Nebraska returns to the road for a second consecutive week in Big Ten play, as the Huskers travel to Minneapolis to take on Minnesota in a Friday night contest. Game time from Huntington Bank Stadium is set for 7 p.m. CT and the game will be televised by FOX. The contest can also be heard on the Huskers Radio Network, Huskers.com and the official Huskers App.

Nebraska is 5-1 overall and 2-1 in Big Ten Conference play after a dramatic 34-31 comeback victory at Maryland on Saturday. The victory pushed Nebraska into the national polls for the first time this season. NU is ranked No. 25 in the AP poll and is just outside of the top 25 in the Coaches Poll. This week against the Gophers, Nebraska will look for back-to-back road victories in consecutive weeks for the first time since 2006, and a win would give Nebraska its first 6-1 start since winning its first seven games in 2016.

The Huskers trailed 31-24 in the fourth quarter at Maryland before rallying with 10 points in the final 7:47 to pull out the three-point victory. The win was Nebraska's first when trailing entering the fourth quarter since 2022. The Huskers relied on a balanced offensive attack in the win, rolling up 193 yards on the ground, while throwing for 260 yards. Nebraska gained 187 yards in the fourth quarter and had scoring drives of 83 and 81 yards.

Minnesota enters the game at 4-2 overall and 2-1 in Big Ten action. The Gophers also had a fourth-quarter rally last week in a 27-20 win over Purdue. Minnesota out-scored the Boilermakers 14-0 in the final quarter to pull out the win. Minnesota relies on a strong defense that allows just over 300 yards per game, and has recorded 10 takeaways on the season, including three defensive touchdowns. Minnesota is a perfect 4-0 at home this season.

Nebraska has a trio of receivers with at least three touchdown catches this season, including Nyziah Hunter (4), Dane Key (4) and Jacory Barney Jr. (3). This is the first time Nebraska has had three wideouts catch three or more TD passes in a season since 2015.

Nebraska is one of four schools in the country to have a player ranked in the top 20 nationally in rushing yards per game (Emmett Johnson) and passing yards per game (Dylan Raiola). The other three schools are Baylor, Rutgers and USC.

Nebraska led Maryland 24-17 at the half, marking the 10th straight game Nebraska has led or been tied at the half dating back to last season. The previous time Nebraska had a streak of 10 consecutive games without trailing at the half was a 12-game streak spanning the 2000 and 2001 seasons.

HUSKERS LOOK TO END GOPHER WIN STREAK IN SERIES

Friday's game in Minneapolis is the first meeting between the schools since Matt Rhule's first game as the Huskers' head coach in August of 2023.

- Minnesota owns a five-game winning streak in the series, dating back to a win in Minneapolis in 2019. Each of the past four Gopher victories have been by seven or fewer points, including a walk-off 13-10 victory in 2023.
- Nebraska won four of the first six meetings between the schools after joining the Big Ten, but Minnesota has won six of the past seven games to hold an 8-5 advantage since 2011.
- Before Nebraska joined the Big Ten, Minnesota was the most frequent opponent among Big Ten schools. The Huskers and Gophers met 51 times between 1900 and 1990, including 19 consecutive seasons between 1934 and 1952 and eight straight years from 1967 to 1974.

NEBRASKA HEADS BACK ON THE ROAD

After opening the season with a neutral site victory over Cincinnati on Aug. 28 at Kansas City's Arrowhead Stadium, Nebraska enjoyed the comforts of home for four games, before playing its first true road game at Maryland last Saturday. Nebraska stays on the road this week for back-to-back conference road tests.

- This marks the fourth straight season the Huskers have faced back-to-back road games in consecutive weeks. Last year, Nebraska faced back-to-back ranked opponents on the road in October (Indiana, Ohio State). In 2023 Nebraska opened at Minnesota and at Colorado.
- Nebraska last won back-to-back road games in consecutive weeks in 2006, when the Huskers won
 at lowa State and Kansas State in mid-October. Nebraska last won consecutive road games in
 2017 with wins at Illinois and Purdue, but those were separated by a month.

NEBRASKA SET FOR SECOND 2025 WEEKNIGHT GAME

The Huskers' Friday Night Lights matchup at Minnesota is their second weeknight game of 2025. Nebraska opened the season with a 20-17 victory over Cincinnati in a Thursday night matchup at Arrowhead Stadium.

- The Minnesota matchup marks the second of three weekday games for Nebraska in 2025. The Huskers conclude the regular season with their traditional Black Friday matchup with Iowa in Lincoln.
- Nebraska is one of seven teams from a power conference who play three weekday games in 2025 (also Cal, Houston, Minnesota, North Carolina, North Carolina State and Rutgers).
- Nebraska is playing a weeknight Big Ten game for the fourth consecutive season, following a 2024
 Friday night home game against Illinois, the 2023 Thursday night opener at Minnesota and a 2022
 road Friday tilt at Rutgers.
- Overall this is Nebraska's sixth Friday night conference game (non-Black Friday) since 2017, and its seventh weeknight Big Ten game since 2017.

NEBRASKA ENTERS RANKINGS FOR FIRST TIME IN 2025

Following its dramatic comeback road victory at Maryland, Nebraska entered the national polls for the first time in the 2025 season.

- The Huskers are ranked No. 25 in this week's Associated Press Poll and are just outside of the Top 25 in the Coaches poll. Nebraska's 90 points in the coaches poll are the second-most among teams outside of the Top 25.
- This is Nebraska's first ranking in either poll since being ranked No. 25 in the coaches poll after a 5-1 start last season and before a loss at Indiana.
- It is the Huskers' first ranking in the AP poll since being ranked No. 22 after a 3-0 start to the 2024 season.
- Nebraska's 5-1 start this year marks the second straight year the Huskers have achieved that record at the midway point of the season. This is the first time Nebraska has started 5-1 in consecutive seasons since the 2013 and 2014 campaigns.

NOTING LAST GAME

- Nebraska outscored Maryland, 10-0 in the fourth quarter and won for the first time when trailing in the fourth quarter since a 14-13 win at Rutgers in 2022.
- Nyziah Hunter opened the scoring with a career-long 64-yard touchdown reception.
 The catch bettered his previous long of 60 yards while at Cal against SMU in 2024.
- Hunter added a 12-yard TD catch in the second quarter, giving him his second multi-TD catch game of his career.
- Hunter finished the game with five receptions for a career-high 125 yards, bettering his previous high of 93 against Michigan State.
- Emmett Johnson carried 21 times for a career-high 176 yards in the game, marking his third 100-yard rushing game in 2025 (also vs Cincinnati and Akron). His previous high was 140 yards against Akron.
- Johnson's 176 yards rushing is the most by a Husker since Anthony Grant had 189 yards vs. North Dakota in 2022. It is the most yards by a Husker in a Big Ten game since Dedrick Mills had 191 yards at Rutgers in 2020.
- Johnson's 50-yard run in the fourth quarter was a career long, betting his previous best of 47 yards earlier this season against Akron.
- Dylan Raiola completed 20-of-29 passes for 260 yards and a career-high four touchdowns. His 64-yard TD pass to Hunter marked his career long pass.
- Kenneth Williams had an 85-yard kickoff return in the second quarter to set up a Nebraska touchdown. The 85-yard return was Nebraska's longest kickoff return since JD Spielman had a 99-yard kickoff return for a touchdown against Arkansas State on Sept. 2, 2017.

BLACKSHIRTS STIFLING OPPONENT PASSING GAME

The Nebraska Blackshirts have been strong in 2025, ranking among the Big Ten and national leaders in numerous categories. At the top of that list is a shut-down pass defense.

- Nebraska leads the nation in pass yards allowed per game at 118.0 per contest, 8.3 yards per game better than Oklahoma. NU is second in the nation in team pass efficiency defense with an 94.28 rating.
- The Huskers held each of their first three opponents to less than 70 yards passing, including Cincinnati (69 yards), Akron (62) and Houston Christian (67). It marked the first time Nebraska held three straight opponents to fewer than 100 passing yards since 1990, when the Huskers held their first four opponents below the century mark in passing yards.
- Both Michigan (105 yards) and Michigan State (156 yards) were held below 100 yards until their final drive of the game.
- Husker opponents are completing 55.8 percent of their passes, a rate that is 15th nationally.
- Nebraska's five opponent pass plays of 20 yards or more leads the nation, with every other FBS team allowing at least seven 20-yard passes. Nebraska did not allow a pass play of 20 yards or more until Michigan State completed a 24-yard pass in the game's final minutes against the Huskers' second unit.
- Nebraska has allowed two touchdown passes this season, and is one of only four teams in the nation to allow two or fewer TD passes this season.
- In addition to its dominant pass defense, Nebraska also ranks in the top 30 nationally in total defense (269.3 ypg, 14th), scoring defense (18.7 ppg, 30th) and 3rd-down defense (26.8%, 8th).
- Nebraska's shutout of Akron on Sept. 6 marked the first shutout by the Blackshirts in 16 seasons, dating back to a 2009 Holiday Bowl whitewash of Arizona.
- Both Houston Christian and Akron were held to less than 200 yards. It marked the first time Nebraska held an opponent to less than 200 yards in consecutive games since 2017.
- Under Head Coach Matt Rhule, NU has held opponents to 14 or fewer points 16 times in 31 games.

IMPROVED NU OFFENSE SHOWING EFFICIENCY AND BALANCE

Nebraska has shown explosiveness and efficieny on offense throughout the 2025 season.

- Nebraska ranks in the top 30 nationally in scoring offense (41.0 ppg, 11th), passing offense (310.2 ypg, 9th), and total offense (450.0 ypg, 27th).
- Nebraska is second in the nation in completion percentage. The Huskers have completed 154of-205 passes for a 75.1 completion percentage, trailing only top-ranked Ohio State's 77.9 completion percentage. NU's school season pass completion record is 68.3 percent in 2008.
- Nebraska is averaging 91.0 yards per game more in 2025 than last season. The Huskers are one of 15 FBS teams averaging 90 more yards of offense per game this season than last season.
- Nebraska is averaging 41.0 points per game, an improvement of 17.5 points per game over its average of 23.5 points per game in 2024. That is the fourth-best improvement in the nation.
- The passing attack has been balanced. A total of 19 receivers have caught passes, including five players with at least 19 receptions.
- Nebraska threw for better than 300 yards in three consecutive games (Akron, Houston Christian, Michigan). It marked the first time NU had thrown for more than 300 yards in three straight games since a five-game stretch, including the 2014 Holiday Bowl and the first four games in 2015.
- Nebraska produced a 300-yard passer (Raiola), a 100-yard rusher (Johnson) and a 100-yard receiver (Barney Jr.) against Akron. It marked the first time Nebraska has accomplished that trifecta since a 2022 game against Georgia Southern.
- Nebraska has 32 plays of at least 20 yards to rank 36th nationally in that category. The Huskers had 11 offensive plays that covered at least 20 yards in the victory over Akron.

RAIOLA IN YEAR TWO AS STARTING QUARTERBACK

Dylan Raiola has started all 19 games of his Nebraska career. This season, he has completed 138-of-188 passes for 1,591 yards and 16 touchdowns. Raiola had a career-best 364 passing yards and a career-high four touchdowns against Akron, and added a second 300-yard game with 308 yards and three TDs against Michigan. He matched his career best with four TD passes at Maryland, including the game-winner with just over a minute remaining. He has topped 200 passing yards in five of six games. In 2024, Raiola guided the Huskers to a 7-6 record while becoming the first true freshman quarterback in school history to win a bowl game.

- Raiola has completed 73.4 percent of his passes, and his completion percentage ranks fourth nationally. He has completed better than 70 percent of his passes in 10 of 19 career games, including seven of the past 10 contests.
- Raiola's 265.2 passing yards per game ranks 19th nationally and fourth in the Big Ten.
- Raiola completed his first nine passes against Akron after completing his final 11 against Cincinnati. The 20 consecutive completions are a Nebraska record, bettering the previous record of 15 straight by Dave Humm against Kansas in 1974.
- Raiola's 364 passing yards against Akron bettered his previous career high of 297 yards against Illinois in 2024. It was the most passing yards by a Husker since Adrian Martinez threw for 384 yards at Wisconsin in 2018.
- Raiola has had a caeer-high four passing touchdowns against Akron and Maryland, which bettered
 his 2024 high of three TD passes against Illinois. His four-TD effort agaisnt Akron was the first time
 a Husker quarterback had four passing touchdowns since Ryker Fyfe had four at Purdue in 2015.
- Raiola's 33 completions against Cincinnati were the fourth-most in school history and just three shy
 of the school record. His 78.6 completion percentage vs. the Bearcats was the best of his college
 career. He added a second game with 30 completions in a 30-of-41 effort against Michigan.
- Raiola's 16 touchdown passes through six games, are already three more than he threw in 2024.
 The Nebraska season record for touchdown passes is 26 by Zac Taylor in 2006.
- With 1,591 passing yards this season, Raiola has increased his career total to 4,410 yards, moving him into ninth place on the Nebraska career passing list.
- In Big Ten play, Raiola has been strong in crunch time. After Nebraska has trailed in the second half of three Big Ten games, Raioloa has completed 33-of-46 passes (71.7 percent) for 357 yards and three touchdowns with no turnovers, with Nebraska scoring on eight of 12 drives. His play has led Nebraska to second-half comebacks against Michigan State and Maryland.
- Raiola threw for 2,819 yards and 13 touchdowns in 2024 with a 67.1 completion percentage. His
 completion percentage and passing yardage were both NU freshman records. Overall, Raiola
 ranked third in school history in season completion percentage and seventh in passing yards.
- Nationally, Raiola ranked 13th in completion percentage among all FBS quarterbacks in 2024, and he led all FBS freshmen in completion percentage. Raiola also led all true freshmen and ranked third overall among all freshmen in passing yards.
- Raiola's 2,819 passing yards were the most by a true freshman Big Ten quarterback since 2013 and marked the second-best passing season by a Big Ten true freshman this century.

HUSKERS SHARING THE WEALTH IN PASSING GAME

Nebraska's potent passing game highlights multiple players as Raiola has distributed the ball evenly among talented playmakers.

- Five Huskers have at least 19 receptions, including three wideouts, a tight end and a running back.
- In total, 19 players have caught a pass this season with 14 pass catchers in the Huskers' victory over Akron on Sept. 6.
- Ten different players have a catch of at least 20 yards this season.

- Sophomore **Jacory Barney Jr.** leads Nebraska in receptions (26), and receiving yards (364) and has three touchdown receptions. Barney has a pair of 100-yard games with seven catches for 132 yards against Akron and six receptions for 120 yards and two touchdowns against Michigan. Barney has multiple receptions in 18 consecutive games.
- Barney caught his first career TD pass against Houston Christian and followed with two TD catches against Michigan. He has three career rushing touchdowns.
- In his first year at Nebraska, senior **Dane Key** has 20 catches for 269 yards and four touchdowns. He had a touchdown in each of his first three games, and added his fourth TD of the season with a game-winning grab at Maryland. Key led the Huskers in receiving against Houston Christian with four catches for 104 yards.
- Sophomore receiver **Nyziah Hunter** has been Nebraska's big play receiver with 22 catches for 415 yards for an average of 18.9 yards per reception. Hunter had a pair of touchdowns at Maryland, including a career-long 64-yard catch. He had a 59-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter against Michigan State to help secure the win.
- Hunter had a career-best 125 yards on five catches at Maryland and is the third different receiver to post a 100-yard receiving day in 2025, joining Barney and Key.
- Junior tight end **Luke Lindenmeyer** has 19 catches for 196 yards, with touchdowns against Akron and Maryland. He set career highs with seven catches for 60 yards against Michigan, including a career-long 23-yard catch. His seven catches against the Wolverines were just one shy of the Nebraska tight end single-game record.
- Running back **Emmett Johnson** has been a steady receiver out of the backfield the past two seasons. Johnson has 24 receptions, including a career-best seven catches against Cincinnati and six against Michigan State.

JOHNSON THRIVING IN HUSKER BACKFIELD

Junior running back **Emmett Johnson** has been one of the Big Ten's most productive backs over the past 10 games since Dana Holgorsen became Nebraska's play-caller.

- Johnson is coming off a career outing at Maryland in NU's 34-31 victory. Johnson rushed 21 times
 for a career-high 176 yards, incuding a career-long 50-yard run on a critical fourth-quarter scoring
 drive. Johnson had seven runs of at least 10 yards against the Terrapins, and had a total of 196
 yards from scrimmage.
- Johnson ranks seventh nationally and second in the Big Ten with 108.3 rushing yards per game and first in the Big Ten and fifth nationally in yards from scrimmage at 130.0 yards per game.
- Johnson has eight touchdowns and ranks 10th nationally in touchdowns scored.
- Johnson had 140 rushing yards against Akron on Sept. 6. He also reached the end zone a career-best three times against the Zips, including two rushing scores and a touchdown catch. He matched the three-TD total against Michigan State with a trio of rushing touchdowns. He has a third multi-TD game this season with two rushing scores against Houston Christian.
- Johnson posted back-to-back 100-yard rushing games to open the season (140 vs. Akron, 108 vs. Cincinnati). Johnson was the first Husker to rush for 100 yards in back-to-back games since Anthony Grant topped the century mark in each of the first three games of the 2022 season.
- In Johnson's 140-yard effort against Akron, he had 134 yards before halftime, including runs of 47 yards and 36 yards.
- Johnson took over the lead back role in the final four games last season when Holgorsen joined the Nebraska staff. Over the last 10 games, Johnson has averaged 126.4 yards from scrimmage per game, including 96.4 rushing yards and 30.0 receiving yards per game.

HUSKER SPECIAL TEAMS MAKE MARK

Nebraska has shown improved special teams in 2025, highlighted by the work of the punt return unit. Nebraska is on pace for its best punt return season in more than a decade and the Huskers have also blocked two punts.

- Nebraska had 92 punt return yards against Akron, including four returns for 87 yards by Jacory Barney Jr. The 92 punt return yards in that game alone bettered Nebraska's punt return totals for each of the past four seasons. As a team, Nebraska had 73 yards in 2024, 48 yards in 2023, 66 punt return yards in 2022 and 27 total punt return yards in 2021. Through six games, Nebraska has 18 punt returns for 266 yards, and ranks 16th nationally averaging 14.8 yards per return.
- Barney's 87 punt return yards vs. Akron were the most by a Husker since De'Mornay Pierson-El had 134 punt return yards at Iowa in 2014. Barney's 39-yard punt return in the third quarter was the longest by a Husker since JD Spielman had a 76-yard punt return against South Alabama in 2019.
- Barney had four returns for 81 yards against Michigan State, including a career-long 57-yarder. He
 now has 195 punt return yards this season, the highest total by a Husker since Pierson-El had 596
 punt return yards on 34 returns in 2014. Barney is the first Husker to top 100 punt return yards in
 a season since 2019.



- Nebraska got its kickoff return game going at Maryland. Kenneth Williams had an 85-yard kickoff
 return in the second quarter, marking the longest kickoff return by a Husker since 2017. Nebraska
 totaled 162 kickoff returns in the game. For the season, NU is averaging 28.8 yards per return to
 rank first in the Big Ten and seventh nationally.
- The Huskers have blocked three kicks in 2025. Defensive back Jamir Conn has blocked a pair
 of punts, including a blocked punt against Michigan State that Carter Nelson returned for a
 touchdown. Conn also partially blocked a punt against Houston Christian. Defensive tackle Riley
 Van Poppel blocked a third-quarter Akron field goal attempt to preserve a shutout.
- Place-kicker **Kyle Cunanan** is 9-of-10 on field goals, including a career-long 52-yarder against Cincinnati. Cunanan is also 31-of-31 on PATs and has nine touchbacks on 18 kickoffs.
- Freshman punter **Archie Wilson** has downed five of his 13 punts inside the opponent 20-yard line, including three against Cincinnati. He averaged a season-best 49.2 yards on four punts against Michigan. Nebraska has allowed -1 yards in punt returns.

NEBRASKA EXCELLING IN WINNING CATEGORIES

In addition to improved special teams, Nebraska has shown progress in critical areas that impact winning including third downs, penalties and turnover margin.

- Nebraska has converted 47.1 percent of its third-down attempts to rank 27th nationally.
 Defensively, Nebraska ranks eighth in the nation, allowing opponents to convert just 26.6 percent of their third-down attempts.
- Nebraska is being flagged for 4.7 penalties per game to rank 19th nationally in fewest penalties per game. NU's 40.8 yards per game in penalty yardage is 24th nationally.
- Nebraska continues to make progress in turnover margin. In Matt Rhule's first season in 2023, Nebraska was -17 in turnover margin before improving to -2 in 2024. This season, Nebraska is +3 in turnover margin. NU committed just three turnovers in its first five games, before overcoming a -3 turnover margin in its win at Maryland. Nebraska has not had a positive turnover margin for a season since 2016.

MATT RHULE IN THIRD SEASON LEADING HUSKER PROGRAM

Matt Rhule is in his third season at Nebraska in 2025. He owns a 64-57 record in his 10 seasons as a college head coach, including 17-14 at Nebraska. He took on a rebuilding project in each of his three college stops and excluding his first year at each school, Rhule boasts a 56-29 record.

- Year three has proven to be a breakthrough year for Rhule. At both of his previous college stops (Temple and Baylor), Rhule led his team to the conference championship game in his third season.
- In his third season at Temple in 2016, the Owls went 10-4 and played for the American Athletic Conference championship.
- In his third season at Baylor in 2019, the Bears were 11-3 and played for the Big 12 title.
- In his second season at Nebraska in 2024, Rhule guided the Huskers to their first winning record in eight years and first bowl win in nine years.
- Rhule posted an 8-28 combined record in his first seasons at Temple, Baylor and Nebraska. In year two at those three schools, that record improved to 20-18. In his third season at Temple and Baylor, Rhule's teams posted a combined 21-7 record.
- Rhule has matched or improved his previous season's win total every year of his college coaching career. Temple went from two wins in his first season to six wins in his second season and 10 wins in both his third and fourth seasons. Baylor went from one win in Rhule's first season to seven wins in year two and 11 wins in year three. Rhule led Nebraska to a five-win season in 2023 and a seven-win campaign in 2024.

HOLGORSEN COORDINATING HUSKER OFFENSE

Dana Holgorsen is in his first full season as Nebraska's offensive coordinator in 2025 after he coordinated the offense and called the plays for the final four games last season. Nebraska has thrived on offense since Holgorsen's arrival. This season, the Huskers are averaging 41.0 points and 450.0 yards of total offense per game.

- Holgorsen boasts six full seasons of experience as an offensive coordinator at Texas Tech, Houston and Oklahoma State. In six full seasons as a coordinator before 2025, Holgorsen's offenses have averaged 402.2 passing yards per game, 524.9 total yards per game and 40.7 points per game.
- The offenses Holgorsen has coordinated have an average national finish of second in passing offense, third in total offense and sixth in scoring average. He was the coordinator for two of the top four passing seasons in FBS history (2007 at Texas Tech and 2009 at Houston).
- Quarterbacks have thrived in Holgorsen-coached offenses. Holgorsen coached the all-time FBS leader in touchdown passes and total offense (Houston's Case Keenum) along with the FBS season record holder in completions (Texas Tech's Graham Harrell). Since Holgorsen took over the Husker offense in the final four games last season, Dylan Raiola has completed 73.1 percent of his passes and at least 70 percent of his passes in seven of 10 games.
- In addition to his experience as an offensive coordinator, Holgorsen has also been a successful head coach. He won 92 games in 13 seasons at West Virginia and Houston. Holgorsen is second in coaching victories at West Virginia and fifth at Houston.

BUTLER IN CHARGE OF BLACKSHIRT DEFENSE

John Butler is in his first season as Nebraska's defensive coordinator in 2025 after he served as the Huskers' defensive backs coach in his first year on staff in 2024. In seven games as NU's defensive coordinator, Nebraska has allowed two passing touchdowns and posted its first shutout in 16 years.

- Butler served as Nebraska's defensive coordinator for the 2024 Pinstripe Bowl. NU limited Boston College to 15 points, allowing only one scoring drive longer than two yards.
- Butler helped Nebraska rank in the top 20 nationally in rushing defense, total defense and scoring
 defense in 2024. His defensive backs helped the Huskers record their most interceptions (11) in
 eight seasons.
- Butler, who was Penn State's defensive coordinator in 2013, boasts a decade of experience in the National Football League. In his 10 years in the NFL, he helped his teams win six division titles.
- Butler coached the Buffalo Bills defensive backs for five seasons from 2018 to 2023. In those five seasons, the Bills allowed the fewest passing yards in the NFL.
- Previously he spent four seasons coaching the secondary for the Houston Texans. The Texans ranked in the top three in the NFL in pass defense twice in his four seasons.

EKELER LEADS HUSKER SPECIAL TEAMS

Mike Ekeler is in his first season as Nebraska's special teams coordinator, and has directed dramatic improvement for the Huskers. Nebraska ranks in the top 20 nationally in blocked kicks, kickoff returns, punt returns and punt return defense, while also making 9-of-10 field goals. Ekeler, who coached the Husker linebackers from 2008 to 2010, served as Tennessee's special teams coordinator from 2021 to 2024. Nebraska's special teams are on track to be much improved under Ekeler's direction.

- Ekeler brought a wealth of experience to the Husker sideline, as he has coached in every power conference (ACC, Big Ten, Big 12, Pac-12 and SEC) while serving on staffs at six of the 12 winning programs in college football history (Oklahoma, Nebraska, Georgia, Tennessee, USC and LSU).
- Tennessee led the nation in punt return yards and percentage of punts downed inside the opponent's 10-yard line over the course of Ekeler's four-year tenure.



- Ekeler's special teams units were routinely ranked in the top 25 during his time in Knoxville. In Ekeler's four seasons, Tennessee finished in the top 25 nationally in punt returns (2021, 2022, 2023, 2024), punt return defense (2021, 2022, 2023), net punting (2021, 2023), kickoff returns (2021), blocked punts (2021, 2023, 2024) and blocked kicks (2023).
- Ekeler has been a winner in his college coaching career. He has won 10 bowl games in his 20 years at a Power Four program. His teams have played for the national title three times, and he was a member of LSU's 2007 national championship team. In his first stint at Nebraska, Ekeler helped the Huskers to a pair of appearances in the Big 12 Championship Game in three seasons.

HUSKERS POSSESS VETERAN OFFENSIVE LINE

The most experienced unit on the Nebraska team is the offensive line. Husker offensive linemen had combined to play in 227 career games with 123 career starts entering this season. Seven Husker offensive linemen have started at least 14 games in their career, all at Power Four schools.

- According to research compiled by Clemson, Nebraska's 227 combined games played by offensive linemen ranked as the 10th-most in the country entering the 2025 season.
- Notre Dame transfer Rocco Spindler played in 41 games with 24 starts at right guard in his Irish career, and has started all six games in 2025. He has played in more games than any other Husker offensive lineman.
- Justin Evans has started 23 games at Nebraska, including 16 starts at left guard, seven starts at center and one start as a sixth offensive lineman. He is anchoring the 2025 line at center.
- Henry Lutovsky has made 21 starts in his Husker career, 15 at right guard and six this season at
- Gunnar Gottula has started 15 games for the Huskers. He started nine games at left tackle in 2024, and manned the position for the first four games this season before starting at right tackle the past two weeks.
- Alabama transfer Elijah Pritchett started 12 games with the Crimson Tide. He started 11 games at right tackle in 2024 and one at left tackle. He has been Nebraska's starting left tackle the past two games.
- Teddy Prochazka has started 15 games for Nebraska. Prochazka returned after missing the entire 2024 season due to injury, and started the first four games at right tackle. He previously started 11 games at left tackle.
- Turner Corcoran has started 35 games for the Huskers with 30 starts at left tackle, three starts at left guard and two starts at right tackle. Corcoran had started 30 consecutive games at one point before suffering season-ending injuries during both the 2023 and 2024 seasons.

TRANSFERS ADD EXPERIENCE & PRODUCTION TO HUSKER ROSTER

Nebraska added 36 newcomers to its roster in 2025, including a freshman class of 21, and 15 first-year transfers.

- Ten transfers came from FBS programs while five came from the FCS. Of the 10 FBS transfers, eight came from Power Four programs: Alabama, Georgia, Kentucky, Mississippi State, Missouri, Notre Dame, Oklahoma and Purdue.
- Dane Key started 36 games at Kentucky, and is NU's most experienced receiver. Key has four touchdown catches this season, including one in each of the first three games and the game-winner at Maryland. He has 20 catches for 269 yards. Key has 146 career receptions for 2,139 yards and 18 touchdowns. He is 12th receiving yards among active FBS players.

WATCH LIST HUSKERS

Several Huskers were named to preseason watch lists. The offensive side of the ball was particularly well represented with five players earning preseason recognition.

- Jacory Barney Jr. was named to the Paul Hornung Award watch list, which is presented annually to the most versatile player in major college football. Barney led Nebraska with 55 catches in 2024, tying the Nebraska freshman receptions record, while totaling 447 receiving yards. He also led Nebraska in kickoff return yards and ranked second on the team in punt return yards, allpurpose yards and rushing touchdowns.
- Emmett Johnson was named to the Doak Walker Award watch list, an annual award presented to the nation's most outstanding college running back. Johnson led Nebraska with 884 scrimmage yards last season, including ranking second on the team with 598 rushing yards. He also caught 39 passes for 286 yards. Over the final four games of the season, Johnson averaged 121.0 scrimmage yards per game.
- Dylan Raiola was named to the Maxwell Award watch list, an award presented annually to the College Player of the Year, and was on the Polynesian Player of the Year watch list. Raiola was a semifinalist for the Shaun Alexander Freshman of the Year award in 2024, when he set Nebraska freshman records in passing yards (2,819) and completion percentage (67.1).
- Teddy Prochazka was named to the Allstate Wuerffel Trophy watch list and was a nominee for the Allstate Good Works team. The Wuerffel trophy honors student-athletes who are inspired to serve others and make positive impacts on society. The Good Works Team recognizes players for their commitment to community service and leadership beyond the gridiron. Prochazka is one of the most active Huskers in the community, as he participated in more than 45 community events during the 2024-25 academic year.
- Dane Key, a first-year transfer from Kentucky, was named to the 2026 Senior Bowl Top 300 list. Key caught 126 passes for 1,870 yards and 14 touchdowns as a Wildcat from 2022 to 2024.
- Kevin Gallic, a first-year transfer from FCS New Hampshire, was named to the watch list for the Patrick Mannelly Long Snapper Award, presented annually to the nation's top long snapper.
- Malcolm Hartzog, a senior defensive back, was named as a semifinalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy presented by the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame. All semifinalists are seniors in their final season of eligibility who has at least a 3.2 GPA, excels on the field and demonstrates strong character and leadership.

- Nyziah Hunter caught 40 passes for 578 yards and five touchdowns for Cal in 2024. Hunter averages 18.9 yards on his 22 receptions this season and has four touchdowns, including a two-touchdown effort at Maryland.
- Together, Key and Hunter have a combined 208 career receptions for 3,132 yards and 27 touchdowns.
- Rocco Spindler and Elijah Pritchett joined the offensive line after each was a starter for top-25 programs. Spindler started 23 games over four seasons at Notre Dame. Pritchett started 12 games at Alabama in 2024 and played in 29 games over his three years with the Crimson Tide.
- Dasan McCullough played in 12 games with four starts as a freshman at Indiana in 2022 and then appeared in 17 games with eight starts as an Oklahoma Sooner in 2023 and 2024. McCullough has 106 career tackles with 14.5 TFL and 4.0 sacks. He has 13 tackles and two sacks in 2025.
- Marques Watson-Trent spent five seasons at Georgia Southern. He has played in 53 career games with 40 starts, making him the most experienced player on the Husker roster. He has made three starts in 2025 and has 15 tackles and a sack. The 2024 Sun Belt Conference Defensive Player of the Year, Watson-Trent ranks second among all active FBS players with 380 career tackles.
- Nebraska added two FCS transfers to the secondary in **Jamir Conn** and **Andrew Marshall.** Conn played in 23 games with 11 starts in two years at Southern Illinois, registering 68 tackles with nine pass breakups and 4.5 TFLs. Marshall was a first-team All-Big Sky cornerback at Idaho in 2024. He started 14 games in two seasons with the Vandals, and has started all six games in 2025.
- On the defensive line, **Jaylen George** spent three seasons at East Tennessee State, starting 23 games and totaling 54 tackles, 9.5 tackles for loss and 3.0 sacks.
- Nebraska also went to the FCS level to bolster its special teams units. Kevin Gallic is NU's long snapper after handling those duties for New Hampshire the past three seasons. Place-kicker Kyle Cunanan made 14-of-20 field goals over two seasons at Charlotte, and has hit 9-of-10 attempts with the Huskers, including a career-long 52-yarder against Cincinnati.

HUSKERS FINISH NON-CONFERENCE PLAY UNBEATEN

Nebraska completed non-conference play with a perfect 3-0 record with victories over Cincinnati, Akron and Houston Christian. The Huskers completed non-conference play unbeaten for the second straight season and have won nine straight games against non-conference competition.

- Nebraska's nine-game win streak against non-conference competition is the longest by the Huskers since a 12-game win streak spanning the 1999 to 2001 seasons.
- Nebraska was also a perfect 3-0 in non-conference play in 2024, and defeated Boston College in the Pinstripe Bowl. Before last season, Nebraska's previous unbeaten non-conference season was in 2016.

HUSKERS PRODUCE BACK-TO-BACK DOMINANT WINS

Nebraska capped non-conference play with a pair of dominant victories–68-0 over Akron on Sept. 6 and 59-7 over Houston Christian on Sept. 13.

- The 68-0 victory marked Nebraska's most lopsided win since a 70-0 shutout at Kansas in 1986. The back-to-back wins by more than 50 points marked the first time NU had 50-plus margins in consecutive games since 2000 when NU defeated Texas Tech (56-3) and Baylor (59-0).
- The Huskers scored better than 50 points in consecutive games for the first time since the final two games of the 2007 season against Kansas State and at Colorado.
- Nebraska's 68 points against Akron were its most since a 73-7 victory over Idaho State in 2012.
- Against Akron, Nebraska posted its first shutout since a 33-0 victory over Arizona in the 2009 Holiday Bowl.
- The Huskers produced 728 yards of total offense against Akron. That total ranks as the eighthmost in school history and the most since posting 784 yards against FAU in 2014. Nebraska had 554 yards against Houston Christian marking the first time Nebraska has had back-to-back 500-yard games since the 2021 season (Fordham, Buffalo).
- Nebraska's 494 passing yards against Akron were the second-most in school history and the most since a school-record 519 passing yards against Kansas State in 2007. It was the 10th game with at least 400 passing yards in school history and the first since 2018 at Wisconsin.

SIX CAPTAINS SELECTED TO LEAD 2025 HUSKERS

Nebraska elected six season captains for the 2025 season. This marks the first time in Coach Matt Rhule's three seasons that Nebraska has selected season-long captains. The group includes five senior veterans along with sophomore quarterback **Dylan Raiola**.

- Raiola has started all 19 games in his Nebraska career and has already cracked the top 10 in career passing yards. He is just the third sophomore to serve as a season captain for Nebraska in the modern era.
- Senior guard **Henry Lutovsky** has made 21 career starts for the Huskers, playing both guard positions in his career. Lutovsky started 11 games last season.



- Kentucky transfer **Dane Key** is one of the nation's most productive returning receivers. In his first year with the Huskers, Key has 41 career collegiate starts and 146 career receptions. He surpassed 2,000 career receiving yards against Houston Christian.
- Fifth-year senior **Marques Buford Jr.** has spent his entire career at Nebraska. Buford has played in 46 career games with 30 starts and has spent time at both safety and cornerback in his career.
- Senior rover **DeShon Singleton** is in his fourth year in the program. Singleton has made 24 career starts for the Huskers, including all 20 games the past two years. He has 121 career tackles and had a two-interception effort against Michigan State.
- Cornerback **Ceyair Wright** is in his second season at Nebraska after transferring from USC. Wright has 26 career starts, including 11 at Nebraska, and has three career interceptions.

SINGLE-DIGIT NUMBERS AWARDED THROUGH TEAM VOTE

For the third straight season, single-digit jersey numbers were awarded to the players who best represent what it means to be a Husker. The single-digit honorees were chosen through a players-only vote and the players then got to choose which single-digit number they wanted.

• The tradition of single-digit numbers being reserved for the chosen few dates back to Rhule's time at Temple.

"I got really tired of having a guy in my program who was there for three years, four years, really busted his tail and represented the program the right way, and he finally gets to be a senior and wants to wear a single digit, he's earned it...and invariably coaches give [a recruit] a single digit to get him to come there. It never felt right to me. It should be something earned. It's really just who do we want our players to say 'this is a guy who represents everything it means to be a Husker. He's tough, he's hard working, he's competitive'. It's not a popularity contest, it's an opportunity for our team to say these are the guys that embody everything it means to be a Husker."

• The 10 players listed below were selected by their teammates to be worthy of having a single-digit number this season. Marques Buford Jr., Malcolm Hartzog Jr. are wearing a single-digit number for the second straight year while senior defensive back DeShon Singleton is in No. 8 for a third straight year. The other seven players earned a single-digit for the first time.

NEBRASKA AMONG TOP ALL-TIME PROGRAMS

Nebraska is playing its 136th football season this fall, and the Huskers have historically been one of the top programs in college football history.

- NU ranks eighth in NCAA history with 929 wins and ninth with 54 all-time bowl game appearances.
- The Huskers have won five national titles. Nebraska's four AP national championships (1970, 1971, 1994, 1995) rank seventh all-time and NU's four coaches poll titles (1971, 1994, 1995, 1997) rank fifth.
- Nebraska's 46 conference titles rank second in NCAA history.

HUSKERS ALSO EXCEL IN THE CLASSROOM

In addition to being one of the winningest and most successful program in NCAA history, the Nebraska football program has also led the way in the classroom.

- Nebraska football has produced more Academic All-Americans (108) and more NCAA Impact Award (formerly Top Ten) winners (9) than any other team in any sport in NCAA history.
- Nebraska led the Big Ten with 73 Academic All-Big Ten selections for the 2024 season.
- Following the 2025 spring semester, the cumulative grade-point average for all members of the Nebraska football team was 3.304, the highest in recorded history.



Matt Rhule has a proven track record as a program builder. In his first two collegiate head coaching jobs at Temple (2013-16) and Baylor (2017-19), Rhule led both the Owls and the Bears to their most victories in school history in just his third season. He also took both teams to the conference championship game in year three.

Rhule took Temple from two wins in his first season to a school-record 10 victories in both his third and fourth seasons with an appearance in the conference championship game both seasons. He then took Baylor from one win in his first season to a school-record 11 victories in his third season and an appearance in the Big 12 Championship Game and the Sugar Bowl.

At Nebraska, Rhule led Nebraska to a 7-6 record and a bowl victory in his second season in 2024, marking the Huskers' first winning record in eight years and first bowl win in nine years.

TAKING TEMPLE TO NEW HEIGHTS

In his tenure at Temple from 2013 to 2016, Rhule took the Owls to new heights.

- In Rhule's second season in 2014, Temple posted the program's first win over an SEC team since 1938, its first win over a ranked opponent in 16 seasons and the program's largest margin of victory in nearly 50 years.
- Rhule won 10 games in both 2015 and 2016. He is responsible for two of the three 10-win seasons in Temple's 125-year history.
- He also took the Owls to back-to-back bowl games in 2015 and 2016, the first time Temple played in a bowl in consecutive seasons.
- In 2015, Rhule led Temple to the American Athletic Conference Championship Game, the first conference title game in program history.
- The next season, Rhule guided the Owls to their second conference title in program history and the first in nearly 40 years.
- Temple has spent a total of 16 weeks ranked in the 88-year history of the Associated Press top-25 poll. More than half of those top-25 rankings (9) came under Rhule in 2015 and 2016.

AN ENCORE AT BAYLOR

At Temple, Rhule led the Owls to their highest season win total in program history, their first conference championship game appearance and an impressive run in the national rankings. He produced an encore by repeating each of those same feats in three seasons at Baylor.

- Baylor finished with 11 losses in Rhule's first season in 2017 but two years later, he guided the Bears to 11 wins in 2019. Baylor became the first Power Conference program to go from 11 losses to 11 wins in two or fewer seasons.
- Baylor won its final two games of the 2018 season and its first nine games of the 2019 campaign. The 11 straight victories marked the second-longest winning streak in school history, while Baylor's 9-0 start in 2019 was the best start in program history.
- In his third season in 2019, Rhule led Baylor to its most wins (11) in school history, the Bears advanced to their first Big 12 Championship Game and played in the Sugar Bowl for only the second time in program history.
- Baylor finished with a No. 13 ranking in 2019, its second-highest final ranking since 1951.

SCHEDULE NOTES

- Nebraska's schedule consisted of three nonconference games followed by nine Big Ten contests. In Big Ten Conference play, the Huskers will play Iowa, Maryland, Michigan, Michigan State, Minnesota, Northwestern, Penn State, UCLA and USC. Nebraska will not play Illinois, Indiana, Ohio State, Oregon, Purdue, Rutgers, Washington or Wisconsin.
- Nebraska plays three non-Saturday games, playing once on Thursday (Cincinnati) and twice on Friday (at Minnesota, Iowa). The Huskers are one of seven teams from a power conference who play three weekday games in 2025 (also Cal, Houston, Minnesota, North Carolina, North Carolina State and Rutgers).
- The 2025 season began with a win over Cincinnati in Kansas City. NU opened away from home for the fifth time in six seasons.
- After beginning conference play with consecutive home games, Nebraska will play four Big Ten road games in a span of six games. That includes back-to-back road games at Maryland and Minnesota just six days apart in October.
- Nebraska wraps up the regular season at home against lowa the day after Thanksgiving (Nov. 28), the 36th straight year the Huskers will play on Black Friday.
- The Huskers will appear on multiple national television networks this season. Nebraska has already appeared or is set to appear on BTN, CBS, ESPN, FOX and FS1.

COACHING STAFF NOTES

- Matt Rhule is in his third season at Nebraska in 2025. Rhule is in his 13th season as a head coach after previously leading programs at Temple (2013-16) and Baylor (2017-19) along with an NFL stint as head coach of the Carolina Panthers (2020-22).
- Rhule owns a career record of 64-57 as a college head coach. He has a proven record as a program builder after taking on rebuilding projects at Temple, Baylor and Nebraska. Excluding his first season at each school, that record improves to 56-29.
- Rhule's college teams have taken a major step forward in his third season. Temple improved by four wins in Rhule's third season in 2014 and Baylor also improved by four wins in his third season in 2019. Rhule took both Temple and Baylor to the conference championship game in his third season.
- Nebraska features three new full-time coordinators this season. Dana Holgorsen is in his first full season as the Huskers' offensive coordinator after he served in that role for the final four games of the 2024 campaign. John Butler is in his first year as Nebraska's defensive coordinator after he coached the cornerbacks and was NU's defensive pass game coordinator in 2024. New to the staff is Mike Ekeler, who serves as special teams coordinator following a successful four-year run in the same role at Tennessee.



HOME OF THE HUSKERS



Memorial Stadium celebrated its 100th year in 2023. In the fall of 1922, a drive for \$430,000 in stadium construction funds was undertaken by faculty, students, alumni and friends of the University.

The stadium was named Memorial Stadium to honor all Nebraskans who served in the Civil and Spanish-American Wars; the 751 Nebraskans who died in World War I; the 3,839 in World War II; the 225 in Korea; the 422 in Vietnam; and those in Iraq.

Construction was completed in a few more than 90 working days and Memorial Stadium was dedicated on Oct. 20, 1923, at the Homecoming game in which Nebraska was held to a scoreless tie by Kansas.

The field at Memorial Stadium was named Tom Osborne Field - after the Huskers' legendary Hall-of-Fame coach - in 1998, one year after Osborne's retirement following 25 years and 255 victories as head coach.

SCOUTING THE MINNESOTA GOPHERS



Minnesota enters Friday night with a 4-2 record, including a 2-1 mark against Big Ten foes after recording a 27-20 victory vs. Purdue last weekend.

The Gophers come in averaging 340.8 yards per game, with 228.5 yards per game through the air and 112.3 yards per game on the ground. Drake Lindsey has completed 113-of-188 passes for 1,284 yards, nine touchdowns and three interceptions. Le'meke Brockington has 23 receptions for 253 yards and two touchdowns, followed by Javon Tracy with 16 grabs for 253 yards and two

Defensively, Minnesota is allowing 308.3 yards per game and 21.2 points per game. Devon Williams leads the Gophers with 50 tackles, followed by Maverick Baranowski and Koi Perich with 42 and 35 stops, respectively. Anthony Smith has a team-high 6.5 tackles for loss and 4.5 sacks, while John Nestor has snagged a team-leading three interceptions through six games.

P.J. Fleck is in his ninth season as the head coach at Minnesota.

In eight years, Fleck has recorded three seasons with nine wins or more. In 2019, Minnesota finished 11-2, the most wins for a Gopher team since 2019. Fleck was named the 2019 Big Ten Coach of the Year and was a National Coach of the Year Finalist.

Fleck came to Minnesota after spending four years as the head coach at Western Michigan, where he was 30-22 overall and 21-11 in the Mid-American Conference. The Broncos were 1-11 in his first year in 2013, but ended the 2016 season with a No. 12 ranking, a 13-1 record, a conference championship and a berth in the Cotton Bowl.

Prior to serving as a head coach, Fleck served as a wide receivers coach with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers (2012), Rutgers (2010-11), and Northern Illinois (2007-2009).

P.J. FLECK VS. NEBRASKA

Fleck will face Nebraska for the eighth time as a head coach on Friday. He holds a 6-1 record against the Big Red.

The Huskers last faced Fleck in 2023, when Nebraska visited Minneapolis. Fleck and the Gophers picked up a 13-10 victory over Nebraska in the season opener.

MINNESOTA INFORMATION

Minnesota has fielded a football team since 1882, and the Golden Gophers have tallied over 700 wins as a program. Minnesota has claimed seven national titles and 18 Big Ten Conference Championships.

The Gophers have made 24 bowl appearances, claiming 12 wins. Minnesota's last bowl game appearance came last season when the Gophers took on Virginia Tech in the Duke's Mayo Bowl, defeating the Hokies with a 24-10 victory.
