HUSKERS RETURN HOME FOR WINTHROP TUESDAY NIGHT

The Nebraska men's basketball team looks to remain unbeaten Tuesday night as the Huskers host Winthrop at Pinnacle Bank Arena to begin a four-game homestand. Tipoff is set for 7:30 p.m. (central) and 300 Level tickets are available for the matchup by visiting Huskers.com/Tickets or at the PBA Ticket Office beginning at 6 p.m. on Tuesday. The game will be televised on BTN, while the radio broadcast is available on the Husker Sports Network, as well as on Huskers.com and on the Huskers app.

The Huskers (6-0) are coming off an 86-85 win over previously unbeaten Kansas State in title game of the Hall of Fame Classic last Friday. Sam Hoiberg's free throw with 0.6 seconds remaining provided the margin in a game which saw 12 lead changes in the second half. Hoiberg went 6-of-6 from the field and added four assists and three steals in the win as the Huskers shot 54 percent from the floor. Pryce Sandfort (21) and Rienk Mast (20) both scored over 20 points in the win while Braden Frager added 16 points off the bench.

The Huskers' strength has been a balanced offense which features four double-figure scorers and two others who average at least 8.2 points per game. During the two games in KC, four different Huskers - Sandfort, Mast, Frager and Jamarques Lawrence - all posted 20-point efforts. Nebraska's 87.7 ppg is the program's highest scoring average after its first six games in 30 years.

Nebraska will take on a Winthrop team that is 3-3 on the season following an 80-62 win at Jackson State on Sunday. The Eagles, who average 84.2 points per game, nearly knocked off No. 21 Arkansas last Tuesday before falling 84-83. Winthrop had a five-point lead with 2:00 left before the Razorbacks scored the final six points, including a go-ahead basket by Nick Pringle with 11 seconds left. Last season, Winthrop won 23 games before losing to High Point in the Big South Tournament title game.

87.7 Nebraska's 87.7 ppg is the program's highest scoring average thru six games since the 1995-96 season when Nebraska averaged 91.3 ppg in its first six contests. That team averaged 80.2 ppg for the season.

SCOUTING WINTHROP

The Eagles come to Lincoln with a 3-3 record after winning at Jackson State on Sunday night. The trip to Lincoln wraps up a three-game road trip for the Eagles, who play four of their next five games at home following Tuesday's contest. Winthrop returned six letterwinners from last year's Big South runner-up, but has a retooled starting lineup after losing all five starters from a year ago. The Eagles average 84.2 points per game and average nearly 11 3-pointers per contest while shooting 37.6 percent from beyond the arc. Winthrop is a veteran team that starts three seniors and a pair of graduates in its lineup. Daylen Berry averages a team-high 14.5 points and 5.0 rebounds per game, as the Charleston Southern transfer averaged 13.8 points, 5.3 rebounds and 1.7 steals per game last season. Duquesne transfer Kareem Rozeier is at 14.2 points and 4.5 assists per game while shooting .435 from 3-point range. Rozier, who has a 6.75-to-1 assist-to-turnover ratio, paces an offense that averages just 8.8 turnovers per game.

Mark Prosser is in his fifth season with Winthrop and has guided the Eagles to a pair of 23-win seasons in his first four seasons. Last year, Winthrop went 23-11 and tied for second in the Big South before losing to High Point in the title game. The son of former Xavier and Wake Forest Coach Skip Prosser, Mark spent six seasons as an assistant coach at Winthrop under current Louisville Coach Pat Kelsey from 2012-13 to 2017-18 before taking the head job at Western Carolina. Prosser spent three seasons at WCU, including a 19-12 mark in 2019-20, before returning to Winthrop in the spring of 2021.

Series History: Tuesday's game will be the third meeting between the two programs and the first since a 73-65 Husker win on Nov. 24, 2001, at the Devaney Center. NU also won the initial meeting 65-44 on Nov. 27, 2000. Nebraska is 5-1 all-time against current members of the Big South Conference.

WORTH NOTING

- Nebraska has now won its last 17 non-conference games dating back to Nov. 22, 2024, which is the nation's longest non-con win streak. The Huskers have also won 11 straight home games against non-conference foes dating back to the 2023-24 season.

- Nebraska enters the week riding a 10-game win streak dating back to last season's College Basketball Crown. It is the longest active streak in the nation and is tied for the ninth-longest streak in school history. With a win on Tuesday, it would mark only the fourth time since WW2 that NU won at least 11 or more consecutive games (1993-94, 1990-01 and 2010-11).

Nebraska averages 11.5 3-pointers per game to lead the Big Ten and rank 20th nationally as of Nov. 24. Currently, five Big Ten teams are averaging more than 10.0 3-pointers per game.

For just the third time in the Big Ten era (2011-12 to present), Nebraska returns multiple double-figure scorers with Rienk Mast (12.3 ppg in 2023-24) and Connor Essegian (10.7 ppg). In both previous instances (2018-19 and 2024-25), Nebraska has advanced to postseason play.

Before the current win streak, NU's longest streak under Fred Hoiberg was a seven-game streak to start the 2023-24 season. Nebraska is averaging 84.9 ppg on 49 percent shooting during its 10-game win streak and has scored at least 1.00 points per possession in all 10 contests.

• Nebraska has been one of the nation's top 3-point shooting teams, as the Huskers lead the Big Ten and rank 20th nationally with 11.5 3-pointers made per game. Nebraska's 11.5 3-pointers per game is five more per game more than last season after six games and is the best early-season start for a Fred Hoiberg team at Nebraska.

• Nebraska has made 10-or-more 3-pointers four times in six games, including 17 against FIU and 15 vs. Oklahoma. It marked only the seventh and eighth time in school history that NU had at least 15 3-pointers in a game. Last year, the Huskers made double-digit 3-pointers seven times in 35 contests.

• After going 24 seasons without an in-season tournament championship, Nebraska has won two since last Christmas, taking home the Diamond Head Invitational last December and the Hall of Fame Classic in Kansas City. NU's Hall of Fame Classic title marked the first time a Big Ten team won the event since 2014.

• Nebraska enters Tuesday's game with Winthrop ranked sixth in the Big Ten and 22nd nationally with 19.8 assists per game. It is an increase of 5.6 assists per game from last season. NU has averaged 20 assists only two times in school history (1990-91 and 1984-85).

• NU's team 1.80-to-1 assist-to-turnover ratio ranks 34th nationally entering this week's action and is on track to be NU's best total in Fred Hoiberg's seven seasons. NU's best assist-to-turnover ratio under Hoiberg was 1.38-to-1 in 2023-24. The school record in that category is 1.81-to-1 in 1984-85. Against Oklahoma on Nov. 15, Nebraska had 20 assists and just five turnovers, its lowest total since having a school-record two turnovers against Duquesne in 2023.

• Rienk Mast is one of 23 players nationally - and 10 from power conference teams - averaging at least 15.0 points, 6.0 rebounds and 3.0 assists per game entering this week's action.

• Mast, who is averaging 21.0 ppg on 54 percent shooting over NU's last three games, is just seven points shy of 1,500 for his career. When he reaches 1,500 career points, he will join Gonzaga's Graham Ike (2,044 points, 941 rebounds) as the only active Division I players with 1,500 points and 900 rebounds.

• Pryce Sandfort is averaging 19.2 ppg on 51 percent shooting, 4.4 rebounds and 3.0 assists per game over the past five contests. He also has a 7.5-to-1 assist-to-turnover ratio in that span. Sandfort has scored 20+ points three times after eclipsing that mark once in his two seasons at Iowa.

• Braden Frager was named MVP of the Hall of Fame Classic after averaging 18.0 points on 72 percent shooting and 7.0 rebounds per game. His 20-point effort in the win over New Mexico was his second 20-point game of the season, and he joins Connor Essegian as the only Huskers under Hoiberg with multiple 20-point games off the bench in a season. Frager is of only two power conference players - joining Arkansas' Maleek Thomas - to have multiple 20-point efforts off the bench this season.

Nebraska is 22-1 at home in non-conference play over the last three-plus seasons and is 35-9 (.795) at home in non-conference action in Fred Hoiberg's tenure at Nebraska.

- Nebraska has had nine double-digit scoring runs over the first five contests, including three each against West Georgia and FIU.
- Eight Huskers have posted double-figure efforts this season, while five players have had at least one 20-point performance (Pryce Sandfort-3; Rienk Mast-2; Braden Frager-2; Jamarques Lawrence-1).
- Nebraska is 40-14 (.740) over the past three-plus seasons when Sam Hoiberg plays at least 20 minutes. The senior is setting career bests in nearly every category, including scoring (7.4 ppg), rebounding (6.0 rpg), assists (4.0 apg) and steals (2.0 spg). According to stathead, Hoiberg is the only power conference player - and just one of seven players nationally averaging at least 5+ rebounds, 4+ assists and 2+ steals per game entering this week's action.
- Nebraska's signing class of Colin Rice and Jacob Lanier is ranked by ESPN as the No. 24 signing class nationally during the early signing period.

KANSAS STATE RECAP

Sam Hoiberg's free throw with 0.6 seconds remaining lifted Nebraska to an 86-85 win over Kansas State in the championship game of the Hall of Fame Classic Friday night.

Hoiberg was fouled after he grabbed the offensive rebound on Pryce Sandfort's jumper on NU's final possession. The senior, who finished with 13 points, hit the first one and intentionally missed the second as Kansas State got the rebound and called timeout with 0.1 seconds remaining.

The officiating crew went to the monitor and reset the clock to 0.9 seconds, giving Kansas State one last chance for the win. Pryce Sandfort sealed the win as he knocked away the inbounds pass to preserve the victory.

Sandfort finished with a game-high 21 points, including five 3-pointers, to lead four Huskers in double figures. Rienk Mast added 20 points, including eight points in the final eight minutes, while Braden Frager came off the bench and had 16 points on 7-of-10 shooting as Nebraska shot 54 percent from the field.

Frager, who averaged 18.0 points on 72 percent shooting in two games off the bench was named tournament MVP while Mast, who averaged 18.5 points on 52 percent shooting, joined Frager on the all-tournament team.

PJ Haggerty had a game-high 27 points for Kansas State (5-1) while Abdi Bashir Jr. had 26 points, including seven 3-pointers, in a game which featured 12 lead changes in the second half.

Nebraska trailed 83-81 with 2:09 left after Haggerty's 3-point play but Hoiberg tied the game with a driving basket with 1:34 left and NU got a stop on the defense end. Mast then gave NU an 85-83 lead with a layup with 34.6 seconds remaining before Haggerty's basket with 26 seconds left in regulation set up the final sequence.

NOTES FROM THE KANSAS STATE WIN

- Nebraska has now won 10 straight dating back to last year and 17 straight non-conference games dating back to last season. Both streaks lead the nation.
- Nebraska had multiple 20-point scorers for the third straight game - Pryce Sandfort (21) and Rienk Mast (20).
- With the win, NU has won its last four games against Big 12 teams dating back to the win at K-State in 2023.
- Rienk Mast (18.5 ppg on 52 percent shooting and 4.0 rpg) and Braden Frager (18.0 ppg on 72 percent shooting) were named to the all-tournament team with Frager earning MVP honors.

MAST MAKING HISTORY WITH A TRIPLE-DOUBLE

Senior forward Rienk Mast posted the third triple-double in school history against FIU on Nov. 8. He tallied 18 points on 8-of-10 shooting along with 12 rebounds and 10 assists in NU's 96-66 win.

• Mast joined Cam Mack (2019) and Dalano Banton (2020) as the three Huskers in school history with triple doubles. All three triple-doubles have come during Fred Hoiberg's seven seasons at Nebraska.

• Mast has 28 career double-doubles, while his 10 assists bettered his previous high of eight set against Michigan in 2023-24.

• As of Nov. 24, Mast is one of only seven Division I players with a triple-double this season. He joins USC's Rodney Rice and UConn's Silas Demary Jr. as the only power conference players with triple doubles this season.

• There were only two triple doubles by Big Ten players in both 2023-24 (Marcus Domask, Illinois; Payton Sandfort, Iowa) and 2024-25 (Kylan Boswell, Illinois; Dylan Harper, Rutgers).

• The last Big Ten player with multiple triple-doubles in a season was Illinois' Ayo Dosunmu in 2020-21.

BENCH SUPPORT

Nebraska has received outstanding play from its bench, averaging 28.0 ppg through the first six contests.

• The Huskers have gotten seven double-figure efforts from their bench in the first six games (Braden Frager-4; Connor Essegian-2; Cale Jacobsen-1).

• Nebraska got 46 points from its bench in the wins over both West Georgia and FIU.

• The back-to-back 46-point efforts marked the seventh and eighth time the Husker bench has scored 40+

- Last year, Nebraska got 31 double-figure efforts from its bench and averaged 23.0 ppg from its bench.

NEW FACES MAKING CONTRIBUTIONS

Of the eight players averaging at least 10 minutes per game, two are in their first season at Nebraska while a third returned to the program in 2025-26.

- Pryce Sandfort started all six games and enters the Winthrop game averaging a team-high 16.5 points per game while chipping in 4.3 rebounds and 2.8 assists. He leads NU with 19 3-pointers and is shooting 38 percent from beyond the arc. After having one game of more than 16 points in his two seasons at Iowa, he has scored 19 or more points four times, including a career-high 28 against Oklahoma and 21 vs. Kansas State.

- Braden Frager redshirted last year after reclassifying into the class of 2025. Frager, who turned 19 on Nov. 10, Frager is third on the team in scoring at 12.5 ppg while shooting a team-high 63 percent from the field. The Lincoln Southwest product led NU in scoring with 22 points in his collegiate debut, the third-highest debut by a Husker freshman in school history. At the Hall of Fame Classic, he took home MVP honors as he averaged 18.0 points and 7.0 caroms per game in wins over New Mexico and K-State.

- Jamarques Lawrence returned to Nebraska after spending last season at Rhode Island. The senior guard is averaging 10.5 ppg and 3.8 apg while shooting 50 percent from 3-point range. Lawrence had a career-high 21 points, including four 3-pointers and four assists vs. New Mexico. He also had an 18-point night including five 3-pointers, in the win over West Georgia and had 14 points, all in the second half, and four assists vs. Oklahoma.

RETURN OF MAST ANCHORS HUSKER POST

The biggest addition of the offseason is the healthy return of Rienk Mast to the Husker lineup. Mast earned all-conference recognition from both the coaches and media in 2023-24, but missed all of last season following left knee surgery. Mast began limited practice work last July and has been full go during practice.

- Mast averages 16.2 points per game on 53 percent shooting along with a team-high 6.5 rebounds and 3.3 assists per game. Mast also has 28 career double-doubles to rank second among all active Big Ten players.

- He earned a spot on the Hall of Fame Classic All-Tournament team by averaging 18.5 ppg in NU's two wins. Mast had 20 points, four rebounds and three assists in the 86-85 win over Kansas State.

- He totaled a season-high 26 points against Oklahoma when he hit 5-of-7 from 3-point range and added six rebounds and three assists. It was his third career game with at least 25 points while his five 3-pointers were one shy of his career high.

- Mast wrote his name into the Husker history book with his triple double against FIU on Nov. 8, finishing with 18 points, 12 rebounds and 10 assists. He is the third Husker - and first NU post player - to ever record a triple double.

- For his college career, Mast is a three-time all-conference pick, as he was also a two-time All-Missouri Valley selection at Bradley in 2022 and 2023.

- In 2023-24, Mast averaged 11.3 ppg and led Nebraska in both rebounds (7.5 rpg) & assists (3.0 apg), becoming the third player in school history to lead the team in both assists and rebounds in the same season.

- His six double-doubles in 2023-24 were the most by a Husker since Aleks Maric had 15 during the 2007-08 season. Mast and Maric are the only Huskers in the last two decades with at least six double-doubles in a season.

- He had the best game of his career against Ohio State on Jan. 23, 2024, setting highs in points (34) and 3-pointers (six) while adding 10 rebounds and four assists. It marked the first 30-point, 10-rebound game by a Husker since 2008. Mast, Aleks Maric and Eric Piatkowski are the only Huskers with 30-point, 10-rebound games in the last 35 years.

MAST NAMED TO ABDUL-JABBAR AWARD WATCH LIST

Mast was named to the Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Center of the Year Top 20 Preseason Watch List on Oct. 31. In 2023-24, he averaged 12.3 points, 7.5 rebounds and 3.0 assists per game in helping Nebraska to 23 wins and an NCAA Tournament bid. Mast is the first Husker to be named on the Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Award Watch List and the first NU player on any of the Hoop Hall awards watch lists since James Palmer Jr. in 2018-19.

WHAT'S NEW A PBA IN 2025-26

Fans will see a number of upgrades at Pinnacle Bank Arena this season, as ASM Global and PBA completed \$10 million in capital improvements to help continue a first-class experience for fans and teams earlier this fall.

- Center court features a new center hung scoreboard. The 37' 6" tall by 32' 6" wide scoreboard features a resolution of 29.9 million pixels. For comparison, the previous board had 6.5 million pixels. The board has fully integrated video screen capability, including the underbelly.

- A new 900 feet ribbon board was added inside the arena, expanding from 2' 7" tall to 3' 1" tall. The resolution doubled from 1.3 million pixels to 2.6 million pixels.

- The arena wi-fi network was upgraded throughout the PBA. The access points went from 250 to 600, tripling coverage and improving performance 5x, as a new 10 GB fiber pipe was added. Access points are in the seating areas with each access point supporting 70 seats.

- Other arena enhancements in 2025 include new LED lighting enhancements on the roof and in the concourses, along with new seats in the suite area around the arena.

HUSKERS ANNOUNCE SIGNINGS OF RICE AND LANIER

Nebraska men's basketball coach Fred Hoiberg announced Nov. 11 that high school seniors Colin Rice (Waukee, Iowa) and Jacob Lanier (Maumelle, Ark.) have signed to play basketball at the University of Nebraska beginning next fall. Both Rice and Lanier are ranked among the top 100 seniors in the country and are rated as four-star prospects by many of the major recruiting services.

"We are pleased to add both Colin and Jacob to our program," Fred Hoiberg said. "It was a priority to find shooting, playmaking and positional size with the number of seniors we have on our roster, and both players can flourish in our system with their respective skillsets. They come from successful programs, both at the high school level and in the AAU ranks, and will have an opportunity to contribute early in their college careers."

Rice is a 6-foot-8, 200-pound forward who plays for Coach Brett Watson at Waukee Northwest High School. He is a four-star prospect who is ranked No. 69 in the class by Rivals, No. 76 by 247Sports and No. 91 by ESPN. As a junior, Rice led Waukee Northwest to a 23-4 record and a runner-up finish in Class 4A, averaging 12.5 points, 7.2 rebounds, 2.6 assists, 1.6 blocks and 1.3 steals per game while shooting 37.8 percent from 3-point range. He garnered 4A all-tournament team accolades after averaging 18.7 points and 11.3 rebounds over three tournament games, including 18 points and 15 rebounds in the 4A championship game. He played for Martin Borthers on the AAU circuit, earning first-team UA Rise honors by averaging 19.1 points, 7.3 rebounds and 2.3 assists per game in 16 games this summer. He was the MVP of Session 3 when he averaged 23.6 ppg while hitting on 42.3 percent from 3-point range. He was also selected for the 2025 NBPA Top 100 Camp. Rice selected Nebraska over a host of schools, including Iowa, Illinois and Northwestern.

Hoiberg on Rice: "Colin is a versatile wing who can score at all three levels and has the skillset that we are looking for in that position. He can facilitate offense, play in the pick and roll game and can space the floor with his shooting. Colin has very good body control for his size and that helps him play through tight spaces and the length to rebound and make an impact on the defensive end. Colin is someone we have watched develop over the years and is someone who can contribute early to our program."

Lanier returns to his home state for his senior season as he plays for Parkview Magnet School and Coach Jason Harrison. He is a top-100 recruit by ESPN, 247Sports and Rivals, which ranked him as the No. 2 player in the state of Arkansas. A four-star recruit by ESPN and 247 Sports, he opened his senior year with a 34-point, seven-rebound effort last weekend. Lanier finished his junior season at DME Academy, helping the school win the Sunshine Independent Athletic Association State championship in 2025. Lanier began his high school career at Maumelle High School, earning all-state honors as a freshman and sophomore, as he averaged 15 points and seven rebounds per game as a freshman. He played for Gulf Coast Blue Chips on the UAA Circuit this spring, earning first-team honors for the circuit as he averaged 17.4 points, 4.1 rebounds, 2.1 assists and 1.5 steals per game. Lanier was the MVP of the 2024 Pangos All American Camp Top 30 all-star game and attended the 2024 USA Basketball Men's Junior National Team April minicamp. Lanier chose Nebraska over other finalists TCU, Ole Miss, East Carolina and Texas State.

Hoiberg on Lanier: "Jacob is a combo guard who does a good job of getting others involved and is a very good shooter. His combination of size, physicality and length show up on the defensive end where he can guard multiple positions. When watching him over the summer, the trait that stands out about Jacob is his competitiveness. He's a winner who plays with a chip on his shoulder, and we are excited to get him on campus."

ESSEGIAN FLOURISHES AS HUSKER SIXTH MAN

NU's top returning scorer from 2024-25 is senior Connor Essegian, who is reprising his role as one of the Big Ten's top sixth men. The 6-foot-4 guard averaged 10.7 points per game while pacing the Big Red with 78 3-pointers in 2024-25.

- This season, he is averaging 5.8 ppg on 34 percent shooting in just 14.5 minutes of action. He has two double-figure efforts, including 13 points vs. FIU. Essegian had seven first-half points against New Mexico before having a part of a tooth knocked out on a flagrant foul by New Mexico.
- In 2024-25, he tied for sixth on NU's single-season 3-point list with 78, the most by a Husker since Glynn Watson Jr. had 82 in 2019.
- Essegian totaled five 20-point games, including a career-high 29 points in NU's win over South Dakota on Nov. 27, 2024. In that game, he set personal highs in points (29), assists (five) and 3-pointers (six).

Fans watching Husker basketball will see a trio of Hoiberg family members in 2025-26.

- Head Coach Fred Hoiberg begins his seventh season at the helm of the program after guiding the Huskers to back-to-back postseason appearances.
- Senior guard Sam Hoiberg is back for his fifth season, as he has played in every game the past two seasons, moving into the starting lineup during the second half of the 2024-25 season. This season, Hoiberg is enjoying his best year as a Husker, averaging 8.3 points per game and posting career highs in assists (4.0), rebounds (5.5) and steals (2.2) per game. He tops the Huskers in assists and steals and is third in rebounding. Hoiberg comes of a 13-point effort against Kansas State, where he hit the game-winning free throw with 0.6 seconds remaining. Sam enjoyed a career night vs. UMES on Nov. 11, setting career bests with 18 points and seven rebounds.
- The Hoibergs are one of 22 father-son duos in college basketball this season.
- Charlie Hoiberg begins his first season as a graduate manager for the Huskers after earning his undergraduate degree at TCU last May. Charlie, who is Sam's twin brother, was a manager for TCU last season.

HUSKERS BIDDING FOR THIRD STRAIGHT POSTSEASON APPEARANCE

The Huskers will be shooting for a third straight postseason appearance in 2025-26. It would be the first time since a nine-year stretch between 1990-91 and 1998-99 and just the third time in program history. NU also made five straight postseason appearances between 1982-83 and 1986-87.

BACK-TO-BACK 20 WIN SEASONS

Nebraska finished with 21 wins in 2024-25, a total which tied for seventh on the Huskers' single-season list. It marked the 15th 20-win season in program history and second straight under Fred Hoiberg.

- Nebraska posted consecutive 20-win seasons for the third time in school history and the first since the late 1990s. Fred Hoiberg joined Danny Nee (twice) as the only Husker men's basketball coaches in school history to accomplish the feat. Hoiberg would be the first Husker coach to ever accomplish the feat at Nebraska if the Huskers can eclipse the 20-win mark in 2025-26.

HOME SWEET HOME

The Huskers have made Pinnacle Bank Arena a formidable home court in recent seasons under Fred Hoiberg. In 2024-25, NU was 10-6 at home with six wins coming by double figures and is an impressive 41-11 (.792) over the last three-plus seasons following Tuesday's win over UMES.

- Nebraska finished the season ranked 13th nationally in attendance with 14,964 fans per game.
- NU has ranked in the top-15 nationally in attendance 10 times since Pinnacle Bank Arena opened in 2013-14.

ADDING PUNCH FROM THE PORTAL

Nebraska has relied on the transfer portal under Fred Hoiberg, getting players such as All-Big Ten performers Derrick Walker (2023) Rienk Mast (2024) and Brice Williams (2025) in his six years at Nebraska. The Huskers' six-member transfer class this season enters 2025-26 with over 200 combined starts and nearly 3,400 points and 1,500 rebounds. Lawrence, who spent two years at Nebraska before starting 31 games at Rhode Island last year, Blue and Jarusevicius all started at their previous institutions last season. Sandfort was one of the Big Ten's leading bench scorers while Garcia started at Tulsa in 2023-24.

NEBRASKA HEAD COACH FRED HOIBERG

NEBRASKA (2019-PRESENT)

- Hired as Nebraska's 28th men's basketball coach on March 30, 2019, a position his grandfather (Jerry Bush) held for nine seasons from 1954 to 1963.
- Became the second Husker coach to post consecutive 20-win seasons, as the 2024-25 Huskers won 21 games and won the inaugural College Basketball Crown
- Guided Nebraska to the 2024 Diamond Head Classic title, the Huskers' first MTE title since 2000.
- Named Jim Phalen National Coach of the Year and shared Big Ten Coach-of-the-Year honors (coaches and media) in 2024.
- Coached Nebraska to a third-place finish in the Big Ten in 2023-24, the highest conference finish by NU since 1992-93.
- Guided Nebraska to its first NCAA Tournament appearance since 2014.
- Led Nebraska to its fourth win over a No. 1 team in school history and first time since 1982 (1/9/24 vs. No. 1 Purdue).
- Is the only coach in school history with two road wins against top-10 teams.
- Guided Nebraska to three consecutive road wins over ranked opponents (No. 23 Ohio State and No. 10 Wisconsin in 2021-22 and No. 7 Creighton in 2022-23) for the first time in school history.
- Had NBA Draft Picks in both 2021 (Dalano Banton) and 2022 (Bryce McGowens) and has produced 12 players who have reached the NBA.

CHICAGO BULLS (2015-18)

- Coached the Chicago Bulls for three-plus seasons, posting a 115-155 record.
- Became just the fifth coach in franchise history to post a winning record in his debut season.
- Took the Bulls to the 2017 NBA Playoffs where they won the first two games against the top-seeded Boston Celtics, as the Bulls were the first No. 8 seed to take a 2-0 lead against a No. 1 seed since 1993.
- Was the fifth coach in NBA history to have each of his first two career playoff victories come on the road.

IOWA STATE (2010-15)

- Served as head coach at his alma mater for five seasons, posting a 115-56 record, which is the top winning percentage in school history (.673).
- Led the Cyclones to four straight NCAA Tournament appearances - a program record - while his 115 wins were the most in a five-year stretch in school history.
- Guided Iowa State to back-to-back Big 12 Tournament titles in 2014 and 2015.
- Produced four All-Americans, 12 All-Big 12 honorees and 10 players who played in the NBA.
- Named Big 12 Coach of the Year in 2012, as the Cyclones went from three conference wins to 12 in one season.
- Won 28 games and reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2014.
- Led the Big 12 in scoring offense in two of his last four seasons and topped the conference in 3-pointers four times in five years.

MINNESOTA TIMBERWOLVES (2005-10)

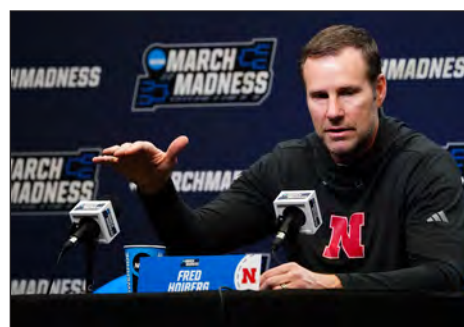
- Served as Vice President of Basketball Operations in 2009-10, overseeing the day-to-day operations of basketball programs including college and pro scouting, salary cap management and NBA Draft preparations.
- Was the Assistant General Manager for three seasons, helping the Timberwolves orchestrate a draft-day trade for five-time all-star Kevin Love in 2008.

AS AN NBA PLAYER (1995-2005)

- Spent 10 years in the NBA with the Indiana Pacers (four seasons), Chicago Bulls (four seasons) and Minnesota Timberwolves (two seasons) after being selected in the second round of the 1995 NBA Draft.
- Was a member of three NBA Playoff Teams, including a Timberwolves team that reached the 2004 Western Conference Finals.
- Shot 40 percent from 3-point range during his career and led the NBA in 3-point shooting in his final season (48.3, 2004-05).
- Ended his NBA career abruptly at the age of 33 after undergoing open-heart surgery to repair an aneurysm in his aortic root.

AS A PLAYER AT IOWA STATE (1991-95)

- Started all four seasons at Iowa State, averaging 15.8 points, 6.9 rebounds, 2.8 assists and 1.6 steals per game in his collegiate career.
- His No. 32 was retired by Iowa State in 1997 and he is a member of the Iowa State Hall of Fame.
- Garnered third-team All-America honors as a senior in 1994-95, averaging 19.9 points per game to help the Cyclones win a then-school-record 23 games and was named Big Eight Co-Male Athlete of the Year in 1995.
- Two-time Academic All-American who was inducted into the CSC Academic Hall of Fame in 2016.
