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

# Basic Procedure When Finding an Injured Person

Stay calm Secure the accident scene Ensure your own safety If necessary, rescue the injured person from the danger zone





### Content of the Emergency Call

Where did it happen? Provide the accident location, e.g., place, street, floor, section of the facility
What happened? Accident, fire, injury, illness, special hazards
How many injured? e.g., life-threatening injuries, unconsciousness
What type of injuries? Respiratory arrest, cardiac arrest
Wait for follow-up questions


## **Immediate Life-Saving Measures**

The most important steps to save a life

Check consciousness: Speak loudly, touch, shake.



Consciousness present: Act appropriately to the situation, e.g., treat wounds.



## **Emergency call**




### Consciousness not present:

Check breathing Clear airway, tilt head back, look, listen, feel.

Breathing present: Recovery position

### \* Retrieve AED



#### - 30 x Chest Compressions

Place hands on the lower third of the breastbone and press toward the spine Compression depth: 5 cm Rate: /min

#### Alternate with



#### - 2 x Rescue Breaths

Tilt the head back, blow air into the mouth or nose for second until the chest clearly rises

# **AED\*** If available follow the instructions of the Automated External Defibrillator

# Immediate Life-Saving Measures

## **Chest Compressions**




- Lay the injured person flat on a hard surface
- Expöse the chest
- Kneel beside the upper bödy
- Place the heel öf öne hand ön the löwer third öf the breastböne
- Place the heel of the second hand on top of the first (apply pressure only on the breastbone)
- With straightened arms, press döwn ön the breastböne 30 times, 5-6 cm deep, releasing after each cömpressiön
- 30 x chest cömpressiöns (cömpressiön rate I00-I20/min), alternate with 2 x rescue breaths
- Repeat until breathing starts ör emergency services take över

## **Rescue Breathing**



- 2 x rescue breaths alternating with chest compressions
- Tilt the head back
- For mouth-to-mouth breathing: pinch the nose closed, blow air into the mouth for 1 second until the chest visibly rises
- For mouth-to-nose breathing: close the mouth, blow air into the nose for 1 second until the chest visibly rises

### **Recovery Position**



- Straighten the unconscious person's legs
- Place the arm closest to you bent upward, palm facing up
- Place the far hand, palm against the cheek closest to you, and hold it in place
- With your free hand, grab the far thigh (not at the joint), bend the leg, and pull the person toward you
- The bent leg should rest at a right angle to the hip
- Now tilt the head back and open the mouth if needed, adjust the hand under the cheek to keep the head tilted back
- Continuously monitor breathing

# **Bleeding**

Recognition: - leeding wounds may be hidden by the

injured person's position or clothing

Principle: - Ensure self-protection and wear disposable gloves

#### Measures:





- The wound should be covered with a sterile dressing
- If necessary, place the person in the shock position
- Apply a pressure bandage if required

### Applying a Pressure Bandage:

- Place a wound dressing directly on the wound and secure it
- Place a pressure pad (e.g., a dressing pack) on top of the wound dressing
- Wrap tightly with bandages

## **Pressure Bandage**





### **Demolition of cooper parts**

#### Measures:

- Find the severed body part, do not wash it off
- Wrap in aseptic, cool dressing material as found
- Place in replantation bag

## Schock

Recognition: - Shivering and trembling

- Pale, cold skin

- Sweat on the forehead

- Noticeable restlessness

 These symptoms may not all appear or may not appear at the same time

Measures: - Ensure adequate rest


- Stop any bleeding if necessary

- Provide protection (e.g., place something under the person or cover them)

- Lay the person in the shock position

- ffer comforting words

 Continue monitoring consciousness and breathing



# **Fractures and Joint Injuries**

Recognition: - sually severe pain

- Abnormal position / restricted movement

Shortening of limbsLoss of functionProtective posture

Measures: - Immobilize in the position found

- Do not move the body part with the fracture

 If spinal injury is suspected, avoid changing the person's position

For open fractures, cover wounds with sterile dressings

- Cool the joints

#### Burns

#### Measures:

- Immediately stop and extinguish any burning on the person
- Remove clothing contaminated with hot substances immediately
- Do not remove clothing that is stuck to the skin
- Cool affected areas with running water until the pain subsides (approx. to 5 min)
- Cover with sterile burn dressing
- Protect from heat loss

- Ensure self-protection by wearing protective gloves and a mouthquard
- Ensure adequate rest for the body
- Important: Always seek medical attention from a specialist
- Do not induce vomiting
- Arrange for medical treatment

Eyes Must be rinsed thoroughly with water

- Remove any remaining solid substances mechanically using a damp cloth
- se a sterile protective dressina



#### Measures for Skin:

- Remove burned clothing, including underwear and shoes
- Rinse the skin with plenty of water
- Treat any resulting wounds with sterile dressings

### Measures for Swallowing:

- Immediately rinse the mouth thoroughly several times
- To achieve a dilution effect, administer water in small sips

### **Measures for Respiratory Organs:**

- Chemical burns from irritant gases (e.g., chlorine, nitrogen oxides) should always be assessed by the company doctor as part of first aid
- First aiders should be properly trained in this regard

# Poisoning by Inhalation, Contact, or Ingestion

Recognition: - Information from the injured person and others

Look for signs of toxic substances

Principle: - Ensure self-protection, such as using

protective gloves and respiratory protection

Measures: - Remove the poisoned person from the danger zone

- Determine the duration of exposure to the poison (which substances, concentration, amount)

- If necessary, secure any remaining poison

- Do not induce vomiting

-Arrange for medical treatment

Skin: - Immediately remove poisoned clothing (including

underwear and shoes)

- Rinse the skin thoroughly with water or a special rinse

solution

- Cover any wounds with sterile dressings

Swallowing: - Immediately rinse the mouth thoroughly

#### **Respiratory Organs:**

In cases of danger from toxic substances, specific first aid measures should be determined by the company doctor (e.g., oxygen, antidotes) and first aiders should be properly trained

## **Accidents Due to Electric Shock**

Recognition: - In every electrical accident, expect the

possibility of cardiac arrest

Principle: - Ensure self-protection

Measures: - Always ensure the power is cut off first, e.g.,

unplug, switch off, or activate the circuit breaker

Measures for Low Voltage over 1000 Volts

Principle: - Ensure self-protection, keep a 5-meter

distance, and immediately report the emergency as an "electrical accident"

Principle: - Ensure self-protection, keep a 5-meter

distance, and immediately report the emergency as an "electrical accident"

Measures: - Continuous monitoring of consciousness

- Continuous monitoring of breathing

- Provide care according to the person's condition

- Arrange for medical treatment

Measures for unknown voltages

Principle: - Pay attention to self-protection, keep a distance

of 5 m and report an 'electrical accident'

emergency call immediately

Measures: assistance in the event of an electrical accident:

- constant control of consciousness

- Constant control of breathing

- Care depending on condition

- Medical treatment

# **14 Documentation of First Aid Actions**

The documentation of a first aid action must be kept for at least 5 years and should contain the following information:

Report on the circumstances of the accident and the injured person			
Name of the injured person			
Date and time			
Department and work area			
Name of the witness			
Type and extent of the injury			
Type and extent of the illness			
Description of the incident

Description of the measure taken	
First aid materials used / removed
