DEPARTMENT RULES

- 1. General rules, regulations and health requirements listed on the Iowa State Fair website and in the FFA section apply in this department, with special emphasis on the following sections: Member Eligibility, Supervision and Lodging, Good Conduct Policy, Medication and Drug Testing, and Showing and Fitting Ethics.
- 2. Nominations must be submitted online on or before May 15. A maximum of 20 head may be nominated.
- 3. Entries are open to registered and identified grade dairy animals that meet the stated FFA, 4-H and Iowa State Fair rules and regulations and were born before May 1, 2023. They must be enrolled as a part of each exhibitor's SAE program. Animals born prior to July 1, 2020 may be entered if they were enrolled as the exhibitor's SAE program and eligible to be exhibited as a 2-year-old heifer or younger. Animals entered are limited to those identified as either a 4-H or FFA project, but not both. Exhibitors may NOT show as both a 4-H and FFA exhibitor.
- 4. Entries must be submitted online on or before July 1. Entry fee is \$25 per head.

Common bedding will be used in the barns for all dairy cattle. The stalls will be bedded by the lowa State Fair Maintenance Staff with the fee included in the entry fee. No alternative bedding will be allowed on the grounds. Exhibitors will be allowed to purchase additional bedding to freshen stalls, but there will be a standard depth maintained.

- 5. Registered cattle may be entered in corresponding Open Classes provided additional entry is made on or before July 1 on an Open Class entry form, accompanied by an additional \$10 Open Class entry fee for each head. FFA or 4-H dairy animals also entered in the Open Classes must be entered in the same name as shown on the certificate of registry. All such entries are subject to Open Class rules.
- 6. Any yearling heifer that has freshened prior to time of judging must be evaluated in a 2-year-old class.
- 7. Each animal must be properly identified. Animals must have 2 out of 3 of the following identification methods recorded online by May 15:
 - a. Tag/Ear Tattoo; or
 - b. Registration Number; or
 - c. DHIA metal tag ID number

All levels of registry are acceptable. Registration papers or identified grade papers must match the animal.

- 8. Each exhibitor may enter up to six head with no more than two entries per class.
- 9. SUBSTITUTIONS Exhibitors may substitute provided the substitute animal was listed online by May 15.
- 10. Animals exhibited in this department must be housed in stalls designated by the Show Supervisors or forfeit all premiums earned. It shall be the prerogative of the Show Supervisors to reduce the number of stalls assigned to a county or chapter to the number actually required.
- 11. All animals will be judged on conformation only.
- 12. Placings will be made in four ribbon groups: purple, blue, red and white. Animals will be placed in numerical order within ribbon groupings. The number of animals in each grouping will be at the discretion of the judge.
- 13. First and Second place winners from calf and yearling classes will compete for Junior Champion. First and Second place in each of the 2 and 3 Yr Old cow classes are eligible for Intermediate Champion. First and Second place in each of the 4 Yr Old and Aged old cow classes are eligible for Senior Champion. Junior, Intermediate and Senior Champions will compete for Grand Champion.
- 14. **PREMIUMS AND RIBBONS** Each entry will receive a ribbon (purple, blue, red or white) in each class. Monetary premiums will be paid to the top three entries in each class. Premiums paid will be \$40, 25, 15. Premium amounts for classes 2-year old or older will be \$50, 30, 25.
- 15. If numbers in class warrant, the Show Committee will split classes accordingly.
- 16. FFA members will compete for showing awards with other youth in the designated showmanship class.

The lowa Jersey Cattle Club will provide an award for the top Jersey exhibitor in the Junior, Intermediate and Senior division of Dairy Showmanship.

The Iowa Milking Shorthorn Society offers a trophy to the Grand Champion Milking Shorthorn Female.
