## HUSKERS OPEN PACIFIC NORTHWEST TRIP AT OREGON

- The Nebraska women's basketball team plays its final road game of the regular season when the Huskers complete their trip to the Pacific Northwest by battling Washington Sunday.
- The NCAA NET 30 Huskers (16-11, 5-11 Big Ten) will face off with the NET 29 Huskies (19-8, 9-7 Big Ten) at Alaska Airlines Arena in Seattle with the tip scheduled for 2 p.m. (CT) / Noon (PT).
- Free live audio from the Huskers Radio Network will be available on Huskers.com, the Huskers App, 107.3 FM in Lincoln and 1490 AM/97.3 FM/97.7 HD3 in Omaha with Matt Coatney and Jeff Griesch on the call for their 25th consecutive season.
- A live television broadcast will be provided by BTN with Krista Blunk and Edona Thaqi on the call.
- Nebraska is coming off an 80-76 setback at NET 23 Oregon on Thursday night in Eugene. **Britt Prince** led five Huskers in double figures with 18 points and five assists, while **Logan Nissley** added 15 points, five rebounds and five assists despite battling illness. **Jessica Petrie** pitched in 12 points while sophomores **Amiah Hargrove** and **Petra Bozan** each added 11 points despite foul trouble.
- Nebraska, which is still hunting its first February win, led the Ducks 63-52 after Hargrove scored on the opening possession of the fourth quarter. The Big Red hit better than 63 percent of its shots through the first 30 minutes, but went 3-for-17 in the final period including 0-for-12 from long range. The Huskers were hindered by an early exit from forward **Eliza Maupin** (second quarter injury) before Hargrove fouled out for the first time in her 59-game career. Oregon opened the second half with 10-1 foul advantage, and from the end of the third quarter into the start of the fourth, the Ducks capitalized by hitting 9-of-10 free throws in a five-minute span to account for all their scoring.
- The loss was Nebraska's sixth straight to open February against top-25 NET teams.
- In fact, 10 of Nebraska's 11 losses this season have come to current NET top-25 Big Ten teams, including NET 2 UCLA, at NET 6 Michigan, at NET 8 Minnesota, twice to NET 12 Iowa, NET 14 Maryland, at NET 15 Michigan State, at NET 17 Ohio State, NET 21 USC and at NET 23 Oregon. NU's 10th setback was a one-possession midweek road loss at Wisconsin (63-60, Jan. 21).
- Washington, which defeated Oregon, 51-43 in Seattle last Sunday, is coming off an 82-67 loss at No. 2 UCLA Thursday. The Huskies are 2-4 in February, including back-to-back home losses to Illinois (Feb. 1) and Ohio State (Feb. 5). UW closed January with five straight victories, including big wins over Minnesota (Jan. 18) and at Maryland (Jan. 28). The Huskies opened January with a 64-52 home win over Michigan on New Year's Day in Seattle.

**HUSKER NUGGETS**

- Nebraska ranks 13th nationally in FG pct. (.480), 10th in FT pct. (.790) and 27th nationally in 3FG pct. (.355).
- Nebraska's 20 threes in a win over South Dakota at the Sanford Pentagon (Nov. 16, 2024) shattered the previous school record of 17, which came in the 2010-11 season opener against Vermont at the Devaney Center on Nov. 13, 2010.
- The 30 combined threes by NU (20) and USD (10) were the most in school history, eclipsing the previous school record of 27 (twice). The Huskers (15) and Oregon (12) matched the second-highest total in school history with 27 (Feb. 19, 2025).
- The Huskers have hit at least one three in 559 straight games dating back to a loss at UTEP on Dec. 20, 2008. Nebraska has hit at least two threes in 438 consecutive games.
- Nebraska has hit 10 or more threes 55 times in the last 168 games, including six times in 2025-26. NU hit 13-of-40 threes in a win over Omaha (Dec. 9), 12-of-19 threes in a win over Purdue (Jan. 4), and 12-of-29 threes in a win at Penn State (Dec. 6). The Huskers hit 11-of-21 threes in a win over Northwestern (Jan. 28) and 10-of-28 threes in a win over Creighton (Nov. 12). NU hit double-digit threes 10 times in 2024-25, highlighted by a school-record 20-of-34 threes in a win over South Dakota (Nov. 16). The Huskers tied a Pinnacle Bank Arena record with 16-of-32 threes in a win over Wisconsin (Jan. 20). NU hit 15-of-29 threes in a win over Oregon (Feb. 19). Nebraska hit double-digit threes 12 times in 2023-24, including 14 against Iowa in the Big Ten Championship Game (March 10), after hitting 13 in a win over Maryland (March 9).

**INSIDE THE HUSKER LINEUP**

• **Britt Prince**, who was named to the Nancy Lieberman Award Midseason Top 10 on Feb. 2, is one of the nation's most efficient guards. The 5-11 point guard out of Elkhorn North High School in the Omaha metro area, is hitting 55.5 percent (176-317) of her field goals, 46.6 percent (34-73) of her three-point attempts and 93.1 percent (81-87) of her free throws. Prince, who also leads the Huskers in assists (113) and steals (40), leads the Big Ten and the nation the Big Ten in free throw percentage (.931). She owned a school-record streak (men's or women's basketball) of 56 straight made free throws before missing her first attempt of the Big Ten season (54-54) against Iowa on Monday (Feb. 16). She has made seven straight since the miss and is 61-of-62 (.984) in league play. Nebraska's leading scorer, Prince ranks 10th in the Big Ten in scoring (17.3 ppg) and 13th in assists (4.2 apg). She owns eight 20-point efforts, including a pair of 30-point games this season. Prince has produced double figures 24 times this season.

• Fellow sophomore **Amiah Hargrove** is emerging as a star in the conference. A contender for Big Ten Sixth Player of the Year, Hargrove ranks second on the team in scoring (12.5 ppg) while leading the Huskers in rebounding (5.6 rpg). She had 24 points and six rebounds in her second start in place of Jessica Petrie (illness) at Ohio State (Feb. 1). It followed Hargrove's second double-double of the year with 13 points and 11 rebounds in her first start of the year in a win over Northwestern (Jan. 28). The 6-2 forward from Christopher, Ill., opened Big Ten play with a career-high 26 points on 10-of-14 shooting (4-5 3FG) at Penn State (Dec. 6). She added 21 points on 9-of-11 shooting at No. 15 Michigan State (Jan. 15). Hargrove is shooting 53.8 percent from the field, including 41.2 percent from long range and 79 percent from the free throw line. She has hit 52.8 percent (19-36) of her threes in league play. She missed the loss at No. 14 Iowa (Jan. 1) after suffering a mild concussion late in the loss to No. 17 USC (Dec. 29). She has produced double figures 19 times this season.

• Junior **Jessica Petrie** has provided consistency and leadership. The 6-2 forward from Gold Coast, Australia, ranks third on the team in scoring (11.4 ppg) and second in rebounding (4.6 rpg), but missed the first games of her Nebraska career with illness in the win over Northwestern (Jan. 28) and a loss at No. 11 Ohio State (Feb. 1). She returned in a somewhat limited role off the bench at No. 8 Michigan (Feb. 4). Petrie, who has produced double figures 16 times, has scored at least seven points in all 25 of her games this season. She also leads Nebraska with a career-high 26 blocks and owns a career-high 26 steals this season after getting 12 total steals her first two years.

• Junior **Logan Nissley** has made 14 straight starts. The 6-0 guard from Bismarck, N.D., has averaged 12.9 points on 47.9 percent (34-71) shooting over the last eight games. She erupted for a career-high 22 points and a career-best 6-of-12 three-point shooting against Maryland (Feb. 7). She opened the seven-game stretch with 15 points in a win over Illinois (Jan. 24) and struck for 15 more along with five rebounds and five assists at Oregon (Feb. 19). She hit for 14 points on four threes in a win over Northwestern (Jan. 28). Nissley, who had 11 points at No. 11 Ohio State and pitched in 12 points and four assists at Minnesota (Feb. 12), also ranks high on the efficiency scale. She has hit 46.8 percent (72-154) from the field, including 43.8 percent (53-121) from three-point range and 89 percent (24-27) of her free throws. Nissley is averaging 8.6 points, 2.2 rebounds and 2.5 assists with a 1.8 assist-to-turnover ratio. She ranks No. 7 in Nebraska history in three-pointers made (167).

• **Callin Hake** provides veteran leadership and an emotional heartbeat for the Big Red while joining Prince, Petrie and Nissley as returning starters from a year ago. Hake, a 5-8 senior guard from Victoria, Minn., is averaging 7.5 points and 3.9 assists while hitting 34.8 percent (39-112) of her threes. Hake, who has added 37 steals, also leads the Big Red with 28 charges drawn through 27 games. She has scored double figures eight times, including a season-high 17 in a win over Omaha.

• Senior transfer **Eliza Maupin** provides another starting option for the Huskers. The 6-3 forward from Webster Groves, Mo., is averaging 7.9 points and 4.4 rebounds over 24 games with 10 starts. She notched her second double-double of the year with 13 points and a career-high 13 rebounds at Wisconsin (Jan. 21). She had her first Husker double-double with 12 points and 11 boards at Iowa, before getting 11 points, six boards, three assists, two steals and a block against Iowa (Feb. 16).

• Nebraska plays a deep rotation that includes 6-3 sophomore **Petra Bozan** (14 starts, 6.9 ppg, 3.4 rpg), 6-0 graduate guard **Hailey Weaver** (13 starts, 2.8 ppg, 2.0 rpg), 5-8 sophomore **Claire Johnson** (3.4 ppg), 5-4 redshirt freshman **Kennadi Williams** (2.5 ppg, 2.4 apg) and 6-0 junior **Emily Fisher** (1.8 ppg, 1.5 rpg).

**SCOUTING THE WASHINGTON HUSKIES**

• Washington enters Sunday's game searching for its 20th win overall and 10th in Big Ten play. Fifth-year head coach Tina Langley is trying to secure Washington's second straight NCAA Tournament bid after taking the Huskies to the 2025 First Four. UW went 19-14 and 9-9 in the Big Ten, including an 83-62 win at Nebraska (Feb. 23, 2025).

• Midseason Naismith National Player-of-the-Year candidate Sayvia Sellers leads the Huskies with 19.1 points and 1.6 steals per game. The 5-7 junior guard from Anchorage, Alaska, has hit 37.1 percent of her threes and 49.2 percent of her field goals overall.

• Senior guard Elle Ladine, who led Washington with 28 points and four threes in last year's win over the Huskers in Lincoln, is averaging 9.7 points and 4.8 rebounds but has hit less than half the total threes compared to last season despite shooting 35 percent from beyond the arc.

• Newcomer Avery Howell, a 6-0 sophomore transfer from USC, has solidified the UW backcourt by averaging 13.6 points and a team-best 8.3 rebounds per game. Howell is shooting a scorching 42.1 percent from three-point range with a team-best 67 triples.

• Hannah Stines, a 5-11 junior guard, returns to the UW lineup averaging 6.6 points and 4.3 rebounds while ranking second on the team with 2.4 assists.

• Brynn McGaughy moved into Washington's starting five for four games before coming off the bench Thursday at UCLA. The 6-3 freshman forward from Colfax, Wash., is averaging 8.8 points and 4.3 rebounds while leading the Huskers with 32 blocks on the year.

- Yulia Grabovskaia, a 6-5 senior center who transferred to Washington after stops at Middle Tennessee and Michigan, started UW's first 22 games and earned a start against UCLA's Lauren Betts Thursday. The Russian is averaging 4.6 points and 4.8 rebounds.
- Chloe Briggs, a 5-11 junior guard, gives Washington an experienced reserve after serving as a part-time starter last season. She is averaging 2.2 points and 1.9 rebounds.
- Devon Coppinger, a 5-10 sophomore guard, is one of six Huskies to play in all 27 games. She is averaging 3.9 points and 2.2 boards.
- Teagan Brown, another 5-10 sophomore guard, has appeared in 24 games with eight starts, averaging 1.8 points and 1.7 rebounds, while 5-10 freshman Sienna Harvey (3.9 ppg, 1.8 rpg) rounds out UW's regular contributors.
- Washington is averaging 72.3 points while allowing 61.2 points per game on the season. The Huskies are shooting 44.9 percent from the field, including 35.1 percent from beyond the arc. UW also has hit 73.5 percent of its free throws. The Huskies have been strong on the glass with a plus-7.7 rebound margin, including plus-3.6 in the Big Ten. Washington carries a minus-1.0 turnover margin, including a minus-3.0 margin in league play.

## NEBRASKA VS. WASHINGTON SERIES HISTORY

- Washington leads the all-time series with Nebraska, 3-2, including an 83-62 win over the Huskers in Lincoln on Feb. 23, 2025. Returning guard Elle Ladine led the Huskies with 28 points on 11-of-18 shooting, including four three-pointers, while Dalayah Daniels added 21 points, 10 rebounds, five assists and five steals. Alexis Markowski (19 points, 12 rebounds) and Jessica Petrie (10 points, 10 rebounds) both produced double-doubles for the Huskers. Britt Prince did not play after suffering an ankle sprain late in a loss at Illinois.
- It was the first win for UW in Lincoln after falling 89-86 to the Big Red at the Bob Devaney Sports Center on Dec. 6, 1999. The Huskers also defeated Washington, 98-81, in the first-ever meeting between the two teams at the Devaney Center in Lincoln on Dec. 4, 1982.
- In the only previous meeting between the teams in Seattle, the Huskies held off Nebraska, 69-57, on Dec. 6, 2000.
- Washington also owns a 1-0 edge on neutral courts with a 101-70 win over the Huskers at the Michigan Domino Classic in Ann Arbor, Dec. 30, 1984.

## PRINCE ADVANCES TO LIEBERMAN MIDSEASON TOP 10

- Nebraska's **Britt Prince** advanced to the list of 10 women's college basketball players on the Nancy Lieberman Point Guard of the Year Midseason Top 10 on Monday, Feb. 2. The Lieberman Award was the first of the Naismith Starting 5 award watch lists announced by the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame on Oct. 27.
- Fan voting for the Nancy Lieberman Point Guard Award opened at <http://www.hoophallawards.com> on Friday, Feb. 6.
- Prince, a 5-11 sophomore from Omaha, Neb., returns for her second season at Nebraska after averaging 13.4 points, 4.0 rebounds, 3.8 assists and 1.7 steals as a true freshman.
- Through 27 games this season, she is averaging a team-best 17.3 points per game while hitting 55.5 percent (176-317) of her shots from the field, including 34-of-73 threes (.466).
- **Through 22 games, Prince was the only Division I starter in the country hitting 50 percent of her field goals (.562), 50 percent of her threes (.500) and 90**

percent of her free throws (.930), before dipping below the 50 percent 3FG line by going 1-for-3 at No. 8 Michigan (Feb. 4).

- She owns two 30-point performances, eight 20-point efforts and 20 double-figure scoring games this season.
- Prince was the MVP of the Emerald Coast Classic Beach Bracket (Nov. 24-25) after leading the Huskers to a tournament title with 30 points on 12-of-17 shooting in a 91-82 win over Virginia. She averaged 24.0 points and 6.5 assists in the tournament, including 18 points and a season-high seven assists in a win over Purdue Fort Wayne.
- She established her career high with 30 points on 13-of-18 shooting in a win over Oral Roberts (Nov. 19).
- Prince produced a 28-point, six-rebound, six-assist effort in a win over Northwestern (Jan. 28). She hit 10-of-15 shots from the field, including 2-of-3 threes and all six of her free throws.
- She produced a 27-point performance at No. 14 Iowa (Jan. 1), when she also recorded five rebounds and four steals, before getting a game-high 17 points to go with a team-high four rebounds in the win over Purdue (Jan. 4).
- She had 23 points, two assists and two steals in a win over Samford (Nov. 8).
- Prince opened Big Ten play with 20 points in a win at Penn State (Dec. 6) and produced her fourth 20-point effort in conference play this season with 20 points and four assists in a win over Illinois (Jan. 24). She added 20 points and seven assists in a win over Indiana (Jan. 8).
- She tipped 2025-26 with 19 points, five rebounds, an assist and a steal in a win over Northwestern State (Nov. 3).
- Prince led all players with 18 points and seven assists against No. 17 USC (Dec. 29). She also had 18 points and a season-high seven rebounds in a win over Creighton (Nov. 12). Most recently, she led Nebraska with 18 points and five assists at Oregon (Feb. 19).
- Prince had 17 points, four rebounds and five assists in a 92-53 win over Bradley (Dec. 3).
- She had 16 points and three assists in a win over North Dakota State in Sioux Falls, S.D. (Nov. 16).
- Prince also had 16 points, four rebounds and four assists at No. 15 Michigan State (Jan. 15).
- Prince, a two-time Gatorade and MaxPreps Nebraska High School Player of the Year at Elkhorn North, earned Big Ten All-Freshman honors while leading the Huskers to the 2025 NCAA Tournament.
- In the NCAA Tournament, Prince led the Big Red with 14 points and six assists against Louisville. She averaged 17.0 points and 5.3 assists over three Big Ten Tournament games, including a season-high-tying 24 points against tourney champion and NCAA No. 1 seed UCLA.
- Prince was the USBWA National Freshman of the Week (Jan. 21, 2025) after going for 22 points, seven rebounds, five assists and a career-high six steals in a win at Iowa (Jan. 16, 2025), when she hit a career-high five three-pointers.

## POTTS ANNOUNCES PLAN TO REDSHIRT, RETURN IN 2026-27

- Nebraska redshirt sophomore **Natalie Potts** will not return to the court in competition this season as she continues her rehabilitation from injury.
- Potts, who made the announcement on Thursday, Jan. 29, plans to return for her fourth year at Nebraska in 2026-27 with up to three years of eligibility remaining.
- "I am making slow but steady progress, and I appreciate the thoughts and encouragement of Husker fans everywhere," Potts said. "I love my teammates and coaches and will give them my full support as we push for the postseason. I really want to be out there fighting to win with them, but I am just not in position to do that yet."
- Potts, who was the 2024 Big Ten Freshman of the Year, suffered a knee injury in the fifth game of the 2024-25 season against North Alabama (Nov. 19). The 6-2 forward from O'Fallon, Mo., underwent surgery Dec. 4, 2024, and was eligible for a medical redshirt last season.
- She hoped to return to practice midway through the 2025-26 season, but her participation has been limited while she regains strength. Potts has recently returned to active participation in Nebraska game-day shoot-arounds, but she will not return to competition this season.
- Potts, who earned a spot on the preseason top 20 list for the Katrina McClain Award, will be eligible to take a redshirt this season.
- "Natalie is working diligently and progressing with her rehabilitation," Nebraska Coach Amy Williams said. "At this time, we believe that it is in the best interest of her long-term health to give her more time to continue to progress and gain confidence with her return to full participation."
- In 2023-24, Potts was a unanimous choice to the Big Ten All-Freshman team from the conference coaches and was an honorable-mention All-Big Ten selection by the league media. Potts started all 35 games for a Nebraska team that advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament after working its way to the Big Ten Tournament Championship Game. She averaged 10.2 points and 5.5 rebounds per game on the season.
- Through the first four games of her sophomore season, Potts averaged 17.5 points and 8.0 rebounds, before suffering her injury 10 minutes into the game with North Alabama at Pinnacle Bank Arena in Lincoln.
- In 2023-24, Potts led all Big Ten freshmen in rebounding (5.2 rpg) and field goal percentage (.489), while ranking second among league freshmen in scoring (10.2 ppg) and free throw percentage (.829) in

2023-24. She started all 35 games for the 23-12 Huskers, who advanced to the Big Ten Championship Game and the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

## NEBRASKA EXCELS IN NCAA STAT RANKINGS

- Through 27 games, Nebraska ranks among the top 25 teams in 7 NCAA categories.

## BIG RED TRIPLE THREATS

- Nebraska is hitting 35.5 percent of its shots from three-point range and averaging 7.9 made threes per game with shooters up and down the lineup.
- Five Huskers are shooting better than 34 percent from long range: **Britt Prince** (.466), **Logan Nissley** (.438), **Amiah Hargrove** (.420), **Hailey Weaver** (.414) and **Callin Hake** (.345). Additionally, **Emily Fisher** is 1-for-2 (.500) from long range on the season.
- In Big Ten play, the Huskers have knocked down 35.7 percent of their threes while averaging 7.8 makes per game.

## HUSKERS MAKE OPPONENTS PAY AT FREE THROW LINE

- Nebraska is challenging the school record for best team free throw percentage in Husker history. Through 27 games, the Huskers are shooting 79 percent (354-448) from the line. In 2013-14, the Big Ten Tournament champion Huskers hit a school-record 79.6 percent (507-635) of their free throws.
- The top six Huskers in minutes played are all shooting 75 percent or better at the line, including **Britt Prince** (.931), **Logan Nissley** (.889), **Callin Hake** (.875), **Amiah Hargrove** (.789), **Eliza Maupin** (.782) and **Jessica Petrie** (.755).
- **Britt Prince** has been Nebraska's leader at the line. The sophomore point guard leads the Big Ten and the nation by hitting 93.1 percent (81-87) of her free throw attempts. She set a school record (men's or women's basketball) by hitting 56 consecutive makes, which was snapped on her first free throw attempt against Iowa. She has made her next seven and is 61-of-62 (.984) in Big Ten play.
- **Cathy Owen** owns the Nebraska season free throw percentage record (.950, 57-60) with a minimum of 50 made free throws required. Former Husker point guard Rachel Theriot, an Ohio native and long-time European professional, hit 92.6 percent (63-68) of her free throws in 2014-15. Prince, Theriot and Owen currently own five of the top-six season free throw shooting percentages in Nebraska history, including Prince's 87.2 percent (68-78) as a freshman last season.

## HUSKER FORWARDS PRODUCING CAREER YEARS

- Sophomore **Amiah Hargrove** is proving herself as one of the Big Ten's most improved players in 2025-26. Hargrove's 324 total points are 168 more than the 156 she scored for the Huskers over 33 games as freshman. The 6-2 forward also has more than doubled her total steals this season (16) compared to last season (6). She put up 24 points at No. 11 Ohio State (Feb. 1), which followed her second double-double of the year with 13 points and a career-high-tying 11 rebounds in her first start of the season against Northwestern (Jan. 28). She added 16 points and a team-high rebounds at No. 8 Michigan (Feb. 4).
- Junior **Jessica Petrie** has totaled 285 points through 25 games, surpassing her previous season-best total of 210 points (2024-25) in 90 fewer minutes. Petrie's 26 blocked shots and 26 steals are also career bests, exceeding her previous career total of 12 steals through her first two seasons combined as a Husker. She had 20 blocks a year ago.
- Senior **Eliza Maupin** has scored 190 points for the Huskers through her 24 games this season, already surpassing her previous career-best season total of 146 points as a freshman at Kansas State (2022-23). Maupin's seven three-pointers this season have far exceeded the one triple she hit in her first three seasons at K-State. Her 70 made field goals and 43 free throws made are also the most in a season during her career, while her 18 blocks also have exceeded her previous career season high.

## HAKE LEADS BIG TEN AS SAIC CHAIR; NU SAAC PRESIDENT

- **Callin Hake** has proven herself a leader on and off the court in her four seasons at Nebraska, and the junior from Victoria, Minn., was elected President of the Nebraska Student-Athlete Advisory Committee for 2024-25 and will serve in that role again in 2025-26.
- Hake, who was Nebraska's Big Ten Sportsmanship Award winner for women's basketball in 2025, was the Big Ten Outstanding Sportsmanship Award winner across all NU women's sports in 2024-25.
- In 2025-26, Hake has taken on additional responsibilities across the conference as the chair of the Big Ten Student-Athlete Issues Commission (SAIC).
- Through 27 games this season, Hake is averaging 7.5 points, 2.4 rebounds and 3.9 assists while ranking second on the team with 1.4 steals. She also leads the Big Red in charges drawn (28) while carrying a 2.3 assist-to-turnover ratio.
- Hake tied career highs with 17 points and five three-pointers while dishing out six assists with no turnovers in a win over Omaha (Dec. 9). She has produced eight double-figure scoring efforts this season - Northwestern (13), Creighton (13), Northwestern State (13), Purdue (11), Virginia (11), UCLA (10) and Cal Baptist (10), while distributing a career-high eight assists in a Big Ten-opening win over Penn State.

• Last season, Hake earned 30 starts and averaged 6.4 points, 3.0 rebounds, 3.1 assists and 1.3 steals, while scoring in double figures nine times.

• Hake produced her best performance with a career-high 17 points and a then-career-best seven assists, while knocking down back-to-back threes in OT in a 94-90 win over Oregon (Feb. 19).

• Hake established her career high with 17 points to go with five rebounds, two assists and two steals in a win over North Alabama (Nov. 17).

• Hake was NU's leading scorer with 16 points, six rebounds and four assists in Nebraska's win over Penn State (Jan. 5, 2025).

• She had 16 points on a career-high five three-pointers to go with four rebounds, four assists and two steals in a win over Kansas City (Nov. 26, 2024).

• She produced a 12-point effort that included three threes for the second straight game against No. 12 Ohio State (Jan. 26, 2025).

• She put up 11 points on 3-of-5 three-point shooting in a Big Ten win over Minnesota (Dec. 8, 2024), after a strong 12-point, six-rebound effort that included three assists and a career-high four steals in a win over Lindenwood (Dec. 3, 2024).

• Hake added 10 points and four assists in NU's 91-71 victory at No. 17 Maryland (Feb. 13, 2024).

• She had 10 points, five rebounds and three assists in a win over Chattanooga (Dec. 15, 2024).

• She earned a prestigious Nebraska Sam Foltz 27 Hero Leadership Award in 2024. She is a three-time member of the Tom Osborne Citizenship Team.

## PETRIE, NISSLEY RETURNING STARTERS FOR BIG RED

• Juniors **Jessica Petrie** and **Logan Nissley** return to Nebraska's lineup after serving as starters alongside fellow returners **Callin Hake** and **Britt Prince** in 2024-25.

• Petrie, a 6-2 forward from Gold Coast, Australia, started 23 games a year ago after the injury to Natalie Potts. Petrie averaged 6.4 points and 4.4 rebounds to help the Huskers to a second straight NCAA bid. Petrie, who appeared in all 68 games for the Big Red in her first two seasons, averaged 8.7 points and 3.7 rebounds in the Big Ten Tournament while hitting 12-of-19 shots (.632).

• Petrie opened 2025-26 in the starting lineup in a win over Northwestern State (Nov. 3), posting 11 points and a game-high seven rebounds in a team-high 25 minutes.

• She followed with a career-high 20 points to go with five boards in a win over Samford (Nov. 8), before adding 11 points, four rebounds, three assists, two steals and a block in NU's win over Creighton (Nov. 12). Petrie put up 12 points in a win over North Dakota State (Nov. 16), before getting 10 points, six rebounds and four assists in a win over Oral Roberts (Nov. 19).

• Petrie put up the second-best scoring total of her career with 18 points to go with a team-high seven rebounds, two assists and two blocks in a Big Ten win over Indiana (Jan. 8). She owns 15 double-figure scoring efforts on the season, including 15 points in a win over Illinois (Jan. 24).

• She missed the first game of her Husker career (illness) in the win over Northwestern (Jan. 28), snapping a streak of 88 straight games played and 41 consecutive starts. Petrie did not travel to Nebraska's loss at No. 11 Ohio State (Feb. 1) because of the illness, but returned in limited duty off the bench for seven points and three rebounds in a loss at No. 8 Michigan (Feb. 4).

• She had 17 points on a career-high three three-pointers at No. 14 Iowa (Jan. 1).

• Petrie also scored 17 points in a win over Cal Baptist (Dec. 21), which followed a 14-point, seven-rebound effort in a win over Omaha (Dec. 9).

• She produced her first double-double of the season and second of her career with 15 points and a career-high-tying 10 rebounds in a win over Bradley (Dec. 3), before opening Big Ten play with 10 points and four boards in a road win at Penn State (Dec. 6).

• Petrie put up 14 points on a career-high four threes to go with a career-high three steals at Minnesota (Feb. 12).

• She added 10 points against No. 4 UCLA (Jan. 11).

• She had eight points, five rebounds and three blocks in a win over Purdue Fort Wayne (Nov. 24), before adding 11 points and four boards in a win over Virginia (Nov. 25).

• Nissley, a 6-0 guard from Bismarck, N.D., averaged 7.0 points, 2.7 rebounds and 2.6 assists while making 26 starts over 32 games as a sophomore. One of the Big Ten's most dangerous three-point threats, Nissley drained 55 threes on 36.2 percent shooting on the year.

• She erupted for her best game of the 2025-26 season with a career-high 22 points on a career-high six three-pointers against No. 22 Maryland (Feb. 7). Nissley hit 6-of-12 threes against the Terps and has moved up to No. 7 on Nebraska's career three-point list with 167.

• The effort surpassed her previous season-high 15 points on 5-of-7 shooting (2-of-4 3FG) while adding three assists in a win over Illinois (Jan. 24). She also hit for 15 points, five rebounds and five assists despite battling illness at Oregon (Feb. 19).

• She owns 12 double-figure scoring efforts this season, including six in the past eight games.

• Nissley had 14 points on 4-of-7 shooting, including 4-of-6 three-pointers, in a win over Northwestern (Jan. 28). She also tied a season high with five rebounds against the Wildcats.

• She posted her third straight double-figure effort with 11 points at No. 11 Ohio State (Feb. 1).

- Nissley added 14 points on 4-of-6 three-point shooting, while pitching in a team-high five rebounds to go with four assists in a Big Ten road win at Penn State (Dec. 6).
- She contributed 12 points and four assists at Minnesota (Feb. 12).
- She added 11 points in a Big Ten win over Indiana (Jan. 8), before putting up 11 more points against No. 4 UCLA (Jan. 11). She also had 11 points on 3-of-4 three-point shooting in just 15 minutes in a win over Purdue Fort Wayne in the first game of the Emerald Coast Classic in Florida (Nov. 24).
- Nissley followed with 10 points, five rebounds, a career-high seven assists with no turnovers, and two steals in a win over Bradley (Dec. 3).
- She also scored 10 points against No. 17 USC (Dec. 29), before earning her first start of the season at No. 14 Iowa (Jan. 1).
- Nissley, who missed Nebraska's closed scrimmage against Missouri and an exhibition win over Mount Marty (Oct. 24) with a lower leg injury, came off the bench to produce eight points, three rebounds and two assists in 19 minutes in the season-opening win over Northwestern State (Nov. 3).
- She missed NU's wins over Samford (Nov. 8) and Creighton (Nov. 12) before returning to the court for three points, two rebounds and an assist in a win over North Dakota State (Nov. 16). Nissley added seven points, two rebounds and three assists in 13 minutes in a win over ORU (Nov. 19).
- In 2023-24, Nissley helped the Huskers to the NCAA Tournament and the Big Ten Championship Game by making 10 starts down the stretch. The Big Ten All-Freshman selection averaged 7.0 points while hitting 39.9 percent (59-148) of her three-point attempts over 35 games.

## SOPHOMORES MAKING MAJOR IMPACT

- **Britt Prince** was the leader of a talented freshman trio for Nebraska in 2024-25. While Prince earned headlines by starting at point guard and putting up some of the best numbers in history by a Big Red rookie, fellow freshmen **Amiah Hargrove** and **Petra Bozan** were dynamic inside.
- **Claire Johnson**, an All-SoCon selection as a freshman at Samford, was added to a talented group of four Husker sophomores in 2025-26.
- Through 27 games, NU's four sophomores have combined for 1,066 of Nebraska's 2,152 points (49.5 percent) while hitting 52.9 percent (415-784) of their shots from the field.
- In NU's Big Ten-opening win at Penn State, Hargrove erupted for a career-high 26 points on 10-of-14 shooting with a career-best 4-of-5 threes, while Prince added 20 points (6-12) and Bozan contributed a career-high 17 on 8-of-12 shooting to combine for 63 points. The sophomore trio teamed for 44 of NU's record-setting 67 points in the second half alone.
- In the Emerald Coast Classic Beach Bracket (Nov. 24-25), Prince was named the tournament MVP while Hargrove joined her on the all-tournament team. In the title game win over Virginia, Prince finished with 30 points and six assists, while Hargrove added 17 points and a game-high eight rebounds, as the four sophomores combined for 50 of NU's 91 points while hitting 19-of-30 shots.
- In the win over Northwestern (Jan. 28), Prince scored a game-high 28, while Hargrove added a double-double with 13 points and 10 rebounds. Bozan and Johnson each contributed six points as the sophomores accounted for 53 of NU's 89 points.
- In the loss at No. 8 Michigan (Feb. 4), Prince and Hargrove led the Huskers with 16 points apiece while Bozan was the only other Husker in double figures with 12 points. The sophomores combined for 45 of Nebraska's 76 points.
- In the setback at Oregon (Feb. 19), Prince (18), Hargrove (11) and Bozan (11) combined for 40 of NU's 76 points while hitting 18-of-29 shots (.621).
- In the victory over Bradley, the sophomores combined for 44 points on 19-of-26 shooting (.731) while adding 20 rebounds, as Prince (17), Hargrove (13) and Bozan (12) all finished in double figures.
- The trio was back in double figures again in the win over Illinois State (Dec. 14), as Bozan (14), Prince (13) and Hargrove (11) reached double digits while Johnson added seven points.
- In the win over Oral Roberts (Nov. 19), the quartet combined for 48 points and 23 rebounds in a 103-58 win, fueled by a career-high 30 points from Prince and a career-high 10 boards from Bozan.
- In an 82-70 win over North Dakota State (Nov. 16), the sophomores combined for 48 points and 12 rebounds, while going 20-of-27 (.741) from the field, including 3-of-7 from three-point range (.429).
- NU's 84-50 win over Creighton (Nov. 12), included Prince's 18 points, followed by 11 from Johnson, nine from Bozan and six from Hargrove, as the class combined for 44 points and 17 rebounds.
- The sophomores produced big numbers in a win over Samford (Nov. 8), including 23 points from Prince, a career-high 13 points and six rebounds from Bozan, and the second career double-double with 12 points and 11 rebounds for Hargrove.
- In the regular-season opening victory over Northwestern State (Nov. 3), the sophomore quartet combined for 55 points, 16 rebounds and five assists, led by 21 points from Johnson, 19 from Prince and 11 from Bozan.
- Bozan, a 6-3 forward from Split, Croatia, replaces four-time All-Big Ten center Alexis Markowski inside for the Huskers in 2025-26. She averaged 5.3 points and 2.8 rebounds while playing in all 33 games off the bench for the Big Red last season. Bozan produced six double-digit scoring efforts, including 11 points in Nebraska's second-round Big Ten Tournament win over Illinois (March 6, 2025). She tied her season high with 12 points - all in the fourth quarter - at Indiana (Feb. 2, 2025). It matched her 12 points in an opening-day win over Omaha (Nov. 4). She also had 11 against Southeastern Louisiana (Nov. 9, 2024). She had her first double-digit effort in Big Ten play with 10 points on 4-of-4 shooting in a win over Wisconsin (Jan. 20, 2025).
- She closed the 2024-25 regular season with nine points in a win over Northwestern (March 2, 2025), before opening the Big Ten Tournament with nine points in a win over Rutgers (March 5, 2025). She combined to go 8-for-9 from the field in those two wins, including 4-for-4 in the tournament.
- **Hargrove**, a 6-2 forward from Christopher, Ill., capped her freshman season with 10 points and nine rebounds in less than 17 minutes of action off the bench in Nebraska's first-round NCAA Tournament game with Louisville (March 21, 2025). It was her eighth double-figure scoring effort of the season.

The 5-10 guard from Humphrey, Neb., had played in 15 of NU's first 16 games and was coming off her best performance of the year with 11 points and six assists in Nebraska's 85-80 win over No. 20 Michigan State (Jan. 8).

• She underwent her most recent knee surgery on Jan. 28, 2025, and is working to return for a sixth season at Nebraska in 2026-27 while trying to complete her master's degree in educational psychology from Nebraska. Weidner earned her bachelor's degree as a child, youth and family studies major from Nebraska on Dec. 21, 2024.

• In 61 career games with 25 starts, Weidner has averaged 7.0 points, 4.0 rebounds and 2.2 assists.

• Weidner returned to the court as a starter in Nebraska's season-opening victory over Omaha (Nov. 4) in front of the Pinnacle Bank Arena crowd after missing 55 consecutive regular-season games over the past two seasons because of leg injuries (first left, then right).

• Weidner made her triumphant and hard-fought return with 11 points, three rebounds, two steals and one assist in 24 minutes of Nebraska's 88-48 win over the Mavericks.

• She averaged 10.2 points and 6.2 rebounds through 13 games as a starter for the Huskers as a sophomore in 2022-23, before suffering a left leg injury early in the fourth quarter of Nebraska's triple-overtime victory over Kansas (Dec. 21).

• Weidner had started 21 consecutive games before missing the first game of her career in the loss to No. 14 Michigan (Dec. 28). She underwent successful surgery on her left leg on Jan. 10, 2023.

• She was on track to return for the Huskers ahead of the 2023-24 season before suffering a right leg injury in practice on Friday, Oct. 13, 2023. She underwent successful surgery on Oct. 25.

## HUSKERS RANKED FOR SEVEN WEEKS IN AP TOP 25

• Nebraska slipped out of the AP Top 25 (Jan. 26) after spending seven consecutive weeks (six polls) in the rankings. The Huskers received votes in each AP poll until going without a vote on Feb. 9. Nebraska continued to receive votes in the WBCA/USA Today Top 25 (Feb. 10 & 17).

• Seven Big Ten teams are ranked in this week's AP Top 25, while Washington and Illinois are both receiving votes. No. 2 UCLA, No. 6 Michigan, No. 10 Ohio State, No. 13 Iowa and No. 14 Maryland give the Big Ten five teams in the top 15, while No. 18 Michigan State and No. 23 Minnesota round out the conference teams in the top 25.

• The Huskers made their first appearance in the WBCA/USA Today Top 25 on Dec. 16, coming in at No. 25 with 63 points. They moved to 24th with 95 points (Dec. 23), before slipping back to No. 25 (44 points, Dec. 30). NU fell out of the poll but received votes in each poll in January.

• The Huskers were ranked in the AP Top 25 for seven straight weeks to open 2024-25, before falling out of the rankings Dec. 23, following a 72-61 road loss at then-No. 17 Georgia Tech (Dec. 21).

• The trio of **Natalie Potts** (Missouri, 2021, 2023), **Logan Nissley** (North Dakota, 2021, 2022, 2023) and **Britt Prince** (Nebraska, 2023, 2024) combined for seven total state basketball player-of-the-year honors, while adding a pair of state volleyball player-of-the-year awards (Nissley, North Dakota, 2021, 2022).

• In addition, **Allison Weidner** was the Nebraska Girls Athlete of the Year across all sports in 2021, while **Britt Prince** added a Nebraska Girls Athlete of the Year award over all sports in 2024.

• Prince (2,491) and Weidner (2,282) combined for 4,773 points during their Nebraska High School careers.

• While **Amiah Hargrove** was not the overall Illinois state player of the year, she was the Illinois Class 1A Player of the Year in 2023 and was named the Southern Illinois Player of the Year three times (2022, 2023, 2024).

• Hargrove (2,774), Potts (2,108) and Nissley (1,664) combined for 6,546 points in their high school careers, while Hargrove and Potts each added more than 1,000 career rebounds.

## KOUPAL NAMED MCDONALD'S HIGH SCHOOL ALL-AMERICAN

• Nebraska signee Ashlyn Koupal earned one 24 roster spots for the McDonald's High School All-American Game ahead of the NCAA Women's Final Four in Phoenix. The final rosters for the McDonald's boys and girls All-American games were announced on Monday, Feb. 2.

• Koupal, a 6-3 senior from Wagner, S.D., becomes the first McDonald's All-American in school history, claiming one of 12 spots on the West Team. Through games Jan. 30, Koupal was averaging 30.0 points and 15.5 rebounds per game for Wagner Community High School. She has totaled 2,308 points, 1,508 rebounds, 417 assists, 223 steals and 348 blocked shots in her career.

• She set the Wagner High School single-game scoring record with a 42-point performance earlier this season and recently broke the school's career scoring record previously held by her aunt, Mandy Koupal, who was a two-time NCAA Division II Player of the Year (2003, 2004) at South Dakota.

• Ashlyn Koupal is one six high school players who signed with Big Ten schools during the early period in November to earn spots in the McDonald's All-American Game.

• The McDonald's All-American Games will be held at Desert Diamond Arena in Phoenix, March 31. The NCAA Women's Final Four will be held at PHX Arena, April 3-5.



## HUSKERS SIGN THREE TOP 100 HIGH SCHOOL RECRUITS

• Nebraska signed a trio of top-100 high school seniors from the Midwest on the opening day of the national signing period on Wednesday, Nov. 12.

• Jersey Mike's Naismith Trophy Girls National High School Player of the Year candidate and McDonald's All-American Ashlyn Koupal (South Dakota), Ava Miles (Missouri) and Maddi Stewart (Oklahoma) plan to join Nebraska Head Coach Amy Williams and the Huskers as true freshmen for the 2026-27 campaign.

• "We are thrilled that these three talented, hard-working, driven young women have chosen to join our Husker family," Williams said. "Ashlyn, Ava and Maddi each bring the skills, intelligence, character and work ethic to thrive as Huskers and will be instrumental in helping us continue to raise the bar in our program."

• One of the highest ranked recruits in Husker history, Koupal (pronounced - KO-pull) is the No. 22 player in the current ESPN Top 100. The 6-3 forward from Wagner, S.D., was also ranked as a five-star recruit as the No. 10 player in the current 247 Sports rankings (No. 13 composite), as the No. 3 power forward in the nation. Koupal was the Gatorade South Dakota High School Player of the Year as a junior after averaging 22.8 points, 10.2 rebounds, 4.9 assists, 2.3 steals and 3.5 blocks in leading Wagner to the state tournament. It was her third straight season averaging better than 20 points per game. She also produced one quadruple-double, two triple-doubles and 10 double-doubles as a junior. A three-time all-state selection, Koupal helped Wagner to a Class A state runner-up finish as a sophomore in 2023. Koupal is also an outstanding student, carrying a 4.0 GPA.

• Koupal, who chose Nebraska over Duke, Kansas, Michigan State and TCU, was one of 45 high school players from across the country invited to the 2025 USA Basketball Junior National Team minicamp during the NCAA Women's Final Four. Entering her senior season, Koupal had amassed 1,939 points, 860 rebounds, 364 assists, 189 steals and 287 blocks.

• An outstanding all-around athlete, Koupal won her fifth consecutive South Dakota Class A state high jump championship as a junior in 2025. She also notched 12 kills to help the Red Raider volleyball team clinch a berth in the 2025 South Dakota Class A state tournament on Tuesday night.

• "Ashlyn has great versatility, which makes her a dangerous threat to score both inside and out," Williams said. "She makes those around her better with her ability to pass and defend at a high level. She has a strong desire to be great, and the work ethic to match. She is going to have a tremendous career as a Husker."

• A four-star recruit who was ranked No. 69 nationally by ESPN and No. 70 by 247 Sports, Miles was ranked as the No. 14 shooting guard in the country by 247 Sports. The No. 3 ranked recruit in the state of Missouri, Miles, who committed to Nebraska in July of 2025, led Staley to a Class 6 runner-up finish with a 29-2 record by averaging 14.2 points, 5.6 rebounds, 3.8 assists and 2.8 steals per game as a junior. She also hit 50.1 percent of her shots from the floor, including 33.3 percent of her three-point attempts for the Falcons.

• A three-time adidas All-American, Miles is a two-time all-state pick and a three-time all-district and all-conference choice. She was the 2025 Greater Kansas City Conference Player of the Year.

• "Ava is an outstanding all-around player who is going to bring energy to the court and the locker room every day," Williams said. "She is a high-level communicator with the ability to create in transition and score at all three levels. She is willing to do all the little things to help her team win. Husker fans are going to love watching her energy and enthusiasm on the court."

- Miles said she chose Nebraska over Maryland and Michigan State.
- "It truly is the only place that felt like home," Miles said. "I knew that no matter how my day was, that I would find peace and joy with this program. God told me this is where I needed to go, and I know this program is very, very special."
- Stewart, a 5-9 guard from Claremore, Okla., is the No. 80 recruit in the country and the No. 16 shooting guard according to 247 Sports. She is also No. 100 nationally by ESPN. Stewart averaged 14.7 points, 7.8 rebounds, 3.2 assists and 2.2 steals while leading Lincoln Christian High School to the 2025 Class 4A state championship. She shot 46 percent from the field and 82 percent at the free line for the Bulldogs, while eclipsing 1,000 career points early in her junior season.
- Stewart, who committed to Nebraska in mid-August, was the unanimous MVP of the Oklahoma Class 4A state tournament after getting 20 points and 12 rebounds in the state championship game. The two-time first-team all-stater was named the MVP of the Pinnacle Conference while playing for her coach and mother, Melody, who was named the state high school coach of the year by the Tulsa World. It was Lincoln Christian's third straight trip to the state finals, but its first state championship.
- "We are so excited about what Maddi brings to the Husker program," Williams said. "She is a winner! She is also a tough, gritty player who can shoot from outside and create off the dribble. As the daughter of a coach, she brings a high basketball IQ with her and a real desire to grow as a player and person to help her team win championships."
- Stewart, who chose Nebraska over Oklahoma, Missouri and Oklahoma State, said the Husker program provided a strong sense of belonging.
- "Nebraska feels the most like home to me," Stewart said. "I believe in what Coach Williams has built and in her vision for integrating me in the program as well. The fan base is unmatched and it is clearly Nebraska vs. everyone. Go Big Red!"

### HUSKERS IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

- Nebraska made its 17th NCAA Tournament appearance and its 11th since 2007 (last 18 tournaments) in 2024-25.
- The Huskers own nine all-time NCAA Tournament wins with their last coming in the first round over Texas A&M in Corvallis, Ore., in 2024.
- The Huskers advanced to NCAA Sweet Sixteens in 2010 and 2013.
- Nebraska has advanced to the NCAA Second Round on seven occasions.
- Nebraska earned a No. 1 seed in the 2010 NCAA Tournament after going 29-0 in the regular season. The Huskers were the first Big 12 Conference team in history to go through an unbeaten conference regular season (16-0). NU defeated No. 16 Northern Iowa, before knocking off No. 8 UCLA in Minneapolis in the NCAA Tournament.
- The Big Red earned a No. 4 seed in the 2014 NCAA Tournament after winning the Big Ten Tournament title. Nebraska defeated No. 13 Fresno State in Los Angeles, before falling to No. 5 BYU at Pauley Pavilion on the UCLA campus in the second round.
- The Huskers advanced to the NCAA Sweet Sixteen as a No. 6 seed in 2013, defeating No. 3 seed Texas A&M in College Station after defeating No. 11 seed Chattanooga.
- Nebraska also earned a No. 6 seed in 2024 in Corvallis, defeating No. 11 Texas A&M before falling to No. 3 Oregon State.
- The Huskers won their first and only NCAA Tournament home game as a No. 6 seed by beating San Diego at the Devaney Center in 1993.

## HUSKER WOMEN DRIVE FOUR-SPORT ATTENDANCE

• Nebraska continued as one of the top draws in women's sports in 2024-25, ranking second in NCAA four-sport attendance with 337,348 fans to women's basketball, volleyball, soccer and softball games.

• In 2023-24, Nebraska led the nation in four-sport women's attendance with a record 418,198 total fans across the same four sports, a total of 19,090 fans more than South Carolina's 399,108.

• Over the past three seasons, Nebraska has joined South Carolina as the only collegiate women's programs to draw more than 1 million fans in four-sport attendance. South Carolina leads with 1,096,561 while the Huskers have attracted 1,035,226. LSU is a distant third with 870,822 dating back to the start of the 2022-23 campaign.

• Nebraska was the only school in the country to rank in the top 16 nationally in average home attendance in all four major women's team sports in 2024-25, including No. 1 in volleyball (8,713), No. 4 in softball (2,306), No. 11 in soccer (1,437) and No. 16 in women's basketball (5,638).

• Overall, Nebraska ranked seventh nationally in seven-sport attendance (football, men's basketball, baseball) with 1.3 million fans attending Husker home events in 2024-25. Only Ohio State ranked ahead of the Huskers in the Big Ten with 1.35 million fans.

• Nebraska was the only school in the nation to rank among the top 16 in the nation in average home attendance in each of the seven sports, including football (12th, 86,900), men's basketball (13th, 14,964) and baseball (14th, 4,913).

## HUSKERS CONTINUE TOP 25 ATTENDANCE STREAK

• Nebraska women's basketball ranked among the top 25 in average home attendance for the 15th consecutive season in 2024-25 by averaging 5,638 fans per game at Pinnacle Bank Arena with a total of 95,838 fans over 17 regular-season home games to rank 16th nationally.

• The Huskers averaged 6,088 fans over 16 games at PBA in 2023-24, which ranked No. 3 in school history behind only 7,390 fans (2009-10) and 6,161 fans per game (2013-14). Nebraska's 2023-24 average home attendance ranked 15th in the nation.

• Nebraska set the school record with a sellout crowd of 15,042 in an 82-79 victory over No. 2 Iowa at Pinnacle Bank Arena (Feb. 11, 2024). The game also came in front of a FOX national TV audience on Super Bowl Sunday in Lincoln. The game was sold out six weeks in advance with no promotion.

• The attendance eclipsed the previous school record of 14,289 fans for Pack PBA on Play4Kay Day at Pinnacle Bank Arena (Feb. 18, 2023) vs. No. 7 Iowa.

• Nebraska's 2023 Pack PBA crowd surpassed its previous women's basketball attendance mark of 13,595 fans (sellout) against Missouri at the Devaney Center on Feb. 27, 2010. NU drew 10 straight crowds of more than 10,000 fans at the Devaney Center in 2009-10.

• Nebraska drew 9,750 to open its stay in Pinnacle Bank Arena with a win over UCLA on Nov. 8, 2013. The home-opening crowd at PBA is also a Nebraska non-conference record. The Big Red surpassed that crowd with 9,772 fans on Pack PBA Day against No. 12 Ohio State (Jan. 26, 2025).

• Nebraska ranked No. 13 nationally in average home attendance (5,761) over 17 games in 2022-23. It was an increase of 1,282 fans per contest at Pinnacle Bank Arena over 2021-22, when Nebraska averaged 4,489 fans while going 16-1 at home.

• Nebraska finished No. 14 nationally in total home attendance (76,317) while ranking 18th in NCAA Division I women's basketball in average home attendance (4,489). Nebraska's 16 home regular-season wins (16-1) at Pinnacle Bank Arena also led the nation in 2021-22.

• In 198 games with attendance allowed (excludes 11 games during COVID pandemic 2020-21), the Huskers have averaged 5,253 fans per game (1,040,173 total fans/198 games).

• Nebraska produced its top attendance season in school history by ranking No. 7 nationally with a record 7,390 fans per game at the Bob Devaney Sports Center in 2009-10. The Huskers went 16-0 at the Devaney Center on their way to a perfect 29-0 record, a Big 12 title and a No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament.

## BIG RED DOMINANCE AT PINNACLE BANK ARENA

• Nebraska is 12-4 at Pinnacle Bank Arena in 2025-26.

• The Huskers went 13-4 at home in 2024-25 with 11 wins by double digits. The Big Red owns a 66-17 record (.795) over the past five seasons with 11 of the losses to top-25 teams.

• In 16 regular-season games in 2023-24, Nebraska finished 13-3 at home, including a win over No. 2 Iowa (Feb. 11) to match the highest-ranked team ever defeated by the Huskers.

• Nebraska tied a school record by winning 16 home games at Pinnacle Bank Arena in 2021-22. The Huskers finished 16-1, matching the 1997-98 (16-0), 2009-10 (16-0) and 2013-14 (16-2) teams for most home wins. Coach **Amy Williams** was a senior guard on Nebraska's 1997-98 team coached by 2022 Women's Basketball Hall of Fame inductee Paul Sanderford.

• Nebraska delivered double-digit margins in 15 of 16 home wins in 2021-22, including wins over top-10 Michigan (79-58) and Indiana (72-57) teams, with only 2022 NCAA Elite Eight qualifier Creighton falling by single digits (67-62).

• The Huskers are 544-184 (.747) all-time at home, including 12-4 in 2025-26.

• Nebraska tied the school record for home victories by going 16-1 at Pinnacle Bank Arena in 2021-22. The Big Red followed with a 12-5 record in 2022-23, before going 13-3 in 2023-24 and 13-4 in

2024-25. NU has posted double-figure home victory totals 20 times in the last 23 seasons, including 2025-26.

- The Huskers were 15-4 at Pinnacle Bank Arena in 2015-16 after going 12-3 (13-3 at home) in 2014-15. The Huskers are 155-53 (.745) all-time at PBA since the building opened in 2013-14. The Big Red went 16-2 at home in 2013-14, suffering their only Big Ten loss to Purdue, 77-75, on Jan. 19, 2014. NU's 16 home wins in 2013-14 tied the school record for single-season home victories.

- The Huskers played the first regular-season game in arena history against USA Today No. 25 UCLA (Nov. 8, 2013) and rolled to a 77-49 win over the Bruins. NU's first win over an AP Top 25 team came with a 76-56 win over No. 24 Michigan State on Feb. 8, 2014. The Huskers added their first-ever win over an AP Top 10 team at the arena with a 94-74 victory over No. 8 Penn State on Feb. 24, 2014.

- NU won its first Big Ten home game at Pinnacle Bank Arena with a 66-65 thriller over Northwestern Jan. 2, 2014, before an 88-85 win over Minnesota on Jan. 16, 2014, marked the first overtime game.

- NU suffered its first loss at the arena to Washington State (76-72) on Nov. 30, 2013.

- Nebraska notched its first postseason home victory at Pinnacle Bank Arena with its 74-65 win over Missouri State (March 15, 2023), before adding a 77-57 win over Northern Iowa in the second round (March 19, 2023). It marked the first time Nebraska had ever won two home games in the same postseason tournament (NCAA or WNIT). NU's only other postseason home game at PBA came with a 64-62 loss to Northern Iowa (March 17, 2016). The Huskers are 4-3 all-time in Lincoln in Postseason WNIT games, including 4-1 against Missouri Valley Conference opponents.

- The Huskers are 49-3 all-time in home season openers, following a 103-46 win over Northwestern State on Nov. 3, 2025. Nebraska has won 19 of its last 20 season openers.

- Nebraska played in the Devaney Center from 1976-77 through 2012-13, and added one appearance at Devaney against Utah on Nov. 23, 2014. The Huskers own a 389-130 record at the Devaney Center, including 146-88 (.624) mark in conference play.

### HUSKERS RADIO NETWORK COVERS WORLD

- The Huskers Radio Network is in its fourth season producing and marketing the live broadcasts of Nebraska women's basketball in 2025-26, but play-by-play announcer Matt Coatney and color commentator Jeff Griesch team up for their 25th season as the Husker broadcast team.

- The Huskers Radio Network carries every game, home and away, around the world for free on Huskers.com, marking the 25th year that all of Nebraska's women's basketball games are free and available to fans. In addition to carrying every women's basketball game free on Huskers.com, the Huskers Radio Network flagship stations B107.3 FM-KBBK (Lincoln) and 97.3 FM and 1490 AM-KIBM (Omaha) provide bandwidth for Husker women's basketball. When a network conflict occurs in Lincoln, the Huskers also can be heard on 105.3 FM KLNC. 880-AM-KRVN (Lexington) also provides a huge AM signal statewide in central Nebraska, while more than 20 stations carry the Huskers Radio Network's women's basketball coverage across the state and the Midwest.

- Inside Pinnacle Bank Arena, fans can access the direct radio call of the game at 87.7 FM.

- Nebraska's game at Washington will be Coatney and Griesch's 829th women's basketball broadcast together - more than any other Husker radio team across all sports in history.

- Griesch also has called 779 consecutive Husker games dating back to Jan. 5, 2003. The last game he missed came against Penn State on Dec. 30, 2002 at the Surf & Slam in San Diego, following the birth of he and his wife Emily's first child, Hollan. A University of Nebraska-Lincoln graduate, Hollan celebrated her 23rd birthday on Dec. 10, 2025. Hollan has three younger brothers, Jackson (21), a junior at Nebraska, Brennan (17) and Isaac (12).

- Griesch's streak has continued despite undergoing open heart surgery (Sept. 28, 2022) to replace a mechanical aortic valve. Less than five weeks later, he was on air with Coatney for Nebraska's exhibition game with Washburn. Griesch also had open heart surgery as a junior in high school (May 1, 1990).

### HUSKERS TO APPEAR 11 TIMES ON BIG TEN TV PARTNERS

- Nebraska is scheduled to play 11 regular-season games televised by Big Ten TV partners in 2025-26. The Huskers opened a strong slate of televised games by rolling to an 84-50 win over in-state rival Creighton (Nov. 12) at Pinnacle Bank Arena in a game televised by FS1.

- Nebraska made the first of nine appearances on the Big Ten Network when the Huskers defeated North Dakota State at the Sanford Pentagon in Sioux Falls, S.D. (Sunday, Nov. 16).

- The Huskers will appear on BTN early and often to start 2026, beginning with a New Year's Day game at Iowa with a 1 p.m. tip at Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

- Nebraska was back on BTN at PBA to battle 2025 NCAA Final Four participant UCLA on Sunday, Jan. 11 at 6 p.m., before squaring off with Michigan State in East Lansing on BTN on Thursday, Jan. 15 at 6 p.m.

- The Huskers played for the fourth time in January on BTN when they defeated Illinois Saturday, Jan. 24 at 1 p.m. in NU's annual Pack PBA game.

- Nebraska opened February on BTN by traveling to Ohio State to battle the Buckeyes on Sunday, Feb. 1 at 5 p.m., before facing Maryland on BTN at PBA on Saturday, Feb. 7 at 1 p.m. in the Big Red's annual Pink Game.

- The Huskers returned to BTN at Minnesota to clash with the Golden Gophers on Thursday, Feb. 12 at 7 p.m., before a Presidents' Day showcase on FOX against Iowa on Monday, Feb. 16 at 11 a.m.

- The Huskers close their regular-season TV appearances on BTN by tangling with Washington in Seattle on Sunday, Feb. 22 at 2 p.m. (CT).

## NEBRASKA POSTS 21ST STRAIGHT PERFECT GSR

• In the eyes of the NCAA's Division I Graduation Success Rate (GSR), the Husker women's basketball program has been perfect for 21 consecutive years. Nebraska is the only program among the 18 Big Ten Conference schools to accomplish the perfect score for 21 straight seasons.

• The NCAA announced the release of its annual Graduation Success Rate report Nov. 19, 2025, and Nebraska was a national leader in women's basketball for the 21st straight season, dating back to the initial public tracking of the GSR since 2004-05.

• The Nebraska women's basketball program joins the Husker women's tennis and volleyball programs as Husker teams that have produced perfect 100 percent rates each of the last 21 years.

• Overall, the Nebraska Athletic Department produced a GSR of 92 percent.

• Nebraska continues to lead the Big Ten in Academic All-Americans across all sports (374) and NCAA Impact Award winners (19). More than 100 Huskers have also earned NCAA Postgraduate Scholarships in history.

## NEBRASKA OVERTIME FACTS

• Nebraska improved to 27-27 all-time in overtime games with its 94-90 win over Oregon (Feb. 19), including 14-12 at home, 9-11 in true road games and 4-4 on neutral courts in overtime.

• The Huskers are 7-7 in overtime games under Coach Amy Williams.

• Nebraska is 4-3 in overtime games at Pinnacle Bank Arena.

• The Huskers have played 19 all-time overtime games against Big Ten opponents and own a 7-12 record. NU is 6-9 against Big Ten opponents in OT since joining the conference in 2011-12, including 2-0 in 2024-25.

• Nebraska is 6-2 in multi-overtime games with its most recent contest coming with an 85-79 3OT win over No. 20 Kansas in Lincoln (Dec. 21, 2022). The most recent loss in a multi-overtime game came with an 87-84 2OT setback at Washington State (Nov. 16, 2018) in Pullman. NU's only other loss in a multi-overtime game came to Purdue in the 2012 Big Ten Championship Game, 74-70 in double-overtime in Indianapolis.

• The Huskers are 2-0 in OT in 2024-25, including a 94-90 OT victory over Oregon (Feb. 19) and an 87-84 OT win at Iowa (Jan. 16).

• NU's lone overtime game in 2023-24 also came against Iowa with a 94-89 OT loss to the No. 3 Hawkeyes in the Big Ten Championship Game at the Target Center in Minneapolis (March 10, 2024).

• Nebraska was 2-1 in overtime games in 2022-23, after a 74-62 OT loss at No. 4 Indiana (Jan. 1, 2023). The Huskers notched an 85-79 3OT win over No. 20 Kansas at Pinnacle Bank Arena (Dec. 21, 2022). It matched the longest game in school history and was the first triple-overtime game in women's basketball at Pinnacle Bank Arena. Nebraska also defeated Mississippi State 73-65 in OT at the Puerto Rico Clasico at Roberto Clemente Coliseum in San Juan (Nov. 26, 2022). It was NU's first overtime game since 2019-20.

• The Huskers, who did not play an overtime game in 2020-21 or 2021-22, were 1-2 in OT in 2019-20 with an 80-74 loss to Ohio State (Feb. 2) and a 78-70 OT loss at Michigan State (Dec. 31, 2019). The Huskers opened non-conference road action with a 90-85 OT win at Missouri (Nov. 10, 2019).

• The 2019-20 season marked the first time that Nebraska played three overtime games in the same season since 2011-12 - NU's first season in the Big Ten. In 2011-12, the Huskers played a total of seven OT periods in those three games.

• Nebraska has never played four overtime games in the same season.

• Nebraska's lone overtime game of 2018-19 also came in the Huskers' first road game of the season, but NU suffered an 87-84 double-overtime loss at Washington State (Nov. 16, 2019). It marked the second straight season that Nebraska played a multi-overtime game (also at Drake, Dec. 9, 2017).

• The Huskers went 1-1 in overtime in 2017-18, including a 69-64 overtime loss to No. 23 Michigan at Pinnacle Bank Arena (Jan. 13). The Huskers won their first overtime game of 2017-18 with an 89-85 double-overtime win at Drake (Dec. 9).

• Nebraska was 1-1 in overtime in 2016-17, including a 76-74 win over Michigan State at Pinnacle Bank Arena to close the regular season (Feb. 26, 2017). The Huskers lost 79-69 in OT to Minnesota at the arena (Feb. 4, 2017).

• The Huskers defeated Minnesota 88-85 in overtime on Jan. 16, 2014. It marked the first overtime game in the history of Pinnacle Bank Arena. Nebraska's first overtime game in the history of the Bob Devaney Sports Center also came against Minnesota - a 68-67 win for the Huskers on Dec. 30, 1977.

• Nebraska played its fourth OT game in 73 meetings with Missouri in a 90-85 OT win at Mizzou Arena (Nov. 10, 2019). All four OT games against the Tigers were settled in a single overtime period.

• Nebraska's next most frequent overtime opponents are Big Ten foes Purdue, Minnesota and Wisconsin and former Big 12 foe Kansas. The Huskers and Purdue have played three OT games in 20 meetings. NU's six total overtimes against Purdue are the most against any team in school history.

• The Huskers also have played three overtime games against Minnesota (33 games), including two of the six overtime games in Pinnacle Bank Arena history.

• Nebraska played its third overtime game in history against its most frequent rival Kansas. The Huskers defeated KU 85-79 in 3OT (Dec. 21, 2022). It marked the third overtime game in 85 contests with the Jayhawks. Nebraska improved to 2-1 in OT against KU with all three games coming in Lincoln.

• In 24 all-time games with Wisconsin the Huskers have played three overtime contests.

• Nebraska has never played back-to-back overtime games at home. The Huskers have played back-to-back overtime games only once in school history, an 83-81 loss to Texas A&M in College Station on Dec. 30, 1985, before returning to Lincoln for an 80-75 win over Eastern Kentucky at the Devaney Center on Jan. 2, 1986.

Chit-Chat Wright led Iowa with 24 points, while Hannah Stuelke added a double-double with 21 points and 10 rebounds. Ava Heiden put three Hawkeyes in double figures with 18 points. Nebraska jumped out to a 12-2 lead and held a 21-18 lead after one quarter. The second quarter featured nine ties and six lead changes, before NU took a 45-44 lead to halftime. The game was tied at 70 with 5:44 left, before Iowa went on a 10-0 run.

NU outscored Illinois 12-4 in points off turnovers and 7-1 in second-chance points to account for 14 points of its 18-point halftime lead. In a balanced effort, nine Huskers found the scoring column in the first half. Conversely, Berry Wallace scored 18 of the Illini's 23 first-half points, but only two other Illini found the scoring column. Nebraska maintained a 12-point lead after three quarters, and pushed the lead back to 15 points on a Nissley three-pointer with 7:48 left in the game. Illinois trimmed the Husker lead to six points late in the game, but the Nebraska still carried a 10-point lead with 20 seconds left.

**Game Highlights:** Britt Prince scored 13 points to lead three Huskers in double figures, but No. 15 Iowa jumped out to a quick lead and never looked back in an 80-67 win over Nebraska. Playing in an 11 a.m. tip on a FOX national telecast on Presidents' Day, Iowa went on a 10-0 run in the first two minutes after Amiah Hargrove got the first bucket of the game. Hargrove, who finished the game with 10 points, was strapped with two early fouls and Iowa took advantage. The Hawkeyes built a 25-13 lead after one quarter and pushed the edge to 45-27 at the half. Eliza Maupin helped the Huskers off the bench with 11 points, including the last basket of an 8-0 Husker run midway through the quarter that cut the Iowa lead to 12. Petra Bozan added a basket to trim the Iowa margin to 52-41 with 4:27 left in the third, before the Hawkeyes responded with a 13-1 surge over the next three minutes to build a 65-42. The Huskers refused to quit, outscoring the Hawks 18-11 in the fourth quarter, but it was not enough. Ava Heiden led Iowa with game highs of 27 points, 11 rebounds and three blocks. Taylor Stremlow added a career-high 17 points on a career-high three threes - all in the first quarter.

**Game Highlights:** Nebraska held a 63-52 lead early in the fourth quarter, but home-standing Oregon outscored the Huskers 28-13 down the stretch to knock off NU, 80-76 at Matthew Knight Arena. The Big Red fell behind 15-8 early but tied the game at 20 after one quarter. The Huskers opened the second period on a 6-0 run to cap an 11-0 run overall and held a 37-33 edge at halftime. The Big Red built their biggest lead at 50-38 midway through the third quarter and headed to the fourth shooting 63 percent from the field. But in the final 10 minutes, Nebraska hit just 3-of-17, including 0-of-12 from three-point range after hitting 6-of-13 through the first 30 minutes. Oregon rallied largely at the free throw line despite trailing in the game. The Ducks scored their last four points of the third at the line before opening the fourth by going 9-of-10 at the line before Katie Fiso hit a field goal to take give Oregon a 68-67 lead. Fiso finished with 19 points, including 10 in the final four minutes. Ehis Etute led the Ducks with 21 points, while drawing nine fouls on the Huskers and going 9-for-10 at the line. Britt Prince led five Huskers in double figures with 18 points, while Logan Nissley added 15 points, five rebounds and five assists.

"We are thrilled that Hailey will be finishing her career at Nebraska," Williams said. "Her versatility on the offensive side of the ball makes her a great fit with our team and our style of play. She has three years of experience guarding in the Big Ten Conference, and we are excited for what she brings to us on that side of the ball as well."

In three career games against the Huskers at Pinnacle Bank Arena, Weaver went 5-for-11 from beyond the arc. She scored 11 points on 2-of-5 long-range shooting in a loss to the Huskers in Lincoln (Feb. 20, 2024).

## GRADUATE (2025-26)

Nebraska bolstered its 2025-26 backcourt with an experienced Big Ten guard when Husker women's basketball coach Amy Williams announced the signing of Hailey Weaver on April 14.

Through 27 games as a Husker, Weaver is averaging 2.7 points, 2.0 rebounds and 1.0 assist. She put up a season-high 11 points to go with five rebounds in Nebraska's Emerald Coast Classic Beach Bracket championship game win over Virginia (Nov. 25). Weaver lifted the Huskers with 11 third-quarter points in a three-minute span, including 3-of-3 three-point shooting.

She produced an eight-point effort to go with three rebounds, three assists and three steals in an 87-56 win over Cal Baptist to close non-conference play (Dec. 21).

She added six points, three rebounds, three assists, a block and a steal in Nebraska's Big Ten-opening win over Penn State (Dec. 6). She also scored six points on a pair of three-pointers against No. 15 Iowa (Feb. 16).

Weaver made her regular-season Husker debut as a starter with four points, two rebounds, three assists, two steals and a block in Nebraska's 103-46 win over Northwestern State (Nov. 3). She added five points, three boards, two assists and four steals in an 80-46 win over Samford (Nov. 8), before pitching in six points on her first two three-pointers as a Husker in an 84-50 win over Creighton (Nov. 12).

She had four points, two rebounds, two steals and a career-high-tying two blocks in NU's 82-70 win over North Dakota State in Sioux Falls, S.D. (Nov. 16). She had four points, a season-high eight rebounds to go with two more blocks and a steal in a 103-58 run past ORU (Nov. 19).

against Loyola-Chicago (Nov. 29). The stretch began with back-to-back 15-point games to open the season, before she notched the only double-double of her career with 12 points and a career-high 13 rebounds against Florida State (Nov. 22). During the stretch, Weaver went 16-for-30 (.520) from three-point range, including 3-for-5 from beyond the arc on her way to 11 points against Notre Dame (Nov. 15, 2023).

She scored 11 points on 2-of-5 long-range shooting in a loss to the Huskers in Lincoln (Feb. 20).

For the season, Weaver averaged career bests of 7.9 points and 3.1 rebounds per game, while shooting 36 percent (32-89) from three-point range and 83.8 percent (31-37) from the free throw line.

She produced double figures in points 12 times, while starting 14 of 28 games. Weaver averaged 11.4 points and 4.2 rebounds while starting each of her first 10 games as a junior, but averaged 5.9 points and 2.4 rebounds while making just four starts over the last 18 games of the season.

## SOPHOMORE (2022-23)

Weaver's contributions increased during her second season at Northwestern. She played in 28 games for the Wildcats and averaged nearly 11 minutes per game off the bench.

Weaver averaged 3.0 points, 1.4 rebounds and 1.2 steals per game for the Wildcats. She erupted for a season-high 14 points on a career-best 3-of-4 three-pointers at Purdue (Feb. 12).

Two weeks later she added the second double-figure scoring effort of her college career when she pumped in 12 points on 2-of-5 three-pointers to go along with three steals and two assists in a loss at Nebraska (Feb. 26).

Over the last 10 regular-season games of 2022-23, Weaver averaged 5.2 points, 1.9 rebounds and 1.9 steals in just 15.7 minutes per game, after averaging 1.8 points, 1.2 rebounds and 0.8 steals in just under eight minutes per game through the first 17 contests of the season.

## FRESHMAN (2021-22)

Weaver played six games during her true freshman season at Northwestern. Her sporadic contributions came in each month of the regular season, playing in two games in November, one in December, one in January and two in late February. She hit a three-pointer against Nebraska in Lincoln on her only shot attempt in one minute of play (Feb. 27). She went 3-for-3 from three-point range in Big Ten play on the



road at Maryland (Jan. 23), at Illinois (Feb. 20) and at Nebraska (Feb. 27), scoring nine points in just nine total minutes over three Big Ten road games as a freshman.

Overall on the season, she totaled 14 points and four steals in just 21 minutes, while hitting 50 percent (4-8) of her shots, including 60 percent (3-5) of her three-point tries.

## HIGH SCHOOL

Weaver was named to the 2021 Jersey Mike's Naismith National High School Girls Trophy Watch List. She was ranked as the No. 35 overall recruit in the nation by ESPN. She was named second-team All-Ohio Division I as a senior at Solon High School after averaging 11.9 points per game as a senior. She claimed third-team All-Ohio honors as a sophomore in 2019 (15.0 ppg) and as a junior in 2020 (16.4 ppg).

She was also an academic honor roll selection throughout high school.

## PERSONAL

The daughter of Kevin and Stephanie Weaver, Hailey also was recruited by Michigan, Marquette, Pittsburgh, Kentucky and Miami out of high school. She earned her bachelor's degree from Northwestern in 2025. She is pursuing a graduate certificate in marketing analytics.

5-10 Graduate Guard Humphrey, Nebraska (Humphrey St. Francis)

The graduate student from the small Northeast Nebraska town of Humphrey (pop. 832) earned her bachelor's degree in child, youth and family studies in December 2024. A Big Ten Distinguished Scholar in 2025, she is a three-time Academic All-Big Ten selection.

Weidner had outstanding rehabs on both her left and right knees heading into 2024-25, before suffering a right knee injury in practice (Jan. 11, 2025) prior to Nebraska's road game at Rutgers. She underwent surgery on Jan. 28, 2025, and has had another excellent rehab.

The 5-10 guard averaged 10.2 points, 6.2 rebounds and 2.4 assists while starting Nebraska's first 13 games in 2022-23, before suffering a left ACL tear against No. 20 Kansas (Dec. 21, 2022). She was ready for the start of practice before the 2023-24 season, but suffered a right ACL tear in practice on Oct. 13, 2023.

Nebraska's Lifter of the Year in 2023-24, Weidner is one of the best all-around athletes in state history as a seven-time all-state selection in basketball (4) and volleyball (3) and an eight-time state champion in track and field.

In 10 career Big Ten starts as a freshman (8) and sophomore (2), Weidner helped Nebraska to a 7-3 record including a pair of wins over top-20 teams (No. 10 Michigan, No. 20 Maryland) away from Pinnacle Bank Arena. In those 10 starts, Weidner averaged 10.8 points, 4.4 rebounds and 3.6 assists.

### REDSHIRT JUNIOR (2024-25)

Weidner made her return to Nebraska's starting lineup with 11 points in a season-opening win over Omaha (Nov. 4). Weidner, who missed nearly two years with back-to-back knee injuries, added three rebounds, two steals and an assist in a team-high 24 minutes of action against the Mavs.

She matched her season highs with 11 points and six assists off the bench in Nebraska's win over No. 20 Michigan State (Jan. 8).

Weidner was averaging 3.8 points, 3.0 rebounds, 2.1 assists and 1.0 steal over 15 games before suffering a season-ending right knee injury in practice (Jan. 11). She underwent surgery on Jan. 28.

She had five points, three rebounds and two steals in a win over Chattanooga (Dec. 15). She grabbed a season-high seven rebounds in the win over Tarleton State (Dec. 11).

### REDSHIRT (2023-24)

Weidner was on track to return to Nebraska's starting lineup as a junior in 2023-24 before suffering a right knee injury in practice on Oct. 13. She underwent surgery on Oct. 25, and was with the Huskers on the sideline while redshirting in 2023-24.

Her recovery and rehab after surgery went well on her left knee before suffering her right knee injury just three weeks before the start of the 2023-24 regular season.

### SOPHOMORE (2022-23)

Weidner showed major improvements to her all-around game while taking on a greater leadership role in her second season. She averaged 10.2 points, 6.2 rebounds and 2.4 assists while starting each of Nebraska's first 13 games of 2022-23. She scored in double figures in four consecutive games before suffering a season-ending leg injury early in the fourth quarter of NU's triple-overtime win over No. 20 Kansas (Dec. 21). She underwent successful surgery on Jan. 10.

Weidner had 13 points, seven rebounds and three assists in a win over Wyoming (Dec. 18). It followed her second double-double of the season with 15 points, 11 rebounds and a career-high five steals in a win over Samford (Dec. 10).

She notched her first career double-double with 13 points and a career-high 15 rebounds in Nebraska's upset of No. 20 Maryland in College Park (Dec. 4). Weidner, who added five assists against the Terps, scored all 13 of her points and grabbed eight of her rebounds in the second half alone, as NU outscored Maryland 59-31 in the second half. Weidner's effort helped the Huskers secure their first-ever win over Maryland, which went on to advance to the NCAA Elite Eight.

Weidner added 13 points, five rebounds and seven assists in an 82-54 win over Wisconsin (Dec. 7) to help the Huskers improve to 2-0 in Big Ten play despite the absence of starters Isabelle Bourne, Trinity Brady and Sam Haiby - who all missed the game with injuries.

Weidner opened the season with 19 points and a then-career-high nine rebounds in a win over Omaha (Nov. 7). She made a career-high nine field goals in just 11 attempts against the Mavs. She added her second career 20-point

performance with 20 points and seven boards in a win over Houston Christian (Nov. 11).

She was injured on an offensive rebound on the first possession of the game against Tarleton (Nov. 22), but still finished the play with a bucket in the opening minute before she left the court. Weidner, who played 59 seconds, did not return to the game after suffering an eye injury. She did return to the starting lineup three days later in NU's win over Texas A&M-Corpus Christi at the Puerto Rico Clasico (Nov. 25). She had 13 points and five rebounds against the Islanders.

## FRESHMAN (2021-22)

Weidner joined Alexis Markowski as freshman starters in Nebraska's lineup down the stretch in 2021-22. Weidner averaged 7.2 points, 3.7 rebounds and 2.2 assists while playing in all 33 games for the 24-9 Huskers in 2021-22.

She moved into Nebraska's starting five for the final eight games of the season and started nine contests overall for the Huskers, who finished No. 23 in the NET rankings and advanced to the 2022 NCAA Tournament.

She produced the most memorable performance of her young career with a team-high 16 points, including two free throws with 5.5 seconds left to seal Nebraska's 76-73 victory over No. 10 Michigan in the Big Ten Tournament quarterfinals in Indianapolis (March 4). Weidner added three rebounds, two assists and two steals against the Wolverines to give Nebraska two wins over the eventual 2022 NCAA Elite Eight qualifiers.

Weidner put together her best game with a career-high 23 points and a career-best three threes in a 93-70 win over Minnesota (Feb. 20). She hit 8-of-10 shots from the field, including all three of her long-range attempts, while also going 4-for-4 from the free throw line against the Gophers. She added five rebounds.

She scored in double figures seven times on the season, including 11 points, eight rebounds and five assists in just 18 minutes off the bench in a win over Prairie View A&M (Nov. 11). She added 10 points, five boards and three assists in



a victory over Drake (Dec. 19), before producing her first double-digit effort in Big Ten play with 14 points and five rebounds off the bench in a win over Purdue (Jan. 30). She scored all 14 points in the first half against the Boilermakers.

Weidner matched that performance with 14 points, four rebounds, two assists and two steals in a win over Penn State (Feb. 3). She scored 10 points in the fourth quarter to help the Huskers turn a one-point lead into a 15-point win. Weidner also had 11 points, four rebounds, two assists and a steal in Nebraska's 72-55 run past No. 5 Indiana (Feb. 14). She hit 5-of-7 shots from the field, including her lone three-point attempt, to help the Huskers to their largest victory margin ever against a top-five team. The win over Indiana marked Weidner's last game off the bench in 2021-22.

In nine starts on the season, Weidner averaged 9.3 points, 4.4 rebounds and 3.0 assists. She made her first career start in place of an injured Sam Haiby at Iowa (Jan. 16), in a game the Huskers also played without starting guard Jaz Shelley (COVID protocols). Weidner finished with eight points, three rebounds, five assists and a block against the Hawkeyes.

Weidner made a solid debut with nine points in a win over Maine (Nov. 9) and threatened a triple-double with eight points, eight rebounds

and eight assists in just 18 minutes off the bench in a win over North Carolina Central (Nov. 20). Her eight rebounds and eight assists were both season highs.

## HIGH SCHOOL

One of the top small-school players in Nebraska history, Weidner finished her four-year high school career with 2,282 points, 741 assists and 629 steals. Her career point total ranked No. 3 across all classes in Nebraska girls basketball history, while she became just the 13th player in state history to score 2,000 career points. The star from Humphrey St. Francis High School was a four-time first-team Class D2 All-State selection for Coach Bryan Reichmuth. A first-team all-class, all-state pick by both the Omaha World-Herald and the Lincoln Journal Star as both a junior and senior, Weidner led the state in scoring with 25.0 points per game as a senior, while also leading the state with 6.4 assists per game. Her 6.4 steals per game also ranked second in the state across all classes, while she added 7.0 rebounds per contest. Weidner scored 71 points over three state tournament wins to lead Humphrey St. Francis to the state title.

As a junior, Weidner averaged 25.2 points, 6.1 rebounds, 6.5 assists and a whopping 7.3 steals per game in 2020. She also led the Flyers

to a state runner-up finish while earning a spot on the Class D2 All-Tournament team. She scored a state tournament-best 83 points over three games as a junior. She led St. Francis to a Class D2 state runner-up finish as a freshman and claimed her first selection to the all-tournament team. Weidner also guided the Flyers to a state tournament bid as a sophomore in 2019.

As a junior, Weidner nearly notched a quadruple-double with 28 points, 10 assists, 10 steals and nine rebounds against Elkhorn Valley. She also produced a triple-double with 29 points, 12 rebounds and 10 steals against Fullerton. In the 2020 state tournament, she erupted for a career-high 39 points against Mullen. She had 38 points against Howells/Dodge.

She also led the state in assists in both 2018 and 2019, while leading the state in steals in 2019.

Weidner played club basketball for the Nebraska Attack and Coach Zach Isherwood. She led the Attack to the championship of the Nike Tournament of Champions Session 2, Gold Division. The Nebraska Attack also finished fifth at Under Armour Nationals and won the Midwest Basketball Showcase.

Chosen as one of the top multi-sport athletes in the state by the Lincoln Journal Star in 2018-19, 2019-20 and 2020-21, Weidner was also a first-team all-stater in volleyball while leading St. Francis to a state runner-up finish as a junior in 2019. She was also an honorable-mention Class D2 all-state choice and led the Flyers to a third-place finish as a sophomore in 2018. She guided Humphrey St. Francis back to the state tournament as a senior in 2020.

On the track, Weidner swept the Class D2 state titles in the 400 and 800-meter runs in 2018, 2019 and 2021. She added two more state titles as a member of the 3,200-meter relay team as a sophomore and senior, after helping the 1,600-meter relay to a state runner-up finish as a freshman. Weidner also finished sixth in the triple jump as a senior. No state track and field championships were held in 2020 because of COVID-19.

She earned 11 letters across basketball, volleyball and track at St. Francis, capturing a total of 10 individual or team state championships.

Weidner was also a leader in the classroom at Humphrey St. Francis. She earned Academic All-State honors in basketball as a senior (winter 2021) and volleyball as a junior (fall 2019). She was a two-year member of the National Honor Society, serving as the group's treasurer as a senior. She was also a member in the Big Sisters Program at Humphrey St. Francis.

## PERSONAL

The daughter of Dan and Cathy Weidner, Allison was born in Norfolk, Neb. She has two older brothers, Brandon and Nathan. A child, youth and family studies major, Allison earned her bachelor's degree from Nebraska in December 2024. She was a 2025 Big Distinguished Scholar and a three-time Academic All-Big Ten pick. She is a seven-time Nebraska Scholar-Athlete Honor Roll selection and a four-time member of the Tom Osborne Citizenship Team. She also earned a prestigious Sam Foltz 27 Hero Leadership Award in 2025.

She tied career highs with 17 points and five three-pointers - all in the first half - in NU's 87-35 win over Omaha (Dec. 9).

Hake produced a 13-point effort on 3-of-6 three-point shooting in a win over Northwestern (Jan. 28). It was her eighth double-digit scoring performance of the season.

She opened the regular season with 13 points on 4-of-4 shooting from the field in a 103-46 win over Northwestern State (Nov. 3). Hake added 13 on 4-of-6 shooting, including 3-of-4 from long range, in NU's 84-50 win over Creighton (Nov. 12). She added a game-high four assists to go along with three rebounds against the Jays.

She scored 11 points on 3-of-5 three-point shooting in a win over Purdue (Jan. 4). She also drew two charges. She added 11 points, six assists, two rebounds and two steals in Nebraska's Emerald Coast Classic Beach Bracket championship game win over Virginia (Nov. 25).

Hake had 10 points while drawing two more charges against No. 4 UCLA (Jan. 11). She also put up 10 points to go with six rebounds, five assists, a steal and three charges drawn in an 87-56 win over Cal Baptist (Dec. 21).

Hake had eight points against No. 17 USC (Dec. 29) and eight more in a win over ORU (Nov. 19). She had a career-high eight assists while snagging two steals in a Big Ten-opening win over Penn State (Dec. 6).

She added seven points, seven rebounds and six assists with no turnovers in a 92-53 run past Bradley (Dec. 3). She also had seven points, four rebounds, five assists and her third career block in a win over Purdue Fort Wayne (Nov. 24).

Hake was counted on for leadership and stability in Nebraska's backcourt in her third season as a Husker in 2024-25.

Hake started 30 of NU's 33 games, helping lead the Big Red to a second consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance. She averaged 6.4 points, 3.0 rebounds, 3.1 assists and 1.3 steals.

Hake sank a pair of free throws with 11 seconds left to seal Nebraska's come-from-behind win over Illinois (March 6).

She tied career highs with 17 points and seven assists in a win over Oregon (Feb. 19). She hit back-to-back threes in overtime to help the Huskers overcome a 14-point third-quarter deficit.

She established a career high with 17 points in a win over North Alabama (Nov. 19), when she hit 5-of-7 shots from the field and all six of her free throws. She added five rebounds, two assists and two steals.

Hake contributed a strong effort with 16 points, a season-high six rebounds, four assists and two steals in a win over Penn State (Jan. 5).

She also had 16 points on a career-high five threes in a win over Kansas City (Nov. 26), before adding 12 points, six rebounds, three assists and a career-high four steals in a win over Lindenwood (Dec. 3).

She notched her seventh double-figure scoring performance with 15 points, including 12 in the second half, in Nebraska's 64-56 win over Purdue at the Big Ten Tournament (March 7). Hake averaged 8.3 points and 3.3 rebounds, while hitting 7-of-15 threes (.467) in Nebraska's run to a Big Ten Tournament runner-up finish.

Hake had 11 points and four rebounds at No. 5 Iowa (Jan. 27). She had a career-high-tying 16 points on 4-of-7 three-point shooting in NU's first-ever home win over Maryland (Dec. 31).

Hake scored 14 points and notched seven rebounds and three steals in a win over Alcorn State (Nov. 14). She opened the season with 12 points on perfect 4-for-4 three-point shooting in a win over Northwestern State (Nov. 6). She contributed 11 points and a career-high four assists in a win over Florida Atlantic (Nov. 29), before pitching in 10 points, five boards, a career-high-tying four assists and her first career block in a win over UNCW (Dec. 5). Hake added nine points on 3-of-5 three-point shooting in a Big Ten-opening win at Michigan State (Dec. 9).

## FRESHMAN (2022-23)

Hake was a regular contributor for the Nebraska women's basketball team as a true freshman in 2022-23.

She appeared in 31 of Nebraska's 33 games, while making her first career start in a victory at Purdue (Jan. 18). She scored eight points in place of Maddie Krull in Nebraska's 71-64 win over the Boilermakers. Hake, who averaged 4.3 points and 1.3 rebounds, produced four double-figure scoring efforts in a five-game span early in Big Ten play.

Hake put up a season-high 16 points on 4-of-6 three-point shooting in Nebraska's run past Penn State (Jan. 11). She opened the stretch with 11 points on 3-of-4 three-point shooting against No. 14 Michigan (Dec. 28), before capping the group of double-digit efforts with 11 more points on 3-of-6 three-point shooting against No. 3 Ohio State. She added 10 points on a pair of threes in an overtime setback at No. 4 Indiana (Jan. 1).

In NU's second-round WNIT win over Northern Iowa (March 19), Hake had six points, three rebounds and two assists off the bench after starter Sam Haiby suffered a lower leg injury that knocked her out for the rest of the game.

Hake scored six points on a pair of threes in wins over Houston Christian (Nov. 11) and Texas A&M-Corpus Christi (Nov. 25). She opened her career with three points, three rebounds, an assist and a steal in a win over Omaha (Nov. 7). She also knocked down a three-pointer at No. 20 Creighton (Nov. 15).

Overall, Hake connected on at least one three-pointer in 20 games, including nine games with multiple threes.

## HIGH SCHOOL

A four-time first-team All-Metro West Conference selection for the Storm, Hake was also a four-time Chanhassen team most valuable player. She captured Metro West Player-of-the-Year honors as a senior in 2021-22 after averaging 22.2 points per game. She became Chanhassen's first career 2,000-point scorer after a 26-point, 12-rebound performance against Cooper on Jan. 31, 2022. That performance followed a then-career-high and Chanhassen-record 37 points in a win over Waconia (Jan. 30). She topped that mark with 38 points in a win over New Prague (Feb. 18).

A McDonald's All-America Midwest nominee, Hake earned honorable-mention All-Metro accolades from the Minneapolis Star-Tribune as a senior. She was also named to the Metro West Conference All-Defensive Team before capping her high school career by playing in the Minnesota Girls Basketball Coaches Association All-Star Series. She claimed the MGBCA Three-Point Championship by draining 14 three-pointers in 45 seconds.

As a junior in a COVID-shortened 2020-21 season, Hake averaged 21.5 points per game. She averaged 22.2 points per game as a sophomore and 20.4 points per contest as a freshman at Class 4A Chanhassen.

She entered her junior season with high school career totals of 1,633 points, 442 rebounds, 147 steals and 120 assists. She added 599 points as a senior to finish with 2,232 career points.

Hake spent six years competing for the UAA Minnesota Fury, helping the team to a national runner-up finish. She was a first-team Minnesota AAU all-state selection in 2021.

She also earned three letters in track and field at Chanhassen. She was also involved as the DECA President and won the DECA Outstanding Student Award in 2021-22. She was also a two-year National Honor Society member and a four-year Key Club member.

## PERSONAL

The daughter of Chad and Jill Hake, Callin was born in Waconia, Minn. She has an older brother, Carson, who was a senior infielder for the North Dakota State baseball team in 2024.

A double-major in management and marketing at Nebraska, Callin was a College Sports Communicators Academic All-District VII selection in both 2024 and 2025. A 2025 Big Ten Distinguished Scholar, she claimed Academic All-Big Ten honors in both 2024 and 2025. She was also a member of the Chi Alpha Sigma Honor Society in 2025.

Hake has earned six spots on the Nebraska Scholar-Athlete Honor Roll and is a three-time member of the Tom Osborne Citizenship Team. She also captured a prestigious Sam Foltz 27 Hero Leadership Award in 2024. In 2025, Hake was Nebraska's Big Ten Outstanding Sportsmanship Award winner across all of its female sports, after being named the Nebraska women's basketball Big Ten Sportsmanship honoree.

The President of Nebraska's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee in 2024-25 and 2025-26, Hake is the chair of the Big Ten Conference Student-Athlete Issues Commission in 2025-26.

"I chose Nebraska because of the endless opportunities the University has to offer, the coaching staff and their visions and goals, and the tight bond the girls have on and off the court," Hake said. "Also, getting to play in the best conference and go out and battle every single night is something I have always wanted to do."

## SENIOR (2025-26)

Nebraska added size, experience and athleticism with the signing of Eliza Maupin (pronounced MOP-in) to its 2025-26 women's basketball roster, Husker Head Coach Amy Williams announced on Monday, April 14.

Maupin, a 6-3 forward from Webster Groves, Mo., joined the Huskers after playing in 33 games with two starts for Kansas State as a junior in 2024-25. Maupin hit 63.2 percent (55-87) of her shots from the field while averaging 3.9 points and 2.8 rebounds per game. She also dished out a career-high 29 assists and blocked a career-best 17 shots for the Wildcats.

She notched her fifth career double-double and second as a Husker with 13 points and a career-high 13 rebounds to go with a career-high four assists, two blocks and two steals at Wisconsin (Jan. 21).

Maupin posted her first Husker double-double with 12 points and a then-career-high-tying 11 rebounds in her first Nebraska start at No. 14 Iowa (Jan. 1).

Maupin, who is averaging career bests of 7.9 points and 4.4 rebounds, has produced double figures nine times this season, including 11 points and six rebounds against No. 15 Iowa (Feb. 16).

She produced 13 points on 4-of-5 shooting in a win over Purdue (Jan. 4). Maupin also had 10 points against No. 4 UCLA (Jan. 11), after getting nine points and seven rebounds in a win

3), before getting seven points, six boards and two assists in an 87-35 win over Omaha (Dec. 9).

Maupin made her NU debut with five points, four rebounds and a career-high-tying two blocks in an 84-50 win over Creighton (Nov. 12). She added eight points, three boards and two assists in a win over North Dakota State (Nov. 16). She missed NU's first two regular-season games and its exhibition win over Mount Marty (Oct. 24) because of a minor lower leg injury suffered in practice. She re-tweaked the injury prior to the opener with Northwestern State.

"We are so excited to welcome Eliza to the Husker women's basketball family," Williams said. "She has a winning mindset and strong desire to develop, which fits perfectly in our culture. Her length, athleticism, skillset and experience make her primed to excel on both sides of the ball within our system."

In three seasons at KSU, Maupin played in 98 games with three starts while converting 62.3 percent (157-252) of her field goal attempts. She totaled 390 points, 263 rebounds, 47 assists, 38 blocks and 49 steals. She averaged 4.0 points and 2.7 rebounds in 11.7 minutes per game as a Wildcat.

Maupin, who has scored in double figures 19 times, owns five career double-doubles.

She has been perfect from the field with at least five makes on four occasions in her career, including 7-for-7 at Texas (Feb. 4, 2024), 6-for-

6 at Baylor (Jan. 22, 2024), 6-for-6 against USC Upstate (Dec. 5, 2024) and 6-for-6 as a Husker against Purdue Fort Wayne (Nov. 24, 2025).

Maupin has appeared in three career NCAA Tournament games, scoring 11 total points on a combined 5-of-6 shooting (.833) while hitting her only free throw attempt in 18 total minutes.

### JUNIOR (2024-25)

Maupin played in 33 games with two starts as a junior for K-State, totaling 128 points, 92 rebounds and career season bests of 29 assists

## SOPHOMORE (2023-24)

As a sophomore in 2023-24, Maupin appeared in 29 games and averaged 4.0 points per game while shooting a career-best 68.7 percent (46-67) from the field. She added 2.3 rebounds per game. She notched her third career double-double with 15 points and a career-high 11 rebounds to go with three steals off the bench against UCF (Feb. 17). Maupin erupted for a career-high 18 points on 7-for-7 shooting in a career-high 30 minutes off the bench at Texas (Feb. 4). She added 16 points on 6-for-6 shooting, including her first career three-pointer, to go with nine rebounds in 29 minutes off the bench at Baylor (Jan. 22).

In Big 12 Conference play, Maupin hit an incredible 72.7 percent (32-44), including a five-game stretch midway through the conference season in which she hit 19-of-21 shots (.905) including her only career three-pointer.

The stretch started with a 3-for-3 effort against Kansas (Jan. 20), before she went 6-for-6 with a three-pointer to finish with 16 points and nine rebounds against Baylor (Jan. 22). Maupin hit 1-of-3 shots against BYU (Jan. 27), before going 2-for-2 against Oklahoma (Jan. 31) and 7-for-7 against Texas (Feb. 4) on her way to a career-high 18 points against the Longhorns.

## FRESHMAN (2022-23)

Maupin played in 36 games with one start as a true freshman for the Wildcats in 2022-23, averaging 4.1 points and 2.9 rebounds per game. She hit 57.1 percent of her shots from the field, while adding 15 blocked shots and 17 steals on the year.

She produced her first career double-double with 12 points and 10 rebounds in just 13 minutes of work in a win over Utah Tech (Nov. 20). She added her second double-double with 10 points and 10 rebounds in 22 minutes at TCU (Feb. 18).

Maupin just missed another double-double with 11 points and nine rebounds off the bench at West Virginia (Feb. 25).

She pumped in a season-high 14 points to go with five rebounds at Oklahoma (March 1) for her sixth double-figure scoring effort of her freshman campaign.

Maupin produced her final double-digit scoring performance of the season with 10 points on 5-of-6 shooting against Texas Tech at the Big 12 Tournament (March 9).

## HIGH SCHOOL

Maupin earned Missouri Class 5 All-State honors as a senior at Webster Groves High School in 2022 after averaging 15.3 points on 61 percent shooting, including 34 percent from three-point range. She added 7.5 rebounds, 2.1 assists and 1.7 rebounds on her way to Class 5 District 2 Player-of-the-Year honors and first-team All-Suburban Conference accolades.

As a junior in 2021, Maupin averaged 12.3 points and 5.3 rebounds while shooting 54 percent from the field and 47 percent from three-point range to help Webster Groves to a Missouri Class 6 state runner-up finish. She was also a significant contributor for the Stateswomen as a freshman and sophomore.

In addition to her exploits on the basketball court, Maupin was the Missouri Class 5 state high jump champion as a freshman in 2019 and as a junior in 2021. She also set the Webster Groves school record in the long jump.

### JUNIOR (2025-26)

Emily Fisher was one of four NCAA Division I transfers to join the Nebraska women's basketball program in the spring of 2025. The Huskers announced the signing of the 6-0 guard/forward on April 16.

Fisher, who spent her first two collegiate seasons at Maryland, comes to Lincoln after playing 52 games with the Terrapins.

She made a strong Husker debut with a career-high-tying nine points and a career-high four steals to go along with a career-high-matching three assists in a 103-46 win over Northwestern State (Nov. 3). She added four rebounds and a block for the Big Red in 20 minutes off the bench.

She produced a six-point effort in just four first-half minutes at No. 8 Michigan (Feb. 4). Fisher converted a traditional three-point play before knocking down her first three-pointer of the season late in the half to help Nebraska take a 44-42 lead to halftime.

Fisher added five points on perfect shooting in 14 minutes in her first Big Ten appearance at No. 14 Iowa (Jan. 1).

In 76 minutes in Big Ten play this season, Fisher has produced 22 points and 12 rebounds. She contributed a traditional three-point play in 11 minutes in Nebraska's Big Ten win over Northwestern (Jan. 28).

She had a season-high six rebounds to go with two assists, a steal and a block in eight minutes in NU's 87-35 win over Omaha (Dec. 9). She added two points, two rebounds, two assists

and two steals in 10 minutes in an 85-44 win over Illinois State (Dec. 14).

She did not play in Nebraska's exhibition win over Mount Marty (Oct. 24) because of a minor lower leg injury suffered in practice. Fisher also missed NU's wins over Samford (Nov. 8) and Creighton (Nov. 12) with a separate lower body injury suffered in practice after the win over Northwestern State.

Fisher returned for 90 seconds in the win over North Dakota State (Nov. 16), before getting two points and a rebound in 11 minutes of NU's 103-58 win over ORU (Nov. 19).

She did not play in Nebraska's Emerald Coast Classic wins over Purdue Fort Wayne and Virginia (Nov. 24-25), but returned to the court for seven minutes in a win over Bradley (Dec. 3).

"We had a strong relationship with Emily from her recruitment out of high school and believe that she fits perfectly with our tough, hard-nosed, gritty, hard-working culture here at Nebraska," Husker Head Coach Amy Williams said. "She brings a versatility and a willingness to guard almost any position on the floor. We are excited to have her spend her remaining two years here in Lincoln."

Fisher played her best game of the season in Maryland's 91-71 loss to Nebraska in College Park. Fisher finished with a season-high eight points, including her first career made three-pointer. She added a season-high two assists against the Big Red.

### SOPHOMORE (2024-25, MARYLAND)

As a sophomore, Fisher missed 11 games with a concussion, but averaged 1.7 points and

### JUNIOR (2025-26)

One of the Big Ten's most consistent long-range shooters, Logan Nissley returns for her third season as a Husker ready to help lead an experienced Big Red backcourt.

Through 25 games, Nissley has averaged 8.8 points, 2.3 rebounds and 2.6 assists despite being limited by minor injuries. She also has moved to No. 7 on Nebraska's career three-point list with 167 made.

Nissley pumped in a career-high 22 points on a career-best 6-of-12 three-point shooting against No. 22 Maryland (Feb. 7). Her previous season high came with 15 points to go with three assists in a Big Ten win over Illinois (Jan. 24), before adding 14 points, on 4-of-6 three-point shooting in a win over Northwestern (Jan. 28). She added a season-best five rebounds against the Wildcats.

Nissley added 15 points, five rebounds and

five assists in a gutsy effort while battling illness at Oregon (Feb. 19).

She pitched in 14 points on 4-of-6 shooting in NU's 101-83 win at Penn State (Dec. 6). Nissley drained three three-pointers in a 2:30 span in the fourth quarter to help NU pull away down the stretch with the highest scoring period (36) in school history.

Nissley, who owns 12 double-figure scoring efforts on the year, put up 12 points and four assists at Minnesota (Feb. 12).

She contributed 11 points - all in the fourth quarter with three threes - to help Nebraska pull away in a win over Purdue Fort Wayne (Nov. 24). She followed with four assists in an Emerald Coast Classic Beach Bracket championship game win over Virginia (Nov. 25). She added 11 points at No. 11 Ohio State (Feb. 1). Nissley had 11 points against No. 4 UCLA when she went 3-for-5 from long range. She also had 11 points in a Big Ten win over Indiana (Jan. 8).

She scored 10 points in a season-high 29 minutes against No. 17 USC (Dec. 29). She had 10 points, five boards and a career-high seven assists in a win over Bradley (Dec. 3).

Nissley opened the season with eight points, three rebounds and two assists off the bench in a 103-46 win over Northwestern State (Nov. 3). She added eight points and two steals in an 87-35 win over Omaha (Dec. 9). She had eight more to go with five rebounds, two steals and

her second block of the year in an 87-56 win over Cal Baptist (Dec. 21).

She did not play in Nebraska's wins over Samford (Nov. 8) and Creighton (Nov. 12) because of a lower leg injury. She returned with three points, two rebounds and an assist in a win over North Dakota State (Nov. 16), before getting seven points, two rebounds and three assists in less than 14 minutes in a 103-58 win over Oral Roberts (Nov. 19).

Last year, Nissley was a primary starter in the Husker backcourt despite being limited by foot injuries. She averaged 7.0 points, 2.7 rebounds and 2.6 assists. While her scoring and rebounding numbers were similar to her

season-high 34 minutes. She also went 4-for-6 from long range on her way to 12 points and a career-high six assists in a win over Northwestern (Feb. 20), after going 4-for-5 from beyond the arc in a win over Southern (Dec. 17). Nissley established her season best by hitting 4-of-6 threes on her way to a career-high 18 points in a win over UNCW (Dec. 5).

The three-time North Dakota Gatorade High School Player of the Year matched her career scoring high with 18 points in a road win at Purdue (Feb. 17) in her first career start. Nissley helped Nebraska rally from a 10-point first-quarter deficit by scoring 11 first-half points and NU's first six points of the second half.

Nissley averaged 9.2 points, 2.3 rebounds and 1.9 assists while hitting 42.9 percent (21-49) of her three-pointers in 10 games as a starter.

She also erupted for one of her best efforts of the season with 15 points and a career-high seven rebounds in 24 minutes in Nebraska's 82-79 upset of No. 2 Iowa (Feb. 11), just two games prior to making her starting debut.

Nissley produced 12 double-figure scoring efforts on the season, including 11 points - all in the third quarter - of Nebraska's 73-61 Big Ten quarterfinal win over Michigan State (March

8). She notched six double-figure efforts in the final 12 games beginning with her 12-point performance in the win over No. 2 Iowa (Feb. 11).

Nissley notched her first double-figure effort with 10 points in a win over Alcorn State (Nov. 14). She added 11 points in 12 minutes against TCU (Nov. 25), before pumping in 11 points in 13 minutes in a win over Georgia Tech (Dec. 2). Nissley hit three threes against the Yellow Jackets, including back-to-back fourth-quarter threes to turn a two-point NU deficit into a four-point lead the Huskers never relinquished. She added 13 points on 3-of-6 three-point shooting against No. 14 Indiana (Jan. 7).

## HIGH SCHOOL

A three-time North Dakota basketball state player of the year, Nissley averaged 20.8 points, 7.4 rebounds, 2.5 assists and 3.9 steals as a senior in 2022-23. She helped the Patriots to a state runner-up finish for the second straight year, while closing her career with 1,664 points.

22. She led Bismarck Century to a 50-game winning streak over two seasons before claiming a state runner-up finish in 2022. In the 2022 Class A state championship game, Nissley put up 32 points, 11 rebounds and four assists.

As a sophomore in 2020-21, Nissley powered Bismarck Century to a state title to win Gatorade and MaxPreps North Dakota Player of the Year honors after producing school records with 556 points (21.4 ppg), 100 assists and 93 steals while hitting 46.4 percent of her three-point attempts.

A four-time volleyball letterwinner, Nissley captured back-to-back North Dakota Volleyball Player of the Year awards in 2021 and 2022. She finished her career with more than 1,000 career kills and 1,000 career digs. As a senior, she recorded 361 digs, 357 kills, 34 blocks and 19 service aces while leading the Patriots to their second straight volleyball state championship.

Nissley played her club basketball for North Tartan - the same program as former Huskers Sam Haiby and Annika Stewart.

## PERSONAL

The daughter of Brad and Ashley Nissley, Logan was born in Bismarck, N.D. She has a younger brother, Garrett. A child, youth and family studies major, Logan was an Academic All-District VII selection by the College Sports Communicators in 2025. She was also a Big Ten Distinguished Scholar and an Academic All-Big Ten choice following her sophomore season.

A three-time Nebraska Scholar-Athlete Honor Roll selection, Nissley was also a member of the Tom Osborne Citizenship Team in 2024 and 2025.

She selected Nebraska over Gonzaga, Minnesota, Utah and Iowa.

"I chose Nebraska because of the family culture the girls brought to me when I visited," Nissley said. "The program itself and the facilities are amazing, but it felt like my second home and I knew it was meant for me. The coaches were unmatched and were by far my favorite because they cared about me as a person not just an athlete."

Petrie, who owns 16 double-figure scoring efforts this season, put up her second-best scoring total with 18 points and seven rebounds in a Big Ten win over Indiana (Jan. 8).

She added 17 points, five rebounds, two assists, two steals and a block at No. 14 Iowa (Jan. 1). She also had 17 points, four rebounds and two steals in an 87-56 run past Cal Baptist to close non-conference play (Dec. 21).

Petrie produced a 15-point, six-rebound effort in a Big Ten win over Illinois (Jan. 24).

She added 14 points with a career-high four three-pointers while adding a career-best three steals at Minnesota (Feb. 12). Petrie also had 14 points, seven rebounds and two blocks in an 87-35 run past Omaha (Dec. 9).

Petrie put up 12 points off the bench at Oregon (Feb. 19). She also had 12 points, three rebounds, four assists and two blocks in a win over North Dakota State (Nov. 16).

## JUNIOR (2025-26)

Australian National Program member Jessica Petrie (pronounced PEA-tree) returns for her third season inside for the Huskers. The 6-2 forward from Gold Coast, Australia, filled the void inside at power forward left by the season-ending injury to the 2024 Big Ten Freshman of the Year Natalie Potts in November 2024. Petrie started 23 games for the Big Red as a sophomore alongside four-time All-Big Ten center Alexis Markowski. Petrie averaged 6.4 points and 4.4 rebounds to help Nebraska to its second straight NCAA Tournament.

Through 25 games in 2025-26, Petrie is averaging 11.4 points, 4.6 rebounds, 1.2 assists, 1.0 steal and 1.0 block. She missed Nebraska's win over Northwestern (Jan. 28) and did not make the trip to No. 11 Ohio State (Feb. 1) because of illness.

She returned to action in a somewhat limited role off the bench at No. 8 Michigan (Feb. 4).

Petrie notched her first double-double of the year and second of her career with 15 points and 10 rebounds in a 92-53 win over Bradley (Dec. 3).

three-pointer with 1:36 left to help the Huskers rally from a nine-point third-quarter deficit.

She averaged 8.7 points and 3.7 rebounds in the tournament while hitting 12-of-19 shots (.632) from the field.

Petrie closed the season with six points and three assists against Louisville in the NCAA Tournament first round (March 21).

She surged in the heart of conference play, producing her third straight double-figure scoring effort with a career-high 15 points to go with seven rebounds and three assists in a win over Wisconsin (Jan. 20). Petrie hit 6-of-8 shots, including a career-best 3-of-4 three-pointers against the Badgers.

It followed a 13-point, six-board effort in a road win at Iowa (Jan. 16). She started the stretch with 12 points and a career-high nine rebounds in a win at Rutgers (Jan. 12).

She closed the regular season with back-to-back double-digit scoring efforts, including 11 points, eight rebounds and a career-high seven assists in a win at Northwestern (March 2). She added her second start against Kansas City (Nov. 26), before making her third start at No. 1 UCLA. She finished with seven points against the Bruins, while wearing jersey No. 45 instead her red No. 12, which was damaged. and nine rebounds in a win over Hungary.

At the 2022 FIBA U16 Asian Championship in Amman, Jordan, June 24-30, Petrie averaged eight points, five rebounds and four assists. In the championship game against Japan, Petrie finished with 12 points, six rebounds and a game-high six assists to help the Sapphires to a 59-58 victory. Her performance against Japan followed a near triple-double in a semifinal win over Korea, when she produced 13 points, nine rebounds and 10 assists.

Petrie also starred at Lake Ginninderra College, leading the Lakers to the Australian Schools Championship at Gold Coast in December of 2022. Petrie was named to the tournament's all-star five and was the Defensive MVP of the tournament. She averaged 23.8 points, 16.8 rebounds and 6.4 assists at the tournament.

## PERSONAL

The daughter of Anthony and Sarah (Berry) Petrie, Jessica has younger sisters, Emma and Holly, and a younger brother, William.

Jessica's father was a long-time forward (2007-18) in Australia's NBL, helping the Adelaide 36ers to NBL Grand Final appearances in both 2014 and 2016. In 2009-10, he was second-team All-NBL and was named the NBL's Most Improved Player. He is currently coaching for the Gold Coast Rollers in NBL1. Her mother, Sarah, was a two-time WNBL champion with the Canberra Capitals.

Jess is majoring in communication studies and earned Academic All-District VII honors from the College Sports Communicators in 2025. She also earned Academic All-Big Ten recognition and claimed an Arthur Ashe Jr. Sports Scholar Award in 2025. She is a four-time member of the Nebraska Scholar-Athlete Honor Roll and has been named to the Tom Osborne Citizenship Team on two occasions.

Petrie closed the regular season with a solid seven-point performance at Illinois (March 3).

She competed for Australia in three different age divisions (U16, U17, U18) in the summer of 2022 and at the U19 World Cup in Madrid, Spain (July 15-23, 2023).

Petrie, from Gold Coast, Queensland, averaged 17.6 points, 9.1 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 1.1 steals through seven games for the Basketball Centre of Excellence in Australia's semi-professional NBL1 East Division in 2023.

## HIGH SCHOOL

Petrie starred at three levels for the Australian National Team in the summer of 2022. She averaged 7.0 points, 5.0 rebounds and 2.0

assists over five games for the Australian U18 National Team at the FIBA Asian Championship in Bengaluru, India in September. She helped the Australia Gems to a gold medal with a championship game win over China. In a semifinal victory over Taipei, Petrie produced 11 points and three rebounds, after getting eight points, eight rebounds and three assists in a win over Korea.

Her performance at the U18 level followed a seven-game stint with the Australian U17 National Team at the World Cup in Debrecen, Hungary, July 9-17, 2022. She averaged 12.3 points, 8.1 rebounds and 2.4 assists, posting double-doubles against both Belgium and Spain before capping the World Cup with 15 points

Potts was replaced in the Husker lineup by classmate Jessica Petrie, and Potts continued to play an integral role in Nebraska's season. Not only did she help keep the Huskers focused on their run to the NCAA Tournament from the sideline, she focused herself on a diligent rehab after surgery.

"Natalie is a great fit for us both on and off the basketball court," Nebraska Coach Amy Williams said. "She has an incredible motor, and her competitive spirit matches the values we have for our team. She is versatile and a proven winner from one of the most successful high school programs in the country."

### OUTLOOK (2025-26)

Natalie Potts hoped to return to the Nebraska lineup in her third year as a Husker, but announced on Jan. 29 that she will not return to the court competitively in 2025-26. She will redshirt and plans to return in 2026-27 with a possibility of three years of eligibility.

The 6-2 redshirt sophomore from O'Fallon, Mo., suffered a season-ending knee injury in Nebraska's fifth game of 2024-25.

Through the first four games last season, the 2024 Big Ten Freshman of the Year was performing at an all-conference level, averaging team bests of 17.5 points and 8.0 rebounds while shooting nearly 70 percent from the field, including 72.7 percent from three-point range.

## SOPHOMORE (2024-25)

Potts was the only Husker to score in double figures in each of NU's first four games of 2024-25, before being sidelined by a season-ending knee injury against North Alabama in Nebraska's fifth game (Nov. 19).

She tied her career high with 22 points on 8-of-10 shooting to go with seven rebounds in just 23 minutes in a record-setting win over South Dakota (Nov. 16).

It followed her sixth career double-double with 17 points and a game-high 12 rebounds in a win over Southern (Nov. 12). Potts also put up 17 points to go with seven rebounds on a career-best 4-of-5 three-point shooting in a win over Southeastern Louisiana (Nov. 9).

Potts opened 2024-25 with 14 points in an 88-48 run past Omaha (Nov. 4). She added six rebounds, an assist, a block and a steal.

She underwent knee surgery Dec. 4, 2024.

## FRESHMAN (2023-24)

The 2024 Big Ten Freshman of the Year as voted by the conference coaches, Potts was a unanimous choice on the Big Ten All-Freshman Team and claimed honorable-mention All-Big Ten accolades from the league media.

The eight-time Big Ten Freshman of the Week ranked among the top freshman scorers (10.2

ppg) and rebounders (5.5 rpg) in the conference. She started all 35 games for the Huskers, which set the school record for most consecutive starts by a freshman in school history. Potts was one of only 10 freshmen in Husker history to start every game.

Potts produced five double-doubles in her rookie campaign, including 15 points, 11 rebounds and three blocks in a Big Ten quarterfinal win over Michigan State (March 8).

Potts, who tied the Nebraska Big Ten Tournament record with nine blocks over four games, followed with her second career 20-point performance, just missing a double-double with 21 points and nine rebounds in the Big Ten Championship Game against No. 3 Iowa (March 10). It was her 20th game scoring in double figures in 2023-24.

She produced game highs of 18 points, including 13 in the third quarter, and 10 rebounds in Nebraska's win over Northwestern (Feb. 20).

She led the Huskers with game highs of 13 points and 10 boards in a win over Michigan (Jan. 17). Potts produced 17 points and a career-high 13 rebounds in NU's first-ever win over Maryland (Dec. 31). She had 13 points and 12 boards in the second half alone against the Terps. She also went 7-for-7 at the line, including 4-for-4 in the final 45 seconds to seal the win.

She followed with 16 points - all in the second half - in NU's win at Wisconsin (Jan. 4). She had an 11-point, six-rebound effort that included a career-high four steals in a win over Purdue (Jan. 31), before adding 12 big points in a win at Michigan (Feb. 6).

Potts produced a 14-point, six-rebound effort in Nebraska's upset of No. 2 Iowa (Feb. 11) when she had eight points and five rebounds to spark a comeback from a 14-point fourth-quarter deficit. She earned her sixth Big Ten freshman honor on Feb. 12.

She claimed her seventh freshman award by averaging 15.0 points, 8.5 rebounds and 2.0 steals in wins over Northwestern (Feb. 20) and Minnesota (Feb. 24) to close out Nebraska's home schedule with a pair of wins.

Potts, who produced six double-digit rebound efforts, led Nebraska and all Big Ten freshmen with her .489 field goal percentage. She also ranked among Big Ten freshman leaders with her 82.9 free throw percentage (63-76).

She produced 11 double-digit scoring games in Big Ten play and two more in the Big Ten Tournament.

She notched her first career double-double with 12 points and 12 boards in a win over FAU (Nov. 29), before adding 13 points in a win over Georgia Tech (Dec. 2). She closed NU's three-game stand with 11 points and eight rebounds in a win over UNCW (Dec. 5).

Potts opened her college career with 10 points, five rebounds, an assist, a block and two steals in a win over Northwestern State (Nov. 6). She was even better in her first road game, going for 15 points on 6-of-7 shooting, including a three-pointer, while adding two more steals and a block in a win at Wyoming (Nov. 10) to capture the inaugural Big Ten Freshman-of-the-Week award of 2023-24 (Nov. 13).

After getting seven points, 11 rebounds and a career-high three blocks against Alcorn State (Nov. 14), she pumped in 16 points against No. 22 Creighton (Nov. 19).

Potts led NU to a win over Lamar with a career-high 22 points on 9-of-10 shooting at the St. Pete Showcase. Potts earned her second Big Ten Freshman of the Week (Nov. 27).

Potts pitched in 10 points, five boards and two blocks in a win at Michigan State (Dec. 9) on her way to her third Big Ten Freshman of the Week honor (Dec. 11).

She claimed her fourth Big Ten honor (Jan. 8) after averaging 12.5 points, 4.5 rebounds, 2.5 assists and 2.0 steals against Wisconsin and No. 14 Indiana. Potts added a fifth weekly honor (Jan. 15) by averaging 9.0 points, 4.5 rebounds and 2.0 steals against Illinois and Minnesota.

## HIGH SCHOOL

Potts averaged 18.7 points, 7.4 rebounds and 2.9 assists per game as a senior for Incarnate Word Academy in Bel Nor, Mo., which won its sixth consecutive Missouri state championship in 2023. She capped her career with a 32-0 record, a third straight Class 6 state title and a No. 6 final national ranking from MaxPreps.

The two-time Missouri High School Player of the Year, Potts showed explosive all-around ability, while providing a winning attitude.

Potts led Incarnate Word Academy to three consecutive Missouri state championships (no 2020 state tournament because of COVID-19) and a nation's best 100-game winning streak to close her prep career. She led the Red Knights to a 117-4 record during her four high school seasons, including a 32-0 mark in Class 6, as Incarnate Word finished No. 6 nationally by MaxPreps and No. 10 in the final ESPN SCNext national rankings in 2022-23.

Potts captured Missouri MaxPreps Player of the Year honors in both 2021 and 2023, while adding a Gatorade Player of the Year award as a sophomore in 2021. She was also the St. Louis Post-Dispatch Metro Player of the Year in both 2021 and 2023.

Potts closed her high school career with 2,108 points and 1,008 rebounds in four seasons - just the third player in Missouri high school history to reach the combined milestones of 2,000 points and 1,000 boards.

She produced 19.3 points, 8.6 rebounds, 3.3 assists and 1.5 blocks per game while hitting 61.9 percent of her shots from the floor as a junior to lead Missouri Hall of Fame Head Coach Dan Rolfes' team to a 32-0 record, another Class 6 state championship and recognition as the Blue Star Media 25 national champion in 2021-22.

Potts averaged 20.7 points and 9.3 rebounds as a sophomore to earn Gatorade and MaxPreps Missouri Player-of-the-Year honors after leading Incarnate Word Academy to a Class 6 state championship in 2021. She was also the St. Louis Metro Area Player of the Year. Incarnate Word Academy finished No. 20 in the final espnW national rankings with a perfect 29-0 record.

She also broke the Incarnate Word Academy single-game scoring record with 40 points on 19-of-21 shooting in a win over Ladue on Feb. 3, 2021. The previous record was held by two-time UConn first-team All-American Napheesa Collier. Potts finished her career with four 30-point games and 36 career double-doubles.

Potts opened her high school career with averages of 10.1 points and 8.3 rebounds as a freshman in 2019-20.

Potts, who played AAU basketball for Phee Elite, was ranked as the No. 1 recruit in the state of Missouri by Prep Girls Hoops.

The daughter of Eric and Sharon Potts, Natalie was born in St. Louis, Mo. She has an older brother, Kyle, and a sister, Sarah. Natalie

is a management major and earned Academic All-Big Ten recognition in 2025. She is also a three-time Nebraska Scholar-Athlete Honor Roll selection.

A two-time member of the Tom Osborne Citizenship Team, Potts is also a representative on the Nebraska Student-Athlete Advisory Committee in 2025-26.

She selected Nebraska over Gonzaga.

"I chose Nebraska because I loved the community and the family feel. Everything about the campus and the town was what I wanted," Potts said. "The coaching staff and the team are just super sweet and welcoming and just a good group of people to be around."

Bozan put up a then-career-high 13 points to go with six rebounds, two steals and a block in an 80-46 win over Samford (Nov. 8). She opened the regular season with 11 points and three rebounds in her first career start in a 103-46 win over Northwestern State (Nov. 3).

Bozan had eight points on 4-of-5 shooting to go with four rebounds in an 87-56 win over Cal Baptist to close non-conference play (Dec. 21). She also eight points and three rebounds in an 87-35 run past Omaha (Dec. 9). She had eight points, four rebounds and a career-high three assists at No. 15 Michigan State (Jan. 15).

Through 27 games, she is averaging 6.9 points and 3.4 rebounds.

## SOPHOMORE (2025-26)

Croatian Petra Bozan (pronounced PET-ruh, BO-jahn) is coming off a strong summer with the Croatian U20 National Team and hopes to work her way into a prominent role inside for the Huskers as a sophomore in 2025-26.

Bozan, a 6-3 forward from Split, Croatia, was the primary backup to four-time All-Big Ten center Alexis Markowski in 2024-25, averaging 5.3 points and 2.8 rebounds while playing all 33 games for NCAA Tournament-bound NU.

Bozan produced the best week of her career by averaging 14.5 points and 6.5 rebounds in Nebraska wins over Bradley and Penn State. She capped the week with a career-high 17 points on 8-of-12 shooting in NU's Big Ten-opening road win over the Lady Lions. She scored 11 straight points, including NU's first nine points of the fourth quarter to help the Huskers surge to a 101-83 win with a 36-point final period.

She opened the week with 12 points and nine boards in a 92-53 run past Bradley (Dec. 3).

Bozan notched her eighth double-figure scoring effort of the season and fourth in Big Ten play with 11 points on 5-of-6 shooting in a start at Oregon (Feb. 19). She also had 12 points on 4-of-6 shooting and a perfect 4-for-4 effort at the free throw line at No. 8 Michigan (Feb. 4). She added 11 points and four boards in a win over Illinois (Jan. 24).

She had team highs of 14 points, six rebounds and three blocks in just 17 minutes in NU's 85-44 win over Illinois State (Dec. 14).

She scored 11 points on 4-for-4 shooting including a pair of three-pointers in a win over Southeastern Louisiana (Nov. 9), before adding 10 points on 5-of-7 shooting in a win over Lindenwood (Dec. 3). among all players in the 16-team tournament in scoring (16.1 ppg) and third in rebounding (10.0 rpg). She added 1.6 blocks and 1.3 assists.

Against Turkey (Aug. 8), Bozan erupted for 25 points, 17 rebounds and two blocks in 36 minutes, going 10-of-16 from the field, including 3-of-6 from three-point range. She added a second double-double with 16 points and 12 rebounds in a win over Poland (Aug. 4), before putting up her first of two 20-point performances in the tournament with 21 points to go with nine rebounds against Belgium (Aug. 5).

For the tournament, Bozan hit 48 percent of her field goal attempts, including 27.3 percent (6-22) of her threes, while knocking down 72.2 percent (13-18) of her free throws.

During the 2023-24 season, Bozan competed for KAZL Split in Croatia's Premier League, averaging 15.6 points, 12.0 rebounds, 2.5 assists, 1.7 steals and 1.7 blocked shots over 22 games, to earn second-team All-Premier League honors. She hit 54.5 percent of her field goals and 73.6 percent of her free throws, helping KAZL Split to a 17-5 record. Her performances included a

season-high 31 points on 14-of-21 shooting to go along with 10 rebounds and seven steals in a win over Zagreb (Oct. 28, 2023). It was one of her 17 double-doubles during the 22-game Premier League regular season. She pulled down a season-high 19 rebounds against Brod na Savi (Nov. 4, 2023).

Bozan averaged 12.4 points, 9.0 rebounds and 3.4 assists for Croatia at the 2023 FIBA U18 European Championships. Her efforts in Sofia, Bulgaria included double-doubles against Greece and Macedonia before adding a third double-double with 20 points, 11 rebounds and four assists in the title game win over Luxembourg. She earned a spot on the tournament's All-Star Five to propel Croatia to the championship of Division B.

She also represented Croatia at the 2022 FIBA U16 European Championships in Portugal, averaging 13.6 points and a tournament-best 15.0 rebounds over seven games. She led Croatia to a third-place finish, including a 16-point, 13-rebound effort against Spain in the semifinals. She produced six double-doubles, including a 19-point, 15-rebound effort in a win over Italy, and a huge 14-point, 23-rebound performance in a win over Finland. She also averaged 2.4 blocks and 1.7 steals.

She added a 21-point effort on 9-of-11 shooting at No. 15 Michigan State. She scored nine of NU's final 13 points to rally the Huskers from a 62-58 deficit to a 69-66 lead before NU fell on the road in the final seconds.

Hargrove had 15 points and a game-high eight rebounds in an 87-56 win over Cal Baptist (Dec. 21). She added 15 points and five rebounds on 7-of-10 shooting at Wisconsin (Jan. 21).

Hargrove, who has scored in double figures 18 times this season, including six times in seven games as a starter, put up 13 points on just five field goal attempts, including 3-of-3 three-point shooting in a Big Ten win over Purdue (Jan. 4). She had missed the previous game against No. 14 Iowa (Jan. 1) in the concussion protocol after being struck in the head twice in the fourth quarter in a loss to No. 17 USC (Dec. 29).

Hargrove had 12 points against No. 4 UCLA (Jan. 11). She had 11 points and five boards in an 85-44 win over Illinois State (Dec. 14). She also had 11 points, nine boards and a career-high three assists in a win over Omaha (Dec. 9).

She earned a spot on the Emerald Coast Classic Beach Bracket All-Tournament Team after putting up 17 points, eight rebounds and two steals in 26 minutes off the bench to help the Huskers to a championship game win over Virginia (Nov. 25).

It followed an 11-point, six-rebound game in a win over Purdue Fort Wayne (Nov. 24), as Hargrove averaged 14.0 points, 7.0 rebounds and 1.5 steals in two tournament games.

## SOPHOMORE (2025-26)

A 6-2 forward from Illinois, Amiah Hargrove is hoping to make a significant impact to Nebraska's fortunes in 2025-26.

As a true freshman for the Huskers, Hargrove appeared in all 33 games with two starts and averaged 4.7 points and 3.7 rebounds per game to help Nebraska to the NCAA Tournament.

Through 26 games, Hargrove is averaging 12.5 points and a team-best 5.6 rebounds in 23 minutes per game. She came off the bench in Nebraska's first 20 games this season before starting the past seven contests. Her first starts came in place of Jessica Petrie, who was battling illness.

Hargrove has averaged 13.1 points and 5.7 rebounds in 26 minutes per game as a starter, including a double-double in a win over Northwestern (Jan. 28) and the second-highest scoring total of her career with 24 points at No. 11 Ohio State (Feb. 1). It was her third 20-point scoring effort of the season.

She added 16 points and eight rebounds at No. 8 Michigan (Feb. 4) after notching her second double-double of the season with 13 points and a career-high-matching 11 rebounds in her first start of the season in the win over

She had 13 points and six rebounds in just 13 minutes in NU's 92-53 win over Bradley (Dec. 3).

Hargrove produced her second career double-double with 12 points and 11 rebounds to go along with a career-high three steals in an 80-46 win over Samford (Nov. 8). Hargrove led Nebraska with a career-high 17 points on perfect shooting while adding a team-high seven rebounds off the bench in a win over North Dakota State (Nov. 16).

In a key Big Ten win over Indiana (Jan. 8), Hargrove had nine points and six rebounds. She added six points and five boards in an 84-50 win over Creighton (Nov. 12) and six points and six rebounds in a 103-58 win over ORU (Nov. 19).

Nebraska Coach Amy Williams said Hargrove has a ton of upside in her basketball future.

"Amiah is a high achiever in everything she pursues, and we could not be more thrilled to be

welcoming her to the Husker family," Williams said. "Her size and athleticism combined with her versatile skill set make her the perfect fit for our team on the court. ## FRESHMAN (2024-25)

Hargrove produced the best game of her young career with her first double-double in a road win at Iowa (Jan. 16). She scored 10 points on 3-of-4 shooting, including a pair of threes, while adding career highs of 11 rebounds and two blocks against the Hawkeyes. She also played a career-high 28 minutes in the overtime victory to help the Huskers to their first win in Iowa City since 2018.

She nearly notched another double-double with 10 points and nine rebounds in just 17 minutes off the bench in Nebraska's NCAA Tournament first-round battle with Louisville in Fort Worth, Texas (March 21). Hargrove hit 3-of-5 shots, including a three-pointer, while going 3-for-4 at the free throw line against the Cardinals. She also pulled down four offensive boards, while adding an assist and a steal.

For the season, she averaged 4.7 points and 3.7 rebounds per game while hitting 50 percent (17-34) of her three-pointers and 81.6 percent (31-38) of her free throws. She played in all 33 games with a pair of starts. In 18 conference games, Hargrove's numbers were nearly identical, averaging 4.6 points and 3.8 rebounds while shooting 51.8 percent from the field including 52.9 percent (9-17) from three-point range in 14 minutes per game.

She opened the Big Ten Tournament by tying her career high with 13 points while adding four rebounds in a first-round win over Rutgers (March 5).

Hargrove produced a career-high 13 points on 5-of-6 shooting in a win over Tarleton State (Dec. 11). It followed 10 points and a career-high eight rebounds in a Big Ten-opening win over Minnesota (Dec. 8). She added a team-high 12 points on 4-of-6 shooting at No. 1 UCLA (Dec. 29), before getting 11 points at Indiana (Feb. 2).

Hargrove scored in double figures seven times, including 10 points and seven boards in

a win over Kansas City (Nov. 26). She made her first start in a win over Chattanooga (Dec. 15), when she pulled down seven rebounds.

She added a strong seven-point, six-rebound performance in a win over No. 20 Michigan State (Jan. 8). Hargrove's effort included five big rebounds in the game's final five minutes to help Nebraska close out the victory.

Hargrove had eight points, three rebounds and two assists in a win over South Dakota (Nov. 16). She went 3-for-3 from the field, including a pair of three-pointers against the Coyotes.

## HIGH SCHOOL

Hargrove averaged 28.7 points, 10.7 rebounds, 2.9 steals and 1.9 assists as a senior at Illinois Class 1A Christopher High School. The No. 2 recruit in the state of Illinois, Hargrove was a three-time Southern Illinois Player of the Year and a four-time Class 1A all-state selection. She was also named to the MaxPreps Small Town All-America Team as a senior at Christopher (pop. 2,644), located approximately 100 miles southeast of St. Louis. She finished with 2,774 points and 1,096 career rebounds after averaging 25.8 points and 10.2 rebounds during her prep career. She also totaled more than 200 career steals while hitting more than 83 percent of her free throws.

As a junior in 2022-23, Hargrove averaged 24.7 points, 9.7 rebounds, 1.4 assists, 2.2 steals and 1.3 blocks while hitting 62.8 percent of her shots from the field to help Christopher High School to a Class 1A runner-up finish. The four-time Illinois Class 1A all-state selection was the 2023 Associated Press Illinois Class 1A Player of the Year and a three-time Southern Illinois Girls Basketball Player of the Year. She was also a three-time conference MVP and four-time all-conference selection.

A talented all-around athlete, Hargrove erupted for a career-high 55 points against Salem and 51 points against Cobden. She led

Christopher High School to a state runner-up finish after capturing sectional and super-sectional titles in 2023. She also fueled the Bearcats to a trio of conference championships and two regional crowns.

Hargrove also has competed in volleyball, softball and track and field, while earning third-team Academic All-America honors. She was a member of the High Honor Roll and National Honor Society at Christopher.

She played AAU basketball for Bradley Beal Elite and was ranked as the No. 159 recruit in the nation by Blue Star Basketball.

## PERSONAL

The daughter of Anthony and Ami Hargrove, Amiah was born in St. Louis, Mo. She has a younger sister, Aralynn, and an older brother, Tre Carroll, who is a senior basketball player at Xavier in 2025-26. He was a redshirt freshman on Florida Atlantic's 2023 NCAA Final Four team and played at FAU through 2024-25.

Amiah's father was an NFL defensive end from 2004 to 2013. He was drafted out of Georgia Tech by the St. Louis Rams and was a member of seven NFL teams, including the Super Bowl champion New Orleans Saints.

A sociology major, Hargrove earned spots on the Nebraska Scholar-Athlete Honor Roll in the fall and spring semesters of 2024-25. She was also a member of the 2025 Tom Osborne Citizenship Team.

Hargrove selected Nebraska over Creighton, Missouri, Illinois and Marquette.

"I chose Nebraska because it was the perfect fit for me," Hargrove said. "From the Lincoln community to the coaching staff, it instantly reminded me of home. I know that sounds cliché, but it is so true. I could not wait to be a Husker!"

The last of four transfers to join the Huskers ahead of the 2025-26 season, All-Southern Conference guard Claire Johnson signed with Nebraska on May 5, 2025.

Through 27 games, Johnson is averaging 3.4 points in 11 minutes per game off the bench.

Johnson led five Huskers in double figures with a game-high 21 points in 19 minutes in Nebraska's 103-46 season-opening win over Northwestern State (Nov. 3). She hit 7-of-9 shots from the field, including 2-of-3 three-pointers, while knocking down all five of her free throw attempts. She closed the first quarter with nine straight points in a 2:20 span to fuel an 18-0 run.

Johnson added 11 points, two rebounds and an assist in Nebraska's 84-50 run past Creighton (Nov. 12), before pitching in double figures for the third time this season with 10 points, two rebounds and two assists in a win over North Dakota State (Nov. 16).

She pitched in eight points, including a pair of three-pointers, two rebounds and an assist in NU's 103-58 run past Oral Roberts (Nov. 19). Johnson added seven big points in a Big Ten home win over Purdue (Jan. 4). She had six points in a win over Northwestern (Jan. 28) and contributed six points and two assists in an 87-35 win over Omaha (Dec. 9).

"We are thrilled to be adding Claire Johnson to the Husker women's basketball family," Nebraska Coach Amy Williams said. "Claire is coming off an outstanding freshman campaign where she showcased her versatility, efficiency and ability to impact games. Her skillset coupled

She played in 30 games with 14 starts for Samford, hitting 47.2 percent (120-174) of her shots from the field, including a sizzling 40.4 percent (61-151) of her three-pointers. She also knocked down 87.7 percent (64-73) of her free throws. She played at least 30 minutes in each of her final 11 games of the season.

Johnson showed her explosiveness in midseason, earning SoCon Player-of-the-Week honors (Feb. 4) after averaging 28.0 points, 5.5 rebounds and 3.5 assists in back-to-back games against Western Carolina and UNC Greensboro. She opened the week with a then-career-high 26 points on a then-career-high five three-pointers to go with a career-high four steals against Western Carolina (Jan. 30), before erupting for a career-high 30 points and career highs of nine

made field goals and nine made free throws against UNCG (Feb. 1).

In her collegiate debut, Johnson scored 13 points on 4-of-6 shooting with a pair of three-pointers to go with four rebounds in 22 minutes off the bench in a loss at Tennessee (Nov. 5). Two games later, she added 13 points and two more threes at Memphis, before scoring eight points at Florida State (Nov. 14). Later in the non-conference campaign, she added 10 points

on perfect shooting (3-3 FG, 2-2 3FG, 2-2 FT) at TCU (Dec. 17).

For the season, Johnson produced double figures 18 times, including nine of the last 10 games. She hit multiple three-pointers in a game 18 times, including a career-high six against Western Carolina in the regular-season finale (March 1). She also hit six threes in just 19 minutes off the bench against Berry College (Jan. 4).

## HIGH SCHOOL

Johnson committed to Samford following her junior season at McCracken County High School, where she was one of 16 finalists for Kentucky Miss Basketball honors as the Region 1 Player of the Year as a senior in 2023-24. She scored more than 2,000 points during her high school career and finished her senior season with 878 total points (23.1 ppg). She also ranked fifth in the state in free throw percentage (.844). She led the Mustangs to the 2024 KHSAA state championship game with a 39-point performance in a state semifinal win over Butler. She was a member of the 2024 KHSAA All-Tournament team. She averaged 17 points per game for McCracken County as a junior, and began playing for the Mustangs varsity team while she was still in junior high school. McCracken County went 98-10 in her final three seasons. Johnson scored 26 points in the Kentucky-Ohio All-Star game following her senior season. She was also invited to play in the Kentucky-Indiana All-Star game, but did not participate.

rebounds and 4.2 assists while hitting 55.5 percent of her shots, including 46.6 percent of her threes.

Prince captured MVP honors in leading Nebraska to the Emerald Coast Classic Beach Bracket title with a career-high-tying 30 points on 12-of-17 shooting in a championship game win over Virginia. In a head-to-head matchup with Cavalier All-American Kymora Johnson, Prince outscored the first-team All-ACC guard 18-2 in the first half. Prince averaged 24.0 points and 6.5 assists in two games, while hitting 20-of-31 shots.

She opened the tournament with 18 points, season highs of seven assists and two steals and her first block of the year in a win over Purdue Fort Wayne (Nov. 24).

Prince erupted for a career-high 30 points on 13-of-18 shooting, including 4-of-6 threes, in just 27 minutes in NU's 103-58 win over Oral Roberts (Nov. 19).

Prince, who owns eight 20-point efforts on the season and 14 in her career, has 23 double-figure scoring efforts this season and 47 in her career. She is one of the nation's best free throw shooters (.931), including a school-record streak of 56 straight makes that ended with her first attempt against Iowa (Feb. 16). She is 61-of-62 from the line in Big Ten play, including her first 54 straight before the miss against the Hawkeyes.

She produced a 28-point performance in a win over Northwestern when she hit 10-of-15 shots, including 2-of-3 threes and all six of her free throws while adding six rebounds and six assists against just one turnover. It was her fifth 20-point effort this season in Big Ten play.

Prince put up 27 points on 10-of-18 shooting at No. 14 Iowa (Jan. 1).

She pumped in a game-high 23 points on 10-of-13 shooting in an 80-46 win over Samford

two steals and a block in a Big Ten win over Purdue (Jan. 4).

She was even better over three games at the Big Ten Tournament, averaging team highs of 17.0 points and 5.3 assists on 55.9 percent shooting, including 75 percent (9-12) from long range.

Prince capped the conference tournament by tying a career high with 24 points, including four three-pointers, to go along with six assists in a quarterfinal loss to No. 4 UCLA (March 7). She opened the Big Ten Tournament with 10 points and five assists in a win over Rutgers (March 5), before leading NU with 17 points and five assists in a win over Illinois (March 6).

Nebraska with 14 points and six assists against Louisville in the NCAA Tournament first round (March 21). It was her 23rd double-figure scoring effort of the season.

She shared Nebraska's team MVP honors with senior Alexis Markowski, before being named Nebraska's Female Freshman Athlete of the Year across all sports for 2024-25.

Prince missed Nebraska's win over Oregon (Feb. 19) and a loss to Washington (Feb. 23) with a lower leg injury suffered in the closing minutes at Illinois (Feb. 16). She returned for 15 points and six assists in a win at Northwestern in the regular-season finale (March 2).

An outstanding defender, Prince was the first Husker freshman since Nicole Kubik (1996-97) to record 50 steals while ranking among Big Ten leaders with 1.7 steals per game.

She notched six 20-point efforts, including a career-high 24 points to lead Nebraska to a Big Ten road win at Rutgers (Jan. 12). She also had six boards and three assists at Rutgers.

Prince added a 23-point performance in a road win at Purdue (Jan. 30) when she closed out the win with NU's final nine points.

She had a game-high 22 points on a career-high five threes, while adding seven rebounds, five assists and a career-high six steals in a career-high 41 minutes in Nebraska's 87-84 OT win at Iowa (Jan. 16). Her performance against the Hawkeyes earned her Big Ten Freshman-of-the-Week honors (Jan. 20) and USBWA National Freshman of the Week (Jan. 21).

She added 23 points on 10-of-13 shooting to go with four assists, two steals and a block in Nebraska's record-setting 113-70 run past South Dakota (Nov. 16).

Prince had 20 points and six rebounds at Creighton (Nov. 22).

She had a solid 13-point, four-rebound effort that included a career-high eight assists in an upset win at No. 17 Maryland (Feb. 13). Prince added eight more assists to go with nine points at Illinois (Feb. 16), before suffering a lower leg injury in the closing minutes.

Prince put up a 14-point, seven-rebound effort that included three steals in a win over Wisconsin (Jan. 20), before getting eight points, eight rebounds, three assists and three steals against No. 12 Ohio State (Jan. 26). She scored 11 points at Indiana (Feb. 2) and 10 points against Michigan (Feb. 6).

She had 10 points in NU's win over No. 20 Michigan State (Jan. 8). It followed a 13-point performance that included four steals in a win over Penn State (Jan. 5). She also had 10 points and a career-high-tying eight rebounds to go with four assists at No. 4 USC (Jan. 1).

She led all scorers with 19 points, including a trio of three-pointers, to go with five rebounds in a win over Tarleton State (Dec. 11).

She had 14 points in a win over Lindenwood (Dec. 3), after getting 13 in a win over Kansas City (Nov. 26). She also had 13 points, six assists and two blocks in a win over North Alabama (Nov. 19).

Prince opened her career with 10 points, a game-high five assists and two steals as a starter in a win over Omaha (Nov. 4), before missing NU's win over Southeastern Louisiana (Nov. 9) with a lower leg injury. She returned with six points, three rebounds, four assists and three steals in a win over Southern (Nov. 12).

## HIGH SCHOOL

Prince produced one of the best senior seasons in Nebraska high school history, averaging 27.0 points, 10.3 rebounds, 6.3 assists and 2.9 steals to



capture her second straight Nebraska High School Player-of-the-Year honors from both Gatorade and MaxPreps in 2024. She led the state in both scoring and assists as a senior. Prince closed her career with a Nebraska Class B scoring record of 2,491 career points, surpassing previous record-holder Jordan Hooper, who was a first-team All-American at Nebraska in 2014, after a standout prep career at Alliance High School. Prince's 2,491 points rank No. 2 all-time across all classes in state high school history. Prince also totaled 271 career points at the state tournament, matching Hooper for second on the state tournament scoring list.

An honorable-mention All-American by both the Naismith Trophy and MaxPreps as a senior, Prince was the No. 16 recruit by Prospects Nation

and No. 28 by ESPN before signing with the Huskers on Nov. 8, 2023.

Prince averaged 24.2 points, 8.6 rebounds and 6.2 assists while hitting 59 percent of her shots from the floor, including 46 percent of her three-pointers, and 92 percent of her free throws as a junior at Elkhorn North in 2022-23 to earn her first state player of the year awards.

Prince was a four-time Super State and All-Nebraska selection while leading the Wolves to four consecutive Class B state championships while playing for her mother and head coach, Ann Prince. At the 2023 state tournament, Prince totaled 84 points on 29-of-40 shooting, including 10-of-14 from long range. She was also a perfect 16-for-16 at the free throw line. During the regular season, Prince recorded a triple-double with 33 points, 11 rebounds and 10 assists in a win over Hastings.

Prince capped her career with 17 points and 12 rebounds in a low-scoring 49-47 championship game victory over Omaha Skutt, which came after producing a triple-double with 21 points, 13 rebounds and 10 assists in a semifinal victory over Beatrice. Prince scored a career-high 42 points in the 2023-24 season opener, before tying her school record with 42 points in a 71-53 win over No. 2 Skutt (Jan. 6) to become the Class B all-time scoring leader, surpassing Husker first-team All-American Jordan Hooper's previous mark (2,078). The next day, Nebraska retired Hooper's No. 35 jersey.

She averaged 23.4 points per game as a freshman and 24.1 points per game as a sophomore.

She capped her high school career with a Nebraska Coaches Association All-Star Game record 32 points to go with 13 rebounds and six assists at Lincoln North Star on July 24, 2024. She hit 4-of-6 threes in the game to lead the Blue squad to a 99-87 win over the Red.

A talented all-around athlete, Prince finished fifth at the state cross country championships as a freshman, before winning state titles as a member of Elkhorn North's 4x400 relay team on the track as a freshman, sophomore and senior. She ran a personal-best time of 56.55 in the 400 in 2024. Prince won state gold in the 800-meter run as a sophomore, after taking silver in the event as a freshman. As a senior at the state championships in 2024, she ran a personal-best time of 2:16.62 in the 800 to finish fifth. She added relay golds in the 4x800 relay as a sophomore and senior after taking silver as a freshman.

An Academic All-State selection in both cross country and basketball in 2023, Prince was a member of National Honor Society and the Honor Roll at Elkhorn North.

## PERSONAL

The daughter of Mark and Ann Prince, Britt was born in Fremont, Neb. She has an older brother, Mack.

A business administration major, Britt earned spots on the Nebraska Scholar-Athlete Honor Roll in the fall and spring semesters of 2024-25. She was also a member of the Tom Osborne Citizenship Team.

She chose Nebraska over Louisville, Iowa, Oregon, Michigan, Indiana, Kansas, Oklahoma, Marquette, Illinois, North Carolina, Florida, Creighton and UCLA.

dream to represent the Huskers and help push this program to national prominence," Williams said. "She is a tough competitor, a gifted athlete, and an amazing teammate who will do whatever it takes to help her team win. I am really looking forward to sharing this experience with her."

## REDSHIRT (2024-25)

Williams took a basketball redshirt season while continuing to recover from a knee injury suffered as a high school soccer player on March 23, 2024.

Her rehabilitation allowed her to compete in 44 games with the Nebraska softball team. She scored 19 runs and went 4-for-5 on stolen base attempts to help Coach Rhonda Revelle's Huskers advance to an NCAA Super Regional.

## HIGH SCHOOL

A four-year varsity letter winner in basketball, softball and soccer at Lincoln Southwest, Williams was a Class A all-state selection and a member of the Class A All-Tournament Team while leading the Silver Hawks to a runner-up finish at the Nebraska girls basketball tournament in 2022. She was also an honorable-mention all-state choice in 2023, despite missing 80 percent of the season.

As a senior, Williams averaged team bests of 16.5 points, 3.2 assists and 3.8 steals in leading Southwest to a 22-4 record and a berth in the Class A state semifinals. As a junior, Williams played in Southwest's final five games after returning from a knee injury suffered during summer basketball in June of 2022. She averaged 10.6, 1.0 rebound and 1.6 steals over those five games to help the 14-11 Silver Hawks to a state tournament berth in 2023.

As a sophomore, Williams averaged 11.9 points, 3.2 assists and 3.0 steals to earn second-team Super-State and All-Nebraska honors. She was also the 2022 Lincoln Journal Star Girls Basketball Player of the Year. She helped the Silver Hawks to a state runner-up finish by scoring 24 points in a quarterfinal win Omaha Central. Southwest finished with a 21-6 record that included a semifinal victory over Millard South, before suffering a loss to Fremont in the state championship game.



Williams sparked an upstart Southwest team as a freshman, averaging 8.9 points, 1.9 assists and 2.6 steals in helping the Silver Hawks to a 19-3 record and a berth in the Class A state tournament first round. Williams earned honorable-mention Class A all-state accolades from both the Lincoln Journal Star and Omaha World-Herald in 2021.

She led Southwest to a Class A state semifinal appearance as a senior softball player in the fall of 2023, leading Class A with 18 runs scored while batting .450 with 18 RBIs and 17 stolen bases. She earned first-team All-Nebraska and Super-State recognition along with first-team Class A all-state honors as a senior.

She missed her junior softball season in the fall of 2022 after suffering a knee injury in summer basketball. As a sophomore, Williams batted .362 with six home runs, seven doubles and 29 RBIs as a shortstop and center fielder to help the Silver Hawks to a Class A state championship in

the fall of 2021. She was an honorable-mention Class A all-state choice as a sophomore.

She was a member of Lincoln Southwest's soccer program that advanced to the Class A state soccer tournament in the spring of 2021, 2022, 2023 and 2024.

## FRESHMAN (2025-26)

California high school star Alanna Neale signed with Nebraska on April 16, 2025, before joining the Huskers in June ahead of the 2025-26 season.

The 5-10 guard out of national power Ontario Christian averaged 12.1 points, 6.8 rebounds, 1.8 assists and 2.2 steals over 32 games as a senior in 2024-25 to earn All-California Interscholastic Federation Southern Section honors.

Neale put up a career-high five points in just over three minutes of action in Nebraska's 92-53 win over Bradley (Dec. 3). She hit both her shots from the field and completed her first career three-point play against the Braves.

Neale scored the first points of her Husker career with a three-pointer in Nebraska's 84-50 win over Creighton (Nov. 12). It was NU's 10th three of the game, marking the first time in school history that the Huskers hit double-digit triples in the 51-game series with the Jays.

She added two points and her first career steal in NU's 87-35 run past Omaha (Dec. 9).

She opened the regular season by playing eight minutes off the bench in a 103-46 win over Northwestern State (Nov. 3). She followed with two rebounds and an assist in NU's 80-46 win over Samford (Nov. 8).

Neale tipped her Husker career with a five-point effort in 10 minutes off the bench in a 104-40 exhibition win over Mount Marty (Oct. 24).

"We are beyond excited to make things official with the signing of Alanna Neale," Nebraska Coach Amy Williams said. "She joins us from one of the winningest and most
