MEN'S GYMNASTICS EVENTS



FLOOR EXERCISE

The entire floor area must be used during the exercise, which consists primarily of three to five tumbling passes performed in different directions. The new NCAA scoring system requires gymnasts to include non-acrobatic elements, acrobatic forward, backward and sideward elements and a dismount. The exercise must also contain elements of balance, strength, jumps and leg circles. The area of the floor exercise mat is 40 feet by 40 feet.

POMMEL HORSE

The gymnast must cover all three areas of the horse, the middle and both ends, while performing continuous circular movements interrupted only by the required scissor element. The only parts of the body that should touch the apparatus are the hands. The entire exercise should flow with a steady, controlled rhythm. Considered by many to be the most difficult of all men's gymnastics events, the pommel horse is also the most subtle. Each move is defined by complex hand placements and body positions. NCAA rules require gymnasts to include single leg work, circles, spindles and handstands, side and cross travels, kehres and wendeswings and a dismount. The pommel horse stands 42 inches high as measured from the top of the mat to the top of the apparatus.



STILL RINGS

The ring routine must include a swing to a handstand, swing to a strength element and a static strength skill. The exercise must also include kip and swing portions that may not lead to a held position. Examples of strength elements include a cross, an inverted cross or a planche. The rings should be absolutely still and in control at the end of each skill. The rings are 100 inches from the top of the mat.

VAULT

Each individual vault is categorized in the Code of Points, the official text giving relevant value of each skill performed. During the pre-flight from the springboard to the horse, the body must maintain proper form, i.e. legs together and straight. During the second flight, from the horse to the landing, the gymnast's body must rise and show a complete body extension before landing. The landing should be firm, without extra steps, and in line with the horse. The men's vault stands 53 inches high. The runway is a maximum of 82 feet long.



PARALLEL BARS

A parallel bar routine consists of swinging, flight and hold elements. The gymnast is required to execute swinging skills which originate from a support, a hang below the bars and an upper arm hang. Also required is at least one skill from the strength, leg swing and side bar element group. The parallel bars stand 70 inches high.

HIGH BAR

The routine on the high bar consists exclusively of swinging parts without stops. The gymnast must execute at least one move in which he releases and re-grasps the bar, and must perform at least one giant with either his back to the bar or with an "eagle" grip in which the wrists are rolled outward until the thumbs are on the outside. The gymnast is also required to perform an "in bar" skill like a stalder circle. The bar is 100 inches from the top of the mat.



MEN'S GYMNASTICS SCORING

HISTORY:

Prior to 2005, both men's and women's gymnastics used the well-known scoring system with a top score of a "perfect 10." However, in 2005, gymnastics officials created a new scoring system for men's gymnastics. In this new system, there is no limit to the score a gymnast can achieve for his routine. The top performances in men's gymnastics right now are receiving scores in the 15s and, occasionally, the low 16s.

Before the 2024-25 season, NCAA men's gymnastics switched from a five-up, five-count format to a four-up, four-count format. Under the new system, only four athletes compete on each event, and all four scores count toward the team's event total. The change was designed to shorten meets and better align the number of routines with women's gymnastics.

There are three components used in judging a men's gymnastics routine: difficulty, element groups and execution.

THE DIFFICULTY SCORE:

There are nine countable skills, plus a dismount. Skill values range from A to H, with A being the easiest and H being the hardest. (A: 0.1, B: 0.2, C: 0.3, D: 0.4, E: 0.5, F: 0.6, G: 0.7, H: 0.8). Judges will add the values of the 10 skills together to get the gymnasts' difficulty score.

Example Routine: E(0.5) D(0.4) C(0.3) C(0.3) D(0.4) B(0.2) A(0.1) B(0.2) B(0.2) D(0.4) equals a difficulty score of 3.0.

ELEMENT GROUPS:

There are four different element groups on each event and each group is worth 0.5. For each of the element groups that a gymnast fulfills, he receives 0.5. If all four element groups are fulfilled, a gymnast will receive 2.0.

EXECUTION SCORE:

Each gymnast automatically starts with an execution score of 10.00. Judges can take the following deductions from that 10.00 score:

Small Error 0.1 (little step, small leg separation, slight knee bend, slight arm bend)
Medium Error 0.3 (big step, medium leg separation, medium knee bend, medium arm bend)

Large Error 0.5 (large leg separation, large knee bend, large arm bend)

Fall 1.0 (falling off apparatus)

The totals of these three components are added together to reach a start value:

= Start Value	15.0
+ Difficulty Score	3.0
Element Groups	2.0
Execution Score	10.0

If the gymnast had 0.9 points taken off for execution errors, the execution score would be 9.1 and the final score would look like this:

= Final Score	14.1
+ Difficulty Score	3.0
Element Groups	2.0
Execution Score	9.1

WHAT TO LOOK FOR:

Though the scoring system is complicated, fans can still identify great routines without knowing everything about the scoring system. When watching a routine, be sure to look for:

Good Form and Execution: A gymnast should always look as though he is in complete control, even when performing the most difficult of skills. Good form in gymnastics includes pointed toes, straight arms and legs and a tightness throughout the body. Every movement should look planned.

Strength Moves Held Long Enough: On the still rings and on floor, the gymnast must stay in position for two seconds on each strength move (e.g. an iron cross).

Height and Distance: In tumbling passes, vaults and release moves, the gymnast should look as if he is exploding off the apparatus. On vault, the distance a gymnast travels from the horse is also a factor in his final score.

A Stuck Landing: On vaulting, dismounts, and tumbling passes on floor, the gymnast should end with a "stuck landing" -- he should not move his feet once they hit the ground. The gymnast is not allowed to lunge backward out of tumbling passes. (The women used to be able to do this without deduction, but it is now considered an error in women's artistic as well).

Uniqueness of the Routine: A great gymnast will perform a routine that looks different from the rest. It will have something special about it -- risky tricks, an artistic flair or skills that are simply unique from others performed in the competition.

Media Parking: Parking for the media is in lot 52 on the south side of the Devaney Center. Handicap parking is primarily on the East side of the Devaney Center.

Devaney Center Directions: The Bob Devaney Sports Center is located on the west edge of the Innovation Campus. To reach it from the Lincoln Municipal Airport, turn right on Northwest 12th Street as you drive out of the airport. Northwest 12th Street becomes Cornhusker Highway, which intersects with 14th Street. Exit south on 14th Street off Cornhusker Highway. Travel to Military Avenue and turn left. Continue a half mile and enter the Innovation Campus. Take the first right turn before the Devaney Center and follow the access road to Lot 52 on the South Side of the arena. From Omaha's Eppley Airfield, follow the signs to downtown Omaha and I-480. Take I-480 west to I-80, then take I-80 west approximately 60 miles to I-180. Exit south on I-180, then exit east to Cornhusker Highway and follow the instructions above.

Interviews: All media requests for interviews with Nebraska gymnasts should be directed to Ellie Fulcher, office phone: (402) 472-2263; cell phone: (402) 953-6695 at least one day in advance. The best time for in-season interviews is after practice in the practice gym. Practice is typically held from 2 to 5 p.m at the Devaney Center. For post-meet interviews, Nebraska gymnasts and coaches are generally available on the gym floor immediately following the presentation of team and individual event awards. The best time to reach Coach Chuck Chmelka is weekdays from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. Interviews with Coach Chmelka should be coordinated through Ellie Fulcher in the Communications Office at (402) 472-2263 or (402) 953-6695 or by e-mail at efulcher3@huskers.unl.edu.

Media Services: Pre-meet notes and media guides will be provided before each meet. Final results will be available following each meet in the press room. Press row for most Nebraska gymnastics meets is located on the south sideline of the gym floor. The Devaney Center media work room is located off the southwest corner of the floor level, across from the interview room.

HEAD COACH I 17TH SEASON

Coach Chmelka enters his 17th season as Nebraska's head coach prepared to lead the Huskers through their 16th season in the Big Ten in 2025. In his last 16 years as NU's head coach, he helped produce 10 top-10 NCAA finishes and 25 All-Americans. Chmelka looks to continue leading the Huskers to become one of the nation's top programs in the years to come.

In 2025, Chuck Chmelka led the team to a third place finish at the Big Ten

Conference Championships. He coached them to a fourth-place finish at the NCAA Championships. He produced five All Americans (Taylor Christopulos, Chris Hiser, Chase Mondi, Max Odden and Asher Cohen).

In 2024, Chmelka produced five All-Americans (Taylor Christopulos, Zac Tiderman, Cooper Giles, Asher Cohen, Sam Phillips). Chmelka led the Huskers to their first regular Big Ten season title. Chemelka also coached the

team to a fourth-place finish at the NCAA Championships.

In 2023, Chmelka produced three All-Americans (Taylor Christopulos, Donte McKinney, Zac Tiderman) and a fifth-place finish at the NCAA Championships. Chmelka also led the Huskers to a third place finish at the Big Ten Conference Championships.

In 2022, Chmelka produced two All-Americans (Dillan King, Donte McKinney) and a fourth-place finish at the NCAA Championships. He led the Huskers to a second-place finish at the Big Ten Championships, tying for the best finish since joining the conference.

In 2021, Chmelka produced four All-Americans (Taylor Christopulos, Charlie Giles, Evan Kriley, Mitch Tyndall). Chmelka led the Huskers to their best conference finish since joining the Big Ten, taking second. The season was highlighted by a first-place finish at the NCAA Qualifiers and a fourth-place finish at the NCAA Finals.

In 2020, Chmelka produced one regular-season All-American (Jake Bonnay) despite the season ending early due to the coronavirus pandemic. Nebraska was on track to reach the NCAA Championship Finals for the fourth year in a row. The Huskers finished the season ranked fourth in the CGA Coaches Poll.

In 2019, Chmelka led the Huskers to their best finish since 1999, as the team finished third nationally. Chmelka produced five All-Americans who earned six All-America awards (Jake Bonnay, Charlie Giles, Khalil Jackson, Josh Martin, Anton Stephenson). He coached Anton Stephenson to his third Big Ten vault title.

In 2018, Chmelka led the Huskers to a fifth-place finish at the NCAA Championships with four All-Americans. He also developed the vault program, as Anton Stephenson placed second at the NCAA Championships program, as Anton Stephenson placed second at the NCAA Championships and earned the gold medal at the Big Ten Championships. Chmelka also had three Huskers place in the top three at the Big Ten Championships (Anton Stephenson, Jake Bonnay, Kyle King).

In 2017, Chmelka led the Huskers to the team finals at the NCAA Championships for the first time since 1999, as Nebraska finished sixth nationally. Chmelka produced two All-Americans (Austin Epperson, Kyle King).

both on floor. Additionally, Anton Stephenson claimed the vault title at the Big Ten Championships, becoming Chmelka's first conference winner and NU's first Big Ten Champion.

In 2016, the team shattered school records nearly every week, including

total team score, total floor score (twice), total pommel horse score (twice) and total high bar score. Individually, Ethan Lottman and Kyle King broke the program record on pommel horse (15.55) and floor (15.85) respectively. Daniel Leal placed second on parallel bars at the Big Ten Championships. At the NCAA Championships, the team finished seventh. Four gymnasts took home All-America honors (Ethan Lottman, Sam Chamberlain, Austin Epperson, Anton Stephenson). It was the first time since 1998 that four gymnasts brought home an All-America honors.

In 2015, Chmelka helped the Huskers overcome several health issues during the season. Junior Ethan Lottman erupted for a breakout year under Chmelka, earning All-America honors on pommel horse at the NCAA event finals. Lottman also captured the Elite 90 Award and was a CSC Academic

All-American.

In 2014, Senior Wyatt Aycock led the team in the all-around, earning his second All-America honor. Over the course of the season, 15 Huskers tied or set career highs on individual events. These achievements helped pave the way for NU's eighth-place finish at the NCAA Championships.

In 2013, Chimelka produced three All-Americans (Wyatt Aycock, Grant Perdue, Sam Chamberlain). This trio became NU's 48th, 49th and 50th All-Americans since 1975. At the time, the three All-America awards were the

most earned in a eason for the Huskers since 1999.

In 2012, Chmelka led the Huskers to their first season in the Big Ten Conference. Under Chmelka's leadership, NU completed its inaugural Big Ten season with a 10th-place finish at the NCAA Championships paced by freshman All-American Grant Perdue.

In 2011, the Huskers continued to build by posting another top-10 national finish despite a lineup made up of primarily first- and second-year gymnasts.

In his first season as head coach, Chmelka helped the Huskers return to the national top 10 by tying for ninth with a veteran team in 2010.

Before the 2010 season, Chmelka replaced legendary NU coach Francis

Allen, an icon of U.S. men's gymnastics.

Prior to becoming head coach, Chmelka served as an assistant under Allen (1986-2009), and assisted with three of the Huskers' eight national team championships. Since Chmelka joined the staff in 1986, he has coached Nissen-Emery Award winners Wes Suter (1986) and Tom Schlesinger (1988) and helped Nebraska win eight conference titles. Chmelka was named the 2007 CGA West Region Assistant Coach of the Year and was a finalist for the 2009 CGA West Region Award.

Chmelka competed at Nebraska from 1978 to 1981 and was a member of NU's first three national championship teams in 1979, 1980 and 1981.

Since 1982, Chmelka has been the program director and head coach for the Nebraska School of Gymnastics (NSG) boys' team, producing Nebraska All-Americans Dusty Jakub, Blake Bukacek, Derek Leiter, Ryan McEwen, Burkett Powell and Jason Christie. NSG athletes have competed in the Junior Pan American Games, Junior Olympic Nationals, Olympic Festival and have traveled abroad for various competitions (Junior Pacific Alliance Championships and USA vs. Canada).

After completing his eligibility at NU, Chmelka was a volunteer assistant coach while finishing his bachelor's degree in community health, which he earned in 1982. In 1988, Chmelka added a bachelor's degree in education.

An Omaha South graduate and product of Omaha Sokol and the legendary Phil Cahoy Sr., Chmelka was a high school and collegiate teammate of Husker Olympians Jim Hartung and Phil Cahoy Jr.

ASSISTANT COACH | 21ST SEASON

One of gymnastics most highly decorated competitors of all time, Jim Hartung enters his 21st season as a Nebraska assistant coach in 2025. Hartung has dedicated his life to bettering the sport he loves. Over the last 33 years, Hartung has worked in all aspects of the gymnastics community from competing to judging and now coaching and has earned a level of success paralleled by few in his field.

Hartung garnered All-America status on five of six events during his freshman season and went on to amass a total of 22 All-America awards and seven NCAA individual titles over the next of 22 All-America awards and seven NCAA individual titles over the next three years. His accolades included a pair of all-around titles in 1980 and 1981. Hartung led the Huskers to their first four NCAA team titles and consequently became Nebraska's first Nissen-Emery Award winner in 1982. The Omaha native finished his collegiate career as the most highly

decorated gymnast in Nebraska history.

His tremendous collegiate career led Hartung to the Olympics, as he was first selected to the U.S. team in 1980. Hartung repeated the honor in 1984 after graduating from NU. He helped the United States to its first and only team gold medal at the summer games in Los Angeles,

After competing in the Olympics as an athlete, Hartung went on to spend nearly a decade as a visitation coach for the U.S. national team and became one of the top 10 gymnastics judges in the world.

Hartung has four children, Jim, Nick, Jake and Hannah.

An experienced leader in collegiate athletics with a strong Midwestern background, Troy Dannen is in his second year as Nebraska's Director of Athletics. Dannen guides Nebraska's 24-sport athletic department that ranks among the nation's most successful programs both athletically and academically.

Nebraska Athletics has enjoyed success since Dannen arrived in Lincoln in March of 2024. During the 2024-25 athletic year, five Husker teams finished in the top four nationally, including volleyball, wrestling, men's gymnastics and bowling. The volleyball program reached the Final Four, while the wrestling team posted its highest

finish in school history with a national runner-up showing and had multiple national champions for the first time since 1984. The softball program won its first NCAA regional since 2014 while baseball repeated as Big Ten Tournament champions. Overall, Nebraska finished 21st in the final 2024-25 Learfield Director's Cup, the program's highest finish since 2010.

In the spring of 2024, the Husker baseball team won its first Big Ten tournament title, and the men's track team won the Big Ten Outdoor Championships. The men also had their best NCAA Championship showing since 2016 with a 13th-place finish. The women's track team posted their second straight top-10 NCAA finish and placed ninth at the national meet.

Dannen has long been a leader in charting the course for the future of college athletics and that continues at Nebraska. In May of 2025, Dannen was appointed to the College Football Playoff Selection Committee, continuing his impact on the national level. He served from 2021 to 2023 as a member of the NCAA Constitution Committee and the Division I Transformation Committee. He also previously served as chair of the NCAA Football Competition Committee and was an Executive Committee member of the Football Oversight Committee. In total, Dannen has served on seven NCAA committees. In 2022, Dannen was a finalist for Sports Business Journal's Athletic Director of the Year award, and he received the Distinguished American Award from the Sugar Bowl Chapter of the National Football Foundation.

Dannen came to Lincoln after serving as Director of Athletics at the University of Washington. He helped guide the Huskies' transition to the Big Ten Conference and oversaw a football program that reached the College Football Playoff National Championship Game in January of 2024. He arrived at Washington in the fall of 2023 after serving as Director of Athletics at Tulane University since 2015. While at Tulane, Green Wave student-athletes earned 49 All-America honors, a national championship, 21 conference championships and 41 postseason appearances.

In 2022-23, Tulane football won its first American Athletic Conference football championship and won the Cotton Bowl over USC, which was ranked ninth in the nation at that time. The men's basketball program won 20 regular-season games for the first time in two decades. Additionally, men's tennis advanced to its sixth NCAA Tournament in seven years, both bowling and beach volleyball finished ranked in the top 20, and baseball won the conference championship.

Tulane's football program participated in an unprecedented three consecutive bowl games from 2018 to 2020, winning back-to-back bowl games for the first time in 128 years of football at the University. In the classroom, Tulane student-athletes excelled at a high-level. At the end

of the 2022-23 academic year, over 68 percent of Green Wave student athletes earned a 3.0 GPA or better, with a 93 percent Graduation Success Rate and a record-setting department Academic Progress Report of 992, with seven teams earning a perfect 1000 APR score.

Dannen spearheaded fundraising efforts and numerous capital projects at Tulane. He helped secure the largest unrestricted gift in Tulane Athletics history, an endowment gift that funded the operation of a new sport (sailing), and a \$10 million lead gift for capital renovations, which was the secondlargest gift in department history. In addition, marketing and licensing revenue grew four-fold, and in 2022-23, Tulane football, basketball and volleyball set ticket sales and revenue records. Under Dannen's leadership, the Green Wave Club Annual Fund grew by 40 percent in terms of donors, and 45 percent in terms of dollars.

Increases in fundraising and major gift donors positively impacted capital project development and completion. A \$13 million renovation to the Reilly Natatorium, home of the swimming and diving program, as well as \$8 million in renovations to locker rooms and the sports medicine area inside the Wilson Center were completed in 2023. Dannen also oversaw construction of a new dining facility, weight room, basketball and volleyball locker rooms. Tulane also completed a \$2.4 million academic center renovation and a \$5 million television and digital production center.

Dannen came to Tulane after serving eight years as the Director of Athletics at the University of Northern Iowa (UNI) from 2008 to 2015. During his tenure, the Panthers enjoyed success at both the conference and national levels, highlighted by an NCAA Sweet 16 appearance in 2010 by the UNI men's basketball team. During his eight-year tenure, UNI was recognized with 39 All-Americans, 13 Coaches of the Year and nine Missouri Valley Conference (MVC) Players of the Year. UNI football, men's basketball, women's basketball, volleyball and softball combined to reach 15 NCAA tournaments and 20 postseason berths during that stretch. For his efforts, Dannen was recognized as NACDA's FCS Athletic Director of the Year in 2014.

Prior to his time at UNI, Dannen served as the Iowa Girls High School Athletic Union's Executive Director for seven years, overseeing 400 high schools and 10 sports.

Dannen grew up on a farm just outside Marshalltown, Iowa, and graduated from UNI in 1989 with a degree in communications. He is married to Amy and has four children: Elizabeth, William, Emily and Holly

in achieving increases in student enrollment and retention; ongoing growth in sponsored research awards; advancements in national rankings for academic excellence and student success; innovative research and academic program development; enhancements to shared governance processes; significant progress in fundraising and external outreach: investments to improve the quality of student life and the workplace environment for faculty and staff; and the implementation of changes to eliminate a historic budget deficit.

Prior to his tenure at UNL, Dr. Bennett served nearly ten years as President of The University of Southern Mississippi (USM), a comprehensive public research institution of approximately 14,000 students with campuses in South Mississippi and along the Mississippi Gulf Coast. Under his leadership, USM achieved R1 status; reached significant fundraising milestones; increased its annual economic impact; expanded operations along

the Mississippi Gulf Coast; supported innovations in healthcare; invested in new faculty positions, student success programming, and capital improvements; and increased access to quality education and research programs. USM became one of only fourteen R1 institutions in the nation that compete at the NCAA Division I level and maintain accreditation in all four major areas of the Arts.

Dr. Bennett previously served more than a decade in senior level positions at the University of Georgia in Athens, where he chaired the institution's NCAA certification review and self-study process; completed more than \$150 million in facilities projects; re-established the Dean of Students office after more than two decades; enhanced on-campus student health and counseling services; and managed oversight of robust student programs and support services for an enrollment of more than 34,000.

Throughout his career, Dr. Bennett has demonstrated a strong commitment to community leadership and service, including board membership for the Lincoln Chamber of Commerce; Nebraska Innovation Campus; Mississippi Aquarium; The First Bank (Hattiesburg); the Classic Center Cultural Foundation and Authority Board (Athens); the Northeast Georgia Girl Scouts of America; Catholic Health East (Philadelphia); and St. Mary's Health Care System (Athens). As USM President, Dr. Bennett chaired the athletic conference board and served as a founding member of the Board of Managers for the College Football Playoff national championship. He is a member of Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Inc., and Past Sire Archon for Sigma Pi Phi Fraternity, The Boulé.

Dr. Bennett holds a Doctor of Education in Educational Administration from Tennessee State University and specialist, master's, and bachelor's degrees from Middle Tennessee State University. Dr. Bennett's wife, Temple, is a member of The Links, Inc., an international women's social and public service organization founded on the principles of friendship and service, and Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. She holds a Master of Business Education and a Bachelor of Business Administration from Middle Tennessee State University. The couple has two adult daughters, Colby and Logan.

FACULTY ATHLETICS REPRESENTATIVE

Scott M. Fuess Jr. is in his fifth year as Nebraska's Faculty Athletics Representative, having started on July 1, 2020.

As faculty athletics representative, Fuess serves as a liaison between the Office of the Chancellor and Athletic Department. He also serves on the Athletic Department's Executive Staff. His areas of focus in the role include the welfare of studentathletes, NCAA and Big Ten Conference compliance, maintaining the positive relationship between athletics and faculty, developing and responding to NCAA legislative proposals and representing the university at related NCAA and Big Ten Conference meetings.

The half-time position - which was restructured to an expected term of five years - reports directly to the University of Nebraska System President and consults with Director of Athletics Troy Dannen. He splits time between faculty representative duties and academic responsibilities. Fuess, the Steinhart Distinguished Professor of Business and former chair of the College of Business' economics department, has worked at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln since 1986.

He serves on the Faculty Senate's Intercollegiate Athletics Committee, having chaired the committee for 2018-19 and a sub-committee in 2017-18. He also has served on numerous Big Ten Conference committees, including the Sports Management Committee, the Compliance and Reinstatement Committee and the Legislative Review Committee.

For 2022-23 he served as Chair of the B1G Compliance and Reinstatement Committee. Fuess earned a bachelor's degree from the University of Delaware, as well as master's and doctoral degrees from Purdue University.

His research interests are labor economics, the economics of collegiate sports, and the economy of Japan.

He has earned numerous "Distinguished Teaching" awards. In 2016 he received the UNL College of Business "Distinguished Service" award.

Jeffrey P. Gold, M.D., became the ninth president of the University of Nebraska System on July 1, 2024, following a national search by the Board of Regents. As president, Gold leads a four-campus university

system that enrolls nearly 50,000 students and employs 16,000 faculty and staff on campuses in Lincoln, Omaha and Kearney, plus academic divisions and research and extension centers across the state. He serves as chief spokesman and chief executive officer for the system, whichoperates on a \$3 billion annual budget and includes a flagship Big Ten institution, a world-renowned academic health sciences center, Division I athletics programs, and preeminent institutes focused on water and agriculture, national security and defense, infectious disease and early childhood education.

He is a nationally recognized higher education and health care leader and advocate. He was the chancellor of the University of Nebraska Medical Center (UNMC) and board chair for the Nebraska Medicine Health System from 2014 to 2024. As UNMC's chief operating officer, Dr. Gold was responsible for all aspects of campus leadership, program quality and operation – including 7 colleges, 37 institutes and centers, 5,429 faculty and staff and 4,700 health professions students.

In July 2021, Dr. Gold was named the Provost and Executive Vice President of the University of Nebraska System in addition to his ongoing UNMC/Nebraska Medicine responsibilities. In this role, he served as the chief academic officer of the University of Nebraska System and liaison to the Board of Regents for academic affairs. From May 2017 through June 2021, Dr. Gold served as the chancellor of the University of Nebraska at Omaha, the state's only public metropolitan university – a role he held concurrently with being UNMC's chancellor.

He holds tenured faculty appointments in UNMC's College of Medicine and in the College of Public Health, where his research interests in health care policy, population health and epidemiology are concentrated. He has authored over 200 peer-reviewed manuscripts, 350 national presentations, 40 books and chapters and engaged in over 300 invited professorships and keynote presentations.

Dr. Gold is a first-generation student; he graduated from the Cornell University College of Engineering with a bachelor's degree in Theoretical and Applied Mechanics. He earned his M.D. from the Weill Cornell College of Medicine and completed his general surgery residency at The New York-Presbyterian Hospital and Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center. He completed his cardiothoracic surgical fellowship training at the Brigham and Women's Hospital in Boston, with additional training in pediatric cardiac surgery at the Boston Children's Hospital, both of the Harvard Medical School.

He has been certified by the American Board of Surgery and by the American Board of Thoracic Surgery, specializing in adult and pediatric cardiac surgery. Dr. Gold is licensed in Nebraska, Ohio, New York and New Jersey.

Dr. Gold leads several key economic development boards for the State and the University System, including the Greater Omaha Chamber, University Tech Development Corp, the University Tech Transfer Corp, and UNeTech Corp.

His national leadership roles have included more than 50 national professional committees and more than 100 national organizations, volunteer boards, government and public health councils.

He has worked extensively with national- and state-level elected and appointed governing and administrative bodies as an advisor and trusted resource in the areas of higher education, research and clinical care.

Dr. Gold has been married for more than 50 years to a medical school classmate. They have two adult children and two grandchildren.

UNIVERSITY BOARD OF REGENTS

The Board of Regents consists of eight voting members elected by district for six-year terms, and four non-voting student Regents, one from each campus, who serve during their tenure as student body president. The board supervises the general operations of the university, and the control and direction of all expenditures. 

2025 (JUNIOR)

Asher Cohen opened his junior season in a dual meet with Cal and Oklahoma. He competed in the still rings, where he logged a 12.85. He later improved his scores to what became his personal best in the event at the Michigan meet. He earned a 14.45 for his first individual title of the season.

Cohen pulled out notable performances in the conference and NCAA Championships. On the still rings, he earned a silver medal in the individual finals at the 2025 Big Ten Championships. Cohen displayed exemplary skills on the rings for the team finals through a 14.00-point performance. He grabbed the first qualifying spot for the 2025 NCAA Championships, where he later went on to nab the first-place spot in the qualifiers with a 14.20.

The team captain from Lakewood, Colo., received his second All-American award on rings by posting 13.933 for seventh place at the NCAA Championships. In his third year as a Husker, Cohen received second-team All-Big Ten honors.

In the classroom, Cohen was named to the Academic All-Big Ten list and the Nebraska Scholar-Athlete Honor Roll. He was also a member of the Tom Osborne Citizenship Team.

2024 (SOPHOMORE)

Cohen competed in every meet for the Huskers en route to his first All-

American honor as he placed sixth on rings at the NCAA Championships. His best score on the season came against Army and Greenville where he had a 14.10 on the parallel bars, and he also set a career best for the rings with a score of 14.05 in the Huskers' against Illinois. Additionally, Cohen scored a 13.966 in the NCAA Qualifiers to put together a strong fourth-place finish.

Cohen was also a member of the Academic All-Big Ten Team and was named to the Tom Osborne Citizenship Team.

2023 (FRESHMAN)

Asher Cohen competed regularly for the Huskers on the rings and parallel bars. His season high and personal best on the parallel bars came at the NCAA Qualifiers, with a score of 14.166. Cohen also logged a high score of 13.85 on the rings in a meet against Michigan on February 4, 2023.

Cohen excelled outside the gym, earning a spot on the Nebraska Scholar-Athlete Honor Roll, as well as the Tom Osborne Citizenship Team.

BEFORE NEBRASKA

Cohen competed for 5280 Gymnastics under Head Coach Vladimir and Sasha Artemev, and Irina Bendassova. The Lakewood, Colo. native competed at the 2021 USA Championships where he placed fourth on floor and pommel horse and 10th in the all-around competition. At the 2021 Junior Olympic National Championships, Cohen finished first on rings and eighth in the all-around competition.

2025 (JUNIOR)

Nathan York was a mainstay in the floor, pommel horse, vault and parallel bars lineups. York excelled on vault and parallel bars, claiming individual titles in both events.

At the Big Ten Individual Finals, York posted a career high of 13.975 on floor, earning the silver medal and a Second-Team All-Big Ten honor for the second consecutive time. At the Illinois meet, York earned his first event title on parallel bars, putting up a 13.70. The Illinois native earned three top-three finishes, taking second on pommel horse with a career high of 13.95. York continued his success against Greenville, placing first on vault with a career high of 14.45 and parallel bars with a 14.15 to earn titles in two consecutive meets.

2024 (SOPHOMORE)

York competed in every competition for Nebraska and set a career best on the pommel horse with a 14.35 in NU's win over Illinois. He competed in the pommel horse and the floor exercise in the NCAA Qualifiers. York received Second-Team All-Big Ten this season and was a Big Ten bronze medalist for the floor exercise.

2023 (FRESHMAN)

York was a regular competitor for the Huskers on the floor and pommel horse. He notched a career high score of 14.45 on the floor at the Big Ten Championships, earning him a bronze medal. He was named Second Team All-Big Ten. York went on to compete at the NCAA Championships, placing in the top 20 in both floor and pommel horse and helping the Huskers to a fifth place national finish.

NEBRASKA'S CHAMPIONSHIP TRADITION

College gymnastics' highest honor, the Nissen-Emery Award, has been presented annually since 1966 to an outstanding senior collegiate gymnast based on gymnastic achievement, sportsmanship and academic excellence.

The original Nissen Award was named in honor of George Nissen, a former NCAA champion, for his contributions to men's gymnastics. The award was re-named the Nissen-Emery Award in 1998 to honor Dr. Robert Emery, a Penn State graduate, who won the Nissen Award in 1969.

The "Heisman Trophy" of gymnastics, the Nissen-Emery Award is inscribed with the following motto:

"The true champion seeks excellence physically, mentally, socially and morally."

Nebraska's dominance of men's gymnastics throughout the 1980s is best illustrated by the three Huskers who captured the Nissen Award within a period of seven years.

Tom Schlesinger was the third NU recipient of the Nissen. He won the award in 1988, following former Huskers Jim Hartung (1982) and Wes Suter (1986).

NEBRASKA NISSEN-EMERY AWARD WINNERS



JIM HARTUNG, 1982

Jim Hartung captured Nebraska's first Nissen Award in 1982. A seven-time NCAA champion, Hartung led the Huskers to their first four NCAA team titles. The Omaha native capped his career as a member of the gold medal winning 1984 U.S. Olympic Team.



WES SUTER, 1986

Wes Suter won the Nissen Award in 1986 to cap a brilliant career in which he won the 1985 NCAA all-around title and two NCAA individual event championships. He competed for the United States in the 1988 Olympic Games.



TOM SCHLESINGER, 1988

Tom Schlesinger earned the Nissen en route to winning the 1987 NCAA all-around title. He earned NCAA All-America status seven times and went on to capture a spot on the 1988 Olympic Team as the United States' top alternate.




TAYLOR CHRISTOPULOS, 2025

Taylor Christopulos won the Nissen Award in 2025 to finish an incredible year career in which he was a 10x All American. He also Big Ten Gymnast of the Year in both 2023 and 2025. Christopulos also was Big Ten Freshman of the year in 2021.

NEBRASKA'S OLYMPIANS

One of the nation's premier programs, Nebraska has produced nine athletes who have earned 11 U.S. Olympic positions, including a two-time Olympic appearance by current Nebraska assistant coach Jim Hartung. Former Head Coach Francis Allen was also a two-time Olympic team head coach for the 1980 and 1992 teams.




JIM HARTUNG: 1980, 1984

A two-time Olympian, Jim Hartung helped the 1984 U.S. squad to the gold medal. It marked the only time in Olympic history that the U.S. men have claimed team gold. A 22-time NCAA All-American and seven-time NCAA champion, Hartung won NCAA all-around titles in 1980 and 1981, was second in 1982 and third in 1979. In addition, Hartung won three straight NCAA still rings titles (1980-82) and back-to-back NCAA parallel bars crowns (1981-82). As a freshman in 1979, Hartung led NU to its first national championship. During his Husker career, Hartung guided NU to four straight national championships. An Omaha native and South High School graduate, Hartung was a product of the Cahoy School of Gymnastics. In 1982, Hartung became NU's first Nissen Award winner.



PHIL CAHOY: 1980

One of three Huskers on the 1980 Francis Allencoached U.S. Olympic team, Phil Cahoy was a 10-time NCAA All-American at Nebraska. Like Jim Hartung, Cahoy was an Omaha South High School graduate. He trained under his father, Phil Cahoy Sr., at the Cahoy School of Gymnastics before coming to Nebraska. As a Husker, he was a key figure on four NU squads that won national championships (1980-83). Individually, he was a four-time NCAA champion, winning back-to-back NCAA parallel bars and horizontal bar national titles in 1980 and 1981.



SCOTT JOHNSON: 1984, 1988

One of two Huskers who were two-time Olympians, Scott Johnson was a member of the gold medal winning U.S. squad in 1984. An 11-time NCAA All-American, Johnson was a three-time national champion at NU. At the 1983 NCAA Championships, Johnson won the floor exercise, parallel bars and horizontal bar national titles and placed second in the all-around.




JIM MIKUS: 1984

The alternate for the gold medal winning 1984 U.S. squad, Jim Mikus was a five-time NCAA All-American at Nebraska. He was a valuable contributor for NU's national championship teams in 1981, 1982 and 1983. Mikus was a two-time NCAA All-American on the floor exercise and horizontal bar, and finished fourth in the all-around in 1982.



FRANCIS ALLEN: 1980, 1992

A two-time Olympic team head coach, Francis Allen was selected to guide the U.S. squad in 1980 and in 1992. During his 40 seasons at NU, the Huskers won eight national titles, including an unprecedented five straight titles from 1979 to 1983, and finished second on seven other occasions.



LARRY GERARD: 1980

One of three Huskers on the Francis Allencoached 1980 U.S. Olympic team, Larry Gerard was a seven-time NCAA All-American while at Nebraska. In 1979, Gerard finished fifth in the all-around to help Nebraska win its first national championship.



WES SUTER: 1988

One of three Huskers on the 1988 U.S. Olympic squad, Wes Suter became NU's second Nissen Award winner in 1986. A five-time NCAA All-American at Nebraska, Suter finished his Husker career as a three-time NCAA champion. At the 1985 NCAA Championships, Suter won national titles in the all-around, floor exercise and horizontal bar.

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
KEVIN DAVIS: 1988

A member of the 1988 U.S. Olympic team, Kevin Davis was a seventime NCAA All-American for the Huskers. Davis was a two-time NCAA champion, winning parallel bars titles in 1987 and 1988. He helped NU to the 1988 national title, finishing third in the all-around.




TRENT DIMAS: 1992

A standout on the high bar, Trent Dimas won the only U.S. gymnastics medal at the 1992 Olympics with a 9.875 for a gold medal on the high bar. Dimas picked up two NCAA All-America awards for the Huskers in 1990, placing second in both the floor exercise and horizontal bar. Dimas' gold medal is the only individual gold medal an NU gymnast has won.



TOM SCHLESINGER: 1988

One of three Huskers on the 1988 U.S. Olympic team, Tom Schlesinger was a seven-time NCAA All-American at Nebraska. At the 1987 NCAA Championships, Schlesinger won the all-around and parallel bars national titles on his way to winning the Nissen Award in 1988.



YANNI CHRONOPOULOS: 2024

Yanni Chronopoulos was selected as an alternate for Team Canada during the 2024 Olympics held in Paris. Chronopouls was competing with Team Canada during the 2023 World Championships in October of 2023, where the team placed seventh. Before qualifying last year, Canada had not qualified in team events since 2008.
