SCOUTING THE MICHIGAN STATE SPARTANS

No. 20 Michigan State brings a 12-2 record and a 2-1 Big Ten mark to Lincoln in search of its first-ever road win over Nebraska. The Spartans, who were No. 19 in Monday's NCAA NET rankings, have had a full week to prepare for the Huskers following a 77-59 home win over Purdue on New Year's Day. MSU opened Big Ten play with a 68-66 win over Iowa in East Lansing (Dec. 15), before dropping a 72-66 decision to unbeaten and No. 8 Maryland (Dec. 29).  
Coach Robyn Fralick has designed an aggressive Spartan defense that ranks seventh nationally with 25.8 turnovers forced per game. MSU ranks eighth nationally in turnover margin (+10.0) and leads the nation in free throw attempts per game (25.7). The Spartans also carry a plus-4.9 rebound margin.  
Graduate forward Julia Ayrault leads Michigan State with team-best averages of 16.2 points and 7.8 rebounds per game. Junior guards Theryn Hallock (12.1 ppg) and Jocelyn Tate (8.4 ppg, 5.1 rpg) offer both athleticism and experience for the Spartans. Tate has been an efficient scorer early this season as the only Michigan State player to start all 14 games. Hallock leads the Spartans with 3.1 assists and ranks third on the team with 16 three-pointers.  
Transfers Grace VanSlooten and Jaddan Simmons have made major impacts. VanSlooten, a 6-3 junior from Oregon, ranks second on the team in scoring (13.5 ppg) and rebounding (7.2 rpg), while leading the Spartans with 18 blocks. She has started 12 of 13 games, coming off the bench for the first time in the win over Purdue (Jan. 1). Simmons, a 5-9 graduate from Arizona State, has added 7.0 points, 4.4 rebounds, 2.9 assists and 2.1 steals.  
Two more transfers, Emma Shumate (Ohio State) and Nyla Hampton, have added depth as part-time starters. Shumate leads MSU with 18 three-pointers. Hampton spent three seasons playing for Fralick at Bowling Green before spending last season as a starter at Ball State.

HUSKERS AIM FOR UPSET OF NO. 20 SPARTANS

Nebraska goes hunting for its first win over a top-25 opponent this season when the Huskers collide with No. 20 Michigan State tonight at Pinnacle Bank Arena.  
The Big Red improved to 2-2 in the Big Ten with a 72-61 win over Penn State on Sunday at PBA. Callin Hake led the Huskers with 16 points, six rebounds and four assists, while Alexis Markowski added her sixth double-double of the season with 13 points, 10 rebounds and three big blocks.  
Britt Prince rounded out three Huskers in double figures with 13 points, four rebounds, four assists and a career-high four steals as Nebraska improved to 11-4 overall and snapped a three-game losing streak - all to top 20 teams.  
While Nebraska's first three meetings with ranked foes came on the road this season, the Spartans are the first top-25 team to visit Lincoln since the Huskers knocked off No. 2 Iowa, 82-79, Feb. 11, 2024.  
The victory over the Hawkeyes started Nebraska's current 13-game home-court winning streak that has included four straight home wins over Big Ten foes. NU's last 12 home wins since beating Iowa have all been by double digits, including all 10 of the Husker home victories this season.  
Like Nebraska, Michigan State is unbeaten at home this season, and the Spartans own quality neutral site wins over California (78-72) and Vanderbilt (78-70) along with a 68-66 home win over Iowa (Dec. 15). However, MSU's last two results away from home have included a 72-66 loss at Maryland (Dec. 29) and an 82-67 loss to Alabama at the West Palm Beach Classic (Dec. 20).  
**NEBRASKA VS. MICHIGAN STATE SERIES**  
• Nebraska leads the all-time series with Michigan State 12-6 with all 18 meetings as Big Ten foes.  
• The Huskers won both games against the Spartans a year ago, including a 73-61 victory over MSU in the quarterfinals of the Big Ten Tournament at the Target Center in Minneapolis (March 8, 2024). Nebraska also opened Big Ten play last season with an 80-74 win at Michigan State (Dec. 9, 2023).  
• Alexis Markowski produced double-doubles in both wins over the Spartans last season, including 22 points and 12 rebounds at the Big Ten Tournament, after putting up 13 points and 17 rebounds in East Lansing.  
• Jessica Petrie (11) and Natalie Potts (10) both produced double figures at the Breslin Center, while Potts added a double-double of her own with 15 points and 11 rebounds in the Big Ten Tournament victory for the Huskers.  
• Moira Joiner (18) and Theryn Hallock (17) led the Spartans in last year's first meeting, while Julia Ayrault erupted for 25 points against the Big Red at the conference tournament.  
• In the last meeting in Lincoln, the Huskers fought to a 71-67 win over the Spartans (Feb. 2, 2023). It is the only game at PBA between NU and MSU in the last seven contests. On Feb. 27, 2021, Michigan State chose not to play on Nebraska's Senior Day, despite traveling to Lincoln. As a result, NU played three consecutive games in the series at East Lansing before the February 2023 game. The Huskers won the previous meeting in Lincoln, 82-71, Feb. 17, 2019.  
• Nebraska is 6-0 all-time in Lincoln against Michigan State.  
• The Huskers are 4-5 against Michigan State all-time in East Lansing and 2-1 against the Spartans in the Big Ten Tournament, including an 85-58 pounding of MSU on March 8, 2014, on the way to the Big Ten Championship.  
• Seven of Nebraska's 12 wins have been by 10 points or less, while each of MSU's last three wins have been by single digits.

THREE THINGS TO WATCH

- 1** Alexis Markowski enters tonight's game at No. 4 in Husker history with 1,076 rebounds after getting 10 boards in Sunday's win over Penn State. Janet Smith (1979-82) owns the school record with 1,280 rebounds, while Emily Cady (2012-15) ranks second with 1,114. First-team All-American and 2014 Big Ten Player of the Year Jordan Hooper ranks third with 1,110. Markowski needs four rebounds to catch Nebraska men's basketball career leader Venson Hamilton (1,080, 1996-99).
- 2** Markowski owns 46 career double-doubles, including six this season. Husker All-Americans Jordan Hooper (2011-14) and Kelsey Griffin (2006-10) are tied for second in career double-doubles with 40.
- 3** Nebraska has hit 10 or more three-pointers 44 times in the last 123 games, including a school-record 20 three-pointers in a win over South Dakota in Sioux Falls. The Big Red also hit 14 threes in a win over Southeastern Louisiana (Nov. 9), 12 threes in the win over Kansas City (Nov. 26) and 12 more in a win over Minnesota (Dec. 8). Nebraska leads the Big Ten with 8.3 three-pointers made per game this season.
- Nebraska is 11-4 in its last 15 meetings with the Spartans, although 10 of the 15 games have been played away from Pinnacle Bank Arena.
- FACTS & FIGURES**
- Nebraska has won its first 10 home games at Pinnacle Bank Arena this season by an average of 24.7 points per game.
  - The Huskers lead the Big Ten in three-point field goal percentage (.361) and three-pointers made per game (8.3), despite hitting just 22-of-87 threes (.253) over the last four games combined. Nebraska opened Big Ten play by draining 12-of-28 threes in an 84-65 win over 15-1 Minnesota.
  - The Huskers have hit at least one three-pointer in 514 straight regular-season games dating back to a loss at UTEP on Dec. 20, 2009. Nebraska has hit at least two three-pointers in 393 consecutive games.
