Nebraska kicks off its 2025 home season on Saturday night when the Huskers play host to the Akron Zips at Memorial Stadium. The game is set for 6:30 p.m. with television coverage provided by BTN, while the game can be heard on the Huskers Radio Network, Huskers.com and the Huskers App.

The matchup with Akron begins a four-game homestand for Nebraska that will keep the Huskers in Lincoln until mid-October. Nebraska comes into the game fresh off a 20-17 victory over Cincinnati in the season opener last Thursday at Arrowhead Stadium in Kansas City.

Nebraska led for the majority of the final three quarters against the Bearcats, but needed a late interception by senior Malcolm Hartzog to secure the victory. Nebraska's defense was strong against the pass, allowing just 69 passing yards in the contest. Offensively, Nebraska was efficient, controlling the ball for more than 39 minutes and completing better than 75 percent of its passes. The win marked the first time the Huskers opened the season with a victory over a Power Four opponent since 2003.

Akron comes into the game at 0-1 after dropping a 10-0 home contest against Wyoming last Thursday. The Zips held Wyoming to three points until a touchdown in the final five minutes provided the final margin. Akron is in its fourth season under the direction of Coach Joe Moorhead, who previously served as the head coach at Fordham and Mississippi State. He also had stints as the offensive coordinator at Penn State and Oregon.

The matchup is the Huskers' second against the Zips and marks the third time in the past five seasons that Nebraska has faced an opponent from the Mid-American Conference.

Nebraska's matchup with Akron will mark the second official meeting between the schools but the third time Akron has come to Lincoln for a game. NU defeated Akron in 1997. In 2018 the teams kicked off their matchup before severe thunderstorms forced a delay and ultimately a cancellation of the game.

Nebraska has won its past seven games against non-conference opponents, following its season-opening victory over Cincinnati. That is Nebraska's longest non-conference win streak since a seven-game streak from 2004 to 2006.

Running back **Emmett Johnson** produced his second career 100-yard rushing game against Cincinnati with 108 yards on a career-high 25 carries. Johnson accounted for 135 total yards, including 27 receiving yards.

## HUSKERS OPEN HOME SCHEDULE

Nebraska opens its seven-game home schedule on Saturday night against Akron in front of the 404th consecutive sellout at Memorial Stadium. It marks the first of a four-game homestand for Nebraska, marking the second straight year the Huskers have had four straight home games.

- Nebraska has won six straight home openers since a loss to Colorado in 2018. Overall, Nebraska has dropped just two home openers since 1985.

## SERIES HISTORY AGAINST AKRON AND MAC

Nebraska's matchup with Akron is the second official matchup between the two schools. Nebraska defeated Akron, 59-14, in the 1997 season opener to start a national championship season. The Huskers were also set to open the 2018 season against Akron at Memorial Stadium. However, severe thunderstorms delayed the game after the opening kickoff and hours later the game was canceled and not re-scheduled.

- Nebraska is 8-1 all-time against members of the Mid-American Conference, with the lone loss a 21-17 setback against NIU in 2017.

## HUSKERS IN PRIME TIME AT MEMORIAL STADIUM

## HUSKERS HOPE TO CONTINUE TO SHINE UNDER THE LIGHTS

Nebraska's matchup against Akron marks its first home night game since playing three straight night games at Memorial Stadium early last season.

- Nebraska posted a 2-1 record in home night games last season and has a strong history of success under the lights in Lincoln. The Huskers are 52-11 in home night games at Memorial Stadium.

## SIX CAPTAINS SELECTED TO LEAD 2025 HUSKERS

Nebraska elected six season captains for the 2025 season. This marks the first time in Coach Matt Rhule's three seasons that Nebraska has selected season-long captains. The group includes five senior veterans along with sophomore quarterback **Dylan Raiola**.

- Raiola has started all 14 games in his Nebraska career and surpassed 3,000 career passing yards in the season opener against Cincinnati. He is just the third sophomore to serve as a season captain for Nebraska in the modern era.
- Senior guard **Henry Lutovsky** has made 16 career starts for the Huskers, playing both guard positions in his career. Lutovsky started 11 games last season.
- Kentucky transfer **Dane Key** is one of the nation's most productive returning receivers. In his first year with the Huskers, Key has 36 career collegiate starts and has 132 career receptions.
- Fifth-year senior **Marques Buford Jr.** has spent his entire career at Nebraska. Buford has played in 41 career games with 27 starts and has spent time at both safety and cornerback in his career.
- Senior rover **DeShon Singleton** is in his fourth season in the Nebraska program. Singleton has made 19 career starts for the Huskers, including all 14 games the past two years and has 100 career tackles.
- Cornerback **Ceyair Wright** is in his second season at Nebraska after transferring from USC. Wright has 24 career starts, including nine at Nebraska, and has three career interceptions.

## HUSKERS POSSESS VETERAN OFFENSIVE LINE

The most experienced unit on the Nebraska team is the offensive line. Husker offensive linemen had combined to play in 227 career games with 123 career starts entering this season. Seven Husker offensive linemen have started at least nine games in their career, all at Power Four schools.

- According to research compiled by Clemson, Nebraska's 227 combined games played by offensive linemen ranked as the 10th-most in the country entering the 2025 season. Husker offensive linemen have combined for 123 career starts, a total that ranks 13th nationally.
- Turner Corcoran** has started 35 games for the Huskers with 30 starts at left tackle, three starts at left guard and two starts at right tackle. Corcoran had started 30 consecutive games at one point before suffering season-ending injuries during both the 2023 and 2024 seasons.
- Notre Dame transfer **Rocco Spindler** played in 40 games with 23 starts at right guard in his Irish career, and started the opener. He has played in more games than any other Husker offensive lineman.

## NOTING LAST GAME

- Nebraska improved to 2-1 all-time in Kansas City's Arrowhead Stadium.
- Nebraska improved to 16-3 all-time in August, including 14-0 against non-conference opponents.
- Place-kicker Kyle Cunanan connected on a career-long 52-yard field goal bettering a 49-yard field against Tulsa in 2023 while he was playing at Charlotte. The 52-yard field goal tied for the 10th-longest in Nebraska school history.
- Junior running back Emmett Johnson rushed 25 times for 108 yards. His 25 carries set a career high, bettering 18 carries at Iowa last season. Johnson posted his second career 100-yard rushing game.
- Quarterback Dylan Raiola completed 33-of-42 passes for 243 yards and two touchdowns. He increased his career passing total to 3,062 making him the 13th Husker with 3,000 career passing yards.
- Raiola's 33 completions were the fourth-most in school history, three shy of the Nebraska record (36 by Zac Taylor [2005]; Sam Keller [2007]; Joe Ganz [2008]).
- Senior safety DeShon Singleton had seven tackles to increase his career total to 100 tackles.
- Senior Dasan McCullough had four tackles in the game to push his career total to 100.
- Luke Lindenmeyer had a 19-yard reception in the fourth quarter, marking his career long. His five catches for 47 yards were also career highs.

- Justin Evans** has started 19 games at Nebraska, including 16 starts at left guard, two starts at center and one start as a sixth offensive lineman. He is anchoring the 2025 line at center.
- Henry Lutovsky** has made 16 starts in his Husker career, 15 at right guard and this season at left guard.
- Teddy Prochazka** has started 12 games for Nebraska, including 10 at left tackle. Prochazka returned after missing the entire 2024 season due to injury, and started the opener at right tackle.
- Alabama transfer **Elijah Pritchett** started 12 games with the Crimson Tide. He started 11 games at right tackle in 2024 and one at left tackle.
- Gunnar Gottula** has started 10 games at left tackle, nine last season as a redshirt freshman and the season opener.

## RAIOLA IN YEAR TWO AS STARTING QUARTERBACK

**Dylan Raiola** started all 13 games for Nebraska as a true freshman in 2024. He guided the Huskers to a 7-6 record while becoming the first true freshman quarterback in school history to win a bowl game. Raiola opened the 2025 season with an efficient outing against Cincinnati, completing 33-of-42 passes for 243 yards and two touchdowns.

- Raiola's 33 completions against the Bearcats were the fourth-most in school history and just three shy of the school record. His 78.6 completion percentage was the best of his college career and marked the seventh time in 14 career games he has completed better than 70 percent of his passes, including four of the past five games.
- With 243 passing yards against Cincinnati, Raiola increased his career total to 3,062 yards, making him the 13th Husker to throw for 3,000 career yards.
- Raiola threw for 2,819 yards and 13 touchdowns in 2024 with a 67.1 completion percentage. His completion percentage and passing yardage were both NU freshman records. Overall, Raiola ranked third in school history in season completion percentage and seventh in passing yards.
- Nationally, Raiola ranked 13th in completion percentage among all FBS quarterbacks in 2024, and he led all FBS freshmen in completion percentage. Raiola also led all true freshmen and ranked third overall among all freshmen in passing yards.
- Raiola's 2,819 passing yards were the most by a true freshman Big Ten quarterback since 2013 and marked the second-best passing season by a Big Ten true freshman this century.

## TRANSFERS ADD EXPERIENCE & PRODUCTION TO HUSKER ROSTER

During the offseason, Nebraska added 36 newcomers to its roster. That number includes a freshman class of 21, but 15 first-year transfers add experience to the roster.

- Ten transfers came from FBS programs while five came from the FCS. Of the 10 FBS transfers, eight came from Power Four programs: Alabama, Georgia, Kentucky, Mississippi State, Missouri, Notre Dame, Oklahoma and Purdue.
- The transfers have immediately made their mark with eight earning starts against Cincinnati.
- **Marques Watson-Trent** spent five seasons at Georgia Southern. He has played in 50 career games with 38 starts, making Watson-Trent the most experienced player on the Husker roster in terms of starts and games played. He started and made two tackles in the opener. The 2024 Sun Belt Conference Defensive Player of the Year, Watson-Trent ranks second among all active FBS players with 365 career tackles.

- **Dane Key** started 36 games at Kentucky, and is Nebraska's most experienced receiver. In his first start with the Huskers, Key had six catches for 51 yards and a fourth-quarter touchdown. Key has 132 career receptions for 1,921 yards and 15 touchdowns.
- **Nyziah Hunter** adds further experience to the wide receiver position as he caught 40 passes for 578 yards and five touchdowns for Cal in 2024. He had six receptions for team-high 65 yards and a touchdown in his Nebraska debut.
- Together, Key and Hunter have a combined 178 career receptions for 2,564 yards and 21 touchdowns. The other 11 receivers on Nebraska's roster have a combined 77 career receptions for 585 yards and one touchdown.
- **Rocco Spindler** and **Elijah Pritchett** join Nebraska's offensive line after each was a starter for top-25 programs. Spindler started 23 games over four seasons at Notre Dame. Pritchett started 11 games at Alabama in 2024 and played in 29 games over his three seasons with the Crimson Tide.
- **Dasan McCullough** played in 12 games with four starts as a freshman at Indiana in 2022 and then appeared in 17 games with eight starts as an Oklahoma Sooners in 2023 and 2024. McCullough has 100 career tackles with 12.5 tackles for loss and 4.0 sacks. He opened with four tackles and a PBU against Cincinnati.
- Nebraska added two FCS transfers to the secondary in **Jamir Conn** and **Andrew Marshall**. Conn played in 23 games with 11 starts over two seasons at Southern Illinois, registering 68 tackles with nine pass breakups and 4.5 TFLs. Marshall was a first-team All-Big Sky cornerback at Idaho in 2024. He started 14 games in two seasons with the Vandals, and started Nebraska's opener.
- On the defensive line, **Jaylen George** spent three seasons at East Tennessee State, starting 23 games and totaling 54 tackles, 9.5 tackles for loss and 3.0 sacks.
- Nebraska also went to the FCS level to bolster its special teams units. **Kevin Gallic** is NU's long snapper after handling those duties for New Hampshire the past three seasons. Place-kicker **Kyle Cunanan** made 14-of-20 field goals over two seasons at Charlotte, and connected on his first two attempts with the Huskers, including a career-long 52-yarder.

## MATT RHULE SET FOR THIRD SEASON

**Matt Rhule** is in his third season at Nebraska in 2025. He owns a 60-56 record in his nine seasons as a college head coach. He took on a rebuilding project in each of his three college stops and excluding his first year at each school, Rhule boasts a 52-28 record.

- Year three has proven to be a breakthrough year for Rhule. At both of his previous college stops (Temple and Baylor), Rhule led his team to the conference championship game in his third season.
- In his third season at Temple in 2016, the Owls went 10-4 and played for the American Athletic Conference championship.
- In his third season at Baylor in 2019, the Bears were 11-3 and played for the Big 12 title.
- In his second season at Nebraska in 2024, Rhule guided the Huskers to their first winning record in eight years and first bowl win in nine years.
- Rhule posted an 8-28 combined record in his first seasons at Temple, Baylor and Nebraska. In year two at those three schools, that record improved to 20-18. In his third season at Temple and Baylor, Rhule's teams posted a combined 21-7 record.
- Rhule has matched or improved his previous season's win total every year of his college coaching career. Temple went from two wins in his first season to six wins in his second season and 10 wins in both his third and fourth seasons. Baylor went from one win in Rhule's first season to seven wins in year two and 11 wins in year three. Rhule led Nebraska to a five-win season in 2023 and a seven-win campaign in 2024.

## HOLGORSSEN COORDINATING HUSKER OFFENSE

**Dana Holgorsen** is in his first full season as Nebraska's offensive coordinator in 2025 after he coordinated the offense and called the plays for the final four games last season.

- Holgorsen boasts six full seasons of experience as an offensive coordinator at Texas Tech, Houston and Oklahoma State. In six full seasons as a coordinator, Holgorsen's offenses have averaged 402.2 passing yards per game, 524.9 total yards per game and 40.7 points per game.
- The offenses Holgorsen has coordinated have an average national finish of second in passing, third in total offense and sixth in scoring. He was the coordinator for two of the top four passing seasons in FBS history (2007 at Texas Tech and 2009 at Houston).
- Quarterbacks have thrived in Holgorsen-coached offenses. Holgorsen coached the all-time FBS leader in touchdown passes and total offense (Houston's Case Keenum) along with the FBS season record holder in completions (Texas Tech's Graham Harrell).
- In addition to his experience as an offensive coordinator, Holgorsen has also been a successful head coach. He won 92 games in 13 seasons at West Virginia and Houston. Holgorsen is second in coaching victories at West Virginia and fifth at Houston.

## BUTLER TAKES OVER AS LEADER OF BLACKSHIRT DEFENSE

**John Butler** is in his first season as Nebraska's defensive coordinator in 2025 after he served as the Huskers' defensive backs coach in his first year on staff in 2024.

- Butler served as Nebraska's defensive coordinator for the 2024 Pinstripe Bowl. NU limited Boston College to 15 points, allowing only one scoring drive longer than two yards.
- Butler helped Nebraska rank in the top 20 nationally in rushing defense, total defense and scoring defense in 2024. His defensive backs helped the Huskers to their most interceptions (11) in eight seasons.
- Butler, who was Penn State's defensive coordinator in 2013, boasts a decade of experience in the National Football League. In his 10 years in the NFL, he helped his teams win six division titles.
- Butler coached the Buffalo Bills defensive backs for five seasons from 2018 to 2023. In those five seasons, the Bills allowed the fewest passing yards in the NFL.
- Previously he spent four seasons coaching the secondary for the Houston Texans. The Texans ranked in the top three in the NFL in pass defense twice in his four seasons.

## EKELER LEADS HUSKER SPECIAL TEAMS

**Mike Ekeler** is in his first season as Nebraska's special teams coordinator in 2025. Ekeler, who coached the Husker linebackers from 2008 to 2010, served as Tennessee's special teams coordinator from 2021 to 2024.

- Ekeler brought a wealth of experience to the Husker sideline, as he has coached in every power conference (ACC, Big Ten, Big 12, Pac-12 and SEC) while serving on staffs at six of the 12 winning programs in college football history (Oklahoma, Nebraska, Georgia, Tennessee, USC and LSU).
- Tennessee led the nation in punt return yards and percentage of punts downed inside the opponent's 10-yard line over the course of Ekeler's four-year tenure.
- Ekeler's special teams units were routinely ranked in the top 25 during his time in Knoxville. In Ekeler's four seasons, Tennessee finished in the top 25 nationally in punt returns (2021, 2022, 2023, 2024), punt return defense (2021, 2022, 2023), net punting (2021, 2023), kickoff returns (2021), blocked punts (2021, 2023, 2024) and blocked kicks (2023).
- Ekeler has been a winner in his college coaching career. He has won 10 bowl games in his 20 years at a Power Four program. His teams have played for the national title three times, and he was a member of LSU's 2007 national championship team. In his first stint at Nebraska, Ekeler helped the Huskers to a pair of appearances in the Big 12 Championship Game in three seasons.

## HUSKERS REPRESENTED ON PRESEASON WATCH LISTS

Several Huskers were named to preseason watch lists. The offensive side of the ball was particularly well represented with five players earning preseason recognition.

- **Jacory Barney Jr.** was named to the Paul Hornung Award watch list, which is presented annually to the most versatile player in major college football. Barney led Nebraska with 55 catches in 2024, tying the Nebraska freshman receptions record, while totaling 447 receiving yards. He also led Nebraska in kickoff return yards and ranked second on the team in punt return yards, all-purpose yards and rushing touchdowns.
- **Emmett Johnson** was named to the Doak Walker Award watch list, an annual award presented to the nation's most outstanding college running back. Johnson led Nebraska with 884 scrimmage yards last season, including ranking second on the team with 598 rushing yards. He also caught 39 passes for 286 yards. Over the final four games of the season when Dana Holgorsen took over as offensive coordinator, Johnson averaged 121.0 scrimmage yards per game. He added 135 scrimmage yards, including 108 rushing yards against Cincinnati in the season opener.
- **Dylan Raiola** was named to the Maxwell Award watch list, an award presented annually to the College Player of the Year, and was on the Polynesian Player of the Year watch list. Raiola was a semifinalist for the Shaun Alexander Freshman of the Year award in 2024, when he set Nebraska freshman records in passing yards (2,819) and completion percentage (67.1).

• **Teddy Prochazka** was named to the Allstate Wuerffel Trophy watch list and was a nominee for the Allstate Good Works team. The Wuerffel trophy honors student-athletes who are inspired to serve others and make positive impacts on society. The Good Works Team recognizes players for their commitment to community service and leadership beyond the gridiron. Prochazka is one of the most active Huskers in the community, as he participated in more than 45 community events during the 2024-25 academic year.

• **Dane Key**, a first-year transfer from Kentucky, was named to the 2026 Senior Bowl Top 300 list. Key caught 126 passes for 1,870 yards and 14 touchdowns as a Wildcat from 2022 to 2024.

• **Kevin Gallic**, a first-year transfer from FCS New Hampshire, was named to the watch list for the Patrick Mannelly Long Snapper Award, presented annually to the nation's top long snapper.

## SINGLE-DIGIT NUMBERS AWARDED THROUGH TEAM VOTE

For the third straight season, single-digit jersey numbers were awarded to the players who best represent what it means to be a Husker. The single-digit honorees were chosen through a players-only vote and the players then got to choose which single-digit number they wanted.

• The tradition of single-digit numbers being reserved for the chosen few dates back to Rhule's time at Temple.

"I got really tired of having a guy in my program who was there for three years, four years, really busted his tail and represented the program the right way, and he finally gets to be a senior and wants to wear a single digit, he's earned it...and invariably coaches give [a recruit] a single digit to get him to come there. It never felt right to me. It should be something earned. It's really just who do we want our players to say 'this is a guy who represents everything it means to be a Husker. He's tough, he's hard working, he's competitive'. It's not a popularity contest, it's an opportunity for our team to say these are the guys that embody everything it means to be a Husker."

• The 10 players listed below were selected by their teammates to be worthy of having a single-digit number this season. **Marques Buford Jr.**, **Malcolm Hartzog Jr.** are wearing a single-digit number for the second straight year while senior defensive back **DeShon Singleton** is in No. 8 for a third straight year. The other seven players earned a single-digit for the first time.

## A LOOK AT NEBRASKA'S 2025 SCHEDULE

Nebraska will play three non-conference games and nine Big Ten contests in 2025. The Huskers face three Big Ten teams they also played in 2024 in UCLA, USC and Iowa. Nebraska has played each of those three teams in November in both 2024 and 2025.

- In Big Ten Conference play, the Huskers will play Iowa, Maryland, Michigan, Michigan State, Minnesota, Northwestern, Penn State, UCLA and USC. Nebraska will not play Illinois, Indiana, Ohio State, Oregon, Purdue, Rutgers, Washington or Wisconsin.
- Nebraska has three non-Saturday games this season, playing once on Thursday and twice on Friday. NU is one of seven Power Conference programs with three weekday games this season along with Cal, Houston, Minnesota, North Carolina, North Carolina State and Rutgers.
- The 2025 season began with a victory over Cincinnati in Kansas City. Nebraska opened away from home for the fifth time in six seasons.
- The Huskers then play four consecutive home games, hosting Akron (Sept. 6), Houston Christian (Sept. 13), Michigan (Sept. 20) and Michigan State (Oct. 4) at Memorial Stadium.

- After playing its first two Big Ten games at home, four of Nebraska's next six Big Ten games are on the road. NU travels to Maryland (Oct. 11) and Minnesota (Oct. 17) in a span of six days in October, before hosting Northwestern (Oct. 25) and USC (Nov. 1) in consecutive weeks. The Huskers then have back-to-back road games at UCLA (Nov. 8) and Penn State (Nov. 22) with a bye in between.
- Nebraska wraps up the regular season at home against Iowa the day after Thanksgiving (Nov. 28), the 36th straight year the Huskers will play on Black Friday.
- The Huskers will appear on multiple national television networks this season. Television designations are set for six of Nebraska's 12 games, and in those six games the Huskers will appear on the Big Ten Network, CBS, ESPN, FOX and FS1.

## NOTES FROM NEBRASKA'S 2024 SEASON

Nebraska finished with a 7-6 record under Matt Rhule in 2024. Five of the six losses came in one-possession games, including a four-point road loss at eventual national champion Ohio State.

- Nebraska posted the program's most wins (7) and first winning record in eight seasons.
- The Huskers made a bowl game for the first time in eight seasons and won a bowl game for the first time in nine seasons.
- Nebraska went undefeated (4-0) against non-conference opponents for the first time in 19 seasons (since the 2005 season).
- The Huskers ranked in the top 20 nationally in rushing defense, scoring defense and total defense.
- Nebraska held seven of its 13 opponents to 15 or fewer points.
- Offensively, NU had the third-most improved passing offense in the country from the 2023 to the 2024 season, passing for 1,338 more yards in 2024 compared to 2023.
- Quarterback **Dylan Raiola** set Nebraska freshman records for passing yards and completion percentage, while **Jacory Barney Jr.** had the most catches by a freshman in school history (55).

## NEBRASKA AMONG TOP ALL-TIME PROGRAMS

Nebraska is playing its 136th football season this fall, and the Huskers have historically been one of the top programs in college football history.

- NU ranks eighth in NCAA history with 925 wins and ninth with 54 all-time bowl game appearances.
- The Huskers have won five national titles. Nebraska's four Associated Press national championships (1970, 1971, 1994, 1995) rank seventh all-time and NU's four coaches poll titles (1971, 1994, 1995, 1997) rank fifth.
- Nebraska's 46 conference titles rank second in NCAA history.

## HUSKERS ALSO EXCEL IN THE CLASSROOM

In addition to being one of the winningest and most successful program in NCAA history, the Nebraska football program has also led the way in the classroom.

- Nebraska football has produced more Academic All-Americans (108) and more NCAA Impact Award (formerly Top Ten) winners (9) than any other team in any sport in NCAA history.
- Nebraska led the Big Ten with 73 Academic All-Big Ten selections for the 2024 season.
- Following the 2025 spring semester, the cumulative grade-point average for all members of the Nebraska football team was 3.304, the highest in recorded history.

## HOME OF THE HUSKERS



Memorial Stadium celebrated its 100th year in 2023. In the fall of 1922, a drive for \$430,000 in stadium construction funds was undertaken by faculty, students, alumni and friends of the University.

The stadium was named Memorial Stadium to honor all Nebraskans who served in the Civil and Spanish-American Wars; the 751 Nebraskans who died in World War I; the 3,839 in World War II; the 225 in Korea; the 422 in Vietnam; and those in Iraq.

Construction was completed in a few more than 90 working days and Memorial Stadium was dedicated on Oct. 20, 1923, at the Homecoming game in which Nebraska was held to a scoreless tie by Kansas.

The field at Memorial Stadium was named Tom Osborne Field - after the Huskers' legendary Hall-of-Fame coach - in 1998, one year after Osborne's retirement following 25 years and 255 victories as head coach.

## 2025 NEBRASKA SEASON NOTEBOOK

## SCHEDULE NOTES

- Nebraska's schedule consists of three non-conference games to open the season followed by nine Big Ten contests. In Big Ten Conference play, the Huskers will play Iowa, Maryland, Michigan, Michigan State, Minnesota, Northwestern, Penn State, UCLA and USC. Nebraska will not play Illinois, Indiana, Ohio State, Oregon, Purdue, Rutgers, Washington or Wisconsin.
- Nebraska plays on three different days of the week: Thursday, Friday and Saturday.
- Nebraska plays three non-Saturday games, playing once on Thursday (Cincinnati) and twice on Friday (at Minnesota, Iowa). The Huskers are one of seven teams from a power conference who play three weekday games in 2025 (also Cal, Houston, Minnesota, North Carolina, North Carolina State and Rutgers).
- After beginning conference play with consecutive home games, Nebraska will play four Big Ten road games in a span of six games. That includes back-to-back road games at Maryland and Minnesota just six days apart in October.

## COACHING STAFF NOTES

- Matt Rhule** is in his third season at Nebraska in 2025. Rhule is in his 13th season as a head coach after previously leading programs at Temple (2013-16) and Baylor (2017-19) along with an NFL stint as head coach of the Carolina Panthers (2020-22).
- Rhule owns a career record of 60-56 as a college head coach. He has a proven record as a program builder after taking on rebuilding projects at Temple, Baylor and Nebraska. Excluding his first season at each school, that record improves to 52-28.
- Rhule's college teams have taken a major step forward in his third season at each school. Temple improved by four wins in Rhule's third season in 2014 and Baylor also improved by four wins in his third season in 2019. Rhule took both Temple and Baylor to the conference championship game in his third season.

- Nebraska features three new full-time coordinators this season. **Dana Holgorsen** is in his first full season as the Huskers' offensive coordinator after he served in that role for the final four games of the 2024 campaign. **John Butler** is in his first year as Nebraska's defensive coordinator after he coached the cornerbacks and was NU's defensive pass game coordinator in 2024. New to the staff is **Mike Ekeler**, who serves as special teams coordinator following a successful four-year run in the same role at Tennessee.

- Other new assistant coaches include: **Phil Snow** (associate head coach); **Terry Bradden** (defensive line); **Daikiel Shorts Jr.** (wide receivers); **Phil Simpson** (outside linebackers); and **Addison Williams** (secondary).

## ROSTER NOTES

- Nebraska's roster features 125 players. Nearly three-quarters of the roster is comprised of underclassmen with almost half of the roster classified as freshmen.

- The roster features 89 returning players and 36 newcomers. Nebraska returns a total of 10 starters and 38 letterwinners.
- Nebraska added 15 transfers and 21 true freshmen to its roster in 2025. Among the 15 transfers are 11 FBS transfers and four FCS transfers.
- Nine of Nebraska's FBS 11 transfers came from Power Conference programs (Alabama, Cal, Georgia, Kentucky, Mississippi State, Missouri, Notre Dame, Oklahoma and Purdue).
- The roster features players from 29 states and three foreign countries (Australia, Germany and New Zealand).
- Nebraska has had a letterwinner from 47 of the 50 states in its history, missing only Idaho, New Hampshire and Rhode Island.
- States with multiple players on the roster include: Nebraska (36), Texas (10), Missouri (7), California (6), Florida (6), Iowa (6), Pennsylvania (5), Arizona (4), Colorado (4), Georgia (4), Kansas (4), Louisiana (3), New Jersey (3), Hawaii (2), Illinois (2), Kentucky (2), Maryland (2), Michigan (2), Minnesota (2), Mississippi (2) and South Dakota (2).
- The states of Indiana, Montana, Nevada, North Dakota, New York, Tennessee, Utah and Wisconsin are each represented with one player on Nebraska's 2025 roster.
- The players who are wearing a single-digit jersey number (0-9) earned the right to wear that number through a team vote.

## SCOUTING THE AKRON ZIPS



The Akron Zips kicked off the 2025 campaign with a 10-0 setback in their home opener against Wyoming last week.

The Zips come into Saturday night averaging 228 yards per game, with 139 yards per game through the air and 89 yards per game on the ground. Marquese Williams leads the Akron rushing attack with six carries for 30 rushing yards, while Sean Patrick has 26 rushing yards on five carries.

In the passing game, Ben Finley has completed 16-of-38 passes for 139 yards and an interception. Patrick has four receptions for 47 yards, followed by Kyan Mason with three grabs for 29 yards.

Defensively, the Zips are allowing 10 points per game and 426 yards per game this season. Shammond Cooper leads the Akron defense with a team-high 10 tackles, followed by Alex Branch and Justin Anderson with nine tackles each. Julien Laventure and Bruno Dall have tallied a team-best 1.5 tackles for loss through one game this season.

#### HEAD COACH JOE MOORHEAD

Joe Moorhead is in his fourth season as the head coach at Akron, guiding the Zips to an 8-29 mark.

Prior to Akron, Moorhead spent two seasons as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Oregon in 2021 and 2022.

Moorhead came to Oregon from Mississippi State, where he served as head coach during the 2018 and 2019 seasons. He led the Bulldogs to back-to-back bowl appearances, the first Mississippi State head coach to do so in their first two seasons in program history. He also sparked the Bulldogs to a pair of triumphs over rival Ole Miss, claiming the Golden Egg Trophy both seasons.

Before Mississippi State, Moorhead spent two seasons as the offensive coordinator at Penn State in 2016 and 2017, where he was honored at National Offensive Coordinator of the Year in each of the two seasons in State College.

Moorhead spent four seasons as the head coach at Fordham, compiling a 38-13 record from 2012-15. After taking over a program that was 1-10 in 2011, Moorhead led the Rams to a 12-2 record, the best season in program history in 2013 and the Patriot League title in 2014.

Akron has been a member of the Mid-American Conference since 1992, after being a Division I independent for five seasons from 1987 to 1991. The Zips won a MAC title in 2005 and also captured East division championships in 2000 and 2017.

# HEAD COACH MATT RHULE

Matt Rhule has a proven track record as a program builder. In his first two collegiate head coaching jobs at Temple (2013-16) and Baylor (2017-19), Rhule led both the Owls and the Bears to their most victories in school history in just his third season. He also took both teams to the conference championship game in year three.

Rhule took Temple from two wins in his first season to a school-record 10 victories in both his third and fourth seasons with an appearance in the conference championship game both seasons. He then took Baylor from one win in his first season to a school-record 11 victories in his third season and an appearance in the Big 12 Championship Game and the Sugar Bowl.

At Nebraska, Rhule led Nebraska to a 7-6 record and a bowl victory in his second season in 2024, marking the Huskers' first winning record in eight years and first bowl win in nine years.

## TAKING TEMPLE TO NEW HEIGHTS

In his tenure at Temple from 2013 to 2016, Rhule took the Owls to new heights.

- In Rhule's second season in 2014, Temple posted the program's first win over an SEC team since 1938, its first win over a ranked opponent in 16 seasons and the program's largest margin of victory in nearly 50 years.
- Rhule won 10 games in both 2015 and 2016. He is responsible for two of the three 10-win seasons in Temple's 125-year history.
- He also took the Owls to back-to-back bowl games in 2015 and 2016, the first time Temple played in a bowl in consecutive seasons.
- In 2015, Rhule led Temple to the American Athletic Conference Championship Game, the first conference title game in program history.
- The next season, Rhule guided the Owls to their second conference title in program history and the first in nearly 40 years.
- Temple has spent a total of 16 weeks ranked in the 88-year history of the Associated Press top-25 poll. More than half of those top-25 rankings (9) came under Rhule in 2015 and 2016.

## AN ENCORE AT BAYLOR

At Temple, Rhule led the Owls to their highest season win total in program history, their first conference championship game appearance and an impressive run in the national rankings. He produced an encore by repeating each of those same feats in three seasons at Baylor.

- Baylor finished with 11 losses in Rhule's first season in 2017 but two years later, he guided the Bears to 11 wins in 2019. Baylor became the first Power Conference program to go from 11 losses to 11 wins in two or fewer seasons.
- Baylor won its final two games of the 2018 season and its first nine games of the 2019 campaign. The 11 straight victories marked the second-longest winning streak in school history, while Baylor's 9-0 start in 2019 was the best start in program history.
- In his third season in 2019, Rhule led Baylor to its most wins (11) in school history, the Bears advanced to their first Big 12 Championship Game and played in the Sugar Bowl for only the second time in program history.
- Baylor finished with a No. 13 ranking in 2019, its second-highest final ranking since 1951.

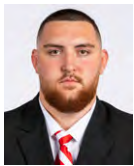

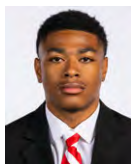
