SCOUTING THE ORAL ROBERTS GOLDEN EAGLES

Oral Roberts comes to Lincoln with a 2-3 record following a Monday night home loss to Tulsa (78-69 OT). The Golden Eagles opened the season with home wins over Friends (97-65) and Haskell (92-50) before a 112-62 loss at No. 22 Oklahoma State. ORU also suffered a 76-65 setback at Lindenwood in St. Charles, Mo., before facing the Golden Hurricane. Cophie Anderson is in her first season officially as ORU's head coach, but she served as the acting head coach for three seasons. She helped the Golden Eagles to the postseason three straight years, including the 2023 WNIT and the 2024 and 2025 WBIT. In 2024-25, Oral Roberts finished with a 24-9 record that included a 12-4 Summit League mark. ORU fell to No. 25 South Dakota State, 84-68, in the Summit League title game, before suffering a WBIT loss at Missouri State. ORU is replacing all five starters from last year's team, including four who averaged double figures (first-team All-Summit Taleyah Jones, 18.1 ppg; Ruthie Udoumoh, 12.1 ppg; Makyra Tramble, 10.6 ppg, Emily Robinson, 10.0 ppg). Udoumoh and Tramble both completed their eligibility while Jones and Robinson both transferred to Arkansas. Redshirt senior Jalei Oglesby and sophomore Anna Trusty have been reliable threats for ORU early this season. Oglesby, a 5-8 guard from Howe, Okla., scored at least 18 points in each of the first four games, including 24 in the loss at Oklahoma State. However, she was limited to four points on 2-of-12 shooting against Tulsa. Oglesby is averaging 17.6 points, 5.2 rebounds and 1.2 steals while shooting 47.3 percent from the field and 85.7 percent from the free throw line. She has not hit a three-pointer. Last season, Oglesby earned first-team All-Summit League honors and her second straight Summit League Sixth Woman of the Year award in 2025. Trusty, a 6-0 guard from Greenwood, Ark., also put up double figures in the first four games, including 14 points against both Oklahoma State and Lindenwood, before being held to eight by Tulsa. She has hit just 2-of-10 three-point tries. She was the MIAA Freshman Year at Arkansas-Fort Smith in 2024-25 after being named the Gatorade Arkansas High School Player of the Year in 2023-24. Freshman A'Maya Holton has started all five games and ranks third on the team in scoring (10.6 ppg) while leading ORU in rebounding (5.6 rpg). The 6-0 forward from San Antonio opened her career with 26 points and 11 rebounds in a win over Friends, but totaled just two points combined in losses to Lindenwood and OSU. She scored 14 vs. Tulsa. Fellow freshman Kayten Donley (7.4 ppg, 5.2 rpg), a 6-0 forward from Bethany, Okla., and 5-5 junior guard Gentry Baldwin (8.6 ppg) from Bixby, Okla., round out the starting five. Baldwin led ORU with 21 points against Tulsa. ORU is shooting 43.1 percent but just 24.4 percent (20-82) from three-point range.

HUSKERS HOPE TO FLY BY GOLDEN EAGLES

Nebraska shoots for its fifth consecutive win to open the season when the Huskers play host to Oral Roberts tonight at Pinnacle Bank Arena. The Big Red improved to 4-0 with an 82-70 win over North Dakota State at the Sanford Pentagon in Sioux Falls, S.D., on Sunday afternoon. Sophomores Amiah Hargrove, Britt Prince and Claire Johnson all produced double figures as the Huskers reached the 80-point plateau for the fourth straight game to open the season. Hargrove, a 6-2 forward from Christopher, Ill., led the Big Red with 17 points and seven rebounds off the bench against the Bison, while enjoying a perfect shooting performance. She went 7-for-7 from the field, including a three-pointer, while knocking down both of her free throw attempts. Prince added 16 points on 7-of-12 shooting while contributing three assists. The Nancy Lieberman Award candidate has put up double figures in each of NU's first four games and owns a team-best 19.0 points per game. Johnson, a 5-9 guard from Paducah, Ky., added 10 points, two rebounds and two assists in 16 minutes off the bench for her third double-figure scoring effort of the season. Junior Jessica Petrie continued her outstanding start to the season by contributing 12 points, three rebounds and season highs of four assists and two blocks against the Bison. The 6-2 forward from Gold Coast, Australia has joined Prince in double figures in all four games for the Huskers, averaging 13.5 points and 4.8 boards in her second season as a starter. Nebraska's offense has been feeding off the success of its defense early this season. The Huskers have forced 20 or more opponent turnovers in each of the first four games - the longest stretch for the Big Red since the 2011-12 season. NU has turned its defense into offense with four straight 80-plus scoring games for the first time since the 2015-16 campaign. As a team, the Huskers are shooting 54.4 percent from the field, 36.1 percent from three-point range and 76 percent from the free throw line. All three of those shooting percentages rank among the top six in the 18-team Big Ten, while Huskers also rank fifth in the conference in scoring defense, fifth in three-point field goal percentage defense and sixth in turnover margin.

SERIES HISTORY WITH ORU

- Nebraska leads the all-time series with Oral Roberts 8-0, including a 90-61 win over the Golden Eagles in the most recent meeting on Dec. 4, 2020 at Pinnacle Bank Arena. All eight games in series history have been played in Lincoln.
- ORU battled Nebraska until late in the fourth quarter in a 77-67 loss to the Huskers on Dec. 14, 2019 - the closest game in the series.
- In the first meeting at PBA in Nebraska's opening year in the arena, the No. 18 Huskers rolled to an 89-53 win on Dec. 29, 2013.
- The previous year, in the final meeting between the two teams at the Devaney Center, Nebraska battled to an 80-67 victory on Dec. 20, 2012.
- The first-ever meeting between the teams came with a 100-87 Nebraska victory at the Devaney Center on Nov. 27, 1987. Every other game between the teams was played in December, prior to tonight's matchup.
- The Huskers put up 100 points again on ORU with a 110-61 win in the second meeting (Dec. 5, 1989), before a 95-62 win over the Golden Eagles (Dec. 31, 1990). The teams did not meet again until a 70-51 Husker win on Dec. 2, 2008.

THREE THINGS TO WATCH

1 Nebraska ranks seventh nationally and second in the Big Ten with its 54.4 field goal percentage through four games. Eight Huskers are hitting 50 percent or better from the floor, and no Husker is shooting below 40 percent.

2 Nebraska is hunting for a 5-0 start for the second consecutive season. The last time the Huskers opened a year 6-0 came in 2021-22 when the Big Red reeled off 12 straight wins to begin the season.

3 Nebraska has hit 10 or more three-pointers 51 times in the last 145 games, including 10-of-28 threes in last Wednesday's home victory over Creighton. Nebraska sank 10 or more threes 10 times in 2024-25, including a school-record 20-of-34 threes in a win over South Dakota in Sioux Falls (Nov. 16, 2024). Nebraska also tied a Pinnacle Bank Arena record last year by hitting 16-of-32 threes in a win over Wisconsin (Jan. 20, 2025), before hitting 15-of-29 threes in a win over Oregon (Feb. 19, 2025). Nebraska set a school record with 292 made threes in 2023-24 and has produced the four highest season totals in school history the past four years.

FACTS & FIGURES

- Through four games Nebraska is forcing an average of 24.0 turnovers per game, while Oral Roberts is committing 19.2 turnovers per contest. The Huskers have committed 14.5 turnovers per game, while the Golden Eagles have forced 24.2 turnovers per contest.
- Although ORU is averaging 77 points per game, the Golden Eagles have failed to score 70 points in three straight games against NCAA Division I teams, including No. 22 Oklahoma State (62), Lindenwood (65) and Tulsa (69 in OT).
- The Huskers have hit at least one three-pointer in 536 straight regular-season games dating back to a loss at UTEP on Dec. 20, 2009. Nebraska has hit at least two three-pointers in 415 consecutive games.
- Nebraska is 45-6 all-time in its fourth home game of any season.
