Additional Case Information:

One pen RTR on site - pushed on for harvesting on 10/03/2026. Fish seen shoaling well and looked in good condition.

Input 17/02/2026 from Otter Ferry. Plans to have ~4 pens of halibut on site and next scheduled transfer w/b 23/03/2026.

Business is to sample the fish every 6 weeks to compare with Otter Ferry, Norway and Canada.

3 halibut were observed - swimming and looking well.

Whilst on site, a cage push from Kames Bay (West) onto Kames Bay (East) was observed. These rainbow trout were due to be harvested the following day. Based on the harvesting procedures/details supplied by the business, towing pens containing Rainbow Trout from Kames Bay (West) to Kames Bay (East) constitutes a breach of authorisation conditions, as this effectively stocks the site with a species it is not authorised to hold. Currently, the site is only authorised to stock Atlantic Halibut. An authorisation amendment application is required to be submitted to request that Rainbow Trout are added to the authorisation. The application should be accompanied by updated supporting documentation reflecting accurate operational activities at the site. This includes relevant SOPs (e.g. sea lice counting procedures for rainbow trout, harvesting procedures, cleaning and disinfection protocols for equipment moved between sites), as well as the BMP, VHWP, FMS and any other documents requiring revision. Any updates should clearly describe site operations to enable the Fish Health Inspectorate to assess any associated disease risks arising from current practices.


Case completion report

Inspection under the Aquatic Animal Health (Scotland) Regulations 2009

The above site was inspected, in accordance with the Aquatic Animal Health (Scotland) Regulations 2009.

All epidemiological units were inspected. On this occasion no samples were taken for disease analysis. The Inspector did not observe any clinical signs associated with the listed diseases as described in the Aquatic Animal Health (Scotland) Regulations 2009.

Records

The surveillance frequency category of the site was assessed as medium. An inspection under the Aquatic Animal Health (Scotland) Regulations 2009 will be conducted every second year. The category of the site will be reassessed on a routine basis and updated as required.

The information required for the public record of aquaculture production businesses regarding this site was verified and where necessary updated. The following records were also inspected to ensure that the conditions of authorisation for your Aquaculture Production Business (APB) are being met:

Aquaculture animal and aquaculture animal product movement records were inspected and appeared to be adequately maintained.

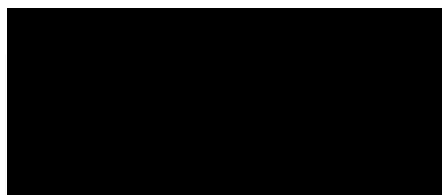
