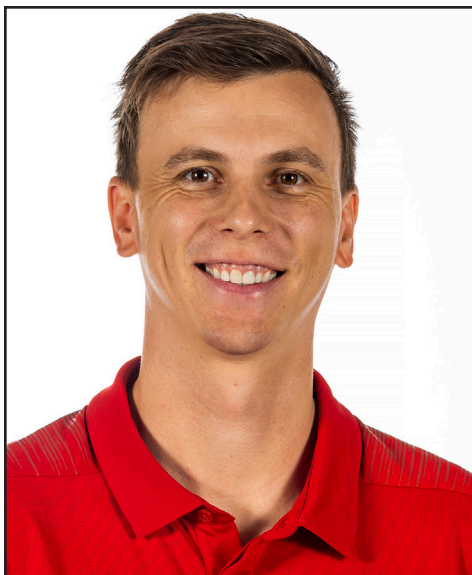

# PETER KOBELT

## Head Coach >> Second Season | Ohio State (2014)

Peter Kobelt was named the 12th head coach of the Husker men's tennis team at the conclusion of the 2023-24 season.

Kobelt served as the interim head coach the previous season, leading the 2023-24 team to one of the best seasons in Nebraska history. Kobelt accomplished the best record by a first-year coach in program history, leading the Big Red to a 17-10 record. The feat of 17 single-season wins was a program best since 1990, and Kobelt led the Huskers to the first Big Ten Tournament Semifinals in school history.

A successful collegiate tennis athlete himself, Kobelt led junior Calvin Mueller to claim the 2023 Big Ten Singles Individual Championship. Mueller also earned a 27-12 singles record, which notched him at No. 5 in program history for most singles wins in a season, and was named to the All-Big Ten First Team.

"Peter has provided outstanding leadership for our men's tennis program over the past year, and we are excited to name him our permanent head coach," Dannen said. "Our men's team had one of the best seasons in Nebraska history and we are confident the program will continue an upward trajectory under Peter's guidance."

"Peter has shown the ability to develop and improve the young men already in the program and has an excellent recruiting plan to attract elite future prospects to the University of Nebraska."

Prior to his role as interim head coach, the Ohio State alum served as assistant coach at NU for the 2022-23 season. Kobelt helped the team reach an Intercollegiate Tennis Association (ITA) season-high ranking of 45th and stayed in the top 50 rankings for much of the 2022-23 season.

Before coming to Nebraska, Kobelt served as the volunteer assistant coach at Kentucky for two seasons (2020-22), helping the Wildcats finish as the 2022 NCAA runner-up and a No. 7 national ranking. He was responsible for implementing the doubles strategy and on-court fitness for the entire team and coached the No. 1-ranked ITA player, Liam Draxl, to the semifinals of the 2021 NCAA men's singles competition.

Kobelt played collegiately and professionally. On the ITF and ATP men's professional tours, he peaked with a No. 332 singles and No. 378 doubles ranking. Kobelt was a tennis standout at Ohio State, finishing his career as one of the most successful men's tennis players in school history. He led Ohio State to its first NCAA National Indoor Team Championship in 2014 and was selected as the 2014 ITA National Indoor Championships Most Outstanding Player. During his career, he held the ITA No. 1 singles ranking and the No. 2 doubles ranking.







# BRETT FORMAN

## Assistant Coach >> First Season | Michigan State (2018)

Brett Forman joins the Nebraska men's tennis coaching staff as an assistant coach ahead of the 2024-25 season. Forman has spent the past four collegiate seasons in coaching positions at Wisconsin, Wichita State and UNC Charlotte.

"We are extremely excited to have Brett join our family," head coach Peter Kobelt said. "Brett brings an elite skill set with him that is going to help push the program forward. His impact will be felt immediately. He will be a great leader on and off the court as well as in the Lincoln community."

In just one year with the Badgers, Forman helped two student-athletes achieve career national rankings in singles. As interim head coach with Wichita State, he recruited and coached Kristof Minarik, who was named the 2022 ITA Central Region Rookie of the Year.

Forman has spent the 2022-23, 2023-24 seasons at UNC Charlotte. In his time with the 49ers, the team achieved a program career high end-of-season ITA ranking of 46. The Charlotte team also claimed a conference title, winning the AAC tournament, and made the NCAA tournament for the second time in program history.

Prior to his assistant coaching positions, Forman spent two seasons as a volunteer assistant coach, one with his alma mater, and one at Princeton. Forman graduated from Michigan State in 2018, where he was a four-time letterwinner and three-time captain on the men's tennis team. In his time as a Spartan, he tallied over 100 career match wins, and led the team in single victories in his captain seasons. Forman was also selected for Academic-All Big Ten three times, and named Big Ten Athlete of the Week his senior season.

Forman earned a Bachelors in Marketing in 2018, as well as a Masters in Sports Leadership and Coaching in 2020, both at MSU. He is originally from Troy, Mich.

"I'd like to thank Pete and Keith (Zimmer) for the opportunity to join the Husker family," Forman said. "I'm excited to help make an impact on our student-athletes on and off the court and to continue the quest of winning championships here at Nebraska."

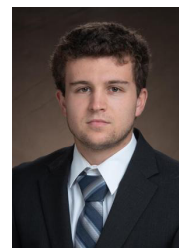

# TROY DANNEN

## Director of Athletics

Troy Dannen, a leading voice in collegiate athletics with extensive experience as an athletic director and deep ties to the Midwest, is in his first year as Nebraska's Director of Athletics. Dannen was hired on March 20, 2024, and has hit the ground running in Lincoln.

Nebraska Athletics enjoyed success during Dannen's first championship season, as the Husker baseball program won its first Big Ten Tournament title and reached the 40-win plateau for the first time since 2014 while the Husker track teams put together impressive showings. The Husker men won the Big Ten Outdoor title and earned their best NCAA Championship finish since 2016 with a 13th-place finish, while the Husker women posted their second straight top-10 NCAA finish and placed ninth at the national meet. Nebraska finished 22nd in the final 2023-24 Learfield Director's Cup, the program's highest finish since 2010.

Dannen has been a leader in charting the course for a new era of collegiate athletics, serving from 2021 to 2023 as a member of the NCAA Constitution Committee and the Division I Transformation Committee. Dannen also previously served as the chair of the NCAA Football Competition Committee and was an Executive Committee member of the Football Oversight Committee. In total, Dannen has served on seven NCAA committees.

In 2022, Dannen was a finalist for Sports Business Journal's Athletic Director of the Year award, and he received the Distinguished American Award from the Sugar Bowl Chapter of the National Football Foundation.

Dannen came to Lincoln after serving as Director of Athletics at the University of Washington. He helped guide the Huskies' transition to the Big Ten Conference and oversaw a football program that reached the College Football Playoff National Championship Game in January of 2024.

He arrived at Washington in the fall of 2023 after serving as Director of Athletics at Tulane University since 2015. While at Tulane, Green Wave student-athletes earned 49 All-America honors, a national championship, 21 conference championships and 41 postseason appearances.

In 2022-23, Tulane football won its first American Athletic Conference football championship and won the Cotton Bowl over USC, which was ranked ninth in the nation at that time. The men's basketball program won 20 regular-season games for the first time in two decades. Additionally, men's tennis advanced to its sixth NCAA Tournament in seven years, both bowling and beach volleyball finished ranked in the top 20, and baseball won the conference championship.

Tulane's football program participated in an unprecedented three consecutive bowl games from 2018 to 2020, winning back-to-back bowl games for the first time in 128 years of football at the University.

In the classroom, Tulane student-athletes excelled at a high-level. At the end of the 2022-23 academic year, over 68 percent of Green Wave student-athletes earned a 3.0 GPA or better, with a 93 percent Graduation Success Rate and a record-setting department Academic Progress Report of 992, with seven teams earning a perfect 1000 APR score.

Dannen spearheaded fundraising efforts and numerous capital projects at Tulane. He helped secure the largest unrestricted gift in Tulane Athletics history, an endowment gift that funded the operation of a new sport (sailing), and a \$10 million lead gift for capital renovations, which was the second-largest gift in department history. In addition, marketing and licensing revenue grew four-fold, and in 2022-23, Tulane football, basketball and volleyball set ticket sales and revenue records. Under Dannen's leadership, the Green Wave Club Annual Fund grew by 40 percent in terms of donors, and 45 percent in terms of dollars.

Increases in fundraising and major gift donors positively impacted capital project development and completion. A \$13 million renovation to the Reilly Natatorium, home of the swimming and diving program, as well as \$8 million in renovations to locker rooms and the sports medicine area inside the Wilson Center were completed in 2023. Dannen also oversaw construction of a new dining facility, weight room, basketball and volleyball locker rooms. Tulane also completed a \$2.4 million academic center renovation and a \$5 million television and digital production center.

Dannen came to Tulane after serving eight years as the Director of Athletics at the University of Northern Iowa (UNI) from 2008 to 2015. During his tenure, the Panthers enjoyed success at both the conference and national levels, highlighted by an NCAA Sweet 16 appearance in 2010 by the UNI men's basketball team. During his eight-year tenure, UNI was recognized with 39 All-Americans, 13 Coaches of the Year and nine Missouri Valley Conference (MVC) Players of the Year. UNI football, men's basketball, women's basketball, volleyball and softball combined to reach 15 NCAA tournaments and 20 postseason berths during that stretch. For his efforts, Dannen was recognized as NACDA's FCS Athletic Director of the Year in 2014.

Prior to his time at UNI, Dannen served as the Iowa Girls High School Athletic Union's Executive Director for seven years, overseeing 400 high schools and 10 sports.

Dannen grew up on a farm just outside Marshalltown, Iowa, and graduated from UNI in 1989 with a degree in communications. He is married to Amy, and they have four children: Elle, Emily, Holly and William.

## KORTNE GOSHA

### Senior Associate A.D. - Capital Planning/Tennis Administrator

Long-time college administrator Kortne Gosha joined Nebraska Athletics in July of 2024 as the Senior Associate Athletic Director for Capital Planning and Facilities. Gosha previously served as the Deputy Director of Athletics at Tulane University.

At Tulane, Gosha oversaw numerous areas within the department including facilities and maintenance services, capital projects/construction, facilities master planning, event management and guest services, camps/clinics, risk management and information technology. In addition, Gosha served on the executive leadership staff and served as the sports administrator for football, baseball, sailing, cross-country, track and field. Gosha was a principal lead in the Investing in Excellence capital campaign raising over \$62 million dollars within the first 6 months of the campaign.

Prior to Gosha's time at Tulane, he served as the Vice President and Director of Athletics at Florida A&M for three years, starting in December of 2019.

Among his more notable accomplishments was laying the groundwork for the school's landmark decision to move from the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) to the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) in the fall of 2022 along with developing a comprehensive strategic plan "Strike" for the department and raising \$13 million in philanthropic support.

In his time with the Rattlers, Gosha was known for his innovative push of marketing and external efforts for Florida A&M including securing first of its kind, a landmark deal with the LeBron James Nike Brand as the official uniform for the athletic department.

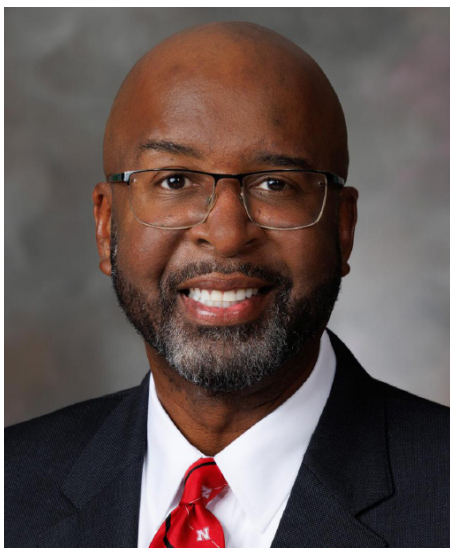
Prior to Florida A&M, Gosha spent two years with Miami Athletics as the Associate Athletic Director for Facilities & Operations. He oversaw day-to-day facility and event operations, grounds, custodial, information technology, access control, and capital projects. During his time with the Hurricanes, Gosha assisted in over \$50 million in capital improvement projects.

Gosha spent seven years at Middle Tennessee State. He served as the Associate Athletic Director and Chief Operating Officer (2014-18) as well as the Assistant Athletic Director of Equipment Operations (2012-14) during his tenure. Gosha is credited for renegotiating the department's multi-media rights contract, a new contract with apparel provider Nike, and oversight of \$40 million in capital improvement projects while overseeing an annual \$36 million operating budget. In 2018, Gosha wrote and implemented the sale of alcohol at athletic venues as the first institution in the state of Tennessee to serve on campus. He oversaw equipment operations, sports medicine, strength and conditioning, contracts, facilities, and all athletic events including post-season competitions. He also assists the Director of Athletics as sports administrator for football and basketball, while serving as the primary sport administrator for baseball, men's, and women's track.

Gosha made his way to Murfreesboro from Jacksonville State where he worked three years as an equipment manager. He served as the Gamecocks student manager from 2007 until July of 2011 before being hired full-time in August of 2011 as the coordinator of operations and facilities. In his role, Gosha handled the day-to-day operations, planned team travel, drafted athletic department apparel contracts, served as camp director for summer, coordinated use of athletic facilities, events and coordinated the \$47 million Paul Snow Stadium project before leaving his post in 2012.

Gosha earned his degree in political science from Jacksonville State University in 2011 and a masters in sports management from Southern New Hampshire University in 2014. He was also accepted into the 2015 class of Collegiate Athletic Leadership Symposium, graduate of the 2016 Sports Management Institute, 2018 NCAA Dr. Charles Whitcomb Leadership Institute, & 2019 LEAD1.

The Birmingham, Ala. native has memberships to the Athletic Equipment Managers Association, Minorities Opportunities Athletics Association, Collegiate Events & Facilities Management Association and Collegiate Business Management Association.



# RODNEY BENNETT

## University of Nebraska-Lincoln Chancellor

Dr. Rodney D. Bennett began his work as the 21st chancellor of the University of Nebraska–Lincoln, Nebraska's flagship, Big Ten research institution on July 1, 2023. He is a 30-year veteran of higher education with a track record of growing research, increasing student success and building impactful partnerships.

In his first year as Chancellor, the University experienced rising retention and graduation rates, demonstrated positive signs related to enrollment, and expanded its research and creative activity efforts.

- In Fall 2023, almost 4,700 first-time freshmen enrolled at UNL—an increase of 1.3 percent from 2022. 75.4 percent of those first-time freshmen are from Nebraska.

- Spring 2024 overall enrollment reversed a trend of five straight years of spring enrollment declines.

- Over the last five years, UNL retention from first to second year has increased 2.3 percentage points and four-year graduation rate has increased more than 8.5 percentage points.

- In 2023, the university's total research expenditures grew to \$366 million, a 37 percent increase over the past decade. UNL has also experienced tremendous growth in externally sponsored federal funding, increasing to a record \$163 million in 2023.

Chancellor Bennett came to Nebraska after nine years of successful leadership at the University of Southern Mississippi. During his tenure as president, USM was reclassified from a Carnegie R2 to an R1 university, signaling growth in research prestige and funding. Dr. Bennett also invested in programs to support student recruitment, retention and outcomes, including for the 30 percent of USM students who were first-generation.

His efforts led to an improvement in the university's six-year graduation rate.

Prior to his role at the University of Southern Mississippi, Dr. Bennett served at the University of Georgia for more than a decade. Chancellor Bennett values community leadership and service. He has served on numerous boards, including the Mississippi Aquarium, Northeast Georgia Girl Scouts of America, Catholic Health East (Philadelphia), and St. Mary's Health Care System in Athens, Georgia. He is a member of Kappa Alpha Psi fraternity and Past Sire Archon for Sigma Pi Phi fraternity, The Boulé.

Dr. Bennett earned a bachelor's degree in mass communication, a master's degree in educational administration, and an education specialist degree from Middle Tennessee State. He earned his Doctor of Education degree from Tennessee State University.



# SCOTT FUESS JR.

## Faculty Athletic Representative

Scott M. Fuess Jr. is in his fifth year as Nebraska's Faculty Athletics Representative, having started on July 1, 2020.

As faculty athletics representative, Fuess serves as a liaison between the Office of the Chancellor and Athletic Department. He also serves on the Athletic Department's Executive Staff. His areas of focus in the role include the welfare of student-athletes, NCAA and Big Ten Conference compliance, maintaining the positive relationship between athletics and faculty, developing and responding to NCAA legislative proposals and representing the university at related NCAA and Big Ten Conference meetings. This past year he was appointed to a four-year term on the NCAA DI Committee on Academics.

The half-time position - which was restructured to an expected term of five years - reports directly to the University of Nebraska System President and consults with Director of Athletics Troy Dannen. He splits time between faculty representative duties and academic responsibilities.

Fuess, the Steinhart Distinguished Professor of Business and former chair of the College of Business' economics department, has worked at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln since 1986. He serves on the Faculty Senate's Intercollegiate Athletics Committee, having chaired the committee for 2018-19 and a sub-committee in 2017-18. He also has served on numerous Big Ten Conference committees, including the Sports Management Committee, the Compliance and Reinstatement Committee and the Legislative Review Committee. From 2022 to 2024, he served as Chair of the B1G Compliance and Reinstatement Committee.

Fuess earned a bachelor's degree from the University of Delaware, as well as master's and doctoral degrees from Purdue University. His research interests are labor economics, the economics of collegiate sports, and the economy of Japan. He has earned numerous "Distinguished Teaching" awards. In 2016 he received the UNL College of Business "Distinguished Service" award.

## 2023-24 SEASON RECAP

After making it to the program's first ever Big Ten Tournament Semifinal, the Nebraska men's tennis team (17-10, 5-4 Big Ten) ended their campaign with the most single-season wins since 1990, after being consistently ranked, and developing several stand-outs.

NU concluded the season within the Top 50 teams nationally at No. 49. The final win of the season was a 4-2 upset over the #26 Fighting Illini, which pushed the Big Red to accomplish 17 wins in the 2023-24 season, the most in the past 34 years. The Huskers also made their first and only appearance in the Big Ten Tournament semifinals and claimed the winningest men's season at the Dillon Tennis Center with an 11-3 home record.

Off the courts, all 11 Huskers were named the Tom Osborne Citizenship Team, and for the third-straight year, the men's tennis team received the Herman GPA Award. The honor is given to the team with the highest GPA across Husker athletics, and men's tennis has won the award 11 times total, tied with cross country for the most by a team.

Numerous Huskers had seasons to remember, setting records, concluding careers, and claiming accolades.

Junior Calvin Mueller had an outstanding and decorated season, reaching 27 singles wins and being named to the All-Big Ten First Team. Mueller was named Big Ten Player of the Week twice in the season, the only current Husker to do so. The international business administration major was most recently ranked No. 71, the highest Husker ranking since 2012, with records of 27-12 in singles and 18-12 in doubles. The 2023 Big Ten Individual Singles Champion tallied six ranked-upset wins against conference opponents, most notably taking down #34 Ronald Hohman, #28 Justin Boulais and #42 Hunter Heck. Mueller was also named to the Big Ten Tournament team. His 27 singles wins notch Mueller at No. 5 in program history for top singles wins in a season.

Anton Shepp was the other Husker to receive the Big Ten Player of the Week, consistently playing No. 1 doubles, and No. 1 or No. 2 singles. The junior reached 45 career singles wins and 46 career doubles wins in his first season with the Big Red. The UT-Arlington transfer put up two ranked wins in singles, #51 Enzo Aguiard and #99 Kenta Miyoshi, both in straight sets. Shepp, partnered with Nic Wiedenhorn, also claimed two ranked doubles wins, against #31 Burton/Vandecasteele and #35 Lutschaunig/Boulais. Shepp and Wiedenhorn were ranked nationally at No. 74 on May 2 by ITA. Senior captain Shunya Maruyama tallied 20 singles wins in his fifth season with the Big Red, to tally a combined total of 137 singles and doubles wins as a Husker. Maruyama also claimed the No. 8 spot on the top career singles wins record list, with 70 career singles wins.

Senior captain Nic Wiedenhorn reached 46 career doubles wins in his final campaign with the Big Red. Roni Hietaranta reached 40 career singles wins, and captain Lars Johann tallied his 30th.

Despite a strong finish, the Huskers did not make it to the NCAA tournament, and have not had an appearance since 2011. The Big Red will begin its 2024-25 campaign in the fall, with individual competition.

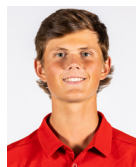

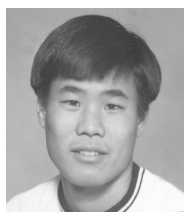

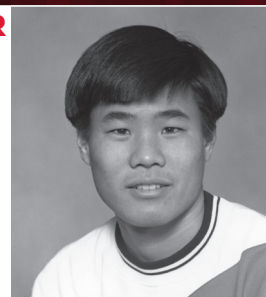

## ATHLETIC MEDICINE

Nebraska features one of the most well-trained and highly skilled athletic medicine staffs in the country. Under the guidance of Head Athletic Trainer and Physical Therapist Jerry Weber (pictured, bottom) and Football Head Athletic Trainer Chris Peduzzi, the Nebraska athletic medicine staff consists of 16 full-time athletic trainers, six graduate assistant athletic trainers, as well as a team of primary care, sports medicine, and orthopedic physicians.

Nebraska's medical facilities have long been among the nation's best, and Husker Athletic Medicine will have a new home beginning this fall with the completion of a new facility which will feature state-of-the-art equipment including recovery modalities. Currently, NU's athletic medicine center is housed in the Tom and Nancy Osborne Athletic Complex. In addition to Nebraska's North Stadium facility, Hawks Field, Bowlin Stadium, Pinnacle Bank Arena, the Bob Devaney Sports Center and the Nebraska Soccer and Tennis Complex all feature athletic medicine facilities.

## SPORT PSYCHOLOGY

Continuing its commitment to complete care for all student-athletes, Nebraska has a staff of five in-house mental health providers specializing in performance psychology who work directly with student-athletes, teams and coaches. Under the leadership of Director of Sport Psychology Dr. Brett Haskell, the Huskers' sport psychology staff provides counseling, psychological services, mental skills training, team-building and leadership development services for each of Nebraska's 24 sports and more than 600 Husker student-athletes. The staff works directly with student-athletes to help them develop skills to enhance personal well-being, address mental health and train psychological skills to optimize performance.

The Life Skills staff provides proactive education fostering the acclimation to the University of Nebraska, promote total person development best preparing student-athletes for life after sport, and serve as a powerful recruiting resource for each team.

#### INDIVIDUAL MEETINGS

Every Nebraska student-athlete meets individually with a Life Skills staff member to create and maintain a personal resume throughout their collegiate career. Since it is critical that a student build a resume throughout their collegiate career, each student-athlete creates a resume during their first year on campus. This allows the student-athlete to learn ways to best improve their resume and take steps each year to strengthen the resume. As a student-athlete moves through their collegiate career, they will meet with their Life Skills Counselor in follow-up meetings, allowing for resume updates. Nebraska athletics is proud to boast a 100% resume completion rate.

#### CAREER COMMITMENT & NETWORKING

Nebraska Life Skills organizes an annual Student-Athlete Career Fair Networking Night and other career events aimed at connecting Huskers with companies desiring competitive, hard-working, accountable candidates. Athlete Network and UNL's Handshake Link provide opportunities to explore career opportunities across the country.

#### COMMUNITY OUTREACH

Nebraska student-athletes readily accept the role-model challenge, collectively giving more than 8,000 hours annually to impact thousands across the state of Nebraska. Outreach events include but are not limited to hospital visits, mentoring, school assemblies, statewide rallies, Make-A-Wish, School is Cool and Husker Heroes. During the 2019-20 academic year, 296 Husker student-athletes completed at least six service projects earning spot on the coveted Tom Osborne Citizenship Team.

#### LEADERSHIP

Nebraska Life Skills provides student-athletes with countless opportunities to enhance leadership skills while distinguishing themselves from the competition. Student-athletes can be members of the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee, Nebraska Football Road Race, Inner Circle, N-Vest or N-VOLVED. UNL offers more than 600 recognized student organizations allowing athletes to collaborate with other campus leaders for common goals. Nebraska Life Skills has funded and coordinated an annual service abroad trip that allows 20 student-athletes to work together toward a common goal while enriching cultural competencies.

#### DIVERSITY AND INCLUSION

The Life Skills program also is responsible for all Diversity and Inclusion initiatives for Husker Athletics. Since 2016, the Diversity and Inclusion Summit has reached all student-athletes and staff with programming emphasizing respect, acceptance and unity. Numerous other special events are coordinated in collaboration with campus departments highlighting the diversity within Husker Nation. N-Vest is a new mentoring program aimed at fostering successful transitions while connecting participating athletes with campus or community mentors to aid in personal and career development.

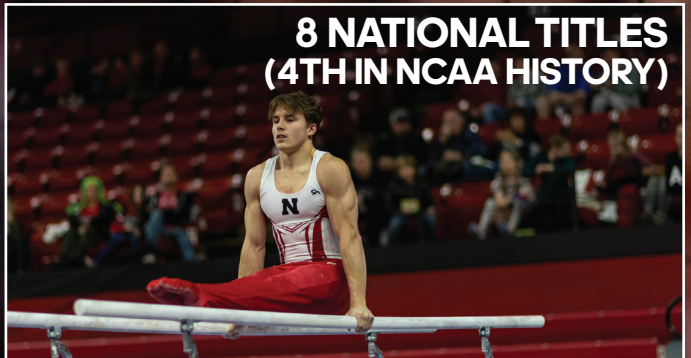

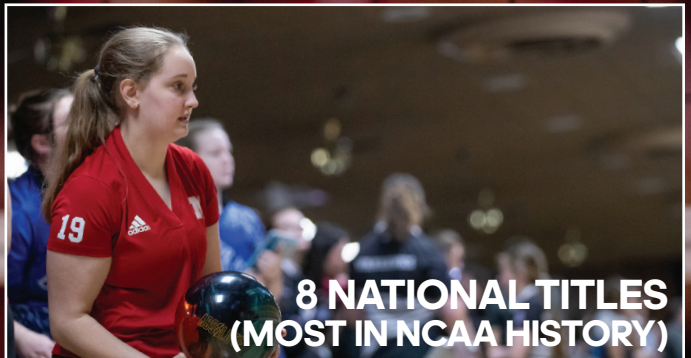

### ACADEMIC COUNSELING

A team of 14 academic staff members are in place to monitor daily academic progress, promote skill development, receive consistent course feedback, assist with the advising/registration process and monitor eligibility and progress toward graduation.

### TUTORIAL SUPPORT

A tremendous resource for all academic abilities, unlimited tutorial support is available from day one up to college graduation in all subject areas. Tutorial support is provided both in-person and virtually. Nebraska's tutorial program is certified by the College Reading and Learning Association.

### STUDY HALL

Student-athletes attend a supervised study hall within the Herman Student Life Complex that features day, evening and weekend hours. Student-athletes are required to complete a specific number of study hours each week and/or a list of academic tasks as determined by their academic counselor, learning specialist and coach.

### MENTORING

Academic staff serve as mentors to all incoming student-athletes and select returning student-athletes. The student-athletes meet with their mentor weekly to develop time management skills, gather and report academic progress information and discuss academic success strategies.

### EDUCATIONAL ASSESSMENTS

Assessments are administered upon the request of the student-athlete, academic counselor or coach. Learning specialists are available to administer and score informal assessments, which include a reading comprehension and a writing assessment. When more in-depth assessments are necessary, referrals are made to a neuropsychologist who conducts the assessments. If it is determined a student-athlete has a learning disability or another medical condition that impedes the student from reaching their academic potential, appropriate accommodations are implemented by the Office of Services for Students with Disabilities.

### STUDENT-ATHLETE ORIENTATION

Each new student-athlete attends an orientation at the beginning of their academic career. Student-athletes are introduced to staff, faculty, administrators and a variety of resources that help facilitate the transition into college while enhancing awareness of support services in the Athletic Department and across campus.

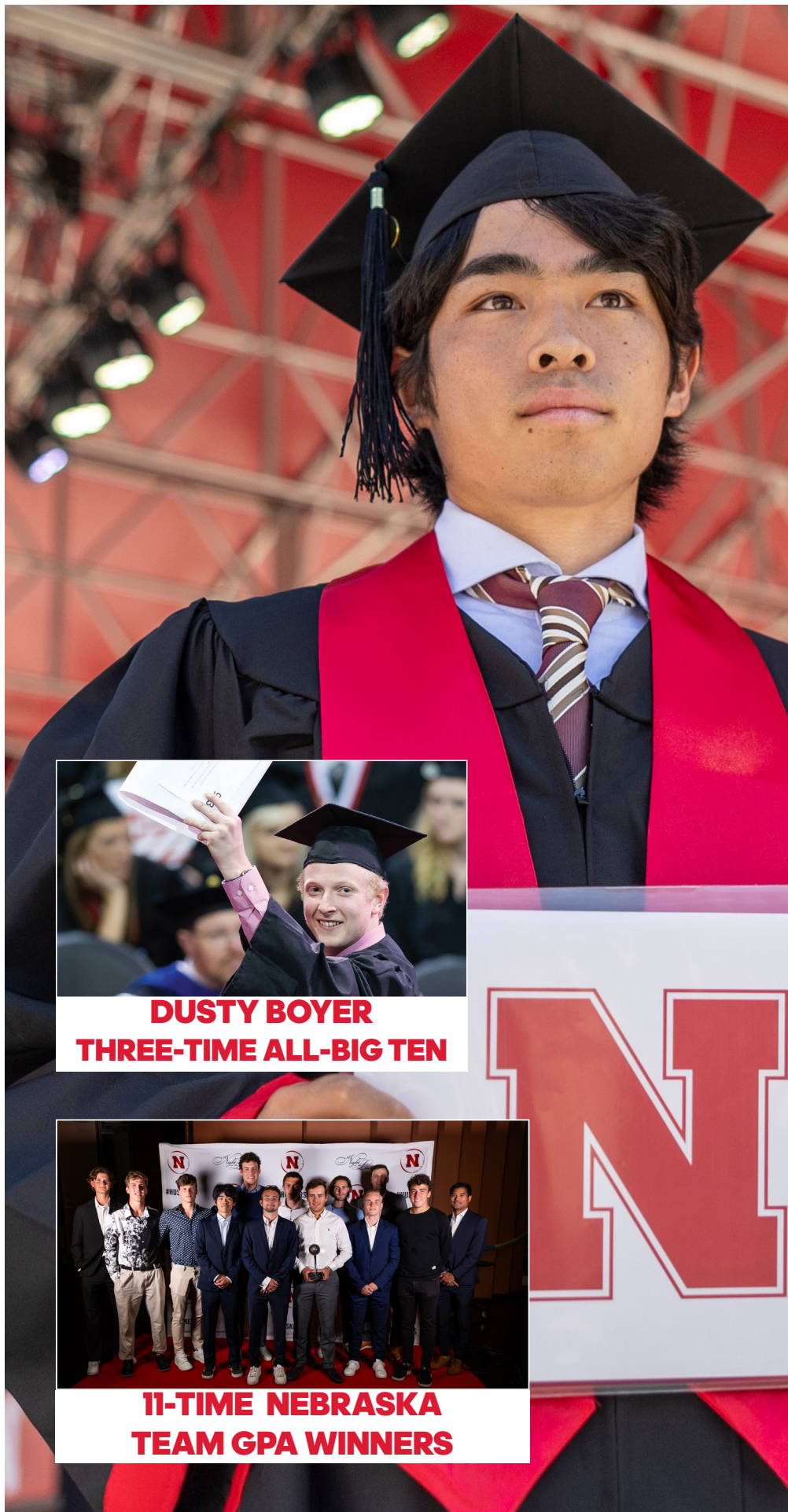
### PERSONAL COUNSELING

Student-athletes will find a supportive and caring environment at Nebraska. Transitional issues, stress management, time management, academic focus and problem resolution are all addressed in a proactive manner throughout the year. If necessary, counseling referrals are also made to designated practitioners.

### COMPUTER RESOURCES

All student-athletes are provided the opportunity to have a laptop for use during their academic career at Nebraska. The Herman Student Life Complex has printers and desktop computers available for student-athletes to use in the facility. A full-time computer specialist is on-site and available to assist with technology needs.

## THE UNIVERSITY OF NEBRASKA

Chartered in Lincoln by the Nebraska Legislature in 1869, the University of Nebraska was expanded in 1968 into a university system now comprising four campuses under the guidance of a Board of Regents and a central administration. The flagship University of Nebraska–Lincoln is an educational institution of international stature. Nebraska is classified within the Carnegie “R1: Doctoral Universities – Highest Research Activity” category. Nebraska is also a land-grant university and a member of the Association of Public and Land-grant Universities. The university is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission.

## BIG TEN ACADEMIC ALLIANCE

As a member of the Big Ten, the University of Nebraska–Lincoln is a member of the Big Ten Academic Alliance (BTAA), formerly the Committee on Institutional Cooperation, which is the academic consortium of the universities in the Big Ten Conference. The BTAA includes all 14 Big Ten Institutions and partners with the University of Chicago. The Big Ten Academic Alliance and the institutions together have annual research expenditures topping \$11.5 billion — more than the Ivy League and the University of California System combined — and they educate a total of nearly 600,000 students with approximately 50,000 faculty members.
