Over 300 types of machines, including backhoes, excavators, tractors, and diesel engines. Products are sold in more than 150 countries. **Joseph Cyril Bamford, CBE** (21 June 1916 – 1 March 2001) was a British businessman. He was the founder of J.C. Bamford Excavators Limited (JCB), a manufacturer of heavy equipment.

JCB machine prices in India vary significantly by model, with backhoe loaders like the JCB 3DX ranging from approximately ₹35-38 Lakh, and excavators like the JCB NXT 140 costing around ₹45-47 Lakh. The JCB 4DX backhoe loader is priced between ₹36-40 Lakh, while a JCB 100C1 excavator is available for about ₹26-28 Lakh.

A JCB is operated using multiple levers and controls, depending on the specific model and function. For a backhoe loader, the left lever controls the boom (**moving it up, down, and side-to-side**), the right lever controls the stick and bucket (moving them closer, further away, and curling the bucket), and stabilizer controls are in the center of the armrests. Modern machines may also feature lever steer for steering, which is a separate, single lever for steering the wheels.

JCB speed varies significantly by model, with the Fastrac achieving record-breaking speeds of up to 153.771 mph for a modified version, while the standard agricultural Fastrac models typically top out around 70 km/h (43 mph). In contrast, a standard JCB 3DX backhoe loader has a maximum speed of about 40 km/h (25 mph). The

JCB 3DX backhoe loader has different top speeds depending on the model and market; older or base models might have a top speed around 32 km/hr (20 mph), while enhanced versions like the 3DX Plus can reach up to 36 km/hr (22.4 mph), and even higher speeds like 40 km/hr (25 mph) or 50 km/hr (31 mph) are available on some variants.

Factors influencing top speed

- **Engine power:** Higher engine power and torque generally allow for higher travel speeds.
- **Transmission type:** Synchroshuttle and other advanced transmissions can handle higher speeds and improve on-site efficiency.
- **Model variant:** Different models, such as the 3DX, 3DX Plus, or 3DX Xtra, are designed with distinct specifications, including varying top speeds.
- **Market:** The availability of certain speed ratings

can differ by region.

JCB machines like the Fastrac tractor can reach speeds between 65 km/h and 103.6 km/h (40 to 64 mph), with record-breaking models achieving over 218 km/h (135 mph). These are all diesel-powered; there are no common petrol-driven models for standard construction and agricultural work, as diesel engines are preferred for their torque and fuel efficiency.

Standard models

Typical JCB backhoe loaders and other construction equipment have a maximum speed of around 65 km/h (40 mph).

Some 100 and 3000 series Fastrac tractors can reach 75 km/h (47 mph).

Record-breaking models

The world's fastest tractor, a modified JCB Fastrac, has a top speed of 218 km/h (135 mph), powered by a 1016 hp, 7.2-liter, 6-cylinder JCB Dieselmax engine.

- for pulling heavy loads and operating at low speeds.
- Diesel engines are also more fuel-efficient for these types of applications, which is a critical factor in construction and farming.

The speed set was 350.092mph, and their record still stands. The JCB Dieselmix had two 750-horsepower engines and four-wheel-drive. A JCB's lifting capacity varies significantly by model, with JCB backhoe loaders like the 3DX lifting around 1,490-1,650 kg and JCB telehandlers like the 540-70 lifting up to 4,000 kg. Other factories produce a variety of machines and fabrications, supporting India's role as a key manufacturing and export hub for JCB and have 22 plants on four continents and more than 750 dealers worldwide. forklifts, with some models capable of lifting loads of 3,000 kg and more.




Figure-7: JCB in action.
