Each month we try to come up with an article that will be helpful to my equestrian readers. Well this month, with the election coming and fiscal spending out of control, I have decided to return to an issue dear to my heart and try to help the four-leggeds that can't speak for themselves.

If enough equestrians that care about this issue "speak up," we can make a difference. Rounding up wild mustangs and burros from federal lands allocated for their habitat and protection at a high cost to taxpayers has to be addressed by the next administration. Just a couple of years ago there were only 20,000 captive wild horses in holding facilities, please read the following:

Tell BLM to Cancel 5-Year Plan to Remove Wild Horses

The Bureau of Land Management (BLM) has stockpiled nearly 50,000 wild horses in government holding facilities and is running out of space to house more captured mustangs. Despite this fact



and the staggering cost to taxpayers, the agency is proposing to remove hundreds of horses from the Triple B, Maverick-Medicine, and Antelope Valley Herd Management Areas (HMAs) in Nevada -- where many times more livestock are permitted to graze than mustangs. Fortunately, the BLM is proposing to use more humane bait/water trapping to capture horses, a far less traumatic alternative than helicopter stampedes. But instead of removing horses, the agency should use bait-trapping methods to apply safe, proven and humane PZP fertility control in order to manage the herds on the range and leave them in the wild where they belong.

BLM Announces Oct 1st Start Date for Roundup of 200 Mustangs in Nevada

Helicopters will be used to round up 200 wild horses in the Nevada's Antelope and Antelope Valley Herd Management Areas (HMAs) beginning October 1, 2012. Livestock grazing in and around the area was permitted earlier this year despite the emerging "drought" situation. Now, the BLM is claiming that drought conditions are taking a toll on wild horse herds and using this "rationale" as an excuse to drastically reduce their numbers. Halloween Superstitions

- Spirit-chasing bells. A medieval superstition that still lingers today, the ringing of bells (or chimes, doorbells, and other sound-making devices) is supposed to chase away evil spirits.
- Flying bats. If you happen to catch sight of bats flying around your house-either inside or outside-this could be a sign of ghosts and spirits nearby. Grab the garlic.
- Black and white cats. In Britain, white cats are a sign of bad luck and may mean evil spirits are lurking close by. Black cats have
 often been associated with the devil, and even though many black cat owners will insist this is just a superstition, Halloween calls
 for many witch and black cat duos. Seeing a black cat, or simply crossing paths with one over Halloween, could be a sign of negative things ahead.
- Halloween birthdays. According to Welsh legends, children born on Halloween will have special powers to ward off evil spirits and the 'gift of second sight.'
- The moonlight shadow. Another Celtic superstition involves the moon; if you catch your shadow in the moonlight, you're simply doomed to bad luck-and even death.
- **Big brother spiders.** A European superstition involves seeing spiders on Halloween; if you find a few lurking in your room or house on Halloween night, it means that the spirit of a dead loved one is watching over you. Very comforting, indeed.

While most of these might make you think twice this year, a strange encounter might lead you to knock on wood and hope for the best...
