Q&A With The Corp Of Engineers

If there is a problem with dissolved oxygen in the river, will you correct it with outflows from the reservoirs?

Our current outflows already help correct dissolved oxygen problems in the Savannah River although late summer quality remains a



problem. Because dissolved oxygen is less of problem in the cooler winter months, our drought plan now allows for reducing outflows down to 3,100 cubic feet per second for November through January when we reach drought level 3.

Before we deepen the Savannah Harbor we will install an oxygen injection system into the harbor to mitigate for additional loss of dissolved oxygen due to the harbor expansion. This injection system, in the form of Speece cones, will prevent the need to increase water flows to maintain current dissolved oxygen levels in the harbor

Isn't there sufficient storage capacity with all three reservoirs to reduce the winter drawdown from 4 feet to 2 feet?

Stakeholders often suggest the Corps should limit the amount of winter-draw down to 2 feet instead of four. They argue that when Thurmond Dam and Lake were built, a 4-foot winter drawdown was established to make room for excess runoff above Thurmond. But afterward Hartwell and Russell reservoirs were constructed upstream. These reservoirs provide more flood storage space because their collection capacity combines with Thurmond.

Indeed, with the construction of Hartwell and Russell there is more flood storage available in the basin. The question now becomes: is this additional storage capacity enough to decrease the amount we draw down the reservoirs in the winter? The answer may very well be 'yes,' but since so much has changed since 1954 we don't have enough data (yet) to answer that question definitively.

For example, we know human development, especially development of urban areas, changes the rainfall-runoff ratio. That is, in areas where porous soil is replaced with concrete roads, parking lots and buildings, less water soaks into the ground and more water fills the reservoirs. Cultivated lands, such as farm land also changes this ratio.

Another example of change since 1954 is the pendulum swing of the dry-wet periods. Although we are generally receiving about the same annual amount of precipitation from 60 years ago, the wet and dry swings tend to be more extreme. When rainfall intensity is high in short periods, greater amounts of flood storage may be necessary.

We need to examine these kinds of conditions before making the case to reallocate flood storage. Because of all the unknowns, the prudent approach is to assess current conditions and how they affect impacts of probable excessive rainfall.

For these reasons we have taken initiative to implement a flood-storage assessment that will provide the information needed to make an informed decision on the amount of winter drawdown required. We recently secured \$240,000 for this study. The assessment will provide data to help us reevaluate how much flood-storage is needed in the reservoirs. The study began October 2013 and we expect it to take about a year. Results of the assessment could demonstrate that less than 4 feet of drawdown is sufficient each winter; or it could confirm that a 4-foot drawdown (or perhaps more) is needed in the basin as it exists today.



Lake Hartwell to Host ACC Rowing Championships



The May 14th event and parking is free. Races can be viewed along the dike or from the grand-stands at the finish line. The rowing championships can be viewed live on the watch ESPN app.

The Clemson Rowing boathouse is located on the western edge of Clemson's campus, overlooking beautiful Lake Hartwell. Only a quarter of a mile from the other athletic facilities, the boathouse seems worlds apart lying in a secluded wooded area on the shore of one of the Southeast's largest lakes. With 56,000 acres of water and 962 miles of shoreline, Lake Hartwell offers plenty of rowable water. Built as an Army Corps of Engineers project in 1962, the lake includes many pristine rivers, creeks and inlets that provide sheltered water on even the windiest of days.

Lake Hartwell facilitates an ideal venue for the Tigers' fully bouyed, six-lane 2000m race course. The entire course is visible from the boathouse.

Directions: I-85 to exit #19B towards Clemson. Follow Hwy 76/28 west for a while. Turn left onto Perimeter Road in Clemson. Follow Perimeter around campus, pass the football stadium (on right) and Jervey Gym (on left). Take next left on East Bank Drive where the "Clemson Rowing" sign. East Bank will lead you past the baseball stadium (on the left), up a hill and to the boathouse.

Park to Use Green Glow Fish Attractors

A Lake Hartwell cove will be illuminated with 16 4-foot LED Hydro Glow fish-attracting lights around the fishing pier at the Brown Road boat ramp.

After the sun sets, the green lights will go on. The green lights boost micro-organisms that are the food base for shad and herring, the bait fish population in the area. The presence of bait fish will draw larger fish to the pier. "This virtual 80-foot-by-30-foot aquarium exhibit further transforms



Anderson County's Brown Road facility from the once stand-alone boat ramp into a waterfront park," park manager Matthew Schell said. "Clearly visible from the Brown Road Bridge, this waterfront park is the closest lake access to the city limits of Anderson."

"Parks play a vital role in a community's success, accommodating residents while attracting and retaining business," District 4 County Councilman Craig Wooten said. "Anderson County's abundant natural resources are only complemented by the facilities we are building today. The lighted pier extending 160 feet from the banks of Hartwell is like no other park on this 56,000-acre lake."

Try Hartwell's Cats

April is when the last vestiges of winter become just memories, the days get longer and the water temperature rises into that magic range in the low 60s that puts the catfish in Lake Hartwell on the move. That's when the fishing starts to get good, according to guide Seth Owens of Anderson, S.C.

Hartwell is home to three major catfish species, and Owens has developed strategies to catch all three during the month of April.

Blue catfish. "Depending on the sunlight and temperature, the fish may be anywhere from 3 to 30 feet of water. The males will move in first, then the big females," Owens said. "If I am confident there are fish in a certain area, I will cast bait on the bottom but only (let it) sit there for about 45 minutes before moving. If I am searching for fish, I will drift bait with planer boards, moving the boat .5 to .7 mph, usually starting in the backs of the creeks where there is a flat and fishing out toward deeper water, crossing the channels as we go." The fish will be feeding mainly on gizzard shad, herring or perch, he said. "I use 30-pound monofilament with a 2/0 or 3/0 Kahle hook. For drifting large baits, I use the same hook with a No. 6 treble stinger hook crimped on with 60-pound steel leader. I may also attach a spinner above the swivel or a rattle to attract fish."



Channel catfish. Late in the winter and early in spring, channel catfish can be caught in the main river channel in 60 to 80 feet of water, but as the water warms in April they will move up to the 20-to 30-foot range, Owens said. "The easiest way to catch them is to pull up on the bank and fan cast into that 20- to 30-foot depth," he said. "You can use cut herring, worms, or my favorite: Hoss's Hawg Bait stinkbait. We cut small pieces of swim noodle to hold the bait with a No. 2 to No. 4 hook and a half-ounce of weight." Owens borrows from bass fishermen's arsenals for a different tactic on channel catfish. "Another fun way to catch them is to cast along riprap, dragging night-crawlers on the bottom like fishing a plastic worm. I like to use a spinning reel with 12-pound monofilament on an 8-foot rod for this."

Flathead catfish. "Flathead fishing starts to pick up about mid-April, and the hotter the weather gets, the better it will be," Owens said. "As the water heats up, the flatheads will move up into the shallower water, sometimes just 2 feet deep." Flathead fishing is best at night, he said, either anchoring, pulling up on the bank and fan-casting baits out around the boat. "We use the same tackle as with the blues, but they prefer live bait. The hardest part about chasing these big fish is having live bait big enough to entice them to eat," Owens said. "You really need a bream, perch, crappie, maybe even a spotted bass that is at least a pound or bigger."

Lake Keowee, upstream from Hartwell, is a prime place to fish with a spotted bass simply because they are everywhere, according to Owens (864-909-7388).


Fishing Report

Lake Hartwell May 63 degrees

Bass fishing is good. The water temperatures are in the high 60's to low 70's with the recent weather we have had. The fish are still in all phases some are post spawn some are spawning and still have some pre spawn. We have stayed focused in the Tugaloo river area of the lake and in some creeks we have even found a good shad spawn going on already but with the cooler weather it has slowed things down a little. First thing in the morning we have



been focusing on the shad spawn and when the sun comes up we have focused on a couple different patterns. With the shad spawn we have been focusing around docks and using either a wacky rigged Bass Pro Shops Stik O or a weight less Trick worm. After the sun gets up we have done a couple different things first we have continued to fish around the same docks using the weight less Trick work or Wacky rigged Stick O. Make sure to keep a good distance from the docks as the bass are suspending up under the floats and will be able to see you before you see them. Second we have been working on post spawn fish around secondary and main lake points just outside of the spawning pockets. We have been using swim baits, crank baits, pop r style baits and a buzz bait on these areas to catch some fish. If the bite slowed down we would switch to a shaky head in the same areas to help get some bites.




