RULES

- 1. Open Class Livestock general rules, regulations and health requirements apply in this department. In case general rules conflict with Beef Cattle Department general or special rules, the latter shall govern.
- 2. SUBMITTING ENTRIES. Entries must be made online at https://www.iowastatefair.org/participate/competition/enter-open-class-animals.
- 3. ENTRY DEADLINE IS JULY 1. ENTRIES MUST BE SUBMITTED ONLINE ON OR BEFORE JULY 1.
- 4. ENTRY FEES. Each exhibitor, as a requirement for entry, will pay an entry fee of \$30 per animal. Entry Fee must accompany entry or it will be returned. If a calf of a cow/calf pair is also shown individually, there will be an entry fee of \$30 for the pair and an entry fee of \$30 for the calf (two stalls will be issued).

4-H/FFA HEIFERS. Exhibitors entering in 4-H or FFA classes may also enter in corresponding Open Classes by paying a \$15 fee and making entry on Open Class entry forms on or before July 1. All such entries must be made in the name of the owner as shown on the registry certificate and become subject to Open Class rules.

- 5. LATE ENTRIES. Entries submitted July 2 July 8 will be charged a late fee of \$10 per head in addition to regular entry fees. No entries will be accepted after July 8. Entries are accepted according to earliest submit date.
- 6. **REFUNDS.** No refunds of fees will be made unless cancellation is received **IN WRITING** (letter or e-mail) by July 21. No refunds will be given on tickets, wristbands or vehicle permits. No refunds of \$10 or less will be issued. Refunds will be made by mail after the close of the Fair (separate from premium checks).
- 7. ADMISSION TO THE FAIR. Each exhibitor, as a requirement for entry, must purchase two discounted admission tickets at \$11 each when making entry. Additional tickets may be purchased. Discounted tickets for children 6-11 years old may be purchased for \$7 each. Without admission tickets, the full price of \$16 (adults) and \$10 (children) per day will be charged at the gate.
- 8. UNLOAD PERMITS. Each exhibitor will be given one unload permit. This permit allows a maximum of 30 minutes to unload animals and tack but does <u>not</u> provide parking.
- 9. VEHICLE PERMITS. Each exhibitor may purchase a vehicle parking permit at \$10 per day. Each exhibitor is limited to two ongrounds lot permits per day. Any additional passes will be issued for Lot Y. Vehicle permits must be purchased in advance by indicating the specific days needed on the Beef Cattle Entry Form. Each vehicle permit will park one car or truck (no trailers) in a Fairgrounds lot for the specified day(s). Vehicle permits are required to park in Fairgrounds lots on a space available basis. Parking will not be available at the gate.

STALLS

- 10. STALL SIZE IS APPROXIMATELY 48 INCHES WIDE. PLEASE PLAN ACCORDINGLY FOR COW/CALF PAIRS, TWO YEAR OLD BULLS AND OTHER ANIMALS THAT WILL NEED ADDITIONAL ROOM. Additional bedded stalls can be purchased for \$30 per stall.
- 11. All animals must be stalled. No cattle are to be kept in trailers. The Beef Cattle Superintendent can reassign stalls based on entries and available space.
- 12. TACK STALLS. All Open Class Beef Cattle Exhibitors are required to purchase a minimum of one tack stall at \$7 per stall. A maximum of three tack stalls may be purchased.
- 13. BLOCKING CHUTES. Blocking chute fee is \$15 per chute. Fee does <u>NOT</u> include stall. Any blocking chute without lowa State Fair identification for the current year will be removed. (If purchased, chute pass will be mailed with admission tickets/vehicle permits.) Blocking chutes will not be allowed in barn aisles. No chutes allowed in walk way behind cattle and when not in use all chutes are to be collapsed and put out of sight. Abuse of this rule will cause chutes to be stored outside Barn.
- 14. **BEDDING.** Common bedding will be used in the barns for all beef cattle. The stalls will be bedded by the lowa State Fair Maintenance Staff. No alternative bedding will be allowed on the Fairgrounds. Exhibitors will be allowed to purchase additional bedding to freshen stalls, but there will be a standard depth maintained.
- 15. Exhibitors must keep the space in the rear of their stalls clear and clean; all litter must be thrown where indicated by the Beef Cattle Superintendent.
- 16. Exhibitors must keep their stalls open and stock uncovered from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. during each day of exhibition.
- 17. **TIE-OUTS.** Livestock tie-outs will be assigned by the Cattle Barn Office Staff. Each breed will have an assigned area. Exhibitors should report to the Cattle Barn Office for tie-out assignments upon their arrival to the Fair. Cattle must be tied in this area and no pens will be allowed. Tie-outs will be rebedded once each day as determined by the Beef Cattle Superintendent.

ARRIVAL/RELEASE

- 18. Open Class Beef Cattle must be stalled and released by times listed on the Cattle Schedule. Cattle exhibitors may request late arrival or early release by showing evidence of exhibiting at another fair. Request must be made in writing to the Superintendent by August 1. Early arrivals will not be accepted. Any exhibitor arriving before the scheduled time will forfeit premiums. Entry fees will not be refunded.
- 19. Premiums will be withheld by the Iowa State Fair if cattle and equipment are not out of stalls according to the schedule as determined by the Beef Cattle Superintendent.

ELIGIBILITY OF ANIMALS

- 20. **IDENTIFICATION.** ALL breeding cattle must have official individual identification and be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection that lists official identification. Examples of acceptable official identification are: a USDA approved alphanumeric tag, Brucellosis (calfhood) vaccination tag, or purebred registry tattoo, or USDA approved RFID or 840 series tag.
- 21. **REGISTRATION.** All registry information must be listed on entry form due on or before July 1. The following must be included: name, registry number, date of birth and sire of each bull and female entry. Applied for registrations on spring born calves will be allowed on July 1 entries. You <u>must</u> have the original registration at check-in time. Affidavits or applied for paperwork will not be accepted at check-in. Electronic registration papers will be accepted if accessed directly from the breed registry's website. Each breed catalog will include only those animals named on the entry form and no others may be shown.
- 22. **OWNERSHIP.** Unless otherwise specified, to be eligible for competition, whether single or in groups, animals must be the bona fide property of and owned by the exhibitor at the time of exhibition. Registry or transfer certificate showing exhibitor to be the owner must be presented upon demand. Animals owned in partnership may be entered in all classes, to which they are eligible, in one partner's name, but must be shown under the same ownership in each class. The entry must carry a footnote showing the actual ownership of the animal as appearing in the herd book records.
- 23. Animals shown as bred by exhibitor must be so recorded with the Breed Association. Those bought in dam cannot be shown as bred by exhibitor. Animals bred by a member of a firm or partnership shall be considered as bred by the firm or partnership.
- 24. **IOWA OWNED.** An animal must be bred, and an interest owned or co-owned by an Iowa exhibitor, and such ownership must be shown on the certificate of registry as of date of exhibition for Iowa Special Classes.
- 25. ENTER BEEF CATTLE BY DIVISION AND CLASS NUMBERS ACCORDING TO SPECIFIC BREED. AN ANIMAL MAY ONLY BE SHOWN IN ONE BREED SHOW.
- 26. Any bulls shown at the 2024 lowa State Fair cannot be born before January 1, 2022. All bulls 12 months of age and older must show with a nose lead.
- 27. Females of any age may be shown; however, those born before September 1, 2022 must show in lactation with natural born calf at side. For calf age requirements refer to "Special Breed Rules". Calves must be entered in their respective calf class if they are to be shown as a calf entry.
- 28. Unnamed entries will not be accepted in individual classes. Animals to compose a group need not be named on the entry form, but each one must be entered and shown in individual classes. The catalog number of each animal must be stated on a printed form available at the Superintendent's Office and handed to the ring clerk before the show or upon entry of the group into the show ring. Sire in "Get of Sire" and Dam in "Produce of Dam" classes must be named on entry form.
- 29. SUBSTITUTION. Substitution outside the class (same breed) will be accepted at check-in. Animal to be substituted must be owned by the exhibitor at the time of exhibition.
- 30. See "Special Breed Rules".

DISQUALIFICATION

- 31. Any artificial means of removing or remedying physical defects or conformation in exhibition animals, such as lifting or filling under the skin, will be considered as fraud and deception. No unnatural means of providing an animal feed, water (i.e. stomach pump, drench gun, IV) will be allowed. All exhibitors whose animals give evidence of such treatment will be barred indefinitely from exhibition at the Iowa State Fair. In addition, any exhibiting family whose animals are found suspect of using illegal drugs at any fair or livestock show holding membership in the International Association of Fairs and Expositions may be barred indefinitely from showing at the Iowa State Fair.
- 32. No powders of any color, false tailheads, glued-on hair or hair-like substances may be used to fit cattle.
- 33. All Beef Cattle animals must be on a halter at all times. Absolutely no loose beef animals will be allowed.
- 34. Cable halters will not be allowed in the show ring.

BREED DISPLAYS

35. A 10x10 foot area will be furnished by the lowa State Fair for a breed display booth to state associations currently holding a scheduled show. Additional space can be reserved through the Entry Department at \$10 per front foot. Beef cattle breeds that do not have competition classes may be displayed with payment of \$100 per 20' space, if space is available.

SHOW PROCEDURE

- 36. A farm, family, firm or partnership may show up to 24 head no limit on number shown by one exhibitor in an individual class. 4-H and FFA heifers shown in Open Class shall count toward the limitation of 24 head.
- 37. Classes in each breed will be determined after all entries are in based on total number shown. As nearly as practical, classes will be set at 15 head, based on date of birth.
- 38. Exhibitors should be to the show ring in a timely manner. Ring staff reserves the right to close the class as deemed appropriate. Absolutely NO entries may enter the ring once a class has begun to be placed.
- 39. Only one person per animal shall lead an animal in the show ring.
- 40. All male breeding cattle must be weighed (female optional) at the show, prior to showing, and exhibit cards will carry this information.
- 41. Determination will be made after classes are made up as to which class winners will compete for each championship award.
- 42. An lowa Champion Bull and Female will be selected from the highest placing lowa bred and owned or co-owned division winners in each breed.
- 43. Group classes will be provided in some breeds as follows and can be entered after arrival at Fair.

Produce of Dam: Two or more animals with same dam, shown in individual classes, may be owned by more than one exhibitor.

Junior Get of Sire: Three animals by one sire, both sexes represented, shown in Junior classes (first one-half of the classes, or in case of odd number of classes, one-half plus one).

Get of Sire: Four animals, by one sire, both sexes represented, may be owned by more than one exhibitor.

Five Head: Any age, bred and owned or co-owned by exhibitor.

Exhibitor is limited to two entries in each group class, but an exhibitor may make only one entry by the same sire in each Get of Sire class. All animals showing in groups must have been exhibited in individual classes.

OPEN CLASS BEEF CATTLE SPECIALS

The **lowa Beef Breeds Council** will award \$500 to the junior exhibitor of the highest ranking heifer purchased from each breed sale at the 2024 lowa Beef Expo and exhibited at the 2024 lowa State Fair. Heifers will be ranked at the discretion of each breed association under the following conditions: 1. The heifer must have been purchased in an lowa Beef Expo sanctioned sale and exhibited by a junior at the 2024 lowa State Fair.

- The heifer must have been purchased in an Iowa Beef Expo sanctioned sale and exhibited by a junior at the 2024 Iowa State Fair.
 Only one heifer per breed sale (12 total) will be awarded. Therefore, high and low percentage cattle will be considered for one reward.
- Only one heifer per breed sale (12 total) will be awarded. Therefore, high and low percentage cattle will be considered for one reward. Furthermore, cattle with multiple registrations may only be awarded by the breed association which sold those cattle at the 2024 Iowa Beef Expo.

BREED PROBATION

According to the Breed Probation rule listed in the General Rules and Regulations of the Iowa State Fair Open Class Livestock Premium Book, the following breed is on probation for the 2024 Iowa State Fair: **South Devon**. As a result of probation status, 25% of the offered premiums will be deducted. Probation premiums are listed in italics in the Premium Schedule. Please review the Breed Probation rule for further information.

SPECIAL ANGUS RULES

- 1. A minimum of 50 head must be shown in the Open Class Division to receive American Angus Association premium participation for the following year.
- Premiums from the Association are paid only to registered Angus cattle and only if the registration number is a part of the show report provided to the Association. Therefore, all cattle should be registered at the time of entry to make certain they receive the Association's portion of premiums. The Association does not pay on championship or any group classes (i.e. get of sire, junior get of sire or breeder six head).
- Exhibitors must have the original registration certificate issued by the American Angus Association available for inspection at the show for each animal
 or another current proof of ownership issued by the American Angus Association pedigree look up. Electronic registration papers will be accepted if
 accessed directly from the breed registry's website.
- 4. Any animal, upon check-in, which does not have a legible permanent identification mark (ear tattoo marks, freeze-branded marks or hot-branded marks) corresponding to the permanent identification mark on the registration certificate, is ineligible to show. Once disqualified due to an incorrect or illegible permanent identification mark, animals cannot be re-identified (tattooed/branded) and re-checked at the show.
- 5. Any female shown with calf at side: the calf must be the cow's most recent natural calf and the calf must be registered by show day and have proof of registration at check-in.
- 6. Any female that qualifies for female classes in the Association's standard classifications is not eligible to show in the cow/calf classes. However, the calf at the side of the female is eligible to show in its respective class.
- 7. Grand and Reserve Grand Champion Cow/Calf pairs do not show for Grand Champion Female and are ineligible to compete in the Get of Sire, Junior Get of Sire and Breeder Six Head Classes.
- 8. Only one person at a time shall lead an animal into the show ring.
- 9. Exhibitors who participate in shows that accept premium monies contributed by the American Angus Association are subject to the Association Rules as found in the Breeders Reference Guide of the Association. These rules are found in Part 2; Association Rules. The rules relating directly with the exhibition of Angus cattle are Part 2: Association Rules; Rule 800 Series; including Rule 800-810. These rules can be found at <u>www.angus.org</u>.
- 10. Altering the conformation and/or appearance of an animal for exhibition is prohibited. This includes the use of chin straps, covering of white skin, false tail heads (or use of any false hair), with the exception of false tail switches. The use of graphite, powders, hemp or other similar substances used externally are also prohibited. Other prohibited products include those used internally such as steroids, illegal or unlicensed pharmaceuticals or artificial filling. Any animal found to be in violation will be barred from showing.
- 11. At any show for which the American Angus Association appropriates funds toward the payment of premiums, no exhibitors, individuals assisting exhibitors or member owners at such show shall be allowed to use any coloring agents, on any animal exhibited. The Association may adopt and implement various tests designed to monitor this prohibition, including but not limited to a "white towel" or "white glove" test. No aerosol cans or other pressurized containers will be allowed in designated line up areas.
- 12. All animals exhibited are subject to DNA marker or blood type test to verify accuracy of parentage as covered under the Association Rules and for other testing as required by the individual show.
- 13. Authorized representatives of the Association have the authority to enforce the rules set forth herein as well as in the Association Rules, including the barring of a registered animal from a livestock show at which it is to be shown, if there are reasonable grounds to believe a violation has occurred.

Only bona fide (original) certificates of registration will be accepted as evidence of registration and ownership; <u>NO PHOTOCOPIES</u>. Electronic registration papers will be accepted if accessed directly from the breed registry's website.
- 2. Percentage Charolais Females must be composed of at least 50% and no more than 15/16 Charolais Percentage. Females must have a RF or FP certification of recordation with the American-International Charolais Association (AICA).
- 3. An animal is eligible to enter or compete in an Open Charolais Breeding Class if registered in country of origin outside the United States and is eligible for purebred registry in the AICA Herdbook.
- 4. Animals registered in the AICA Colored Division Registry (QF and QM initialed registration numbers) must meet the parameters of the AICA Color Card.
- 5. All animals to be eligible may be approved by a sifting committee designated by the AICA. Stall space will not be provided for any Charolais cattle that have not been accepted by the sifting committee.
- 6. All animals are subject to a medical examination in order to determine age, and each animal will be present in the show ring in its natural conformation without alteration or modification. Use of artificial tailheads is not permitted.
- 7. Any animal not having a legible tattoo or firebrand number is ineligible and will be barred from showing.
- 8. Bulls from Classes 24, 25, 26, 27 and 28 must have a valid, satisfactory semen test certificate in possession. This certificate is valid for the entire show season.
- All animals shown in individual classes must be weaned, with the exception of the Cow/Calf Class and calves at the side of females calved after September 1, 2022. Calves at side must be purebred and registered with the AICA. Females calved after September 1, 2022, must show in individual female class appropriate to age. Nurse cows are not permitted.
- 10. All females 20 months and older exhibited at AICA sanctioned shows must be accompanied by a certificate of pregnancy from a licensed veterinarian or have produced fertile eggs as certified in a written statement by a licensed veterinarian or embryologist or have a calf at side.
- 11. AICA requires that all animals be shown with a halter and suggests that all bulls be shown with a nose lead.
- 12. ALL EXHIBITS OF CHAROLAIS BREEDING CATTLE SHALL BE GOVERNED BY THE AICA RULES AND REGULATIONS, ARTICLE XV, TITLED EXHIBITION OF ANIMALS. THE INSPECTION OF EXHIBIT CATTLE IS SPECIFIED IN ARTICLE XV, PARAGRAPH C, OF THE ASSOCIATION RULES AND REGULATIONS AND NON-COMPLIANCE OF EXHIBIT INSPECTION IS SPECIFIED IN PARAGRAPH D OF THE SAME ARTICLE XV.
- 13. ARTICLE XV, PARAGRAPH B, POINT 2: "Each animal will be presented in its natural conformation and structure without alteration or modification. Alteration or modification shall be defined to include any surgical, chemical, electrical or other (including banding or other circulatory constriction) appearance change for cosmetic purpose, save only branding, tattooing, foot trimming or dehorning. The act of artificially filling animals internally, which would include stomach pumping, drench tubes or any other method per os (by esophagus) is prohibited. Silicone injection or other injection for

cosmetic purpose shall be prohibited. Anabolic steroid use shall likewise be prohibited and any animal testing positive for anabolic steroid or diuretic use shall be presumed to be altered and modified."

- 14. Effective October 22, 2004, at any American-International Charolais Association (AICA) sanctioned show (including shows receiving AICA premium funding and/or qualifying as a Roll of Excellence Show), the use of a coloring agent, flock and powder is prohibited. Use of these products will result in immediate disqualification of a given animal at such show.
- 15. Where circumstances exist and/or allow, AICA reserves the right to split large individual classes after the check-in procedure is complete.
- 16. ALL RULES OF SHOW APPLY.

- 1. All animals must be registered with the American Gelbvieh Association.
- 2. Percentage, purebred and fullblood Gelbvieh bulls 75% to 100% will show together in the Gelbvieh Show.
- 3. Percentage and purebred Gelbvieh females 75% to 100% will show together in the Gelbvieh Show.
- 4. A 75% female or bull that qualifies to show either as a Gelbvieh or Balancer, can only be entered and exhibited in one division at a show. Exhibitors must designate Gelbvieh or Balancer as "Breed" at the time of entry NO changes will be allowed after entries are received.
- 5. Balancer is a registered trademark of the American Gelbvieh Association. All animals shown in the Balancer division must meet the AGA's rules for registration as a Balancer hybrid.

Balancer cattle are:

- a. 25% to 75% Gelbvieh
- b. 25% to 75% Angus, black or red
- c. Up to 1/8th other or unknown ancestry as a Balancer
- d. A minimum of 75% of the pedigree must be documented through official breed registries.
- 6. Group classes can be made up of a combination of Gelbvieh and Balancer cattle, but no group can be entirely made up of Balancers. All animals must be shown in individual classes.
- 7. Ring of Gold points will be awarded to winning animals in accordance with the American Gelbvieh Association's Ring of Gold rules available on the American Gelbvieh Association web site http://www.gelbvieh.org/news/shows/.
- 8. All animals exhibited must be recorded in the name of the exhibitor prior to check-in at the Iowa State Fair. Registration papers must be presented at check-in at the Fair. Electronic registration papers will be accepted if accessed directly from the breed registry's website.
- 9. Cattle must be entered and exhibited under the recorded ownership at the time of the show entry deadline date. Jointly owned animals must be entered and shown under the multi-ownership (all co-owners) in the individual classes.
- 10. All animals must be properly tattooed, including herd prefix, and may be inspected at the show. Tattoos must be legible and match registration papers at check-in.
- 11. Age of calf at side in Cow/Calf Class must not exceed 240 days as of date of the show.

SPECIAL HEREFORD RULES

- 1. Horned and Polled Hereford bulls, cow/calf pairs and group classes will show together. Horned and Polled Hereford females will show separately.
- 2. Exhibitors in Hereford classes are subject to the American Hereford Association's special rule on class qualification, and any animal without a legible tattoo will not be eligible for show. Animals must be tattooed prior to arriving on the Fairgrounds. All Hereford animals must be officially recorded at show time to be eligible to show. Entries with registrations "Pending" or "Applied For" will be ineligible to show.
- 3. If there are more than 10 animals in a class, the AHA show committee recommends that the class be split.
- 4. Cow/calf does not compete for overall champion female.
- 5. Premier Exhibitor and Premier Breeder will be awarded using the following point system: 1st place, 5 points; 2nd place, 4 points; 3rd place, 3 points; 4th place, 2 points and 5th place, 1 point. No points will be given for champions. Points will be awarded for the Best Six Head for Premier Exhibitor. The same scoring system as above will be used for awarding points for the group classes.

NORTH AMERICAN LIMOUSIN FOUNDATION - MEDAL OF EXCELLENCE - LEVEL II - SPECIAL LIMOUSIN AND LIM-FLEX RULES

- 1. All animals must be registered with the North American Limousin Foundation.
- Fullblood, percentage and purebred Limousin cattle will show together in the Limousin Show including all classes, divisions and championships. All animals must be 75% (3/4) Limousin or greater as indicated by an orange registration certificate. Lim-Flex cattle will show in the Lim-Flex Show including all classes, divisions, and championships. Lim-Flex cattle will be indicated by purple registration certificates. Cow-Calf entries will show based on the cow's registration. All percentages will be NALF calculated percentages.
- 3. Animals must be properly tattooed and will be inspected at the show. Tattoos must be legible and match the registration certificates. If an animal's tattoo is not legible or cannot be read upon initial processing, it will be ineligible to show and not be allowed to return with a new or corrected tattoo.
- 4. To maintain a high degree of confidence in Limousin shows, NALF reserves the right to disqualify any animal that has been fitted in an unethical manner. Unethical fitting shall include the following:
 - a. any use of paints, hair-coloring conditioners, colored show foam, graphite, colored powders or any other substances; animals may be subject to white towel test
 - b. the addition of any hair or hair like substances, including false tail heads and false polls (false tail switches are allowed)
 - c. the cutting, tearing or gluing of the hide or underneath the hide or removal of tissue in an attempt to alter the shape of the animal or the injection of any gas, solid or liquid under the hide to alter the normal conformation
 - d. any products, solutions or liquids administered internally or externally to alter the conformation of the animal is prohibited. This includes the use of steroids, growth stimulants and the act of artificially filling animals internally, which would include stomach pumping, drench tubes or any other method

EXCEPTION: In the case of severely sick or severely dehydrated animals, the exhibitor may have fluids or electrolytes administered by the licensed official show veterinarian with the approval of the show superintendent or a NALF representative. This exception is not applicable on show day or weigh-in/check-in day.

- 5. Bulls older than one year must show with a nose lead. The Limousin show superintendent and the show management reserve the right to disqualify animals deemed unmanageable.
- 6. Protests against exhibitors, individual animals or fitting violations must be submitted in writing, signed by five active members of NALF and presented to the show superintendent within 12 hours of the show's completion.
- 7. NALF reserves the right to mouth animals for dental development.
- 8. NALF reserves the right to collect hair samples from any animal.
- 9. Classes and championship breaks will be determined after all cattle have been checked in. No class shall contain more than 20 head or have an age spread of more than 60 days unless the animals are older than 2 years.
- 10. Limousin: Calves exhibited alongside dams in the cow/calf division **are eligible** to show as individuals in the **Lim-Flex show** (if offered) as long as the calf is registered and qualifies as determined by registration papers from NALF.

Lim-Flex: Calves exhibited alongside dams in the cow/calf division **are eligible** to show as individuals in the Limousin show as long as the calf qualifies as determined by its NALF percentage. (Exception: Calves exhibited alongside dams at Major MOE shows where the calf can show in either the Limousin or Lim-Flex show, as registered.)

- 11. All animals shown must be solid red or black above the flanks, excluding birth marks.
- Credibility Requirement. To maintain a high degree of integrity and credibility in all Limousin shows, all owners and exhibitors are expected to
 adhere to all NALF rules and regulations regarding the exhibition of Limousin cattle and to adhere to rules and regulations of particular shows, fairs
 and expositions.

- Committee representing the Miniature Hereford Breeders Association.
- 3. All exhibitors must be current members of the MHBA in order to be eligible to show.

SPECIAL RED ANGUS RULES

- 1. All animals entered will have at least one owner on record as a Regular or Junior Member of RAAA at time Shows' published entry deadline.
- 2. Be registered with RAAA or the Canadian Angus Association and meet all requirements for Category 1A or 1B at time of Shows' published entry deadline. (Rev. 10.6.2015 BOD meeting. Temporary until REDSPro can process registrations and transfers without delay.)
- 3. Have Official Registered Status at the time of Shows' published entry deadline.
- 4. Entries are accepted with the understanding that each exhibitor agrees to conform to the Rules and Regulations of the RAAA. Enforcement will be at the discretion of the RAAA authorized representatives and may include barring an animal or exhibitor.
- 5. Exhibitors shall exhibit sportsmanship and professional behavior in and around the show ring. Abusive, discourteous, or threatening behavior towards judges, show officials, fellow exhibitors or RAAA authorized representatives will not be tolerated.
- 6. All animals must have legible tattoos, which match the Animal ID and Herd Prefix as recorded in the RAAA database prior to processing.
 - a. Animal ID and Herd Prefix verification may be via printed registration certificate or real time electronic representation of the RAAA database.
 - b. If the Animal ID and/or Herd Prefix are not legible and cannot be read during processing, it will be allowed to participate in the show. A fee of \$100 will be charged to the exhibitor for a DNA parentage test of said animal.
 - c. If the Animal ID and/or Herd Prefix are legible but are incorrect and/or no visible indications of a tattoo in either ear, the animal will not be allowed to show. Red Angus Association Breeder's Guide RR-40
- 7. Each animal will be exhibited in its natural conformation and structure and without any alterations or modifications, with the exception of acceptable fitting and grooming practices.
- 8. The use of paints, and/or the addition of any hair or hair-like substances will not be allowed.
- 9. At the time of processing, all females 20 months of age or older on publicized date of show must have the one of the following:
 - a. Certificate of pregnancy from a licensed veterinarian.
 - b. Written statement by a licensed veterinarian or embryologist of having produced fertile eggs.
 - c. A female's own natural born calf at side, which need not be registered, but must be eligible for category 1A or 1B registration in the RAAA.
- 10. All bulls 9 months of age or older on publicized date of show must be shown with a nose lead.
- 11. After processing, should the number of entries in any class exceed practicality, authorized representative of the RAAA have the authority to "split" classes and divisions according to age and at the date of birth that best encourages fair competition.
- 12. Any calf exhibited at the side of their dam in a cow/calf class may be exhibited in an individual class subject to all pertinent RAAA Show Rules and Classifications.
- 13. Any exhibitor who loses control of his/her animal twice in the show ring will be required to remove the animal from the ring.

SPECIAL RED ANGUS PERCENTAGE FEMALE RULES

- 1. Females must be registered with RAAA as a Category 2 or 3.
- 2. Females must be no less than 50 percent Red Angus.
- 3. The sire or the dam must be a registered Red Angus.
- 4. Must be red hided and polled (no black hided or black animals, refer to the RAAA Breeder's Guide for disqualifying characteristics).

- 5. All females must be under 2 years of age and will be shown as individuals.
- 6. A scurred animal is considered polled if you choose not to remove the scurs, if you surgically or mechanically remove the scur you will be disqualified.
- 7. Pairs will not be allowed in the show.
- 8. Classes will be broken by the show committee by animal date of birth.

- 7. All Shorthorn & ShorthornPlus are subject to a tattoo inspection, parentage DNA testing, an age inspection and/or females 20 months of age on day of show are subject to a blood test to prove pregnancy if deemed necessary by the ASA. The decision of an examining veterinarian is final.
- 8. Females 20 months of age on the day of the show need to have a pregnancy verification signed by an accredited, nonowner veterinarian at the time the female is processed for the show. If verification cannot be produced upon request, the exhibitor is allowed to find a qualified veterinarian to verify pregnancy prior to time of show.
- 9. Senior Yearling Females who have calved will show based on age. The exhibitor can exhibit the female with or without the calf at side. If a Purebred Female has a ShorthornPlus calf at side, it is not eligible for the Purebred Shorthorn Show, however it is eligible for the ShorthornPlus Show.
- 10. Females entered in a cow/calf class must have a natural born calf at side that does not exceed 280 days of age on show day and the calf must be registered with the ASA. If a Purebred Female has a ShorthornPlus calf at side, it is not eligible for the Purebred Shorthorn Show, however it is eligible for the ShorthornPlus Show.
- 11. Each of the listed classes MAY be broken into multiple classes to accommodate large numbers of entries, but separate classes <u>may NOT</u> be combined into one. For example, there MAY be four "Junior Heifer Calf" classes, but there <u>may NOT</u> be one single "Spring Heifer Calf" class combining Late and Early Spring calves).
