This hands-on approach bridges classroom learning with life skills and builds a strong foundation for future independence and success.

Hamilton County Youth Employment Services Partnership:

PREPARING FOR SUMMER JOBS

Hamilton County Youth Employment Services brought career readiness directly to CCPA last February with a series of four after-school workshops designed to prepare students for summer jobs. The program culminated with an on-campus info session in March about the types of jobs available, followed by a hiring session in April.

Cincinnati Works Partnership:

BUILDING SKILLS & EXPLORING POSSIBILITIES

Through a partnership with Cincinnati Works, seniors participated in four sessions in March and April designed to build essential soft skills and explore diverse career pathways. Students created personalized career roadmaps, connected with industry professionals, and met one-on-one with career coaches. The program concluded with the chance to interview for real job opportunities, helping CCPA scholars take tangible next steps toward their futures.



DeShaun “Petey” Jones ’25

The DeShaun “Petey” Jones ’25 left an indelible mark on CCPA. He earned the title of Class of 2025 Salutatorian, and along the way, he helped the 2024 Lions football team make school history through their first-ever Regional Semifinal (Sweet 16) appearance in the D7 State Football Tournament. In short, Petey excelled wherever he put his efforts.

But Petey’s path to graduation was far from easy. During his middle school years, he endured profound personal loss, losing both of his parents and then his sister – with whom he’d planned to live with after his parents died. Mid that grief, his 7th-grade social studies teacher and assistant football coach, Ryan Holdren, along with his wife Caitlin, also a teacher at CCPA, opened their home and hearts. They gave him stability, encouragement, and belonging during one of life’s darkest seasons.

Within weeks of Petey joining the Holdrens, Ryan and Caitlin began talking to Petey and his surviving siblings, who were in their 20s and living independently, about Petey staying with them indefinitely. Everyone was in agreement—most of all, Petey—and the Holdrens applied for legal custody of Petey in April 2021. Custody was granted less than a year later.

When the Holdrens had a baby boy, Everett, in 2023, Petey was quick to step in with support, especially during Everett’s time in the neonatal intensive care unit. For Petey, who had longed for a younger sibling, Everett’s arrival was a joy.

Through the Holdrens’ support and Petey’s own grit, he stayed focused on academics and athletics—plus a part-time job—throughout high school. Today, Petey is pursuing his education and career goals

at Kentucky State University, where he majors in Nursing and competes on the Thoroughbreds’ varsity football team. With grants and scholarships covering 90% of his costs, Petey is stepping into higher education and life with remarkable momentum. CCPA could not be prouder of this Lion.

Devean Bush ’23

From his days at CCPA to now representing thousands of undergraduate students worldwide, Devean Bush’s journey is one of dedication, service, and leadership.

CCPA teachers and mentors recall Devean as someone who asked questions, volunteered for projects, and sought opportunities to make a difference. His peers recognized his academic strength and consistent encouragement and integrity.

After graduating in 2023, Devean enrolled at Jackson State University in Mississippi. He joined the Alpha Beta Chapter of Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc., immersing himself in the historic Black fraternity’s principles of brotherhood, service, and scholarship. Within his first two years of college, Devean distinguished himself as a reliable contributor and caring brother within the fraternity.

As a result, at the fraternity’s International Conclave in Tampa, Florida, in summer 2025, Devean was elected International Second Vice President of Phi Beta Sigma, the highest-ranking undergraduate officer in the organization. He campaigned on a message of authentic leadership, accountability, and unity.

At only 20 years old, Devean now serves as the voice for undergraduate Phi Beta Sigma members across the U.S., Africa, and the Caribbean. In his new role, he will help shape and implement fraternity-wide policies and programs and will represent and mentor chapters globally.

For Devean, this role means commitment. Over the next two years, he intends to uplift underrepresented voices, create more inclusive fraternity spaces, and encourage younger students to lead with purpose and humility. Devean’s story underscores what CCPA seeks to instill: not just academic success, but a mindset rooted in community, resilience, and intention.

At CCPA, we strive to foster a positive learning environment, promote active and collaborative learning, improve foundational skills, and develop higher-level critical thinking, analytical, and problem-solving skills.

We create classrooms where students feel safe, respect one another, and are motivated to learn. And we prepare our students for complex challenges that lie ahead in college and careers.



The academic performance information provided in this report outlines CCPA's educational successes and student progress, including key metrics like graduation rates, achievement scores, early literacy, and college and career readiness, alongside qualitative information on program achievements and challenges. In the last five years, we have increased our Academic Performance Index by nearly 18%, which is an incredible 3.5% improvement per year. CCPA's devotion to academic and achievement success demonstrates the school's accountability, transparency, and effectiveness in achieving our educational mission and goals.

card is to foster transparency and accountability within Ohio's education system, equipping parents, educators, and community members with crucial information to bolster student achievement.

Our leadership, staff, students and families are so proud to have achieved an Overall 4 Star Rating for the second consecutive year, which exceeds the state standard for overall school performance!

EARLY LITERACY AT CCPA

At CCPA Elementary School, we emphasize the importance of developing essential skills—such as language, critical thinking, and empathy.


We work to develop students' ability to recognize letters, understand sounds in words, and use a broad vocabulary through activities like talking, singing, reading, and playing. CCPA's investment in early literacy helps ensure our children are prepared for school while strengthening family relationships and creating a more engaged and collaborative learning environment.

The Early Literacy Component of Ohio's Report Card measures reading improvement and proficiency for students in Kindergarten through third grade. The measures include the following: (1) Proficiency in 3rd Grade Reading, (2) Promotion to 4th Grade, and (3) Improving K-3 Literacy.

Providing a Strong Foundation for Success in Post-Secondary Education

Preparing students for college is crucial; it builds confidence, increases academic success, and equips young adults with essential life skills like time management, communication, and problem-solving, which also benefit their future careers. Early preparation helps students make informed choices about their educational paths, navigate the admissions process, and transition smoothly into the demanding environment of higher education, ultimately leading to greater fulfillment and success in college and beyond.

CCPA High School is one of the few high schools in Ohio to receive 5 Star Ratings on both the Graduation and the College, Career, Workforce & Military Readiness Components of the 2025 School Report Card. These achievements showcase how CCPA meets its educational responsibilities to students, parents, and the community.



Early Literacy Highlights

Over a 3 year period (2023 to 2025), CCPA Elementary has promoted an incredible 99% of students to our 4th grade class.

Over that same time period, our 3rd grade teachers have produced some of our highest ELA achievement scores, averaging a 76.5% passing rate equating to a nearly 80% performance index percentage and a 4 Star Rating.


Maintain Equity Gains (Gap Closing)

Year-to-date Receipts for FY25 are **\$2,403,068** *Lower* than disbursements.




YEAR-END FISCAL REVIEW

COMMUNITY

A message from the Ohio Department of Education and Workforce, Office of School Sponsorship:

Ohio Revised Code (ORC)3314.03(D)(2) specifies that the sponsor of a school must “monitor and evaluate the academic and fiscal performance and the organization and operation of the community school on at least an annual basis.” And ORC 3314.023(C) requires all sponsors of community schools to annually report the results of the evaluation to the Department of Education and Workforce and parents of students enrolled in the community school.

The Ohio Department of Education and Workforce, Office of Ohio School Sponsorship evaluates its sponsored schools on the performance of Ohio School Report Card indicators and on performance measures as listed in the school’s community school contract.

The Office of School Sponsorship monitors the performance of its sponsored community schools through attendance at governing board meetings, on-site visits, and through the review of compliance surveys, monthly financial reports, and other reports related to the school’s academic, financial and operational performance to ensure compliance with rule and law.



ENGAGE. EMPOWER.

At the Cincinnati College Preparatory Academy, every success story is written through partnership. And we are grateful for our community partners, who poured into us this year. Our food and pantry was stocked with nutrition and volunteers thanks to Freestore Foodbank, Mazunte Taqueria, and Seven Hills School, while Sweet Cheeks Diaper Bank provided for our littlest Lions.

Total Quality Logistics donated 1,000 back-to-school supply bags so all students could start the school year strong, and a partnership with the Sam Hubbard Foundation and Crayons to Computer ensured our scholars had access to core school supplies and hygiene items in our on-site “Hubbard’s Cupboard,” throughout the year. We received a \$2,500 grant for book carts from the Greater Cincinnati Foundation, the YMCA provides swimming lessons for our K-3 students, and organizations like Crossroads Church and Cincinnati Children’s Hospital ensured happy holidays for our students and families with meals and gifts.

Your engagement—whether as a donor, volunteer, mentor, or advocate—has empowered our students to dream big and achieve even more. For that, we are deeply grateful.
