About the PJC

The Panamerican Judo Confederation (PJC) is composed of the national judo federations of the Americas. Each national federation must be recognised by its Olympic Committee as the only official federation representing its country before international sporting bodies which, in turn, must have been recognised as such by the International Olympic Committee. The PJC comprises 32 national judo federations/associations and the IJF recognises the PJC as one of the five continental judo bodies.

The magnitude of judo development in the world has made the creation of the continental unions necessary, to implement the policy of the International Judo Federation and the International Olympic Committee.

Events in Lima Peru, in collaboration with the Oceania Judo Union



CAMPEONATO PANAMERICANO Y DE OCEANIA CADETES | JUNIOR | SENIOR 9-18 ABRIL

For the first time, the championships for two continents were held together, with Panamerica and Oceania sharing the tatami in the beautiful city of Lima. The Panamerican Judo Confederation, the Oceania Judo Union and the Peruvian Judo Federation organised this great event where more than 500 athletes from cadet, junior and senior categories participated. The championship was held at the Videna Sports Center 1 from 9th to 17th April.

The presence of world-class judoka such as Rafael Silva from Brazil (+100 kg), 2-time bronze medallist at the Olympic Games, London 2012 and Rio 2016, stood out. There was also Christa Deguchi of Canada (-57 kg), world champion in Baku 2018, and Mayra Aguiar of Brazil (-78 kg), 3-time bronze medallist at the Olympic Games, London 2012, Rio 2016 and Tokyo 2020.

Rafaela Silva of Brazil also participated (-57kg), gold medallist at the Rio 2016 Olympic Games, along with her compatriot, Beijing 2008 Olympic bronze medallist Ketleyn Cuadros (-63kg). Catherine Beauchemin-Pinard of Canada (-63kg), bronze medallist at Tokyo 2020, also competed.


Among the Peruvian judoka were Juan Miguel Postigos, three-time Olympian and bronze medallist at the 2011 Guadalajara Pan American Games; Yuliana Bolívar, bronze medallist at the Lima 2019 Pan American Games; and Yuta Galarreta, also bronze medallist at Lima 2019.

It is also important to mention that in the cadet, junior and senior events a refereeing exam was held for referees aspiring to earn their IJF international grade.

On 12th and 13th April, a training camp was held with two world renowned judoka: Nicolas Gil from Canada (Olympic medallist) and Daniela Krukower from Argentina (world medallist).




IJF-PJC-OJU Refereeing seminar and examination



















































Representation of Panamerica at Tokyo 2020 (24th - 31st July 2021)

PJC – PANAM SPORTS Training camp

Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic – 29th August to 6th September 2022

The camps of the PANAMERICAN JUDO CONFEDERATION (CPJ) and PANAM SPORTS seek to develop, integrate and empower new generations of athletes. In this structure, the development of high level competition begins and launches the sporting careers of our athletes in municipal, state, regional, national, international and continental competitions, including the Youth Olympic Games. Then in the following years they participate in the Junior Pan American Games, the elite Pan American Games, finally culminating the cycle at the Olympic Games.

From 29th August to 6th September 2022, in Santo Domingo in the Dominican Republic, a training camp for cadets and juniors was held, sponsored by PANAM SPORTS, PJC and FEDOJUDO, with 61 registered participants from 10 countries, including 17 coaches and 44 official athletes (the local headquarters had more representatives). There were daily training sessions with practical and theoretical classes for young athletes and their coaches, plus lectures in the evenings with core issues for the comprehensive training and improvement of young athletes and teachers.
