Under Mrs. Jain's leadership, IIFL Foundation's flagship education project, Sakhiyon Ki Baadi, has successfully enrolled over 36,000 out-of-school girls into 1,200 schools, primarily located in remote tribal villages of Rajasthan. The program provides educational opportunities for girls who have either never attended school or had their education interrupted. Currently, the initiative is active in the districts of Udaipur, Rajsamand, Pratapgarh, Banswara, Dungarpur, Sirohi, Pali, Jalore, Bhilwara, Jodhpur, and Ajmer.



In addition to Sakhiyon Ki Baadi, IIFL Foundation has initiated several other education-focused programs. The innovative 'Maa Bari' project has transformed 30 schools by providing modern infrastructure and facilities to support first-time learners from indigenous tribal communities in Rajasthan. Another notable initiative is 'Sampark,' which aims to improve English and Mathematics education for over 4 lakh students across more than 5,800 government schools in Rajasthan, with plans to expand to additional schools.

IIFL Foundation's 'Digital Shaala' project introduces over 5,000 students to digital pedagogy through the installation of TV sets equipped with AV learning material for grades 6 to 10. Additionally, the Sesame Community radio initiative has reached over 2.5 lakh students, providing foundational literacy. The foundation also operates 'Chauras,' a daycare-cum-literacy centre for children residing at construction sites.

Beyond education, IIFL Foundation is renowned for its impactful work in health, poverty alleviation, and climate action. The foundation was among the first CSR entities to introduce drone-based last-mile vaccine delivery and agricultural drone technology. Through its various initiatives, the foundation reaches over 10 lakh beneficiaries.

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
