The Clinical Health Psychology (CHP) Fellowship program in Adult Consultation & Liaison Psychology Service (Adult C/L) has three (3) fellowship positions available for the 2025-2026 training year. Through our devotion to health service training and patient care, the Clinical Health Psychology Fellowship training program is **fully-accredited** by the Commission on Accreditation (CoA) of the American Psychological Association (APA). As such, fellowship training is structured around proficiency in APA's core competencies in Clinical Health Psychology, preparing fellows for immediate specialty certification in Clinical Health Psychology by the American Board of Clinical Health Psychology (ABCHP), a member specialty board of the American Board of Professional Psychology (ABPP).

Describe any other required minimum criteria used to screen applicants:

Our program is best suited for postdoctoral fellows who have received graduate-level training as scientist-practitioners or clinical scientists, and whose professional interests and internship experiences align with the specialty area of clinical health psychology. Eligible candidates must have completed a doctoral program (PhD or PsyD) in clinical or counseling psychology from an APA-accredited institution, as well as an internship at an APA-accredited or APPIC-member site.
