SCOUTING THE OMAHA MAVERICKS

First-year head coach Jamie Carey brings her first Maverick team to Lincoln with a 1-8 record after a 71-60 home loss to Northern Colorado Saturday. The former Texas and Stanford point guard has coached the last three games without Omaha's leading scorer, Cora Olsen (17.3 ppg). Olsen had 23 points and seven rebounds in her last appearance against CS Bakersfield (Nov. 20). It was her third 20-point performance in Omaha's first six games.

Omaha went 14-17 overall and 5-11 in the Summit League last season, but lost leading scorers Grace Cave (16.2 ppg) and Ja Harvey (15.0 ppg) to graduation.

Newcomer Saria Estupinan is leading the Mavs through nine games this season. The 5-5 graduate guard is averaging 15.6 points and a team-best 3.4 assists. A transfer from Old Dominion, Estupinan also leads Omaha with 19 three-pointers (.339) and is shooting nearly 90 percent (35-39) from the free throw line. She is playing at her fifth school in five years (ODU, UTSA, Tallahassee CC, St. Mary's [Texas]).

Freshmen Ali Stephens (5.8 ppg, 4.7 rpg), Leekaya Burke Perryman (4.7 ppg) and Avril Smith (2.3 ppg) have started every game this season to give the Mavs a young starting five. Smith, a 6-0 forward from Millard North, is Omaha's top rebounder (9.9 rpg), shot-blocker (1.9 bpg) and defender (1.7 spg).

A fourth freshman, Regan Juenemann comes off the bench as Omaha's third-leading scorer at 7.8 points per game. She is also shooting a team-best 43.3 percent (13-30) from beyond the arc. Freshmen Lillian Mero (4.6 ppg, 4.4 rpg) - the tallest Mav at 6-2 - and Elsa Vedral (3.6 ppg, 1.7 rpg) give Omaha six freshmen who are significant contributors. Vedral, an all-stater out of Omaha Marian, is the daughter of former Nebraska football player Mike Vedral.

As a team, Omaha is shooting just 34.2 percent from the field and 30.7 percent from three-point range.

HUSKERS HUNT FOR 10TH STRAIGHT VICTORY

Nebraska enters tonight's game against Omaha shooting for its 10th consecutive victory to open the season. A win for the Huskers would match the fourth-longest winning streak in program history.

The Big Red come into the game ranked No. 12 in the NCAA NET rankings and No. 24 in the most recent Associated Press Top 25. The 9-0 Huskers feature one of the nation's most efficient offenses after producing their ninth consecutive game with 80 or more points in Saturday's 101-83 victory at Penn State.

The win over the Lady Lions in the Big Ten opener also marked Nebraska's third 100-point game of the season - tying the school single-season record for reaching the century mark. The Huskers have only scored 100 or more points three times in a season on two other occasions (1982-83, 2021-22).

Sophomore Britt Prince leads a balanced Husker attack as one of the Big Ten's best scorers at 21.2 points per game. The 5-11 sophomore point guard from Omaha is coming off a 20-point performance at Penn State. The Elkhorn North grad owns a pair of 30-point scoring efforts already this season (ORU, Virginia).

Fellow sophomore Amiah Hargrove ranks second among the Huskers in scoring (12.4 ppg) while leading the team in rebounding (6.3 rpg) after her career-high 26-point outburst at Penn State Saturday. Hargrove hit 10-of-14 shots from the field, including 8-of-9 in the second half. She scored 19 in the second half alone as Nebraska set a school record with 36 points in the fourth quarter while tying the school record against any conference opponent with 67 in the second half.

Junior Jessica Petrie has pitched in 12.0 points and 5.3 boards as one of Nebraska's most consistent players early in the season. Petrie put up double figures for the eighth time in nine games with 10 points at Penn State.

Sophomore Petra Bozan erupted for a career-high 17 points in Saturday's win. The 6-3 forward from Split, Croatia scored nine straight points to open the fourth quarter after getting NU's final bucket of the third at State College. She is averaging 9.0 points and 4.4 rebounds in her first year as a starter.

Logan Nissley also produced her best game of the year with a season-high 14 points to go along with five rebounds and four assists to put five Huskers in double figures for the third consecutive game at Penn State.

Senior Callin Hake (8.0 ppg, 5.0 apg) and Hailey Weaver (4.7 ppg, 2.9 rpg) round out the starting five as two of the Big Ten's best defenders. Hake also ranks among the conference leaders in both assists and assist-to-turnover ratio.

SERIES HISTORY WITH OMAHA

- Nebraska leads the all-time series with Omaha, 18-9, including four consecutive wins. In the most recent meeting, the Huskers rolled to an 88-48 victory over the Mavs in the 2024-25 season opener at PBA (Nov. 4, 2024). Alexis Markowski and Natalie Potts each scored 14 points to lead six Huskers in double figures. Allison Weidner added 11 points and Britt Prince pitched in 10 in her collegiate debut. Logan Nissley and Petra Bozan each contributed 12 points off the bench in front of 8,106 fans following Nebraska's Life Skills Sportsmanship Pep Rally.
- The Huskers rolled to a 100-36 win over the Mavs at PBA in the 2022-23 opener as part of the Sportsmanship Pep Rally (Nov. 7, 2022).
- Tonight's game will be the third straight against Omaha that the Huskers enter as an AP Top 25 team (No. 22, 2022; No. 23, 2024).
- In the first meeting between the schools as Division I teams, Nebraska worked its way to a 66-58 win in Coach Amy Williams' fourth game as NU's head coach (Nov. 22, 2016) in Lincoln.

THREE THINGS TO WATCH

- 1 Nebraska leads the Big Ten and ranks No. 2 nationally in field goal percentage (.539).
- 2 Sophomores Britt Prince (7th, .639) and Amiah Hargrove (12th, .616) rank among the top players in NCAA Division I in field goal percentage. They both rank among the top five in the Big Ten in that category.
- 3 Nebraska has hit 10 or more three-pointers 52 times in the last 150 games, including 12-of-29 in Saturday's win at Penn State. The Huskers hit 10-of-17 threes in the second half alone against the Lady Lions. It was the second time this season NU hit 10 threes in a game, joining a 10-for-28 effort against Creighton (Nov. 12). Nebraska hit double-digit threes 10 times in 2024-25, including a school-record 20-of-34 threes in a win over South Dakota at the Sanford Pentagon in Sioux Falls (Nov. 16, 2024). Nebraska also tied a Pinnacle Bank Arena record last year by hitting 16-of-32 threes in a win over Wisconsin (Jan. 20, 2025), before hitting 15-of-29 threes in a win over Oregon (Feb. 19, 2025).

- In 2010-11, the Huskers defeated the Division II Mavs, 80-44, at the Devaney Center, as freshman Jordan Hooper scored 25 points on 12-of-14 shooting. The 2010 meeting was the first between the schools since a 76-74 UNO win in Omaha on Dec. 20, 1986.
- NU owns six straight home wins in the series dating to a 66-62 loss on Jan. 30, 1980.
- Overall, Nebraska is 11-3 against Omaha in Lincoln dating back to first meeting between the schools (Dec. 4, 1974) - a 47-41 win by the Mavs.

FACTS & FIGURES

- Nebraska ranks ninth nationally and third in the Big Ten in scoring (90.7 ppg).
- The Huskers rank sixth nationally and third in the Big Ten in assists (21.1 apg).
- NU ranks fourth in the NCAA and second in the Big Ten in bench scoring (35.8 ppg)
- The Huskers have hit at least one three-pointer in 541 straight regular-season games dating back to a loss at UTEP on Dec. 20, 2009. Nebraska has hit at least two three-pointers in 420 consecutive games.
