**DEPARTMENT RULES**

1. General rules, regulations and health requirements listed on the Iowa State Fair website and in the FFA section apply in this department, with special emphasis on the following sections: Member Eligibility, Supervision and Lodging, Good Conduct Policy, Medication and Drug Testing, and Showing and Fitting Ethics.
2. **Nominations must be submitted online on or before May 15.** Exhibitors may nominate a maximum of six horses; up to **two of which may be leased, one if a light breed horse or two if a draft team.** No late nominations will be accepted.
3. FFA horses and ponies must be owned **or leased** by the FFA exhibitor by the nomination due date. Ownership and lease agreement must be maintained from the nomination date through the exhibition date of the Iowa State Fair. A copy of the lease agreement (signed by the leaser and leasee) must be sent to the State Fair Office on or before May 15.
4. **Three color photographs (front view and both side views) along with the Iowa State Fair Horse Identification Form must be sent to the State Fair Office on or before May 15.** Pictures, identification forms and lease agreements must be updated yearly. They will NOT be kept on file.
5. Once an animal listed on the Horse Identification Form is solely identified or entered by an individual, it becomes ineligible for all other individuals.
6. **Entries must be submitted online on or before July 1.** The entry fee is \$25 per horse plus \$5 per class. Each exhibitor may show no more than four animals (may pre-enter five) except a mare and foal, which is considered one entry. The fourth animal must be a 1, 2 or 3 year old.
7. A horse or pony can only be shown in one western pleasure or ranch pleasure class plus bareback pleasure, western equitation and ranch riding.
8. A horse or pony can only be shown in **one halter class.** Showing and Division Champions are not considered.
9. An exhibitor may compete on only one horse per class with the exception of Draft Breeds (Division 842) and Heavy Hitch Draft Team (Class 18) of which 2 entries are allowed.
10. Horses in Ranch Conformation halter (Class 46) must have been in Ranch Horse Pleasure (Class 17) or Ranch Riding (Class 20).
11. No stallions beyond 12 months of age can be shown in this department.
12. Any horse or pony age 2-5 may be ridden in all performance classes with a snaffle bit or bosal and two hands on reins.
13. The age of animals shall be based on January 1 of the year the animal was born.
14. A pony is defined as any equine under 14.1 hands, a horse is any equine 14.1 hands and over (14.1 hands equals 57 inches).
15. Broodmare is defined as having foaled in the current year. **Broodmares must have foaled by August 1 of the current year. Foals may accompany broodmares at the Fair.**
16. Showing is the ability to show at halter. Equitation is the exhibitor's riding ability.
17. All entries must be confirmed with the FFA Horse Supervisor prior to show.
18. After entries close, a letter will be posted on the Iowa State Fair website with details about State Fair arrival, gate to use, unloading procedures, trailer parking, arrival time and stalling.
19. The contact person for the Cowgirl Queen contest is Mary Moorman. Questions should be directed to her at 515-961-4925. Entries for the Cowgirl Queen Contest and the Open Horse Show will be handled through the Iowa State Fair Horse Department.
20. Check in will occur from 1:00 p.m. - 4:00 p.m. on Tuesday, August 11. Members must come to the FFA Horse Stall office and bring Health Papers (must be stamped by the State Fair Veterinarian).
21. There will be an exhibitors' meeting at 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, August 11; 8:00 a.m. on Wednesday, August 12 and 11:00 a.m. on Thursday, August 13.
22. All the FFA horses will be assigned box stalls in the west end of the Sheep Barn. **Exhibitors will NOT be permitted to work out of their trailers on the Iowa State Fairgrounds.** Horses must be in assigned stalls.
23. **Stall cards must be used for each stall.**
24. Horses must be stalled as assigned unless written permission is granted by the FFA Horse Supervisor.
25. Aisles **must** be kept clean until horses are released. Carts will be available to haul manure to a designated area.
26. All stalls must be cleaned by moving the straw or bedding to the proper disposal area before horses are released. Failure to comply is cause to hold premiums.
27. Horse trailers shall be parked in a designated area off the State Fairgrounds.

28. The FFA Horse Supervisor has the right to combine any class or classes with less than five entries.
29. The AQHA Rule Book will prevail over the Horse Show Rules except for printed FFA Horse Show Rules and those that are breed specific.
30. Only immediate family, FFA advisor and fellow active Iowa FFA chapter members may assist with fitting. Exhibitors who hire professionals shall not qualify for showing awards. Family members include and are limited to: parent/legal guardian, brother, sister or step-siblings.
31. Only FFA exhibitors can warm-up or ride FFA horses before, during and after the FFA Horse Show at the Iowa State Fair. Trainers and parents will NOT be allowed to warm-up or ride the FFA exhibit horse.
32. All decisions of the Judges, Superintendents and Supervisors are final.
33. Exhibitors are to wear Official FFA Jackets with the FFA Armband or white long-sleeve shirt/blouse with FFA Armband. **Armbands will be available for purchase at the Fair.** Western exhibitors shall wear western style hats and boots. Western exhibitors may choose to wear a helmet without penalty. Exhibitors shall wear solid dark black or dark blue jeans or slacks. No other special attire shall be worn (including chaps). Exhibitors in Saddle and Hunt Seat Riding Classes are to wear attire appropriate for season and Saddle and Hunt Seat Classes. T-shirts will not be allowed for any speed events. At no time will attire be considered except to coincide with rules listed here and cleanliness. T-shirts will be given to FFA exhibitors.
34. **All FFA participants in classes Barrel Racing, Flag Race and Pole Bending must wear American Society of Testing Materials (ASTM) and Safety Engineering Institute (SEI) approved headgear with chin strap and properly fitted harness while mounted and riding, including warm up.** The Iowa State Fair makes no representation or warranty, express or implied, about any protective headgear and cautions riders that death or serious injury may result despite wearing such headgear as all equestrian sports involve inherent dangerous risk and as no helmet can protect against all foreseeable injuries.
35. All FFA horses will be subject to random chemical testing and analysis of saliva, urine, blood or other excretions to determine whether a substance or drug has been induced or whether a substance or drug has been introduced to interfere with the testing procedures. Positive tests will result in forfeiture of ribbons, trophies, plaques and premiums and may result in banning from future participation.
36. **PREMIUMS AND RIBBONS** - Each entry will receive a ribbon (purple, blue, red or white) in each class. Monetary premiums will be paid to the top three entries in each class, excluding Showmanship. Premiums paid will be \$20, 15, 10.
37. Exhibitors may be disqualified and all premiums withheld for unnecessary roughness or poor sportsmanship.
38. Classes to receive plaques: Division Champions (Western, Draft, Other Breeds, Mule and Pony); Showing; Draft Showing; English and Western Equitation; High Point Exhibitor; High Point Equestrian Team; additional awards may be announced on show day.
39. **Only purple and blue ribbon winners can be named Champion of a show/division/class.**
40. All horses will be excused after showing and must be out of area by 10:00 p.m. on Thursday, August 13. (Horses in the Parade of Champions must be out following the Parade.) Failure to comply will result in loss of premiums and banning from exhibiting next year.

**SHOWING - DIVISION 849**

**CLASS**

- 48 Showmanship - The class must be entered on the entry form. This is a class to illustrate the exhibitor's ability to fit, groom and show a horse or pony at halter. Only owners of the animals exhibited are eligible to compete for and receive showing awards.  
Ribbons only - Ribbons will be awarded designating 1<sup>st</sup> through 5<sup>th</sup> place. Ribbons for other awards will be marked "Honorable Mention".  
Gold Showing Group - Ribbons and FFA Belt Buckles (belt buckles will not be presented to previous winners).

**HIGH POINT AWARDS**

No entry form or entry fee required.

High Point Awards will be determined using class placing 1<sup>st</sup> - 5<sup>th</sup>.

High Point Exhibitor - Exhibitor earning the most points in two or more classes.

Reserve High Point Exhibitor - Runner up to the High Point Exhibitor.
