### TICKETS

Buy advance admission tickets and save \$5. You can buy them at any local Hy-Vee, Fareway or online at www.iowastatefair.org. Before August 10, tickets are \$11. If you do not buy them in advance, don't worry, you can buy them at the gate! Wednesday, August 16, is Older Iowans' Day; admission will be \$12 for anyone 60 and older.

## PARKING

There are two ways for you to park. One is parking right on the Fairgrounds; we have accessibility parking in Lot A. Entrance to Lot A would be driving through Gate 2 right off University Ave. The Lots do fill up quickly though, so the easiest way to park for the Fair is by taking the DART Park and Ride. There are three locations: Center Street Park and Ride, State Capitol and Southeast Polk High School. If you buy Fair tickets in advance, Park and Ride tickets will only be \$1. (If you do not buy the Fair tickets in advance, tickets are \$2.) The DART Park and Ride will then drop you off right at Gate 10.

#### **ANIMAL LEARNING CENTER**

Start your morning off right by seeing the cutest baby animals and their mothers at the Paul R. Knapp Animal Learning Center.

**FAIR MUSEUM** Take the east Sky Glider

(located between Thrill Ville and Ye Old Mill) or the Campground Tram up the hill to visit the Ralph H. Deet's Museum Complex. Learn about the history of the Iowa State Fair; maybe you will even remember some events that happened at the Fair.

#### **PIONEER HALL**

Watch fun contests or even participate in some at the Farm Bureau Pioneer Hall.
