Taking Notes for a Fused Outline

Notes from Tips and Tricks in Teaching Writing: Structure and Style for Unit 6

- 1. Begin with contrived, "guaranteed-to-work" materials.
 - a. Find a class set of source texts at or below reading level.
 - b. Everyone works on the same topic.
 - c. Walk through the entire process together at least one more time.
 - d. Assist students in finding appropriate materials.
- 2. Paper management: 11x17 tri-fold:

- 3. Save related topic-based paragraphs from Unit 4 or 6 to demonstrate Unit 8.
- 4. Documentation Pathway: Teach in Unit 6 or Unit 8, not all at once. Teach until that part becomes easy.
 - Step 1: bibliography
 - Step 2: integrated quotation with citation (endnotes preferred)
 - Step 3: inset quotation with citation (no quotation marks)
 - Step 4: paraphrase with citation
 - Step 5: in text citation or endnotes and Works Cited page (Choose a style, get a style sheet for books, periodicals, websites, etc. MLA formatting samples are provided in the *Classroom Supplement* e-resources.)
 - Step 6: informational footnote (falling out of favor)
- 5. Documentation Resources
 - a. most college and university websites (e.g., Purdue Online Writing Lab)
 - b. Cite it Right, Little Brown Handbook, Chicago Manual of Style, www.mla.org
