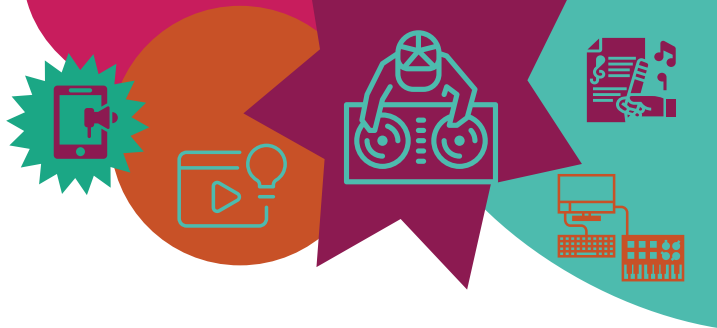
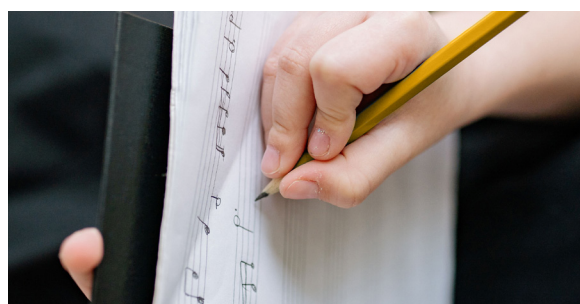
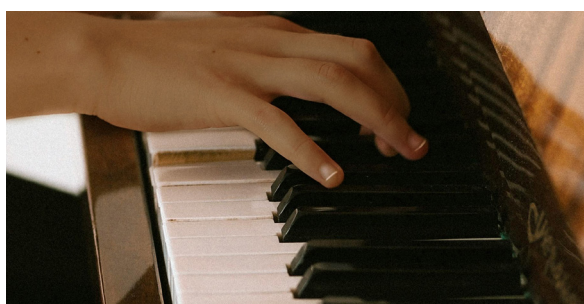




Music in Junior Cycle

What is it?

Music has three main parts:

- 1. Procedural knowledge (how music works) - You'll:**
 - Learn by listening, thinking, and doing.
 - Read music, recognise sounds, and spot patterns.
- 2. Innovate and ideate (create your own music) - You'll:**
 - Make and share your own music.
 - Try new sounds and styles.
- 3. Culture and context (music and the world) - You'll:**
 - See how music is shaped by everyday life.
 - Explore music from around the world.
 - Learn why music is important to different people and cultures.
