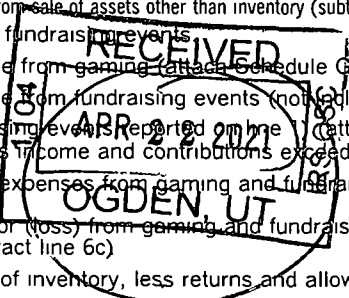

2019 Eloy Chamber's Program of Work The Eloy Chamber of Commerce provided community leadership, operates as the voice of business while encouraging growth by promoting the interests of business through advocacy, networking, and education. Business & individual Memberships total 125 - includes 13 non-profit organizations that also pay membership dues. During the year we provide local non-profit service organizations a venue to display their services and network with our membership at no cost. We organized 5 business luncheons & networking events with relevant speakers, & 6 business mixers as well. We held a community awards banquet in March 2019. We assisted local citizens with City contacts & City services. We provided mailing packets for anyone interested in relocating Eloy. Our Chamber Website includes our community guide. We are the liaison for our business clients who need assistance & representation to solve problems working with the City on code & zoning issues. We provide visitor information and are open daily to provide all citizens of Eloy with information & assistance pertaining to city services, community planning updates & community activities. We publish an annual Business Directory & Community Guide and distribute it throughout the state to 18 Visitor Centers/Chambers. The Chamber's CEO, Mark Benner is vice-chairman of the Eloy Downtown Advisory Council. The Chamber & the Sunland Visitor Center of Eloy share offices. The Chamber assists @ 300 visitors annually with recommendations on hotels, restaurants, and tourism activities. We also represent businesses and individual interests with our interaction with the City of Eloy's Economic Development & Community Planning Office. We sponsor advertising in partnership with the City of Eloy. Additionally, we are a community supporter and partner with the Eloy Community Services by assisting in their marketing to the Eloy community and providing financial support of their individual programs for the children.

Our efforts for marketing the Eloy Community continues with a year-round program. The Chamber funds, operates and maintains a chamber website and offers continuous marketing which provides up to date information about our community, member businesses and local attractions. We provide a Chamber Focus Radio Program weekly on KURE 106.1 FM, which includes a world-wide online streaming service as well. We hold quarterly business luncheons with speakers that share their knowledge with our members including Habitat Business Warrior speaker Eric Swanson, State of the City of Eloy annual business luncheon, the annual economic development presentation by Tim Kanavel the Economic Development Director in Pinal County & Jeff Fairman Eloy Economic Development Consultant for the City of Eloy We sponsor the Awards Banquet which recognizes local businesses and community leaders. We include community awards as well honoring the City of Eloy employee of the year Eloy Police Departments employee of the year. In 2019 we added the first responder category for the Fire District recognition of their selected employee. We also provide statewide tourist brochures and pamphlets for visitors to the greater Eloy community, our director & volunteer met with approximately 200 visitors looking for statewide traveling information, we assisted in the training of our in-house Sunland Visitor Center volunteers as well. these 11 volunteers average 150 visitors a month stop by during the winter season. Social media continues to be a growing community marketing channel and we have added additional videos including Facebook live broadcasts to promote Eloy events. Our Facebook Chamber Business Page and our Chamber Website garners more than 1,000 people interested in the Eloy community, visiting our website. We work with Google analytics to ensure our visitor count is accurate. The Eloy Chamber has a tight online security parameter, so we are able to eliminate potentially nefarious hits from accessing our chamber website.
