SCOUTING THE MOUNT MARTY LANCERS

Fourth-year coach Allan Bertram leads Mount Marty into the 2025-26 season with an experienced lineup following a 12-16 campaign that included a 6-16 mark in the Great Plains Athletic Conference (GPAC).
The Lancers will be led by junior guard Kaela Martinez, who averaged 11.4 points, 3.0 rebounds and 2.8 assists while hitting a team-best 49 three-pointers (.292). Martinez, who attended Sioux Falls Roosevelt High School, will be rejoined in the starting lineup by former rival Alexis Motley. The 5-8 junior out of Sioux Falls Washington averaged 9.7 points and 6.1 rebounds per game a year ago.
Signe Bang, a 6-1 senior from Copenhagen, Denmark, returns to the starting lineup after managing 3.5 points and 2.8 rebounds in 17 starts a year ago. Bang played at Roane State CC in Tennessee and Snow College in Utah before joining the Lancers last season.
Part-time starter Alexis Folkers also returns after averaging 6.8 points and 3.3 rebounds for the Lancers last season. The Hastings College transfer played her high school basketball at Crofton alongside teammate Lacey Sprakel. A newcomer to the Lancers in 2025-26, Sprakel started for Dakota Wesleyan against the Huskers in Nebraska's exhibition game to open the 2023-24 season. Sprakel had three points and four rebounds in 22 minutes against the Big Red.
Although the Lancers must replace two of their top-three scorers in Sidney Thue (11.5 ppg, 6.6 rpg) and Emma Jarovski (9.7 ppg, 4.2 rpg), Mount Marty has returning depth from Leah Williams (5.9 ppg, 2.5 rpg), Kyra Griese (4.5 ppg, 2.0 rpg), Alyssa Moschell (1.7 ppg, 1.6 rpg), Claire Tereshinski (1.4 ppg), Kaylee Whatley (1.3 ppg), Maci Nemetz and Brielle Bussinger.
The Lancers also expect to get help from junior transfers Kaitlyn Tendal (Iowa Central CC) and Lucia Gonzales De Las Cuevas (Wheeling University) and freshman Lennix DuPris from Pierre, S.D., who averaged 17.1 points, 6.8 rpg and 4.7 apg as a high school senior for the Governors. DuPris was also a two-time South Dakota all-state selection.

HUSKERS TIP EXHIBITION WITH MOUNT MARTY

Nebraska gets its first look at outside competition when the Huskers take on Mount Marty University from Yankton, S.D., in women's basketball exhibition play tonight at Pinnacle Bank Arena.
The Huskers are coming off back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances, including a 21-12 overall record that included a 10-8 Big Ten mark in 2024-25. Nebraska lost four-time All-Big Ten center Alexis Markowski to graduation. The 6-3 Markowski averaged team bests of 16.3 points and 8.0 rebounds a year ago, while finishing No. 7 in points (1,902) and No. 2 in rebounds (1,220) in Husker history.
In addition, Nebraska will need to replace guards Alberte Rimdal, Kendall Moriarty and Kendall Coley from last year's group.
Coach Amy Williams enters her 10th season leading the Huskers hunting for Nebraska's fourth NCAA Tournament bid in the past five seasons.
Britt Prince, a 2025 Big Ten All-Freshman selection, leads Nebraska's returning players. The 5-11 point guard from Omaha, who was named to the Nancy Lieberman Award Watch List on Monday, averaged 13.4 points, 4.0 rebounds and a team-leading 3.8 assists a year ago. The two-time Nebraska High School Player of the Year at Elkhorn North hit nearly 40 percent of her three-pointers and better than 87 percent of her free throws as a true freshman.
Senior Callin Hake joins Prince as a returning starter in the Nebraska backcourt. The 5-8 guard from Victoria, Minn., averaged 6.4 points and 3.0 rebounds while adding 3.1 assists. Hake, who ranked second in steals among the Huskers with 42, also led the Big Red in charges drawn.
Logan Nissley gives Nebraska a third returning starter to the backcourt. The 6-0 junior who was a Big Ten All-Freshman pick in 2024, averaged 7.0 points and 2.7 rebounds a year ago while hitting better than 36 percent of her three-point attempts. Nissley, Hake and Prince give the Husker backcourt three starters with point guard skills and high percentage success rates from long range.
Jessica Petrie returns to the power forward spot for the Big Red after starting 23 games alongside Markowski last season. A 6-2 junior from Gold Coast, Australia, Petrie averaged 6.4 points and 4.4 rebounds last season. Petrie increased her production throughout the season in place of injured teammate Natalie Potts.
Potts, who missed all but the first five games a year ago after being named the 2024 Big Ten Freshman of the Year, suffered a season-ending knee injury against North Alabama (Nov. 19). Potts was Nebraska's leading scorer and rebounder prior to her injury a year ago, and is hopeful to return to the Husker lineup this season. She was named the Preseason Watch List for the Katrina McLain Award Thursday.
Sophomore Petra Bozan could provide a significant presence inside for the Huskers in place of Markowski. Bozan, a 6-3 forward from Split, Croatia, averaged 5.3 points and 2.8 rebounds while playing in all 33 games a year ago. A member of the All-Star Five at the 2025 European Division B World Championships for Croatia, Bozan is a high efficiency finisher inside with the ability to stretch the floor to three-point range.
Kansas State transfer Eliza Maupin adds size, athleticism and experience inside. The 6-3 Maupin averaged 4.0 points and 2.7 rebounds while shooting 62.3 percent from the field over 98 games for the Wildcats the past three seasons.
Sophomore Amiah Hargrove adds depth up front for the Huskers after averaging 4.7 points and 3.7 rebounds while playing in all 33 games last season. Maryland transfer Emily Fisher gives the Huskers more size at the small forward position, while Northwestern transfer Hailey Weaver and Samford transfer Claire Johnson will provide high level skills to the Big Red backcourt. Freshmen Kennadi Williams and Alanna Neale also look to make their collegiate debuts.

THREE THINGS TO WATCH

1 Nebraska will meet Mount Marty for the first time in school history in women's basketball tonight. The two schools have never met in either regular season or exhibition action.
2 Tonight's game represents the third consecutive season that the Huskers have opened exhibition play against a team from the Great Plains Athletic Conference (GPAC). The exhibition streak against the GPAC began against Dakota Wesleyan (83-47) in 2023, before the Huskers tangled with the Doane Tigers (89-52) a year ago.
3 Nebraska has hit 10 or more three-pointers 50 times in the last 141 games, including 10 times in 2024-25. The Huskers hit a school-record 20-of-34 threes in a win over South Dakota at the Sanford Pentagon in Sioux Falls (Nov. 16, 2024). Nebraska also tied a Pinnacle Bank Arena record last year by hitting 16-of-32 threes in a win over Wisconsin (Jan. 20, 2025), before hitting 15-of-29 threes in a win over Oregon (Feb. 19, 2025). Nebraska set a school record with 292 made threes in 2023-24 and have produced the four highest season totals in school history the past four years.

FACTS & FIGURES

- Nebraska opens the regular season by playing host to Northwestern State on Monday, Nov. 3. Tip-off between the Huskers and DeVilettes is set for Noon, following the annual Sizemore Sportsmanship Pep Rally. The Huskers expect to have nearly 4,000 middle-grade students and accompanying adults from 80 schools at the rally, which begins at 9:30 a.m.
- The Huskers have won 38 consecutive exhibition games dating back to an 81-58 loss to the Australian Institute of Sport at the Devaney Center on Nov. 12, 2000.
- The Huskers have hit at least one three-pointer in 532 straight regular-season games dating back to a loss at UTEP on Dec. 20, 2009. Nebraska has hit at least two three-pointers in 411 consecutive games.
