

## **Abstract Guidelines**

**Deadline : February 15<sup>th</sup>**

### **1. Formatting and Structure**

Abstracts must be written in English.

Abstract must follow the required structure: **Background, Methods, Results, Conclusion, and Military Impact.**

The use of abbreviations and acronyms should be kept to a minimum.

Abstracts should not contain any tables, figures, or references.

### **2. Content**

Abstracts should :

- Present the essential background and the main scientific findings to be discussed.
- Emphasize the military relevance, particularly in the context of high-intensity conflicts.

Please do not include grant acknowledgements, or copyright or trademark symbols in your abstract. However, this information will be required in the actual oral or poster presentation.

### **3. Length (not including spaces)**

- **Title** : up to 200 characters
- **Abstract body** : up to 3,000 characters
- **Keywords** : up to 5

### **4. Reporting Standards**

When applicable, abstracts should include:

- **Sample size**. Preliminary studies with smaller samples are welcome but must be clearly identified as such in the title.
- **Statistical information**: report the statistical tests used, confidence intervals, p-values, and effect sizes.

Well-powered negative studies are encouraged and valued.

### **5. Submission requirements**

- **Registration**: Accepted abstracts will only be scheduled once registration (and payment) is complete.
- **Authors and affiliations**
  - The presenting author must be the first named author on the abstract.
  - **Affiliations**: Each author should list only one institutional affiliation (Institution, Country).
- **Originality**: Submissions must be original and not previously published.
- **Ethics statement**: Authors must confirm that all experimental procedures were approved by an ethics committee or complied with institutional and national regulations.
