Nebraska continues a four-game homestand on Saturday when the Huskers take on Houston Christian at Memorial Stadium. The game is set for 11 a.m. with television coverage provided by FS1, while the game can be heard on the Huskers Radio Network, Huskers.com and the Huskers App.

Nebraska stands at 2-0 following a 68-0 victory over Akron last Saturday in the home opener. Nebraska's performance against the Zips was one of the Huskers' most statistically dominant efforts in the past several decades. The 68-point margin of victory was the largest by Nebraska since 1986, with the first shutout for the Blackshirts since the 2009 Holiday Bowl vs. Arizona. In addition, the 68 points were Nebraska's most in 13 seasons, the 728 total offensive yards were Nebraska's most in 11 seasons while the Huskers' 494 passing yards were the second-most in school history.

Nebraska will be looking for its ninth consecutive victory against a non-conference opponent and its second consecutive 3-0 start to a season.

Houston Christian, a member of the Football Championship ranks, comes to Lincoln with a 1-1 record, following a 20-10 loss at Eastern Kentucky on Saturday night. Despite the loss, the Huskies limited Eastern Kentucky to just 173 total yards, and are allowing just 139.0 yards per game. HCU opened the season with a 69-0 victory over Arkansas Baptist on Aug. 28.

This is the first all-time meeting between the Huskers and Houston Christian. Nebraska is 15-0 all-time against FCS opponents, most recently defeating Northern Iowa last season.

HUSKERS TO TAKE ON FCS FOE IN HUSKIES

Saturday's game is the first all-time meeting between Nebraska and Houston Christian. It will mark Nebraska's 16th game all-time against an FCS foe (at time of game), with the Huskers holding a 15-0 record in those contests.

- In 2024, Nebraska defeated Northern Iowa, 34-3, in its most recent matchup with an FCS foe.
- All of Nebraska's games against FCS opponents have occurred since 1992, including facing an FCS opponent for five straight seasons from 2010 to 2014.
- Houston Christian is a member of the Southland Conference. Nebraska is 3-0 all-time against current members of the Southland, posting a 2-0 record against McNeese State and 1-0 against Nicholls.

HUSKERS LOOK TO FINISH NON-CONFERENCE PLAY UNBEATEN

Nebraska completes non-conference play this weekend against Houston Christian. The Huskers will be looking to win their ninth consecutive game against a non-conference opponent and complete non-league play unbeaten for the second straight season.

- Nebraska's eight-game win streak against non-conference competition is the longest by the Huskers since a 12-game win streak spanning the 1999 to 2001 seasons.
- Nebraska was a perfect 3-0 in non-conference play in the 2024 regular season and defeated Boston College in the Pinstripe Bowl. Before last season, Nebraska's previous unbeaten non-conference season was in 2016.

NEBRASKA FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME TO INDUCT 2025 CLASS

The 2025 Nebraska Football Hall of Fame Class will be inducted on Friday night and will be honored on the field before Saturday's game. Six Husker football standouts and a state college All-American comprise the 2025 class. Additionally, 1972 Heisman Trophy winner **Johnny Rodgers** will receive the first-ever Legends award, and a pair of long-time staff members will receive special merit awards. To be eligible, players must have been either an All-American or first (before 1996) or second-team (after 1996) all-conference selection to make the Nebraska Football Hall of Fame ballot.

- **Bob Nelson** was a three-year letterman as a linebacker for Nebraska in 1972, 1973 and 1974. Nelson finished his career at Nebraska with 189 total tackles, and earned second-team All-Big Eight honors. Nelson went on to an 11-year professional career in the NFL, and was a starting linebacker for the Raiders in their Super Bowl XV and XVIII wins.
- Tom Welter was a standout offensive tackle for the Huskers in the mid 1980s. Welter earned third-team All-America and first-team All-Big Eight honors in 1986, helping Nebraska rank second nationally in both rushing and scoring offense en route to a 10-2 season. Welter also distinguished himself in the classroom earning first-team Academic All-America honors during his senior season.
- **Derek Brown** ranks as one of the top running backs in school history. He finished his Husker career with 2,699 yards and 23 touchdowns, averaging 5.9 yards per carry. Brown became just the fifth Husker to have back-to-back 1,000-yard rushing seasons. He was selected as the AP's Big Eight Offensive Player of the Year in 1992 and earned honorable-mention All-America honors.
- The late **Dahrran Diedrick** led the Big 12 in rushing as a junior in 2001, churning out 1,299 yards to earn first-team All-Big 12 honors and help NU to the BCS National Championship Game. He played in 48 career games with 24 starts as a Husker, rushing for 2,745 yards and 26 touchdowns.
- Brett Maher was the starting punter and place-kicker during his career. He was a two-time Big Ten Kicker of the Year and in 2011, Maher was both the Big Ten Kicker and Punter of the Year. Maher's 20 field goals in 2012 rank second in school history and his 119 points are an NU record for a kicker. He also averaged better than 41.5 yards per punt. Maher played five seasons in the NFL, and currently serves as a special teams assistant for the Huskers.
- Kenny Bell was one of the most prolific receivers in school history with 181 career receptions for 2,689 yards, totals that both rank second in NU history. Bell earned All-Big Ten honors three times during his career, including first-team honors as a senior and second-team accolades as a sophomore. Bell's 49 career starts are among the most in school history. Bell spent four seasons in the NFL following his college career.
- Dennis Leblanc has been a fixture in Husker Athletics over the past four decades and is the recipient of the Lyell Bremser Special Merit Award. Since Leblanc joined the academic staff in 1987, nearly 4,000 Husker student-athletes have earned their degrees, and Nebraska has been among the national leaders in Academic All-Americans and graduation rates. Dr. Robert Dugas was affiliated with Nebraska Football for the majority of the past 35 years as an orthopedic surgeon, serving hundreds of Husker athletes during his time in Lincoln. An All-America player and Academic All-American at LSU, Dugas is a member of the LSU Athletic Hall of Fame.

NOTING LAST GAME

- Nebraska's 68-point margin of victory was the largest for the Huskers since a 70-0 win at Kansas in 1986.
- NU's 68 points were its most since scoring 73 in a victory over Idaho State in 2012.
- The shutout was Nebraska's first since a 33-0 victory over Arizona in the 2009 Holiday Bowl.
- Nebraska's 728 yards of total offense were the eighth-most in school history and the most by Nebraska since 784 yards against FAU in 2014.
- The Huskers' 494 passing yards were the second-most in school history and the most since a school-record 519 yards against Kansas State in 2007. It marked the 10th 400-yard passing game in school history.
- Quarterback Dylan Raiola completed 24-of-31 passes for a career-high 364 yards and a career-best four touchdowns. His 364 yards are the most by a Husker since 2018, and it was the first four TD passing game by a Nebraska player since 2015.
- Running back Emmett Johnson had a careerhigh 140 yards on 14 carries, including 134 yards before halftime. Johnson had a careerbest three touchdowns, including two rushing TDs and a receiving score.
- Sophomore Jacory Barney Jr. had a careerhigh 132 receiving yards, the most by a Husker since 2022.
- Barney had four punt returns for 87 yards, the most by a Husker since 2014, while his 39-yard return was the longest for NU since 2019.

HUSKERS PRODUCE DOMINANT VICTORY OVER AKRON

Nebraska posted a 68-0 victory over Akron last Saturday in Lincoln, marking one of the Huskers' most dominant victories in the past several decades.

- The 68-0 victory marked Nebraska's most lopsided win since a 70-0 shutout at Kansas in 1986.
- Nebraska's 68 points were its most since a 73-7 victory over Idaho State in 2012. Nebraska had topped 50 points just 10 times since that victory and had not posted more than 60 points since the win over Idaho State.
- Nebraska posted its first shutout since a 33-0 victory over Arizona in the 2009 Holiday Bowl.
- The Huskers produced 728 yards of total offense which ranks as the eighth-most in school history and the most since posting 784 yards against FAU in 2014.
- Nebraska's 494 passing yards were the second-most in school history and the most since a school-record 519 passing yards against Kansas State in 2007. It was the 10th game with at least 400 passing yards in school history and the first since 2018 at Wisconsin.
- Nebraska produced a 300-yard passer (Raiola), a 100-yard rusher (Johnson) and a 100-yard receiver (Barney Jr.). It marked the first time Nebraska has accomplished that trifecta since a 2022 game against Georgia Southern.
- Nebraska had 11 offensive plays that covered at least 20 yards in the victory.

BLACKSHIRTS STIFLING OPPONENTS

The Nebraska Blackshirts posted their first shutout in 16 seasons against Akron, continuing their recent dominant play, particularly at Memorial Stadium.

- The Huskers held Akron to 62 passing yards, after limiting Cincinnati to 69 yards through the air in the season opener. It marks the first time Nebraska has held back-to-back opponents to fewer than 100 passing yards since the final two games of the 2019 season (Maryland, 57 yards; lowa, 99 yards).
- Nebraska ranks second nationally in passing yards allowed per game at just 65.5 yards per contest.
 The 45.8 percent opponent completion rate is the third-best in the country, and Nebraska is the only team in the FBS ranks to not allow a completion of at least 20 yards.
- Nebraska's four most recent opponents have found scoring extremely difficult. In the first half of the past four games, Nebraska has not allowed a touchdown and has allowed just five combined points (Akron, 0; Cincinnati, 3; Boston College, 2; Iowa, 0).
- The shutout of Akron marked the eighth consecutive game at Memorial Stadium that Nebraska has not allowed a rushing touchdown. The last opponent to score a rushing touchdown in Lincoln was Iowa in the 2023 regular-season finale.

RAIOLA IN YEAR TWO AS STARTING QUARTERBACK

Dylan Raiola has started all 15 games of his Nebraska career. In 2024, he guided the Huskers to a 7-6 record while becoming the first true freshman quarterback in school history to win a bowl game. Raiola has opened the 2025 season in impressive form. He has completed 57-of-73 passes for 607 yards and six touchdowns. Raiola had a career-best 364 passing yards and a career-high four touchdowns against Akron.

- Raiola completed his first nine passes against the Zips after completing his final 11 against Cincinnati. The 20 consecutive completions are a Nebraska record, bettering the previous record of 15 straight by Dave Humm against Kansas in 1974.
- Raiola has completed 78.1 percent of his passes and better than 75 percent in each of the first two games. His completion percentage ranks fifth nationally.
- Raiola's 364 passing yards against Akron bettered his previous career high of 297 yards against Illinois in 2024. It was the most passing yards by a Husker since Adrian Martinez threw for 384 yards at Wisconsin in 2018.
- The four passing touchdowns against Akron surpassed Raiola's previous high of three touchdowns last season against Illinois. It was the first time a Husker quarterback had four passing touchdowns since Ryker Fyfe had four at Purdue in 2015.
- Raiola's 33 completions against Cincinnati were the fourth-most in school history and just three
 shy of the school record. His 78.6 completion percentage was the best of his college career. He
 has completed at least 70 percent of his passes in eight of 15 career games, including five of the
 past six games.
- With 364 passing yards against Akron, Raiola increased his career total to 3,426 yards, moving him into 10th place on the Nebraska career passing list.

- Raiola threw for 2,819 yards and 13 touchdowns in 2024 with a 67.1 completion percentage. His
 completion percentage and passing yardage were both NU freshman records. Overall, Raiola
 ranked third in school history in season completion percentage and seventh in passing yards.
- Nationally, Raiola ranked 13th in completion percentage among all FBS quarterbacks in 2024, and he led all FBS freshmen in completion percentage. Raiola also led all true freshmen and ranked third overall among all freshmen in passing yards.
- Raiola's 2,819 passing yards were the most by a true freshman Big Ten quarterback since 2013 and marked the second-best passing season by a Big Ten true freshman this century.

SIX CAPTAINS SELECTED TO LEAD 2025 HUSKERS

Nebraska elected six season captains for the 2025 season. This marks the first time in Coach Matt Rhule's three seasons that Nebraska has selected season-long captains. The group includes five senior veterans along with sophomore quarterback **Dylan Raiola**.

- Raiola has started all 15 games in his Nebraska career and surpassed 3,000 career passing yards in the season opener against Cincinnati. He is just the third sophomore to serve as a season captain for Nebraska in the modern era.
- Senior guard **Henry Lutovsky** has made 17 career starts for the Huskers, playing both guard positions in his career. Lutovsky started 11 games last season.
- Kentucky transfer **Dane Key** is one of the nation's most productive returning receivers. In his first year with the Huskers, Key has 37 career collegiate starts and has 135 career receptions.
- Fifth-year senior **Marques Buford Jr.** has spent his entire career at Nebraska. Buford has played in 42 career games with 28 starts and has spent time at both safety and cornerback in his career.
- Senior rover DeShon Singleton is in his fourth season in the Nebraska program. Singleton has made 20 career starts for the Huskers, including all 16 games the past two years, and has 103 career tackles.
- Cornerback **Ceyair Wright** is in his second season at Nebraska after transferring from USC. Wright has 25 career starts, including 10 at Nebraska, and has three career interceptions.

HUSKER SPECIAL TEAMS MAKE MARK

Through two games Nebraska has shown improved special teams, highlighted by a strong punt return effort against Akron.

- Nebraska had 92 punt return yards against Akron, including four returns for 87 yards by **Jacory Barney Jr.** The 92 punt return yards in that game alone bettered Nebraska's punt return totals for each of the past four seasons. As a team, Nebraska had 73 yards in 2024, 48 yards in 2023, 66 punt return yards in 2022 and 27 total punt return yards in 2021.
- Barney's 87 punt return yards were the most by a Husker since De'Mornay Pierson-El had 134 punt return yards at lowa in 2014. His 39-yard punt return in the third quarter was the longest by a Husker since JD Spielman had a 76-yard punt return against South Alabama in 2019.
- Place-kicker Kyle Cunanan is a perfect 3-of-3 on field goals through two games, including a career-long 52-yarder against Cincinnati. Cunanan also has six touchbacks on 11 kickoffs.
- Freshman punter Archie Wilson downed three of his four punts against Cincinnati inside the 20yard line, and did not punt against Akron. Nebraska has yet to allow a punt return.
- The Huskers blocked their first kick of the season against Akron with defensive tackle Riley Van Poppel blocking a third-quarter Akron field goal attempt.

JOHNSON THRIVING IN HUSKER BACKFIELD

Junior running back **Emmett Johnson** has been one of the Big Ten's most productive backs over the past six games since Dana Holgorsen became Nebraska's play-caller. Johnson is coming off one of his best games as a Husker with a career-high 140 rushing yards against Akron. Johnson also reached the end zone a career-best three times, including two rushing touchdowns and a touchdown catch.

- Johnson has posted back-to-back 100-yard rushing games to open the season after topping the
 century mark with 108 yards against Cincinnati. Johnson is the first Husker to rush for 100 yards
 in back-to-back games since Anthony Grant topped the century mark in each of the first three
 games of the 2022 season.
- Johnson had a career-long 47-yard touchdown run to open the scoring against Akron. That bettered his previous career long of 42 yards against UTEP last season. Johnson added a 36-yard run in the second guarter and had 134 of his rushing yards before halftime.
- Johnson ranks seventh nationally with 124.0 rushing yards per game and seventh nationally in yards from scrimmage at 141.0 yards per game.
- Johnson took over the lead back role in the final four games last season when Holgorsen joined the Nebraska staff. Over the last six games, Johnson averages 127.7 yards from scrimmage per game, including 93.7 rushing yards and 34.0 receiving yards per game. He averages 5.7 yards per carry in that stretch.

MATT RHULE IN THIRD SEASON LEADING HUSKER PROGRAM

Matt Rhule is in his third season at Nebraska in 2025. He owns a 61-56 record in his 10 seasons as a college head coach. He took on a rebuilding project in each of his three college stops and excluding his first year at each school, Rhule boasts a 53-28 record.

- Year three has proven to be a breakthrough year for Rhule. At both of his previous college stops (Temple and Baylor), Rhule led his team to the conference championship game in his third season.
- In his third season at Temple in 2016, the Owls went 10-4 and played for the American Athletic Conference championship.
- In his third season at Baylor in 2019, the Bears were 11-3 and played for the Big 12 title.
- In his second season at Nebraska in 2024, Rhule guided the Huskers to their first winning record in eight years and first bowl win in nine years.
- Rhule posted an 8-28 combined record in his first seasons at Temple, Baylor and Nebraska. In year two at those three schools, that record improved to 20-18. In his third season at Temple and Baylor, Rhule's teams posted a combined 21-7 record.
- Rhule has matched or improved his previous season's win total every year of his college coaching career. Temple went from two wins in his first season to six wins in his second season and 10 wins in both his third and fourth seasons. Baylor went from one win in Rhule's first season to seven wins in year two and 11 wins in year three. Rhule led Nebraska to a five-win season in 2023 and a seven-win campaign in 2024.

HOLGORSEN COORDINATING HUSKER OFFENSE

Dana Holgorsen is in his first full season as Nebraska's offensive coordinator in 2025 after he coordinated the offense and called the plays for the final four games last season.

- Holgorsen boasts six full seasons of experience as an offensive coordinator at Texas Tech, Houston
 and Oklahoma State. In six full seasons as a coordinator, Holgorsen's offenses have averaged
 402.2 passing yards per game, 524.9 total yards per game and 40.7 points per game.
- The offenses Holgorsen has coordinated have an average national finish of second in passing, third in total offense and sixth in scoring. He was the coordinator for two of the top four passing seasons in FBS history (2007 at Texas Tech and 2009 at Houston).
- Quarterbacks have thrived in Holgorsen-coached offenses. Holgorsen coached the all-time FBS leader in touchdown passes and total offense (Houston's Case Keenum) along with the FBS season record holder in completions (Texas Tech's Graham Harrell). Since Holgorsen took over the Husker offense in the final four games last season, Dylan Raiola has completed 73.9 percent of his passes, and at least 70 percent of his passes in all six games.

• In addition to his experience as an offensive coordinator, Holgorsen has also been a successful head coach. He won 92 games in 13 seasons at West Virginia and Houston. Holgorsen is second in coaching victories at West Virginia and fifth at Houston.

BUTLER TAKES OVER AS LEADER OF BLACKSHIRT DEFENSE

John Butler is in his first season as Nebraska's defensive coordinator in 2025 after he served as the Huskers' defensive backs coach in his first year on staff in 2024. In three games as Nebraska's defensive coordinator, Nebraska has allowed a total of 32 points, no passing touchdowns and posted its first shutout in 16 years.

- Butler served as Nebraska's defensive coordinator for the 2024 Pinstripe Bowl. NU limited Boston College to 15 points, allowing only one scoring drive longer than two yards.
- Butler helped Nebraska rank in the top 20 nationally in rushing defense, total defense and scoring defense in 2024. His defensive backs helped the Huskers record their most interceptions (11) in eight seasons.
- Butler, who was Penn State's defensive coordinator in 2013, boasts a decade of experience in the National Football League. In his 10 years in the NFL, he helped his teams win six division titles.
- Butler coached the Buffalo Bills defensive backs for five seasons from 2018 to 2023. In those five seasons, the Bills allowed the fewest passing yards in the NFL.
- · Previously he spent four seasons coaching the secondary for the Houston Texans. The Texans ranked in the top three in the NFL in pass defense twice in his four seasons.

EKELER LEADS HUSKER SPECIAL TEAMS

Mike Ekeler is in his first season as Nebraska's special teams coordinator in 2025. Ekeler, who coached the Husker linebackers from 2008 to 2010, served as Tennessee's special teams coordinator from 2021 to 2024.

- Ekeler brought a wealth of experience to the Husker sideline, as he has coached in every power conference (ACC, Big Ten, Big 12, Pac-12 and SEC) while serving on staffs at six of the 12 winning programs in college football history (Oklahoma, Nebraska, Georgia, Tennessee, USC and LSU).
- · Tennessee led the nation in punt return yards and percentage of punts downed inside the opponent's 10-yard line over the course of Ekeler's four-year tenure.
- Ekeler's special teams units were routinely ranked in the top 25 during his time in Knoxville. In Ekeler's four seasons, Tennessee finished in the top 25 nationally in punt returns (2021, 2022, 2023, 2024), punt return defense (2021, 2022, 2023), net punting (2021, 2023), kickoff returns (2021), blocked punts (2021, 2023, 2024) and blocked kicks (2023).
- Ekeler has been a winner in his college coaching career. He has won 10 bowl games in his 20 years at a Power Four program. His teams have played for the national title three times, and he was a member of LSU's 2007 national championship team. In his first stint at Nebraska, Ekeler helped the Huskers to a pair of appearances in the Big 12 Championship Game in three seasons.

HUSKERS POSSESS VETERAN OFFENSIVE LINE

The most experienced unit on the Nebraska team is the offensive line. Husker offensive linemen had combined to play in 227 career games with 123 career starts entering this season. Seven Husker offensive linemen have started at least 11 games in their career, all at Power Four schools.

- According to research compiled by Clemson, Nebraska's 227 combined games played by offensive linemen ranked as the 10th-most in the country entering the 2025 season. Husker offensive linemen have combined for 123 career starts, a total that ranks 13th nationally.
- Turner Corcoran has started 35 games for the Huskers with 30 starts at left tackle, three starts at left guard and two starts at right tackle. Corcoran had started 30 consecutive games at one point before suffering season-ending injuries during both the 2023 and 2024 seasons.
- Notre Dame transfer **Rocco Spindler** played in 40 games with 23 starts at right guard in his Irish career, and has started both games in 2025. He has played in more games than any other Husker offensive lineman.
- Justin Evans has started 20 games at Nebraska, including 16 starts at left guard, three starts at center and one start as a sixth offensive lineman. He is anchoring the 2025 line at center.
- Henry Lutovsky has made 17 starts in his Husker career, 15 at right guard and two this season at left guard.
- Teddy Prochazka has started 13 games for Nebraska, including 10 at left tackle. Prochazka returned after missing the entire 2024 season due to injury, and has started the first two games at right tackle.
- Alabama transfer **Elijah Pritchett** started 12 games with the Crimson Tide. He started 11 games at right tackle in 2024 and one at left tackle.
- Gunnar Gottula has started 11 games at left tackle, nine last season as a redshirt freshman and the first two games in 2025.

TRANSFERS ADD EXPERIENCE & PRODUCTION TO HUSKER ROSTER

During the offseason, Nebraska added 36 newcomers to its roster. That number includes a freshman class of 21, but 15 first-year transfers add experience to the roster.

- Ten transfers came from FBS programs while five came from the FCS. Of the 10 FBS transfers, eight came from Power Four programs: Alabama, Georgia, Kentucky, Mississippi State, Missouri, Notre Dame, Oklahoma and Purdue.
- The transfers have immediately made their mark with eight earning starts in 2025.
- Marques Watson-Trent spent five seasons at Georgia Southern. He has played in 51 career games with 38 starts, making Watson-Trent the most experienced player on the Husker roster in terms of starts and games played. He started the opener and has three tackles this season. The 2024 Sun Belt Conference Defensive Player of the Year, Watson-Trent ranks second among all active FBS players with 368 career tackles.

- Dane Key started 36 games at Kentucky, and is Nebraska's most experienced receiver. In his first start with the Huskers, Key had six catches for 51 yards and a fourth-quarter touchdown against Cincinnati. He added a touchdown against Akron. Key has 135 career receptions for 1,956 yards and 16 tochdowns. He needs just 44 yards to post 2,000 career receiving yards.
- Nyziah Hunter adds further experience to the wide receiver position as he caught 40 passes for 578 yards and five touchdowns for Cal in 2024. He had six receptions for a team-high 65 yards and a touchdown in his Nebraska debut against Cincinnati and had four catches for 82 yards, all in the first half, against Akron.

- Together, Key and Hunter have a combined 185 career receptions for 2,681 yards and 22 touchdowns.
- Rocco Spindler and Elijah Pritchett joined Nebraska's offensive line after each was a starter for top-25 programs. Spindler started 23 games over four seasons at Notre Dame. Pritchett started 11 games at Alabama in 2024 and played in 29 games over his three years with the Crimson Tide.
- Dasan McCullough played in 12 games with four starts as a freshman at Indiana in 2022 and then appeared in 17 games with eight starts as an Oklahoma Sooner in 2023 and 2024. McCullough has 102 career tackles with 12.5 tackles for loss and 4.0 sacks. He opened with four tackles and a PBU against Cincinnati and had two tackles against Akron.
- Nebraska added two FCS transfers to the secondary in **Jamir Conn** and **Andrew Marshall.** Conn played in 23 games with 11 starts over two seasons at Southern Illinois, registering 68 tackles with nine pass breakups and 4.5 TFLs. Marshall was a first-team All-Big Sky cornerback at Idaho in 2024. He started 14 games in two seasons with the Vandals, and has started both games in 2025.
- On the defensive line, **Jaylen George** spent three seasons at East Tennessee State, starting 23 games and totaling 54 tackles, 9.5 tackles for loss and 3.0 sacks.
- Nebraska also went to the FCS level to bolster its special teams units. **Kevin Gallic** is NU's long snapper after handling those duties for New Hampshire the past three seasons. Place-kicker **Kyle Cunanan** made 14-of-20 field goals over two seasons at Charlotte, and has connected on his first three attempts with the Huskers, including a career-long 52-yarder against Cincinnati.

SINGLE-DIGIT NUMBERS AWARDED THROUGH TEAM VOTE

For the third straight season, single-digit jersey numbers were awarded to the players who best represent what it means to be a Husker. The single-digit honorees were chosen through a players-only vote and the players then got to choose which single-digit number they wanted.

- The tradition of single-digit numbers being reserved for the chosen few dates back to Rhule's time at Temple.
 - "I got really tired of having a guy in my program who was there for three years, four years, really busted his tail and represented the program the right way, and he finally gets to be a senior and wants to wear a single digit, he's earned it...and invariably coaches give [a recruit] a single digit to get him to come there. It never felt right to me. It should be something earned. It's really just who do we want our players to say 'this is a guy who represents everything it means to be a Husker. He's tough, he's hard working, he's competitive'. It's not a popularity contest, it's an opportunity for our team to say these are the guys that embody everything it means to be a Husker."
- The 10 players listed below were selected by their teammates to be worthy of having a single-digit number this season. **Marques Buford Jr., Malcolm Hartzog Jr.** are wearing a single-digit number for the second straight year while senior defensive back **DeShon Singleton** is in No. 8 for a third straight year. The other seven players earned a single-digit for the first time.

WATCH LIST HUSKERS

Several Huskers were named to preseason watch lists. The offensive side of the ball was particularly well represented with five players earning preseason recognition.

- Jacory Barney Jr. was named to the Paul Hornung Award watch list, which is presented annually to the most versatile player in major college football. Barney led Nebraska with 55 catches in 2024, tying the Nebraska freshman receptions record, while totaling 447 receiving yards. He also led Nebraska in kickoff return yards and ranked second on the team in punt return yards, allpurpose yards and rushing touchdowns.
- Emmett Johnson was named to the Doak Walker Award watch list, an annual award presented to the nation's most outstanding college running back. Johnson led Nebraska with 884 scrimmage yards last season, including ranking second on the team with 598 rushing yards. He also caught 39 passes for 286 yards. Over the final four games of the season, Johnson averaged 121.0 scrimmage yards per game.
- Dylan Raiola was named to the Maxwell Award watch list, an award presented annually to the College Player of the Year, and was on the Polynesian Player of the Year watch list. Raiola was a semifinalist for the Shaun Alexander Freshman of the Year award in 2024, when he set Nebraska freshman records in passing yards (2,819) and completion percentage (67.1).
- Teddy Prochazka was named to the Allstate Wuerffel Trophy watch list and was a nominee for the Allstate Good Works team. The Wuerffel trophy honors student-athletes who are inspired to serve others and make positive impacts on society. The Good Works Team recognizes players for their commitment to community service and leadership beyond the gridiron. Prochazka is one of the most active Huskers in the community, as he participated in more than 45 community events during the 2024-25 academic year.
- Dane Key, a first-year transfer from Kentucky, was named to the 2026 Senior Bowl Top 300 list. Key caught 126 passes for 1,870 yards and 14 touchdowns as a Wildcat from 2022 to 2024.
- Kevin Gallic, a first-year transfer from FCS New Hampshire, was named to the watch list for the Patrick Mannelly Long Snapper Award, presented annually to the nation's top long snapper.

A dozen Huskers are playing this season as college graduates, including nine players who earned their degrees from Nebraska and three players who joined the Husker program as graduate transfers. Seven additional Huskers are on track to earn their degrees in December.

NOTES FROM NEBRASKA'S 2024 SEASON

Nebraska finished with a 7-6 record under Matt Rhule in 2024. Five of the six losses came in one-possession games, including a four-point road loss at eventual national champion Ohio State.

- Nebraska posted the program's most wins (7) and first winning record in eight seasons.
- The Huskers made a bowl game for the first time in eight seasons and won a bowl game for the first time in nine seasons.
- Nebraska went undefeated (4-0) against non-conference opponents for the first time in 19 seasons (since the 2005 season).
- The Huskers ranked in the top 20 nationally in rushing defense, scoring defense and total defense.
- Nebraska held seven of its 13 opponents to 15 or fewer points.
- Offensively, NU had the third-most improved passing offense in the country from the 2023 to the 2024 season, passing for 1,338 more yards in 2024 compared to 2023.
- Quarterback Dylan Raiola set Nebraska freshman records for passing yards and completion percentage, while Jacory Barney Jr. had the most catches by a freshman in school history (55).

NEBRASKA AMONG TOP ALL-TIME PROGRAMS

Nebraska is playing its 136th football season this fall, and the Huskers have historically been one of the top programs in college football history.

- NU ranks eighth in NCAA history with 926 wins and ninth with 54 all-time bowl game appearances.
- The Huskers have won five national titles. Nebraska's four Associated Press national championships (1970, 1971, 1994, 1995) rank seventh all-time and NU's four coaches poll titles (1971, 1994, 1995, 1997) rank fifth.
- Nebraska's 46 conference titles rank second in NCAA history.

HUSKERS ALSO EXCEL IN THE CLASSROOM

In addition to being one of the winningest and most successful program in NCAA history, the Nebraska football program has also led the way in the classroom.

- Nebraska football has produced more Academic All-Americans (108) and more NCAA Impact Award (formerly Top Ten) winners (9) than any other team in any sport in NCAA history.
- Nebraska led the Big Ten with 73 Academic All-Big Ten selections for the 2024 season.
- Following the 2025 spring semester, the cumulative grade-point average for all members of the Nebraska football team was 3.304, the highest in recorded history.



2025 NEBRASKA SEASON NOTEBOOK

SCHEDULE NOTES

- Nebraska's schedule consists of three nonconference games to open the season followed by nine Big Ten contests. In Big Ten Conference play, the Huskers will play lowa, Maryland, Michigan, Michigan State, Minnesota, Northwestern, Penn State, UCLA and USC. Nebraska will not play Illinois, Indiana, Ohio State, Oregon, Purdue, Rutgers, Washington or Wisconsin.
- Nebraska plays three non-Saturday games, playing once on Thursday (Cincinnati) and twice on Friday (at Minnesota, Iowa). The Huskers are one of seven teams from a power conference who play three weekday games in 2025 (also Cal, Houston, Minnesota, North Carolina, North Carolina State and Rutgers).
- The 2025 season began with a win over Cincinnati in Kansas City. NU opened away from home for the fifth time in six seasons.
- After beginning conference play with consecutive home games, Nebraska will play four Big Ten road games in a span of six games. That includes back-to-back road games at Maryland and Minnesota just six days apart in October.
- Nebraska wraps up the regular season at home against lowa the day after Thanksgiving (Nov. 28), the 36th straight year the Huskers will play on Black Friday.
- The Huskers will appear on multiple national television networks this season. Television designations are set for six of Nebraska's 12 games, and in those six games the Huskers will appear on the Big Ten Network, CBS, ESPN, FOX and FS1.

COACHING STAFF NOTES

- Matt Rhule is in his third season at Nebraska in 2025. Rhule is in his 13th season as a head coach after previously leading programs at Temple (2013-16) and Baylor (2017-19) along with an NFL stint as head coach of the Carolina Panthers (2020-22).
- Rhule owns a career record of 61-56 as a college head coach. He has a proven record as a program builder after taking on rebuilding projects at Temple, Baylor and Nebraska. Excluding his first season at each school, that record improves to 53-28.
- Rhule's college teams have taken a major step forward in his third season. Temple improved by four wins in Rhule's third season in 2014 and Baylor also improved by four wins in his third season in 2019. Rhule took both Temple and Baylor to the conference championship game in his third season.
- Nebraska features three new full-time coordinators this season. Dana Holgorsen is in his first full season as the Huskers' offensive coordinator after he served in that role for the final four games of the 2024 campaign. John Butler is in his first year as Nebraska's defensive coordinator after he coached the cornerbacks and was NU's defensive pass game coordinator in 2024. New to the staff is Mike Ekeler, who serves as special teams coordinator following

a successful four-year run in the same role at Tennessee.

 Other new assistant coaches include: Phil Snow (associate head coach); Terry Bradden (defensive line); Daikiel Shorts Jr. (wide receivers); Phil Simpson (outside linebackers); and Addison Williams (secondary).

ROSTER NOTES

 Nebraska's roster features 125 players. Nearly three-quarters of the roster is comprised of underclassmen with almost half of the roster classified as freshmen.

- The roster features 89 returning players and 36 newcomers. Nebraska returns a total of 10 starters and 38 letterwinners.
- Nebraska added 15 transfers and 21 true freshmen to its roster in 2025. Among the 15 transfers are 11 FBS transfers and four FCS transfers.
- Nine of Nebraska's FBS 11 transfers came from Power Conference programs (Alabama, Cal, Georgia, Kentucky, Mississippi State, Missouri, Notre Dame, Oklahoma and Purdue).
- The roster features players from 29 states and three foreign countries (Australia, Germany and New Zealand).
- Nebraska has had a letterwinner from 47 of the 50 states in its history, missing only Idaho, New Hampshire and Rhode Island.
- States with multiple players on the roster include: Nebraska (36), Texas (10), Missouri (7), California (6), Florida (6), Iowa (6), Pennsylvania (5), Arizona (4), Colorado (4), Georgia (4), Kansas (4), Louisiana (3), New Jersey (3), Hawaii (2), Illinois (2), Kentucky (2), Maryland (2), Michigan (2), Minnesota (2), Mississispipi (2) and South Dakota (2).
- The states of Indiana, Montana, Nevada, North Dakota, New York, Tennessee, Utah and Wisconsin are each represented with one player on Nebraska's 2025 roster.
- The players who are wearing a single-digit jersey number (0-9) earned the right to wear that number through a team vote.



HOME OF THE HUSKERS



Memorial Stadium celebrated its 100th year in 2023. In the fall of 1922, a drive for \$430,000 in stadium construction funds was undertaken by faculty, students, alumni and friends of the University.

The stadium was named Memorial Stadium to honor all Nebraskans who served in the Civil and Spanish-American Wars; the 751 Nebraskans who died in World War I; the 3,839 in World War II; the 225 in Korea; the 422 in Vietnam; and those in Iraq.

Construction was completed in a few more than 90 working days and Memorial Stadium was dedicated on Oct. 20, 1923, at the Homecoming game in which Nebraska was held to a scoreless tie by Kansas.

The field at Memorial Stadium was named Tom Osborne Field - after the Huskers' legendary Hall-of-Fame coach - in 1998, one year after Osborne's retirement following 25 years and 255 victories as head coach.



Matt Rhule has a proven track record as a program builder. In his first two collegiate head coaching jobs at Temple (2013-16) and Baylor (2017-19), Rhule led both the Owls and the Bears to their most victories in school history in just his third season. He also took both teams to the conference championship game in year three.

Rhule took Temple from two wins in his first season to a school-record 10 victories in both his third and fourth seasons with an appearance in the conference championship game both seasons. He then took Baylor from one win in his first season to a school-record 11 victories in his third season and an appearance in the Big 12 Championship Game and the Sugar Bowl.

At Nebraska, Rhule led Nebraska to a 7-6 record and a bowl victory in his second season in 2024, marking the Huskers' first winning record in eight years and first bowl win in nine years.

TAKING TEMPLE TO NEW HEIGHTS

In his tenure at Temple from 2013 to 2016, Rhule took the Owls to new heights.

- In Rhule's second season in 2014, Temple posted the program's first win over an SEC team since 1938, its first win over a ranked opponent in 16 seasons and the program's largest margin of victory in nearly 50 years.
- Rhule won 10 games in both 2015 and 2016. He is responsible for two of the three 10-win seasons in Temple's 125-year history.
- He also took the Owls to back-to-back bowl games in 2015 and 2016, the first time Temple played in a bowl in consecutive seasons.
- In 2015, Rhule led Temple to the American Athletic Conference Championship Game, the first conference title game in program history.
- The next season, Rhule guided the Owls to their second conference title in program history and the first in nearly 40 years.
- Temple has spent a total of 16 weeks ranked in the 88-year history of the Associated Press top-25 poll. More than half of those top-25 rankings (9) came under Rhule in 2015 and 2016.

AN ENCORE AT BAYLOR

At Temple, Rhule led the Owls to their highest season win total in program history, their first conference championship game appearance and an impressive run in the national rankings. He produced an encore by repeating each of those same feats in three seasons at Baylor.

- Baylor finished with 11 losses in Rhule's first season in 2017 but two years later, he guided the Bears to 11 wins in 2019. Baylor became the first Power Conference program to go from 11 losses to 11 wins in two or fewer seasons
- Baylor won its final two games of the 2018 season and its first nine games of the 2019 campaign. The 11 straight victories marked the second-longest winning streak in school history, while Baylor's 9-0 start in 2019 was the best start in program history.
- In his third season in 2019, Rhule led Baylor to its most wins (11) in school history, the Bears advanced to their first Big 12 Championship Game and played in the Sugar Bowl for only the second time in program history.
- Baylor finished with a No. 13 ranking in 2019, its second-highest final ranking since 1951.

The Houston Christian Huskies are off to a 1-1 start this season after falling 20-10 to Eastern Kentucky on the road last weekend.

The Huskies are averaging 396.5 yards per game, with 173 yards per game through the air and 223.5 yards per game on the ground. Xai'Shaun Edwards leads the HCU rushing attack with 27 carries for 200 yards and four scores, followed by Darryle Evans with 128 yards and three touchdowns on 33 rushes.

HEAD COACH **JASON BACHTEL**

Jason Bachtel is in his second season as the head coach at Houston Christian, guiding the Huskies to a 6-8 record.

In his first year with the Huskies, Bachtel led HCU to a 5-7 overall record and 3-4 mark in 2024. The Huskies picked up the program's first-ever win over a ranked opponent with a 43-22 win over No. 22 McNeese.

Bachtel spent the 2023 season as Houston Christian's offensive coordinator, playing a pivotal role in the program's first winning season and leading the Southland Conference's No. 2 scoring offense.

Prior to HCU, Bachtel spent two seasons as the head coach at Howard Payne. While leading the Yellowjackets, Bachtel posted back-to-back 7-3 seasons. In his two years at the helm, HPU averaged 489.5 yards of total offense and scored 38.4 points per game.

Bachtel was a three-year letterwinner at quarterback for Howard Payne from 1999-2001.

BACHTEL VS. NEBRASKA

Saturday's matchup is Bachtel's first meeting vs. Nebraska.

HCU INFORMATION

Houston Christian has fielded a football team since 2014 and has an all-time record of 29-98.
