1967	Lough Erne
21 July 1968	Lough Erne, 9 miles in 5 hours and 20 minutes
25 August 1968	Mullaghmore to Bundoran, 9 miles in 6 hours 15 minutes
7 June 1970	Lough Erne, 9 miles in 6 hours 15 minutes
13 August 1970	Failed English Channel, England to France, 18 hours 48 minutes (ordered out on the Goodwin Sands)
22 May 1971	Charity Swim, 800 lengths of 33 $\frac{1}{3}$ yard pool in 12 hours
11 July 1971	Charity Swim, Lough Erne, 9 miles in 5 hours 42 minutes
1 July 1972	Charity Swim, 1000 lengths of 33 $\frac{1}{3}$ yard in 14 hours
13 August 1972	English Channel, England to France in 18 hours 11 minutes
7 July 1973	Charity Swim, Portora Pool, 6 hours swim
11 August 1973	North Channel, Ireland to Scotland in 18 hours 27 minutes
24 August 1974	Lough Erne, Enniskillen to Belleek in 10 hours
17 July 1975	Bristol Channel, England to Wales in 14 hours 26 minutes
10 March 1979	Sponsored Jog, Belleek to Enniskillen
1 August 1982	Mullaghmore to Bundoran (Donegal Bay) in 6 hours 53 minutes
1984	Hall of Fame, Fort Lauderdale in Florida
