Additional Case Information:

Mortality generally low across the site. Very few moribund fish seen - a few in the Comphatch with fungus and less than 10 across the parr and smolt unit tanks. One smolt section completely empty and works going on on roof so tanks not inspected. All other tanks and hatcheries inspected.

Morts incinerated on site, culled fish go for processing for pet food - Tinyfoods.

Morts (approximate average by tank) - Q3 26 - all weeks less than 0.01%, Q2 26 - all ~0.1-0.2% per week, Q2 27 - week 15 - ~5% egg picking, Q1 26 - < 0.01%, Q1 27 - wk 12 - 1% egg picking. Q4 26 - ~1.4% week 6 (59800 morts - 4333243 eggs) and similar for wk 9. Majority of morts have been due to egg picking, handling and a bit of fungus.

Medicines stored in chemical bund area - one in each section for daily use.

The separate units on site are held at different temperatures: Smolt unit - 13.9, parr unit - 13.8, hatcheries - 3.8, 3.4 and 10.7. Site thermometer used for biosecurity - calibrated regularly and daily performance checks.

Inspection under the Aquatic Animal Health (Scotland) Regulations 2009

The above site was inspected in accordance with the Aquatic Animal Health (Scotland) Regulations 2009.

All stocked epidemiological units were inspected. On this occasion no samples were taken for disease analysis. The Inspector did not observe any clinical signs associated with the listed diseases as described in the Aquatic Animal Health (Scotland) Regulations 2009.

Records

The surveillance frequency category of the site was assessed as high. An inspection under the Aquatic Animal Health (Scotland) Regulations 2009 will be conducted annually. The category of the site will be reassessed on a routine basis and updated as required.
