HUSKER GOLFERS SET SIGHTS ON BIG TEN CHAMPIONSHIP

The Nebraska men's golf team takes aim at the conference title when the Huskers travel to Maryland for the Big Ten Championship, April 25-27.

The three-day, 54-hole tournament at the Baltimore Country Club gets underway with tee times off No. 1 and No. 10 at 8 a.m. (CT) on Friday, April 25, before Saturday's second round continues with the same schedule. Sunday's final round will begin with tee times at 7 a.m. (CT).

The Huskers, who own six top-five tournament finishes this season, head into the conference championship ranked No. 82 nationally. Nebraska is still hunting for its first tournament title of the season, but is coming off a runner-up finish at Ohio State's Robert Kepler Invite (April 18-19).

Nebraska has established a solid five-player rotation during the spring led by Hamish Murray. The senior from Sydney, Australia has produced five top-20 finishes in his last six tournaments and carries a 72.00 stroke average while playing in all 29 rounds for the Huskers this season.

Freshman Brodie Cunningham has contributed four consecutive top-15 finishes, including tying Murray for third at the Bell Bank "Pay It Forward" Collegiate in Litchfield Park, Ariz. (March 24-25). Cunningham owns a 72.15 stroke average over 20 rounds on the season.

Rudy Sautron owns a team-best 71.48 stroke average over 27 rounds on the year. The sophomore from Reunion Island, France, won his Husker debut at the Gopher Invitational and has produced six top-15 finishes this season.

Redshirt sophomore Evan McDermott has added a strong 73.41 stroke average on the season, while notching a trio of top-25 finishes this spring.

Graduate Reed Malleck has added a 74.04 stroke average while recording five top-40 finishes on the year.

The Huskers will need to fire on all cylinders to challenge a Big Ten Championship field that features six top-50 teams nationally, including No. 11 Illinois, No. 13 UCLA, No. 27 Northwestern, No. 36 Oregon, No. 37 Purdue and No. 50 USC.

SAUTRON MAKES MAJOR SPLASH IN WINNING NEBRASKA DEBUT

Rudy Sautron made his NCAA Division I debut as a Husker by capturing the tournament title at the season-opening Gopher Invitational (Sept. 8-9).

The sophomore from Reunion Island, France, who transferred to Nebraska after spending his first collegiate season at NCAA Division II Cameron University in Oklahoma, tied the

Nebraska sophomore tournament record with a 208 (-5) at the Windsong Farm Golf Club.

Sautron's three-round total included an opening-round 69 (-2) that featured Nebraska's first eagle of the season on No. 18. He added a second-round 70 (-1) before closing with a final-round 69 (-2). His 208 matched the NU sophomore record set by former PGA pro Brady Schnell (2004-05) and Seth Porter (1999-2000).

Sautron's effort helped NU to a third-place team finish in a strong 15-team field in Minnesota - Nebraska's best team finish since 2021.

His effort also earned him a share of the first Big Ten Conference Men's Golfer-of-the-Week award for the 2024-25 season announced Sept. 12.

Sautron added a second top-five finish with his tie for third to help the Huskers to another third-place finish in a loaded 13-team field at the Qubein Cup in Greensboro, N.C. (Oct. 14-15). Sautron finished with a three-round total of 213 (+3) that included an opening-round 69 (-1).

He closed the fall by tying his Husker sophomore record with a 208 (-8) at the Steelwood Collegiate (Oct. 26-27), which included a school-record 63 (-9) in the final round.

Sautron added a fourth top-10 finish by tying for eighth at The Johnnie-O at Sea Island (March 17-18) with a two-round total of 139 (-1).

MURRAY OWNS EIGHT TOP-25 FINISHES IN 2024-25

Hamish Murray, a second-year Husker from Sydney, Australia, captured his best finish by tying for third with a season-best 209 (-7) at the Bell Bank "Pay It Forward" Collegiate in Litchfield Park, Ariz. (March 24-25). He added a tie for fifth with a 212 (+2) at the Tiger Intercollegiate (April 7-8). It was Murray's fourth top-10 finish of the season among his eight top-25 showings this year.

Murray opened the spring with a 212 (-4) to tie for seventh at the Palmas Del Mar Collegiate in Puerto Rico (Feb. 9-11). He also tied for seventh with a season-best 209 (-4) at the Git-R-Done Invitational (Sept. 23-24).

He tied for 12th at 215 (-1) at the Badger Invite (Sept. 29-Oct. 1), before closing the fall with another tie for 12th that included rounds of 71-69-71 to finish at 211 (-5) at the Steelwood Collegiate (Oct. 26-27).

He tied for 24th to open the 2024-25 season at the Gopher Invitational (Sept. 8-9).

Murray, who owns 13 top-25 showings as a Husker, fired an NU career-best 66 (-6) in the second round of the Badger Invite (Sept. 30), before matching that score in the final round at Bell Bank (March 25). He earned Big Ten Co-Golfer-of-the-Week honors (March 27) for his performance in Arizona.

Murray, who led Nebraska with a 72.69 stroke average as a junior in 2023-24, carries a 72.00 average through 29 rounds in 2024-25.

He opened his NU career with three top-20 finishes, including a season-best tie for ninth in his Husker debut at the Bearcat Invitational (Sept. 18-19, 2023) in Cincinnati. He ended his first season at NU with five total top-25 finishes.

During the summer of 2024, Murray was the runner-up at the Nebraska Amateur Championship with a four-round total of 274 (-10), trailing only champion Reed Malleck (273, -11).

Murray, who was a 2024 GCAA Scholar All-American and a College Sports Communicators Academic All-District VII selection, also took time during the summer to participate in the Nebraska Life Skills No Filter Service Trip Abroad to Panama.

Murray was ranked among the top 50 golfers in NCAA Division II by Golfstat in 2022-23 and was the Cameron Athlete of the Year across all sports.

MALLECK LEADS HUSKER SWEEP AT 116TH NEBRASKA AMATEUR

Reed Malleck fired a final-round 69 to end with a winning four-round total of 273 (-11) to capture the Nebraska Amateur Championship at the Fremont Golf Club (July 19).

Malleck, a four-year letterman for the Huskers entering the 2024-25 season, put together four consistent rounds (68-68-68) to work his way to his first Nebraska Amateur title. Malleck was the 2020 Nebraska Junior Match Play champion, and the 2022 Nebraska Match Player runner-up.

He led a Husker sweep of the top three spots at the 116th Nebraska Amateur by holding off teammate Hamish Murray (Sydney, Australia) who finished one shot back at 274 (-10), including a final-round 70 (-1).

Evan McDermott (Spring Lake, Michigan), a redshirt sophomore for the Huskers in 2024-25, added a third-place finish at 277 (-7), including a final-round 69 (-2).

Malleck became the 32nd Husker golfer in history to win the Nebraska Amateur Championship, but the first Husker to win the title since Brandon Crick in 2009.

HUSKER ROSTER FEATURES EXPERIENCED LEADERS

Nebraska's 10-man roster features a growing group of experienced, high-character leaders both on and off the course.

Graduate student Reed Malleck returns for his fifth competitive season hoping to help lead the Huskers to an NCAA Regional berth. The reigning Nebraska Amateur champion, Malleck has represented the Huskers twice at the Big Ten Championship. The three-time Academic All-Big Ten choice was a 2024 GCAA Scholar All-American and Nebraska's Big Ten Sportsmanship Award winner in 2023, before earning his bachelor's degree in finance in May of 2024.

Senior Hamish Murray has been a leader on the course, in the classroom and the community. The second-year Husker led Nebraska with five top-25 finishes a year ago before adding GCAA Scholar All-America honors. He was also Nebraska's 2024 Big Ten Sportsmanship Award winner.

Senior Grant Jabenis adds more leadership skills on and off the course. Jabenis has competed in 37 rounds for the Huskers, including an appearance at the 2023 Big Ten Championships. He was also a 2024 Big Ten Distinguished Scholar. He tied for sixth with a 215 (+5) at the Qubein Cup (Oct. 14-15).

Juniors Quinn Yost (47 rounds) and Davis Johnson (32 rounds) add substantial experience. Yost was a 2024 GCAA Scholar All-American, while Johnson has competed for the Big Red at both the 2023 and 2024 Big Ten Championships while adding Academic All-Big Ten accolades.

Evan McDermott, who redshirted in his second season at Nebraska in 2023-24, also has seen significant playing time. The redshirt sophomore has competed in 49 rounds, including all 29 for the Huskers in 2024-25, while adding Academic All-Big Ten honors as a mechanical engineering major in 2024.

NEBRASKA ADDS THREE TALENTED FRESHMEN IN 2024-25

Jackson Benge (Omaha, Neb.), James Ackerman (Leawood, Kan.) and Brodie Cunningham (Glasgow, Scotland) signed letters of intent to join the Husker program on Nov. 8, 2023.

Benge brings a rich family tradition with him from Nebraska high school power Omaha Westside. Benge, whose mother Amy (Roux) was a standout on the Husker women's golf team, helped the Warriors to back-to-back Class A state team titles in 2023 and 2024. The 2022 Nebraska Junior Match Play champion, Benge was a two-time Class A all-state selection (2022, 2023) and

qualified for the 2022 U.S. Junior Amateur. He is also the cousin of Gold Glove winner and World Series champion Alex Gordon, and the nephew of Nebraska men's gym All-American Ted Harris.

Ackerman was the 2023 Kansas Class 6A Player of the Year after leading Blue Valley High School to back-to-back state team titles in 2021 and 2022. Ackerman also competed at the 2022 U.S. Junior Amateur in Oregon.

Cunningham came to Nebraska after capturing back-to-back Barrie Douglas Scottish Junior Masters championships in 2023 and 2024. He competed at the Scottish Men's Open Championship at Muirfield in May of 2024, putting together rounds of 72 and 73.

SAUTRON MAKES INSTANT IMPACT

One of the top newcomers in NCAA Division II in 2023-24, Rudy Sautron joined the Huskers for the 2024-25 season after signing with Nebraska in early March.

The former vice champion of France was named to the Golf Coaches Association of America Division II All-Freshman Team after producing eight top-10 finishes in 11 tournaments.

Sautron claimed one of five spots on the NCAA Division II All-Freshman Team selected by the GCAA after qualifying as an individual to the NCAA Division II West/South Central Super Regional. He was also named to the Division II PING All-South Central Region team.

Sautron followed former Cameron golfer Hamish Murray to Nebraska, after Murray joined the Huskers for the 2023-24 season. Sautron and Murray were not teammates at Cameron.
