## RULES

1. Iowa Family Living general rules and regulations apply in this department. In case general rules conflict with Fabric and Threads Department general or special rules, the latter shall govern.
2. SUBMITTING ENTRIES. Entries may be submitted online or by mail. Online entry and a printable lowa Family Living entry form are available at: https://www.iowastatefair.org/participate/competition/enter-iowa-family-living. If entering online, payment will be collected at time of entry. If entering by mail, complete entry form and return it with full payment of all fees to: lowa State Fair, lowa Family Living Entry Department, PO Box 57130, Des Moines, IA 50317-0003.
3. ENTRY DEADLINE IS JULY 1. Entries must be submitted online or postmarked on or before July 1.
4. ENTRY FEES. Each exhibitor, as a requirement for entry, will pay a $\$ 10$ department fee plus $\$ .50$ per entry. One tag will be issued for each entry. Exception: Quilt Block entry fee is $\$ 5$ (and department fee).
5. LATE ENTRIES. A $\$ 20$ department fee plus class fees will be charged for all entries submitted online or postmarked July 2 - July 8 . No entries will be accepted after July 8.

## ENTRY ELIGIBILITY

6. Entries in this department are limited to living residents of lowa.
7. All articles entered in this department must be strictly the work of the exhibitor.
8. Exhibitors are limited to one entry in each class.
9. A youth (exhibitors under 18 years) can enter an adult class only if there is not a comparable class for youth. If there is a youth class available in the Junior Division, youth must submit their entries in the appropriate youth class. Entries in adult classes will be judged as adult.
10. Articles may not have been exhibited in this department before.
11. Exhibit categories are based on techniques used. Please check each listing to assure the entry fits the categories listed. If it does not fit the categories listed, the entry will not be accepted. Entries that do not fit the size requirements or technique requirements of the category you enter them in will NOT be moved to the appropriate category. It is the exhibitors responsibility to enter their items correctly. You are encouraged to contact the Superintendent or ask questions on entry intake day to ensure your items are correctly entered.

## ENTRY TAGS

12. Entry tags will be mailed to you to be completed and placed on articles by you before shipment or delivery. Please complete both sides of entry tag.
13. Please complete the entry tag and secure to item with safety pin at least one inch in length. Exhibits will not be judged or displayed if tags are attached in any other manner.

## DELIVERY OF ENTRIES

14. The department will be open on Saturday, July 27 for receipt of articles. Parking is available on the south side of the Varied Industries Building. Please use southeast entrance to access the building. Articles will be received from 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Contact superintendent if you need other arrangements.
15. Articles entered may be sent by mail. For standard mail, send to: lowa State Fair, Fabric \& Threads Entry Department, PO Box 57130, Des Moines, IA 50317. For UPS or FedEx, send to: Iowa State Fair, Fabric \& Threads Entry Department, 3000 East Grand Avenue, Des Moines, IA 50317. Articles must be received by 4:00 p.m. on July 24. In no case will packages be received and articles placed on exhibition, unless all charges are prepaid.
16. Articles with entry tags attached using safety pins and sewn clothing on hangers must be in place by $4: 00 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{m}$. on Saturday, July 27 or they will not be judged. Please do not tie the tags to the exhibit. Please have some means of keeping all parts of an exhibit together.

## JUDGING

17. Exhibits that are soiled, covered in pet hair or emitting an unpleasant odor will not be judged or displayed.
18. Any premium may be withheld at the discretion of the judge. Judges are instructed to only give awards to exhibits deemed worthy of merit.
19. Sweepstakes is awarded to the person winning the most premium money in a division providing he/she has won at least one blue ribbon in that division. Best of Show premiums are not included in the total. Sweepstakes and Best of Show will be awarded in Divisions 51-65.

## RECLAIMING ENTRIES

20. Fabric \& Threads will be open ONLY on Monday, August 19 from Noon to $6: 00$ p.m. for return of exhibits. Arrangements to return exhibits by mail need to be made if entries cannot be picked up on August 19. Postage for items to be mailed needs to be sent to the superintendent before August 15 so that exhibits can be prepared for mailing in a timely manner.

Quilt Block on a Stick - Theme: Fair Fever (maximum perimeter no more than 36 inches; any construction; hand or machine quilted by entrant; backing must have a centered vertical sleeve in which a paint stick has been inserted)

## QUILT BLOCKS OF THE IOWA STATE FAIR RULES

1. This class is for a quilt constructed using the designs of the blocks that surround the Richard O. Jacobson Exhibition Center on the lowa State Fairgrounds. Patterns of the blocks can be found in the publication Quilt Blocks of the lowa State Fair.
2. Must use a minimum of 4 different block designs (no maximum).
3. Perimeter of at least 32 inches and no more than 400 inches.
4. May be made by an individual or a team.
5. Colors do not have to be an exact color match but must be in the same color family as depicted on the block (green where there is green, blue where there is blue, etc.). Colors may be pastel to dark or anything in between.
6. Using one of the quilt patterns included in the book is permitted.
7. Quilts must be entered in the lowa State Fair Fabric \& Threads division to be eligible to exhibit.

## QUILT BLOCK CONTEST

 RULES1. Blocks entered will become property of the lowa State Fair.
2. Limited to 60 participants
3. Contestants must specifically enter the quilt block contest and pay a fee of $\$ 5$. One block per exhibitor
4. A packet of materials will be mailed to the contestant to be used for construction of quilt block. DO NOT ADD FABRICS AND DO NOT QUILT.
5. Exhibitor may use an established pattern or create an original block.
6. Deliver completed quilt block to the Fabric \& Threads Department on July 27 between 8:30 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. or mail to the Fabric \& Threads Entry Department by July 24 .
7. Judging will consider use of fabric, workmanship and overall appearance.
8. Blocks from each contest will be made into items to be given away by raffle at the 2025 lowa State Fair or used for other fundraising endeavors for the department.

## QUILTS OF VALOR

## RULES

1. Quilts entered will become property of the lowa State Fair and will be distributed by Central lowa Quilt Sew-ciety to Veterans at the lowa Veterans Home.
2. Premiums will be awarded as follows: $1^{\text {ts }}-\$ 50,2^{\text {nd }}-\$ 40,3^{\text {rd }} \$ 30$.
3. Please follow basic requirements listed below.

## BASIC REQUIREMENTS

1. Fabric used should be high quality $100 \%$ "shirt-weight" or "quilt-weight" cotton fabric appropriate for adults.
2. While Quilts of Valor do not have to be red, white and blue, most recipients, given a choice, choose quilts that are patriotic in theme.
3. Patterns and blocks can be of any design suitable for a patriotic theme.
4. Use of military-branch-specific fabrics (Army, Navy, etc.) or non-"patriotic" fabric (overly floral), unless the recipient is known in advance, may create difficulty in identifying a recipient.
5. A Quilt of Valor is to be large enough to cover an average-sized adult, with an ideal size approximately $60^{\prime \prime} \times 80$." Finished size can be no smaller than 55 " x $65^{\prime \prime}$ and no larger than $72^{\prime \prime} \times 90$."
6. A Quilt of Valor consists of a top, batting and backing and must be machine quilted or hand quilted. A tied quilt is not acceptable for a Quilt of Valor.
7. Backings provided to volunteer QOVF-registered longarmers must be 4" larger than the quilt top on all sides ( 8 " wider in with and 8 " longer in length than the top). Note: Some longarmers may have different requirements.
8. Only member volunteers in good standing can request free-of-charge quilting of their tops by a QOVF-registered volunteer longarmer.
9. Batting should be quality, low-loft batting. Quilting should be appropriate for the quilt and not overly dense, which can reduce the loft of the quilt.
10. Binding strips should be joined with diagonal seams. Binding should be double-fold ("French fold"), attached by machine, and finished by hand or machine.
11. A Quilt of Valor must be labeled as such:
-- Must have the words Quilt of Valor
-- May be purchased (www.spoonflower.com, www.modernyardage.com)
-- May be your own design (hand-written in permanent ink, embroidered, pieced, computer printed, screen printed)
-- Must include space for name of recipient
-- Must have names of top maker, quilter, and binder (can include first and last names, city, state)
-- Cannot include religious or political message
-- May include date and location of award
-- May include washing instructions (cold water, mild detergent, "color catcher", dry on low heat)
12. Before awarding, a Quilt of Valor must be machine laundered (gently, using mild detergent) so any bleeding of fabric dyes has occurred prior to awarding, and because some facilities where quilts are awarded require pre-laundering. Use of a "color catcher" that attracts loose dye during washing is recommended.
13. A note, card, letter or journal documenting the creation of a Quilt of Valor may be presented to the recipient along with the quilt.

## CLOTHING CONSTRUCTION - DIVISION 62

1. Ready to wear items are garments like those that would be available to buy off the shelf at a retail store. They can include tops, shirts, blouses, tunics, slacks, pants, etc. Any item can be exhibited in the ready to wear classes that do not have a specific class noted. There is no restriction on fabric type - it can be woven, knit, etc.
2. Athleisure wear is a style of clothing that is comfortable and suitable for doing sports, but also fashionable and attractive enough to wear for other activities. Examples include tracksuits, sports jackets, hoodies, yoga pants, tights, leggings and shorts that look like athletic wear, characterized as fashionable, dressed-up sweats and exercise clothing.
