EDITORIAL

The repression is on. The Superior Court of New Jersey, Chancery Division, has found the John Lennon/Yoko Ono nude photo album cover obscene. Judge Herbert Mintz Wednesday morning ruled that, "Community standards are such in New Jersey that they deem it obscene." It is the opinion of a majority of lawyers in New Jersey that even the Supreme Court of New Jersey will probably affirm the Lower Court's decision if it is appealed.

In the wake of all this repression, EVO was busted last week in West End, New Jersey for the January 31st issue in which appeared a photo of a **behind** from Grove Press' "Erotic Art" book. This issue was confiscated from a Head Shop called "The Conspiracy" and the owner arrested for selling obscene material. His trial will take place on Tuesday, February 17th, 9 a.m. at the Longbranch Municipal Court, Longbranch, New Jersey.

The piece in which the "photo in question" appeared, was entitled Fucking Through The Ages by Alex Gross. It was not just a piece on Grove Press' Erotic Art book but a plea to the populace at large to allow the erotica art show, which was presented in Lund Sweden by Doctors Eberhard and Phyllis Kronhausen and which made up a large part of the book, to be allowed to be shown in this country. In the interest of our readers, I quote a small section from Mr. Gross' article:

"The freedom which not only the young but all sections of the population have won in the last few years is not so easily pushed aside, and certainly not by a weak president chosen by a minority in a dubious election. The direction is not backwards. From the Swinging Sixties we must all go foward together in this supremely suitable year of sixty-nine into an era of even greater freedom and self-liberation, the Sensual, Sensuous Seventies. As the French artist Andre Mason told the Kronhausens on their arrival in Paris during the spring uprising, 'The real revolution is not here in the streets. It has no direction and will lead nowhere. The real revolution today is taking place up there in that museum in Lund. The fire you have kindled with that exhibition will in time destroy the old order more effectively than anything else.'"

MIDEAST FULCRUM BALANCES PRESSURE

United Nations, N. Y. (EVO) - The Mideast is acting as a fulcrum for the weights and pressures of the major powers, and it is probable that a new world political structure will be created from these forces.

The political structure of the world today is very much in a state of flux with extraordinary fluidity as evidenced by the nearly simultaneous stirrings in Hanoi, Saigon, Moscow, Washington, Tel Aviv, Cairo and Peking. Smaller ripples are being felt in the East and West European capitals.

From information gleaned here at United Nations headquarters it appears that the major trouble spots of the world are about to be dealt with.

The Mideast dangers seemed to have threatened the two superpowers long enough, and the two appear set on ending their confrontation.

It seems as if the Americans and the Russians agreed that a Soviet presence was going to be established in the Arab world. In exchange, the United States has the pressure of war taken away.

The Communist Chinese enter the stage in Warsaw on Feb. 20 to remind the United States that no peace exists in Asia unless China calls it peace. And Asia still includes South Vietnam.

So the United States wants to change the shooting war to a peaceful competition so she can solve domestic problems, but thus implying that Washington fully intends to keep her foot or the Asia mainland, washed by the Pacific, an American lake.

There is also evidence that China is willing to make an accomodation because she needs technological help. Mao, via the cultural revolution, has raised the conscious collective of the Chinese masses who are now better able to face the world beyond the Great Wall.

The war between the racial brothers of Israel and the Arabs is a tragic one if only for the dreams it destroyed. But it has been contained for fear of starting a worldwide fire.


The movement toward settlement most recently started during the Christmas holidays. The Russians proposed that the Nov. 22 Security Council resolution on the Mideast is a good solution: seized lands exchanged for recognition. Next the French call for an imposed settlement created by the Big Four. And the British have gone along. old hands at desert intrigue. Recently, the Americans have endorsed the plan to have the French, British, Russian and American representatives at the United Nations draft a settlement plan. And U Thant, the Secretary General, has annoitted the rite. Later, the people's of the world, through their appointed representatives at the General Assembly, will endorse the plan and calm shall appear in the land.

In the meanwhile, it has been diffi cult to make arrangements between the United States and the Soviet because Vietnam keeps them on edge, especially because of Red China.

Vietnam has proven to be no test at all, unless one considers a test to in clude a standoff. Vietnam is a stalemate. For both sides. It has taken 20 years of war, and neither side won. Now they are both weary of it. Every ounce of propaganda has been milked.

Shoot the cow.

So the Paris peace talks suddenly progress, military problems to be taken up first, if the United States has its way. Then the political problems. But seeing eternity, the Communist-Asia side wants political matters resolved first for politics in the essence. "We



will never give up on the battlefield what we can get at the conference table," Chairman Mao says.

But there is real movement, despite mass media rhetoric emanating from Paris.

The Russians, it is clearly understood, want talks very soon on disarmament measures. The United States, the de facto leader in the arms race, is torn between its desire for peace and the money it makes from guns. But the proposed ABM system is the last straw, it seems to the Russians. The costs involved are worth a generation of drudgery for the Russian people.

But disarmament persists in being the only key which can now unlock peace. And the peace can not be piecemeal. It can only be global.

These forces are the weights and pressures balanced on the lever that rests atop the fulcrum of the Mideast.

The balancing act is now to be held in the United Nations, giving the world organization a prominence that it has not enjoyed in a score of years. It makes a new level of international consciousness, in a sense giving the UN its graduation diploma, the creden tials to play power politics.

Cairo's recent statements referring to ending the "state of belligerency" also indicates that the Arab leaders have finally seen the mess.

And despite Abba Eban's recent pronouncements slighting the UAR proposals, the Israeli's certainly know a deal is about to be struck. And deals mean that you have to give something to get something back.

TIBETAN RITUAL ART HEADED HERE

New York (EVO) - Ancient Tibetan ritual art pieces, many of which have never been seen in the United States, are to be put on display her from April 10 to June 28, the exhibit's sponsors, The Asia Society, have an nounced.

It is thought that this exhibit of ancient painting, temple scrolls, bronze sculpture and ritual implements is the first such collection to be shown in the United States.

The exhibit is being staged and organized by Dr. Pratapaditya Pal, Keepor of Indian Art at Boston's Museum of Fine Arts. Dr. Pal has been glean ing material for the spring show from museum's around the world, but especially from Tibet House in New Dehli.

FLORIDA STUDENTS GET AN OMBUDSMEN

Miami, Fla. (EVO) — Florida State University has created a "collective ombudsman" which has the power to investigate all students, complaints and review all rules and regulations or policies which affect student life.

At Florida, a group of students will, as a group, play the ombudsmen roles.

But at the University of Texas College of Arts and Sciences, a senior law student was appointed the student ombudsman. The dean of the college said that the ombudsman has the power to investigate student grievances and to recommend solutions.

COMPUTER IMPLICATIONS TO BE SCRUTINIZED

Manchester, England (EVO) — The sociologic implications inherent in the age of the computer are to undergo a through examination during the month-long Datafair to be held here next August.

These implications have been for the most part relegated to the periphery of the cyrbernetic revolution, at least as far as the technicians are concerned. It is this situation which the Datafair organizers wish to correct.

The discussions of the sociological effects of computers are to be centered on practical problems rather than theoretical questions, the fair's organizers said.

The agenda now includes seminars on the effect on the freedom of the individual with the introduction of computers in industry and government, and the social and organizational effects of introducing advanced computer systems.

Datafair also is to include a symposium on data processing in business and industry.

BRITISH BRAINS ARE FILLING UP

London (EVO) - A recent government statistical report revealed that Great Britain is now spending about 2.7 per cent of her gross national product on scientific research.

The pounds for research are greater than the funds provided by any other Western European nation. The report said that 180,000 scientists would be working in England by the year 1970. double the number that were working 12 years ago.

BABY PRODUCTION CALLED "CRIPPLING"

Washington, D. C. (EVO) - Robert Strange McNamara, the president of the World Bank, has warned that the enormous increases in world population today are having a "crippling effect on the economies" of developing nations.

The former secretary of defense warned of what he thought could happen if population growth was left uncontrolled.

During a speech last month, McNamara said, "Take two developing countries with similar standards of living, each of a birth rate of 40 per thousand - what it actually is in Mexico and India — and estimate what would happen if the birth rate of one of these countries, in a period of 25 years, were to be halved to 20 per thousand — a rate well above that in most developed nations. The country which lowered its population growth would raise its standard of living by 40% above the other in a single generation."

U.N. NARCOS ACT ON LSD

Geneve, Switzerland (EVO) - The United Nations Commission on Narcotics meeting here has drafted a 20article protocol on the control of psychotropic drugs which are not now under international controls.

The Commission is advocating "severe measures of control" of "such dangerous substances as LSD."

The protocol is now being transmitted to member government for their comments, and the document will be considered by the Commission when it meets next year.

The Commission said that it has found psychotropic drugs are being increasingly abused, "especially by young people." It hopes to impose import and export regulations, and establish a campaign against abuse of these drugs.

MORE BOMBINGS IN MICHIGAN By Michael Dover

ANN ARBOR, Mich. (LSN) - A National Guard garage and a business administration building in Kalamazoo, and the state capitol in Lansing were the targets of the latest bombing in Michigan.

The Kalamazoo bombings occurred within 20 minutes of each other in the early morning hours, but police say they have established no connection between them. A gallon jug of gasoline with a wick did \$12,000 worth of damage to the National Guard building, destroying a jeep and damaging another, and causing extensive smoke damage.

The fire bomb sent through a window of North Hall, which houses mainly business administration classrooms and is next to the ROTC building, failed to explode. The fire at the state capitol was quickly put out.

Workers there described the bomber as a tall blond "hippie type." In Kalamazoo a woman said she observed three men in a car speeding away after the National Guard garage bombing.

In August and September, dynamite bombs hit draft boards, police cars, military vehicles, a CIA office and a research lab in the Ann Arbor and Detroit area. These bombings resulting in the arrest of 13 street people on

charges of conspiring to place explosives in order to commit property damage; all but two have been bailed out. They are awaiting trial, set for later this month.

NASA STEPS UP by Don Katzman

After the hasty circumstances that led to the creation of The National Aeronautics Space Administration, congress and the country began to question the authenticity of NASA as a practical program which could substantiate the endowment of large funds for its existence and continuation. NASA tried to meet this question of practibility by creating the NASA technology Utilization program whose four basic functions were to:

1) increase the return on the national investment in aerospace research by encouraging additional use of the results.

2) Shorten the time gap between the discovery of new knowledge and its effective use in the market place.

3) Aid the movement of new knowledge across industrial, disciplinary and regional boundaries, and

4) contribute to the development of better means of transferring knowledge from its points of orgin to other points of potential use.

In its headlong rush to substantiate its existence, NASA has created a program that is perhaps the most important creation ever to come out of the American space program. If we were to be asked what discoveries or inventions in this century were the most significant we would most likely reply - nuclear energy and the space rocket, but neither of these are more significant or have done more to change our society than the invention of the computer. Without it, space travel is impossible and the practical applications of nuclear energy would be too slow and painstaking ending in a process too costly to adopt in the near future or at all. Before the computer's advent, it took an average of 126 years before an invention found its application. Now with the computer and NASA's system of storing, retrieving and transfering space-research knowledge into a practical process applicable to earth-oriented problems, an invention can find its application in a matter of years or months. Some 33 broad technological areas have benefited from this flow of information. Commercial applications have appeared in almost their original form in such areas as: electronic components and systems, instrumentation, telemetry, basic and applied research; development of new and improved processes communications and packaging. Other contributions were stimulation of both and techniques especially in the field of medicine; increased availability of materials along with lab and test equipment and cost reduction.

This system of storing, retrieving and economic workings of the United States. Firstly, it has shifted the emphasis of government from a system that merely legislates and executes to one that actively influences and creates the only product that man will ever need - knowledge. Secondly, it has given man, in general, a weapon he can apply to problems that already seem to be overwhelming with instant computerized solutions that can be adopted at the time. Thidly, it can bring the industrial segment of the economy, which falls behind the times due to the fact it will not take the risk in seeking newer products and industries back on the track by creating new products for its commercial use.

None of the above theories are mere conjecture. The influences are already at work in the world. The Department of Defense, the Atomic Energy Com-

mission and NASA are already increasing their programs of information participation and application. Congress is considering a tax incentive program for those private and industrial segments of the economy willing to produce the new found products for the economy. NASA itself, has stimulated discussion and experimentation in advanced computer theory which is of great importance to the future of man among them being the development of instructional systems that will provide optimun conditions for effective learning to carry out courses in specialized training; the attempt to provide machines with the ability to act in ways that are called intelligent when people act in similar ways and under similar conditions; the best possible construction of a system that will allow many users simultaneous access to a computer such as the Los Angeles Police Department using a teletype in connection with a crime-report-retrivial study or a Veterans' Administration hospital participating in a study on patient - data automation; and the designing of a Common Programming Support System for use by programmers in constructing programs systems which will reduce the time and cost of providing reliable operational systems for Federal Government programs as well as non-government use.

In NASA's rush to find a way out of this world to the moon, it has fortunately found a way out of the ecological jeorpardy that has befallen man and his planet Earth, but the question still remains, How will all this instant transfer of knowledge and application of solutions to overwhelming problems affect Man and his place in the universe? The answer to this question can only be provided by the future, but in general, we can state that it will most likely transfer him as symbol of laborer, provider, and destroyer into one who is, more and more, in control of his own creation.

THE CIRCLING GAME BEGINS

WASHINGTON, D.C. (EVO) — The circling game has begun as the United States and the Soviet Union stomp and growl into position for their negotiations which seem likely to begin next month.

Ostensibly, the negotiations are to be conducted by U.S. Ambassador to the United Nations Charles Yost and his counterparts from Moscow, Paris and London over the issue of the Mideast. They are to meet at the U.N.

But as is customary in political dealings, the main issue is never discussed. That is like France when it had a vote of confidence on whether French settlers could legally bear guns, but in truth, the vote was whether to engage in the Algerian war.

The real issue between the Russians and Americans in the Mideast is disarmament. And the Chinese are into the game too.

Canada, on the almost eve of President Nixon's scheduled trip through west Europe, declares that it is actively seeking full diplomatic relations with the People's Republic of China.

China has been lambasting the United States in a relative whisper, merely reciting the catechism of anti-imperialism, in a sense stating all these things now in order to clear the decks for the Warsaw talks that are to start Feb. 20.

Nixon's State Department advisers are stating publically that they do not know what specific questions the Chinese wish to discuss-aside from the acceptance of the Bandung Resolution which calls for non-belligerance and peaceful co-existence.

The Chinese have prepared their position by exploding another H-bomb and letting it be known that it is ahead of its planned program in ICBM ability. Peking is hence, ready to talk about disarmament for she has her deterrent.

Meanwhile, the West puts a bit of pressure on Berlin by having the West Germans stage their presidential election March 7, two days before Nixon comes for his symbolic visit to the beseiged fortress.

The Soviet squeeze back by intensifying preparations for the planned Warsaw Pact war games, allowing the East Germans to block the autobahn linking Berlin to the Federal Republic.

And from Vietnam come warnings of a new Tet offensive: Chinese New Year starts on Sunday, February 16. It is the Year of the Rooster.

Canada is a faithful ally to the United States. But it also does big business with Peking in wheat.

Peking's response to the Canadian overtures is sure to be relayed to Washington for trend analysis. Which way is the Chinese wind blowing: will it spurn Canada in a hurricane of invective, or will the gentler spring breezes prevail?

One even wonders whether the circling game includes such diversions as the release of the Pueblo crew (and the crucifying ritual on Cmdr. Bucher, who, after all, failed in a spy's prime mission: don't get caught) and the capture (defection at first, now a captive) of Mr. Hsiao, the Chinese attache from the Hague who now hobnobs with the CIA. A quid pro quo of a kind?

The arms race sems to be coming to end because it had to. Even flexible responses aren't safe any more. The Americans have experienced this, the Russians fear it and the Chinese are free to say "I told you so." So the circling game starts, like liar's dice, with no one able to win, the object being

not to lose. 5555555555555 BRITONS PLAN PROTEST ON

HIPPIES IN TURKISH JAILS LONDON (LNS) - A number of young Americans and Europeans are languishing in medieval Turkish jails, many of them facing years of imprisonment for the possession of hashish.

A movement to compel the Turks to free these prisoners is underway, however. British protesters hope to put pressure on Turkish authorities and tourist offices in Europe and in the U.S.

Harvey Matusow, editor of the American International Review, a new London publication, reports that the Turks have refused requests from him and from the television arm of the British Broadcasting Co. to enter Turkey to see the conditions in the jails and to interview some of the prisoners.

Londoners are planning a hunger strike and sit-in at the Turkish tourist office in Central London later this month. "If similar action could take place in New York, it would help getting some of the kids released," Matusow told LNS.

The Turkish tourist office in New York is located at 500 Fifth Ave. Its director is Dr. Burham Degancay, and he is reported to be extremely sensitive to pressure, especially where it might affect the American tourist business.

Letters of protest may also be sent to the ambassador from Turkey, Melih Esembel c/o The Embassy of Turkey, Washington, D.C.

A group of London writers is putting together a book of Turkish prison stories in an attempt to raise money for the campaign to free the young people.

Matusow writes: "We need copies of any letters that people have received - and letters from the USA are in short supply. So, please ask Underground Press to ask for letters, and have them sent to me at my London address. Harvey Matusow, 58 Grove Park Gardens, London W4, England. We would also welcome any letters from people in jail for hash or pot anywhere in the world, for the book will in some way end up as a guide to the shit laws throughout the world . . .

in fact petty, introverted, with its face pointed firmly towards the past. It would not be so bad if the issues mentioned were the only ones threatening —they are at least internal issues which can still for a short while be debated among a small circle of friends. But the real problem about to make itself felt is deeper and dirtier—it even has political overtones and will tend to focus on all the phoniest aspects of the art world at a time when these can least afford close scrutiny. It is this issue among others, which is the subject of an ultimatum recently presented to the Modern Museum, an ultimatum which runs out on Friday, February 14th.

The question is one of color. As always it is a huge and painful question, one which cuts through all sections of society. It can perhaps best be phrased in a series of sub-questions: why is there no wellknown major American artist who happens to be black? Why are almost no black artists being shown by the galleries? Why have our major New York and American museums done next to nothing for black artists?

The answers to these questions are not easily forthcoming. There are probably no satisfactory answers. The pitiful attempts some may make to explain themselves out of the situation will only draw them back into it more deeply. I have been told by some that the reason is simply that

There are no good black artists.

Asuming this were true, we would still have to ask why it were true, and the answer would come boomerang- with what is now considered to be junk. ing back that the blacks have never had the same chance to become artists as the whites. But an even more crucial question lies in wait—

WHAT IF THERE REALLY ARE GOOD BLACK ARTISTS WHO HAVE NOT BEEN SHOWN?

And, even more deeply, can we really say that the standards by which we judge good and bad art are the ultimate ones?

Whatever questions we ask, the answers will very likely come back to shame us. There are few black artists in this country (and almost no recognized ones) because art in this country up until this very moment has been the white boy's plaything. It has been a game for the milder sort of bourgeois rebel who having been brought up with a sufficiency of the world's goods, has merrily opted out into a romance of idealized values where the artist is prophet, martyr, and cultural hero. Occasionally it is a very well-paid job, and even if it isn't, it can still bring a bit of status and the illusion that one is doing something better and higher. How delightful it is to have one's works reproduced, to see one's words in print, occasionally to hear them on television as well. The artist is the new preacher, the prophet of the modernist religion. But as soon as a black man appears using the cult words of the religion, the devout begin to feel ill at ease. Why is this?

It is because the assumption that art is only white man's work is built into the very culture itself. Art, which pays homage to the idea of reaching all of society and influencing it, becomes embarrassed when it is actually expected to do so. This is because today's art world, instead of being a busy crossroads, a central circuit point where all the energy of society can pass through, has elevated itself into a limited elite interested primarily in its own promotion and preservation.

In England today a black man may work where bread is baked or milk is bottled, but he is not allowed to be seen delivering them. The sight of his black hand on the pure white essentials of society is too much for the majority to bear. In the same way white society has been quite irrationally uneasy at the thought of a black man occupying the holy citadels of its new religion. The phrases and opinions which seemed like revealed truth when uttered by a white artist have tended to cause doubt and

embarrassment

when spoken by a

BLACK ONE

Clearly something is wrong, not just with attitudes to the blacks, but with our entire notion of culture.

After a long time black playwrights, novelists, and poets were acknowlldged to exist, as long as they expressed the right degree of bitterness at the right time, but they still may not enter the holy of holies. It is not so much a question of whether the art world should respect black artists but whether the blacks should regard the art world as worthy of their

Part of the reason for this scandal is of course the fact that artists are rarely political animals they depend on the monied members of society for their survival and will not readily offend them. This is understandable. What is less understandable is that the art establishment itself, not the most reactionary segment of society, has been so slow in

doing something to equalize the balance in the direction of the blacks. Perhaps the only consolation

(and a dim one it is at this time of radical religious aud-slinging) is that the establishment is divided about equally between gentiles and jews, so that both are equally guilty of this neglect. It is to be hoped that black leaders will see that they are being led off onto a false track on the jewish question, a course that will please only those who hate jew and black alike and would gladly see them destroy one another.

In any case it would appear that artists are now making some steps towards becoming more aware of these problems. The ultimatum to the Modern Museum demands that free open discussions be begun at the museum immediately on this and other subjects. If the museum refuses, these discussions will take place elsewhere in any case. The artists and critics acting to bring about these discussions include Hans Haacke, Tom Lloyd, Takis, Tsai, Farman, John Perreault, Gregory Battcock, and the author of this article. In addition to the points listed in EVO two weeks ago, the following demands are also being made:

1) The Modern Museum should set up a permanent Black Wing for black and Puerto Rican artists, with the goal of inspiring a higher creative level among these communities. This wing should be administered entirely by members of these communities, who should also sit on the selection board for white artists.

2) A permanent wing should also be set up for unknown artists, and a zealous effort should be made to keep it filled not with works which satisfy a coterie but with odd, off-beat work and even

3) The Modern Museum should be open free of charge all seven days of the week.

4) The Modern Museum should also remain open until midnight at least two days a week.

It is also felt that an attempt should be made to bring the International Erotic Exhibition from Sweden to a major New York museum at the earliest possible date. If the Museum should prove adamant and these points are not met, picketings, sit-ins, and demonstrations are anticipated. Anyone is welcome to take part in these, whether he is an artist or not, and should contact Debbie Freeman or Farman at the Chelsea Hotel for more details and for information on the full thirteen points now at issue.

The day after our arrival Jesse Krishna drove us in a jeep up to the end of the valley where the watershed canyons down the steep slopes. As we bumped along the rough road Jesse suddenly slammed on the brakes. Rattler!

There sunning himself on the dusty switch-back was a five foot diamondback. Jesse banged on the jeep door and raced the engine. The serpent rose up, looked at us and slowly glided into the bushes.

We all felt good about not killing the deadly snake, about deciding to love him, respecting his claim to the land.

Who is violent?

Man, and only man is violent.

Every other species of God's creation takes its chance in the membrane to membrane, eye-to-eye, fang-to-claw dance of survival.

Man is the only species who violates by distance-weaponry.

Am I violent?

Siting with Rosemary on a hill above our hippie-commune, high and happy smoking dope, I announce that I have never deliberately used a machine to kill. Fish? Yes, I have fished. In the bay of Zijuatenejo I caught a silver-day-glow, glistening salmon and held his life throbbing in my hands and said the Unite-of-Life prayer from the Tibetan Book of the Dying and placed him in the tackle box. Am I violent? Which human being are violent?

Most human beings are not violent. Mean? Yes. Angry? Yes. But only a small minority of human beings violate the natural plan and these men of violence are easily located. Men who construct, distribute, possess and use violence - machines, distance - weapons, firearms, are violent.

We note here that it is the human male not the female who is violent. Women can be impossibly mean. They can drive us cruelly to despair. But note this, the human female is too close to the rhythms and roots of life to use violence-machines. Does not the thought of a gal with a gun or a lady bomber-pilot give you a queer, freaky sense of rare, twisted, lesbian sexuality? Women are not violent.

Neither are men who attack me in face-to-face confrontation. Those who hit me, rush at me with sword or stick, men who wrestle me down with their own muscle power. These are aggressive but not violent. They do not violate the ancient cellular rules of the life game. They may be murderous, dangerous, but my DNA code has prepared me for two billion years to expect and deal with close contiguous assault. I am genetically guarded against this possibility. It is the distance killing that violates my animal security. Martin Luther King never saw his assassin. Neither does the napalmed Vietnamese peasant.

Which men are violent? Which men specialize in killing at a distance? You know who. Paid, hired government agents account for

99 per cent of the violence that devastates

and terrorizes this planet.

Consider violence in the United States:

(1) The American Air Force is the most violent, violating institution known to man. By conservative estimate the USAF controls and is trained and straining to use more than 50 per cent of the violating energy available to Americans.

(2) The United States Navy with its sleek Polaris bullets is probably the next most potent source of violence. Shall we estimate the Navy controls 20 per cent of our violating capacities? Professionals in navy blue are proudly Number Two in killing.

(3) The U. S. Army and Marine Corps are a vigorous third in the violence race. What a fearful roster of distance-killing machinery the Army distributes to its millions of involuntary, drafted telescope-sight gladiators.

(4) Next on the list of violence-producers

is the police constabulary on this country. The is the police constabulary of this country. The federal agents, FBI, CIA, FDA, narcotic agents, customs officials, the state police, the county sheriffs the municipal fuzz. Each with a machine of death strapped to his side.

Totaling these four categories of self-right-eous destruction we estimate that paid government agents are responsible for 90 per cent of the machine killing and possess more than 90 per cent of the killing technology. It is interesting that in almost every country, our own included, the first function of the military and police is to employ violence or the threat of machine violence against its own citizenry. That is, to protect the Establishment against restless and aggrieved competition.

During the last 20 years, which has seen a tremendous acceleration in the manufacture and possession of killing-machines, only a small per cent of these distance-weapons have been used in defense against equally armed foreign invasions. The dictator's jets roar off South American fields to frighten the peasants. America supplies the juntas of the world with violence-equipment to maintain the civil order. Greek, Guatemalan, South African agents crouch in city streets behind machine guns. African politicians war for civil control. Violence in defense of invasion is actually a rare event. It's more fun to kill unarmed civilians.

(5) A fifth source of violence in this country is located in the arms-bearing citizenry—Mr. Joe Jones and his home arsenal.

Now the possession of firearms by civilians is not an accidental, inexplicable, statistical phenomenon. The social characteristics of the gun-bearing civilian are quite obvious. The "kill-for-sportsmen," the gun-buffs, the armed householders tend to be the super-patriotic, the hawks, the Southerners, the Texans, the American Legionaires, the Anglo-Saxon Protestants—descendants of those who killed the Indian and fought the fraternal Civil War for economic power.

Civilians who own violence-machines are exactly those who are most identified with the government and the military establishments.

Dissenters don't arm.

It is also relevant to mention the trite but always awful fact that violence is profitable: that the manufacture of violence-machinery absorbs the overwhelming majority of our national budget, that the professional military, a notoriously materialistic, nonspiritual group, make a good living off violence-industry of this country has developed the most powerful political lobby in the capital.

(6) A sixth source of violence is robbers, criminals and gangsters. But contrary to the impression given by the Establishment's mass media (TV screens blazing with guns of the wicked Bonnie and Clyde), criminal hoodlums account for an insignificant per cent of the armed mayhem in this country, and the world. Gangsters today are businessmen who invest in armament stock issues. The petty hustlers, the armed robbers comprise less than one per cent of the violence.

(7) In the mind of the average middle-aged American, the Negro is currently seen as the greatest threat to the security of the country. This is nothing less than a paranoid delusion.

In fact, the American black man is one of the least violent people on the face of the earth. For 400 years the white man has ruthlessly eliminated the aggressive, self-confident, blasck man and economically deprived him of access to violence-machinery because distanceweapons cost white money.

Black Power, the current terror, is nothing less than the discovery by certain articulate blacks that blacks and browns have not been violent enough in a nation that is obsessed with violence.

Even in these days of occasional riot and looting the incidence of machine-violence by blacks against whites is amazingly low. When Stokely shouts, "don't loot you a TV set, loot a gun" he is telling his followers to become like patriotic Americans. I don't share these aspirations but I completely sympathize with his logic.

(8) Are the dissident youth and psychedelic young violent?

We are told by the media that the key issues in the 1968 political campaigns are violence in Vietnam and violent crime at home. Dissenting youth, black and white, are the vulnerable targets of the get-tough-crack-downend-this-permisiveness program. The Nixons and Reagans and Wallaces and Daleys wish to mobilize military-police forces to deal with the protesters and the hippies.

The facts, however, will surely show that the hippies, campus protesters, dope-smokers, long hairs, acid heads, detached drop-outs (already the victims of discrimination and harassment) are the least violent of any group in the world.

There was no gunfire in the love-ins, or at the barricades at Columbia. If resident Kirk had walked into his besieged office with his staff and rolled up his sleeves and said to the students drinking his sherry, "O.K. let's talk it out or have it out man to man," the protesters would not have used metal machines to puncturet he soft body of Mr. Kirk. There was never any danger to the skins of the multimillionaire trustees of Columbia. Nor of the Sorbone. Nor of San Francisco State.

Remember, too, that over 50,000 young Americans have meekly been led offi to jail by gun-toting policemen for violating the draft and marijuana laws. Peaceable people. Gentle crimes of conscience and personal behavior.

The politics of paranoia

The obvious truth about violence in the United States is this: it is the rulers of this country and their patriotic partisans who are totally committed to a society of violence and the first target of their violence (in this country as in other countries) is the nonviolent, pacifist majority.

The American military-industrial establishment manufactures violence-machines, distributes them to violent men throughout the world and keeps the American populace conveniently addicted to magazine-movie-television orgies of machine-murder.

The American government is sick, fatally sick, of metal-weapon poisoning.

Am I violent?

Shouts from the barn.

A group of the long-haired, bearded psychedelic brotherhood is crowding around the barn door. There, coiled, head erect and swaying, tail buzzing with electric warnig, is a serpent.

Travis runs to the toolshed and returns with a pole onto which he has looped a leather thong. He pokes the loop near the rattler. All the hippies and wives and children chant "OM," (the ancient Hindu prayer of cosmic unity). The serpent slides up and puts his flat, wedge-shaped head through the noose. Travis pulls the strap and swings the snake into a canvas bag. He drives a few miles down the road and releases the serpent.

How pious we all are.

Are you violent?

In politics there is an implacable Gresham's Law: the violnt drive out the gentle. The wicked drive out the good. In the name of the state every emerging leader of the peaceful majority is routinely assassinated by a patriot.


Gandhi is shot by an ultra-patriotic Brahmin who thinks the Mahatma is too tolerant to the Arabs.

Malcolm X, at the moment of his conversion to Brotherhood, is gunned down by some group that is strangely protected by the government. Christ is murdered by patriotic Jews and Roman soldiers. The young, tousled-haired leader of the young, J. F. K., was killed by a man trained in sharpshooting by the U. S. Marines and loyal, in his twisted fashion, to someone's secret service. BOOKS

MARION ZIMMER BRADLEY

THE DEMON BREED. James H. Schmitz. Ace Science Fiction Special, 1969.

James H. Schmidtz is not an "old and honored name" in science fiction. He is mostly known through a delightfully funny story of psi talents in a space-opera setting, THE WITCHES OF KARRES, which had two things almost unknown in science fiction; genuine belly-laugh humor, and realistic children.

This new book couldn't be less like that. It's a grim-reality sort of story which begins with a biochemist, Dr. Ticos Cay, being tortured to death, or near it, by a group of invading bugeyed-monsters from some alien planet, and simultaneously trying to outthink them. He expects, so he tells them, to have the aid of a human super-type, a "Tuvela" or "Guardian" who is just about to drop in on him - and then the scene shifts to the so-called "Guardian," and it turns out that she is no more a superwoman than the writer of the book - but maybe she can bluff the monsters into thinking that she is.

Told starkly, like that, it could be any one of forty or fifty novels whose direct lineal ancestor is the war movie -you know the type-wth the iname of a big battlefield, dedicated to the proposition that Van Johnson or John Payne or Ronald Reagan, with a little help from the U.S. Navy, really won the war. Most science-fiction reviewers, and I number myself among them, have a constitutional apathy to the kind of story where the hero saves the world, the galaxy, the civilization, all by himself with a few gadgets, his trusty zap--gun and maybe a couple of trained werewolves.

But this one isn't quite that bad. In the first place, the hero, so-called, is a feeble old man — which in itself means that Schmitz has given a little time and thought to populating his story, instead of lining up one "hero" whose main function is to mouth platitudes and Beat the Villain. The young girl who, almost unwarned, has to wear the mantle of the superhuman Guardian, is no bosomy beauty, but a young female scientist, and the hero is an old college professor of hers. So that the reader doesn't have to keep bracing himself for the inevitable scene where the two are Marooned for a Clinch, or for the oh-solightly-handled sexy scene just to prove that the science fiction writer can, too, write realistic adult fiction and is willing to drag in all the back issues of PLAY-BOY to prove it. In short, there are real people in this story - not a Hero and a Heroine, but two random human beings trying to out-bluff some nasty aliens and get themselves and their world out of a jam.


Furthermore, the world on which all this happens is not a spare set for STAR TREK, but a real world with its own characteristic flora and fauna; James Schmitz seems to have made a real study of ecology and the sights and sounds and smells of the alien world come across with real flair and a you-were-there feeling.


And for once, instead of having, for the trusty companions of the humans, those same old dolphins, he was invented a charmingly nonhuman brand of mutated otters, who speak in an idiom of their own instead of the sickening pidgin English which has infected man's animal companions since TARZAN.

This book isn't the year's gift to the science fiction lover — but it isn't a routinely boring piece of hackwork either. It's well worth missing three episodes of STAR TREK for although it probably won't take you that long to read.



nothing new under the sun. Every new science fiction novel that comes along invites comparison with somebody else's on the same theme three or five or twelve years ago. The late beloved Tony Boucher put into the mouth of one of his characters — not a science fiction character, but a writer of science fiction — the following scathing commentary on a fantastic space novel:

"Oh, it's the same old stuff. Martians on the secret asteroid, trying to get away from space pirates — hell, it's routine!"

So that, if I start reviewing Roger Zelazny's ISLE OF THE DEAD by saying that it begins with an ancient gimmick — the very old survivor of the twentieth century, grown incredibly rich and living on a planet all his own — those who have read only a little science fiction will be bewildered, and those who have read a lot will be discouraged.

This book has many virtues. It is beautifully written, in a style which seems nearer to the "poetic fantasy" tradition of Avram Davidson and Cordwainer Smith, than the straightforward narrative which is linely descended from the pulps which were ancestral to science fiction per se. It has a strange and original series of alien worlds and customs. It has a fiercely individual hero who could almost have been invented by Robert Heinlein.

And yet . . . somehow it just doesn't come off, though it is exquisitely written and a fascinating narrative. Perhaps it is because Zelazny, in this book, seems not to know whether he was writing a poignant document, or an exciting novel of chase and adventure. Perhaps because the sophisticated reader simply cannot imagine a man intelligent enough to survive so many centuries, still using tired old slang phrases like "Let's face it." Perhaps because, in the barren pauses of staring at his typewriter and trying to decide whether he is imitating Jack Vance, Philip K. Dick or Cordwainer Smtih, he takes off on twentieth century customs whch he happens to dislike, such as tipping (not that I blame him) and Zalazny the writer gets in the way of Francis Sandow the narrator.

If you like beautifully written books, you'll flip over ISLE OF THE DEAD. If you like strongly coherent, internally consistent works with their own inner integrity, you'll moderate your enthusiasm.



In his book, "The Pornography of Power," Lionel Rubinoff defines the problem in which "Modern man has finally discovered, in a profound and disturbing way, an alarming discrepancy between his self-image (which represents him as basically rational and humane) and his actual behavior, which is characteristically irrational. This discovery parllels the experience of Victorian man who found the aesthetic and psychological pleasures of sex to be inconsistent with the image of it as a purely biological function. The result, in the latter case, was that sexual pleasure became a subject of taboo. The repression of man's demonic nature leads inevitabley to a search for substitute forms of gratification not only in fantasies but also in direct experiences, such as the behavior of nihilism and violence."

With this definition in one hand and armed with the central ideas of progress and power, Rubinoff spins his artful declarations of philosophy—from Plato to Sartre and back again —and in its wake the ruins of such inconsistent theories of man as espoused by social scientists and psycologists, revolutionists and primitivists are left to rot and there remains only room for the existential tool of transcendence and imagination. In Rubinof's lament, he decries the cowardice of modern man. His search for comformity. His fear of being creative or active

..i will mot go...

When a member of the middle class is ordered to yield up his real estate to the Government for use as a freeway cloverleaf or a Sentinel site, he considers it only his just due when the Government then pays him an appropriate price for his land, builds him a new house in a contiguous area, and pays him moving When the stooge from the City Planning Commission walks up six flights to your pad, he just says, "Move out. Now." And then just try getting a comparable place in the same neighborhood - it turns out that the whole area is about to be bulldozed, and every landlord around it has hiked his rents twenty percent. True, there are plenty of nice clean brick and glass development apartments selling for \$50 a month in Deepest Brooklyn and Outer Flatbush, but who the hell wants to live out there? Pray, who wants to live in a brick and glass development project anyway?

It's a startling fact, a fact that the City Planning Commission and its Certified Developers still have difficulty accepting, that most people who live in slums would rather stay there than move to cheerless rectangular boxes of boredom, comparable rentals notwithstanding. Not that your average Puerto Rican and Negro low-income

of four is against developing their slum neighborhood — just that none of them is enchanted by the idea of moving to Queens to live with other average Puerto Rican and Negro low-income families of four in dwelling complexes that were stamped out by a computer-run cookie cutter. Their reluctance to move to City-authorized resettlement projects, in fact, is being used by the Planning Commission as an excuse to avoid providing resettlement areas when they do tear down a slum for redevelopment.

So now the City Planning Commission has turned its baleful eye upon Cooper Square. Visions of Sauron's Eye Peering over the Southfarthing like some unblinking prison spotlight... On next Wednesday 19 February, at 10:00 A.M. at City Hall, the Commission will meet in open session to consider a plan to Rezone the areas on Second Avenue between 33rd and 37th Streets, Sixth Avenue between 14th and 23rd Streets, and Third Avenue between St. Mark's Place and 14th Street. upon approval of the rezoning plan, everyone in these areas for seventeen acres lining the blocks will be kicked out with no relocation facilities in the areas, and the various private developers who do business with the city will start building thirty-story buildings with apartments renting at \$125 a month per room; the rezoning plan, understand, is to change the occupancy regulations from 330 families per square block to 1000 families per square block.

This is nothing new, City Planning Commissions the world over do it all the time, but in Cooper Square they have encountered an unprecedented obstacle — the Cooper Square Development Committee. Cooper Square for ten years now has been a pain in the Planning Committee's ass, because the people who live there have organized to preserve the identity of their community against the wrecking ball that most other communities seem to regard as an agent of God, a natural phenomenon as inexorable as flood, hurricane, and earthquake. Since 1959 the Cooper Square Development Committee has put the blocks to a raft of speculative proposals by various moneygrubbing land developers; without them the area would have long since turned into the kind of thing you see on Sixth Street between First and A. And growing from this latest rezoning proposal, the Development Committee sees bulldozers sweeping straight down the Bowery to China-

It was in response to such voracious redevelopment schemes that the Cooper Square Redevelopment Committee was formed. It's a unique idea: so far as anybody knows, no community has ever organized to prevent demolition and dispersal by profit-minded developers working under government approval. Concerning this last rezoning proposal, the Committee is optimistic that it can successfully knock it down in open session at City Hall.

The proposal to rezone the area and redevelop it was brought about, according to a release from the Planning Commission, by the City's

desire to fihelp stimulate the construction of privately financed apartment houses." It turns out that the construction of middle and high-income apartment dwellings has fallen off drastically in the last few years, and as a result mortgage costs have skyrocketed, afflicting land-owners and developers most adversely. Now the idea is to change the zoning requirements in fertile areas around the city so that the developers can start building projects wholesale.

This in itself wouldn't be so terrible, except for the fact that these proposed new dwellings units are not being designed for the people who will be displaced by the demolition of the existing buildings. Rather, the Planning Commission cites in its release the "increased demand from people who can afford City rents and wish to live near their work." That is, they figure the middleclass suburbanites are getting sick of commuting and want to move back into the City, and are now making enough money to live here if the appropriate dwellings can be constructed for them. The rezoning will spur such construction. Which would turn Cooper Square into a lilywhite ghetto of nine-to-fivers. No more artists. No more hippies. No more young single people looking for mates. No more beautiful fat old Ukranian ladies mumbling down the sidewalk like R. Crumb cartoons. No more Puerto Ricans playing backgammon on the sidewalks listening to portable radios playing Spanish music. No more Hassids. Worst of all, the slums would be gone forever - and anybody who reads Trashman knows how beautiful a slum can look.

So the Cooper Square Redevelopment Committee wants to stock City Hall, which you can fight if you've got the balls. The idea is to demonstrate to the City, once and for all, that there is a community on the Lower Bast Side — a community that some of us feel humbly is the most beautiful in the City, if not in the country — a community that will not be told, "Move out. Now." In the weeks to come, this paper will consider the Cooper Square Redevelopment Committee in detail, starting with the outline of the Committee's Alternative Plan for Cooper Square Redevelopment, devised with the assistance of Licensed City Planner Walter Thabit.

16 I went to a Pornography Festival at Notre Dame University . . . and lived . . . that's as fabulous a punch line as any. It was called, alternatively, Conference on Pornography and Censorship, The First Pornography Conference, or even Erotica Festival, but it never made any difference because none of it stood a chance. I went to a pornography festival and spent most of 3 slightly abortive days in my Holiday Inn motel room watching TV with friends. As a matter of routine Jack Webb fact, we were more pornographic than anything else going on. By the time I got to South Bend, Indiana, on Thursday, the festival-conference was 1 day old and nearly dead, killed by the combined effort of administration blackball and student indifference; when Dad really loses faith in Sonny, there's a mighty vacuum left in everyone's normal life-patterns-or: if you never really had a good relationship with your father, sudden deprivation of any relationship doesn't necessarily make Sonny a self-secure boy. Nobody likes the unknown.

Statistics: There are circa 7-8000 students on campus; perhaps 800 knew of the Festival, and perhaps 500 of them attended any of the aborted efforts scheduled; 50 kids tried and 2 or 3 tried harder. Score: Cardinals 5, Home Team 0.

The conference opened Wednesday, (still referred to as a Festival), with an art show and Allen Ginsberg reading poetry. The art show was closed Wednesday afternoon at the demand of some student officials from the local Administration-in-training, the Student Union Academic Commission (hereafter called SUAC). Ginsberg read and fled to easier quarters: a plane out of there — first taking time to advise the students to hold a sit-in to reinstate the art show.

Ha. The campus paper, The Observer (and later comes a story about this paper and its predecessor) reports that a sit-in was held; 350 sat in and 1800 trooped through the exhibit. It was then closed again, never to be reopened. Now, about the factual nature of the student newspaper: the masthead is dated 1966. The paper before this one ran a reprint form the Berkeley Barb, in which reprint was a sentence which contained the word "fuck". The paper was immediately closed down by the administration. And then, the next attempt was begun, The Observer. Just imagine how much freedom it has or even feels it has 1800 students didn't know about the art show.

It is still Wednesday, and films are scheduled. Carolee Schneemann's Isuses has not yet arrived, so Flaming Creatures is projected — sort of. After a sterling run of 2 minutes, a student official demands that the gross thing be removed. Obligingly, it is replaced by Andy Noren's Kodak Ghost Dreams.

Festival. All films have been cancelled continues.

has made everyone grab their seat and chaos prevails . . . some SUAC (swack? sumac? schmuck?) officials are demanding the end of the festival F.C. is suddenly declared to be legally pornographic, and not only that, but has been run off at a time when other films are supposed to be screened. As if Fuses would have been a milder prescription for these mentally arthritic bunnies . . .)

Andy's film runs for a few frames, suddenly whirring noises are heard. Investigation pends: a fast trip to the projection room finds the film torn off the machine, on the floor. Someone Big has been there, daddy-o.

FROM ON HIGH: The Festival is declared closed. It is now Thursday and I get to the conference. By now, everyone is calling it a "conference" in a last-ditch effort to create an effable air of respectability. Nice play, Shakespeare. Things are at a High Tension — more or less — don't forget only 800 or so students even know about the

Festival. All films have been cancelled, continues the Message from Up There, but the Theatre of the Ridiculous will/will not be allowed to present Lady Godiva. So far They haven't made up their minds. When they do finally decide, it is affirmative. Backstage, there is director John Vaccaro and a perfect boy, all sharp clean face, athlete's body encased in tweed and chinos and high-gloss cordovans: "Look, John, do your things, only please don't make it too sensational. These people don't understand about dirt and sex."

The play is announced, and John comes out front: "The only time sex is dirty is when it's done right. This is good, dirty fun. So laugh."

Everyone did, and the hit of the evening, not surprisingly, was *Morning Horniness*, a song sung by the Nuns in the play...yes, it was the perfect play for this campus. Lynne Reyner playing Lady Godiva, a Mae West-Fanny Brice-Horatio Alger-Fanny Hill heroine, all rubber face and loose morals, in a perpetual state of semi-anything. She will take her historic ride nude on the horse, etc.,

to get Leofric, Lord of Coventry, to lift the tax on the Loose Convent (Order of the Sacred Pussy) Leofric is Bruce Pecheur; Mother Superviva, alias Godiva's Own Mother, let alone Delilah, first ball-breaker in history, was nobly emoted by Rene Ricard who looked fantastic in purple. But the whole cast fantastic, and so as not to slight Lady Kasha Veronicas and Peeping Tom etc., another time another column.

Back to Notre Dame, where christ (with a small c because this was religion, not Faith) reigns in the cafeteria and the bathroom and the dining room. Just for openers. During Intermission, the Involved all got up and made speeches, explaining about the countermand of the conference, and the dastardly deeds; called for a mass meeting the next day at 12 noon. High Noon; Dave Kahn, former head of the ND Film Society and one of the activists, also revealed that it was administration pressure that had ordered the conference closed down. (This may not seem very much of a revelation to you out there safe in blase New York, but in South Bend, any mention of the administration is like an epiphany.) The play finished to applause, stomps and whistles and a chorus of "Morning Horniness. Some of the more daring left their mouths open, guppystyle during the song, and sort of hummed along when the spirit moved them.

Friday. THE MEETING. The President of SUAC, John Mroz, stood up and said he realized a mistake had been made in allowing the conference. but he still felt that Notre Dame students had the maturity necessary for such an experience. He then explained about the "sheer hell" he had been put through, not to mention that he was up for possible dismissal, having committed a breach of contract—according to Dean Lawless of the ND Law (less?) School. Tom Schotz, very active in SUAC and planner of the conference, also spoke of his negligible responsibility. (He was the boy who had spoken to John backstage that first night). Then Rick Kelly, the boy who was mainly responsible for all the uproar, spoke. He had arranged for the films and overseen the details, contacted Theatre of the Ridiculous, along with his roommate Seam Reynolds. He stood, diffident, determined, speaking quietly—almost no one in student government was speaking to him at the time, as he too was being considered for dismissal, so maybe he was not sure if anybody was listening. He explained that Flaming Creatures was playing right then in a commercial house in Chicago; that they could telegram there; that Andy Noren's film had been ripped off the projector, found on the floor; that all he had wanted was a festival which would be fun and maybe beautiful . . .

It was now about 1 p.m. In came De Judge, Philip Faccenda, legal adviser to Notre Dame's President, Father Ted Hesbergh. It was Dad and His Kids.



(My own epiphany occurs: it seems that the administration had discovered that 'Creatures' had been adjudicated hard-core porn in 2 states and had told some SUAC officials who then promised it would not never be shown on ND's campus. And then it was, all 2 minutes of it.)

The dialogue continued, and so it came to pass that everyone tried to evade the responsibility plague except the determined few. Richard Rossie, president of the student body, said that warrants for confiscation were out on the films, and then Marty McNamara stood up and said Bullshit. McNamara. it might be added, can be picked out at any given distance on this campus because he wears his hair long (brushing his ears and over his shirt collar) and is given to jeans and sneakers. He is also up for dismissal for "infringement of rights by unlawful demonstration in connection with the lieagainst CIA recruiting on campus last November 20. Unquote The Observer." WHAT IS THIS BOY DOING THERE, you ask . . . and that's a good question. He is the ND Example of liberalness: he is there on a film scholarship because he hadn't intended to go to college and then decided to accept this scholarship and no, that doesn't explain what he's there for; it must just be one of those things.

Andy Noren confers with Rick Kelly and Sean and a few others. He has offered to let them see his film anyway, by breaking the contract with SUAC and just 'happening' to be there with his film, which, ho-hum, they can see if they want. Yes, he knows what happened before.

Around 2 p.m., a vote was taken on the motion of whether or not to see Kodak Ghost Dreams anyway, in spite of the official NO. Around 2:45, the answer was 244 yes, 128 no. So we toddled off to Room 127 and all sat down. English prof Peter Michelson, active in all this, then bit his lip and explained that is seemed there was a warrant for the film; that police might definitely come in and try to confiscate the film; that we might all be responsible . . . Responsibility . . . that word again ... everyone weighs it against the general adrenalin excitement of doing anything that smacks of guilt or sin. Yeah yeah yeah. The lights go out, the screen flashes blank lead frames . . . there is a scream, the cops come in, grab a girl (Cathy Cecil) who has been given the film, some boys jump to help her, more screams and a general Roar—the cops are—where is anything?—Where is anyone? . . . Everyone flees out the door, screams are heard again, and we rush out after the cops and the film . . . Where is anyone? Outside, there are a few kids walking to campus . . . and cops. The scene: space everywhere, blocks of empty walks, buildings, all overcast-grey . . . one cop mutters to another: "This might turn into a full-scale riot." I look around and see-nobody. Except another plainclothes cop. Possibly they are having the riot . . . then we see them around the corner, cops surrounded by students throwing words mostly and a few snowballs. Guess who have the film. In the middle are Cathy, Marty, and Dave Kahn. Their eyes stream —they have been Maced.

The conference is declared Closed, baby, but excitement keeps the dead body moving, they say, so involuntary contractions provide a few more hours of excitement. Dave Kahn explains that he feels the police were quite fair, using mostly defensive tactics except for the Mace. Cathy feels changed ... At The Observer office, things are in high gear.

Back at my Holiday Inn motel room, I put on the local news at 7 p.m. and hear the Festival has been closed. I run next door to tell Gerard Malanga, who has brought Fuck and Couch (fat chance they're even moving out of the motel room). I call The Observer to check... a meeting is being held right then to determine what if anything will be continued. I look at the film I have brought with me, The Cats, due to open in NY in a few days... Richard McGinnis has been sitting on Fuses while he eats, carrying it with him when he telephones—I am beginning to understand his reactions. I lock my motel room, hide the film (we put the pot in the ice bucket; look around for stray evidence, place hairs on the door before leaving)...


Friday night, SUAC absolves itself by dissociating itself from the conference. Sean Reynolds, president of The Fine Arts Club, assumes responsibility for Godiva, and it is put on again, this time no lights, no nothin', in the student union. The Muzak system continues to play 1920's dance music for the added touch of unreality. We all stay in touch by asking students where 'the people' are and immediately are led to the rest of our Outsiders group. 'Godiva' is given an even bigger hand this night, representing all that is radical and extra-terrestial to the terianism of Notre Dame...

Saturday, another meeting is planned. It turns out to be a farewell one for us and the conference ... Gerard reads a poem and it reaches the audience—if only because it is a creative effort, an alive statement from someone who actually is telling how he feels about his life—a truth revealed ... He reads two more, and we all clap. Rene Ricard kisses him on both cheeks: it is the reunion of De Gaulle and his favorite stallion.

We leave just as it is starting to snow.

New York again: a taxi from the airport through the city, from West 87th Street down over the East Side and home and then, incredibly, to Max's. The cabfare is outrageous, the traffic is ridiculous, and the whole city is in Saturday night preparation for a snow blizzard; i.e. nobody notices anything unusual.


Humanity grows out of disaster: The Upanishads. When the snow piled over onto New England, EVO's Jay Fab found himself trapped in a Hertz car just this side of the Connecticut state line. It took him three days to get to Manhattan-most of which he spent in the Bronx Co-Op City, which became some sort of Utopia for the duration. "It was incredible," Jay told us. "There were all these cars lined up for fucking miles on the New England Freeway, lined up bumper to bumper with a lot of them just herringboned off into the damn ditches! Nobody going nowhere, just sitting there. And this colored cat, some private rent-a-cop, he just kept trudging out along all these cars every few hours, saying "Coffee's being served in the Co-Op, best y'all come in before y'all freeze to death." Too much! And there were these little kids coming out-dig it, in the wind, and it was cold—these little Puerto Rican kids were trudging out, and they'd carry in babies from the damn cars and buses that were stuck on the Freeway. Finally, around eleven o'clock, my old lady and I were frozen stiff, almost out of gas, so we went in. and wind?! About a quarter of a mile to the Co-Op, it was hell! And once we got there, there were hundreds of people stranded in the fucking lobby, sleeping on the floor. Babies bawling-all these babies, you wouldn't believe it. And people, These Cop-Op people, were giving them food and bread and milk and shit . . . And here I am, the only guy with long hair, looking like a freakhadn't shaved in two days-sopping wet . . . And this lady comes up and asks if we need a place to sleep. Sleep?! And she calls her husband, all right, and we go up to their place. Beautiful goddamn people, man . . . They gave us a bed, with blankets, we were stuck there thirtyeight hours. I called the office, they thought I was staying with friends, and I'd only met these people that day. Too much: It was like the blackout, you know, only worse, 'cause it was cold and that damn wind . . . And these people were breaking their





"To be an individual in a collective society is to suffer a kind of madness, but to be part of it, which is normal, is to live without purpose, to worship platitudes and empty truths, to be mediocre, and to exist without love, which is hell."

In a society, such as ours, with its overwhelming problems of environmental degradation, Rubinoff has a good deal to work with as a tool for illustration. These tools he prefers to bypass and chooses to linger in the safer harbors of history and literature. This choice is regrettable because all the knowledge that Rubinoff can muster still needs the stark support of experience or to put it another way, "what is happening." Because of his choice, Rubinoff's book remains, for all its adequate thinking and selection of prose and poetry, ineffectual in the treatment of the subject of power. It also leads Rubinoff back to the erroneous philosophical hang up of "Who is Man" when the question should lie in the direction of "How shall man survive?" It is unimportant to know, at this stage of the game, who man is when it is possible that he might not survive. Like the tree in the forest that is felled without: audience to perceive it falling does not disprove its existence or prove its demise, so too, without man, history and philosophy remains dormant and cannot raise nor solve the question by itself.

In the last chapter of the book, Rubinoff moves towards a brand of thinking and problem solving which is typical of his liberalism. "For just as institutions without concepts are blind, so action which is not informed by the imagination, even though it be driven by moral outrage, can barely be distinguished from blind rage. Only under the guidance of the imagination can the revolt of action transcend the limitations of the evils against which it protests. If what I am saying makes any sense, then it follows that a philosophy of the imagination should precede a philosophy of action." These conclusions would probably be consistent with the world as it was 30 years ago, but modern times has speeded up the process of wear and tear and obsolescense and shortened the distance between our thoughts and our actions. Man's first reaction to an overwhelming problem can conceivably be his best especially where his survival is at stake. It would most likely save him from the blind rage of institutions. After all, the law is also a well thought out process of historical circumstances, but it does not apply to its environment. Law without justice is merely a form of facism and those who uphold it against those who suffer it, is but another example of man's inhumanity to man.

A new controversy has exploded in the ranks of the Underground, a schism so fierce that it bids fair to set the Movement back another twenty-seven years, three months. The import of this latest hoorah cannot be underestimated. It is with the greatest personal embarrassment that I admit that my own paper, loveable ole EVO, has itself been an unwitting pawn of the ominous forces seeking to convulse the New Aquarian Age of Life.

The dilemma first manifested itself with the appearance of the Apple record, "Two Virgins," which as we all know featured on its jacket a photographic study of John Lennon and his bride-to-be, Yoko Ono, both nude fore and aft. 

BOUNCING BUTTOCKS

Maulana Ron Karenga, leader of the black cultural nationalist organization US, denied any association with the murders last month of Black Panther Ministers Alprentice Carter and John Huggins at UCLA.
