 - online 13th 22nd February 2026
- HPAT worth 300 points
 - 1. Logical Reasoning and Problem Solving 40%
 - 2. Interpersonal Understanding 40%
 - 3. Non-verbal Reasoning 20%
- CAO points plus HPAT points, total used to allocate places.
- Student must have CAO Number to register for HPAT
- Students must register for HPAT by January 16th^h

HEAR

HEAR – Higher Education Access Route. Eligibility Criteria

HEAR applicants must meet a range of financial, social and cultural criteria to be considered for a reduced points place and extra college support. Here is a list of all the HEAR indicators:

Income: Your family income falls on or below the HEAR Income Limit for the year 2024.

Medical/GP Visit Card: Your family has a Medical Card/GP Visit Card that was in date on

December 31st 2025.

Means Tested Social Welfare: Your family received a means-tested payment from the

Department of Social Protection for at least 26 weeks in 2024.

DEIS School Attendance: You completed five years in a second level school that takes part

in the Delivering Equality of Opportunity in Schools (DEIS) scheme run by the Department of

Education and Youth.

Area Profile: You live in an area where there is concentrated disadvantage – in other words

an area where, for example, there is high unemployment and poverty and where only a

small proportion of adults have attained third level education. Applicants who experienced

homelessness during their post-primary education and are registered on the Pathway

Accommodation and Support System (PASS) will meet the Area Profile criteria.



HEAR Priority Groups: Applicants who wish to be considered under one or more of the following categories:

- Care-Experienced
- Member of the Traveller Community
- Member of the Roma Community
- Young Parent
- HEAR and DARE Eligible Applicant.

You must meet Indicator 1, the HEAR Income Limit, plus a minimum score of 2.5 to be eligible for HEAR. The criteria scores and eligibility criteria are listed here

DARE —Disability Access Route to Education

- Asperger's Syndrome / Autism
- Attention Deficit Disorder (ADD)/ Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD)
- Blind/Vision Impaired
- Deaf/Hearing Impaired
- Dyspraxia
- Mental Health Condition
- Neurological Conditions (incl. Brain Injury, Speech and Language Disabilities)
- Significant Ongoing Illness
- Physical Disability
- Specific Learning Difficulty (incl. Dyslexia)
- Other Disabilities

DARE cont.....

- Section A Personal Statement
- **Section B** Educational Impact Statement completed by their school. This form provides background information on the applicant's educational experience and helps to determine appropriate supports at third level.
- Section C applicants must return the Evidence of Disability Form completed by the accepted Medical Consultant/Specialist or GP.
 - Applicants with specific learning difficulties (incl. Dyslexia), must provide a full psycho-educational assessment completed by an appropriately qualified psychologist and/or the results of recent school based tests.
 - for students with Dyslexia only, if no educational psychological report is available **Section D** must be printed off by the candidate and completed by the school.

- Round 2 early to mid September

- Any further rounds are aimed at filling any remaining vacancies
- To accept offer, follow instructions carefully and reply within deadline.

Leaving Cert. Grade Appeals

- Form to View Scripts application made through SEC student portal
- Viewing Script late Aug or early Sept (dates tbc) most viewed online through the SEC student portal
- Appeals should be based on whether or not the paper was marked according to the marking scheme.
- •Grades can go down as well as up!

(Note: All 6th years have logged into their studyclix plus account).




3) Access to their **Athena Tracker Personal Profile**.

(Clear snapshot of progress, see their current academic status at a glance; on track, at risk, or needs attention).







Student Profile on Athena Tracker.

Green: Your child is meeting or exceeding expected academic goals. No immediate concerns. Regular study habits and progress seem steady Yellow: Slower progress than expected. Indicates the need for a bit more support (e.g. regular study routines, reviewing key topics).


Red: Action needed. Significant gap or drop in performance. Review recent assessment and feedback from teacher. Establish a consistent study schedule for this subject. Student should also engage with his/her teacher for advice and support. Set a realistic goal for the next assessment in this subject.

Target set during a 1:1 meeting with guidance.

6th year students can adjust their target via Athena tracker.

Athena Tracker shows students their progress in a subject over time.
