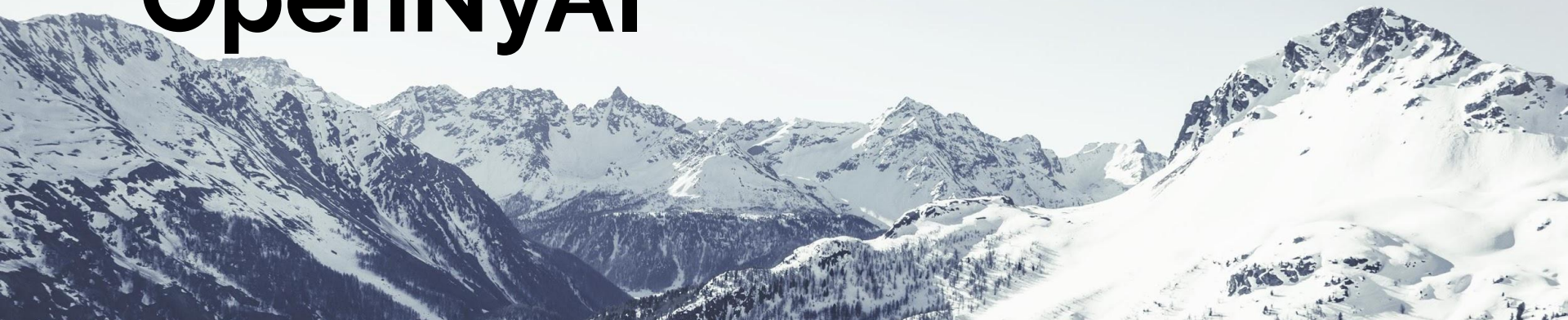

Legal Named Entities

- **Named entity** is a real-world object, such as a person, location, organization, product, etc., that can be denoted with a proper name.
- Legal Named Entities are named entities which are specific to legal domain
- Court Judgments typically start with a preamble which provides the information about parties, court, judges etc.
- Preamble is followed by the main text till the end of the judgment

COMMON GUIDELINES



- Mark the entities at the word boundaries
 - Common word boundaries are space, comma, colon etc. (Leading and trailing boundaries to be skipped)
- Person Names:
 - Don't include prefixes like Dr. , Mr. , Shri., Smt. etc
 - If you see an Alias like "Himmu @ Hemchand" then mark the complete text
 - Don't include commas and dots before and After the names
 - Don't include "the" before names of acts and courts.
 - If you see multiple names separated by commas then mark each of them separately
- Noisy sentences/text
 - If there are page numbers or footers or case numbers in between the sentences then reject those sentences
 - If you see sentence which belong to preamble while annotating judgement text then reject it. And vice versa
 - If you see text that is neither preamble nor judgement text then reject it

PREAMBLE ENTITIES



1. COURT



- Name of the court which has delivered the current judgement
- Complete name of the court with bench (if present) should be selected
 - References to courts like “the high court” or “Banglore court” etc. should not be marked
- For tribunals, the location is also important
- Terms “Apex Court”, “supreme court”, “Constitutional Bench” should be marked as COURT
- All judicial posts where geography is mentioned are courts eg. First add sessions judge, Jabalpur
- Dont include jurisdiction details like “Criminal Appellate Jurisdiction”etc.

2. JUDGE NAME



- Name of the judges from current case
- Don't include Honourable , Mr. before the names
- Don't include the J. after the names
- Dont include judges from foreign courts E.g. "Lord Wellesly" should not be marked
- People who are assisting judges (e.g. accountant member) should not be marked as judge

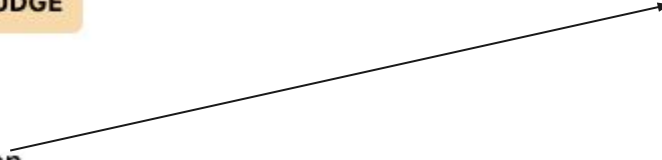

3. PETITIONER NAME



- Name of the petitioners / appellants /revisionist from current case
- Include all the petitioners that are mentioned
- If the petitioner is post or authority then all the details including address should be included
 - E.g. “assistant commissioner income tax office, delhi, 110095” should be marked completely
 - But don't include addresses for people names
- Don't mark the represented by details
- Don't mark the son of (s/o) or w/o words
- Dont mark the corrected names
- Mark the alias as well. E.g. “Kalia @Killu”

4. RESPONDENT NAME



- Name of the respondents / defendants /opposition from current case
- Include all the respondents that are mentioned
- If the petitioner is post or authority then proper details should be included
 - E.g. "The Chief Engineer, Water Resource Organization, Chepauk, Chennai-5" , "Collector, Aurangabad, Maharashtra"
- Dont mark the represented by details
- Dont mark the son of (s/o) or w/o words
- Dont mark the corrected names
- Mark the alias as well. E.g. "Kalia @Killu"

- Name of the lawyers from both the parties
- Dont include posts like APP, PP
- Dont include words like Adv.

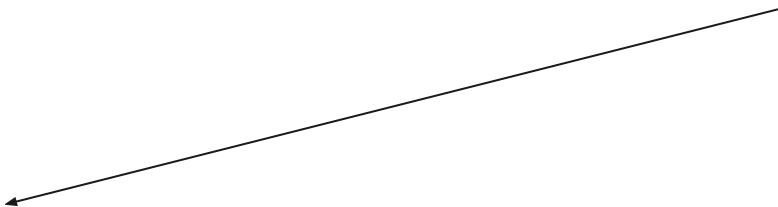

JUDGEMENT TEXT ENTITIES



1. COURT



- Name of all the courts present in the text
- Complete name of the court with bench (if present) should be selected
- For tribunals, the location is also important
- Refrain from marking courts e.g. high court, trial court if the location is not mentioned
- The current court as well as all other courts mentioned should be picked
- All judicial posts where geography is mentioned are courts eg. First add sessions judge, Jabalpur
- Only include supreme court of foreign jurisdiction (E.g. "American Supreme Court"). Exclude foreign lower courts like high court, district courts

2. ORG



- Other organization names that don't belong to any of court
- E.g. Banks, PSU, Police stations, private companies, tax departments, forensic labs, commissions, temple trusts, schools
- Place names like “Golden temple” or names of industrial zones or tech parks like “Manyata Tech Park” or “DLF cyber hub” should not be marked
- Complete names of State government, Indian central govt, Local bodies are ORG
 - E.g. “Income tax department, jabalpur”
- Incomplete names like “Income Tax Office” should not be marked

EXAMPLES OF INCORRECTLY MARKED ORG

Significantly, **Section 113** **PROVISION** of the Act enables **the State** **Government** **ORG** to prescribe the conditions for the issuance of permits for transport vehicles by **the State** **ORG** or **Regional** **Transport Authorities** **ORG** .

Since specific name of the state is not mentioned, this is not proper name. None of these are ORG

Section 231 **PROVISION** of the **IBC** **STATUTE** bars the jurisdiction of civil courts in respect of any matter in which the Adjudicating Authority i.e. the **NCLT** **ORG** or the **NCLAT** **ORG** is empowered by the Code to pass any Order.

NCLT & NCLAT are tribunals and hence should be marked as COURT

The aforesaid judgment rendered by the learned Division Bench of this Court in the case of Khas Mahal Citizen Welfare Society (supra) has also been upheld by a judgment rendered by the Hon'ble **Apex Court** **COURT**, reported in **2019(1) PLJR 628 (SC)** **PRECEDENT**. ↵ ↵

3.DATE



- All the dates mentioned in the judgment
- Does not include time frames like today,the other day,six months etc.
- Only years or months or days mentioned should not be marked as date
- Date consists of day,month and year altogether

4. STATUTE



- Name of the act or law mentioned in the judgement
- Includes all the laws, acts etc.
- It also includes the constitution of India if it is referred to
- Acts 2003 etc. are not statutes

The **73rd Amendment** **STATUTE** came to the **Constitution** **STATUTE** by way of amendment under **Article 368** **PROVISION** and, therefore, it can not be said to be a basic feature of the **Constitution** **STATUTE** .

5.PROVISION



- Sections, sub-sections, articles, orders, rules under a statute
- Included the names of all sections as well as sub-sections, including Order no., Rule no., and Schedule
- Multiple comma-separated provisions are marked as a single entity.Eg. section 420,435 and 202

6. PRECEDENT



- All the past court cases referred in the judgement as precedent
- They typically are supreme court cases and judgement refer to them
- Precedent consists of party names + citation(optional) or case number (optional)
- Either party names or Citation is mandatory. If only case number is mentioned then it should be marked as CASE_NUMBER and not PRECEDENT
- Foreign cases should not be marked
- A reference to case mentioned earlier with only one party name is written in the current sentence should not be marked as precedent E.g. "Khas Welfare Citizen Society (supra)"

Again an instructive insight can be obtained from the observations of Justice Holmes OTHER_PERSON of the American Supreme Court COURT in the case of State of Georgia v. Tennessee Copper Co. [51 L Ed 1038 PRECEDENT : 206 US 230 (1906) PRECEDENT : 27 CARDINAL SCR 618 CARDINAL], which was a case involving air pollution in Georgia GPE caused by the discharge of noxious gases from the defendant's plant in Tennessee GPE .

- Don't mark the titles like Dr./Ms.
- We are not marking if a person is accused or complainant unless the given sentence sufficiently mentions that they are respondents or petitioner in the present case

9. CASE NUMBER



- All the case numbers mentioned in the judgment where party names and citation is not provided
- Included case numbers of the previous cases as well as the current case
- Lower court case numbers
- FIR number ,chargesheet number or Post mortem report etc. number should not be marked as case_number

10. JUDGE



- Name of the judge of the current as well as previous cases
- Include all the judges
- Dont include judges from foreign courts E.g. "Lord Wellesly" should not be marked

EXAMPLES OF CORRECTLY MARKED JUDGE

Hon'Ble Mr. Justice **G.P.Mittal JUDGE**

In the case of **Union of India v. Exide Industries Ltd.**⁵ **PRECEDENT**, the **Supreme Court** **COURT**, (in the decision authored by Hon'ble Shri Justice **A.M. Khanwilkar** **JUDGE**) has reiterated that the examination of the Court begins with a presumption in favour of constitutionality.

EXAMPLES OF INCORRECTLY MARKED JUDGE

JUDGMENT G.P. MITTAL, JUDGE J.

In a classic passage **Lord Cairns** JUDGE stated the principle thus ; "If the person sought to be taxed comes within the letter of the law he must be taxed, however great the hardship may appear to the judicial mind to be.

Foreign Judges should not be marked

11. WITNESS NAME



- Name of all the witness mentioned
- Generally identified by keywords like PW

EXAMPLES OF CORRECTLY MARKED WITNESS NAME

the husband of the additional 3rd plaintiff and Sri. A.P.Khan WITNESS ,

- Name of the all the person that are not included in petitioner,respondent,judge and witness
- Do not mark titles like Mr./Dr. Etc
- Official Posts are not other person

EXAMPLES OF INCORRECTLY MARKED OTHER PERSON

The petitioner, Dr. **Y.Adilakshmi** OTHER_PERSON, who is serving on the post of Civil Assistant Surgeon, Hyderabad, has filed the present writ petition challenging the order, dated **22.02.2017** DATE allocating her to the State of Andhra Pradesh.

Should be PETITIONER

The **Director of Town and Country Planning, Madras,** OTHER_PERSON addressed the **Commissioner, Thoothukudi Panchayat** OTHER_PERSON vide letter dated **23.02.1987** DATE, by which the consent was granted for construction and commissioning of the petitioner in the land in **SIPCOT industrial complex** ORG.

Only proper names are other persons. So "Town and Country planning Madras" and "Thoothukudi panchayat" are ORG

Not ORG as this is name of place

14. GPE



- Geopolitical locations which include names of countries, states, cities, districts and villages
- Name of organizations, streets, chowks etc should not be included.
- Pin codes are also not marked
- If multiple GPE are written one after the other then they should be marked separately

EXAMPLES OF CORRECTLY MARKED GPE



with her mother who had a separate residential premises elsewhere and further that the deceased tenant **Sumitra Devi Poddar** **OTHER_PERSON** died not in the suit premise but at **Khagadia** **GPE** , **Bihar** **GPE** , as would be borne out from Exhibit 1.

It is the case of the petitioner that the petitioner was elected as a member of **Town Panchayath, Sargur** **ORG** from ward No.11 of **Sargur Town** **GPE** , **H.D.Kote Taluk** **GPE** , **Mysuru District** **GPE** and has been serving the public since 2015.

EXAMPLES OF INCORRECTLY MARKED GPE

The National Highways Authority **ORG** being aggrieved by the enhancement granted by the Arbitrator approached **the District Court **COURT**** , **Nagpur **GPE**** by filing proceedings under **Section 34 **PROVISION**** of the Act of 1996.

“District Court, Nagpur” is one entity and should be marked as COURT. It should not be splitted like this
