Q&A With The Corp Of Engineers

If there is a problem with dissolved oxygen in the river, will you correct it with outflows from the reservoirs?

Our current outflows already help correct dissolved oxygen problems in the Savannah River although late summer quality remains a



problem. Because dissolved oxygen is less of problem in the cooler winter months, our drought plan now allows for reducing outflows down to 3,100 cubic feet per second for November through January when we reach drought level 3.

Before we deepen the Savannah Harbor we will install an oxygen injection system into the harbor to mitigate for additional loss of dissolved oxygen due to the harbor expansion. This injection system, in the form of Speece cones, will prevent the need to increase water flows to maintain current dissolved oxygen levels in the harbor.

Isn't there sufficient storage capacity with all three reservoirs to reduce the winter drawdown from 4 feet to 2 feet?

Stakeholders often suggest the Corps should limit the amount of winter-draw down to 2 feet instead of four. They argue that when Thurmond Dam and Lake were built, a 4-foot winter drawdown was established to make room for excess runoff above Thurmond. But afterward Hartwell and Russell reservoirs were constructed upstream. These reservoirs provide more flood storage space because their collection capacity combines with Thurmond.

Indeed, with the construction of Hartwell and Russell there is more flood storage available in the basin. The question now becomes: is this additional storage capacity enough to decrease the amount we draw down the reservoirs in the winter? The answer may very well be 'yes,' but since so much has changed since 1954 we don't have enough data (yet) to answer that question definitively.

For example, we know human development, especially development of urban areas, changes the rainfall-runoff ratio. That is, in areas where porous soil is replaced with concrete roads, parking lots and buildings, less water soaks into the ground and more water fills the reservoirs. Cultivated lands, such as farm land also changes this ratio.

Another example of change since 1954 is the pendulum swing of the dry-wet periods. Although we are generally receiving about the same annual amount of precipitation from 60 years ago, the wet and dry swings tend to be more extreme. When rainfall intensity is high in short periods, greater amounts of flood storage may be necessary.

We need to examine these kinds of conditions before making the case to reallocate flood storage. Because of all the unknowns, the prudent approach is to assess current conditions and how they affect impacts of probable excessive rainfall.

For these reasons we have taken initiative to implement a flood-storage assessment that will provide the information needed to make an informed decision on the amount of winter drawdown required. We recently secured \$240,000 for this study. The assessment will provide data to help us reevaluate how much flood-storage is needed in the reservoirs. The study began October 2013 and we expect it to take about a year. Results of the assessment could demonstrate that less than 4 feet of drawdown is sufficient each winter; or it could confirm that a 4-foot drawdown (or perhaps more) is needed in the basin as it exists today.

Fishing Report


Lake Hartwell May 1st 74 degrees

Bass fishing is fair. Stay away from the rivers as the water is much stained. Down lake use a buzz bait and be sure to use a stinger hook. Lots of fish have been short striking this bait. Zoom baby bass Super Flukes and pearl Senkos are working on the blow throughs and on any sand bank. A trick worm and a Super Fluke ready for the shallow fish on any wood and on the small points in the creek. Try the RA Shad Reel Action swim 3inch soft



baits Multi color grub. Down lake try the Stanley 3/8 ounce all white spinnerbaits in the pockets and around wood. Use the Scrounger and a small pearl Fluke trailer on any wood, points and rocks.

Twenty (20) paddlers and one (1) drummer all work together (along with a professional oarsman) to race on the waters of Lake Hartwell.

Each team can participate in a racing how-to seminar and one hour of practice time during the week of the festival. See the Captain's Information page for the Practice Week Schedule.

Each race is on a 220-meter straight course and will take about two to three minutes to complete the race.

Racing divisions will be determined from the combined times of the morning and afternoon races.

The teams will be ranked according to combined times and then grouped into three competitive divisions with an equal number of teams in each division. The three fastest teams in each division will have the opportunity to race each other for their division championship. In addition to crowning the festival champion, there will be recognition of winners in various categories. It is recommended that each team have 25 participants: 20 paddlers, 1 drummer, and 4 alternates. One person must be registered as the Team Captain and an additional Co-Captain can be assigned to your team

Striped bass tracking project to begin on Lake Hartwell

Striped bass fishing is a favorite pastime for many Lake Hartwell anglers. For more than 40 years, the striped bass population in Lake Hartwell has been maintained by stocking small fish into the lake each spring. Given enough time and "groceries," these striped bass can reach weights of 40 pounds or more.

However, over the last few years, Lake Hartwell anglers have expressed concern about the declining numbers of striped bass in the lake. "We attribute the decline in the striped bass population to low levels of dissolved oxygen found down deep where striped bass live during the summertime," Georgia DNR fisheries biologist Anthony Rabern said. "Droughts and floods can have a strong influ-



ence on water quality in the lake, especially during the summer months." Due to low oxygen levels last September, fisheries biologists from both the Georgia Department of Natural Resources' Wildlife Resources Division and the South Carolina Department of Natural Resources documented a major die-off of striped bass.

To determine how striped bass in Lake Hartwell respond to harsh summertime conditions when these low oxygen levels occur, DNR biologists are surgically-implanting small radio transmitters into 40 striped bass this winter and will track their movements for the next 12 to 36 months. "One of the goals for this project is to determine the seasonal migration patterns of striped bass in Lake Hartwell, and identify potential areas in the lake where summertime water quality may be better suited for their survival," Project Leader Anthony Rabern said. "Another goal is to determine how many striped bass may actually die during the course of the year from either natural causes or from being harvested by anglers."

It might be possible that some anglers will catch one of these striped bass that has an internal transmitter. If you catch a striped bass with a 3-inch long filament protruding from its belly, the DNR encourages you to report the tag number by calling (888) 824-7472 and to release the fish alive, if possible, so officials can continue to track the fish. If the fish is harvested, instructions will be provided on how to return the transmitter.

This project would not be possible without the combined efforts of both state DNRs, and the support of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. "In the long run," Rabern said, "we will use the results from this study to make Lake Hartwell the best fishing destination it can be." The rides on Saturday are: Smith-McGee Sojourn 39.7 miles, Ruckersville Ramble 67.3 miles, and Calhoun Falls Century 99.6 miles



On Sunday

On Sunday the ride heads west and north and is more challenging for the long rides. On Sunday you can do: Ridge View Venture 31.2 miles Pleasant Hill Ride 59.3 miles Assault on Dick's Hill 98.9 miles
