SCHEDULE NOTES

The Nebraska wrestling team hosts Big Ten foe and reigning national champion Penn State (Jan. 17) at the Devaney Center. The Huskers will face six of the top-25 finishers from last season's NCAA Championships.

The Big Red will open the season at home against Utah Valley on Nov. 8. Then NU hits the road for two duals and two invitationals. The Huskers visit North Carolina to face Campbell and North Carolina on Nov. 15, before taking on the Navy Classic on Nov. 23 and the Cliff Keen Invitational on Dec. 6 and 7. On Dec. 20, NU will host Augustana and in-state competitor UNK in one evening. The Big Red will finish non-conference duals with a road matchup at Northern Iowa (Jan. 5), who finished 14th at last year's NCAA Championships.

Conference competition will consist of eight duals, four home and four away. The Big Ten matchups will open at home on Jan. 11, as the Huskers host Minnesota. Less than a week later, Nebraska welcomes Penn State (Jan. 17), for the first time since the 2019 season.

The following weekend, NU takes on Michigan on Jan. 24 and Michigan State on Jan. 26. The Wolverines are another top conference and national competitor, after finishing the 2023-24 season in third at the NCAA Championships. Returning to the Bob Devaney Sports Center, the Huskers close out January with Wisconsin on Jan. 31.

On Feb. 7, the Big Red take on preseason No. 2 lowa in lowa City. The Huskers will have their final home dual on Feb. 16, hosting the Hoosiers before concluding the regular season on the road, at Purdue on Feb. 23.

The Big Ten Championships will be held March 8-9, at Welsh-Ryan Arena in Evanston, Ill. The 2024-25 NCAA Championships will be held in Philadelphia at the Wells Fargo Center, March 20-22.


The Nebraska wrestling program continues its excellence both on and off the mat. Coach Mark Manning has continued a tradition of success in his 24 years at the helm of the Huskers. With hard work and a dedication to excellence, Manning has developed a program that consistently competes with the nation's best in collegiate wrestling.

Since its inaugural season in 1910-11, Nebraska has earned more than 700 dual victories, including 294 wins under Manning. Over the past 24 years, the Huskers have finished in the top 10 at the NCAA Championships 13 times and racked up 136 All-America honors, from 72 wrestlers, including five individual national titles. In the classroom, NU wrestlers have earned 79 NWCA All-Academic Team selections en route to seven CSC Academic All-America awards.

One reason NU has been able to develop such a successful program is its top-notch facilities. In the fall of 2011, the Husker wrestling program moved into the state-of-the-art Hendricks Training Complex, which provides three full-sized practice mats, office suites and areas for both strength and conditioning and athletic medicine. The Hendricks Complex is attached to the Devaney Center, which hosts the majority of Nebraska's duals this season. With a wealth of support and a history of success, Nebraska wrestling expects to contend for conference and national championships every year.









OLYMPIC GLORY

Nebraska wrestling has climbed its way into the Olympic spotlight during the past several Olympics. Former Huskers who have continued their careers on the international stage include 2012 freestyle gold medalist and 2016 Olympian Jordan Burroughs and two-time Olympic medal-winner Rulon Gardner, who won a gold medal in 2000 and a bronze in 2004 in Greco-Roman. Overall, seven Nebraska wrestlers have participated on eight U.S. Olympic teams and claimed six medals.






A three-time All-American and two-time national champion for Nebraska, Jordan Burroughs (top) won the gold medal in freestyle at 163 pounds at the 2012 Olympics in London. He also wrestled at the 2016 Games in Rio.

A 1993 All-American at heavyweight for Nebraska, Rulon Gardner (middle) pulled off one of the most remarkable upsets in sports history with his victory over previously undefeated Alexander Karelin of Russia in the gold medal match in the 2000 Olympics in Sydney, Australia. Gardner also earned a bronze medal in the 2004 Olympics in Athens, Greece.

Matt Lindland (bottom) was a 1993 Big Eight champion for Nebraska and went on to earn a silver medal at the 2000 Olympics in Sydney, Australia. He is currently the head coach of the U.S. Greco-Roman team. In Oct. 2024, Lindland also became the fifth Husker to be induced to the National Wrestling Hall of Fame as a distinguished Member.



INTERNATIONAL EXCELLENCE



Numerous Nebraska wrestlers have continued their careers on the international stage after their time at NU. Most recently, Jordan Burroughs and James Green competed at the 2024 World Championships in Tirana, Albania. In 2022, Burroughs earned the gold medal at 79 kg, which made him the most decorated champion in U.S. wrestling history with a freestyle record of seven World and Olympic Championships combined. Prior to the 2021 World Championships, Burroughs and James Green also helped the United States to its first World Cup title since 2003, going a combined 7-1 at the 2018 UWW Freestyle World Cup in lowa City, lowa, for a Team USA that also featured former Nebraska Assistant Coach Kendric Maple.

Huskers have won 25 medals at the World Championships, including titles by Bill Scherr in 1985, Rulon Gardner in 2001 and Burroughs in 2011, 2013, 2015 and 2017. Green also medaled for the United States in 2015, when he took bronze in freestyle at 70 kg. Brad Vering was named the 2007 Greco-Roman Wrestler of the Year by USA Wrestling after his silvermedal performance at the 2007 World Championships.

Jordan Burroughs (top left) and James Green (top right) were members of the 2021 USA Wrestling World Championships team in Oslo, Norway.

Justin Ruiz (middle-left), a two-time All-American for the Huskers, earned a bronze medal in the 2005 World Championships in Budapest, Hungary.

Tolly Thompson (middle-right) claimed a national title for Nebraska in 1995 and was a three-time All-American before going on to earn a bronze medal at the 2005 World Championships.

After winning national titles at Nebraska in 1984, the Scherr brothers, Bill (bottom left) and Jim (bottom right) continued their wrestling careers by winning seven medals between them at the World Championships, including a title by Bill in 1985.


NATIONAL CHAMPIONS

One of the nation's premier wrestling programs, Nebraska has produced 11 national champions, including five in the last 23 years. Husker wrestlers have earned 131 All-America honors, including 96 awards since 1990 and 70 since Coach Mark Manning took the reins of the program in 2000-01.


Top Right: Jordan Burroughs became Nebraska's first two-time national champion in 2011 at 165 pounds after winning the 157-pound title in 2009.

Bottom Right: The Scherr brothers were standouts for Nebraska from 1980 to 1984. Bill was NU's first three-time All-American and defeated Jim Baumgardner of Oregon State in the finals of the 1984 NCAA Championships at 190 pounds. Bill clinched his national title with a 36-1 senior season at NU. He was also a two-time Big Eight champion. 






The Huskers ranked 11th nationally in home attendance during the 2023-24 season according to The Open Mat with an average of 3,353 fans over seven home duals. The Huskers attracted a total of 23,471 fans over the course of seven duals, including a season-high 5,208 fans in the dual against Iowa on Jan. 12, 2024.

In addition to hosting duals, the Devaney Center and Hendricks Training Complex house the wrestling offices, locker room, weight room, wrestling room and athletic areas all just steps from each other, providing an atmosphere conducive to elite training.

HENDRICKS TRAINING COMPLEX



The Nebraska wrestling program experienced some major facility improvements in the fall of 2011, starting with the addition of the Hendricks Training Complex.

The Hendricks Training Complex provides three fullsized practice mats, office suites and areas for both strength and conditioning and athletic medicine attached to the Bob Devaney Sports Center. The facility was completed in October of 2011.

HEAD COACH MARK MANNING



The all-time winningest wrestling coach in program history, Nebraska Head Coach Mark Manning enters his 25th season as the head coach of the Huskers in 2024-25. Since 2000, Manning's squads have racked up a total of 294 dual wins, 13 top-10 NCAA finishes and one conference championship. Under Manning, Husker wrestlers have won five national championships and 75 All-America awards. Manning continues to coach freestyle wrestlers and former Huskers Jordan Burroughs and James Green, leading the pair to a combined 10 Olympic and World Championship medals.

ACADEMIC COUNSELING

Eight academic counselors, three learning specialists, two assistant academic counselors and one administrative assistant are in place to monitor daily academic progress, receive consistent course feedback, assist with the advising/ registration process and monitor eligibility and progress toward graduation.

TUTORIAL SUPPORT

A tremendous resource for all academic abilities, unlimited tutorial support from approximately 75-100 tutors on staff is available from day one up to college graduation in all subject areas. Tutorial support is provided both in-person and virtually. Nebraska's tutorial program is certified as a model tutoring program by the College Reading and Learning Association. Association.

STUDY HALL

Student-athletes attend a supervised, flex-time study hall within the Herman Student Life Complex that features day, evening and weekend hours. Student-athletes are required to complete a specific number of study hours each week as determined by their academic counselor and/or coach. Additional performance-based or tutorbased study hall also may be determined by the academic counselor.

MENTORING

Academic staff serve as mentors to all incoming student-athletes. The studentathletes meet with their mentor weekly to develop time management skills, gather and report academic progress information and discuss academic success strategies.

EDUCATIONAL ASSESSMENTS

Assessments are administered upon the request of the student-athlete, academic counselor, or coach. Learning specialists are available to administer and score informal assessments, which include a reading comprehension and a writing assessment. When more in-depth assessments are necessary, referrals are made to a consulting neuropsychologist who conducts the assessments. If it is determined a student-athlete has a learning disability or another medical condition that impedes the student from reaching their academic potential, appropriate accommodations are implemented by the Office of Services for Students with Disabilities.

STUDENT-ATHLETE ORIENTATION

Each new student-athlete attends an orientation at the beginning of their academic career. Student-athletes are introduced to staff, faculty, administrators, and a variety of resources that help facilitate the transition into college while enhancing awareness of support services in the Athletic Department and across



COMPUTER RESOURCES






















With nearly 100 years of history, Nebraska wrestling is one of the most storied programs in the collegiate wrestling ranks. Head Coach Mark Manning has taken the Huskers to new heights in his tenure and has established himself as one of the top wrestling coaches in the nation.

The NU record book is a testament to Manning's accomplishments in Lincoln. In his 24 years at the helm, he has coached 36 of Nebraska's 72 All-Americans. He has led the Huskers to eight top-eight finishes at the NCAA Championships, compared to just eight for the 14 NU coaches before him. He became the winningest coach in school history on Feb. 21, 2015 when he picked up his 200th win at Nebraska. He won back-to-back Big 12 Coach-of-the-Year awards (2008 and 2009) after guiding Nebraska to a share of the conference crown in 2009 and a runner-up finish in 2008. Manning has also guided five wrestlers to a total of four individual NCAA championships.

Manning earned one of the top coaching honors in the entire sport when he was named the 2011 FILA Freestyle Coach of the Year by USA Wrestling after helping Jordan Burroughs capture the gold medal at the World Championships in Istanbul, Turkey. In 2015, Manning received the honor for a second time, as Burroughs earned another world title and a spot on the U.S. Olympic Team. Burroughs reached the pinnacle of the sport, earning Olympic gold in 2012, while winning world titles in 2011, 2013, 2015, 2017 and 2021 with Manning in is corner. Manning has also overseen the growth of James Green, who earned world bronze in 2015 and silver in 2017. Manning and Nebraska Associate Head Coach Bryan Snyder were honored as the Terry McCann Award winners as USA Wrestling's Freestyle Co-Coaches of the Year in 2017 for their accomplishments.

Records go on paper and in books and get tucked away. More important to Manning is the fact that he has helped numerous young men grow into upstanding adults by teaching them the correct principles of life. Regarded as one of the nation's top recruiters, Manning has a keen eye for finding the athletes with the right work ethic and dedication that he can develop.

Manning's coaching philosophy is one that he began during his competitive days, developed during his time as an assistant coach and continues to modify during his time as head coach at Nebraska. It focuses on developing wrestlers to reach their potential. A wrestler who brings a positive attitude and work ethic to the room can use goal setting and responsibility to develop into an upstanding citizen who is committed to excellence. Manning works daily with the team on every detail in and out of practice, while keeping in mind the best long-term interests of his student-athletes.

Known for his fiery nature on the edge of the mat, Manning instills in his wrestlers a sense of determination and pride through his actions and demeanor. His guidance teaches his athletes to become winners in life, which translates into success in the classroom, on the mat and in their lives beyond wrestling.

In addition to their success on the mat, Husker wrestlers under Manning have earned 153 academic all-conference selections, including 112 Academic All-Big Ten awards during Nebraska's first 13 seasons in the conference. In 2012, Nebraska turned in the nation's best team grade-point average (3.46). Manning's beliefs and values in developing student-athletes are evident right outside his office, where Snyder, a former Husker All-American, is a member of the NU staff.

Manning's coaching philosophy is one that he began during his competitive days, developed during his time as an assistant coach and continues to modify during his time as head coach at Nebraska.

MANNING'S MARK AT NEBRASKA

Manning began teaching his methods immediately when he was hired at Nebraska in May of 2000. His efforts first paid dividends when he led Nebraska to back-to-back eighth-place team finishes at the NCAA Championships in 2001 and 2002. Four Huskers (Snyder, Todd Beckerman, Ati Conner and Brad Vering) claimed All-America honors in Manning's first year coaching the Huskers in 2000-01, as NU finished with an 11-6 dual record. Powell and Snyder also gave Manning his first two Big 12 Conference champions that year.

During the 2001-02 season, Manning led the Huskers to their third consecutive third-place finish at the Big 12 Championships. Justin Ruiz and Powell earned their first All-America accolades under Manning, while Snyder became Nebraska's first four-time All-American with his second-place finish at 157 pounds.

Nebraska claimed a 16-7 dual record in 2002-03, as Manning guided NU to seven victories over ranked opponents, including a 20-17 victory over fifth-ranked Illinois at the Virginia Duals. At the 2003 NCAA Championships, Manning led a young lineup that included two juniors, five sophomores and three redshirt freshmen to a 13th-place showing. The finish marked the eighth time in nine seasons that NU had claimed a spot in the top 15 in the nation.

The 2003-04 Huskers and Manning posted one of the best wrestling seasons ever at NU with a 19-3 overall record, tying the second-highest win total in NU history. The Huskers posted two team titles during the season, winning the prestigious Las Vegas Invitational behind individual titles from Powell, Travis Shufelt and Travis Pascoe and winning the Virginia Duals with a 25-13 defeat of Lehigh in the finals. Manning directed the Huskers to second at the Big 12 Championships, while qualifying eight wrestlers for the NCAA Tournament, where NU earned a fifth-place finish. Manning coached his first national champion at Nebraska, as Powell claimed the title at 125 pounds with a 17-2 technical fall in the finals.

The Huskers' success continued in 2004-05, with Nebraska winning 19 duals for the second straight year. NU's 19-2-1 dual record was the second-best mark in school history. The Huskers started the campaign with eight straight dual wins, and ended the season by winning 12 of the last 13 duals. Nebraska posted eight wins over ranked foes, including a 16-15 upset of No. 2 lowa State to end the dual season.

Manning's 2005-06 squad was relatively inexperienced, but the Huskers earned a solid 12-5 dual record and a third-place finish at the National Duals. NU claimed third at the Big 12 Championships and two Huskers went on to finish as All-Americans. Manning's legacy continued to grow in 2006-07, as he watched his second Husker claim a national title. Paul Donahoe earned the crown at 125 pounds after helping Nebraska to a 10-7-1 dual record. The 2007-08 Husker campaign was one of the best ever under Manning. NU finished second at the Big 12 Championships with three individual champions and claimed fourth at the NCAA Championships with five Huskers finishing as All-Americans. That success would no doubt be a challenge to match, but the 2008-09 Nebraska wrestling team did just that. The Huskers won a share of the Big 12 championship for the first time in school history behind individual titles from Burroughs, Brandon Browne, Craig Brester and Vince Jones. Seven NU wrestlers qualified for the NCAA Championships, where the Huskers finished fourth with All-America accolades going to Burroughs (1st at 157), Brester (2nd at 197), Browne (4th at 174) and Jones (6th at 184). For his work with the 2009 squad, Manning was named Dan Gable Coach of the Year by WIN Magazine.

In 2010, Nebraska fought through a rash of injuries, including a season-ending setback to Burroughs. Despite the unfortunate luck, the Huskers still qualified five wrestlers for the NCAA Championships and finished 12th in the team standings, marking the seventh top-15 finish under Manning. History was made in 2011, when Manning helped Burroughs become the first two-time national champion in school history by winning the 165-pound title at the NCAA Championships in Philadelphia. After the season, Burroughs was awarded the school's first-ever Hodge Trophy, given annually to the

nation's top wrestler. As a team, the Huskers qualified seven total wrestlers for the national tournament and finished in 12th place for the second consecutive season.

In 2011-12, the Huskers finished 21st at the NCAA Championships as two wrestlers (Josh Ihnen and James Green) earned All-America accolades. Senior Tucker Lane became the 20th member of Nebraska's 100-win club on Feb. 19.

In 2012-13, Robert Kokesh led Nebraska with a 38-4 record and a third-place finish at the NCAA Championships at 174 pounds. Green captured his second consecutive All-America honor at 157 pounds to help NU to a 13th-place finish. Ihnen fell one match short of All-America status but picked up his 100th collegiate win at the national tournament. He also earned CSC Academic All-America honors, and helped the Huskers to an 11-6 dual record.

Green and Kokesh repeated as All-Americans in 2014, as Green took third at 157 pounds and Kokesh earned a fourth-place finish at 174. The pair also took home Big Ten titles, becoming the first Husker champions in three seasons as members of the conference. The Huskers returned to the newly renovated Devaney Center for all of their home duals after years of wrestling at the NU Coliseum. NU finished the dual season with a 12-2 record before finishing 11th at the NCAA Championships.

In 2014-15, the Huskers notched a ninth-place finish at the NCAA Championships, marking the 19th top-10 result in school history and first since 2009. Kokesh and Green each collected third-place finishes, while TJ Dudley earned his first All-America honor with an eighth-place showing at 184 pounds. During the dual season, NU set a school record for winning percentage (.933) after a 14-1 season, which included a tie for second in the Big Ten dual standings.

Dudley repeated as an All-American in 2015-16, this time making it to the NCAA Finals at 184 pounds. His runner-up finish led the team, which produced two additional All-Americans, Eric Montoya and Austin Wilson. As a team, NU finished eighth at the NCAA Championships and fourth at the Big Ten Championships. For the first time since 1995, NU qualified all 10 wrestlers for the national tournament. The Huskers posted an 11-6 record overall, going 5-4 in Big Ten duals.

The Huskers had four All-Americans to finish ninth as a team at the 2017 NCAA Championships. Dudley finished third to capture his third All-America honor. Montoya took sixth to finish his career as a two-time All-American. Aaron Studebaker and Tyler Berger each made the podium for the first time. Nebraska finished fourth at the Big Ten Championships after going 12-4 during the dual season.

Nebraska posted another top-10 finish at the NCAA Championships in 2018, as the Huskers placed ninth with three All-Americans. Berger earned his second All-America honor, as he finished third, while Taylor Venz and Chad Red Jr. became the first pair of freshmen to earn All-America honors for NU in the same season, as Venz placed fourth and Red took seventh. The Huskers went 10-4 on the dual season and placed fifth at the Big Ten Championships after returning just two starters from the 2017 team.

The Huskers stretched their streak of Top-10 NCAA finishes to five in 2019. The Huskers placed 10th with four All-Americans. Tyler Berger earned his third All-America honor with a runner-up finish at the NCAA Championships. Chad Red Jr. earned All-America honors for the second consecutive season with an eighth-place finish while freshman Mikey Labriola capped off a stellar debut campaign by finishing sixth. Isaiah White placed fifth as a junior. The Huskers went 12-5 on the dual season and placed fifth at the Big Ten Championships.

The 2019-20 campaign featured incredible highs and difficult-to-fathom lows. The early portion of the season saw the Huskers climb as high as No. 2 in the NWCA Division I Coaches Poll, tying the highest ranking in program history. NU capped a remarkable two-day run in Las Vegas by winning its third Cliff Keen Invitational team title in program history. The team showed incredible resilience, rebounding from a three-meet losing streak (all against top-10 opponents) to defeat No. 3 Ohio State at the Devaney Center, the program's first win over a top-three opponent since 2008. The Huskers ultimately ended the regular season on a six-match winning streak and carried that positive momentum to the Big Ten Championships, where the Big Red placed second, the program's best finish as a member of the conference. NU qualified all 10 starters for the NCAA Championships but none of them had the chance to take the mat in Minneapolis, as the tournament was canceled due to concerns regarding the spread of the coronavirus. All told, the Huskers finished the season 11-3, marking Coach Manning's 10th consecutive campaign of 10 or more wins and the 18th time in 20 seasons Manning had accrued at least 10 victories.

The Huskers saw a modified spring-only 2021 season where they tallied seven victories, with their lone loss coming to lowa. In postseason competition, NU had an impressive showing at the Big Ten Tournament as the team finished third and Ridge Lovett (149), Taylor Venz (184) and Eric Schultz (197) finished second. Nine Huskers qualified for the NCAA

Tournament, led by Mikey Labriola with a third-place finish to help Nebraska earn 38 points to finish 12th.

In 2021-22, NU went 6-5 during the regular season with quality wins over North Carolina, Wisconsin and Northwestern. For the first time since joining the Big Ten Conference, the Huskers hosted the Big Ten Tournament. NU took seventh at the event, before battling to a fifth-place finish at the NCAA Championships. Lovett ended a stellar tournament with an NCAA runner-up finish.

Nebraska tallied 12 dual victories in the 2022-23, which tied the most wins since 2018-19. The Huskers concluded their regular season with six-straight dual victories. At the Big Ten Championships, Silas Allred won the 197-pound title, marking the first Husker to win since Robert Kokesh in 2015, and the team finished third with 104.5 points. At the NCAA Championships, senior Mikey Labriola became the second-straight NCAA finalist as he concluded his Husker career as the first five-time All-American and the ninth-most wins (120) in Husker history. The team placed eighth overall.

Last season, NU recorded 12 dual wins for the second-straight season and tallied five ranked victories. Also for the second-straight year, the Huskers had a Big Ten champ as Ridge Lovett claimed the crown at 149 and the team finished third with 118 team points. Husker sophomore Brock Hardy (141) led the Huskers with a third-place finish at the 2024 NCAA Championships, and the Nebraska wrestling team scored 60.5 points to claim ninth overall, for Manning's 13th top-10 finish. Five Huskers competed in the NCAA medal round, highlighted by Hardy's upset victory and Peyton Robb's win to conclude his Husker career with his fourth All-America honor. Nebraska's five NCAA All-Americans marked the fifth time in seven years the program had four or more claim the award. Since 2012, Nebraska has had at least two wrestlers earn All-America honors, and the program has earned a total of 136 combined awards from 75 wrestlers.

THE ROAD TO LINCOLN

Manning showed his ability to develop a top-notch program was universal, as he led a turnaround in the tradition-rich Northern lowa program in his first head coaching position. Manning coached three seasons for the Panthers from 1997 to 2000 in Cedar Falls, lowa. Under Manning, UNI compiled a 23-24-2 dual record and improved its mark in each of his seasons. His rebuilding effort with the Panthers included strong showings at the NCAA Championships. Northern lowa tied for 30th in Manning's first year, but improved to a 17th-place showing in 1998 and added an 11th-place finish



at the 2000 NCAA Tournament, which was the school's best showing in seven seasons.

Individually, several UNI wrestlers excelled on the national stage under Manning. In each of his last two seasons, the Panthers had a pair of All-Americans, including Tony Davis. A two-time NCAA finalist, Davis was the national champion at 149 pounds in 2000 and finished second in 1999.

Manning returned the Northern lowa program to national prominence by attracting some of the nation's top wrestling talent. His first Panther recruiting class was ranked second in the nation, while his second class was tabbed as the top class in the nation in 2000.

Before his appointment as the head coach at UNI, Manning had extensive experience as an assistant coach, including ties to the Big 12 Conference. Manning spent four seasons on Jack Spates' staff at Oklahoma from 1993 to 1997 before accepting Northern Iowa's head position. Manning helped guide the Sooners to three top-10 team finishes at the NCAA Championships during his tenure, including a seventh-place showing at the 1997 national tournament. He assisted in coaching 14 OU wrestlers to All-America accolades, and five Sooners to the NCAA finals. John Kading also claimed the 1996 190-pound title under him. Manning aided in the recruitment of three top-five national recruiting classes while in Norman.

Manning began his coaching career as an assistant at North Carolina from 1985 to 1993. While pursuing his master's degree in sports administration, Manning assisted Coach Bill Lam in guiding 15 Tar Heel wrestlers to All-America honors, including four NCAA finalists and a pair of national champions. UNC posted top-10 NCAA finishes in 1986, 1987 and 1993 with Manning on staff, and captured four Atlantic Coast Conference titles. He also helped attract the nation's top recruiting class to Chapel Hill, N.C., in the spring of 1990.

In addition to his extensive collegiate coaching experience, Manning has been selected numerous times to coach the United States in international competition. He has coached on U.S. Olympic teams as an assistant in 1996, 2000, 2012 and 2016, while also being named the head coach at U.S. Olympic Festivals in 1991, 1993 and 1995. Manning was chosen to head the U.S. freestyle team at the 2001 FILA World Championships and was an assistant on the U.S. delegation to the FILA World Championships eight times. He has also been active at the FILA Junior level, serving as the head coach twice, and traveling to the 2008 FILA Junior World Championships in Turkey as an assistant coach, where he coached Burroughs to a 10th-place finish. In 2009, Manning was a coach for the U.S. Freestyle World Team at the World Wrestling Championships in Herning, Denmark.

MOLDING MANNING


Manning had plenty of experience to build his coaching philosophies, as he was one of the top wrestlers in the nation during his competitive career. Manning wrestled collegiately at Nebraska for one year, before transferring to the University of Nebraska-Omaha. After redshirting a season, Manning went on to become a two-time NCAA Division II national champion and three-time All-American under Coach Mike Denney. Manning posted a 121-23 record for the Mavericks, while capturing titles at 150 pounds in 1983 and 1985. Manning helped UNO earn a third-place team finish in 1983 and runner-up honors in 1985. While competing for the Mavericks, he was the leader of UNO's chapter of Fellowship of Christian Athletes for four years. Manning was inducted into the NCAA Division II Hall of Fame for his accomplishments as a wrestler and coach in 1999.

Manning's competitive career also extended beyond the collegiate ranks. He was a member of the U.S. freestyle team from 1986 to 1989. He won a silver medal at the 1989 Pan American Games.

The Vermillion, S.D., native received his bachelor's degree in physical education from Nebraska-Omaha in 1985, with a specialization in exercise science. Manning was the recipient of an NCAA postgraduate scholarship following his graduation from UNO and earned his master's degree in sports administration from North Carolina in 1989.

Manning and his wife, Carrie, were married in August of 2006. Mark has four sons, Matthew, Connor, Ryan and Will.

Bryan Snyder enters his 16th season as a coach for the Nebraska wrestling program and his 14th season as associate head coach in 2024-25. Since returning to the NU staff in 2011, Snyder has helped turn Nebraska's middle weight classes into national powers, as Huskers have earned a total of 32 All-America awards at 157, 165, 174 and 184, in that span.

Snyder was the 2017 Terry McCann Award winner as USA Wrestling's Freestyle Co-Coach of the Year, and serves alongside Nebraska Head Coach Mark Manning as personal coaches for Jordan Burroughs and James Green, in addition to his duties with the NU wrestling team.

From 2011-12 to 2023-24, Snyder helped the Huskers rack up 47All-America honors. Mikey Labriola became the first five-time All-American in Husker wrestling history, Green earned All-America accolades four times, while Robert Kokesh and TJ Dudley each ended their careers as three-time All-Americans. Green and Kokesh also collected the first two Big Ten titles in school history in 2014, Kokesh added a second one in 2015, Silas Allred in 2023, and Ridge Lovett tallied another in 2024.

In 2019-20, Snyder helped Nebraska to a second-place finish at the Big Ten Championships, the team's best finish at the event. A program-high eight Huskers garnered All-America honors, including Chad Red Jr. earning his third award and Taylor Venz, Isaiah White and Mikey Labriola picking up their second awards. In his first season at NU as a coach, Snyder played a key role in helping Burroughs

In his first season at NU as a coach, Snyder played a key role in helping Burroughs win his second national championship with a perfect 36-0 record. Snyder also helped Burroughs win the 201174-kilogram freestyle World Championship in Istanbul, Turkey, becoming the first U.S. wrestler to win a freestyle title since 2006. Additionally, Snyder helped Burroughs win the freestyle gold medal at the 2012 London Olympics as well as the 2013 and 2015 FILA World Championships. Burroughs also represented the United States in the 2016 Olympic Games in Rio. Most recently, Snyder helped Burroughs to gold at the 2021 World Championships. He also helped Green to bronze at the 2015 World Championships and silver at the 2017 World Championships.

Snyder, an Easton, Pa., native spent the 2009-10 season as the head assistant coach at Arizona State and helped guide five Sun Devils to the NCAA Championships in Omaha. Snyder began his coaching experience as an assistant at Harvard in 2002-03, while returning to the Husker wrestling program as a graduate assistant coach for two seasons (2003-04 and 2004-05), as NU went 38-5-1 in duals and finished fifth at the 2004 NCAA Championships. He helped coach eight All-Americans at NU during that time.

Snyder graduated from Nebraska with a bachelor's degree in sociology and communication studies in 2002. He earned a Master of Arts in 2005 before earning a Ph.D. in 2012.

One of the most decorated wrestlers in program history, Snyder owns the best winning percentage all-time at Nebraska with a mark of .925, compiling a 136-11 record from 1999 to 2002. A member of Nebraska's 100-win club, he claimed All-America accolades and a Big 12 championship all four years, while finishing as the NCAA runner-up at 157 pounds in 2001 and 2002.

He amassed more than 30 wins in a season three times, including his 43-3 record as a sophomore that stands as the second-best single-season mark in school history. A four-time NWCA All-Academic selection, Snyder was named the 2002 Nebraska Male Student-Athlete of the Year and was also a four-time first-team academic All-Big 12 selection.

Prior to Nebraska, Snyder was a three-time state place-winner and a 1997 state champion at Easton (Pa.) High School. He finished with a 112-12 record and was one of the nation's most highly regarded recruits.

Former NCAA Champion and Olympic medal winner Tervel Dlagnev enters his second season as Nebraska's assistant coach in 2024-25, after serving as the team's volunteer assistant in 2021-22 and 2022-23.

"We are extremely excited to announce the addition of Tervel," Coach Manning said. "He brings a wealth of knowledge and experience to Nebraska, will provide another piece to our coaching staff and will add value to our student-athletes' experience on and off the mat."

In his first season as an assistant coach, Dlagnev helped heavyweight wrestler Nash Hutmacher qualify for the NCAA Tournament.

One of the nation's best heavyweight freestyle wrestlers in history, Dlagnev won the Olympic bronze medal at the 2012 London Olympic Games and placed fifth in the 2016 Rio Olympic Games. He also won World bronze medals for the United States in 2009 and 2014 and was a 2011 Pan American Games and 2008 University World Champion. In college, Dlagnev was a two-time NCAA Champion and four-time All-American at the University of Nebraska-Kearney.

A native of Arlington, Texas, Dlagnev came to Nebraska after serving as an assistant coach at Ohio State University, where he was hired before the 2016-17 season. Dlagnev has also worked with athletes at the Ohio Regional Training Center.

Former Nebraska wrestling legend James Green enters his second year as a full-time assistant coach for the Husker wrestling program.

A native of Willingboro, N.J., Green joins Manning, associate head coach Bryan Snyder and assistant coach Tervel Dlagnev for the 2024-25 season.

"We're extremely excited about James, Chandell, Glory and Aubrey being back in Lincoln," Manning said. "The attitude, work ethic and commitment to excellence that James competed with both as a Husker and a six-time USA Wrestling World Team member gives our student-athletes a prime example of someone to imitate. His leadership as one of the world's top competitors, coupled with his coaching experience provides our program with an amazing asset as we continue our march to the top. James' passion and heart for Nebraska Wrestling will serve us well."

In June 2023, Green announced he was coming out of retirement and will return to train at the Nebraska Wrestling Training Center (NWTC) after spending 14 months as USA Wrestling's National Freestyle Developmental Coach in Colorado Springs, Colo.

"I am extremely grateful and excited to have the opportunity to be a part of the Husker Wrestling staff," Green said. "I have learned a lot in my short time with USA Wrestling and look forward to sharing my knowledge with the current and future Nebraska wrestlers. As an alum, I've always imagined giving back to the program that has given so much to me. I am really grateful for Coach Manning giving me this opportunity. Go Big Red!"

As a Husker, the 2014 Big Ten Champion became just the second four-time All-American in school history as he placed seventh twice and third twice at NCAAs. On the professional side, he represented the United States on the World Team at the 70kg spot from 2015 to 2021, winning bronze in 2015 and silver in 2017. Green was named to the 2024 World Team, and competed at the World Championships in Albania.

The Nebraska wrestling team has added Brandon Bradley as Director of Operations heading into the 2024-25 season. In three seasons, UWW accomplished a third-place finish at the 2013 NCAA DIII Tournament, with six wrestlers earning All-America honors.

Originally from Richmond, Virginia, Bradley earned his bachelor's degree from North Carolina at Pembroke in exercise and sport science in 2010 and his master's degree in health, human performance and recreation from Wisconsin-Whitewater in 2013. 2024-25 NEBRASKA SEASON NOTEBOOK

HUSKERS TO FACE STRONG SCHEDULE

The Nebraska wrestling team hosts Big Ten foe and reigning national champion Penn State (Jan. 17) at the Devaney Center. The Huskers will face six of the top-25 finishers from last season's NCAA Championships.

The Big Red will open the season at home against Utah Valley on Nov. 8. Then NU hits the road for two duals and two invitationals. The Huskers visit North Carolina to face Campbell and North Carolina on Nov. 15, before taking on the Navy Classic on Nov. 23 and the Cliff Keen Invitational on Dec. 6 and 7. On Dec. 20, NU will host Augustana and in-state competitor UNK in one evening. The Big Red will finish non-conference duals with a road matchup at Northern Iowa (Jan. 5), who finished 14th at last year's NCAA Championships.

Conference competition will consist of eight duals, four home and four away. The Big Ten matchups will open at home on Jan. 11, as the Huskers host Minnesota. Less than a week later, Nebraska welcomes Penn State (Jan. 17), for the first time since the 2019 season.

The following weekend, NU takes on Michigan on Jan. 24 and Michigan State on Jan. 26. The Wolverines are another top conference and national competitor, after finishing the 2023-24 season in third at the NCAA Championships. Returning to the Bob Devaney Sports Center, the Huskers close out January with Wisconsin on Jan. 31.

On Feb. 7, the Big Red take on preseason No. 2 Iowa in Iowa City. The Huskers will have their final home dual on Feb. 16, hosting the Hoosiers before concluding the regular season on the road, at Purdue on Feb. 23.

The Big Ten Championships will be held March 8-9, at Welsh-Ryan Arena in Evanston, Ill. The 2024-25 NCAA Championships will be held in Philadelphia at the Wells Fargo Center, March 20-22.

LOVETT LOOKS TO EARN FOURTH ALL-AMERICAN AWARD

A 149-pound senior from Post Falls, Idaho, Ridge Lovett is working to become the sixth four-time Husker All-American. Lovett is one of 16 three-time All-Americans in the history of Nebraska wrestling. Last season, he claimed the Big Ten Championship before his sixth-place finish at NCAAs cemented his All-America status. Lovett enters his senior season with a career record of 76-19.

FOUR ALL-AMERICANS RETURN TO LEAD NU

Nebraska will be guided by a strong group of veteran returners in 2024-25. NU loses only two senior starters, while returning eight starters for the 2024-25 campaign. Brock Hardy, Ridge Lovett, Caleb Smith and Antrell Taylor all return as All-Americans, as well as Bubba Wilson, Lenny Pinto and Silas Allred who look to capitalize on last year's success. Nine total Huskers qualified for the NCAA Championships in 2023-24 and eight were seeded in the top 20 of their weight classes.



In his senior season, Big Ten champion and two-time All-American Ridge Lovett (149) will look to build on his sixth-place finish at the 2024 NCAA Championships.

DUAL EXPERIENCE A PLUS FOR NU

The Huskers have 12 wrestlers this season with dual experience, including All-Americans Brock Hardy, Ridge Lovett, Caleb Smith and Antrell Taylor. Along with the four aforementioned wrestlers, Jacob Van Dee, Lenny Pinto and Silas Allred return as NCAA qualifiers who gained significant dual experience last season. As a team, NU won 12 of its 14 duals overall and six of its eight Big Ten duals.

FRESHMEN SUCCESS

Projected 197-pound starter Camden McDanel is one of only three Huskers on the current roster to start his freshman season, joined by junior Brock Hardy and senior Ridge Lovett. In 2019-20, Lovett wrestled to a seventh-place Big Ten finish and an NCAA appearance, while Hardy finished the 2020-21 season with a 3-3 dual record. James Green was the most recent Husker wrestler to earn All-America honors as a freshman, finishing seventh at the 2012 NCAA Championships.



NEBRASKA'S COACHING HISTORY


Nebraska has had only 16 head coaches in 101 years of wrestling history, including current Husker coach Mark Manning. Combining for 761 dual wins, NU coaches have always set a standard of excellence in the wrestling community. Dr. R.G. Clapp was the Huskers' first wrestling coach and led the team for 11 years before moving on to promote wrestling with the National Wrestling Coaches Association. Jerry Adam coached Nebraska for the majority of the 1930's and 1940's, before giving way to B.R. Patterson.

Orval Borgialli headed the Huskers for 14 years from 1964 to 1978, amassing 72 dual wins, and Bob Fehrs took over the team until 1985. Fehrs finished with a .648 dual-winning percentage with 95 career dual wins at Nebraska. Tim Neumann racked up 199 dual victories from 1985 to 2000 before Manning took over. Manning has amassed a 294-107-3 mark in Lincoln and is the winningest coach in program history.



Bob Fehrs patrolled the mat for the Huskers from 1978 to 1985, racking up 95 dual wins and coaching 11 Nebraska wrestlers to All-America honors.



Tim Neumann coached Nebraska from 1985 to 2000, producing five top-10 finishes at the NCAA Championships, 40 Husker All-Americans and four NU national champions.



Nebraska's first wrestling coach, Dr. Raymond G. Clapp (1911-26), was more than just a mentor for the first athletes who enjoyed the sport at the university. He was a prominent figure locally and internationally in the world of wrestling.

In the 1890s, Clapp distinguished himself as an all-around athlete while a student at Williston Seminary and at Yale University, starring in football, track, gymnastics and tennis.

It was as a track athlete at Yale that he rose to national and world prominence. Clapp won the IC4A pole vault title twice, annexed the national A.A.U. championship, earned a Canadian title and in 1898, he topped all performances to set a then-world mark in the vault of nearly 12 feet.

Dr. Clapp's interest and ability in gymnastics probably were more responsible than any other one thing in creating his great interest in collegiate wrestling. In addition to his many athletic distinctions, Clapp was crowned the allaround individual gymnastics champion of the Eastern Intercollegiate Association in 1889.

As a member and eventual chairman of the NCAA Wrestling Rules Committee, Clapp was largely responsible for the efficient organization of collegiate wrestling tournaments in the 1930s and 1940s. Clapp pioneered the system that is used to run many of the meets that take place even today.

While Ed Gallagher was building wrestling popularity in the Southwest, and Charlie Mayser was doing likewise in the East and Midwest, Dr. Clapp initiated college wrestling at the University of Nebraska in the earliest days of the sport, serving as head coach from 1911 to 1926.

Known widely as a leader in the promotion of collegiate wrestling, Clapp served in the administrative branch of the National Collegiate Wrestling Association for numerous years.

In 1932 and 1936, Clapp was secretary of the American Olympic Wrestling Committee and in 1940 was elected chairman of the committee. As chairman of the USA-Pan American Wrestling Committee and the committee representative to the 1942 Pan-American Games Committee, Clapp became increasingly prominent in the wrestling community.

For over 30 years, Clapp freely and willingly gave his time and energy to popularize collegiate wrestling.





TROY DANNEN

Director of Athletics

Troy Dannen, a leading voice in collegiate athletics with extensive experience as an athletic director and deep ties to the Midwest, is in his first year as Nebraska's Director of Athletics. Dannen was hired on March 20, 2024, and has hit the ground running in Lincoln.

Nebraska Athletics enjoyed success during Dannen's first championship season, as the Husker baseball program won its first Big Ten Tournament title and reached the 40-win plateau for the first time since 2014 while the Husker track teams put together impressive showings. The Husker men won the Big Ten Outdoor title and earned their best NCAA Championship finish since 2016 with a 13th-place finish, while the Husker women posted their second straight top-10 NCAA finish and placed ninth at the national meet. Nebraska finished 22nd in the final 2023-24 Learfield Director's Cup, the program's highest finish since 2010.

Dannen has been a leader in charting the course for a new era of collegiate athletics, serving from 2021 to 2023 as a member of the NCAA Constitution Committee and the Division I Transformation Committee. Dannen also previously served as the chair of the NCAA Football Competition Committee and was an Executive Committee member of the Football Oversight Committee. In total, Dannen has served on seven NCAA committees.

In 2022, Dannen was a finalist for Sports Business Journal's Athletic Director of the Year award, and he received the Distinguished American Award from the Sugar Bowl Chapter of the National Football Foundation.

Dannen came to Lincoln after serving as Director of Athletics at the University of Washington. He helped guide the Huskies' transition to the Big Ten Conference and oversaw a football program that reached the College Football Playoff National Championship Game in January of 2024.

He arrived at Washington in the fall of 2023 after serving as Director of Athletics at Tulane University since 2015. While at Tulane, Green Wave student-athletes earned 49 All-America honors, a national championship, 21 conference championships and 41 postseason appearances.

In 2022-23, Tulane football won its first American Athletic Conference football championship and won the Cotton Bowl over USC, which was ranked ninth in the nation at that time. The men's basketball program won 20 regular-season games for the first time in two decades. Additionally, men's tennis advanced to its sixth NCAA Tournament in seven years, both bowling and beach volleyball finished ranked in the top 20, and baseball won the conference championship.

Tulane's football program participated in an unprecedented three consecutive bowl games from 2018 to 2020, winning back-to-back bowl games for the first time in 128 years of football at the University.

In the classroom, Tulane student-athletes excelled at a high-level. At the end of the 2022-23 academic year, over 68 percent of Green Wave student-athletes earned a 3.0 GPA or better, with a 93 percent Graduation Success Rate and a record-setting department Academic Progress Report of 992, with seven teams earning a perfect 1000 APR score.

Dannen spearheaded fundraising efforts and numerous capital projects at Tulane. He helped secure the largest unrestricted gift in Tulane Athletics history, an endowment gift that funded the operation of a new sport (sailing), and a \$10 million lead gift for capital renovations, which was the second-largest gift in department history. In addition, marketing and licensing revenue grew four-fold, and in 2022-23, Tulane football, basketball and volleyball set ticket sales and revenue records. Under Dannen's leadership, the Green Wave Club Annual Fund grew by 40 percent in terms of donors, and 45 percent in terms of dollars.

Increases in fundraising and major gift donors positively impacted capital project development and completion. A \$13 million renovation to the Reilly Natatorium, home of the swimming and diving program, as well as \$8 million in renovations to locker rooms and the sports medicine area inside the Wilson Center were completed in 2023. Dannen also oversaw construction of a new dining facility, weight room, basketball and volleyball locker rooms. Tulane also completed a \$2.4 million academic center renovation and a \$5 million television and digital production center.

Dannen came to Tulane after serving eight years as the Director of Athletics at the University of Northern Iowa (UNI) from 2008 to 2015. During his tenure, the Panthers enjoyed success at both the conference and national levels, highlighted by an NCAA Sweet 16 appearance in 2010 by the UNI men's basketball team. During his eight-year tenure, UNI was recognized with 39 All-Americans, 13 Coaches of the Year and nine Missouri Valley Conference (MVC) Players of the Year. UNI football, men's basketball, women's basketball, volleyball and softball combined to reach 15 NCAA tournaments and 20 postseason berths during that stretch. For his efforts, Dannen was recognized as NACDA's FCS Athletic Director of the Year in 2014.

Prior to his time at UNI, Dannen served as the Iowa Girls High School Athletic Union's Executive Director for seven years, overseeing 400 high schools and 10 sports.

Dannen grew up on a farm just outside Marshalltown, Iowa, and graduated from UNI in 1989 with a degree in communications. He is married to Amy, and they have four children: Elle, Emily, Holly and William.

KEITH ZIMMER

Executive Associate A.D. - Life Skills 38th Season

Keith Zimmer is in his 38th year at Nebraska, where he directs the Life Skills Department, serves as a Sport Administrator, and is a member of the Executive Staff. Zimmer provides direct sport oversight and supervision to men's basketball and softball. He has represented Nebraska on various campus, conference, and NCAA committees.

After starting his Nebraska career in academic support, Zimmer pioneered Nebraska's award winning Life Skills program which focuses on the total person development of all Husker student-athletes. Nebraska's comprehensive Life Skills program provides required life skills education from day one through graduation, career development, leadership, and community service opportunities, ultimately preparing student-athletes for life after graduation.

Nebraska Life Skills offers four leadership groups in which nearly 175 student-athletes are selected annually to advance leadership skills, ensure student-athlete welfare, and improve marketability. Every Husker team has representation on the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) which serves as the voice of the entire student-athlete population. Inner Circle is an emerging leadership development group with a focused annual curriculum whereas N-Volved is a social climate discussion group addressing cultural competency, inclusive excellence, mental health, and other critical topics. Husker Healers guides pre-health student-athletes in their journey to enhance marketability for

admission into professional programs and health-related careers.

Community service continues to be a pillar of the Husker Life Skills department. In addition to team service projects and individual community requests, Life Skills directs Husker Heroes, the Nebraska Football Road Race benefitting pediatric brain cancer, School is Cool and American Education Week, local hospital visits, the annual Sportsmanship Pep Rally, holiday outreach, and Link-N-Leaders. Since 2015, Nebraska Life Skills has coordinated an annual international service trip allowing Huskers from all sports the opportunity for an impactful service trip beyond the borders. In 2024, the "No Filter" International Service trip expanded to two locations with one experience in May and the other in August.

Under Zimmer's leadership, Nebraska's one-of-a kind Post Eligibility Scholarship program was initiated providing \$7,500 to Huskers who have lettered at Nebraska, graduated from Nebraska, and exhausted athletic eligibility at Nebraska. Graduates can use funds for an approved career-related internship, UNL study abroad program, graduate school anywhere in the country, or to initiate their own business.

During his Nebraska tenure, Zimmer has been selected as the Life Skills Administrator of-the-Year and a recipient of the Chancellor's Award for Exemplary Service. Zimmer is an honorary member of both Golden Key National Honor Society and Mortar board. Zimmer earned his bachelor's degree from Wayne State College and master's in education from Springfield College (Mass.). He and his wife Michelle, have two sons, Logan and Caden.



Dr. Rodney D. Bennett began his work as the 21st chancellor of the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, Nebraska's flagship, Big Ten research institution on July 1, 2023. He is a 30-year veteran of higher education with a track record of growing research, increasing student success and building impactful partnerships.

In his first year as Chancellor, the University experienced rising retention and graduation rates, demonstrated positive signs related to enrollment, and expanded its research and creative activity efforts.

In Fall 2023, almost 4,700 first-time freshmen enrolled at UNL—an increase of 1.3 percent from 2022. 75.4 percent of those first-time freshmen are from Nebraska.

Spring 2024 overall enrollment reversed a trend of five straight years of spring enrollment declines.

Scott M. Fuess Jr. was named the University of Nebraska-Lincoln Faculty Athletics Representative on Feb. 21, 2020.

As faculty athletics representative, Fuess serves as a liaison between the Office of the Chancellor and Athletic Department. His areas

Over the last five years, UNL retention from first to second year has increased 2.3 percentage points and four-year graduation rate has increased more than 8.5 percentage points.

In 2023, the university's total research expenditures grew to \$366 million, a 37 percent increase over the past decade. UNL has also experienced tremendous growth in externally sponsored federal funding, increasing to a record \$163 million in 2023.

Chancellor Bennett came to Nebraska after nine years of successful leadership at the University of Southern Mississippi. During his tenure as president, USM was reclassified from a Carnegie R2 to an R1 university, signaling growth in research prestige and funding. Dr. Bennett also invested in programs to support student recruitment, retention and outcomes, including for the 30 percent of USM students who were first-generation. His efforts led to an improvement in the university's six-year graduation rate.

Prior to his role at the University of Southern Mississippi, Dr. Bennett served at the University of Georgia for more than a decade. He was the senior administrator for student programs and services for Georgia's 34,000-plus students; oversaw \$150 million in capital projects; and made key staff and programmatic investments in extracurriculars, mental health programs and other areas to better support students.

Dr. Bennett has also been the dean of students at Winthrop University in Rock Hill, South Carolina, and associate dean of student life at Middle Tennessee State University. Chancellor Bennett values community leadership and service. He has served on numerous boards, including the Mississippi Aquarium, Northeast Georgia Girl Scouts of America, Catholic Health East (Philadelphia), and St. Mary's Health Care System in Athens, Georgia. He is a
