Board of Management Meeting February 23rd, 2026

- Key school events and achievements continue to be communicated via the school website and the college's official Instagram platform, supporting transparency and community engagement.
- Parents Council continue to meet every 6 weeks and are assisting with the Musical.
- Calendar committee has been set up to organise next year's calendar
- Significant engagement with third-level institutions and external providers has taken place:
- Sixth Year Physics and Chemistry students attended fieldwork and laboratory experiment days at Maynooth University.
- TY students participated in a workshop at Microsoft DreamSpace, supporting digital skills development.
- The TLP Programme facilitated a trip to the 'I Wish' STEM event at the RDS.
- Rang de hÍde visited Dalkey Castle to support heritage studies.
- Rang Clannad engaged in a visit to Connolly Hospital Blanchardstown.
- TY students also completed First Aid training and Barista training, broadening practical and employability skills.
- Sports facilities and staff expertise have been effectively deployed to support an extensive extra-curricular programme, including provincial and national competitions. The LCC & CNT Athletics Squad competed in provincial qualifiers in the Phoenix Park.
- SNA's received Epilepsy training and training on the administration of Buccalam
- Oide teacher training day on new senior cycle took place
- Curriculum delivery across Junior Cycle, Transition Year, LCA and Senior Cycle continues in line with Department specifications.
