

## **Supervised Study**

Students who regularly attend supervised study report that they are less stressed at school, and say that they are able to stay on top of their work and have more free time at home. ### **SNUS - Pouch Tobacco**

We wish to pass on information that we have received from the HSE in relation to Snus. Often marketed as a "smokeless" alternative to cigarettes, carries significant health risks that young people should be aware of. Because it delivers high levels of nicotine, snus is highly addictive and can lead to dependence very quickly. Its use is linked to gum disease, tooth damage, oral lesions and an increased risk of certain cancers, while the strong nicotine hit can also cause nausea, dizziness, headaches and impacts on concentration. Far from being harmless, snus poses real and long-term dangers, particularly for adolescents whose brains are still developing.



## **Social Media**

With social media playing an increasingly central role in teenagers' lives, it's important for parents and guardians to stay alert to the risks young people can face online, including oversharing, cyberbullying, exposure to inappropriate content and pressure to maintain a constant online presence. Open conversations at home, clear expectations around device use and regular check-ins can make a real difference in keeping young people safe and supported. ## Women in Politics

Scoil Mhuire was well represented at a groundbreaking student event which saw Donegal County Council seek student input on how to increase the number of women elected in the county. Donegal County Council, in collaboration with See Her Elected (SHE) hosted the 'Students Shaping the Future of Democracy in Donegal', at the Mount Errigal Hotel in Letterkenny. Some of the reommendations which came from the students included making politics an official subject in all Donegal schools at Leaving Cert level (already a subject in Scoil Mhuire!), the creation of a county-wide public speaking competition, a mentorship programme involving retired/ former county councillors who could share their experience with people new to politics, were among the recommendations made.

Other suggestions included bursaries for women to help them cover the cost of running for election were just some of the innovative recommendations made by students to Donegal County Council in order to see more women elected in the next local elections. Donegal is in last place in the country when it comes to the % of female councillors and this needs to change!










## **Religious Education**

## Gaeltacht Scholarships 2025/2026

Galway & Roscommon ETB administer a DEIS Bursary fund on behalf or the Department of the Gaeltacht. These can typically cover the vast majority of the course fees for a Gaeltacht course.

The application requires families to have booked the course in advance, with proof of payment provided.

- 1. Each school may submit up to 4 applications for consideration in this DEIS Scholarship Scheme
- 2. If your school is participating in the scholarship scheme, you are required to designate a member of your staff to co-ordinate and submit the application(s) from your school using the online application process
- 3. Only valid applications will be considered, i.e., those with documentary evidence of the student having secured a place in a recognised Gaeltacht summer college.
- 4. The awarding of scholarships is based on a strictly first come, first served basis of valid applications received.
- 5. Links to Summer colleges are in the **FAQs**.

The closing date for application is Wednesday 26 November. If you have proof of payment for a secured place, please contact micheal.clancy@scoilmhuirebuncra.ie and the school will submit the application. This will be done, out of fairness to everyone, on a first come, first served basis.
