



**ASSISTED LISTENING DEVICES:** John and Emily Putney Family Cattle Barn Penningroth Media Center, Pioneer Livestock Pavillion, Sheep Barn Sale Ring and Richard O. Jacobson Exhibition Center when the State Fair sound system is being used. For more information, call (515) 262-3111, ext 322, at least 72 hours in advance. During the 11 days of the Fair, a Telecommunications Device for the Deaf (TDD) will be available 9 a.m.- 9 p.m. for outgoing local/ credit calls located in the Administration Building.

**ON-GROUNDS TRANSPORTATION:**

**Courtesy Carts**

Golf cart mini-shuttle service (not wheelchair accessible) from lots A, B, and C to inner gates is available. Golf carts are not available for rent for safety and liability reasons.

**Campground Shuttle:**

Free Campgrounds shuttles operated by Clearfield Lions run daily beginning at 8 a.m. One wheelchair-accessible unit will be available about every 15 minutes. These shuttles run continuously up the hill, round-trip, from Gate 4, to First Church, to Pioneer Hall, to Gate 5, and reverse.

**For safety reasons, the inner grounds trams will not be running.** Please plan accordingly for additional walking or contact HomeTown Mobility at 1 (712) 938-2029 to reserve a scooter. Scooters are available at Gate 8, 10, 11, 13 & 15. Personal golf carts are not allowed on the Fairgrounds.

**PARKING GOLF CARTS:**

Golf-cart mini-shuttle service (not wheelchair accessible) is available from Lot A, Lot B and Lot C parking lots to Gates 13 and 15, beginning at 8 a.m. While offered as a free service, riders may make donations to the Shriners Children's Hospital and the Za-Ga-Zig Shrine Transportation Fund. Golf carts are not available for rent for safety and liability reasons.

**PAGING:** Representatives of the Iowa State Fair Police offer paging for lost children, senior citizens and emergencies from 9 a.m. to midnight from the Iowa State Fair Police headquarters, located at the west end of the Grand Concourse.

**RESTROOMS:** Facilities with ramps, widened doorways, handrails and stalls built to accommodate those using mobility aids are available in major buildings across the Fairgrounds. They include the Robert G. Horner & Sheri Avis Horner Service Center, Grandstand, Walnut Center, Patty & Jim Cownie Cultural Center, Elwell Family Food Center, Richard O. Jacobson Exhibition Center, Bruce L. Rastetter 4-H Exhibits Building, Paul R. Knapp Animal Learning Center, William C. Knapp Varied Industries Buildings, Stalling Barn, Putney Family Cattle Barn, Pioneer Livestock Pavilion, plus facilities east of the Susan Knapp Amphitheater, north of Gate 15 and north of Ye Old Mill.

**ADULT CHANGING STATION:** An adult changing station is available in the Hy-Vee Health and First Aid Center east of the John Deere Agricultural Building.

**SIGN LANGUAGE INTERPRETERS:**

To arrange for a sign language interpreter for a specific event, please call (515) 262-3111, ext. 287 at least two weeks in advance of the event.

**WHEELCHAIR & SCOOTER RENTAL:**

HomeTown Mobility accepts reservations online or by calling (712) 938-2029 from 9 a.m.-5 p.m. Monday-Friday. They are also open 7 days a week during the Fair to accept call-in reservations and answer questions. There is an additional \$5 processing fee for all call-in reservations. To avoid the processing fee, reserve online at HTMIA.com. A limited number of wheelchairs and scooters are held for walk-up customers on a first-come, first-serve basis. **Reservations will ONLY be accepted for full day Scooter and Wheelchair rentals.** Reservations need to be made 24 hours in advance. A driver's license or state ID is required for all rentals. Cancellations must be made 48 hours in advance to receive a full refund, less a \$5 cancellation fee. Rental locations are: Gate 8, 10, 11, 13 & 15

**SCOOTERS:** \$75 per full day (8 a.m. to 11 p.m.);

**WHEELCHAIRS:** \$30 per day

**IOWA STATE FAIR SCOOTER POLICY:**

Three or four wheeled, manual or electrically driven (at a walking pace) OPDMDs are permitted to be used in all areas open to pedestrian use so long as these devices are 1) designed by the manufacturer for single rider use only; 2) occupied by only one rider while in operation; 3) not pulling or towing any trailer-like object. Scooters are available for rental, during the Fair, at Gates 8, 10, 11, 13, and 15.

**DISCOUNTED GATE ADMISSION:**

**Monday through Thursday Evenings**

\$12 adult admission, \$8 child (ages 6-11) admission available at the gate from 5 p.m. to 10 p.m.

**Veterans Day**

Gate admission is \$12 until 5 p.m. for all active and retired members of the U.S. military and their spouses. Must have military ID.

**Wednesday, August 14**

**Older Iowans' Day**

Fairgoers ages 60 and older receive \$12 gate admission from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Check out the Older Iowan's Day Tent sponsored by Aetna inside Gate 13 along with special programming throughout the day such as the Older Iowan's Cookie Decorating Contest at the Elwell Family Food Center.
