#### **HUSKERS CLOSE REGULAR SEASON AT TERPS INVITE**

The Nebraska women's golf team wraps up its 2024-25 regular season schedule by traveling to College Park, Md., for the Terps Invitational (April 6-7).

The two-day, 54-hole event on the 6,244-yard, par-72 layout of the University of Maryland Golf Course opens with two rounds of continuous play on Sunday, April 6, beginning with a shotgun start at 7:30 a.m. (CT). The tournament concludes with a shotgun start for Monday's final round at 7:30 a.m. (CT).

The Huskers will be part of a 14-team field that features Big Ten counterparts Maryland, Michigan and Penn State, along with Delaware, Georgetown, Harvard, High Point, Howard, James Madison, Navy, Notre Dame, Richmond and Southern Illinois.

Miu Takahashi leads Nebraska to Maryland. The senior from Nasu-machi, Japan, was the Big Ten Golfer of the Week (March 20), after leading Nebraska with a fifth-place finish with a 215 (-1) at the Spring Break Shootout (March 17-18). She was also NU's top finisher at the Clemson Invitational (March 28-30), tying for 45th in a loaded 84-player field with a 218 (+8). Takahashi carries a 74.56 stroke average as the only Husker to compete in all 27 rounds this season.

Hannah Kono will play out of the No. 2 spot in the Husker lineup in Maryland. The sophomore from Enkoping, Sweden tied for 15th with a 223 (+10) in Florida and carries a 74.46 stroke average over 24 rounds for the Big Red this season. She was Nebraska's No. 2 finisher at the Clemson Invitational, tying for 60th with a 223 (+7) including a career-best final-round 69 (-3).

True freshmen Danica Lundgren and Olivia Lovegrove will occupy the No. 3 and No. 4 spots in the Husker lineup at Maryland. Lundgren owns a pair of top-five finishes this season, including a tie for third with a career-best 207 (-9) at the PDI Intercollegiate - hosted by UCF to open the spring (Feb. 2-4). Lovegrove, who carries Nebraska's best stroke average (74.33) over six rounds, will be making her first career collegiate lineup appearance.

Sophomore Arden Louchheim will round out Nebraska's five-player lineup in Maryland, while freshman Eden Lohrbach will compete as an individual outside the Husker lineup.

#### SUTHERLAND ANNOUNCES RETIREMENT AS HUSKER HEAD COACH

Nebraska Head Coach Jeanne Sutherland announced her retirement on March 14, effective at the conclusion of the 2024-25 season.

Sutherland, who is completing her third season as the head coach of the Huskers after spending her first season at Nebraska as associate head coach in 2021-22, has helped at least one Husker golfer to an NCAA Regional appearance in each of her first three seasons in Lincoln. She was named Nebraska's head coach on May 5, 2022, after helping the Huskers to an NCAA Regional appearance. The 2024 Huskers also qualified for NCAA Regional competition as a team.

"I want to thank Jeanne Sutherland for her leadership of our women's golf program and her contributions to the University of Nebraska," Athletic Director Troy Dannen said. "Jeanne has had an outstanding record throughout her college coaching career, both here at Nebraska and at her previous schools. We look forward to our team finishing the season strong and wish Jeanne all the best in her retirement. We will begin the search for our next Nebraska Women's Golf coach immediately."

Sutherland came to Nebraska after spending 10 seasons (2011-21) as the head coach at SMU. She previously spent 15 seasons as the head coach at Texas A&M (1992-2007). She has led 19 teams to NCAA Regional qualification during her award-winning career.

"I'm very lucky to have been a coach for 32 years," Sutherland said. "Some days are tough, but even those are well worth it when you're with wonderful women who want to play their best and pull together as a team. There's a lot that I'll miss about coaching, but number one is getting

the opportunity to spend time with motivated players and watch them learn and mature. With that being said, we still have one third of our season left to play some great golf, so I'm all in on a strong finish."

Sutherland has coached three All-Americans, five individual conference champions and three conference players of the year. In 2018, Sutherland was named the inaugural winner of the WGCA Kim Evans Award. She also earned the WGCA Founders Award in 2017. A four-time conference coach of the year at Texas A&M (3 Big 12, 1 Southwest Conference), Sutherland was also a two-time NCAA Regional Coach of the Year (1997, 2007). She led 13 Texas A&M teams to NCAA Regional play, including four NCAA Championship appearances in 1997 (17th), 2004 (24th), 2005 (22nd) and 2006 (19th).

Sutherland coached SMU to five straight NCAA bids (2013, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017).

In her first 27 seasons as a head coach, Sutherland helped her golfers earn 46 WGCA Scholastic All-America awards and 121 academic all-conference honors, while her Texas A&M and Nebraska teams carried perfect 100 percent graduation rates.

## HUSKER ALL-AMERICAN SMITH CLAIMS LPGA TOUR CARD

Former Husker Kate Smith-Stroh captured her LPGA Tour Card for the 2025 season by tying for 19th at the LPGA Q-Series Final Qualifying Stage in Mobile, Ala., Dec. 10.

Smith-Stroh, an All-American and Big Ten Champion for Nebraska as a fifth-year senior in 2021, put together five solid rounds in Alabama to finish with a total of 350 (-8) with rounds of 69-71-67-72-71 on the Robert Trent Jones Golf Trail - Magnolia Grove to secure a spot on the world's premier women's golf tour next season.

One of the best golfers in Nebraska history, Smith-Stroh has been competing on the Epson Tour since 2022. During the 2023 season, she competed in 22 events and made 19 cuts, while recording four top-10 finishes. She tied for second at the Four Winds Invitational. She added 19 events while making 13 cuts in 2024, including two more top-10 finishes.

She was ranked 33rd in the Race for the Card entering Q-Series Final Qualifying.

The native of Detroit Lakes, Minn., made history during her time at Nebraska. The two-time first-team All-Big Ten award winner stormed to the Big Ten Championship with a school-record 64 (-8) in the final round at TPC River's Bend in Maineville, Ohio. She was named a third-team All-American by Golfweek and an honorable-mention All-American by the WGCA before becoming the first Husker to compete in the Arnold Palmer Cup, helping the United States to a title. She was also the first Husker to compete in the Augusta National Women's Amateur in 2021.

#### **BOUVET EARNS LET CARD**

Former Husker Vanessa Bouvet claimed her Ladies European Tour (LET) card for the 2025 season with a top-20 finish at the Lalla Aicha Q-School in Morocco, Dec. 16-20.

Bouvet, who competed at Nebraska from 2018-19 to 2021-22, put together an impressive five-round total of 353 (-10) at the Royal Golf Marrakech and Al Maaden Golf Marrakech in Morocco to finish in a six-way tie for 19th among 101 players who advanced to the final stage of qualifying in the European Q-School.

Playing out of her home country of France, Bouvet opened with rounds of 70 and 69 before settling for a 76. She bounced back with a 70 before closing with a final-round 68 to secure her LET card.

As a Husker senior in 2021-22, Bouvet tied for 24th at the Big Ten Championship. She played out of the top of the lineup and finished with a team-best 73.17 stroke average during the fall with four top-20 finishes. She closed the year with a 74.67 average over 27 rounds. She had six career top-10 finishes as a Husker.

A big hitter who called both France and Brunei home before coming to Nebraska, Bouvet burst onto the collegiate scene as a freshman by posting a 75.79 average over 24 rounds for the Huskers. Off the course, Bouvet was a three-time Academic All-Big Ten selection. She earned her bachelor's degree as an advertising and public relations major from Nebraska in May of 2022.

# THIELE, LUNDGREN SWEEP TOP SPOTS AT BIG O CLASSIC

Lauren Thiele shot a final-round 75 to hold off Husker teammate Danica Lundgren by one stroke to claim the individual title at the Big O Classic in Omaha on Oct. 1.

Thiele, a redshirt sophomore from Wahoo, Neb., closed with a 54-hole total of 223 (+7) on the par-72, 6,019-yard layout at the Oak Hills Country Club.

Lundgren, a true freshman from Austin, Texas, fired a one-over-par 73 in Tuesday's final round to end her tournament at 224 (+8) just one shot back of Thiele.

#### TAKAHASHI HEADLINES GROUP OF FIVE RETURNING HUSKERS IN 2024-25

Nebraska's most experienced golfer, Miu Takahashi leads the Huskers in 2024-25. The senior from Nasu-machi, Japan, ranks third in NU history with a 74.76 stroke average over 125.5 career rounds.

She produced a career-best 209 (-7) at the PDI Intercollegiate - hosted by UCF (Feb. 2-4). Takahashi's effort in Orlando included a career-best 67 (-5) in the opening round.

Takahashi was a key player in helping the Huskers qualify for the 2023 NCAA Raleigh Regional, posting a 73.49 stroke average over 37.5 rounds as a sophomore.

She owns 11 career top-25 finishes, including six top-10 showings with a tournament title at the 2022 Dale McNamara Invitational.

Takahashi was also the first international golfer to be named Nebraska Women's Amateur of the Year in 2023, after winning the 49th Nebraska Women's Amateur Championship. She also qualified for the 123rd U.S. Women's

Amateur in 2023, carding rounds of 78 and 73 in Los Angeles.

Takahashi produced a 73.91 stroke average over 32 rounds in 2023-24, including a careerbest 211 (-5) to tie for 29th at the Westbrook Spring Invitational (Feb. 25-26).

# KONO FIRES CAREER-BEST SCORES AT WESTBROOK SPRING INVITATIONAL

Hannah Kono shot a career-best 213 (-3) to lead Nebraska with a tie for 21st individually at the Westbrook Spring Invitational in Peoria, Ariz. (Feb. 23-24).

Kono's performance included career-best first and second rounds of 70 (-2) on the 6,248-yard layout of the Vistas Course at the Westbrook Village Golf Club.

Kono closed the fall with a then-career-best 218 (+2) to finish 16th at the Hurricane Invitational in Coral Gables, Fla. The sophomore from Enkoping, Sweden, put together consistent rounds of 73, 72 and 73 on the par-72, 6,175-yard layout at the Biltmore Golf Club to earn her best finish as a Huskers.

She opened her Husker career with a tie for 18th at the Badger Invitational with a 224.

# TRIO OF TRANSFERS MAKING INSTANT IMPACT FOR BIG RED

Division I transfers Hannah Kono (Oakland), Lauren Thiele (Wichita State) and Symran Shah (Virginia Tech) earned spots among Nebraska's top six golfers in qualifying for the seasonopening Badger Invitational (Sept. 8-10).

Kono, who finished sixth at the 2024 Horizon League Championships, was Nebraska's No. 2 qualifier and top finisher in Wisconsin. The sophomore from Enkoping, Sweden, was a two-time Horizon League Golfer of the Week during the spring season while helping the Golden Grizzlies win the conference tournament title and qualify for 2024 NCAA Regional play.

Thiele was the No. 2 golfer for the Shockers with a 76.07 spring stroke average last season. The redshirt sophomore from Wahoo, Neb., competed for the Huskers at the season-opening Badger Invitational before winning the Big O Classic in Omaha (Sept. 30-Oct. 1). She continues the richest family tradition in Nebraska women's golf as the fourth sister to earn a lineup spot for the Huskers, following her older sisters, Haley (2016-20), Hannah (2018-20) and Lindsey (2021-24). The 2024-25 campaign marks the 10th consecutive season that a Thiele sister has been on the NU roster.

Shah came to Lincoln after a redshirt season at Virginia Tech in 2023-24. The redshirt sophomore from Carrollton, Texas, played two rounds for the Hokies as a freshman in 2022-23. She was NU's No. 4 finisher while playing as an individual outside the Husker lineup at the Badger Invitational (Sept. 8-10). She tied for 54th with a 235 (+19) in a 75-player field in Wisconsin before adding an 11th-place finish with a 234 (+18) at the Big O Classic.

She shot a season-best 223 (+10) to tie for 15th at the Spring Break Shootout (March 17-18).

# TALENTED FRESHMEN CONTRIBUTING FOR HUSKERS IN 2024-25

Nebraska's freshman class features the top high school golfer in Iowa, one of the best young golfers in Nebraska, an all-state golfer from Texas and a talented player from Illinois.

The four youngest Huskers combined for four individual state championships and five state team titles during their prep careers.

Four-time Iowa High School Athletic Union Player-of-theYear Eden Lohrbach was a three-time Iowa Class 3A state champion at Ames High School. She made her college debut by leading Nebraska at the Red Raider Invitational (Sept. 24-25) with a three-round total of 229 (+13) to tie for 50th. She added another 229 (+13) at the Jim West Challenge (Oct. 20-21). Lohrbach opened the spring with a 225 (+9) at the PDI Intercollegiate - hosted by UCF (Feb. 2-4), including an even-par 72 in the second round and a 73 in the final round.

Four-time Nebraska Class C all-state choice Olivia Lovegrove from Lincoln Christian High School has been a rising star in the Cornhusker State. The 2022 Class C individual state champion, Lovegrove added a runner-up individual finish as a senior in 2023. She was also a three-time Nebraska Super-State selection. In the summer of 2024, Lovegrove was the Nebraska Girls Amateur runner-up.

Lovegrove made her collegiate debut with a 223 (+7) to tie for 55th while playing as an individual outside the Husker lineup at the Westbrook Spring Invitational (Feb. 23-24). Her performance included a second-round 70 (-2).

She followed with Nebraska's best finish at the MountainView Collegiate in Tucson, Ariz. (March 2-4). Lovegrove finished 19th at 223 (+7) while competing as an individual. She opened the tournament with a 71 (-1).

Bridget Butler (Barrington, III.) and Danica Lundgren (Austin, Texas) also bring strong credentials to Nebraska. Butler was a three-time all-conference and all-regional golfer while helping Barrington High School to a Class 2A state championship in 2021.

Lundgren was the 2023 Southern Texas PGA Junior Golfer of the Year and captured 55 Southern Texas PGA titles from 2015 to 2023. She was also a first-team Texas University Interscholastic League (UIL) Class 6A all-state selection in 2023 at Vandegrift High School. She helped Vandegrift to state team championships in 2023 and 2024. She made her collegiate debut with a runner-up finish at the Big O Classic (Sept. 30-Oct. 1), closing with a 54-hole score of 224 (+8).

Lundgren made her first appearance in the Husker lineup at the Jim West Challenge (Oct. 20-21), contributing to NU's team score with a 74 (+2) in the final round.

She broke through with a career-best 207 (-9) to tie for third at the PDI Intercollegiate - hosted by UCF (Feb. 2-4). Lundgren's effort included an opening-round 68 (-4), before firing a career-best final-round 67 (-5).

## HUSKERS REPLACING THREE OF TOP FIVE GOLFERS FROM 2024-25 CAMPAIGN

The Huskers are replacing three of their topfive golfers from a year ago, including two-time NCAA Regional-qualifier Kelli Ann Strand.

Strand, a two-time All-Big Ten choice, bypassed her final two seasons of collegiate eligibility to pursue a professional career.

Strand, who was also a two-time WGCA Scholastic All-American and a Big Ten Distinguished Scholar, has made six cuts in eight starts on the Epson Tour. She has made \$23,700, including a tie for seventh in her first career top-10 finish at the Island Resort Championship in Harris, Mich. (June 21-23). She opened with a tie for 12th at the Copper Rock Championship in Hurricane, Utah (May 16-18). She recently tied for 11th with a 214 (-2) at the Murphy USA El Dorado Shootout (Sept. 20) to earn her largest professional payday to date of \$6,682.

The Huskers also lost four-year starters Michaela Vavrova and Lindsey Thiele to graduation. Vavrova competed in 112.5 rounds while helping the Huskers to NCAA Regional appearances in 2021 and 2023. She produced a 75.70 career stroke average, including a career-best 74.48 average over 29 rounds a year ago. She was a two-time Slovakian Player of the Year (2022, 2023).

Thiele added 94.5 rounds over the past four seasons, including a career-best 74.04 stroke average as a senior. The four-time WGCA Scholastic All-American helped the Huskers to NCAA Regional bids in 2021 and 2023, while also earning a Big Ten Postgraduate Scholarship. She was also Nebraska's Female Heart & Soul Award winner as the most dedicated student-athlete across all sports to Nebraska's Life Skills program.

## TALENTED YOUNG DUO SET TO JOIN HUSKERS FOR 2025-26 CAMPAIGN

Nebraska added a pair of talented golfers at the national level with the signing of Kaleigh Babineaux and Ailis Tribolet for the 2025-26 season, Head Coach Jeanne Sutherland announced on Nov. 14.

Tribolet, a senior at Valley Christian in Chandler, Ariz., led her high school boys' team to the 2024 Arizona Interscholastic Association Division III state championship by winning the individual title with a two-round total of 132 (-12), including a final-round 63 (-3) at Aguila Golf Course in Laveen Village.

Ranked No. 73 by Junior Golf Scoreboard, Tribolet competed in the 122nd U.S. Women's Amateur in Chambers Bay, Wash., as a 15-yearold in 2022. She also qualified for the 2023 U.S. Girls Junior Amateur.

Most recently, Tribolet won the Junior Golf Association of Arizona Fall Classic at Lone Tree Golf Course (Nov. 2-3).

Babineaux, a senior at Lake Travis High School in Austin, Texas, recently qualified for the Notah Begay III Junior Golf National Championships by winning the Southern Texas Regional after a two-hole playoff. She went on to win the Foresight Sports Long Drive Challenge prior to the event, before tying for 19th at the championship with a 225 (+9), including an even-par 72 in the opening round at Koasati Pines at Coushatta in Kinder, La. (Nov. 3-5).

As a junior at Lake Travis, Babineaux tied for 16th at the UIL Region IV-6A Championship in the spring.

She spent her first two seasons at Cherokee Trail High School in Aurora, Colo., finishing eighth as a sophomore at the Class 5A state tournament. Babineaux was also the Class 5A Northern Regional Champion as a sophomore in 2023, firing a 66 (-4) at Flatirons Golf Course as the only player to break par.

In the summer of 2023, she was a semifinalist at the Colorado Golf Association Girls Match Play, losing to eventual champion and Colorado signee Brenna Higgins.

# NEBRASKA OWNS FOUR-YEAR STREAK WITH NCAA REGIONAL PRESENCE

Kelli Ann Strand's 2024 NCAA Cle Elum Regional bid marked the fourth consecutive year that the Nebraska women's golf program had at least one representative in NCAA Regional competition. Her tie for 24th marked Nebraska's best regional finish since 2008.

In 2023, Nebraska qualified as a team to the NCAA Raleigh Regional, which marked Nebraska's 13th all-time NCAA Regional berth dating back to the 1994 NCAA West Regional.

The Huskers, who finished ninth at the 12-team NCAA Raleigh Regional, also competed at the 2021 NCAA Columbus Regional, tying for 15th in an 18-team field in Ohio.

In 2022, Kirsten Baete represented Nebraska at the NCAA Stanford Regional. Baete tied for 30th with a three-round total of 220 (75-76-69).

The Huskers made regional appearances in 1994, 1995, 1996, 1997, 2000, 2001, 2002, 2003, 2006, 2007, 2008 and 2021.

Nebraska's highest regional finish came with a fifth-place finish in a 21-team field at the 2003 NCAA Central Regional at Firethorn Golf Club in Lincoln. The Huskers advanced to NCAA Championship appearances in 2000 (19th), 2003 (22nd) and 2006 (20th).

#### **HUSKERS SET PACE IN CLASSROOM**

Nebraska leads the Big Ten and ranks second in NCAA Division I with 365 College Sports Communicators Academic All-Americans all-time across all sports. The Huskers also lead all schools in history with 18 NCAA Top 10 Award winners across all sports.

Nebraska women's golf leads the nation with 98 WGCA Scholastic All-Americans since 1989, including four in 2023-24. Lena Hassert, Arden Louchheim, Kelli Ann Strand and Lindsey Thiele all earned WGCA honors in 2023-24. In addition, transfers Hannah Kono and Lauren Thiele earned WGCA Scholastic All-America awards last season at their schools.

Husker women's golf owns a 100 percent graduation success rate.

## **NEBRASKA WOMEN'S GOLF 2024-25 STATISTICS**
