA Championships. Coming in second in the floor exercise, Christopulos also

added a third-place finish in the high bar, a fourth-place finish in the vault and a sixth-place finish in the all-around. He managed to score a personal best in the vault at the NCAA Championships with a 15.00, and placed second on the floor exercise with a 14.500.

Christopulos set a number of other personal bests, recording a 14.75 in the floor exercise and a 14.00 in the pommel horse during Nebraska's win over Illinois. He also had a 14.15 on parallel bars in the Rocky Mountain Open and a 14.125 in the high bar during the Big Ten Championships earning him a third place finsh and sixth all-around.

In the classroom, he was an Academic All-Big Ten honoree and a member of the Nebraska Scholar-Athlete Honor Roll and Tom Osborne Citizenship team.

2023 (JUNIOR)

The 2023 Big Ten Gymnast of the Year, Christopulos captured a trio of All-America awards while helping Nebraska to a fifth-place finish at the NCAA Championships. The NCAA runner-up in the all-around, Christopulos added a fifth-place finish on the floor exercise and a seventh-place showing on parallel bars.

At the 2023 Big Ten Championships, Christopulos captured a gold medal on vault to earn first-team All-Big Ten honors. A 2023 Husker team captain, Christopulos claimed 13 individual titles during the season, including five on vault, four on floor, three all-around crowns and one parallel bars title. He capped the regular season by winning vault, floor and parallel bars titles in a win over Ohio State and Greenville at the Devaney Center on March 17. He added all-around and floor titles in a dual with Illinois (March 12), after capturing titles in the all-around and on vault against Oklahoma and Simpson College (Feb. 17). He won his first all-around title of the season in a dual with Michigan (Feb. 4).

A member of the U.S. Senior Men's National Team, Christopulos helped the United States to a team championship at the Pan American Games. In the classroom, he was a College Sports Communicators Academic All-District and Academic All-Big Ten selection in 2023.

2022 (SOPHOMORE)

Christopulos helped the Huskers to a second-place conference finish and fourth-place national finish during the 2021-22 season. Christopulos claimed two individual titles on vault.

Outside of the gym, Christopulos earned Academic All-Big Ten honors and was named to the Nebraska Scholar-Athlete Honor Roll in both the fall and spring semesters. Christopulos was also named to the Tom Osborne Citizenship team for his dedication to serving the Lincoln community.

2021 (FRESHMAN)

The 2021 Big Ten Freshman of the Year, Christopulos earned four CGA National Rookie of the Week awards and was a three-time Big Ten Freshman of the Week honoree. Christopulos competed in all eight meets, highlighted by his silver medal finish on vault at the 2021 Big Ten Championships at Pinnacle Bank Arena in Lincoln. Christopulos also

captured All-America honors with his fifth-place finish on vault at the 2021 NCAA Championships in Minneapolis. He went on to be named Nebraska's Outstanding Male Newcomer of the Year across all sports in 2021.

Outside of the classroom, Christopulos was named to the Nebraska Scholar-Athlete Honor Roll for his dedication in the classroom.

BEFORE NEBRASKA

Christopulos joined the Huskers after training at USA Gymnastics World in Woods Cross, Utah. He was coached by Adam Jacobs and Gabe Connor.

Christopulos, a 4.5 star recruit according to the College Gymnastics Association, was ranked eighth overall and fifth on floor for the 2020 recruiting class by CGA.

PERSONAL

Taylor was born on Aug. 24, 2001, and is the son of Troy and Jennifer Christopulos. Taylor has four siblings, Tony, Tess, Tia and Tana. Christopulos married Kayzha Madsen in August of 2024. Taylor attended Layton High School in Utah. In his free time, he likes to be active and social as well as play the guitar.

"I chose Nebraska because the coaching staff and team members. I honestly wasn't even considering going to Nebraska at all until I took my trip out there and saw it for myself. 
TAYLOR CHRISTOPULOS







NEBRASKA'S CHAMPIONSHIP TRADITION

ALL-TIME NISSEN-EMERY AWARD WINNERS

College gymnastics' highest honor, the Nissen-Emery Award, has been presented annually since 1966 to an outstanding senior collegiate gymnast based on gymnastic achievement, sportsmanship and academic excellence.

The original Nissen Award was named in honor of George Nissen, a former NCAA champion, for his contributions to men's gymnastics. The award was re-named the Nissen-Emery Award in 1998 to honor Dr. Robert Emery, a Penn State graduate, who won the Nissen Award in 1969.

The "Heisman Trophy" of gymnastics, the Nissen-Emery Award is inscribed with the following motto:

"The true champion seeks excellence physically, mentally, socially and morally."

Nebraska's dominance of men's gymnastics throughout the 1980s is best illustrated by the three Huskers who captured the Nissen Award within a period of seven years.

Tom Schlesinger was the third NU recipient of the Nissen. He won the award in 1988, following former Huskers Jim Hartung (1982) and Wes Suter (1986).

Wes Suter won the Nissen Award in 1986 to cap a brilliant career in which he won the 1985 NCAA all-around title and two NCAA individual event championships. He competed for the United States in the 1988 Olympic Games.




TOM SCHLESINGER, 1988

Tom Schlesinger earned the Nissen en route to winning the 1987 NCAA all-around title. He earned NCAA All-America status seven times and went on to capture a spot on the 1988 Olympic Team as the United States' top alternate.


NEBRASKA'S OLYMPIANS

One of the nation's premier programs, Nebraska has produced nine athletes who have earned 11 U.S. Olympic positions, including a two-time Olympic appearance by current Nebraska assistant coach Jim Hartung. Former Head Coach Francis Allen was also a two-time Olympic team head coach for the 1980 and 1992 teams.



JIM HARTUNG: 1980, 1984

A two-time Olympian, Jim Hartung helped the 1984 U.S. squad to the gold medal. It marked the only time in Olympic history that the U.S. men have claimed team gold. A 22-time NCAA All-American and seven-time NCAA champion, Hartung won NCAA all-around titles in 1980 and 1981, was second in 1982 and third in 1979. In addition, Hartung won three straight NCAA still rings titles (1980-82) and back-to-back NCAA parallel bars crowns (1981-82). As a freshman in 1979, Hartung led NU to its first national championship. During his Husker career, Hartung guided NU to four straight national championships. An Omaha native and South High School graduate, Hartung was a product of the Cahoy School of Gymnastics. In 1982, Hartung became NU's first Nissen Award winner.



SCOTT JOHNSON: 1984, 1988

One of two Huskers who were two-time Olympians, Scott Johnson was a member of the gold medal winning U.S. squad in 1984. An 11-time NCAA All-American, Johnson was a three-time national champion at NU. At the 1983 NCAA Championships, Johnson won the floor exercise, parallel bars and horizontal bar national titles and placed second in the allaround.



A two-time Olympic team head coach, Francis Allen was selected to guide the U.S. squad in 1980 and in 1992. During his 40 seasons at NU, the Huskers won eight national titles, including an unprecedented five straight titles from 1979 to 1983, and finished second on seven other occasions.



LARRY GERARD: 1980

One of three Huskers on the Francis Allencoached 1980 U.S. Olympic team, Larry Gerard was a seven-time NCAA All-American while at Nebraska. In 1979, Gerard finished fifth in the all-around to help Nebraska win its first national championship.



PHIL CAHOY: 1980

One of three Huskers on the 1980 Francis Allen-Color of three ruskers of the 1900 Francis Allefricoached U.S. Olympic team, Phil Cahoy was a 10-time NCAA All-American at Nebraska. Like Jim Hartung, Cahoy was an Omaha South High School graduate. He trained under his father, Phil Cahoy Sr., at the Cahoy School of Gymnastics before coming to Nebraska. As a Husker, he was a key figure on four NU squads that won national championships (1980-83). Individually, he was a four-time NCAA champion, winning back-to-back NCAA parallel bars and horizontal bar national titles in 1980 and 1981.



JIM MIKUS: 1984

The alternate for the gold medal winning 1984 U.S. squad, Jim Mikus was a five-time NCAA All-American at Nebraska. He was a valuable contributor for NU's national championship teams in 1981, 1982 and 1983. Mikus was a two-time NCAA All-American on the floor exercise and horizontal bar, and finished fourth in the allaround in 1982.



WES SUTER: 1988

One of three Huskers on the 1988 U.S. Olympic squad, Wes Suter became NU's second Nissen Award winner in 1986. A five-time NCAA All-American at Nebraska, Suter finished his Husker career as a three-time NCAA champion. At the 1985 NCAA Championships, Suter won national titles in the all-around, floor exercise and horizontal bar.

NEBRASKA'S OLYMPIANS

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KEVIN DAVIS: 1988

A member of the 1988 U.S. Olympic team, Kevin Davis was a seventime NCAA All-American for the Huskers. Davis was a two-time NCAA champion, winning parallel bars titles in 1987 and 1988. He helped NU to the 1988 national title, finishing third in the all-around.



TRENT DIMAS: 1992

A standout on the high bar, Trent Dimas won the only U.S. gymnastics medal at the 1992 Olympics with a 9.875 for a gold medal on the high bar. Dimas picked up two NCAA All-America awards for the Huskers in 1990, placing second in both the floor exercise and horizontal bar. Dimas' gold medal is the only individual gold medal an NU gymnast has won.



TOM SCHLESINGER: 1988

One of three Huskers on the 1988 U.S. Olympic team, Tom Schlesinger was a seven-time NCAA All-American at Nebraska. At the 1987 NCAA Championships, Schlesinger won the all-around and parallel bars national titles on his way to winning the Nissen Award in 1988.



YANNI CHRONOPOULOS: 2024

Yanni Chronopoulos was selected as an alternate for Team Canada during the 2024 Olympics held in Paris. Chronopouls was competing with Team Canada during the 2023 World Championships in October of 2023, where the team placed seventh. Before qualifying last year, Canada had not qualified in team events since 2008.

ACADEMIC COUNSELING

A team of 14 academic staff members are in place to monitor daily academic progress, promote skill development, receive consistent course feedback, assist with the advising/registration process and monitor eligibility and progress toward graduation.

TUTORIAL SUPPORT

A tremendous resource for all academic abilities, tutorial support is available from day one up to college graduation in all subject areas. Tutorial support is provided both in-person and virtually. Nebraska's tutorial program is certified by the College Reading and Learning Association.

STUDY HALL

Student-athletes attend a supervised study hall within the newly-opened Osborne Legacy Complex that features day, evening and weekend hours. Student athletes are required to complete a specific number of study hours each week and/or a list of academic tasks as determined by their academic counselor, learning specialist and coach.

MENTORING

Academic staff serve as mentors to all incoming student-athletes and select returning student-athletes. The student-athletes meet with their mentor weekly to develop time management skills, gather and report academic progress information and discuss academic success strategies.

EDUCATIONAL ASSESSMENTS

Assessments are administered upon the request of the student-athlete, academic counselor or coach. Learning specialists are available to administer and score informal assessments, which include a reading comprehension and a writing assessment. When more in-depth assessments are necessary, referrals are made to a neuropsychologist who conducts the assessments. If it is determined a student-athlete has a learning disability or another medical condition that impedes the student from reaching their academic potential, appropriate accommodations are implemented by the Office of Services for Students with Disabilities.

STUDENT-ATHLETE ORIENTATION

Each new student-athlete attends an orientation at the beginning of their academic career. Student-athletes are introduced to staff, faculty, administrators and a variety of resources that help facilitate the transition into college while enhancing awareness of support services in the Athletic Department and across campus.

PERSONAL COUNSELING



COMPUTER RESOURCES



On July 1, 2011, the University of Nebraska became an official member of the Big Ten Conference, increasing the Big Ten's membership to 12 institutions for the first time in conference history. The addition of Nebraska marked the Big Ten's first expansion since Penn State joined the conference in June of 1990. The nation's oldest conference continued to grow with the addition of Maryland and Rutgers in the summer of 2014. The Big Ten Conference is a union of 14 worldclass academic institutions – who share a common mission of research, graduate, professional and undergraduate teaching and public service. The conference's 100-plus years of history, strong tradition of competitive intercollegiate athletic programs, vast and passionate alumni base, and consistent leadership in innovations position the Big Ten and its entire community firmly on the Big Stage.

The Big Ten has sustained a comprehensive set of shared practices and policies that enforce the priority of academics and emphasize the values of integrity, fairness and competitiveness in all aspects of its student-athletes' lives, with the ultimate goal of ensuring that each individual has the opportunity to live a Big Life.

BIG TEN CONFERENCE HIGHLIGHTS

- Big Ten universities provide approximately \$200 million in direct financial aid to nearly 9,500 student-athletes on 350 teams across 42 sports.
- The Big Ten sponsors 28 official conference sports, 14 for men 14 for women.
- More than 120 years after its inception, the Big Ten remains a national leader in intercollegiate athletics on and off the field. Big Ten programs have combined to win more than 450 team and 1,800 individual national championships, consistently taking home individual honors for athletic and academic accomplishments and fulfilling the Big Ten's mission of academic achievement and athletic success.

The network is available to an estimated 60 million households. The network is carried by all major cable, satellite and telecommunications providers and BTN2Go is also available on smartphones, tables and the internet.

Nebraska has placed first or second at the NCAA Championships 15 times in the past 44 years.


Nebraska gymnasts have won nine NCAA individual allaround titles and 221 All-America awards.
