Dargan Amphitheater

Dedicated in 1926, Dargan Amphitheater seats more than 800 and is located on the campus of the old St. John's High School (Corner of North Main Street and Park Street). Located on the banks of Swift Creek, Dargan Amphitheater has been used for outdoor plays, concerts, graduations, and May Day celebrations. The acoustics are excellent and the Amphitheater is currently maintained by the Darlington County School District.



J.C. Daniel Center for the Performing Arts

Built in the 1930's, the J.C. Daniel Center for the Performing Arts was lovingly restored to its former glory in the 1980's by the St. John's Heritage Foundation.

The 1,000 seat Center is located at 114 Park Street and is available for public use.



Sweet Potato Festival



The longest-running festival in Darlington County (since 1983), the SC Sweet Potato Festival now attracts audiences of over 17,000 people. Attractions include games for the children, crafts, music, live entertainment, a car show and a variety of food concessions, including sweet potato pie! It is sponsored by the Pilot Club of Darlington. Admission is free and it is held the second Saturday in October each year on the Public Square in downtown Darlington.
