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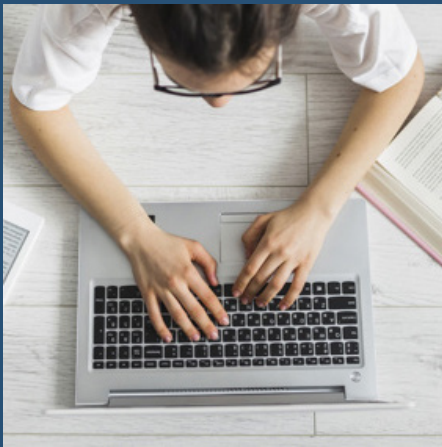

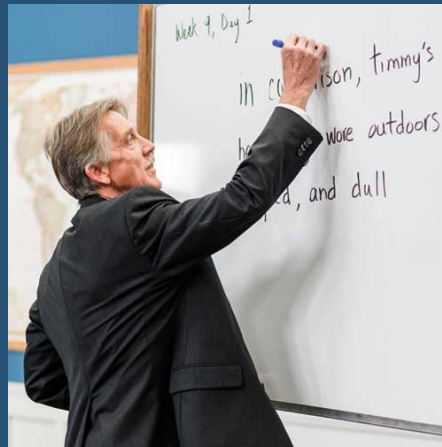

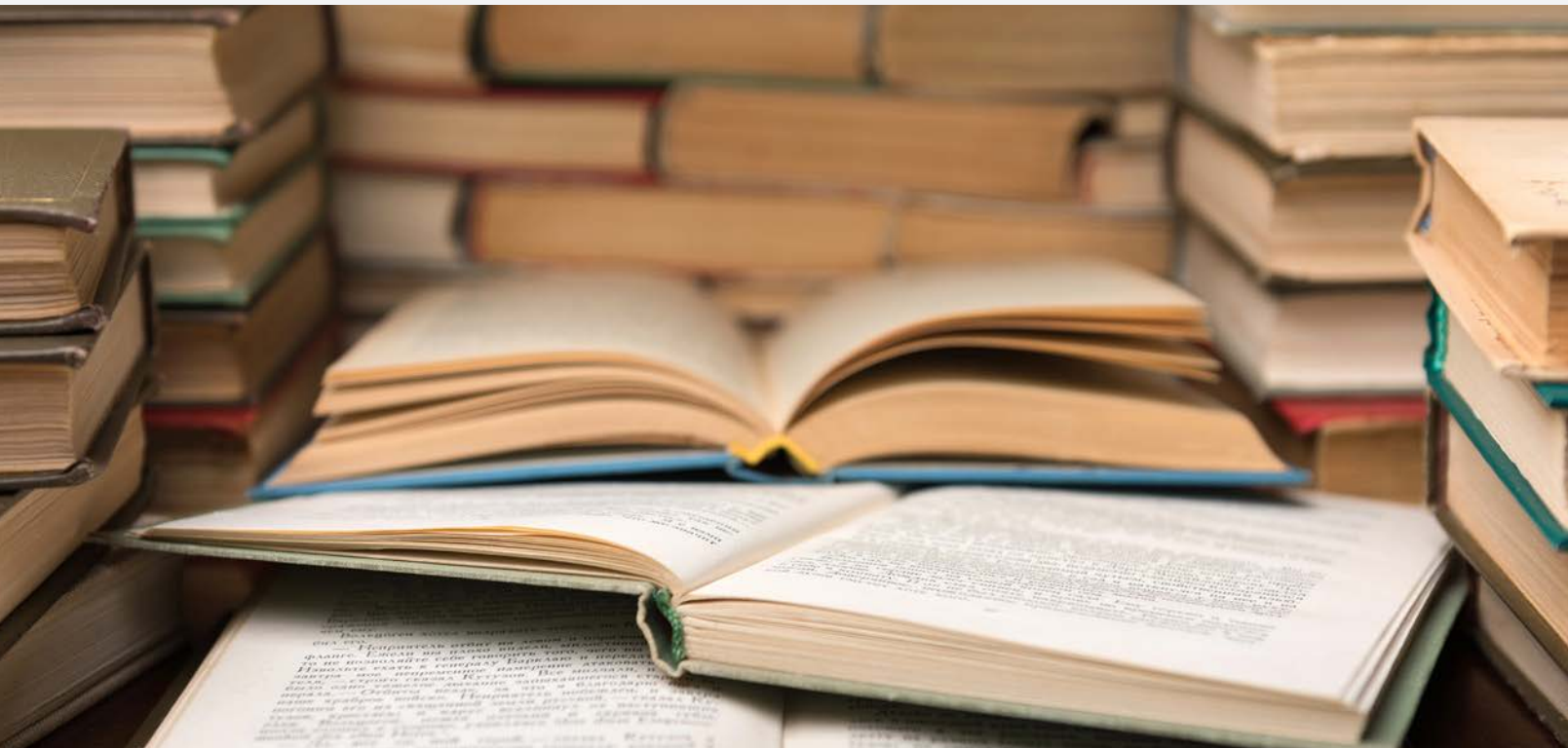

Back to Basics?

I recently watched a social media video post from a teacher, and it stung me, so I transcribe it for you here, verbatim:

New pedagogical idea: stop teaching kids to add. Seriously. AI handles all the arithmetic and perfect grammar instantly. We need to focus on what humans do best. We taught everyone to drive, not to shoe a horse. AI is the new car. The kids aren't wrong, our curriculum is simply ancient. The new essential skill is interpreting the data AI provides. It is critical synthesis of information. We must prioritize prompt engineering, the art of speaking to the machine as the new literacy. Teach them to be the conductor who directs the output. Once they are engaged in creating complex systems, running a business, or building an app, they will naturally choose to specialize, and master the deep math or rhetoric needed for innovation. They'll learn it. Learning foundational skills then becomes a personally motivated specialization, not mandatory homework. Maybe the kids aren't alright. Maybe they're just waiting for us to catch up to the future.

I commented: "Is this satire?" His response: "No. I am a real teacher, and these are my views."

Unfortunately, he is not alone in his opinion. Many modern educators express similar ideas, and many schools are careening down this slippery silicon path while not asking some very basic questions about what human cognition truly is and what may happen when we outsource our thinking *en masse*.

The old idea that we all need to learn the three Rs, "readin', ritin', and 'rithmetic" (painfully forced alliteration though it may be), has roots deep in our understanding of what enables constructive thinking. The ancients valued the skills of literacy and numeracy not merely for their practical applications but as the foundation for the liberal arts—or what we might call the *liberating arts*.

People who assume that learning vocabulary and grammar is merely an academic exercise and will be unnecessary if we have machines that can create perfectly correct prose are entirely blind to the reality that commanding words and syntax is deeply personal and crucial to our intellectual life. Understanding grammar is not just for being able to write and proofread one's own

emails; it actually provides the tools for thinking and comprehending. Confucius observed this (around 2500 years ago):

If language is not correct, then what is said is not what is meant; if what is said is not what is meant, then what must be done remains undone; if this remains undone, morals and art will deteriorate; if morals and art deteriorate, justice will go astray; if justice goes astray, the people will stand about in helpless confusion. Hence there must be no arbitrariness in what is said. This matters above everything.

While the ancient Chinese philosopher was perhaps concerned mostly with political and social health, there are personal implications. Our use of language is deeply connected with our rational thought, which is a distinctly human faculty. Vocabulary and grammar are what allow us to articulate and share ideas, experiences, even feelings, inspirations and intuitions. While large language model AI agents may be able to collect and synthesize information in a very efficient way, they cannot know what it is to be human, they cannot feel, they cannot express a human nature. To embrace a new pedagogical idea that minimizes our capacity for distinctly human thought and communication isn't just a bad idea, it seems

almost criminal—educational neglect at its worst.

Another video that concerned me was of a teacher who reported that one of her fifth grade students asked, “Why do I have to learn to read? My computer reads everything for me.” Now, while I am a big fan of audiobooks, especially for the dyslexic kids out there, this is a statement different in kind; here we have a child who has come to believe that reading is not worth the effort. What then will her computer read for her? Will her life become about asking AI to read something and then summarize it, even telling her what she should think about it? Sadly, it seems that this is already happening as we increasingly hear teachers bemoaning their experience of students turning in AI-generated papers but having little or no concept of what ideas those papers contain or, worse, believing that those ideas were indeed their own reflections on whatever book or source of information the AI used to generate the text. They are outsourcing their thinking, and the result is likely to be intellectual malnutrition.

Human beings can survive—for a time—on highly processed sustenance provided by an intravenous drip or a feeding tube, but we all know that our brains and bodies grow and function best on a diet of natural, whole,



minimally processed foods. Furthermore, we need a balance of macro- and micronutrients to optimize brain and body. Many in the medical world are finally starting to understand and teach that health is achieved not by alleviating symptoms with medicines but by improving and maintaining diet, exercise, sleep, and lifestyle, which can often reverse diseases entirely, restoring energy, vitality, and overall wellbeing.

Just as our bodies require a healthy metabolism to transform the proteins, carbohydrates, and fats into strong muscles and bones, healthy blood, and organs, we need the basic skills of reading, writing, and calculating to be able process the ideas and information in the world around us into helpful thinking and a healthy intellectual life.

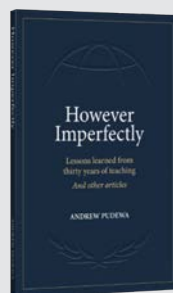

And it seems that our modern world makes both physical and intellectual health more difficult because both “junk food” and “junk information” have become not only ubiquitous but unavoidable. A soda and some fries won’t kill us overnight, but an exclusive diet of such will inevitably lead to degenerative disease. It’s the same thing with what we take in through our eyes and ears. As I have spoken about repeatedly for the last two decades, what we read, what we hear, what we commit to memory will be how we furnish our minds, and as teachers and parents we have a great responsibility to cultivate healthy appetites in our students. As we read to them—and with them—good, true, and beautiful literature, they will grow in their taste for such in their own reading. We must help them learn to feed their minds well even as we lead them to make better health habits and food choices. The analogy holds.

But what scares me more than the “junk” we consume is what will happen if we just totally outsource our thinking. If we, as a society, don’t learn addition and multiplication, how can we even conceptualize quantity; all numbers become meaningless (think about *trillion*). If we don’t learn to read complex text and discuss it, we will only be able to understand simplistic ideas (think about modern election debates). If we default to allowing soulless AI agents to write everything we want to communicate, we will soon be only exchanging soullessness. Our very humanity is at risk.

And, I know you know this. I’m preaching to the choir, but sometimes even the choir needs to have the truth presented again amid the confusion and chaos of untethered postmodern, even post-human propaganda. We will not stop in our mission to bring this truth to all parents and families, teachers and schools. We must not think that we teach children to listen, speak, read, and write because it is useful in a merely practical sense. These are the basic skills that have always been known—and will continue—to cultivate better thinking and hopefully wiser and more virtuous people.

Encouragement for the Journey

Once upon a time, homeschool conventions used to be an opportunity to stock up on curriculum and a few supplemental items for the upcoming school year. After paging through catalogs and writing their lists, homeschooling parents would purposefully make their way to trusted publishers, dragging their loaded carts behind them. Before the days of podcasts and blogs, conventions provided an opportunity for families to listen to keynote speakers and attend workshops, soaking in the encouragement that would have to last for an entire year until the next convention.

After the dawn of the internet, conventions still serve as an opportunity to purchase materials for a new school year and listen to motivational speakers, but the necessity has seemed to wane. However, homeschool conventions still play an important role in the life of homeschool families and groups. Firmly believing in the foundation that conventions lay, IEW regularly attends conventions and hosts booths staffed by dedicated IEW employees and volunteers to serve customers from multiple arenas. Over the years, IEW booth workers have served customers

from a variety of backgrounds, from the brand-new homeschooling mom to the seasoned co-op teacher to the twelve-year-old boy eager to show Mr. Pudewa his paper. Enjoy IEW booth workers' memories and reflections from their convention experiences.

New-to-Homeschooling Families

How do new families find the IEW booth? Some parents systematically wander up and down rows of vendor booths, stopping at places that catch their attention. IEW's large display of curriculum is impressive and catches their eye. Other parents make a beeline for the booth after attending a workshop by Founder and Director Andrew Pudewa. Sometimes the workshop is writing-specific, but just as often he speaks words of wisdom about parenting, education, or life in general. Still others have talked to friends who have sung IEW's praises repeatedly. Knowing nothing else about the program except that everyone raves about it, they circle IEW's booth on their exhibit hall map and make a point to find their way.

For new families, often their first impression is that the booth is busy! IEW workers' attention is in demand as they shift from one customer to the next. However, the parents find that it is worth the wait when a worker can ask about their students and what their homeschooling needs are. The worker makes recommendations, circling pages in the magalog for later reference, and even offers some of her favorite resources and webpages.

One worker recalls a family with English language learners who had recently joined their home. Rather than convince the family to purchase writing materials, she encouraged the parents to continue to work on English skills, reading aloud often and using IEW's poetry memorization program. The parents were invited to come back to the booth the following year and ask, "What's next?"



Families of Students with Learning Differences

As noted in the article "Community and Connection" (page 35), families who educate students with learning differences often struggle to find community in their local homeschool groups but manage to find it at a homeschool convention. Still wary, they approach the IEW booth, having already convinced themselves that this award-winning writing curriculum couldn't possibly be for their family. Much to their surprise, they often encounter booth workers who not only know how IEW can work for their students but also have shared a similar learning situation with their own students.

One such IEW booth worker recalls rich conversations with discouraged parents at a homeschooling special needs conference. During the conference, she readily shared her own experiences with a homeschooling grandmother who desired to provide her grandchildren with the best education possible. Although the grandmother hoped to use IEW writing curriculum, she could not envision how IEW could work with the added challenges of dyslexia and autism. Moved to tears, she left the booth with concrete curriculum recommendations, tips for accommodation, and a promise that she could do it. A later email from this grandmother profusely thanked the booth worker because IEW was indeed working for her grandchildren.

Classroom Teachers

Hats off to classroom teachers of IEW! These individuals have taken on the tremendous task of educating a group of students. Sometimes this is through a formal co-op. Other times it is a group of moms who gather to learn IEW's methodology and to teach their students with one of IEW's courses around a dining room table. Booth workers with classroom experience can discuss scheduling and how to accommodate struggling learners or new students who join midyear. They provide practical tips for challenging an older or more experienced writing student. Co-op leaders and teachers browse the new courses in the booth and walk away excited for the upcoming school year.

Experienced IEW Families

Seasoned IEW families offer their own encouragement to booth workers in the middle of the crowded, busy convention hall. They share success stories of college acceptances, scholarship offers, publications in *Magnum Opus Magazine*, or their reluctant writer's heartfelt sigh, "Maybe this writing stuff isn't so bad after all." Booth workers celebrate each and every win. Many of these testimonies can be found on social media as videos or posts in Facebook groups.

These veteran homeschoolers are excited to see what new offerings IEW has for the upcoming year and will quietly settle into a corner of the booth to take notes while they page through books.

At times, an IEW booth will be staffed with one or more instructors from the IEW Online program. It brings these instructors great joy when one of their students takes the time to stop by the booth to meet them in person. Additionally, local volunteers in the booth have their own students stop by to greet their favorite teacher and ask what the plan is for the next year.

Fans of Andrew Pudewa

Of course, no homeschool convention is complete without a trip to the IEW booth to catch a sighting of the elusive Andrew Pudewa. Although his presence is in high demand as a speaker, he is equally sought after by families whose lives have been touched by his words and work. Parents of students with learning differences share that he is the reason they continued to homeschool. Parents of reluctant writers declare that the tears during language arts have stopped. Parents of graduated students express appreciation for the success their students are experiencing with university writing.

Perhaps even more endearing are the hopeful young students who tentatively ask, "Will Mr. Pudewa be here soon?" They are prepared to share a paragraph, recite a poem, or tell a joke. Regardless of how weary he might be, their beloved Mr. Pudewa smiles down at them with his full attention to praise them for their efforts and encourage them. Families appreciate and value these moments and the time he invests in them.

Do you see yourself in one of those groups? Maybe you consider yourself to be past the stage of needing a homeschool convention. We exhort you to take the time to return to the basics. You may find encouragement to stay the course because you are making a difference in the lives of your students. You may even find that you are the encouragement that someone else needs as they are on their own homeschooling journey.

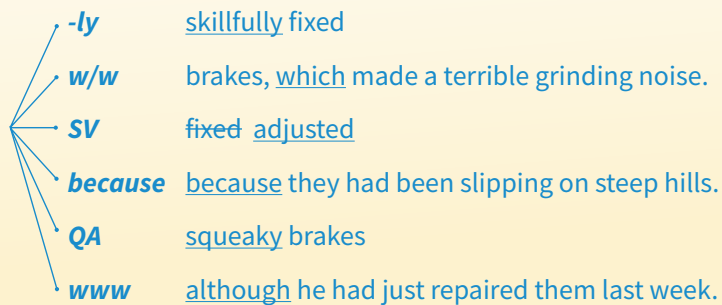

Style

In writing style refers to the language—words, phrases, and clauses—a writer uses to express ideas. The IEW dress-ups and sentence openers are descriptive words, phrases, and clauses that students add to a sentence. Throughout the year, students learn six dress-ups and six sentence openers.

Writing with EZ+1

To avoid overloading students with too many expectations and in the process demoralizing them, IEW created a reminder for how to introduce stylistic techniques. Called EZ+1, it is IEW's mnemonic that helps teachers remember to give students only one new stylistic technique at a time. Students want to do what they think they can do. When one stylistic technique is mastered, add in another. Your student's progress, not the checklist, determines the pace. IEW's progression of stylistic techniques begins with the dress-ups, words or clauses that students insert into the sentence to "dress up" writing. Next, students learn to incorporate sentence openers. It is important to not rush through the process. Students actually develop their skills more quickly when they are allowed to take the time they need to develop mastery. This is why EZ+1 is such a critical philosophy of IEW.
